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BY THE GOVERNOR.

IS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR desires, now that peace has been declared, to express his appreciation of the good work performed by the Ceylon Police Force throughout the Colony during the war. The war undoubtedly threw much additional and arduous work on the Force, more especially on the Colombo and Harbour Police, and it is very gratifying to His Excellency to note that all ranks readily accepted the additional duties allotted to them, and worked in a most willing and cheerful manner, in the face of many difficulties. At the outbreak of the war there were numerous applications from all ranks of the Force to be permitted to go to the front on active service. Permission to do so, however, was given to a few officers and men only; but to the majority of the applicants such permission could not be given, as the adequate policing of the Colony during the period of the war. was a matter of paramount importance.

The officers and men who had to remain to carry on the essential duties of police for the safety of the Colony served the British Empire in a no lesser degree than those who actually left the Colony on active service,

To all ranks of the Force, for services ungrudgingly rendered, and to the gentlemen who volunteered for temporary police duty for the duration of the war, to enable physically-fit officers to proceed to the front, His Excellency desires to express his appreciation and thanks.

WHEREAS by Notification dated July 1, 1899, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, divided the several Provinces of the Island for the purposes of the registration of births and deaths into the divisions specified in the schedule to the said Notification:

"THE TOWN SCHOOLS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following by-laws made by the Local Board of Negombo, under section 7 of "The Town Schools Ordinance, 1906," and confirmed by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, are published for general information.

SCHEDULE.

By-laws made under Sections 7 and 8 of "The Town Schools Ordinance, 1906," by the Local Board of Negombo.

Definitions.—In these by-laws-

The terms "boy," "girl," and "child" mean respectively a boy, or a girl, or a child residing in the area described in the Schedule A hereto.

The term "parent" includes a guardian and any person

who has actual custody of a child.

The term "Code" means the Code for Aided Schools for the time being sanctioned by His Excellency the

Governor in Executive Council.

The term "attendance" means an attendance for the period defined by the Code as, constituting a full attendance recorded in an Attendance Register in the manner prescribed by the Code.

The term "local authority" means the Local Board of

Negombo. term "school" means a school specified in the

Schedule B hereto.

The terms "adequate and suitable provision for the education of a child" and "reasonable excuse" shall bear the meaning defined in sub-section (1) (b) of section 8 of "The Town Schools Ordinance, 1906."

The term "Inspector of Schools" means an Inspector of Schools appointed by His Excellency the Governor

and includes a Sub-Inspector.

Children to attend school.—The parent of every boy of not less than 6 nor more than 12 years of age, and the perent of every girl of not less than 6 nor more than 10 years of age, shall cause such boy or girl to attend one of the schools specified in the schedule hereto, unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such boy or girl, or unless there is a reasonable excuse for non-attendance. Provided that no girl shall be compelled to attend school from a distance of more than two miles, and in the case of boys a distance of three miles.

Time of attendance.—The time during which every boy or girl shall attend school shall be the whole time for which the school shall be open for the instruction of children

of similar age.

Religion.—Nothing in these by-laws-

(a) Shall prevent the presence of children being excused during the hours when religious instruction is given, as provided by sub-section (2) (d) of section 9 of "The Town Schools Ordinance, 1906."

(b) Shall require any child to attend school on any day exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which the child's parent belongs.

Exemption of children with Fourth Standard Certificate.—When a child between 10 and 12 years of age being beneficially employed to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Local Board, Negombo, has received a certificate from an Inspector of Schools that he has passed in Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic, the Fourth Standard prescribed by the Code for the time being, he shall not be required to attend school.

Penalties for offences.—Every parent who shall not observe or shall neglect or violate these by-laws or any of them shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Rs. 20 for each offence, and an additional fine not exceeding Re. 1 per day in the case of a continuing offence.

NOTE.—The following are the portions of "The Town Schools Ordinance, 1906," referred to in section 1 of these

by-laws:

Sub-section (1) (b) of section 8.—A parent shall be deemed to have made adequate and suitable provision for the education of his child, if he proves that his child is in regular attendance at a school registered by the Director of Education for the receipt of a grant in aid, or at a school with regard to which an application for a grant in aid is under consideration, or at a school certified by the Director of Education to provide adequate and suitable instruction; or if he proves that he has made such other provision for his child's education as the Director of Education shall

certify to be adequate and suitable, or if he produces a certificate from the Director of Education recommending that the child shall be exempted from compulsory attend-Provided that no parent shall be convicted for not causing his child to attend such school, if he proves to the satisfaction of the Magistrate that he has reasonable excuse for not causing such child to attend. A parent shall be deemed to have a reasonable excuse for not causing his child to attend school if he proves that the child is prevented from attending by sickness or other unavoidable cause.

Sub-section (2) (d) of section 9.—No school in which religious instruction is given shall be named in any by-law made under clause (a) of the last preceding section as a school in which efficient provision is made for vernacular

education, unless the Local Board is satisfied-

(a) That religious instruction is given only during the time specified in the school time table;

(b) That religious instruction is not given to pupils of other denominations than that to which the school belongs if the parents object;

(c) That pupils who do not attend religious instruction are employed in other studies during the hours

allotted to religious instruction.

(d) That such pupils if their parents object to their being present in the room where religious instruction is given are either allowed to study in some other part of the school premises during the hours when such instruction is given, or their presence in the school during such hours is excused; and

(e) That a copy of this section in the English, Sinhalese. and Tamil languages is conspicuously posted up in

the school.

The above by-laws were approved by the Local Board of Negombo at a meeting held on February 21, 1919.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 12, 1919.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 75 (1 European, 12 Burghers, 42 Sinhalese, 11 Tamils, 5 Moors, 1 Malay, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1919, viz., 285,795) was 13.7, as against 11.9 in the preceding week, 16.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21 5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 131 (2 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 75 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 13 Moors, 9 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 23 9, as against 26 5 in the previous week, 24 7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26 7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 131 total deaths, 26 were of infants under one year of age, as against 26 in the preceding

week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

-The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

Principal Causes of Death.—(a) Seventeen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 8 in Maradana (including 4 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in Slave Island, 2 in Kollupitiya, 1 in Fort, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Kotahena, and 1 in Wellawatta, as against 29, 14, 37, and 51, respectively, in the four preceding weeks. The weekly average for last year was 27.

(b) Eight deaths from Influenza were registered, 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in New Bazaar, 2 in Maradana, 1 in San

Sebsstian, and 1 in Kotahena, as against 3, 16, 24, and 29, respectively, in the four preceding weeks.

(c) One death from Bronchitis was registered in Kollupitiya.

Sixteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, 6 in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in Pettah, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta, as against 11 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

Four deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 2 in Maradana (1 of them being of a non-resident in hospital),

1 in Kotahena, and 1 in New Bazaar, as against 4 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Fourteen deaths were registered from Enteritis, 13 from Debility, 6 from Infantile Convulsions, 4 from Worms, 3 from Dysentery, 1 from Tetanus, and 44 from Other Causes.

5. Fourteen cases of Chickenpox and 6 of Measles were reported during the week, as against 6 and 2 respectively

in the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.9°, against 81.0° in the preceding week and 83.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29 891 in., against 29 878 in. in the preceding week and 29 922 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.32 in., against 0.50 in. in the preceding week and 0.01 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
