WHEREAS His Majesty the King has power to make laws for the peace, order, and good government of His Majesty's Colony of Ceylon:

And whereas by the Coinage (Ceylon) Order, 1892, a law was made respecting the coins which were to be the subject of contract and to constitute legal tender in His Majesty's said Colony:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Order with respect to the millesimal fineness and remedy allowance in respect of certain of the subsidiary coins specified in the Third Schedule to the said Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of all powers vested in His Majesty in that behalf, doth hereby ordain and declare as follows:—

1. (1) 550 shall be substituted for 800 in the fourth column of the Third Schedule to the Coinage (Ceylon) Order, 1892, as the millesimal fineness of Ceylon fifty-cent, twenty-five cent, and ten-cent pieces coined after such date as may be fixed by the Governor of the Colony by Proclamation.

(2) 5 shall be substituted for 3 in the last column of the said Third Schedule as the corresponding remedy allowance for those coins.

2. The Governor of the Colony may, by Proclamation made with the approval of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury and one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, declare that Ceylon fifty-cent, twenty-five cent, and ten-cent pieces coined up to and including such date as may have been fixed by Proclamation under sub-section (1) of section 1 of this Order shall cease to be legal tender, notwithstanding anything in the Coinage (Ceylon) Order, 1892, and the Orders amending that Order.

3. The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order, as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

4. This Order may be cited as the Coinage (Ceylon) Order, 1919, and shall be construed as one with the Coinage (Ceylon) Order, 1892, and the Orders amending that Order; and the Coinage (Ceylon) Order, 1892, the Orders in Council of the 28th day of June, 1892, and the 17th day of July, 1893, amending that Order, the Coinage

(Ceylon) Amendment Order in Council, 1901, the Ceylon (Coinage) Order, 1909, and this Order may be cited together as the Coinage (Ceylon) Orders, 1892 to 1919.

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury and the Right Honourable Viscount Milner, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the requisite directions for causing this Order to be proclaimed in His Majesty's said Colony.

"THE CEYLON RAILWAYS ORDINANCE, 1902."

RULE made by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice of the Executive Council, under section 5 of the above-named Ordinance:—

Rule 49 (b) of the rules for the conveyance of goods traffic framed under the above-named Ordinance, and published in the *Government Gazette* of October 11, 1907, shall be amended by the addition of the following proviso immediately at the end of paragraph (b) of the proviso to the said rule 49 (b):—

Provided further that buffaloes shall be conveyed by railway between stations not less than one hundred miles apart at half the aforesaid rate during the period of one year from September 1, 1919, on production of a certificate from a Government Agent, Assistant Government Agent, or Chief Headman that the buffaloes for which transport by railway at the reduced rate is claimed are *bona fide* required for agricultural purposes and not for slaughter.

All firewood immediately after conversion to be transported to the seashore and thence by boats to Jaffna Customs, loaded into carts and taken to Jaffna Depôt, weighing and stacked in the Jaffna Depôt in such a manner as the Depôt-keeper may direct at a minimum rate of 100 tons per mensem from October 1, 1919, to May 15, 1920. VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 23, 1919.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 111 (2 Europeans, 10 Burghers, 63 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 10 Moors, 8 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1919, viz., 285,795) was 20.3, as against 12.4 in the preceding week, 19.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 127 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 63 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 16 Moors, 8 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 23.2, as against 27.4 in the previous week, 19.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 127 total deaths, 25 were of infants under one year of age, as against 35 in the preceding week, 24 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—(a) Thirteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana (including 4 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in Kotahena, and 3 in Slave Island, as against 18, 14, 10, and 21, respectively, in the four preceding weeks. The weekly average for last year was 27.

(b) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in St. Paul's, 1 in Maradana of a non-resident in hospital, and 1 in Slave Island, as against 4, 6, 13, and 11, respectively, in the four preceding weeks.

(c) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, as against 2 in the previous week.

2. Nine deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Maradana, (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in Wellawatta, 1 each in Kotahena, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya, same as in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

3. Seven deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 each in Slave Island, Wellawatta, and Maradana (of non-residents in hospitals), and 1 in New Bazaar, as against 5 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Smallpox* of a fireman on board the ss. "Clan Matheson" occurred at Infectious Diseases Hospital, Wellawatta, as against nil in the preceding week.

5. Eight deaths from *Diarrhoea* were registered, 8 from *Debility*, 5 from *Dysentery*, 4 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 3 from *Tetanus*, 2 from *Worms*, 1 from *Enteritis* and 58 from *Other Causes*.

6. Seven cases of *Measles* and 7 of *Chickenpox* were reported during the week, as against 9 and 6 respectively in the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.3°, against 81.0° in the preceding week and 81.5° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.951 in., against 29.940 in. in the preceding week and 29.895 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.68 in., against 0.32 in. in the preceding week and 0.65 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

2. The lessee shall not during the term aforesaid sublet or lease any portion of the said plantation or premises, and shall not erect or construct any temporary or permanent buildings upon the said premises, or open any road through the premises, except with the previous consent in writing of the lessor. Surveying and Levelling Examination.

THE examination for the Surveyor-General's license in surveying and levelling (Ordinance No. 26 of 1909) will be held in two parts, written and practical. The written examination will begin on October 13 and the practical examination on November 10, 1919.

2. The centres for the written examination will be Colombo, Galle, Kurunegala, Kandy, Badulla, Diyatalawa, Ratnapura, Batticaloa, Anuradhapura, and Jaffna; and for the practical examination Colombo only.

3. To enter for the above examination application must be made on the form prescribed by the regulations. These forms can be obtained from the Surveyor-General.

4. Candidates must pay the following fees to the Surveyor-General before the date of closing entries:—

5. The subjects of the written examination are:—

- English composition;
- Algebra (including quadratic equations, the theory of indices and logarithms);
- Geometry (theorems and problems on the following: angles at a point; parallel straight lines; side and angle properties of triangles and parallelograms; areas of triangles and quadrilaterals; the chord, angle, and tangent properties of the circle; the properties of the right angled triangle; proportion; similar triangles);
- Plane Trigonometry (including the solution of triangles and the use of logarithmic and trigonometrical tables);
- Mensuration (of areas and solids);
- Surveying; and
- Levelling.

In order to pass candidates must score not less than 40 marks per cent. in each of subjects (a) to (e), and not less than 50 marks per cent. in aggregate; and in subjects (f) and (g) not less than 60 marks per cent.

6. Candidates in surveying only will be required to take only subjects (a) to (f), inclusive; and candidates in levelling only, subject (g) only.

7. Candidates who fail in the written examination will not be required to present themselves for the practical examination.

8. Candidates who pass in the written examination will be duly notified of the time and place of the practical examination, which will comprise the following:—

Surveying.

(a) *Field Work*.—The adjustments of the theodolite, theodolite surveying, and curve ranging.

(b) *Office Work*.—Plotting, plan drawing, and the computation of areas.

Levelling.

(a) *Field Work*.—The adjustments of the level, flying levels, longitudinal and cross sections.

(b) *Office Work*.—Plotting of sections and computation of earthwork.

9. All candidates must provide their own instruments, poles, pickets, coolies, drawing boards and materials, stationery, &c., and no assistance in providing any requirements will be given in any way.

ABSTRACTS OF SEASON REPORTS.

SEASON REPORTS FOR THE MONTH OF JULY, 1919.

WESTERN PROVINCE.

COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Maha season : in almost in all the korales the fields are being prepared for the maha season.

Yala season : in some districts the plants are now ripe, and elsewhere they are thriving well.

Other products : prospects of coconuts are fairly good. The estimated crop for the month is 16,739,479 nuts. Fruits and vegetables are to be had in fair quantity.

Prices of staple products : (a) imported rice is sold according to controlled prices ; (b) coconuts are sold at Rs. 70 to Rs. 80 per 1,000.

Harvest prospect : generally good.

Rainfall : there was sufficient rain during the month.

Health of inhabitants : good, except for a few cases of enteric and malarial fever. Influenza is reported to be prevalent to some extent in Alutkuru korale north.

Health of cattle : fair. A few cases of rinderpest at Nawala and Kirillapone in Colombo Mudaliyar's division, Ihala Biyanwila, Makola South, and Daranagama in Siyane korale west, Timbirigasyaya, Wattala, and Nagoda in Alutkuru korale south, Kandawala in Alutkuru korale north, and Battaramulla, Mulleriyawa, Himbutana, Akarawita, and Hanywella Pahala in Hewagam korale. In all these cases the necessary precautionary measures have been adopted to check the spread of the disease.

KALUTARA DISTRICT.

Paddy : the yala paddy crops which were promising well were damaged in the ear by unseasonable rain. The harvest prospects are therefore not so good as anticipated.

The fields in the Waddu badda, which were ready for maha cultivation, have gone under water.

Dry grain : kurakkan at Galtude in the Panadure badda is thriving well. A considerable area of land has been leased for cultivation of foodstuffs, including dry grains, conditional on reforestation with jak ; the results will not be apparent for some months.

Other products : fruits and vegetables are scarce. The supply of yams and vegetables in the totamunes is fair. Manioc and other yams are grown largely throughout the district on lands specially leased for cultivation of foodstuffs. The flowering of coconut trees was fair. The crop of the month is estimated at 3,550,000 nuts.

Prices of staple products : imported rice was sold at controlled prices. Country rice was not available for sale. Coconuts sold at Rs. 50 to Rs. 100 per 1,000.

Remarks on harvest prospects generally : a moderate harvest can be expected.

Rainfall : total, 10.68 in. ; average, 34 in.

Health of people : good. Some cases of fever, influenza, and dysentery existed in the totamunes.

Health of cattle : good.

CENTRAL PROVINCE.

KANDY DISTRICT.

Rainfall : Nuwara Eliya town, 18.44 in.

Paddy : yala cultivation fields in the district are being ploughed and sown.

Dry grains : no work in chenas.

Health of cattle : there were 34 cases of rinderpest in Udagama, Kotmale, out of which 30 died and 2 recovered.

Agriculture : yala reaping in progress. Prospects good, except in Kandaboda pattu and Wellaboda pattu.

Health of people : satisfactory, except for a few sporadic cases of cholera.

Health of cattle : hoof-and-mouth disease prevailed.

Food supply : rice, Rs. 9 to Rs. 10 per bushel ; paddy, Rs. 4 per bushel ; coconuts, Rs. 75 per 1,000. Rice scarce.

HAMBANTOTA DISTRICT.

Paddy cultivation : yala crops three months old ; prospects favourable.

Fine grain : chena clearing for maha has commenced.

Coconuts : condition of flowers and nuts fair ; price Rs. 9 per 100.

Palmyras : fruits ripening ; crop moderate.

Prices of staple articles : paddy, Rs. 3.50 per bushel ; rice, Rs. 7.50 per bushel ; pairu, Rs. 10 per bushel ; varaku, Rs. 2.50 per bushel ; salt, 4 cents per pound and 10 cents per measure.

Health of people : good.

Health of cattle : a few cases of rinderpest reported from Karampan division.

MANNAR DISTRICT.

Rainfall : nil.

Wind : south-west.

Paddy : kalapokam paddy stacks are still being threshed. There has been a little idaipokam in the Wannu ; crop satisfactory. Sirupokam in the Giant's tank area : plants are in various stages of growth.

Coconuts : condition normal. The drought is somewhat adversely affecting the trees in some localities.

Palmyras : in fruit.

Health of people and cattle : satisfactory.

Prices of foodstuffs : rice, Rs. 5.76 to Rs. 6.40 per bushel ; paddy, Rs. 2 to Rs. 2.25 per bushel ; coconuts, Rs. 6 to Rs. 10 per 100.

MULLAITTIVU DISTRICT.

Prospects of paddy harvests : kalapokam crop has been threshed in many places ; idaipokam crop is being reaped ; sirupokam paddy is ripening.

Dry grains : chenas for kurakkan are being cleared in many villages.

Other products—(a) coconuts : prospects and bearing of coconuts are satisfactory ; (b) tobacco : tobacco crop is being sold at satisfactory prices ; (c) vegetables : not many available owing to dry weather.

Prices of staple products : paddy, Rs. 2.75 to Rs. 3 per bushel; rice, Rs. 6.50 to Rs. 7 per bushel; kurakkan, Rs. 4 to Rs. 6 per bushel; coconuts, Rs. 8 to Rs. 10 per 100 nuts.

Rainfall: a few slight showers of rain fell during the month.

Harvest prospects generally: satisfactory.

Health of inhabitants: fair; malarial fever, pneumonia, and chest cold prevailed in some places.

Health of cattle: good; pasture good; no disease.

EASTERN PROVINCE.

BATTICALOA DISTRICT.

Paddy: threshing of munmari crops is almost over. Kalavellanmai crops are being threshed in some divisions. Outturn satisfactory, excepting in some tracts in the south, where the crops were partly damaged by caterpillar pest.

Dry grain and other chena crops: nil.

Coconuts: prospects not satisfactory, as the trees have not yet recovered from the effects of the last year's drought, and in some estates from the damage caused by caterpillar pest.

Prices of staple products: paddy, from Re. 1.60 to Rs. 2 per bushel; kurakkan, from Re. 1 to Rs. 4 per bushel; Indian corn, from Rs. 2 to Rs. 5 per bushel.

Rainfall: 0.10 in. in 1918; 2.99 in. in 1919.

Health of inhabitants: satisfactory. There were a few stray cases of influenzal fever in some divisions.

Health of cattle: satisfactory.

TRINCOMALEE DISTRICT.

Rainfall: seasonable.

Paddy: threshing at Andankulam in town gravets and Kaddukkulam East and ploughing at Chempianar are going on. Reaping of paddy has been started in Koddiyar pattu. Pinnari cultivation in Tamblegam promises a good crop. Plants are in ears in Kaddukkulam West.

Tobacco: curing operations are over, and tobacco is ready for sale.

Coconuts: condition of crop is medium. Price per 1,000 nuts ranges from Rs. 70 to Rs. 80.

Fishery: medium. Dried and salted fish is transported by cart to inland stations.

Health of people: satisfactory. There are a few cases of fever and cold in Kaddukkulam West.

Health of cattle: satisfactory.

Prices of staple articles: paddy, Re. 1.50 to Rs. 2.35 per bushel; rice (country), Rs. 3.75 to Rs. 5.74 per bushel; rice (imported), nil.

NORTH-WESTERN PROVINCE.

KURUNEGALA DISTRICT.

Paddy crops: yala crops are in ear, and ploughing and sowing for the maha season is being carried on.

Prospects: good.

Dry grain: yala crops are maturing (being reaped in some parts), and chenaing for the maha season has begun.

Flowering and prospects of coconut: good.

Rainfall: there have been a few light showers.

Health of people: good, except for ordinary cases of fever, parangi, &c.

Health of cattle: good.

State of tanks: fairly full.

gingelly, Rs. 8 per bushel; cassava, Rs. 4.48 per cwt.; coconut, 6 cents to 8 cents per nut; salt, 4 cents to 6 cents per pound.

Rainfall of the month: Puttalam, nil; Chilaw, 20 in.

Harvest prospects generally: fair on the whole.

Health of inhabitants: good.

Health of animals: no disease.

NORTH-CENTRAL PROVINCE.

ANURADHAPURA DISTRICT.

Weather: dry and hot.

Rainfall: 0.88 in.

Cultivation—paddy: yala fields have been sown. Kurakkan: chenas being cleared. Gingelly: crops reaped.

Coconuts: flowering and prospects good.

Health of people: satisfactory.

Health of cattle: outbreak of anthrax in tulanas 74 and 75 of the Tamankaduwa district.

Tanks: some tanks have sufficient water, others have run dry.

PROVINCE OF UVA.

BADULLA DISTRICT.

Weather: dry, with occasional showers.

Paddy: paddy fields are being harvested.

Chenas: the clearing of chenas has commenced.

Fruits and vegetables: fruit is scarce. A moderate supply of vegetables is available.

Health of people: fair. There was influenza in a few villages in Wiyaluwa division and in Arawa wasama of Bintenna division. There were also few cases of cholera in Buttala division.

Health of cattle: satisfactory, except for a few cases of hoof-and-mouth disease in Wellassa and Bintenna divisions.

Total rainfall: 4.90 in. as registered at the observatory.

PROVINCE OF SABARAGAMUWA.

RATNAPURA DISTRICT.

Paddy: muttettu fields have been harvested. Yala fields are blossoming. Maha fields are being prepared for sowing. The weather is favourable for the fields, which are being prepared for cultivation.

Dry grain: perayal chenas are blossoming. Owitas are being sown. Chenas for amu and other grains are being cleared in some parts of the district.

Other products: flowering prospects of coconuts are good.

Health of people: satisfactory, but influenza and fever are prevailing in some villages of Atakalan, Kadawata, and Meda and Nawadun Korales.

Health of cattle: not satisfactory. Hoof-and-mouth disease prevails in some wasamas of Meda and Nawadun korales, and rinderpest prevails in Kuruwita wasama.

Rainfall: there has been sufficient rain during the month.

Prices of foodstuffs: rice (country), Rs. 4.50 to Rs. 10 per bushel; rice (imported), Rs. 8.64 to Rs. 10 per bushel; kurakkan, Rs. 3 to Rs. 4 per bushel; salt, 6 cents to 20 cents per measure; chillies, 30 cents to 15 cents per pound; coconuts, Rs. 5 to Rs. 15 per 100.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as well as that of a Special Meeting held on July 10, 1919, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during June, 1919.

Audit queries received with replies sent up to June, 1919.

3A. Petition received by Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle, M.M.C., from the people of Mapanawatura, praying that the existing path to Kandy be improved, was read.

Resolved that the petition be referred to the Superintendent of Municipal Works for inspection and report.

4. Correspondence :—

(1) Letter No. 16 of July 11, 1919, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary that a stamp duty of Rs. 2.50 fixed by the Municipal Council in respect of annual licenses for bicycles for hire has been sanctioned.—Read.

(2) Letter No. 18 of July 2, 1919, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary forwarding copy of a report of the Hon. the Attorney-General regarding pension of transferred officers, and requesting, if the Council approve if it, that amendments of the Council's pension rules be submitted in accordance therewith.

Resolved that these papers be referred to the Members of the Standing Committee on Law.

(3) Letter No. 19 of July 10, 1919, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating sanction of His Excellency the Governor to the contribution of Rs. 1,200 by the Municipal Council towards the peace celebrations to be held on July 19, 1919.—Read.

(4) Letter No. 20 of July 11, 1919, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that the amendments proposed to the water supply by-laws relating to house service have been confirmed by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.—Read.

(5) Letter No. 21 of July 11, 1919, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary vesting two encroachments in Ward street (by Dr. G. P. Hay and Messrs. Walker, Sons & Co.) in the Municipal Council of Kandy.—Read.

(6) Circular No. 46 of July 11, 1919, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary regarding amendments to Weights and Measures Ordinance, No. 8 of 1876, and forwarding copy of Colonial Storekeeper's letter on the subject was read.

Resolved that the papers be referred to the Standing Committee on Law.

(7) Letter No. 116 of July 18, 1919, from the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province, inquiring whether a portion of Bogambra esplanade might be used for cultivation of vegetables and food stuffs by prison labour.

After some discussion it was resolved that the plot on the eastern portion of the esplanade, including the portion across the stream, and the portions of Municipal land outside the catchment area of the reservoir be granted for the purpose.

(8) Letter of June 8, 1919, from Miss Annie Gibbon acknowledging thanks for the letter of condolence sent to her on the death of her father Sir W. D. Gibbon.—Read.

(9) Endorsement No. 1 of July 22, 1919, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* the Asgiriya road outlet.—Read.

(10) Letter from Rev. L. J. Gaster, Principal of Trinity College, Kandy, applying for permission to put up a permanent building on the Municipal land at Trincomalee street, leased to Trinity College, as a memorial to the late Mr. N. P. Campbell.

Resolved that Rev. Gaster be informed that the Council is prepared to consider the proposal favourably.

5. Memorandum dated July 12, 1919, from the Chairman, Municipal Council, Kandy, *re* rice control within Municipal limits of Kandy.

After some discussion it was proposed by the Chairman that the five elected members of the Council, with Mr. C. A. LaBrooy in place of Mr. Beven, with Mr. Beven's consent, be asked to serve on the Food Control Committee of Kandy town, and that application be made to Government to make a further contribution of Rs. 2,000 to the Kandy Social Service League. The proposal was seconded by Mr. Beven and unanimously carried.

6. Pursuant to notice, Dr. Attygalle asked—"What will be the actual cost in granting the rate of allowance proposed for Government officers, as sanctioned at the last meeting of the Legislative Council, to this Council's officers, who are now in receipt of War Allowance, as it would be necessary to discontinue the War Allowance now granted?"

The Chairman replied as follows :—"The approximate cost of allowances according to the latest Government scheme would be Rs. 8,267.74 for the year 1919. This does not include pensions or allowances to daily-paid employes. The cost of allowances now paid by the Council is Rs. 3,701.63 for 1919. The additional cost of allowances according to the scheme sanctioned by Government from November 1, 1918, would be Rs. 1,890.15."

7. Pursuant to notice, Dr. Attygalle moved—"That in future all plots of ground and spaces allowed during the perahera season for construction of booths or for occupation otherwise be first marked out by the Superintendent of Works and put up for public auction in time, after due advertisement, and no application for such plots or spaces be entertained after the auction is held under any circumstances whatsoever." Mr. F. L. Goonewardene seconded.

After discussion it was resolved that the conditions of sale for plots of ground and spaces allowed during the perahera season, 1920, and subsequently be submitted to this Council in May, 1920.

7A. Report of the Finance Committee appointed to inquire into and report on certain paragraphs of the Colonial Auditor's Report on the accounts of the Kandy Municipality for 1918, to which the attention of the Council was drawn by the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, which was previously circulated, was submitted.

The Chairman moved that the report be adopted. Mr. Pieris seconded.

Mr. LaBrooy moved as an amendment that all papers connected with the report be circulated, and the subject brought up at the next Meeting of the Council. Mr. Goonewardene seconded.

The amendment was put to the Meeting and carried.

8. Recommendations of the Standing Committees at the Meetings held on June 21, 1919, were submitted :—

Law and General Subjects.

(1) That the subsidy to the Kandy Central Town Library be discontinued.

Finance and Assessment.

(2) That officers who draw a salary of Rs. 600 and under be put on the same footing as Government servants with regard to the extra war allowance.

(3) That the Assistant Superintendent of Works be paid the commuted allowance during the time he was absent on sick leave.

(4) That the Second Assistant Sinhalese Teacher, Municipal School, be paid a house allowance of Rs. 2·50 per mensem from July 1, 1919, as well as Rs. 5·55 the travelling expenses incurred by him.

(5) That a personal allowance of Rs. 5 per mensem from July 1, 1919, be granted to the Slaughter-house keeper. Such allowance not to count for war allowance or pension.

(6) That a fee of 75 cents be allowed for writing out 100 single assessment receipts (water-rate included).

(7) That carpenter Juanis Fernando be granted a gratuity of Rs. 390 on the basis of 36 years continuous service.

(7A) Supplemental Budget No. 1 for 1919.

Municipal Works.

(8) That house-service pipes be allowed on usual terms to 168, 169, 170, 171, and 172, Trincomalee street, M. Ismail & Co., and 85A, Castle Hill street, M. Meer Mohideen.

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted, save and except item (2), which was deferred.

THE Council met this day at 2 P.M., pursuant to notice dated July 2, 1919.

Present :—The Hon. Mr. R. B. Hellings, Chairman; Mr. D. G. Goonewardene; Mr. D. W. Subesinghe; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. C. E. Abeywardena; Mr. A. C. Hayley; Mr. J. E. Perera; and Mr. A. E. Mayes.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on June 14, 1919, a copy thereof having been sent to each Councillor, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. With the leave of Council, Mr. A. C. Hayley amended his motion (of which he had given notice) as follows:—That in the opinion of this Council, in view of the unequal distribution of the supplies of rice that are rendered available for this Municipality, a system of rationing be adopted, and that the Deputy Food Controller, Galle, be requested to take the necessary steps. Mr. C. E. de Vos seconded.

The Chairman moved the Council into Committee.

On the Council resuming the motion was put and carried by 6 against 2.

3. The Chairman, with the leave of Council, moved that the Council do consider what steps should be taken to celebrate the conclusion of peace with Germany. Mr. D. G. Goonewardena seconded.

Resolved—(1) That public subscriptions be raised by the Elected Members for feeding the poor on July 19; (2) that the sanction of Government be obtained to spend a sum of Rs. 750 for this purpose from the sum of Rs. 2,500 already sanctioned for relief of distress in Galle; (3) that a mass meeting of the inhabitants of the Municipality be held on the esplanade between 4 and 5 P.M. on July 19; (4) that the residents of the Municipality be asked to decorate and illuminate their houses on that day.

4. Mr. D. G. Goonewardena, with permission of Council, moved for a sketch and estimate for improvement of the turn from Dickson's road to Cripp's road, the owners of the land being willing to give it free. Mr. C. E. Abeywardena seconded.

Resolved that the Superintendent of Works be asked to submit a sketch and estimate for improvement of the turn from Dickson's road to Cripp's road and for a report on other blind bends on these roads.

5. Letter No. 4,982 dated June 23/24, 1919, from the Hon. the Government Agent, Southern Province, informing, with reference to the address presented to His Excellency the Governor on the occasion of his recent visit to Galle, that the question of effecting improvements to the Galle Railway Station cannot be considered in connection with the estimates for 1919-20, for want of funds.—Read.
