SUPPLY OF RICE TO ESTATES.

Order made by the Food Controller under "The Defence of the Colony Regulations, 1919."

1. No dealer or importer may withhold delivery of any Estate Cooly rice for which a license signed by the Controller of Estate Supplies, and issued in terms of Section 3 of the Supply of Rice for Estates Order, dated May 9, 1919, has been issued, and for which cash or payment on demand is tendered.

2. No Estate Cooly rice may be sold at a price higher than that fixed by me. Until further notice prices are fixed as follows:—

3. In place of the return required by Section 7 of the Supply of Rice for Estates Order, 1919, each Estate rice supplier having godowns in the Chalmers Granaries shall send to the Controller of Estate Supplies, every Monday, commencing from Monday, May 19, 1919, a statement showing (1) the total quantity of Estate rice in his granary on the previous Monday; (2) the quantity received during the following days up to the Sunday immediately preceding the day of making the return; (3) the name of the ship (or ships) by which it was imported; (4) the issues from stock made during each day of the week in respect of each estate, showing the name of the person buying and of the estate for which the rice is sold, the quantity of rice sold or delivered, the price paid per bushel, and the date of delivery; (5) the balance quantity of rice in store at the end of the weekly period.

4. This Order shall commence and come into operation on May 19, 1919.
