A PROCLAMATION relating to the Importation of certain Articles into the United Kingdom.
GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by section 43 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation :

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly :

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited :

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows :—

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following articles is hereby prohibited, viz. :—

All derivatives of coal tar generally known as intermediate products capable of being used or adapted for use as dye-stuffs, or of being modified or further manufactured into dye-stuffs.

All direct cotton colours, all union colours, all acid wool colours, all chrome and mordant colours, all alizarine colours, all basic colours, all sulphide colours, all vat colours (including synthetic indigo), all oil, spirit, and wax colours, all lake colours, and any other synthetic colours, dyes, stains, colour acids, colour bases, colour lakes, leuco acids, leuco bases, whether in paste, powder, solution, or any other form.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under license given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such license.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 28) Proclamation, 1919.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended April 19, 1919.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 95 (10 Burghers, 55 Sinhalese, 14 Tamils, 12 Moors, 2 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1919, viz., 281,169) was 17·6, as against 22·6 in the preceding week, 22·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21·5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 139 (4 Burghers, 88 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 16 Moors, 4 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 25·8, as against 23·9 in the previous week, 19·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26·7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 139 total deaths, 37 were of infants under one year of age, as against 30 in the preceding week, 25 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

Principal Causes of Death.—Eighteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 6 in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 5 in Kotahena, 5 in Slave Island, 1 in Pettah, and 1 in New Bazaar, as against 23, 27, 26, and 17, respectively, for the four preceding weeks. The weekly average for last year was 27. Thirteen deaths were registered from *Influenza*, 4 in Kotahena, 3 in Slave Island, 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in Maradana, 1 in Pettah, and 1 in Wellawatta, as against 8, 11, 18, and 7, respectively, for the four preceding weeks. One death was registered from *Bronchitis*, same as in the preceding week.

2. Fourteen deaths were registered from *Phthisis*, 5 in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in Kotahena, 2 in Kollupitiya, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Slave Island, as against 6 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

3. One death was registered from *Enteric Fever* in Slave Island, as against 4 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Fourteen deaths were registered from *Debility*, 8 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 7 from *Enteritis*, 5 from *Diarrhæa*, 4 from *Dysentery*, 4 from *Worms*, 2 from *Tetanus*, and 48 from *Other Causes*.

5. Seven cases of *Chickenpox* and 3 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 20 and 1, respectively, in the preceding week.

The weekly average for last year was 27. "An improved bottle lamp with an automatic extinguisher."

Abstract.—The extinguisher consists of a tube or cap fitting loosely on the wick tube, so that it can slide along the wick tube and extinguish the flame if the lamp is upset. The body of the lamp has a wide base; so that when the lamp lies on its side the axis is considerably inclined and causes the extinguisher to slide downwards towards the flaming wick. The extinguisher may be loaded with lead.

An internal tube stretching to the bottom inside the lamp is described, but is disclaimed in the Specification, as accepted.

The claim is:—

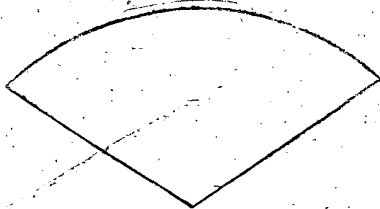

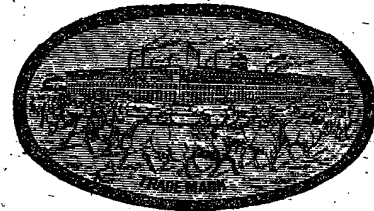

ABSTRACTS OF SEASON REPORTS.

SEASON REPORTS FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH, 1919.

WESTERN PROVINCE.

COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Maha season : is now over.

Yala season : in almost in all the divisions fields are being prepared for yala cultivation.

Other products : prospect of coconuts are fairly good. The estimated crop for the month is 15,454,360 nuts. Fruits and vegetables are to be had in fair quantity.

Prices of staple products : (a) imported rice is sold at Rs. 6.50 to Rs. 10.50 per bushel; (b) coconuts are sold at Rs. 40 to Rs. 55 per 1,000.

Harvest prospect : generally good.

Rainfall : there were a few showers of rain during the month.

Health of inhabitants : good, except for a few cases of chickenpox, dysentery, enteric fever, and ordinary fever. The new influenza is still prevailing in some villages of some korales, but not in an epidemic form.

Health of cattle : unsatisfactory. There had been cases of rinderpest at Kirillapone in Colombo Mudaliyar's division, at Pannila and Humupola in Siyane korale east, Wanawahala, Heiyantuduwa, Pahalakaragahamuna, and Gona-hena in Siyane korale west, Peliyagoda, Ragama, Wattala, Welisara, Keragepokuna, Telengapatha, and Delature in Alutkuru korale south, and Makalangamuwa and Bandara-watta in Alutkuru korale north. The village Peliyagoda in Alutkuru korale south is reported to be the worst infected centre.

KALUTARA DISTRICT.

Paddy : the maha crop having been reaped, fields were under preparation for the yala.

Dry grain : nil.

Other products : fruits were scarce everywhere in the district. There was a fair supply of vegetables in the Rayigam korale and the totamunes. The flowering of coconut trees was fair. The crop of the month is estimated at 3,290,300.

Prices of staple products : rice, Rs. 6 to Rs. 9.50 per bushel; coconuts, Rs. 50 to Rs. 80 per 1,000.

Prospects of harvest crop generally : fair.

Rainfall : total, 6.75 in.; average, .21 in.

Health of people : good everywhere, except in the totamunes, where a few cases of influenza, chickenpox, and dysentery have taken place.

Health of cattle : good everywhere, except in the totamunes, where there was a few cases of hoof-and-mouth disease and rinderpest.

CENTRAL PROVINCE.

KANDY AND NUWARA ELIYA DISTRICTS.

MATALE DISTRICT.

Rainfall : 7.23 in.

Paddy : harvesting.

Dry grain : harvesting.

Coconuts : (a) flowering fair; (b) 144,900 nuts approximate crop.

Tanks : in Matale North contain sufficient water.

Health of people : fair.

Health of cattle : good.

Prices of most commodities have risen above pre-war prices.

SOUTHERN PROVINCE.

GALLE DISTRICT.

Fields have been sown for the yala harvests.

Dry grain is cultivated in the district only on a small scale.

Coconut, tea, rubber, cinnamon, citronella, arecanuts, and vegetables are the principal products. The estimated coconut crop for the month was 11,763,200 nuts.

Rice varied from Rs. 6 to Rs. 9 per bushel; paddy varied from Rs. 2 to Rs. 3 per bushel; dry grain varied from

Rs. 1.20 to Rs. 3 per bushel; coconuts, Rs. 35 to Rs. 70 per 1,000.

The weather was generally dry during the month.

The health of the people was on the whole satisfactory.

MATARA DISTRICT.

Weather : dry.

Agriculture : yala sowing abandoned in many tracts for want of water.

Health of people : good.

Health of cattle : good.

Food supply : rice, Rs. 7 to Rs. 8 per bushel; paddy, Rs. 2.50 per bushel; coconuts, Rs. 50 per 1,000.

HAMBANTOTA DISTRICT.

Paddy cultivation : maha crop reaped. Crops satisfactory. Fine grain : maha crop has been harvested.

Weather : maximum temperature, 91.5°; minimum temperature, 69.5°; rainfall, 1.12 in.

Prices of foodstuffs : country rice, Rs. 6.24 to Rs. 7.84 per bushel; Coast rice, Rs. 6.96 to Rs. 9.60 per bushel; paddy, Rs. 2.16 per bushel; kurakkan, Rs. 2.08 per bushel; plantain bunches, Rs. 75 per 100; pumpkins, Rs. 19 per 100; Indian corn, Re. 1.25 per 100; sweet potatoes, Re. 1.68 per cwt.; coconuts, Rs. 50 to Rs. 60 per 1,000.

About 200,708 coconuts were picked during the month.

Health of people : satisfactory, except in Magam pattu, where fever prevailed in the interior.

Health of cattle : good.

NORTHERN PROVINCE.

JAFFNA DISTRICT.

Weather : there was rain during the middle of the month. The days are hot and the nights are dewy.

Paddy : harvest in progress.

Dry grains : pairu and ellu are being sown.

Tobacco : transplanting over; condition good.

Coconuts : condition of flowers and nuts fair. Price, Rs. 6 per 100.

Palmyras : nil.

Prices of staple articles : paddy, Rs. 3.50 per bushel; rice, Rs. 7 per bushel; pairu, Rs. 15 per bushel; varaku, Rs. 3 per bushel; salt, 4 cents per pound and 9 cents per measure.

Health of people : not satisfactory. Fever prevails in some places.

Health of cattle : good, but rinderpest has broken out in the Cattle Quarantine Camp in Kayts.

MANNAR DISTRICT.

Rainfall : 2.43 in.

Wind : unsettled.

Paddy : reaping of kalapokam crop is in full swing. The yield in the Wannai and Musali pattu is satisfactory, but in the Giant's Tank area owing to influenza epidemic during the sowing season, considerably less acreage was cultivated.

Tobacco : quite ripe, and in some places being reaped and cured.

Coconuts : condition satisfactory.

Palmyras : in spathe.

Health of people : fever is prevalent.

Health of cattle : satisfactory.

Prices of foodstuffs : rice, Rs. 6 to Rs. 10 per bushel; paddy, Re. 1.50 to Rs. 2.50 per bushel; coconuts, Rs. 6 to Rs. 8 per 100.

MULLAITTIVU DISTRICT.

Prospects of paddy harvests : crop on manavari lands has been reaped, and is being threshed in some places. Kalapokam crop on tank lands has also been reaped. Idaipokam is being sown. Partial failure of crop in some places owing to want of rain and damages by flies.

Dry grains : kurakkan sown in chenas has been reaped.

Other products—(1) coconuts : flowering and bearing satisfactory; (2) tobacco : has been planted and coming up well; (3) vegetables : doing well, but not much planted.

Prices of staple products : paddy, Rs. 2.50 per bushel; rice, Rs. 6 per bushel; kurakkan, Rs. 2.50 per bushel; coconuts, Rs. 8 per 100 nuts.

Rainfall: a few good showers fell during the middle part of the month and did much good to paddy cultivation.

Harvest prospects generally: not very bright, more rain wanted.

Health of inhabitants: fair. Fever and pneumonia prevailed in some places.

Health of cattle: good. Pasture good. No disease.

EASTERN PROVINCE.

BATICALOA DISTRICT.

Paddy: reaping of munmari harvest is progressing. Prospects good. Kalavelammai sowing is over; but the supply of water in the tanks is not sufficient for the crops unless there is some rain later on.

Dry grain and other chena crops: already reaped. Satisfactory.

Coconuts: prospects not satisfactory. Some of the trees affected by the drought appeared to be recovering, but owing to the scarcity of rainfall the trees are beginning again to droop. Some of the estates in the northern part of the district have been badly attacked by caterpillar pest. Dead trees are being felled and destroyed.

Prices of staple products: paddy from Re. 1.60 to Rs. 2.40 per bushel; kurakkan from Re. 1.20 to Rs. 2 per bushel; Indian corn from Re. 1 to Rs. 2 per bushel.

Rainfall: 1.66 in. in 1918; 1.64 in. in 1919.

Health of inhabitants: there are cases of influenzal fever in Manmunai North, Manmunai South, Bintenne, and Akkarai pattus. Steps have been taken to relieve distress among indigent patients.

Health of cattle: hoof-and-mouth disease still continues in some places.

TRINCOMALEE DISTRICT.

Rainfall: defective.

Paddy: reaping is finished in town and Kaddukkulam East. Preparations for pinmari cultivation in Koddipattu and Tamblegam pattu are in progress. Plants are in ears in Kaddukkulam West.

Tobacco: curing operations are going on.

Coconuts: condition of crop is medium. Price per 1,000 nuts ranges from Rs. 50 to Rs. 60.

Fishery: medium. Dried and salted fish is transported by cart to inland stations.

Health of people: fever prevails in Trincomalee town. In Kaddukkulam West fever, cold, and cough.

Health of people: satisfactory.

Prices of staple articles: paddy, Re. 1.50 to Re. 1.92 per bushel; rice (country), Rs. 3.75 to Rs. 5.12 per bushel; rice (imported), Rs. 7 per bushel.

NORTH-WESTERN PROVINCE.

KURUNEGALA DISTRICT.

Paddy crops: maha crops being reaped and gathered. Prospects: fair.

Dry grain: maha crops reaped and gathered, and chenas being cleared in some parts of the district for the yala cultivation.
