Articles the exportation of which from Ceylon is prohibited to all destinations :—

Oleaginous kernels, nuts, and seeds, and products thereof (except fresh coconuts, copra, poonac, desiccated coconut, coconut oil, and essential oils), not otherwise specifically prohibited.

SCHEDULE D.

Articles the exportation of which from Ceylon is prohibited to Turkey, Bulgaria, Ports on the Black Sea (not including Roumanian ports), and German-Austria, Jugoslavia, Montenegro, and Albania :—

Aircraft of all kinds, including aeroplanes, airships, balloons, and their component parts, together with accessories and articles suitable for use in connection with aircraft.

Apparatus which can be used for the storage or projection of compressed or liquefied gases, flame, acids, or other destructive agents, capable of use in warlike operations, and their component parts.

Armour plates.

Armoured motor cars.

Arms of all kinds, including arms for sporting purposes, and their component parts.

Barbed wire and implements for fixing and cutting same.

Camp equipment, articles of, and their component parts.

Clothing and equipment of a distinctively military character.

Electrical appliances adapted for use in war, and their component parts.

Explosives specially prepared for use in war.

Field glasses.

Gases for war purposes.

Gun mountings.

Guns and machine guns.
Harness or horse equipment of a military character.
Implements and apparatus designed exclusively for the manufacture of munitions of war or for the manufacture or repair of arms or of war material for use on land or sea.
Limbers, military waggons of all descriptions.

Projectiles, charges, cartridges, and grenades of all kinds, and their component parts.
Range-finders and their component parts.
Searchlights and their component parts.

SCHEDULE E.

In addition to the goods contained in list D the following goods are prohibited from export to Bulgaria :—

Articles for use in transportation on land.
Saddle or pack animals, vehicles, motor cars, bicycles, and their component parts.
Locomotives and rolling stock.
Telegraphs and telephones, and their component parts, and materials for use therewith.

SCHEDULE F.

All articles other than those appearing in the subjoined list are prohibited to be exported to Finland, unless import license for the same has been granted by the Inter-Allied Trade Committee, Helsingfors :—

Fancy goods of paper, ivory, mother-of-pearl, tortoise-shell, amber and amberoid, marble, and other stones, papier-mache, bone, horn, cassein, plaster, ebonite, vulcanite, and xylonite.

Ink, other than printer's ink.

Jewellery, imitation.

Jewellery, real; mounted with precious stones, excluding articles of solid gold, silver, or platinum.

With the above exceptions, a general license is given for export of goods to all neutral countries and to the occupied enemy territories, to wit :—

* Occupied Rhineland Territory (including Luxemburg), † Bosnia, † Herzegovina, † Dalmatia, Czecho-Slovakia, † Turkey, and † Bulgaria, † Russian Black Sea ports except Odessa, German-Austria, and the parts of † Austria-Hungary occupied by Allied Forces.

Note (a).—Tungsten and tungsten ores may not be shipped to the United Kingdom.

Note (b).—Consignments of goods to order is now permissible, and goods for neutral countries may now be consigned direct to importers.

Note (c).—Certificates of Origin are no longer required of importers from any country and Declarations of Ultimate Destination are now unnecessary.

* Export only allowed without license *via* Holland, and provided goods are consigned to Standard Bank of South Africa, Rotterdam.

(b) Rice, paddy, or kurakkan from the Matale District of the Central Province, except under permit to be issued by the Assistant Government Agent, Matale.

(c) Rice, paddy, kurakkan, and Indian corn from the divisions of Uda Hewaheta, Kotmale, and Walapane of the Nuwara Eliya District, Central Province, except under permit to be issued by the Assistant Government Agent, Nuwara Eliya.

(d) Paddy or rice from the Galle District, Southern Province, except under permit to be issued by the Government Agent, Southern Province.

(e) Paddy, rice, kurakkan, and all uncooked foodstuffs manufactured therefrom from the Matara District of the Southern Province, except under permit to be issued by the Assistant Government Agent, Matara.

(f) Paddy, rice, kurakkan, gingelly, tana, mun, or meneri from the Hambantota District of the Southern Province, except under permit to be issued by the Assistant Government Agent, Hambantota.

(g) Rice, paddy, maize, and fine grains of any description from the Jaffna District of the Northern Province, except under permit to be issued by the Government Agent, Northern Province.

(h) Rice, paddy, maize, and fine grains of any description from the Mannar District of the Northern Province, except under permit to be issued by the Assistant Government Agent, Mannar.

(i) Rice, paddy, and kurakkan from the Mullaittivu District of the Northern Province, except under permit to be issued by the Assistant Government Agent, Mullaittivu.

(j) Paddy, rice, and kurakkan from the North-Western Province, except under permit to be issued by the Government Agent, North-Western Province, or the Assistant Government Agent, Puttalam, according to the district from which removal or transport is to be made.

(k) Paddy, rice, and kurakkan from the Puttalam-Chilaw District of the North-Western Province, except on permits to be issued by the Assistant Government Agent, Puttalam.

(l) Paddy, rice, and kurakkan from the North-Central Province, except on permits to be issued by the Government Agent, North-Central Province.

(m) Rice, paddy, kurakkan, or Indian corn from the Eastern Province, except on permits to be issued by the Government Agent, Eastern Province, or the Assistant Government Agent, Trincomalee, according to the locality from which removal or transport is desired.

(n) Rice, paddy, rice flour, crushed rice known as "aval," or kurakkan from the Trincomalee District of the Eastern Province, except on permits to be issued by the Assistant Government Agent, Trincomalee.

(o) Paddy, rice, kurakkan, Indian corn, and kollu from the Province of Uva, except on permits to be issued by the Government Agent, Uva.

(p) Rice, paddy, kurakkan, or other grains from the Sabaragamuwa Province, except on permits to be issued by the Government Agent, Sabaragamuwa, or the Assistant Government Agent, Kegalla, according to the locality from which removal or transport is desired.

(q) Paddy, rice, kurakkan, or other grains from the Kegalla District of the Province of Sabaragamuwa, except on permits to be issued by the Assistant Government Agent, Kegalla.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 2, 1919.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 80 (1 European, 9 Burghers, 46 Sinhalese, 8 Tamils, 12 Moors, 2 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1919, viz., 285,795) was 14.6, as against 15.3 in the preceding week, 16.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 135 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 60 Sinhalese, 34 Tamils, 24 Moors, 1 Malay, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 24.6, as against 28.3 in the previous week, 24.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 135 total deaths, 26 were of infants under one year of age, as against 40 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

Principal Causes of Death.—(a) Seventeen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 9 in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in Slave Island, 2 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 in St. Paul's, as against 12 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths of residents of Colombo occurred at the Ragama Hospital from *Phthisis* during the week.

2. (a) Ten deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 6 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 in Kotahena, 1 in Pettah, and 1 in San Sebastian, as against 21, 14, 17, and 29 respectively, in the four preceding weeks. The weekly average for last year was 27.

(b) Thirteen deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 6 in St. Paul's, 2 in San Sebastian, 2 in Kotahena, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 in New Bazaar, as against 11, 5, 8, and 3, respectively, in the four preceding weeks.

(c) One death from *Bronchitis* was registered in Wellawatta, as against three in the preceding week.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Kotahena, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Maradana, as against 9 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Measles* was registered in Slave Island.

5. Sixteen deaths were registered from *Debility*, 6 from *Diarrhoea*, 5 from *Enteritis*, 4 from *Worms*, 3 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 3 from *Dysentery*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 51 from *Other Causes*.

6. Eight cases of *Chickenpox* and 9 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 1 and 5, respectively, in the preceding week. One case of *Smallpox* was reported from the Harbour.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79°·9', against 80°·5' in the preceding week and 82°·5' in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·873 in., against 29·859 in. in the preceding week and 29·905 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2·54 in., against 0·63 in. in the preceding week and 0·18 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

"Method of treating hoofs and horns of animals so as to render them easily reducible to powder suitable for use as a horticultural and agricultural manure."

Abstract.—The inventor states:—

My invention consists of the treatment of hoofs and horns of animals in such manner that the hoofs and horns become very soft and can be easily reduced to a powder and mixed with other suitable ingredients for making a fertilizing substance or manure for horticultural and agricultural purposes. The method of treatment is as follows:—

The horns and hoofs are placed in vats or any suitable utensil and an alkali (preferably burnt lime) and water added. The contents of the vat or other like utensil are then allowed to stand till the hoofs and horns are thoroughly soaked when the said contents are boiled or steamed until the horns and hoofs are quite soft and can be easily disintegrated.

The hoofs and horns are then removed from the vats or other utensils and allowed to dry and afterwards reduced to a fine powder by any suitable process.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on June 21, 1919, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated June 17, 1919.

Present :—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy, Dr. Allan de Saram, Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle; and Mr. P. M. Bingham.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on May 17, 1919, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1918 to May 31, 1919, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for May.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of May.
- (e) The reservoir readings for May.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during May.

After the confirmation of the Minutes the Chairman made the following statement on the rice situation :—

I received information from the Food Controller on 14th instant that it was hoped to send 1,750 bags to Kandy District out of the Tuticorin shipment expected on 17th instant. 700 bags out of this were allotted to Kandy town, that is about a week's supply. Out of this 700 bags 350 bags arrived on 19th instant. When I was informed on 19th morning the consignment would not arrive till 11.50 P.M. by goods train that night, I asked the railway authorities whether a portion could not be sent by passenger train. This request was granted, and two passenger coaches were detached from the afternoon train, and two wagons of rice sent in their place arrived at 6 P.M. and a portion unloaded at once.

It is expected that the balance 350 bags for Kandy town out of the Tuticorin consignment will be despatched from Colombo on 21st.

In addition the Principal Collector of Customs has allotted 550 bags Rangoon rice to Kandy District, out of which 440 has been apportioned to Kandy town. Permits have been issued to traders for immediate removal.

Rice is being allotted to traders on condition that they comply with any orders made by the Deputy Food Controller from time to time, thus enabling a system of sale by ticket to be introduced.

On the general question, I gather that until the end of September supplies will be two-thirds of the normal. With the help of the machinery of the Kandy Social Service League, it is hoped that this supply will be distributed fairly among all.

4. Correspondence : (1) Letter No. 11 of May 19, 1919, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, requesting that a statement showing the average number of buffaloes slaughtered yearly for food within the Municipality during the last three years be forwarded.—Read.

(2) Letter No. 12 of May 27, 1919, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to nominate Mr. P. M. Bingham to be a Member of the Municipal Council, Kandy, during the absence of Mr. H. F. Tomalin from the Island.—Read.

(3) Letter No. 13 of May 31, 1919, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, acknowledging receipt of letter forwarding a copy of resolution passed by the Municipal Council on the subject of the services of an expert to report on the feasibility of lighting the town of Kandy with hydro-electricity.—Read.

(4) Letter No. 17 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary that Government is itself conducting investigations into the question of utilizing water power for the generation of electricity, and that until further data are obtained Government does not consider that an expert would be able to make any useful report.—Read.

(5) Letter No. 14 of June 10 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, sanctioning the contribution by the Municipal Council of the sums of Rs. 1,000 and Rs. 500 to the Kandy Social Service League as proposed at the Special Meeting of Council held on June 4, 1919.—Read.

(6) Letter No. 15 of June 15, 1919, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, re the supply of rice to Public Departments.—Read.

(7) Circular No. 35 of June 14, 1919, re applications to Government for sanctioning expenditure under sections 45 (i) and (j) of the Municipal Council Ordinance.—Read.

After the correspondence was read, Dr. Attygalle presented the following petitions :—

(a) From Mr. R. Solomons complaining against a demand for payment of Rs. 2.50, excess water charges for first quarter, 1919.

(b) From Mr. L. B. Seneviratne alleging that overseers and kanganies of the Sanitary Department make incorrect entries in the checkrolls.

It was agreed to refer (a) to the Superintendent of Works and (b) to the Sanitary Superintendent for report.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. LaBrooy moved—(1) In view of the outbreak of influenza in Colombo and Galle and of the likelihood of its spreading to Kandy, and in order that such an eventuality may be efficiently met, that steps be taken for the erection of temporary sheds either at the site chosen for the new infectious diseases hospital or at some other suitable site: (a) for the removal to and housing of those attacked by the disease; (b) for the housing of the contacts, more especially of those who, owing to the illness of the bread winners of the family, would be in a state of destitution; (c) for the accommodation of those members of the Social Service League as would be able to remain on the premises for the purpose of looking after the sick and the contacts; (d) for housing the dispensers or apothecaries in charge and the attendants.

(2) That a sufficient quantity of drugs and other medical requisites, including disinfectants, be indented for and had on readiness.

Mr. Pieris seconded. The motion was put to the Meeting and lost by 5 to 2.

Ayes.—Mr. LaBrooy, Mr. Pieris. *Noes*.—The Chairman, Dr. de Saram, Mr. Ratwatte, Dr. Attygalle, Mr. Bingham.

6. Pursuant to notice the Chairman moved—That application be made to the Police Magistrate for a closing order under Ordinance No. 19 of 1915 in respect of alleys Nos. 119 and 144, Colombo street. Mr. LaBrooy seconded.—Carried.

7. Report of the Special Committee on the Kandy public market. It was agreed that the report be brought up at the next Meeting of Council.

8. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

Law and General Subjects.

(1) That the following rule passed by the Colombo Municipal Council be adopted :—

In calculating the pension of an officer or servant transferred from the service of the Government to the service of the Municipality, or from the service of the Municipality to the service of the Government, the payment of the sum due on account of the climate bonus shall be divided as between the Government and the Municipality in proportion to the length of service of such officer or servant under each respectively.

(2) That the Medical Officer of Health and the Superintendent of Works be given a personal allowance of Rs. 40 and Rs. 10, respectively, to cover the tax on their motor vehicles.

Finance and Assessment.

(3) That nuisance watcher M. L. David be given an increase of Rs. 2·50 a month, with effect from May 1 1919.

(4) That the market cooly Sand nam be paid Rs. 8, the amount paid by him when on sick leave to his substitute.

(5) That a supplementary vote of Rs. 2,222·94 be taken for the acquisition of land for the new infectious diseases hospital.

(6) That the substitute employed during the illness of two office peons be paid Rs. 2.

(7) That a substitute be employed at Re. 1 a day during the absence of the License and Commutation Clerk on military duty, from July 12 to August 10 next.

Municipal Works.

(8) That Mr. R. L. de Silva, Assistant to the Superintendent of Works, be allowed time to obtain the Surveyor-General's license till the next examination.

(9) That house service pipes be allowed on usual terms to No. 14, Slaughter-house road, Mr. H. F. de Silva. Resolved that the recommendations be adopted.

9. To elect a Member to serve on (1) the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation; (2) the Standing Committee on Municipal Works. Mr. P. M. Bingham was elected to serve on both Committees.

Rule referred to in Item 5 of the Minutes of May 10, 1919.

The following rules regarding mechanically propelled vehicles made by the proper authority of every province, district, or town within the Island, under the provisions of "The Vehicles Ordinance, No. 4 of 1916," are published for general information:—

1. The proper authority will nominate persons who are possessed of the necessary qualifications to act as examiners of mechanically propelled vehicles in any province, district, or town.
2. Such examiner shall not charge fees in excess of the following scale:—(a) For examining one vehicle for a license and furnishing a certificate, Rs. 10; (b) for re-examination of the same vehicle and report thereon, Rs. 5; (c) for re-examination of a vehicle already licensed and report thereon, Rs. 5.
3. In every application for the license of a carriage or coach which is mechanically propelled, the declaration of ownership in the form A in the 2nd Schedule of the Ordinance shall contain words indicating that the vehicle is one which is propelled mechanically.
4. Upon any such application being made the proper authority may require the owner of such vehicle to produce it for inspection at a stated time and place and may refuse to consider such application till such production, or the proper authority may furnish the applicant with a list of examiners of mechanically propelled vehicles in the district or town, and require the applicant to produce a certificate in the form set out in Schedule 1 of these rules.
5. If an examiner finds any such vehicle unfit for the purpose for which the license is applied for, unless certain adjustments, requirements, or alterations are made, he shall enter in the certificate in the space provided what adjustments, requirements, or alterations he considers are necessary to be made.
6. If a license be refused upon the report of an examiner that a vehicle is not in good order and fit to be hired for the purposes for which the license is applied for, unless certain adjustments, requirements, or alterations are made, the applicant may rectify the defects indicated by the examiner and submit a further application for a license with a further report from the same examiner or some examiner if the same examiner is not available.
7. If an examiner finds a vehicle finally and definitely unfit to be hired for the purposes for which the license is applied for, he shall give information of this fact to the Registrar of Motor Cars, indicating at the same time the registered number of such vehicle, and the Registrar of Motor Cars shall send such application to the proper authorities in the Island for their guidance.
8. Upon a requisition by the proper authority that the owner of any such licensed vehicle shall produce the same for re-examination before a named examiner and at a stated time and place—
 - (a) Failure to produce such vehicle in terms of such order that entail the cancellation, withdrawal, or suspension of the license in the discretion of the proper authority;
 - (b) If the examiner shall report that the vehicle is not being kept in good order and condition, or that it is out of repair and unfit to be used for the purpose for which it was licensed, the proper authority may withdraw the license until such time as the vehicle is reported to be fit.

NUWARA ELIYA DISTRICT.

Rainfall: Nuwara Eliya town, 9·36 in.

Paddy: maha cultivation fields in Walapane were harvested. Yala cultivation fields throughout the District are being ploughed.

Dry grains: no work in chenas.

Health of population: influenza is prevalent in some of the villages of Walapane and Kotmale, and chickenpox in Gannewa korale of Uda Hewaheta.

Health of cattle: there were 9 cases of rinderpest on Madacumbura estate, Watagoda, out of which 8 died and 1 recovered; and 21 cases at Udagama in Kotmale, out of which 16 died.

Prices of staple articles: paddy, Rs. 3 to Rs. 3·50 per bushel; kurakkan, Rs. 6·50 per bushel; Indian corn, Rs. 5 to Rs. 6 per bushel; rice (country), Rs. 7 to Rs. 7·75 per bushel; rice (Bangkok), 37 cents a measure; coconuts, Rs. 9 to Rs. 12 per 100 nuts.

SOUTHERN PROVINCE.

GALLE DISTRICT.

The yala crop promises to be satisfactory.

Dry grain is cultivated in the District only on a small scale.

Coconut, tea, rubber, cinnamon, citronella, and vegetables are the principal products. The estimated coconut crop for the month was 10,275,000 nuts.

Coast rice varied from Rs. 8 to Rs. 15·04 per bushel; paddy varied from Rs. 4 to Rs. 10 per bushel; dry grain varied from Rs. 2 to Rs. 8 per bushel; coconuts varied from Rs. 40 to Rs. 75 per 1,000 nuts.

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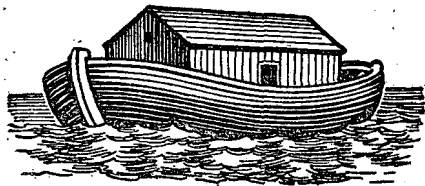

1. The name of the Company is "THE JAFFNA AGRICULTURAL COMPANY, LIMITED."

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE JAFFNA AGRICULTURAL COMPANY, LIMITED.

REGULATIONS.

THE regulations contained in Table C in the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," shall not apply to this Company, which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Articles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolution.

BUSINESS.

2. The Company shall proceed to carry on business as soon after the registration thereof as the Directors shall think fit; and notwithstanding that the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, or applied for, or allotted, they shall do so as soon as, in the judgment of the Directors, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed, or applied for, or allotted.
3. The business of the Company shall be carried on by, or under the management or direction of, the Directors, and subject only to the control of General Meetings in accordance with these regulations.

SHARES.

4. The shares shall be under the control of the Directors, who may allot or otherwise dispose of the same to such persons, on such terms and conditions, and at such times, as the Directors think fit.
5. Every person taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof by writing under his hand in such form as the Directors from time to time specify.
6. The Company shall, before making any calls upon the Shareholders in respect of moneys due from them on their shares, give one month's notice at least of each such call, by publication in one or more of the local papers, and by serving written notice thereof in manner hereinafter prescribed.
7. If on or before the day appointed for payment any Shareholder does not pay the amount due from him, then such Shareholder shall be liable to pay interest for the same at the rate of 12 per cent. per annum from the date of default till the time of payment in full of such amount.
8. The shares shall be allotted at the discretion of and by the Directors, who may from time to time issue any unissued shares, and may add to such shares such an amount of premium as they may consider proper.
9. Shares may be registered in the name of a firm, and any partner of the firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm shall be entitled to vote and get proxies.
10. Shares may be registered in the name of two or more persons not in partnership.
11. In case of death of any one or more joint-holders of any share, the survivor or survivors shall be the only person or persons recognized by the Company as having any title to, or interest in, such shares.
12. The joint-holders of a share shall be severally as well as jointly liable for the payment of all instalments and call due in respect of such share.
13. Each Shareholder shall be liable to pay the amount of calls made on him to the person, and at the time and at the place appointed by the Directors.
14. A call shall be deemed to have been made at that time when the resolution of the Directors authorizing such call was passed.
15. If several persons are joint-holders of any share, any one of such persons may give effectual receipts for any dividend payable in respect to such shares.
16. The certificate of title to shares shall be issued under the seal of the Company and signed by two Directors and the Secretary, or in such other manner as the Directors shall prescribe.

17. Every Shareholder shall be entitled, on payment of 50 cents, to one certificate for all shares registered in his own name, specifying the share or shares held by him and the amount paid up thereon.

18. If such certificate is worn out or lost it may be re-executed on payment of 50 cents.

19. No person shall exercise any rights of a Shareholder until his name shall have been entered in the Register of Shareholders, and he shall have paid all moneys payable for the time being on every share held by him.

TRANSFER OF SHARES.

20. Any Shareholder may, with the consent of the Directors previously obtained, transfer all or any of his shares. The instrument of such transfer shall be in writing, signed both by the transferor and the transferee. And the transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of the share until the name of the transferee is entered in the Register.

21. The Board may, at their absolute and uncontrolled discretion, decline to register any transfer of any share by a Shareholder who is indebted to the Company, or upon whose shares the Company has a lien or otherwise; or in the case of shares not fully paid up to any person not approved by them; in no case shall a Shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the Directors to state the reasons of their refusal to register, but their declinature shall be absolute.

22. The instrument of transfer shall be presented to the Company accompanied by such evidence as they may require to prove the title of the transferor, and thereupon the Company shall register the transferee as a Shareholder.

23. The Transfer Books shall be closed during the fourteen days immediately preceding the Ordinary General Meetings in each year.

24. The executors, administrators, or heirs of a deceased Shareholder shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to his share. Provided, however, that the heirs of a deceased Shareholder shall not be recognized as a Shareholder unless letters of administration be taken to the estate of the said deceased Shareholder if the law so requires.

25. Any person becoming entitled to a share in consequence of the death, or bankruptcy, or insolvency of any Shareholder, or in consequence of the marriage of any female Shareholder, or in any way other than transfer, may be registered as a Shareholder upon such evidence being produced as may from time to time be required by the Company.

CALLS.

26. The Directors may, from time to time, make such calls as they think fit upon the Shareholders in respect of all moneys unpaid on their shares, and not by the conditions of allotment made payable at fixed times; provided that two months' notice at least shall be given to the Shareholders of the time and place appointed for payment of each call; and each Shareholder shall pay the amount of every call so made to the persons and at the same time and place appointed by the Directors.

27. If any Shareholder fails to pay any call or instalments due from him on the appointed day, the Company may, at any time thereafter, during such time as the amount remains unpaid, serve notice on him requiring him to pay such amount, together with any interest that may have accrued by reason of such non-payment.

28. The notice shall name a further date and a place or places on and at which such money to be paid. It shall further state that in the event of non-payment at the time and place appointed the share in respect of which such money is due is liable to be forfeited.

29. If the requisitions of any such notice are not complied with, any share in respect of which such notice has been given may, at any time thereafter, be forfeited by the resolution of the Directors to that effect.

30. Any share so far forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may be disposed of in such manner as the Company thinks fit.

31. Any Shareholder whose share has been forfeited shall, notwithstanding, be liable to pay to the Company all moneys owing upon such shares at the time of forfeiture.

CAPITAL.

32. The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company previously given in General Meetings, increase its capital by the creation of new shares.

33. Any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original, and shall be subject to the same provisions in all respects, whether with reference to the payment of calls or otherwise, as if it had been part of the original capital.

MEETINGS.

34. The first General Meeting shall be held at such times not being more than twelve months after the incorporation of the Company, and at such places as the Directors may determine.

35. Subsequent General Meetings may be held at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, and if not so prescribed, then at such time and place in the month of April in each year as the Directors shall determine.

36. The General Meetings mentioned in the last preceding clauses shall be called Ordinary General Meetings; all other meetings of the Company shall be called Extraordinary General Meetings.

37. The Directors may, whenever they think fit, call an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, and the Directors shall also do so upon a requisition made in writing by not less than one-fifth of the number of the Shareholders of the Company for the time being, or by any Shareholder or Shareholders holding in the aggregate one-fifth part of the shares of the Company for the time being subscribed for.

38. Any requisition so made shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called, shall be addressed to the Directors, and shall be sent to the registered office of the Company. Upon the receipt of such requisition the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting to be held at such time and place as they shall determine. If they do not proceed to convene the same within twenty-one days from the delivery of the requisition, the requisitionists may themselves convene an Extraordinary General Meeting to be held at such time and place as the Shareholders convening the meeting may themselves fix.

39. Any Shareholder may on giving not less than fourteen days previous notice of any resolution submit the same to the meetings.

40. Such notice shall be given by leaving a copy of the resolution at the registered office of the Company.

41. Twenty-one days notice at least, specifying the place and hour of meeting, and the purpose to which any General Meeting is to be held, shall be given by advertisement in any local newspaper or in such other manner, if any, as may be prescribed by the Company.

42. No business shall be transacted at any meeting, except the declaration of dividend, unless a quorum of Shareholders is present at the commencement of such business, and such quorum shall be ascertained as follows: *i.e.*, if the Shareholders belonging to the Company at the time of the meeting do not exceed twenty in number, the quorum shall be ten; if they exceed twenty, there shall be added to the above quorum one for every additional ten Shareholders, with this limitation that no quorum shall in any case exceed forty.

43. If within one hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of Shareholders is not present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of Shareholders, shall be dissolved. In any other case it shall stand adjourned

to the following day at the same time and place; and if at such adjourned meeting the required number of Shareholders is not present, it shall be adjourned *sine die*.

44. The Chairman, if any, of the Board of Directors shall preside as Chairman at every meeting of the Company. If there be no such Chairman, or at any meeting he is not present, the Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of the meeting.

45. The Chairman may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place.

46. At any General Meeting, unless a poll is demanded by at least five Shareholders, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the Book of Proceedings of the Company, shall be sufficient evidence of the fact, without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded for or against such resolution.

47. If a poll is demanded in manner aforesaid, the same shall be taken in such manner as the Chairman directs, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

48. Every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him.

49. If any Shareholder is a minor, lunatic, idiot, or prodigal he may vote by the person legally appointed to the charge and administration of his property.

50. If two or more persons are jointly entitled to a share or shares, the person whose name stands first in the Register of the Shareholders as one of the holders of such share or shares and no other shall be entitled to vote in respect of the same.

51. No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote at any meeting, unless all moneys due from him to the Company are paid.

52. Votes may be given either personally or by proxy. A proxy shall be appointed in writing under the hand of the appointer, or if such appointer is a corporation under their common seal, and shall have affixed thereto a stamp of such values as shall in law be requisite.

53. No person shall be appointed proxy who is not a Shareholder, and the instrument appointing him shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than twenty-four hours before the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote; but no such instrument shall be valid after the expiration of three months from the date of its execution.

DIRECTORS.

54. Until otherwise determined by a General Meeting the number of Directors shall not be less than seven or exceed fifteen.

55. The qualifications of a Director shall be the holding of five shares, or the obtaining of the votes of person or persons holding twenty shares in the aggregate.

56. The first Directors shall be Messrs. K. V. Marcondan, Renter and Merchant; A. Sithamparanathapillai, Notary Public; A. Vyrarnuttu; S. R. Rasaratnam, Advocate; S. Sittampalam, Proctor, Supreme Court; S. R. Muttiah; C. A. V. Muttiah; V. R. Thambirajah; and N. Subramaniam, Landed Proprietor; and W. Supramaniam, Planter; A. Mudr. Velupillai, Proctor, and they shall hold office, except in the event of becoming disqualified, until the first Ordinary General Meeting of the Company.

57. Any casual vacancy in the Board may be filled up by the vote, but any person so chosen shall hold office only until the next Annual General Meeting.

58. As remuneration for their services the Directors shall be entitled to receive out of the funds of the Company such annual sums as may be voted by the Shareholders in General Meeting. Such remuneration shall be exclusive of any sum paid by way of salary or remuneration to any Managing Director or Directors, and shall be divided among the Director as they may determine.

59. The office of a Director shall be vacated—

- (1) If he ceases to hold the number of shares qualifying him for the office.
- (2) If by notice in writing to the Company he resigns office.
- (3) If he becomes insolvent.
- (4) If he is found lunatic or become of unsound mind.

60. The Company may, by special resolution, remove any Director, before the expiration of his term of office, and appoint another Shareholder in his stead.

61. At every Ordinary Meeting of the Company, the whole of the Directors shall retire from office, but they shall be eligible for re-election.

62. The Directors may, from time to time, appoint one or more of their body to be Managing Director or Directors of the Company, with such powers as the Directors may think fit to confer on him or them, either for any fixed term or without any limitation as to the period for which he is to hold such office, and may, subject to any contract between him and the Company, from time to time remove or dismiss him and appoint another in his place. The remuneration of the Managing Director shall be fixed by the Directors, and may be by way of salary, commission, percentage, or participation in profits, or by any or all of these modes.

63. The Directors may meet together for despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings as they think fit, and may determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business; and until otherwise determined, five shall form a quorum.

64. A Director may, and the Secretary at the request of any Director shall, at any time convene a meeting of the Directors. Questions arising at any meeting of the Directors shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the Directors present, and in case of equality of votes, the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

65. The Directors may elect a Chairman of the meeting, and may determine the period for which he shall hold office. If such Chairman has not been appointed, or if he is not present at the time appointed for a meeting, the Directors present shall choose some one of those present to be Chairman of such meeting.

66. The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in a book or books provided for and solely used for that purpose:—

- (1) Of all appointment of officers made by the Directors.
- (2) Of the names of Directors present at each meeting of Directors.
- (3) Of all orders made by the Directors.

(4) Of all resolutions and proceedings of the meetings of the Company and of the Directors. And any such minute as aforesaid, if signed by any person purporting to be the Chairman of any meeting of Directors, shall be receivable in evidence without any further proof.

67. A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted.

68. The Directors may delegate any of their powers to Committees consisting of such Shareholder or Shareholders of their body as they think fit, and may revoke the appointment of any such Committee. Any Committee so formed shall, in the exercise of powers so delegated, conform to any regulations that may, from time to time, be imposed on it by the Directors.

69. The meetings and proceedings of any such Committee consisting of two or more Shareholders shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meeting of Directors so far as the same are applicable thereto and are not superseded by the express terms of the appointment of the Committee or by any such regulations as aforesaid.

DIVIDEND.

70. The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, declare a dividend to be paid to the Shareholders in proportion to their shares.

71. No dividend shall be payable except out of the profits arising from the business of the Company and with the sanction of the Directors.

72. The Directors may, before recommending any dividend, set aside out of the profits of the Company such sum as they think proper as a reserve fund to meet contingencies, or for equalizing dividends, or for repairing or maintaining the works connected with the business of the Company or any part thereof, and the Directors may invest the sum so set apart as a reserve fund upon such security as they may, with the sanction of the Company, select.

73. The Directors may deduct from the dividends payable to any Shareholder all such sums of money as may be due from him to the Company on account of calls or otherwise.

74. No dividend shall bear interest as against the Company.

75. Notice of any dividend that may have been declared shall be given to each Shareholder, or sent by post or otherwise to his registered place of abode; and all dividends unclaimed for three years, after having been declared, may be forfeited by the Directors for the benefit of the Company.

76. The Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the moneys received and expended by the Company, and all matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place, and of the property, assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company. But no Shareholder shall have any right to insist on the inspection of any account book or document of the Company except as conferred by the Ordinance, or authorized by the Directors, or by a resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

ACCOUNTS.

77. Once at least in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company in General Meeting a statement of the income and expenditure of the Company for the past year made up to a date not more than three months before each meeting.

78. The statement so made shall show, arranged under the most convenient heads, the amount of gross income distinguishing the several sources from which it had been derived, and the amount of gross expenditure distinguishing the expense of the establishment, salaries, and other matters.

79. Every item of expenditure fairly chargeable against the year's income shall be brought into account, so that a just balance of the profit and loss may be laid up before the meeting; and in cases where any item of expenditure which may in fairness be distributed over several years has been incurred in any one year, the whole amount of such item shall be stated, with the addition of the reasons why only a portion of such expenditure is charged against the year.

80. At the Ordinary Meeting in each year the Directors shall lay before the Company a balance sheet containing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company.

81. A printed sheet of such balance sheet shall, twenty-one days previously to such meeting, be delivered or sent by post to the address of every Shareholder.

AUDIT.

82. The accounts of the Company shall be examined, and the correctness of the balance sheet ascertained by one or more Auditors to be elected by the Company in General Meeting.

83. The remuneration of the Auditors shall be fixed by the Company at the time of their election.

84. If any casual vacancy occurs in the office of Auditors, the Directors shall forthwith call an Extraordinary General Meeting for the purpose of supplying the same.

85. The Directors shall appoint the first Auditors to audit the accounts of the Company until the first Ordinary General Meeting, and fix the remuneration payable to them.

86. Every Auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto.

87. Every Auditor shall have a list delivered to him of all the books kept by the Company, and he shall at all reasonable times have access to the books and accounts of the Company. He may, at the expenses of the Company, employ accountants or other persons to assist him in investigating such accounts, and he may in relation to such accounts examine the Directors or any other officer of the Company.

88. The Auditors shall make a report to the Shareholders upon the balance sheet and accounts, and in every such report they shall state whether, in their opinion, the balance sheet is full and fair containing the particulars required by these regulations, and properly drawn up so as to exhibit a true and correct view of the state of the Company's affairs; and in case they have called for explanations or information from the Directors, whether such explanations or information have been given by the Directors, and whether they have been satisfactory; and such reports shall be read, together with the report of the Directors at the Ordinary General Meeting.

NOTICES.

89. Notices requiring to be served by the Company upon the Shareholders may be served either personally, or by leaving the same, or sending them through the post, at their registered places of abode.

90. Every Shareholder shall give an address which shall be deemed his place of abode, and shall be registered as such in the books of the Company.

91. Any notice sent by post shall be deemed to have been served at the time when the letter concerning same is posted, and in proving such service, it should be sufficient to prove that the letter containing the notice was properly addressed and put in a Post Office box or handed in at a Post Office.
