KNOW Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, do hereby proclaim that His Majesty has issued the Royal Proclamation published in the schedule hereto, and do call upon His Majesty’s subjects and all other persons being in the said Island to govern themselves accordingly.

A PROCLAMATION for prohibiting the Importation of certain Rouble Notes into the United Kingdom.
GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS it is desirable to prohibit the importation of certain Rouble Notes into the United Kingdom :

Now, therefore, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation in pursuance of section 43 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, and We do hereby proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows :—

The importation into the United Kingdom of all Rouble Notes (other than Rouble Notes issued by the Caisse d’Emission of the Provisional Government of Archangel) is hereby prohibited.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such notes which are imported under license given by or on behalf of Our Treasury and subject to the provisions and conditions of such license.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 30) Proclamation, 1919, and shall come into operation from the date hereof.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Twenty-eighth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Nineteen, and in the Ninth Year of Our Reign.

Special Regulation made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council under Section 38 of
"The Petroleum Ordinance, 1887."

SPECIAL regulation published in *Government Gazette* No. 6,957, dated July 19, 1918, is hereby revoked and the following special regulation is substituted therefor:—

Anything in any regulation to the contrary notwithstanding, the local authority is hereby empowered to issue to Messrs. Delmege, Forsyth & Co., Ltd., of Colombo, a license to store 400,000 gallons of "Shell" motor spirit in the premises described in the schedule hereto upon the said Messrs. Delmege, Forsyth & Co., Ltd., executing a bond to indemnify the Government of Ceylon and the local authority against all actions, proceedings, and suits which may be brought against them or any of them by any person whatsoever, in consequence of any damage or injury arising from the storage of the said spirit within the said premises, and also to indemnify all persons against any loss or injury which they may sustain in consequence of the storage of the said petroleum.

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

All that building known as No. 1,093/12, 13,500 square feet in area, and situated within the premises called and known as Kelaniganga Mills, as shown in Plan No. 1,108 of May 23, 1918, made in the Works Engineer's Office, Maligakanda. NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

TENDERS are hereby invited for the privilege of selling refreshments inside Railway premises at the Colombo Goods Shed and at the Kelani Valley Goods Shed from October 1, 1919, to September 30, 1920, from persons willing to tender for same.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Controller of Revenue.

3. Tenders should either be deposited in the Office of the Controller of Revenue, or be sent through the post.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tender for the privilege of selling Refreshments at Goods Sheds" in the left hand corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Controller of Revenue not later than midday on Tuesday, June 17, 1919.

5. The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Office of the General Manager of the Railway, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form.

6. A deposit of Rs. 25 will be required to be made either at the Treasury or Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. Should any person decline to enter into the contract and bond, or fail to furnish approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Head of the Department, or his duly authorized representative, that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown, and the defaulter will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

7. The successful tenderer will be allowed the sole and exclusive right to sell fruits, bread, cakes, and other refreshments, exclusive of intoxicating liquors, within the Railway premises at the Colombo Goods Shed and at Maradana Kelani Valley Goods Shed during such hours as the said premises are opened to traffic work.

8. The successful tenderer should provide at his own expense portable huts of design approved by the General Manager, not exceeding 14 ft. by 7 ft., which will be permitted to be placed at spots to be pointed out by the Goods Agent, Colombo, and the Chief Goods Clerk, Maradana, Kelani Valley Goods Shed, on the understanding that they may at any time be called upon to remove the same should the sites on which they are placed be required for other purposes.

9. The Government will accept no responsibility for the safe custody of the contents of the huts.

10. The successful tenderer shall agree to subject himself and his servants to all reasonable orders of the General Manager, Traffic Manager, or the Goods Agent, or the Chief Goods Clerk, Kelani Valley Goods Shed.

11. The number of salesmen or other servants admitted to the Railway premises will be limited to four.

12. The successful tenderer will be required to keep his huts and surroundings in a clean and tidy condition, and remove all the refuse matter from the Railway premises each day.

13. The successful tenderer will be required to deposit as security for the good behaviour of himself and his servants and for ensuring compliance with all the conditions of the contract the sum of Rs. 150.

14. The tenderers should state the amounts they are prepared to pay in advance on the first day of each calendar month for the privilege. All other necessary information can be ascertained upon application at the office referred to in section 5.

15. The security should be furnished within ten days of acceptance of tenders being notified.

16. All alterations or erasures in tenders should bear the initials of the tenderers, otherwise the tenders may be treated as informal and rejected.

17. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled, and any offers received containing conditions not mentioned herein will be rejected without question.

18. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.

19. Before tender forms are supplied to persons wishing to tender, they will have to satisfy the General Manager or person delegated by him that they are in a position to execute the contract in a satisfactory manner, and for this purpose they must be prepared to produce documentary or other evidence if called for.

20. Contracts may not be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Tender Board.

21. A Government contractor must not issue a power of attorney to a person whose name is in the defaulting contractors' list authorizing him to carry on the contract.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 103 (1 European, 9 Burghers, 67 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 11 Moors, 2 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1919, viz., 281,169) was 20.0, as against 25.4 in the preceding week, 14.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 148 (10 Burghers, 71 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 20 Moors, 9 Malays, and 11 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27.4, as against 25.4 in the previous week, 20.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 148 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, as against 21 in the preceding week, 25 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of still births registered during the week was 8.

Principal Causes of Death.—Twenty-nine deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 9 in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 7 in Kotahena, 6 in Slave Island, 2 in New Bazaar, 2 in Kollupitiya, 2 in Wellawatta, and 1 in Pettah, as against 24, 31, 19, and 18, respectively, for the four preceding weeks. The weekly average for last year was 27. Twenty-two deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 8 in Kotahena, 5 in Maradana, 3 in St. Paul's, 2 in San Sebastian, 2 in Wellawatta, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Slave Island, as against 21, 8, 12, and 19, respectively, for the four preceding weeks. Two deaths, from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 in Maradana, and 1 in Slave Island, as against 1 in the previous week.

2. Nine deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 2 in Kotahena, 2 in Maradana (including a death of a non-resident in hospital), 1 in Fort, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in New Bazaar, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Kollupitiya, as against 16 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in New Bazaar and 1 in Kotahena, as against 2 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Eleven deaths were registered from *Debility*, 8 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 6 from *Worms*, 2 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 from *Dysentery*, 2 from *Tetanus*, 1 from *Enteritis*, and 51 from *Other Causes*.

5. Eleven cases of *Chickenpox* and 3 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 9 and nil respectively in the previous week. One case of *Smallpox* was reported, same as in the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82.7°, against 81.5° in the preceding week and 79.4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.885 in., against 29.850 in. in the preceding week and 29.851 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.06 in., against 5.20 in. in the preceding week and 7.29 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

NOTICE is hereby given that a competitive examination for Excise Learners will be held at Colombo on Friday and Saturday, August 15 and 16, 1919.

The time table is as follows:—

- 10 A.M. to 12 noon: Arithmetic.
- 1 P.M. to 1.30 P.M.: Dictation.
- 1.30 P.M. to 3.30 P.M.: General English.
- 3.30 P.M. to 5 P.M.: Chemistry or Physics (oral English for those not taking these subjects).

August 16, 1919, 10 A.M.: Oral English (continued).

Applications for admission to the examination will be received by the Excise Commissioner not later than Tuesday, July 1, 1919 (they should be sent in as early as possible).

The number of places open for competition cannot now be definitely stated, some men can be taken on promptly and others later on.

Conditions.

1. The entrance examination for Excise Learners is for candidates wishing to enter the Excise Department as Learners with a view to appointment as Excise Inspectors.

2. Applications for admission to the examination must be addressed to the Excise Commissioner, and must be made in the proper form. Forms are to be obtained from the Excise Commissioner on application.

3. An application from any person in the Public Service of the Colony must be made in the proper form, and must be forwarded through the Head of the Department under whom he is serving. Such an application should contain a certificate from the Head of the Department that he is willing to spare the services of the applicant.

4. (a) A certificate of the registration of a candidate's birth showing him to be on the first day of the examination between the ages of 20 and 25 (unless the Excise Commissioner decides to make a special exception), and one or more

certificates of good character signed by a responsible person or persons* to the satisfaction of the Excise Commissioner, must be attached to the application.

(b) An extract from a Baptismal Register will also be accepted, if the baptism took place within four months of the date of birth.

(c) Affidavits and horoscopes in support of the date of birth will not be accepted.

5. The Excise Commissioner will return to the candidate his application, approved or disapproved, as the case may be. The approved application will constitute the ticket of admission to the examination. Each candidate presenting himself for examination must affix to his application undefaced Ceylon stamps to the value of Rs. 5, and produce it, on the first day of the examination and when called upon to do so, to the officer appointed to supervise the examination. Stamps cut, torn, or in any way defaced will not be accepted. Any candidate failing to produce the form duly stamped, whatever may be the reason for doing so, will not be admitted to the examination.

6. All certificates sent in by a candidate will be returned to him together with his application.

7. Clerks of the Excise Department who have had two years' satisfactory service may be nominated irrespective of age by the Excise Commissioner, subject to the approval of Government, for direct entry into the class of Learners. Formal applications on the proper form should, however, be sent to the Excise Commissioner through their immediate superiors before the first day of the examination. Clerks so nominated must secure a pass in the examination prescribed by Condition 15, and are then eligible (subject to the medical examination prescribed in Condition 9) for one out of every four vacancies.

8. The examination will be competitive, and will be held under the supervision of the Director of Education in the place or places which will be notified to the candidates allowed to take up the examination.

9. The candidates who obtain the highest aggregate marks in the examination will, subject to their other qualifications being considered satisfactory, be selected up to the number required for admission as Learners. Before any candidate is so selected, he must undergo and pass a medical examination as to his fitness for service in any part of the Island. The medical examination will be held by the Principal Civil Medical Officer, and a fee of Rs. 10 for such examination will be charged.

11. Any candidate failing to obtain half the mark allotted for Writing, Spelling, and Arithmetic, respectively, will be excluded from the remainder of the examination. Should any other candidate obtain less than one-third of the marks allotted for any of the subjects, General English, Physics, or Chemistry and English (oral), such marks will not be counted in his favour.

12. Selected candidates will be required to undergo a course of training as Learners for a probationary period, which will usually be about six months, part of which will be

spent in office, and part in outdoor work under Superintendents or Assistant Superintendents of Excise or experienced Excise Inspectors.

13. Learners will receive a subsistence allowance of Rs. 35 per mensem while attached to an office, and, in addition, a commuted travelling allowance of Rs. 35 per mensem while employed in outdoor work.

14. The payment of the allowance is contingent on the satisfactory behaviour of the Learner. A Learner who does not satisfy the Excise Commissioner as regards progress in the study of Excise work and good behaviour is liable to lose part or the whole of any allowance payable to him or to summary rejection and forfeiture of his allowance at any time during the period of training.

15. At the close of the period of training or at such other time as the Excise Commissioner may direct the Learners will be required to take up the subsequent examination in the following subjects:—

- (a) General Excise Work (Part II. of the Excise Manual regarding existing Departmental Orders and a knowledge of the Departmental Circulars issued by the Excise Commissioner will be required).
- (b) (i.) Excise Law. (A knowledge of the Excise Ordinance and of the notifications issued thereunder will be required.)
- (ii.) Criminal Procedure Code (Sections 3, 11-12, 23-26, 38-37, 52-53, 70, 74-78, 133, 148-149, 167-168, 170-179, 187-199, 406-407, and 413 (i.)).
- (iii.) Ceylon Penal Code (Sections 19, 24-25, 75-76, 89-92, 101-109, 112, 138-139, 158-160, 181-186, 198-200, 214, 265, 340-342, and 344).
- (iv.) Evidence Ordinance (Sections 1-32, 53-54, 91-92, 101-106, 133, 137-138, 159-161).

16.
