*Regulations made by the Governor under the provisions of the Order of Her Majesty in Council dated October 26, 1896, as amended by the Order of His Majesty in Council dated March 21, 1916, and of all other powers him enabling.*

1. Regulation 1 of the regulations made by the Governor on November 28, 1918, with reference to the removal and transport of rice from the Southern Province, and published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* of November 30, 1918, is amended by inserting the words "or sea" after "rail" in the first line thereof.
2. This regulation shall come into operation on December 3, 1918.

*Regulations made by the Governor under the provisions of the Order of Her Majesty in Council dated October 26, 1896, as amended by the Order of His Majesty in Council dated March 21, 1916, and of all other powers him enabling.*

1. From and after the commencement of these regulations it is forbidden to remove or transport rice or paddy by rail or road from the North-Central Province except under permit to be issued by the Government Agent of the said Province.
2. Any person who contravenes the provisions of the last preceding regulation shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on summary conviction to imprisonment of either description for any term not exceeding six months, or to a fine not exceeding Rs. 1,500, or to both.
3. These regulations shall commence and come into operation on December 3, 1918.
