PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of His Majesty GEORGE THE FIFTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM HENRY MANNING, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS in pursuance of section 13 of "The Defence Force Ordinance, No. 8 of 1910," We did by Our Proclamations dated August 2, 1914, August 5, 1914, and December 31, 1914, published in the *Government Gazette* of August 3, 1914, August 5, 1914, and January 5, 1915, call out for service the following corps of the Ceylon Defence Force, viz., the Ceylon Engineer Volunteers and the Ceylon Garrison Artillery (A and B Companies):

And whereas by Our Proclamation dated November 19, 1918, We did, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 13 (4) of the said Ordinance, proclaim that the period of such service should end at noon on Tuesday, November 19, 1918, with the exception of the services of Lieut.-Colonel E. J. Hayward, V.D., Major J. A. Symonds, V.D., and Capt. B. R. Lewis, members of the said Ceylon Garrison Artillery:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by the said section 13 (4) do hereby proclaim that the period of the service of Lieut.-Colonel E. J. Hayward, V.D., shall end at noon on February 4, 1919.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Fourth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Nineteen.
