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PART I.

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VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1919.

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Births.

2. The number of births registered was 1,441 (729 males and 712 females), and was equivalent to an annual rate of 26·12 per 1,000, against 26·62 in the preceding month, 26·58 in the corresponding month of the previous year, and 28·67 the average for the corresponding months since 1909. The rate ranged from 10·38 in Panadure to 55·70 in Kalpitiya.

3. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 523 (267 males and 256 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 21·55 per 1,000, against 20·60 in the preceding month, 21·70 in the corresponding month of the previous year, and 23·86 the average for the corresponding months since 1909. The rate ranged from 6·79 in Kollupitiya to 22·26 in Wellawatta.

Deaths.

4. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 2,245 (1,210 males and 1,035 females). There were 1,730 deaths of residents in towns, equivalent to an annual rate of 34·18 per 1,000, against 28·89 in the preceding month, 35·16 in the corresponding month of the previous year, and 32·55 the average for the month of December in each year since 1909. The rate ranged from 82·75 in Chilaw to 10·60 in Panadure.

5. In the city of Colombo the deaths numbered 831 (451 males and 380 females). There were 731 deaths of residents, equivalent to an annual rate of 34·94 per 1,000, against 30·96 in the preceding month, 28·88 in the corresponding month of the previous year, and 31·57 the average for the month of December in each year since 1909. The rate ranged from 34·66 in St. Paul's to 10·33 in Kollupitiya.

6. The stillbirths registered numbered 100 (57 males, 42 females, and one whose sex was undistinguishable), as against 77 in the preceding month.

Infant Mortality.

7. The mortality of infants under one year of age was equal to a rate of 325 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended December 31, 1919. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 316, against 270 in the preceding month, 328 in the corresponding month of last year, and 301 the average for the corresponding months since 1909.

8. In the city of Colombo the mortality of infants was equal to a rate of 382 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended December 31, 1919. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 367, against 291 in the preceding month, 300 in the corresponding month of last year, and 330 the average for the corresponding months since 1909.

Causes of Death.

9. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 12 per cent. of the total deaths was due, 8 per cent. was due to *Debility*, 7 per cent. each to *Convulsions* and *Diarrhœa*, 6 per cent. each to *Dysentery* and *Phthisis*, 5 per cent. to *Anchylostomiasis*, 4 per cent. each to *Influenza* and *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, 3 per cent. each to *Enteritis*, *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, and *Enteric Fever*, and 1 per cent. to *Bronchitis*.

10. In Colombo too, the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 16 per cent. of the deaths was due, 10 per cent. was due to *Phthisis*, 8 per cent. each to *Debility* and *Convulsions*, 6 per cent. to *Influenza*, 5 per cent. to *Enteritis*, 4 per cent. to *Enteric Fever*, 3 per cent. each to *Dysentery* and *Diarrhœa*, and 2 per cent. each to *Anchylostomiasis*, *Bronchitis*, *Plague*, and *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*.

11. Nineteen deaths from *Plague* were registered (in Colombo), as against 30 in the preceding month and 1 in the corresponding month of last year. There were registered 2 deaths from *Cholera* and 3 from *Measles*.

12. *Infectious Diseases reported*.—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Measles*, of which 128 cases were reported (113 in Colombo, 8 in Kandy), followed by *Enteric Fever* 113 (75 in Colombo, 11 in Kandy, 10 in Mannar, 6 in Moratuwa), *Phthisis* 109 (96 in Colombo), *Chickenpox* 68 (47 in Colombo, 11 in Kandy, 5 in Nuwara Eliya), *Plague* 24 (in Colombo), *Continued Fever* 18 (8 in Colombo, 6 in Moratuwa), *Mumps* 7 (5 in Kandy), *Dysentery* 3 (in Kurunegala), *Cholera* 3 (2 in Badulla and 1 in Hambantota), *Diphtheria* 1 (in Colombo), *Acute Diarrhœa* 1 (in Batticaloa), and *Smallpox* 1 (in Colombo).

Meteorology.

13. *Rainfall*.—Vavuniya recorded the highest rainfall (25·54 inches), followed by Mullaitivu (22·30 inches). In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 20·33 inches in Trincomalee to 5·26 inches in Puttalam. Colombo recorded 9·28 inches.

14. *Temperature*.—The mean temperature varied from 59·9° in Nuwara Eliya to 79·6° in Ratnapura, and was 79·4° in Colombo.
