Part I.—General.

Separate paging is given to each Part in order that it may be filed separately.

Order made by the Food Controller under Regulation 1 of "The Defence of the Colony Regulations, 1919."

1. No grade of rice shall be sold or offered for sale at the Chalmers Granaries in Colombo at a price exceeding that set forth in the schedule to this order in respect of each such grade of rice.
2. All dealers in rice throughout Ceylon shall keep exhibited for public information, outside their stores, godowns, shops, or places of sale, a board showing clearly the prices of the several grades of rice stocked by them. Such prices shall in no case exceed the maximum prices fixed by the Food Controller or his Deputies.
3. This order shall commence and come into into operation on June 2, 1919.
