GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATION.

THE following regulations made by the Governor are published for general information.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Colombo, June 19, 1919. By His Excellency's command, A. S. PAGDEN, Acting Colonial Secretary.

Regulations made by the Governor under the provisions of the Order of Her Majesty in Council dated October 26, 1896, as amended by the Order of His Majesty in Council dated March 21, 1916, and of all other Powers him enabling.

1. From and after the commencement of these regulations it is forbidden to remove or transport, by any means, rice, paddy, kurakkan, or other grains from the Province of Sabaragamuwa, except under permit to be issued by the Government Agent of that Province, or by the Assistant Government Agent, Kegalla, as the case may be, according to the locality from which transport or removal is desired; to remove or transport, by any means, paddy or rice from the North-Western Province, except under permit to be issued by the Government Agent of that Province, or by the Assistant Government to be issued by the Government Agent of that Province, or by the Assistant Government Agent, by any means, paddy or rice from the North-Western Province, except under permit to be issued by the Government Agent of that Province, or by the Assistant Government Agent, Puttalam, as the case may be, according to the locality from which removal or transport is desired; and to remove or transport kurakkan, by any means, from the Matale District except under permit to be issued by the Assistant Government Agent of that district.

2. Any person who contravenes the provisions of the last preceding regulation shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on summary conviction to imprisonment of either description for any term not exceeding six months, or to a fine not exceeding Rs. 1,500, or to both.

3. These regulations shall commence and come into operation on June 19, 1919.
