**VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE
MONTH OF MARCH, 1919.**

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Births.

2. The number of births registered was 1,549 (782 males and 767 females), and was equivalent to an annual rate of 28·08 per 1,000, against 30·61 in the preceding month, 28·21 in the corresponding month of last year, and 30·38 the average for the corresponding months since 1909. The rate ranged from 11·24 in Mannar to 72·06 in Kalmunai.

3. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 534 (282 males and 252 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate* of 22·00 per 1,000, against 25·77 in the preceding month, 23·28 in the corresponding month of last year, and 25·60 the average for the corresponding months since 1909. The rate ranged from 10·03 in Kollupitiya to 34·04 in Wellawatta.

Deaths.

4. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,849 (1,016 males and 833 females). There were 1,452 deaths of residents in towns, equivalent to an annual rate of 28·69 per 1,000, against 35·09 in the preceding month, 24·14 in the corresponding month of last year, and 28·53 the average for the month of March in each year since 1909. The rate ranged from 88·23 in Anuradhapura to 8·76 in Weligama.

5. In the city of Colombo the deaths numbered 594 (322 males and 272 females). There were 509 deaths of residents, equivalent to an annual rate* of 24·33 per 1,000, against 29·53 in the preceding month, 21·18 in the corresponding month of last year, and 26·52 the average for the month of March in each year since 1909. The rate ranged from 22·37 in New Bazaar to 8·56 in Kollupitiya.

6. The stillbirths registered numbered 97 (45 males and 52 females), as against 98 in the preceding month.

Infant Mortality.

7. The mortality of infants under one year of age was equal to a rate of 261 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended March 31, 1919. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 240, against 250 in the preceding month, 190 in the corresponding month of last year, and 225 the average for the corresponding months since 1909.

8. In the city of Colombo the mortality of infants was equal to a rate of 279 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended March 31, 1919. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 264, against 250 in the preceding month, 194 in the corresponding month of last year, and 241 the average for the corresponding months since 1909.

Causes of Death.

9. The highest mortality was attributed to *Pneumonia*, to which 14 per cent. of the total deaths was due, 9 per cent. was due to *Debility*, 7 per cent. each to *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia* and *Convulsions*, 6 per cent. each to *Diarrhoea* and *Influenza*, 5 per cent. to *Phthisis*, 4 per cent. each to *Dysentery*, *Anchylostomiasis*, and *Enteritis*, 3 per cent. to *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, 2 per cent. each to *Enteric Fever* and *Bronchitis*, and 1 per cent. each to *Prematurity*, *Tetanus*, and *Puerperal Septicæmia*.

10. In Colombo too the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 16 per cent. of the total deaths was due, 9 per cent. was due to *Phthisis*, 7 per cent. each to *Debility*, *Convulsions*, and *Influenza*, 4 per cent. each to *Enteritis* and *Enteric Fever*, 3 per cent. to *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, 2 per cent. each to *Dysentery*, *Diarrhoea*, *Tetanus*, and *Bronchitis*, and 1 per cent. each to *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, *Cancer*, *Prematurity*, and *Anchylostomiasis*.

11. Three deaths from *Plague* were registered in Colombo, against 1 in the preceding month and 11 in the corresponding month of last year.

12. *Infectious Diseases reported.*—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Phthisis*, of which 117 cases were reported (106 in Colombo, 7 in Galle), followed by *Chickenpox* 78 (54 in Colombo, 8 in Kandy, 5 in Gampola), *Enteric Fever* 53 (42 in Colombo, 4 in Batticaloa), *Continued Fever* 25 (13 in Colombo, 5 in Moratuwa, 5 in Kandy), *Measles* 20 (13 in Matale), *Mumps* 6 (in Kandy), *Whooping Cough* 4 (2 in Colombo and 2 in Kandy), *Smallpox* 4 (in Colombo), *Plague* 3 (in Colombo), and *Diphtheria* 1 (in Colombo).

Meteorology.

13. *Rainfall.*—Ratnapura recorded the highest rainfall (12·77 inches), followed by Kegalla (9·87 inches) and Gampola (9·33 inches). In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 7·92 inches in Kurunegala to 0·73 of an inch in Mullaittivu.

14. *Temperature.*—The mean temperature varied from 57·7° in Nuwara Eliya to 83·0° in Ratnapura, and was 81·6° in Colombo.
