#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM HENRY MANNING, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by the 5th section of the Prisons Ordinance, No. 16 of 1877, as amended by section 1 of Ordinance No. 24 of 1890, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to establish any prison for this Island or for any part thereof:

And whereas it is expedient to establish a prison at Kalutara:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in Us as aforesaid, do by this Our Proclamation establish nine lock-ups at the Kalutara Police Station as a prison at Kalutara aforesaid, for the reception of prisoners of every description committed or remanded under the authority of the several courts of the Island for the period of the Kalutara Sessions of the Supreme Court of the Island of Ceylon, which begin on Wednesday, August 13, 1919.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-fourth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Nineteen.

## NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

TENDERS are hereby invited for the work of repairing the Salt Store 24 in the Northern Depot, Puttalam.

2. The tenders should be enclosed in a sealed envelope, on the left corner of which must be written the words “Tender for repairing the Store 24 in the Northern Depot, Puttalam,” and it should be sent to the Assistant Government Agent, Puttalam, so that he may receive it before 1 P.M. on August 8, 1919.

3. The intending tenderer should, before sending his tender to the Assistant Government Agent, deposit a sum of Rs. 10 at any Kachcheri under the head of “Tender Forms,” and should annex to his tender the receipt obtained for the deposit of the sum.

4. This sum of Rs. 10 will be held by the Assistant Government Agent as a security for the tenderer's entering into the contract with him—in the event of his tender being accepted—for carrying out the work in a satisfactory manner; and will be confiscated, if he fail to enter into such a contract, within a reasonable time after his tender was accepted.

5. The tenderer should name an address at Puttalam, where letters for him may be left or delivered.

6. The work should be completed within four weeks after the contract was entered into.

7. Further particulars may be obtained from the Salt Inspector, Puttalam.

### *Description of the Work to be done.*

All the decayed or otherwise worthless cadjan, timber, and other materials that are on the building now should be removed and replaced by new and sound materials.

The roof should be rethatched with new cadjan, and pootus should be placed thereon to serve as weights.

Those parts of the roof and side walls that are now in a damaged condition should be repaired before they are thatched with cadjan.

The cadjan walls should all be repaired wherever necessary, being straightened wherever they are found bulging.

The interior of the store should be lined with new cadjan. The floor should be raised with clay, levelled, and well stamped.

The ground bordering the fences of the store on the east and the west should be raised to a height of 1 foot from the present level.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

## Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 19, 1919.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 82 (4 Burghers, 53 Sinhalese, 10 Tamils, 12 Moors, 2 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1919, viz., 285,795) was 15.0, as against 13.7 in the preceding week, 15.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.5 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 116 (1 European, 2 Burghers, 64 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 23 Moors, 2 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 21.2, as against 23.9 in the previous week, 23.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26.7 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 116 total deaths, 29 were of infants under one year of age, as against 26 in the preceding week, 32 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 5.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—(a) Fourteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 9 in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 1 in Pettah, 1 in Kotahena, 1 in Slave Island, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta, as against 17, 29, 14, and 37, respectively, in the four preceding weeks. The weekly average for last year was 27.

(b) Five deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 in Pettah, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in New Bazaar, 1 in Maradana, and 1 in Kollupitiya, as against 8, 3, 16, and 24, respectively, in the four preceding weeks.

2. (a) Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in San Sebastian, 1 in New Bazaar, 1 in Slave Island, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta, as against 16 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death of a resident of Colombo occurred at the Ragama Hospital from *Phthisis* during the week.

3. Six deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in Kotahena, 1 in Maradana, and 1 in Slave Island, as against 4 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Nine deaths were registered from *Debility*, 7 from *Enteritis*, 6 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 5 from *Diarrhoea*, 4 from *Dysentery*, 2 from *Worms*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 45 from *Other Causes*.

5. Eight cases of *Chickenpox* and 6 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 14 and 6 respectively in the preceding week. One case of *Smallpox* was reported from the Harbour.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 82.0°, against 81.9° in the preceding week and 81.5° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.877 in., against 29.891 in. in the preceding week and 29.901 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.66 in., against 0.32 in. in the preceding week and 1.59 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

**Entrance Examination for Learners to the Irrigation Department.**

AN examination for admission of Learners to the Irrigation Department will be held during August, at the following centres:—Anuradhapura, Batticaloa, Kurunegala, Tangalla, and Trincomalee.

2. Applications for admission to the examination will be received not later than August 15, by the Divisional Irrigation Engineer in any of the above-named centres in which a candidate desires to be examined.

3. Applications must be on the prescribed form, to be obtained from a Divisional Irrigation Engineer.

4. Candidates must be between the ages of 18 and 22, and must furnish along with their applications the following:—

- (a) A certificate of age.
- (b) A certificate of respectability and good moral character from at least two persons, whose social or official position can be accepted as a guarantee of reliability.
- (c) Educational certificate of a standard not lower than Junior Locals or Junior College of Preceptors' Examination (passes in Arithmetic and Algebra are necessary).

5. Approved candidates will be examined in such a way as a Divisional Irrigation Engineer may think fit to ascertain that the candidate has retained his standard of knowledge, that he is likely to apply his knowledge intelligently, and that he can speak fluently one of the vernacular languages.

6. Accepted candidates will be required to produce a health certificate from a Government Medical Officer testifying to the candidates' sound constitution, good vision and hearing, and physical fitness for service in any part of the Island. They will be taken into a Divisional Office or sent on to works of construction or survey for one year, and during this time will be paid subsistence allowance of Rs. 20 a month.

7. Three months of the year may be spent at the Training School of the Irrigation Department at Trincomalee, where free unfurnished camp quarters will be provided. Travelling expenses to and from a Learner's Station and Trincomalee will be allowed, but will be limited to fare by public conveyance and daily allowance at the rate paid to Sub-Inspectors.

8. At the end of the year a Learner will be examined as to his fitness for appointment as Irrigation Sub-Inspector, but a Learner who does not attend to his work or shows no promise of becoming a satisfactory officer may be discontinued at any time.

9. A Sub-Inspector will be eligible on passing a further examination for promotion to Irrigation Inspector (on vacancies occurring), and ultimately after satisfactory service and approved ability to Assistant Irrigation Engineer. ## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

#### Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, June 13, 1919.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated June 6, 1919.

*Present* :—Mr. R. W. Byrde, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; Major A. W. de Wilton; Mr. L. B. Fernando; The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. H. L. de Mel, C.B.E.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; Mr. T. L. Villiers; Mr. F. R. Senanayake; Mr. W. C. S. Ingles; Mr. W. Philips; Mr. B. F. Khan; the Hon. Dr. E. L. Hunt, C.M.G.; Mr. B. W. Leefe; and Mr. A. E. de Silva.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of May 9, 1919, having been previously printed, and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of May 9, 1919, be confirmed.

2. (a) The Chairman read the following :—I am pleased to say that since the last Meeting of Council no case of human plague has been recorded. The total for the year is 4 cases, as compared with 59 cases for the same period in 1918 and 175 cases in 1917.

(b) The Chairman read the following report received from the Medical Officer of Health :—“After a quiescent period of about 5 months influenza re-appeared in epidemic form about the second week in May. The dispensary returns and the death returns indicate that it increased up till about the end of May and then began to decrease, the improvement being especially marked during the last two days. This is the third outbreak in 12 months. The first outbreak, which occurred about this time last year, was mild and uncomplicated in character. The second outbreak in September–November was complicated by epidemic pneumonia, while the cases in the present outbreak have for the most part been of a mild, uncomplicated character. There has been an increase in the amount of pneumonia, and the death-rate rose during the week ended May 31 to 40·5 per 1,000. It, however, fell during the succeeding week to 36·5, and it is hoped will be still lower this week.”

3. The Chairman read the following :—After a series of tests and experiments, the City Analyst has been able to give a definite decision that the medicated taste in the town water supply was due to the action of the precipitating solution of sulphate of alumina upon the coating in the settling tank. He further states that the action of the sulphate of alumina was quite unforeseeable, and could not have been predicted. In the circumstances no blame whatsoever can be attached to Mr. Reason, the Acting Waterworks Engineer. The coating used for the settling tank was the identical coating which was on the walls of the Elie House Reservoir. It was removed when the work of cementing the inside of that reservoir was undertaken and was utilized for coating the walls of the filtered water basin at Labugama. In neither case was there any deleterious result. The work of coating the settling tank was in accordance with the programme laid down by Mr. Thyne, and Mr. Reason carried out the work under instructions received from Mr. Thyne, prior to his departure. There was no defect in the execution of the work. It was carried out by precisely the same labour as that employed when the clear water tank was coated. During the progress of the work it was inspected by the Chief Inspector, Mr. Samarakoon, in addition to the inspections made by Mr. Reason. With regard to the visits to Labugama made by Mr. Reason, I may mention that in April he paid three and not one visit, namely, on the 5th, 11th, and 25th. He was in that month engaged in supervising the re-lining of the Elie House Reservoir, a work which demanded his constant attention owing to its importance and to the necessity of his watching and instructing the masons. He also, in May, prior to the appearance of the taste in the water, paid two visits to Labugama, namely, on the 1st and 6th May. Every reasonable precaution was taken by him before putting the plant into use. The tank was left empty with all ventilators open for five days. On April 29 the coating was found to be perfectly dry and hard, and the tank was filled with water. It was emptied again on the 30th, filled on the same day, and emptied again on May 1. From May 1 till May 6 water was continually running night and day from the reservoir through the tank in order to wash it out. On May 5 the clear water tank was emptied and washed, and during May 6 all the filters were continually washing. At 9.30 A.M. on Wednesday, the 7th, the filters were put into action. Immediately intimation was given to Mr. Reason on May 8 that there was something wrong with the water, he took very prompt and effective action. He at once visited Labugama, and at 4.30 P.M. that day tasteless and odourless water was coming into the City. He had all the mains washed out, and on Saturday, the 10th, there was no trace of the taste in any of the City mains, though it may have lingered in some cases in the pipes to private premises. With regard to the Superintendent at Labugama, Mr. David, I may mention that he tasted the water, as is his usual practice, but did not detect the taste. He is a non-smoker, and neither drinks nor chews. It is strange that he did not detect it, but I am prepared to accept his statement that he did taste the water, in view of the fact that from the experiments made, it was ascertained that it is quite possible that at the time he tasted the water there was no medicated taste appreciable, as it appears that the taste and odour were to some extent evanescent. This is demonstrated by the fact that, in making his tests, Mr. Bruce found that on the addition of the solution to the water flowing through the settling tank the taste varied in intensity according to the time of contact. After one hour he found a trace, but after 3 hours he found no trace; yet after 5 hours a trace was again perceptible. The occurrence was a very unfortunate one, and one which has caused considerable public inconvenience. At the same time the water was good and wholesome and fit for human consumption and up to the usual standard, with the exception of the taste and smell. In the Labugama water we have a water of particular purity, but it is a soft water, that is, it does not contain much mineral matter in solution. The lime in solution is in small proportion. At the same time the water contains a certain quantity of hydroxide of iron which is akin in character to the alumina hydroxide artificially formed by the solution which is used in order to secure precipitation of the suspended matter in the water and to form a film on the filters. It is found that by the reason of the presence of the hydroxide of iron a natural film can be formed on the filters, and that the use of the sulphate of alumina can be dispensed with. This will not only be economical, but will also be useful, as it will both maintain the alkalinity of the water and preserve the small quantity of lime which is present in the water.

4. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved that a Special Committee consisting of the Elected Members, Mr. Arthur Alvis, Mr. W. Philips, and Mr. B. W. Leefe be appointed to consider what steps should be taken by the Municipality for celebrating the declaration of peace. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. P. Dias moved for a statement showing to what extent the Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals is subsidized by the Municipal Council. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman laid the statement on the table, and undertook to circulate it to Members.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 6 to 11 (inclusive) on the Agenda. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

6-11. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Special and the Standing Committees, named, were then laid before the Council in Committee :—

*Extract from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees on Law, Sanitation, Finance, and Works of May 5, 1919.*

(1) To consider the question of recommending the nomination by the Council of a gentleman and a lady to form a Committee with a gentleman and a lady to be nominated by Government to look into the cases of men and woman who are detained in the Home for Vagrants, with a view to finding employment for such of them as are fit for work.—It is recommended that the Rev. G. B. Ekanayake and Dr. (Mrs.) S. C. K. Rutnam be nominated, but that the Chairman should communicate with them in the first place to ascertain whether they will be prepared to serve on the Committee.

*Resolution.*

The Chairman stated that he had obtained the consent of the Rev. G. B. Ekanayake and Dr. (Mrs.) S. C. K. Rutnam, and moved that they be recommended by Council for nomination. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

*Extract from the Minutes of the Special Committee re "Reservation of Special Areas" of May 19, 1919.*

(3) To consider the proposal to build two blocks of superior tenements on land bearing assessment No. 250, Kollupitiya.—It is recommended that sanction be not granted for the laying down of lines for a private road of 30 feet.

*Resolution.*

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that the recommendation of the Special Committee be adopted. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Committee on Drainage Works of May 22, 1919.*

(2) To consider a report dated March 27, 1919, by Mr. Ernest L. Mansergh, Consulting Engineer, to the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, with regard to Madampitiya Treatment Works, and the comments of the Acting City Sanitation Engineer thereon.—The Committee recommends that the alteration of the two rectangular tanks, according to Mr. Mansergh's design, and the construction of the three circular sedimentation tanks of the first instalment should be proceeded with, and that the Council should approve of an increase in the modified programme of Rs. 80,000 on account of the works at Madampitiya Treatment Works.

The Committee is of opinion that the question of the sanction of the construction of storm water tanks at Wellawatta should be deferred until plans and estimates have been submitted.

(9) To consider a plan and estimate of Rs. 6,634 from the Acting City Sanitation Engineer for the erection of a public latrine at the junction of Modera street and Vuystwyke road.—Recommended for approval.

(10) To consider a plan and estimate of Rs. 5,934 from the Acting City Sanitation Engineer for the erection of a public latrine at Temple road near the junction of Modera street.—Recommended for approval.

*Resolution.*

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Special Committee be adopted.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees and the Elected Members of June 4, 1919.*

I.—*Municipal Dispensaries.*—It was recommended that three permanent Municipal Dispensaries be at once organized, one at Wellawatta, one at Dematagoda, and the other at Modera, and that the Medical Officer of Health should take steps to carry out this resolution, pending the confirmation by the Council.

II.—*Assistance to Charitable Institutions.*—Recommended that a sum of Rs. 10,000 be voted by the Council for the assistance of the charitable institutions in Colombo for supplying soup and bread for those suffering from influenza and other diseases and for supplying foodstuffs to those in actual distress.

III.—*Issue of Disinfectants.*—Recommended that the Chairman be authorized to issue disinfectants to the Ceylon Social Service League, the Friend-in-Need Society, and any other charitable institution for issue among the very poor, free of charge.

IV.—*Relief to Council's own Employés.*—Recommended that the Financial Assistant should draw up a scheme on the following percentages, irrespective of married or unmarried :—

V.—*Relief to Municipal Coolies.*—Recommended that a scheme, similar to the one adopted in December, 1918, be approved, but that the rate of issue be increased from Rs. 6.72 to Rs. 7.04 per bushel, and that the difference between the cost price and the price of issue be borne by the Council.

*Resolutions.*

With regard to item No. I., the Chairman moved that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted; Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

With regard to item No. II., the Chairman informed the Council of the decisions arrived at at the meeting convened by him of the representatives of the charitable institutions, and mentioned the various districts into which the City had been divided for the work of relief, and also the names of those who were to be in charge of each district. He also gave particulars of the nature of the relief being afforded. The Chairman stated he had received the following voluntary donations :—

*Donations received for Relief of Distress:* Mrs. R. Siva Gurunathan, Jaffna House, Ward Place, Rs. 250; Mr. E. C. de Fonseka, M.B.E., Rs. 1,000; "Anonymous," Rs. 1,500; Mr. H. J. P. Samarasekere, Muhandiram, Pussellawa, Rs. 2,000; Dr. C. A. Hewavitarana, Rs. 400 to meet the cost of the difference in the sale of rice at 5 cents a measure below schedule prices.

He said that Messrs. H. L. de Mel, C.B.E., F. R. Senanayake, and A. E. de Silva, Members of this Council, had each promised to give a similar amount, namely, Rs. 400.

The Chairman said that he had accepted an offer from Mr. Wickremasinghe, Proctor of Kegalla, to supply 1,000 unripe plantain bunches free for distribution to the poor.

The Chairman also spoke with regard to the rice situation.

He moved that a sum of Rs. 15,000 and not Rs. 10,000 be voted. Mr. T. L. Villiers seconded.

Mr. F. R. Senanayake, while supporting the motion, questioned whether the rice was at present being equitably distributed.

The Chairman said he understood that as soon as the large supplies come in there would be allotments of rice to various districts, the Government Agents being given their share for their districts and the Chairman receiving the allocation for Colombo. It had been arranged that the Chalmers Granaries should be used for the allotments to the districts, and the Manning Market as a depôt for Colombo under the charge of Dr. Wm. Marshall Philip, the Medical Officer of Health, for the distribution to the City.

Mr. T. L. Villiers and Dr. W. P. Rodrigo also spoke on the subject.

The Chairman put the motion, as amended, to the Meeting and it was carried, namely:—“That a sum of Rs. 15,000 be voted by the Council for the assistance of the charitable institutions in Colombo for supplying soup and bread for those suffering from influenza and other diseases and for supplying foodstuffs to those in actual distress.”

With regard to item No. III., it was resolved that the recommendation of the Committees be adopted.

With regard to item No. IV., the Chairman explained that there was a limited number of officers in the subordinate staff who were drawing a salary of over Rs. 2,160 per annum, and it was a question for the Council to decide whether these officers should also be afforded relief. The total amount required, as per the scheme submitted by the Financial Assistant, in terms of the resolution of the Committees, was about Rs. 3,138 per month.

Resolved that the allowance be not granted to officers who are drawing a salary of over Rs. 2,160 per annum.

The Chairman moved that the Council should approve of the payment, in terms of the recommendation of the Committees, and that the allowance be paid for the month of June and the two following months. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

With regard to item No. V., it was resolved that the recommendation of the Committees be adopted.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of June 6, 1919.*

(2) To consider an application from Messrs. M. R. & M. S. J. Akbar, Proctors, on behalf of the owner of premises No. 116, 2nd Division, Maradana, for certain concessions in connection with the re-erection, without the permission of the Chairman, of buildings within the street lines laid down for Maradana.—The Committee is of opinion that a concession cannot be granted, but that some such alteration in the law, as is suggested by the Chairman, might be recommended to Government to be embodied in the Ordinance.

(3) To recommend, under section 18 (4) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915, the street lines for a private street known as Fonseka road branching off from Dickman's road, as per plan No. 1,377 signed by the Municipal Works Engineer and dated April 16, 1919.—Recommended.

(4) To consider an application from the Municipal Works Engineer for authority to purchase a lathe for the workshop at a cost of £130, f.o.b., Liverpool, from Messrs. John Birch & Co., Ltd., London, on vote I 35, “Maintenance and repairs to plant” (Works Department).—Recommended.

(5) To recommend supplementary provision of Rs. 300 under vote M 17, “Upkeep of latrines” (Sanitation Department), to meet the cost of cleaning water fittings of Gordon Gardens latrine, not provided for in the estimate.—Recommended.

The Chairman moved that the recommendations of the Standing Committees be adopted, with the addition of the name of Mr. B. R. Silva, Sub-Inspector. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

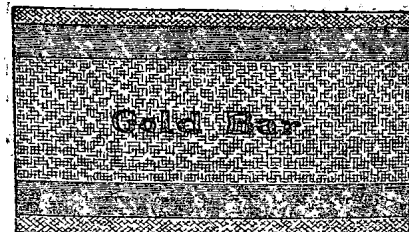

1. From and after the commencement of these regulations it is forbidden to remove or transport paddy, rice, and kurakkan, and all uncooked foodstuffs manufactured therefrom, by any means, from the District of Matara, in the Southern Province, except under permits to be issued by the Assistant Government Agent, Matara.

2. Any person who contravenes the provisions of the last preceding regulation shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on summary conviction to imprisonment of either description for any term not exceeding six months, or to a fine not exceeding Rs. 1,500, or to both.

3. These regulations shall commence and come into operation on July 25, 1919.
