VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1919.

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

This report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Births.

2. The number of births registered was 1,757 (921 males and 836 females), and was equivalent to an annual rate of 31·85 per 1,000, against 26·58 in the preceding month, 32·22 in the corresponding month of last year, and 32·31 the average for the corresponding months since 1909. The rate ranged from 10·83 in Vavuniya to 110·85 in Kalmunai.

3. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 635 (339 males and 296 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate* of 26·16 per 1,000, against 21·70 in the preceding month, 25·66 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·14 the average for the corresponding months since 1909. The rate ranged from 9·74 in Kollupitiya to 41·25 in Wellawatta.

Deaths.

4. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 2,216 (1,193 males and 1,023 females). There were 1,700 deaths of residents in towns, equivalent to an annual rate of 33·59 per 1,000, against 35·16 in the preceding month, 28·62 in the corresponding month of the previous year, and 33·54 the average for the month of January in each year since 1909. The rate ranged from 103·53 in Kurunegala to 9·86 in Weligama.

5. In the city of Colombo the deaths numbered 676 (380 males and 296 females). There were 586 deaths of residents, equivalent to an annual rate* of 28·01 per 1,000, against 28·88 in the preceding month, 26·66 in the corresponding month of the previous year, and 30·83 the average for the month of January in each year since 1909. The rate ranged from 24·44 in Kotahena to 7·68 in Kollupitiya.

6. The stillbirths registered numbered 101 (55 males and 46 females), same as in the preceding month.

Infant Mortality.

7. The mortality of infants under one year of age was equal to a rate of 329 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended January 31, 1919. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 273, against 328 in the preceding month, 232 in the corresponding month of the previous year, and 281 the average for the corresponding months since 1909.

8. In the city of Colombo the mortality of infants was equal to a rate of 332 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended January 31, 1919. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 265, against 300 in the preceding month, 242 in the corresponding month of the previous year, and 298 the average for the corresponding months since 1909.

Causes of Death.

9. The highest mortality was attributed to *Pneumonia*, to which 14 per cent. of the total deaths was due, 11 per cent. was due to *Debility*, 7 per cent. to *Convulsions*, 6 per cent. each to *Influenza* and *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, 5 per cent. each to *Diarrhoea*, *Anchylostomiasis*, and *Dysentery*, 4 per cent. each to *Phthisis* and *Enteritis*, 2 per cent. each to *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis* and *Prematurity*, and 1 per cent. each to *Puerperal Septicæmia*, *Bronchitis*, and *Enteric Fever*.

10. In Colombo the highest mortality was from *Phthisis*, to which 10 per cent. of the total deaths was due, 9 per cent. each was due to *Debility*, *Pneumonia*, and *Convulsions*, 6 per cent. each to *Influenza* and *Enteritis*, 3 per cent. each to *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, *Diarrhoea*, and *Dysentery*, 2 per cent. each to *Anchylostomiasis* and *Prematurity*, and 1 per cent. each to *Enteric Fever* and *Puerperal Septicæmia*.

11. *Infectious Diseases reported.*—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Phthisis*, of which 131 cases were reported (122 in Colombo, 4 in Batticaloa), followed by *Chickenpox* 61 (51 in Colombo), *Enteric Fever* 46 (24 in Colombo, 6 in Panadura, 5 in Jaffna), *Continued Fever* 31 (19 in Colombo, 6 in Moratuwa), *Dysentery* 20 (15 in Badulla), *Measles* 14 (9 in Nuwara Eliya), *Mumps* 2 (1 in Colombo and 1 in Nuwara Eliya), *Diphtheria* 1 (in Colombo), *Diarrhoea* 1 (in Galle), *Pneumonia* 1 (in Moratuwa), *Whooping Cough* 1 (in Colombo), and *Smallpox* 1 (in Colombo).

Meteorology.

12. *Rainfall.*—Ratnapura recorded the highest rainfall (8·62 inches), followed by Trincomalee (8·44 inches) and Batticaloa (8·08 inches). In the other towns it ranged from 6·63 inches in Kalutara to 0·38 of an inch in Tangalla. Colombo recorded 4·33 inches.

13. *Temperature.*—The mean temperature varied from 58·6° in Nuwara Eliya to 81·2° in Ratnapura, and was 80·5° in Colombo.
