#### CENTRAL CHANCERY OF THE ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD.

St. James's Palace.

Instructions for wearing Badges round the Neck by the Possessors of the Insignia of more than one Order which is so worn.

Only one Ribbon and Badge, i.e., the senior one, is worn round the neck inside and under the collar of the Uniform Coat, so that the Badge hangs about an inch outside and below the front of the collar. All other Badges are worn, one below the other, commencing about an inch below the senior badge, each suspended on about three inches of ribbon emerging from between the buttons of the Uniform Coat. A small eye is stitched inside the coat to which the ribbon is fastened by a hook.

In Evening Dress one Badge only is worn round the neck, and, as a rule, the *senior badge* is thus worn, unless a junior one should appear to be more appropriate to the occasion. The ribbon, from which this badge is suspended, is worn under the white tie, the badge hanging about an inch below. All badges are worn also, in Miniature, on the lapel of the coat.

These instructions will not affect the existing regulations with regard to the wearing of Insignia, in Miniature, by Naval and Military Officers.

#### Wearing of Orders, Decorations, and Medals in Morning Dress.

All members of the various Orders of Knighthood, &c.; and all persons who have been awarded Decorations and Medals may, should they wish to do so, wear their Insignia, Decorations, and Medals with Morning Dress on Official Occasions and at Public Functions.

The Ribbons of the Orders, Decorations, and Medals may be worn on all occasions at the discretion of the holder.

The method of wearing the Insignia of Orders, also Decorations and Medals, on Official Occasions and at Public Functions with Morning Dress is as follows:—

Knights Grand Cross.. Knights Grand Commanders Dames Grand Cross ... Knights Commanders Dames Commanders ... Members of the Order of Merit Men who are Members of the Order of the Companions of Honour Companions of the several Orders of Knighthood Commanders of the Royal Victorian Order Men who are Commanders of the Order of the British Empire Women who are Members of the Order of the Companions of Honour.. Companions of the Distinguished Service Order Officers of the Order of the British Empire Members of the 4th and 5th Classes of the Royal Victorian Order Members of the Order of the British Empire Persons who have been decorated with-The Victoria Cross The Royal Red Cross ٠. The Distinguished Service Cross . . The Military Cross The Distinguished Flying Cross The Air Force Cross Persons who have been awarded medals

Should wear the Star only on the left breast of the coat or in a corresponding place on the dress, as the case may be.

Should wear the ribbon to which the Badge is suspended under the tie, which should be a bow, the Badge hanging about three-quarters of an inch below the bow.

Should wear the Badges, Decorations, and Medals on the left breast of the coat, or in a corresponding place on the dress, as the case may be.

The method of wearing the *ribbons* of Orders, Decorations, and Medals, which will be the same in all cases, both or men and women, is as follows:—

A piece of the ribbon one and a half inches wide, or the width of the medal ribbon, and half an inch in depth, accounted on a bar of metal in the form of a brooch, to be worn on the left breast of the coat, or in a corresponding place n the dress as the case may be.

 $N_{o^{te}}$ .—The above intimation only refers to Morning Dress, and does not alter the regulations with regard to wearing orders, Decorations, and Medals with Uniform, or with Evening Dress.

## "THE CEYLON DEFENCE FORCE ORDINANCE, 1910."

EGULATION made by the General Officer Commanding the Troops under section 12 of "The Ceylon Defence Force Ordinance, 1910," in substitution for regulation 217 (a) and (b) of the regulations dated November 24, 1911, and published in Government Gazette No. 6,477 of December 1, 1911, and approved by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government.

## REGULATION REFERRED TO.

217. (a) An instructor after six years' continuous foreign service, of which five years must have been in Colonial employment, may be granted six months' leave, viz., three months on full pay and three months on half pay, with a return passage by sea for himself only from Colombo to a port in the United Kingdom if he is returning to Ceylon for duty. If he is not returning to Ceylon for duty, he will be granted a single passage for himself only and two months' leave on full pay from date of arrival in the United Kingdom.

(b) An instructor who has not been granted leave under paragraph (a) may, after eight years' continuous foreign service, of which six years must have been in Colonial employment, be granted six months' leave as in paragraph (a), with return passages from Colombo to a port in the United Kingdom for himself and his family if he is returning to Ceylon for duty. If he is not returning to Ceylon for duty, he will only be granted single passages for himself and his family and two months' leave on full pay from date of arrival in the United Kingdom.

# Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 3, 1920.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 87 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 43 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 12 Moors, and 3 Malays). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1920, viz., 290,480) was 15.6, as against 15.9 in the preceding week, 26.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21 0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 186 (6 Burghers, 96 Sinhalese, 37 Tamils, 27 Moors, 6 Malays, and 14-Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 33.4, as against 32.7 in the previous week, 26.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 186 total deaths, 37 were of infants under one year of age, as against 50 in the preceding week, 37 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirty-one deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 12 in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 4 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island, 3 in Kotahena, 2 each in San Sobastian, St. Paul's, and Wellawatta, and I each in Pettah and Kollupitiya, as against 29 in the previous week and 21 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Ten deaths from Influenza were registered, 3 each in St. Paul's and Slave Island, and 1 each in Pettal,

Kotahena, New Bazaar, and Maradana, as against 6 in the previous week and 11 the week'y average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from Bronchitis were registered, as against 3 in the previous week.

2. (a) Eighteen deaths from Philipia records a second of the previous week. (a) Eighteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, 9 in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 5 in New Bazaar, 2 in Kollupitiya, and 1 each in St. Paul's and Wellawatta, same as in the previous week. The weekly average for last year was 14.

(b) One death of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama hospital from Phthisis during the week.

3. Eleven deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 4 in Maradana (including I death of a non-resident in hospital), 3 in Kotahena, 2 in San Sebastian, and 1 each in New Bazaar and Wellawatta, as against 2 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

4. Six deaths from *Plague* were registered, 4 in St Paul's, and 1 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island, as against 9, 5, 2, and 1, respectively, for the four preceding weeks. The weekly average for last year was 2.

5. One death from Smallpox, which occurred at the Infectious Diseases Hospital of a passenger on board the s.s. Obra, was registered.

6. Thirteen deaths were registered from Infanțile Convulsions, 12 from Debility, 9 from Enteritis, 4 each from

Dysentery and Worms, 3 from Diarrhea, and 60 from Other Causes.

7. Forty-three cases of Measles, 20 of Chickenpox, and 5 of Plague were reported during the week, as against 11, nil,

and 8, respectively, during the preceding week. One case of Smallpox was reported from the harbour.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.2°, against 79.0° in the preceding week and 79.8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.940 in., against 29.979 in. in the preceding week and 29.959 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 4.94 in., against 1.61 in, in the preceding week and 0.54 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

(a) Thirty-one deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 12 in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 6 in Kotahena, 4 in San Sebastian, 3 in Slave Island, and 2 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, and New Bazaar, same as in the previous week. The weekly average for last year was 21.

(b) Ten deaths from Influenza were registered, 4 in New Bazaar, 2 each in St. Paul's and Maradana, and 1 each in Pettah and San Sebastian, same as in the previous week. The weekly average for the last year was 11.

(c) Four deaths from Bronchitis were registered, same as in the previous week.
2. (a) Sixteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, 5 in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 4 in Kotahena, 3 in Wellawtta, 2 in Kollupitiya, and 1 each in St. Paul's and Slave Island, as against 18 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama hospital from Phthisis during the week.

3. Nine deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 4 in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena, and 1 in Slave Island, as against 11 in the previous week and 5 the weekly average for last year.

4. Eight deaths from *Plague* were registered, 5 in New Bazaar, 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 in San Sebastian, as against 6, 9, 5, and 2, respectively, for the four preceding weeks. The weekly average for last year was 2.

5. Twelve deaths were registered from Enteritis, 11 each from Infantile Convulsions and Debility, 6 from Diarrheea, 4 from Dysentery 1 each from Worms and Tetanus, and 85 from Other Causes.

6. Forty cases of Measles, 13 of Chickenpox, and 10 of Plaque were reported during the week, as against 43, 20,

and 5, respectively, during the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.6°, against 79.2° in the preceding week and 80.8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 30.024 in., against 29.940 in. in the preceding week and 29.983 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.40 in., against 4.94 in. in the preceding week and 0.09 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

This form must be presented in person to the Assistant Surveyor-General at Colombo, accompanied by the certificates referred to in paragraph 2, or to the Superintendent of Surveys in a Province.
  - 4. Subjects for the examination are:-
  - (i.) Mathematics.

(a) Geometry (Euclid Book I.).

- (b) Elementary Trigonometry (up to the solution of triangles).
- (c) Elementary Plane Mensuration.
- (d) Arithmetic.
- (ii.) (a) English Composition (Essay).
  - (b) Dictation.
- (iii.) Plan Drawing.

5. After passing the Entrance Examination candidates will have to pass a Medical Examination to ascertain if they possess a sound constitution, good vision, hearing, and physical fitness for duty in any part of the Island. A fee of Rs. 5 will be charged for the Medical Examination.

6. Applications for admission to the above class will not be accepted after midday on February 7. For further particulars regarding prospects, &c., application should

be made to the Surveyor-General.

7. Pay and conditions of promotion:

Grade I.—The number in this grade is 15, at Rs. 3,180 to Rs. 3,900 per annum by annual increments of Rs. 180, but those who have passed the Senior Departmental Examination will be entitled to rise to a maximum salary of Rs. 4,440 by annual increments of Rs. 180 after a halt of three years on Rs. 3,900.

Grade II.—The number in this grade has lately been increased from 25 to 50, at Rs. 1,800 to Rs. 3,000 per annum

by annual increments of Rs. 120.

Grade III.—The number in this grade has been reduced from 240 to 215, at Rs. 720 to Rs. 1,680 per annum by annual increments of Rs. 120.

8. III. Grade Surveyors with one year's service, irrespective of the salary they draw, and provided they are recommended by their Superintendent, will be eligible to enter for the Departmental Junior Examination, which will be held annually.

9. Surveyors who have passed the Junior Departmental Examination will become eligible for promotion to Grade II. after three years' service in Grade III., should their record be a good one, and also for promotion to Grade I. after serving one year on the maximum salary of Grade II.

Surveyors who have passed the Senior Departmental Examination will become eligible for promotion to

Grade I. after seven years' service in Grade II.

Surveyors who have passed the Senior Departmental Examination and show sufficient administrative ability will receive promotion to the Assistant Superintendent of Surveys Grade.
