## ORDINANCE No. 17 OF 1869.

## "THE LOCAL BOARDS ORDINANCE, 1898."

BY-LAWS made by the Local Board of Gampola, under section 57 of the above-mentioned Ordinance, in substitution for by-law No. 6, Chapter XIII., section 56 (21), Schedule D, of the said Ordinance, and confirmed by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council:—

6. (a) Any person who is desirous that ashes, sweepings, refuse, or other rubbish from his premises shall be removed by the scavengers of the Local Board shall deposit the same in covered tubs, boxes, or other like receptacles of such shape and size as shall be approved in writing by the Chairman on the side of the street outside his premises at such hours daily as the Chairman shall from time to time appoint by notice duly given, and shall remove the said tubs, boxes, or other like receptacles within half an hour after the emptying of such tubs, boxes, or other like receptacles by the scavengers. No person shall place any ashes, sweepings, refuse, or other rubbish on any street, except in covered tubs, boxes, or other receptacles as aforesaid, or except at such hours as aforesaid.

(b) No person shall deposit ashes, rubbish, sewage, soil, dung, or filth at any place within the Local Board of Gampola, except in such places as the Chairman shall from time to time appoint.

(c) No person shall collect or remove, dirt, dust, ashes, rubbish, sewage, soil, dung, or filth from any street or public place within the Local Board of Gampola, unless he be authorized to do so in writing by the Chairman.

## "THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1897."

WHEREAS by Notification dated July 24, 1919, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 7,040 of July 25, 1919, the Police Headmen's divisions of Dodampahala East and West, in the Wellaboda pattu of the Mataia District, in the Southern Province, were proclaimed to be infected with cholera, and deemed to be a "diseased locality" within the meaning of regulation 1 of the regulations framed under the Ordinance No. 3 of 1897, and published in the *Government Gazette* dated July 31, 1914; and whereas cholera no longer exists within the said area, it is now declared free from cholera and to be no longer a "diseased locality."

This Notification shall take effect from August 9, 1919.

## "THE EXCISE ORDINANCE, NO. 8 OF 1912."

*Excise Notification No. 94.*

RULES made by the Governor in Executive Council under section 31 of "The Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912," as modified and confirmed by resolution of the Legislative Council on August 20, 1919.

## SCHEDULE.

*Rules for the Conduct of Voting by Ballot for or against the Existence of Arrack Taverns for the 1920-21 Rent Period.*

1. In these rules—

- (i.) The expression "area" means an area defined by a Government Agent or an Assistant Government Agent.
- (ii.) The expression "tax-paying inhabitants" means persons residing within an area who during the previous twelve months—
  - (a) Have been liable to perform labour upon the thoroughfares in this Colony as residents within such area;
  - (b) Have been certified to the local authority of such area as *bona fide* efficient soldiers of the Defence Force under section 26 (5) of Ordinance No. 8 of 1910.

NOTE.—The names of tax-paying inhabitants who have died in the interval between the preparation of the lists of such inhabitants and the recording of votes shall not be taken into consideration when determining the proportion of votes recorded to the number of road tax-paying inhabitants on the lists.

2. If it be shown to the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent and his Advisory Committee that 75 per cent. of the tax-paying inhabitants of an area served by one or more arrack taverns are opposed to the existence of an arrack tavern or taverns within such area, such arrack tavern or taverns shall be abolished for the 1920-21 rent period.

Voters shall have the power to vote only for or against the total abolition of arrack taverns, whichever they so desire, but they shall not have the power to vote for a reduction in the number of arrack taverns in any area.

3. Information as regards the boundaries or definitions of areas can be obtained from Kachcheries.

4. Objections to the existence of an arrack tavern or taverns in any particular area will be accepted by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent up to October 31, 1919, and not later, as for the 1920-21 rent period.

Provided that the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall not make any arrangements to record votes, unless it be shown to his satisfaction that the number of persons raising any such objection represents not less than 25 per cent. of the tax-paying inhabitants in that area.

Provided further, that such objection shall be made in writing, and that unless the person objecting to the existence of an arrack tavern or taverns adds against his name the number of his last road tax receipt, or the number of his last certificate of performance of labour, or in the case of a person exempted for military service, his rank, regimental number, and the unit to which he belongs, he will not be counted towards the 25 per cent. necessary to secure the ballot.

5. Where a Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent is satisfied that objections have been received on or before October 31, 1919, from 25 per cent. of the tax-paying inhabitants of any area against the existence of an arrack tavern or taverns within such area, the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall fix a date, time, and place at which votes will be recorded for the purpose of ascertaining whether 75 per cent. of such tax-paying inhabitants are opposed to the existence of such tavern or taverns, and shall give not less than twenty days' notice thereof. Provided that the place at which votes shall be recorded shall be within the said area, if such an arrangement is practicable or convenient.

6. Such notice shall be given by publication in one or more local newspapers, by fixing copies of the notice at the Kacheheri, the local Police Court, and the Village Tribunal within the jurisdiction of which the said area is situated, and at prominent places within the said area, and by beat of tom-tom, or such other method as the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall direct. The notice shall state the names of the villages comprised in the said area.

7. It shall be the duty of all division officers of the villages forming the said area to allow voters and any person or persons interested in the ballot to inspect the returns prepared by such division officers under sections 4 and 9 of the Ordinance No. 31 of 1884, and to take copies thereof.

8. The recording officer in charge of the ballot shall be the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent or some person deputed by him in writing, who shall preside at the ballot, and have power to decide all questions arising in connection with the ballot.

9. An agent accredited by the voters in the said area may be present during the progress of the ballot.

10. No person shall be entitled to vote unless he either—
- (a) Produces at the time of voting a receipt for road tax paid by him within the twelve months preceding the ballot as a resident within the area served by the tavern or taverns proposed to be abolished; or
  - (b) Has been certified during the said twelve months to the local authority as having performed the labour due by him under the Thoroughfares Ordinances and produces such certificate at the time of voting; or
  - (c) Has been certified during the said twelve months to the local authority as a *bona fide* efficient soldier of the Defence Force under section 26 (5) of Ordinance No. 8 of 1910, and produces such certificate at the time of voting.

11. The votes shall be counted as soon as possible after the close of the ballot, and the result declared immediately after it has been ascertained.

12. Only ballot papers in the form annexed hereto and issued by the recording officer shall be used in recording votes. Each ballot paper shall have a number printed on the back, and shall have a counterfoil with the same number printed on the face.

13. At the time of voting the ballot paper shall be marked on both sides with an official seal and delivered to the voter within the polling station, and a number corresponding to the number of the voter on the list of tax-paying inhabitants shall be marked on the counterfoil. A mark shall be placed in the list of tax-paying inhabitants against the number of the voter to denote that he has received a ballot paper, but so that it shall not indicate which particular ballot paper he received.

The voter shall record his vote by marking a cross X on the right-hand side of the ballot paper opposite the words "Abolition of existing arrack taverns" or "Retention of existing arrack taverns," as he may decide, and in no other way. He shall then fold it so as to conceal his vote, and place it in a closed box in the presence of the presiding officer, after having shown him the official mark. The presiding officer, on the application of any voter who states that he is unable to read, shall cause the vote of such voter to be marked on a ballot paper in manner directed by such voter, but he shall take such steps as will secure that no one but himself and the voter knows how such ballot paper was marked.

Ballot papers which do not comply with this rule shall not be considered in recording the votes.

14. No votes shall be recorded by proxy. All votes shall be given by the voters personally.

15. The Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall make all necessary arrangements for the ballot.

16. These rules shall not in any way apply to any arrack tavern which in the opinion of the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent mainly serves a population of Indian coolies.

SCHEDULE.

Rules for the Conduct of Voting by Ballot for or against the Existence of Foreign Liquor Taverns for the 1920-21 Licensing Period.

1. In these rules—
  - (i.) The expression “area” means an area defined by a Government Agent or an Assistant Government Agent.
  - (ii.) The expression “tax-paying inhabitants” means persons residing within an area who during the previous twelve months—
    - (a) Have been liable to perform labour upon the thoroughfares in this Colony as residents within such area;
    - (b) Have been certified to the local authority of such area as *bona fide* efficient soldiers of the Defence Force under section 26 (5) of Ordinance No. 8 of 1910.

NOTE.—The names of tax-paying inhabitants who have died in the interval between the preparation of the lists of such inhabitants and the recording of votes shall not be taken into consideration when determining the proportion of votes recorded to the number of road tax-paying inhabitants on the lists.

2. If it be shown to the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent and his Advisory Committee that 75 per cent. of the tax-paying inhabitants of an area served by one or more foreign liquor taverns are opposed to the existence of a foreign liquor tavern or taverns within such area, such foreign liquor tavern or taverns shall be abolished for the 1920-21 licensing period.



Voters shall have the power to vote only for or against the total abolition of foreign liquor taverns, whichever they so desire, but they shall not have the power to vote for a reduction in the number of foreign liquor taverns in any area.

3. Information as regards the boundaries or definitions of areas can be obtained from Kachecheries.

4. Objections to the existence of a foreign liquor tavern or taverns in any particular area will be accepted by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent up to October 31, 1919, and not later, as for the 1920-21 licensing period.

Provided that the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall not make any arrangements to record votes, unless it be shown to his satisfaction that the number of persons raising any such objection represents not less than 25 per cent. of the tax-paying inhabitants in that area.

Provided further, that such objection shall be made in writing, and that unless the person objecting to the existence of a foreign liquor taverns or taverns adds against his name the number of his last road tax receipt, or the number of his last certificate of performance of labour, or in the case of a person exempted for military service, his rank, regimental number, and the unit to which he belongs, he will not be counted towards the 25 per cent. necessary to secure the ballot.

5. Where a Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent is satisfied that objections have been received on or before October 31, 1919, from 25 per cent. of the tax-paying inhabitants of any area against the existence of a foreign liquor tavern or taverns within such area, the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall fix a date, time, and place at which votes will be recorded for the purpose of ascertaining whether 75 per cent. of such tax-paying inhabitants are opposed to the existence of such tavern or taverns, and shall give not less than twenty days' notice thereof. Provided that the place at which votes shall be recorded shall be within the said area, if such an arrangement is practicable or convenient.

6. Such notice shall be given by publication in one or more local newspapers, by fixing copies of the notice at the Kachecheri, the local Police Court, and the Village Tribunal within the jurisdiction of which the said area is situated, and at prominent places within the said area, and by beat of tom-tom, or such other method as the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall direct. The notice shall state the names of the villages comprised in the said area.

7. It shall be the duty of all division officers of the villages forming the said area to allow voters and any person or persons interested in the ballot to inspect the returns prepared by such division officers under sections 4 and 9 of the Ordinance No. 31 of 1884, and to take copies thereof.

8. The recording officer in charge of the ballot shall be the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent or some person deputed by him in writing, who shall preside at the ballot, and have power to decide all questions arising in connection with the ballot.

9. An agent accredited by the voters in the said area may be present during the progress of the ballot.

10. No person shall be entitled to vote unless he either—

- (a) Produces at the time of voting a receipt for road tax paid by him within the twelve months preceding the ballot as a resident within the area served by the tavern or taverns proposed to be abolished; or
- (b) Has been certified during the said twelve months to the local authority as having performed the labour due by him under the Thoroughfares Ordinances and produces such certificate at the time of voting; or
- (c) Has been certified during the said twelve months to the local authority as a *bona fide* efficient soldier of the Defence Force under section 26 (5) of Ordinance No. 8 of 1910, and produces such certificate at the time of voting.

11. The votes shall be counted as soon as possible after the close of the ballot, and the result declared immediately after it has been ascertained.

12. Only ballot papers in the form annexed hereto and issued by the recording officer shall be used in recording votes. Each ballot paper shall have a number printed on

the back, and shall have a counterfoil with the same number printed on the face.

13. ## VITAL STATISTICS.

## Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 16, 1919.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 68 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 32 Sinhalese, 8 Tamils, 12 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1919, viz., 285,795) was 12.4, as against 15.7 in the preceding week, 22.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.5 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 150 (2 Europeans, 10 Burghers, 84 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 23 Moors, 4 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27.4, as against 24.6 in the previous week, 19.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26.7 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 150 total deaths, 35 were of infants under one year of age, as against 24 in the preceding week, 12 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1 (a) Eighteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 4 in Kotahena, 2 in Pettah, 2 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Wellawatta, as against 14, 10, 21, and 14, respectively, in the four preceding weeks. The weekly average for last year was 27.

(b) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Maradana of a non-resident in hospital, and 1 in Kollupitiya, as against 6, 13, 11, and 5, respectively, in the four preceding weeks.

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, as against 5 in the previous week.

2 (a) Nine deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Maradana, 2 in Kotahena, 1 each in St. Paul's, Slave Island, and Wellawatta, as against 6 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths of residents of Colombo occurred at the Ragama Hospital from *Phthisis* during the week.

3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 each in Kotahena, New Bazaar, Maradana, Slave Island, and Wellawatta, as against 11 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered, 1 in St. Paul's and 1 in Maradana. There were no cases in the preceding week.

5. Sixteen deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 8 from *Dysentery*, 8 from *Worms*, 7 from *Enteritis*, 7 from *Debility*, 5 from *Diarrhoea*, 3 from *Tetanus*, and 56 from *Other Causes*.

6. Nine cases of *Measles* and 6 cases of *Chickenpox* were reported during the week, as against 7 and 6 respectively in the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 81.0°, against 79.3° in the preceding week and 81.4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.940 in., against 29.943 in. in the preceding week and 29.911 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.32 in., against 2.12 in. in the preceding week and 0.59 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

"Improvements in vacuum brake gear for railway rolling stock and the like."

*Abstract.*—The inventors state:—

The objects of our invention are (1) to reduce the cost of manufacture by eliminating the use of brass (which, amongst other objections, excites the cupidity of thieves) by reducing the number of air passages in the valve body or casting, and by avoiding the use of a special valve-spindle guide and other small parts; (2) to facilitate the removal of the contained valves and their seatings from the body for examination or renewal; and (3) to increase the efficiency of the valve, enabling the vacuum created to be maintained for a longer time than with valves at present in use, by avoiding the use of washers of leather, india rubber, or other perishable material.

The claims are:—

1. A valve body or casting for vacuum brakes characterized by the provision of only two air passages between the train pipe nozzle and the brake cylinder, one of the said passages communicating with the cylinder above the brake piston and the other below it.

2. In a valve body or casting for vacuum brakes, a release valve of conical shape normally pressed into a correspondingly shaped seating, said valve controlling the admission of air to the brake cylinder above the brake piston.

3. In a valve body or casting for vacuum brakes, an automatic non-return valve arranged in the air passage leading from the release valve to the brake cylinder above the piston, characterized by its being positioned within the train pipe nozzle and being readily removable therefrom.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, July 11, 1919.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated July 4, 1919.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of June 13, 1919, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of June 13, 1919, be confirmed.

2. (a) The Chairman read the following:—I am pleased to say that since the last Meeting of Council no case of plague has been recorded. The total for the year remains at 4, as compared with 65 cases for the same period in 1918 and 176 cases in 1917. The last case for the year occurred on March 17 in No. 39, St. John's road.

(b) The Chairman read the following report received from the Medical Officer of Health:—The death returns show a marked drop in the deaths last week from influenza, only 3 deaths being recorded, as against 16, 24, 29, 28 during the previous 4 weeks. 29 deaths were recorded from pneumonia, as against 14, 37, 51, and 54 during the previous 4 weeks. The death-rate from all causes is also—under existing conditions—satisfactory, as the following shows:—

W. Philips, B. W. Leefe, S. H. Wadia, and the Medical Officer of Health.

With the permission of Council he added the following words to the motion:—"And that the experiment be tried first in Wellawatta Ward as from August 1 next." Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded *pro forma*.

The Chairman commented on the motion and recounted the history of the rice crisis. He pointed out why the present depôt system had to be introduced and the impracticability of restoring the boutique system at present. He detailed the procedure with regard to securing of supplies from the granaries and transporting thrice by lorries to the various depôts. He said that eventually when supplies were larger and more constant there could be a reversion to the boutique system. He stated that he was as anxious as any one else to be rid of the responsibility of the depôt system, but could not advise any change at present, or the fixing of any particular date for such a change. When supplies justified the change, it would be made, and the system of sale by boutiques under the system suggested by the Member for Wellawatta Ward, or some modification of it would be tried.

Mr. B. W. Leefe, Mr. F. R. Senanayake, and Mr. C. P. Dias spoke on the subject.

Mr. H. L. de Mel rose to a point of order as to whether the resolution of Council can bind this Council as the Members are voluntary workers under the Deputy Food Controller, and not under the Chairman of the Council.

The Chairman ruled that such a resolution would amount to an expression of opinion.

The motion was put to the Meeting and it was declared *lost*.

4. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo had given notice of the following motion:—That in view of the uncertain duration of the food crisis in Ceylon, this Council do request the Government of Ceylon to make better provision for the more regular and more adequate supply of rice to the City population.

With the permission of Council he amended his motion with the addition of the words in italics, and moved as follows:—"That in view . . . . . and more adequate supply of rice *and other foodstuffs* to the City population." Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

Mr. F. R. Senanayake and Mr. A. E. de Silva supported the motion.

The Chairman stated that Government was fully alive to the situation, and was doing all it could to obtain as full supplies as possible from every possible source. The allotments were being made on a fair basis of calculation; those to the City were based on the population.

The motion was put to the Meeting and it was declared carried unanimously.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 5 to 10 (inclusive) on the Agenda, and also the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Sanitation and Markets and Finance (met together) on July 11, 1919. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

5-11. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Special and the Standing Committees, named, were then laid before the Council in Committee:—

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Committee re Revision of By-laws of May 21, 1919.*

Chapter XIII., By-laws re Markets.

(2) The Committee considered the general question with regard to the control by the Council over the issue of licenses for the sale of meat and fish. The Committee was of opinion that the Council should have the power of prohibiting the opening of shops for the sale of meat and fish in certain specified streets or areas, and recommended that the Council should request Government to amend the Ordinance if it is considered that the Council has not such power.

Resolved that the recommendation of the Special Committee be adopted.

*Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of March 26, 1919.*

(2) To consider the motion in Council of Mr. H. L. de Mel, C.B.E., on January 17, 1919, re the maintenance by the Council, free of any charge, of the graves of persons belonging to His Majesty's Forces, who were buried in the General Cemetery during the last four years.

The Committee regrets that, in its opinion, the provisions of the Ordinance do not empower the Council to undertake the charge.

*Resolution.*

With regard to above item (corresponding to item No. 1 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of June 30, 1919), resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committees be adopted.

*Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of June 30, 1919.*

(1) To consider the motion in Council of Mr. H. L. de Mel, C.B.E., on January 17, 1919, re the maintenance by the Council, free of any charge, of the graves of persons belonging to His Majesty's Forces, who were buried in the General Cemetery during the last four years.

In view of the opinion of the Law Committee, the Committee cannot recommend the taking up by the Council of this work of maintenance, but consider that the Cemetery-keeper and his staff should, as far as possible, look after such graves.

With regard to above item (corresponding to item No. 2 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of March 26, 1919), resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committees be adopted.

(4) To recommend, under section 18 (4) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915, the private street lines for Frances road, Wellawatta, as indicated in plan No. 1,440, dated June 5, 1919, and signed by the Works Engineer.—Recommended.

(5) To consider an application for 10 months leave from Mr. P. S. Fernando, Assistant Engineer, Buildings, Works Department.—Recommended that the leave be granted, subject to the decision of the Chairman as to the date of departure, which must depend upon the exigencies of the department.

(6) To consider a plan and an estimate of Rs. 1,182 from the Works Engineer for the erection of an additional kitchen and a closet for the Storekeeper's quarters at Suduwella.—Recommended.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

(6) To consider a proposal of the Medical Officer of Health re alteration of the boundaries of the Church of England portion of the Livermentu cemetery.—Recommended that the exchange in the portion be effected.

Daniel, sanctioned by Council on June 13, 1919, to consider further correspondence with Mr. Daniel *re* the rental.—Recommended that the yearly rent be reduced from Rs. 50 to Rs. 12, and that Mr. F. L. Daniel be required to undertake to surrender the land when required for Municipal purposes, and also to fence the land and keep it in order.

(15) To consider an application for 10 months leave from Mr. P. S. Fernando, Assistant Engineer, Buildings, Works Department.—Recommended that the leave be granted, subject to the decision of the Chairman as to the date of departure, which must depend upon the exigencies of the Department.

(17) To consider a plan and an estimate of Rs. 1,182 from the Works Engineer for the erection of an additional kitchen and a closet for the Storekeeper's quarters at Suduwella.—Recommended.

(19) To consider an estimate of Rs. 2,500 from the Works Engineer for the erection of a repair shed at Suduwella.—Recommended.

(20) To recommend the formation of a temporary rice distribution department to meet the present crisis, and to sanction (1) the employment of (a) Dépôt-keepers at Rs. 40 per mensem; (b) Assistant Dépôt-keepers at Rs. 20 per mensem; and (c) 2nd Assistant Dépôt-keepers at Rs. 15 per mensem for each dépôt that the Chairman may find it necessary to open. (2) The taking on rent of any premises needed as a dépôt. (3) The hiring of transport for carrying the rice to the dépôts. (4) The appointment of a shroff and such other clerks and assistant shroffs and assistants as may be found necessary.—Recommended.

The Chairman thanked the Elected Members for coming forward so willingly and assisting in looking after the dépôts in their Wards. He eulogized the splendid work they had done at great sacrifice of their time, and even of their professional work, which was recognized by everyone. He expressed his great appreciation of their services.

He also mentioned the keenness and devotion to duty of Mr. S. H. Wadia, the Financial Assistant, and said that the success of the system was due to his indefatigable work.

Resolved that the estimated expenditure of about Rs. 13,290 per month required for the rice distribution department be sanctioned, and that this department be subsidiary to the Finance Department.

The wish was expressed that the Chairman should convey to Mr. S. H. Wadia, the Financial Assistant, an expression of the Council's appreciation of his indefatigable work. This the Chairman agreed to do.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

#### Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Sanitation and Markets and Finance (meeting together) of July 11, 1919.

(1) To consider:—(a) The case of Mr. P. F. Toussaint, Keeper of the General Cemetery, in that he did, out of the sum of Rs. 3.60 given to each cooly as a special allowance by the Council, receive a sum of Rs. 1.60, in all Rs. 27, at instigation of Mr. A. Vanden Driesen, Head Clerk of the Public Health Department.

(a) The Committee was of opinion that Mr. P. F. Toussaint, should be called upon to resign.

(b) The case of Mr. A. Vanden Driesen, Head Clerk, Public Health Department, in that he induced Mr. P. F. Toussaint, Cemetery-keeper, to ask for and obtain from the coolies employed at the General Cemetery a sum of Rs. 27 as an illegal gratification on or about July 4, 1919, and for having received out of the said sum, a sum of Rs. 15 at the hands of Martin Costa, Peon, on the ground that he had been instrumental in obtaining the allowance for the coolies.

(b) Recommended that Mr. A. Vanden Driesen should be dismissed by the Council.

#### Resolution.

The Chairman stated that, when discussing questions of this nature, it was the usual practice for the public to retire. It was agreed that the public should not be asked to retire, but that the matter be discussed in open Council. The Chairman read the record of the proceedings of his inquiries.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committees be adopted.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Committee for the Peace Celebrations of July 7, 1919.*

(5) Recommended that the Council do vote such sum as may be required to supplement the Government grant, if any, so as to make up Rs. 3,000, which is estimated to be the cost of feeding the poor.

(6) Recommended that a sum of Rs. 2,000 be voted by Council to meet the cost of amusements for the children and for the distribution of sweets and fruits to children.

*Resolutions.*

With regard to item No. 6 the Chairman read a statement from the Acting Director of Education on the subject of amusements for the poor children, and gave particulars of the probable expenditure.

(1) Three cinema shows (a) from 11 A.M., 1½ hours, Rs. 75; (b) from 1 P.M., 1½ hours, Rs. 75; (c) from 3 P.M., 1½ hours, Rs. 75 = Rs. 225; three cinemas, Rs. 3. Total Rs. 675.

Resolved that the cinema performances be confined to the children attending vernacular schools and poor schools and childrens' institutes.

Resolved that the recommendation of the Special Committee be adopted, and that the vote be increased from Rs. 2,000 to Rs. 2,500 to include cost of transport.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do resume and that the resolutions of Council in Committee be adopted, as amended. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman formally moved, in Council, that the recommendations of the various Committees, subject to any amendments of such recommendations by the Council in Committee, be adopted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the leave referred to in items Nos. 11, 12, and 13 on the Agenda and re-numbered 12, 13, and 14 in the Minutes be sanctioned. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

12. To sanction excess leave of 32 days over 42 days granted to Mr. R. P. de Silva, Head Clerk, Secretariat, owing to ill-health.

13. To sanction excess leave of 8 days over 42 days granted to Mr. E. G. B. Calyanaratna, Divisional Inspector, Waterworks Department, owing to ill-health.

14. To sanction excess leave of 19 days over 42 days granted to Mr. A. M. H. Dias, Stock Inspector, Cattle Mart, owing to ill-health.

3. He will also be required to deposit money to pay the fees of Council for examining and giving his opinion on the title deeds of properties tendered by him as security, and for examining and settling the security bond, and the fees charged by the Council's proctor for examining documents and drawing the security bond, and also the expenses of appraising the properties and of registering the security bond.

4. All title deeds tendered as security should be accompanied by a certificate obtained from the Registrar of Lands that the lands to which they relate are unencumbered. This certificate must be obtained at the cost of the party offering the security.

5. The renter shall be bound to provide and maintain, at his own expense, sufficient boats and boats' crew at the said ferry, the seaworthiness of the boats and the number of the crew being subject to the approval of the Chairman, Municipal Council, exclusive of the pada boat provided and maintained by the Council; especially at Lewella and Halloluwa.

**MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.**

**Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on Saturday, June 14, 1919.**

THE Council met this day at 2 P.M., pursuant to notice dated June 9, 1919.

*Present* :—The Hon. Mr. R. B. Hellings, Chairman; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe; Dr. C. B. Lourensz; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. G. E. Abeywardene; and Mr. J. E. Perera.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on May 10, 1919, a copy thereof having been sent to each Councillor, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Mr. J. E. Perera asked permission to present a petition from the rate payers of Ward No. 3, regarding the present assessment of premises. Permission being given, the petition was read.

3. Mr. J. E. Perera, who had given notice of two motions, asked permission to withdraw the first of them.

Permission having been granted, the motion was withdrawn, viz. :—"That owing to the distress prevailing in the town by reason of the war, the assessment taxes for the current year be increased, where necessary, to the extent of 25 per cent. only over the previous year."

4. Mr. J. E. Perera, pursuant to notice, moved :—"That a sum of Rs. 2,500 be set apart for the purpose of relieving distress in the town in the event of the influenza epidemic taking a serious form, and that permission of His Excellency the Governor be obtained therefor." Mr. G. E. Abeywardene seconded.

The Chairman suggested that the motion be amended by deleting the words "in the event of the influenza epidemic taking a serious form," and substituting therefor the words "due to the present scarcity of rice and the high prices of foodstuffs generally."

Mr. Perera accepted the suggested amendment, and with the consent of the seconder, amended his motion to read as follows :—"That a sum of Rs. 2,500 be set apart for the purpose of relieving distress in the town due to the present scarcity of rice and the high prices of foodstuffs generally." The motion in its amended form was carried.

5. Letter No. 247/9,463 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary authorizing the Director of Public Works to pull down the partly erected building on the ramparts which was intended to serve as the residence of the flagstaff signalling officer, and to restore the site to its former condition.—Read.

Mr. C. E. de Vos moved, and Mr. G. E. Abeywardene seconded, the following resolution :—"That the Council desires to record its gratitude to His Excellency the Governor for the prompt action taken to preserve the beauty of the town; and that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Hon. the Colonial Secretary for His Excellency's information."

6. To submit the annual report of the Colonial Auditor on the accounts of the Municipality for the year 1918.—Submitted.

7. To consider petitions from certain rate payers of Wards Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 5, regarding the assessment of properties.

The Chairman moved Council into Committee.

When Council resumed, the Chairman moved "that the petitioners be informed that the rates must be levied on the present appraisal for the current year. Any objection to the valuation will be dealt with according to law. In the case of objections being upheld after payment of the rates, a refund of the surplus will be made." Mr. D. W. Subasinghe seconded.—Carried.

(Dr. C. B. Lourensz left at this stage of the proceedings.)

9.—*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works, Finance and Assessment, and the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation (meeting together) of June 14, 1919.*

(1) To consider (a) the purchase at Rs. 1,000 of the latrine built by the Chetties at Kaluwella to be used as a public latrine; (b) estimate of Rs. 800 for making the necessary alterations to the latrine.—Recommended that the latrine be purchased for Rs. 1,000, and the necessary alterations effected.

(2) Estimate for temporary repairs to the slaughter-house, Rs. 30, and to consider the question of building a new slaughter house.—Recommended that the repairs be effected; but that the construction of a new slaughter-house be deferred till cement becomes cheaper than it is at present.

(3) To consider proposed sites for public latrines at Dewata, Wellaboda, and Mahamodera, with a view to their acquisition.—Recommended that consideration be postponed till the next meeting to enable the Ward Members to inspect the sites with the Medical Officer of Health.

(4) To consider the acquisition of 3½ acres of land at Bataduwa for the extension of the night soil depôt.—Recommended that the Government Agent be asked to have the land surveyed with a view to its acquisition.

(5) To consider the employment of a responsible caretaker for the Municipal cart shed, on an initial salary of Rs. 17·50 per mensem.—Recommended that a responsible caretaker, on a salary of Rs. 17·50, be employed; and that the cart shed be under the control of the Superintendent of Works.

10.—*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of June 14, 1919.*

(1) To consider what fees should be charged for sign boards fixed at right angles to the side of a street. Postponed for inquiry as to how the Colombo Municipal Council interprets the by-law.

(2) To consider draft by-laws for the regulation of public performances within the Municipal limits. Postponed; draft by-laws to be circulated.

*Resolution.*

## ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE JAFFNA AGRICULTURAL COMPANY, LIMITED.

## REGULATIONS.

THE regulations contained in Table C in the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861." shall not apply to this Company, which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Articles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolution.

## BUSINESS.

2. The Company shall proceed to carry on business as soon after the registration thereof as the Directors shall think fit; and notwithstanding that the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, or applied for, or allotted, they shall do so as soon as, in the judgment of the Directors, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed, or applied for, or allotted.
3. The business of the Company shall be carried on by, or under the management or direction of, the Directors, and subject only to the control of General Meetings in accordance with these regulations.

## SHARES.

4. The shares shall be under the control of the Directors, who may allot or otherwise dispose of the same to such persons, on such terms and conditions, and at such times, as the Directors think fit.
5. Every person taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof by writing under his hand in such form as the Directors from time to time specify.
6. The Company shall, before making any calls upon the Shareholders in respect of moneys due from them on their shares, give one month's notice at least of each such call, by publication in one or more of the local papers, and by serving written notice thereof in manner hereinafter prescribed.
7. If on or before the day appointed for payment any Shareholder does not pay the amount due from him, then such Shareholder shall be liable to pay interest for the same at the rate of 12 per cent. per annum from the date of default till the time of payment in full of such amount.
8. The shares shall be allotted at the discretion of and by the Directors, who may from time to time issue any unissued shares, and may add to such shares such an amount of premium as they may consider proper.
9. Shares may be registered in the name of a firm, and any partner of the firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm shall be entitled to vote and get proxies.
10. Shares may be registered in the name of two or more persons not in partnership.
11. In case of death of any one or more joint-holders of any share, the survivor or survivors shall be the only person or persons recognized by the Company as having any title to, or interest in, such shares.
12. The joint-holders of a share shall be severally as well as jointly liable for the payment of all instalments and call due in respect of such share.
13. Each Shareholder shall be liable to pay the amount of calls made on him to the person, and at the time and at the place appointed by the Directors.
14. A call shall be deemed to have been made at that time when the resolution of the Directors authorizing such call was passed.
15. If several persons are joint-holders of any share, any one of such persons may give effectual receipts for any dividend payable in respect of such shares.
16. The certificate of title to shares shall be issued under the seal of the Company and signed by two Directors and the Secretary, or in such other manner as the Directors shall prescribe.

17. Every Shareholder shall be entitled, on payment of 50 cents, to one certificate for all shares registered in his own name, specifying the share or shares held by him and the amount paid up thereon.
18. If such certificate is worn out or lost it may be re-executed on payment of 50 cents.
19. No person shall exercise any rights of a Shareholder until his name shall have been entered in the Register of Shareholders, and he shall have paid all moneys payable for the time being on every share held by him.

## TRANSFER OF SHARES.

20. Any Shareholder may, with the consent of the Directors previously obtained, transfer all or any of his shares. The instrument of such transfer shall be in writing, signed both by the transferor and the transferee. And the transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of the share until the name of the transferee is entered in the Register.
21. The Board may, at their absolute and uncontrolled discretion, decline to register any transfer of any share by a Shareholder who is indebted to the Company, or upon whose shares the Company has a lien or otherwise; or in the case of shares not fully paid up to any person not approved by them; in no case shall a Shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the Directors to state the reasons of their refusal to register, but their declination shall be absolute.
22. The instrument of transfer shall be presented to the Company accompanied by such evidence as they may require to prove the title of the transferor, and thereupon the Company shall register the transferee as a Shareholder.
23. The Transfer Books shall be closed during the fourteen days immediately preceding the Ordinary General Meetings in each year.
24. The executors, administrators, or heirs of a deceased Shareholder shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to his share. Provided, however, that the heirs of a deceased Shareholder shall not be recognized as a Shareholder unless letters of administration be taken to the estate of the said deceased Shareholder if the law so requires.
25. Any person becoming entitled to a share in consequence of the death, or bankruptcy, or insolvency of any Shareholder, or in consequence of the marriage of any female Shareholder, or in any way other than transfer, may be registered as a Shareholder upon such evidence being produced as may from time to time be required by the Company.

## CALLS.

26. The Directors may, from time to time, make such calls as they think fit upon the Shareholders in respect of all moneys unpaid on their shares, and not by the conditions of allotment made payable at fixed times; provided that two months' notice at least shall be given to the Shareholders of the time and place appointed for payment of each call; and each Shareholder shall pay the amount of every call so-made to the persons and at the same time and place appointed by the Directors.
27. If any Shareholder fails to pay any call or instalments due from him on the appointed day, the Company may, at any time thereafter, during such time as the amount remains unpaid, serve notice on him requiring him to pay such amount, together with any interest that may have accrued by reason of such non-payment.
28. The notice shall name a further date and a place or places on and at which such money to be paid. It shall further state that in the event of non-payment at the time and place appointed the share in respect of which such money is due is liable to be forfeited.
29. If the requisitions of any such notice are not complied with, any share in respect of which such notice has been given may, at any time thereafter, be forfeited by the resolution of the Directors to that effect.
30. Any share so far forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may be disposed of in such manner as the Company thinks fit.
31. Any Shareholder whose share has been forfeited shall, notwithstanding, be liable to pay to the Company all moneys owing upon such shares at the time of forfeiture.

## CAPITAL.

32. The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company previously given in General Meetings, increase its capital by the creation of new shares.
33. Any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original, and shall be subject to the same provisions in all respects, whether with reference to the payment of calls or otherwise, as if it had been part of the original capital.

## MEETINGS.

34. The first General Meeting shall be held at such times not being more than twelve months after the incorporation of the Company, and at such places as the Directors may determine.
35. Subsequent General Meetings may be held at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, and if not so prescribed, then at such time and place in the month of April in each year as the Directors shall determine.
36. The General Meetings mentioned in the last preceding clauses shall be called Ordinary General Meetings; all other meetings of the Company shall be called Extraordinary General Meetings.
37. The Directors may, whenever they think fit, call an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, and the Directors shall also do so upon a requisition made in writing by not less than one-fifth of the number of the Shareholders of the Company for the time being, or by any Shareholder or Shareholders holding in the aggregate one-fifth part of the shares of the Company for the time being subscribed for.
38. Any requisition so made shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called, shall be addressed to the Directors, and shall be sent to the registered office of the Company. Upon the receipt of such requisition the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting to be held at such time and place as they shall determine. If they do not proceed to convene the same within twenty-one days from the delivery of the requisition, the requisitionists may themselves convene an Extraordinary General Meeting to be held at such time and place as the Shareholders convening the meeting may themselves fix.
39. Any Shareholder may on giving not less than fourteen days previous notice of any resolution submit the same to the meetings.
40. Such notice shall be given by leaving a copy of the resolution at the registered office of the Company.
41. Twenty-one days notice at least, specifying the place and hour of meeting, and the purpose to which any General Meeting is to be held, shall be given by advertisement in any local newspaper or in such other manner, if any, as may be prescribed by the Company.
42. No business shall be transacted at any meeting, except the declaration of dividend, unless a quorum of Shareholders is present at the commencement of such business, and such quorum shall be ascertained as follows: *i.e.*, if the Shareholders belonging to the Company at the time of the meeting do not exceed twenty in number, the quorum shall be ten; if they exceed twenty, there shall be added to the above quorum one for every additional ten Shareholders, with this limitation that no quorum shall in any case exceed forty.
43. If within one hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of Shareholders is not present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of Shareholders, shall be dissolved. In any other case it shall stand adjourned

to the following day at the same time and place; and if at such adjourned meeting the required number of Shareholders is not present, it shall be adjourned *sine die*.

44. The Chairman, if any, of the Board of Directors shall preside as Chairman at every meeting of the Company. If there be no such Chairman, or at any meeting he is not present, the Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of the meeting.

45. The Chairman may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place.

46. At any General Meeting, unless a poll is demanded by at least five Shareholders, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the Book of Proceedings of the Company, shall be sufficient evidence of the fact, without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded for or against such resolution.

47. If a poll is demanded in manner aforesaid, the same shall be taken in such manner as the Chairman directs, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

48. Every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him.

49. If any Shareholder is a minor, lunatic, idiot, or prodigal he may vote by the person legally appointed to the charge and administration of his property.

50. If two or more persons are jointly entitled to a share or shares, the person whose name stands first in the Register of the Shareholders as one of the holders of such share or shares and no other shall be entitled to vote in respect of the same.

51. No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote at any meeting, unless all moneys due from him to the Company are paid.

52. Votes may be given either personally or by proxy. A proxy shall be appointed in writing under the hand of the appointer, or if such appointer is a corporation under their common seal, and shall have affixed thereto a stamp of such values as shall in law be requisite.

53. No person shall be appointed proxy who is not a Shareholder, and the instrument appointing him shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than twenty-four hours before the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote; but no such instrument shall be valid after the expiration of three months from the date of its execution.

#### DIRECTORS.

54. Until otherwise determined by a General Meeting the number of Directors shall not be less than seven or exceed fifteen.

55. The qualifications of a Director shall be the holding of five shares, or the obtaining of the votes of person or persons holding twenty shares in the aggregate.

56. The first Directors shall be Messrs. K. V. Marcandan, Renter and Merchant; A. Sithamparanathapillai, Notary Public; A. Vyrarnuttu; S. R. Rasaratnam, Advocate; S. Sittampalam, Proctor, Supreme Court; S. R. Muttiah; C. A. V. Muttiah; V. R. Thambirajah; and N. Subramaniam, Landed Proprietor; and W. Supramaniam, Planter; A. Mudr. Velupillai, Proctor, and they shall hold office, except in the event of becoming disqualified, until the first Ordinary General Meeting of the Company.

57. Any casual vacancy in the Board may be filled up by the vote, but any person so chosen shall hold office only until the next Annual General Meeting.

58. As remuneration for their services the Directors shall be entitled to receive out of the funds of the Company such annual sums as may be voted by the Shareholders in General Meeting. Such remuneration shall be exclusive of any sum paid by way of salary or remuneration to any Managing Director or Directors, and shall be divided among the Director as they may determine.

59. The office of a Director shall be vacated—

- (1) If he ceases to hold the number of shares qualifying him for the office.
- (2) If by notice in writing to the Company he resigns office.
- (3) If he becomes insolvent.
- (4) If he is found lunatic or become of unsound mind.

60. The Company may, by special resolution, remove any Director, before the expiration of his term of office, and appoint another Shareholder in his stead.

61. At every Ordinary Meeting of the Company, the whole of the Directors shall retire from office, but they shall be eligible for re-election.

62. The Directors may, from time to time, appoint one or more of their body to be Managing Director or Directors of the Company, with such powers as the Directors may think fit to confer on him or them, either for any fixed term or without any limitation as to the period for which he is to hold such office, and may, subject to any contract between him and the Company, from time to time remove or dismiss him and appoint another in his place. The remuneration of the Managing Director shall be fixed by the Directors, and may be by way of salary, commission, percentage, or participation in profits, or by any or all of these modes.

63. The Directors may meet together for despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings as they think fit, and may determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business; and until otherwise determined, five shall form a quorum.

64. A Director may, and the Secretary at the request of any Director shall, at any time convene a meeting of the Directors. Questions arising at any meeting of the Directors shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the Directors present, and in case of equality of votes, the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

65. The Directors may elect a Chairman of the meeting, and may determine the period for which he shall hold office. If such Chairman has not been appointed, or if he is not present at the time appointed for a meeting, the Directors present shall choose some one of those present to be Chairman of such meeting.

66. The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in a book or books provided for and solely used for that purpose:—

- (1) Of all appointment of officers made by the Directors.
- (2) Of the names of Directors present at each meeting of Directors.
- (3) Of all orders made by the Directors.
- (4) Of all resolutions and proceedings of the meetings of the Company and of the Directors. And any such minute as aforesaid, if signed by any person purporting to be the Chairman of any meeting of Directors, shall be receivable in evidence without any further proof.

67. A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted.

68. The Directors may delegate any of their powers to Committees consisting of such Shareholder or Shareholders of their body as they think fit, and may revoke the appointment of any such Committee. Any Committee so formed shall, in the exercise of powers so delegated, conform to any regulations that may, from time to time, be imposed on it by the Directors.

69. The meetings and proceedings of any such Committee consisting of two or more Shareholders shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meeting of Directors so far as the same are applicable thereto and are not superseded by the express terms of the appointment of the Committee or by any such regulations as aforesaid.

#### DIVIDEND.

70. The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, declare a dividend to be paid to the Shareholders in proportion to their shares.

71. No dividend shall be payable except out of the profits arising from the business of the Company and with the sanction of the Directors.

72. The Directors may, before recommending any dividend, set aside out of the profits of the Company such sum as they think proper as a reserve fund to meet contingencies, or for equalizing dividends, or for repairing or maintaining the works connected with the business of the Company or any part thereof, and the Directors may invest the sum so set apart as a reserve fund upon such security as they may, with the sanction of the Company, select.

73. The Directors may deduct from the dividends payable to any Shareholder all such sums of money as may be due from him to the Company on account of calls or otherwise.

74. No dividend shall bear interest as against the Company.

75. Notice of any dividend that may have been declared shall be given to each Shareholder, or sent by post or otherwise to his registered place of abode; and all dividends unclaimed for three years, after having been declared, may be forfeited by the Directors for the benefit of the Company.

76. The Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the moneys received and expended by the Company, and all matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place, and of the property, assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company. But no Shareholder shall have any right to insist on the inspection of any account book or document of the Company except as conferred by the Ordinance, or authorized by the Directors, or by a resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

#### ACCOUNTS.

77. Once at least in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company in General Meeting a statement of the income and expenditure of the Company for the past year made up to a date not more than three months before each meeting.

78. The statement so made shall show, arranged under the most convenient heads, the amount of gross income distinguishing the several sources from which it had been derived, and the amount of gross expenditure distinguishing the expense of the establishment, salaries, and other matters.

79. Every item of expenditure fairly chargeable against the year's income shall be brought into account, so that a just balance of the profit and loss may be laid up before the meeting; and in cases where any item of expenditure which may in fairness be distributed over several years has been incurred in any one year, the whole amount of such item shall be stated, with the addition of the reasons why only a portion of such expenditure is charged against the year.

80. At the Ordinary Meeting in each year the Directors shall lay before the Company a balance sheet containing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company.

81. A printed sheet of such balance sheet shall, twenty-one days previously to such meeting, be delivered or sent by post to the address of every Shareholder.

#### AUDIT.

82. The accounts of the Company shall be examined, and the correctness of the balance sheet ascertained by one or more Auditors to be elected by the Company in General Meeting.

83. The remuneration of the Auditors shall be fixed by the Company at the time of their election.

84. If any casual vacancy occurs in the office of Auditors, the Directors shall forthwith call an Extraordinary General Meeting for the purpose of supplying the same.

85. The Directors shall appoint the first Auditors to audit the accounts of the Company until the first Ordinary General Meeting, and fix the remuneration payable to them.

86. Every Auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto.

87. Every Auditor shall have a list delivered to him of all the books kept by the Company, and he shall at all reasonable times have access to the books and accounts of the Company. He may, at the expenses of the Company, employ accountants or other persons to assist him in investigating such accounts, and he may in relation to such accounts examine the Directors or any other officer of the Company.

88. The Auditors shall make a report to the Shareholders upon the balance sheet and accounts, and in every such report they shall state whether, in their opinion, the balance sheet is full and fair containing the particulars required by these regulations, and properly drawn up so as to exhibit a true and correct view of the state of the Company's affairs; and in case they have called for explanations or information from the Directors, whether such explanations or information have been given by the Directors, and whether they have been satisfactory; and such reports shall be read, together with the report of the Directors at the Ordinary General Meeting.

#### NOTICES.

89. Notices requiring to be served by the Company upon the Shareholders may be served either personally, or by leaving the same, or sending them through the post, at their registered places of abode.

90. Every Shareholder shall give an address which shall be deemed his place of abode, and shall be registered as such in the books of the Company.

91. Any notice sent by post shall be deemed to have been served at the time when the letter concerning same is posted, and in proving such service, it should be sufficient to prove that the letter containing the notice was properly addressed and put in a Post Office box or handed in at a Post Office.
