WHEREAS the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 13 (4) of "The Defence Force Ordinance, No. 8 of 1910," did proclaim by Proclamation dated November 19, 1918, that, with the exception of the services of Lieutenant-Colonel E. ## GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

### "THE CEYLON MEDICAL COLLEGE ORDINANCE, 1905."

*Rules made by the Council of the Ceylon Medical College, under Section 14 of "The Ceylon Medical College Ordinance, 1905," and approved by the Governor and the Executive Council, in substitution for the Rules dated June 23, 1919, and published in "Government Gazette" No. 7,026 of June 27, 1919.*

THE following rules shall take effect from October 1, 1919:—

1. Students who have passed the First M.B.B.S. Examination of the University of London are exempted from the First Professional Examination, provided they have been registered Medical Students for one year.

2. Students who have passed the Intermediate Science Examination of the University of London in Chemistry and Physics are exempted from the examination in these subjects at the First Professional Examination, provided they have been registered Medical Students for one year.

N.B.—A student allowed exemption from the First Professional Examination of the Ceylon Medical College or from Examination in Chemistry and Physics as stated in rule 2 on account of having passed either of the above examinations must before being permitted to enter for the Second Professional Examination of the Ceylon Medical College produce evidence of having passed the Second Examination for Medical Degrees, Part I., of the University of London.

## BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. *Definitions.*—In these by-laws—

The terms "boy" and "child" mean a boy or a child residing in the area described in the Schedule A hereto.

The term "parent" includes a guardian and any person who has actual custody of a child.

The term "Code" means the Code for Aided Schools for the time being sanctioned by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

The term "attendance" means an attendance for the period defined by the Code as constituting a full attendance recorded in the Attendance Register in the manner prescribed by the Code.

The term "local authority" means the Local Board of Batticaloa.

The term "school" means a school specified in the Schedule B hereto.

The terms "adequate and suitable provision for the education of a child" and "reasonable excuse" shall bear the meaning defined in section 8 (1) (b) of "The Town Schools Ordinance, 1906."

The term "Inspector of Schools" means an Inspector of Schools appointed by His Excellency the Governor and includes a Sub-Inspector.

2. *Children to attend School.*—The parent of every boy of not less than 6 nor more than 12 years of age shall cause such boy to attend one of the schools specified in the Schedule B, unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such boy, or unless there is a reasonable excuse for non-attendance.

3. *Time of Attendance.*—The time during which every boy shall attend school shall be the whole time for which the school shall be open for the instruction of children of similar age.

4. *Religion.*—Provided always that nothing in these by-laws—

(a) Shall prevent the presence of children being excused during the hours when religious instruction is given, as provided by section 9 (2) (d) of "The Town Schools Ordinance, 1906."

(b) Shall require any child to attend school on any day exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which the parent belongs.

5. *Exemption of Children with Fourth Standard Certificate.*—And provided always that when a child between 10 and 12 years of age being beneficially employed to the satisfaction of the local authority has received a certificate from an Inspector of Schools that it has passed in Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic, the Fourth Standard prescribed by the Code for the time being, it shall not be required to attend school.

6. *Penalties for Offences.*—Every parent who shall not observe, or shall neglect or violate, these by-laws or any of them shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Rs. 20 for each offence, and an additional fine of not exceeding Rs. 10 per day in the case of a continuing offence.

NOTE.—The following are the portions of the Town Schools Ordinance referred to in sections 1 and 4 of these by-laws:—

*Section 8 (1) (b).*—A parent shall be deemed to have made adequate and suitable provision for the education of his child, if he proves that his child is in regular attendance at a school registered by the Director of Education for the receipt of a grant in aid, or at a school with regard to which an application for a grant in aid is under consideration, or at a school certified by the Director of Education to provide adequate and suitable instruction; or if he proves he has made such other provision for his child's education as the

Director of Education shall certify to be adequate and suitable, or if he produces a certificate from the Director of Education recommending that the child shall be exempted from compulsory attendance. Provided that no parent shall be convicted for not causing his child to attend such school, if he proves to the satisfaction of the Magistrate that he has reasonable excuse for not causing such child to attend. A parent shall be deemed to have a reasonable excuse for not causing his child to attend school if he proves that the child is prevented from attending by sickness or other unavoidable cause.

*Section 9 (2).*—No school in which religious instruction is given shall be named in any by-law made under clause (a) of the last preceding section as a school in which efficient provision is made for vernacular education, unless the local authority is satisfied—

(a) That religious instruction is given only during the time specified in the school time table;

(b) That religious instruction is not given to pupils of other denominations than that to which the school belongs if the parents object;

(c) That pupils who do not attend religious instruction are employed in other studies during the hours allotted to religious instruction;

(d) That such pupils if their parents object to their being present in the room where religious instruction is given are either allowed to study in some other part of the school premises during the hours when such instruction is given, or their presence in the school during such hours is excused; and

(e) That a copy of sub-section (2) of this section in the English, Sinhalese, and Tamil languages is conspicuously posted up in the school.

All owners, tenants, or occupiers of lands and buildings within the limits of the Sanitary Board towns of Wattagama, Kadugannawa, Teldeniya, Norwood, Bogawantalawa, Maskeliya, Pussellawa, Ulapane, Galaha, Mailapitiya, and Huluganga shall keep the same free from discarded tins, barrels, coconut shells, and other receptacles which are likely to hold water and form breeding places for mosquitoes.

"THE CEYLON RAILWAYS ORDINANCE, 1902."

RULE made by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice of the Executive Council, under section 5 of the above-named Ordinance :—

RULE.

Rule 49 (b) of the rules for the conveyance of goods traffic framed under the above-named Ordinance, and published in the *Government Gazette* of October 11, 1907, shall be amended by the addition of the following proviso immediately at the end of paragraph (b) of the proviso to the said rule 49 (b) :—

Provided further that buffaloes shall be conveyed by railway between stations not less than one hundred miles apart at half the aforesaid rate during the period of one year from September 1, 1919, on production of a certificate from a Government Agent, Assistant Government Agent, or Chief Headman that the buffaloes for which transport by railway at the reduced rate is claimed are *bona fide* required for agricultural purposes and not for slaughter.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

## Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 30, 1919.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 103 (1 European, 13 Burghers, 55 Sinhalese, 14 Tamils, 16 Moors, 2 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1919, viz., 285,795) was 18·8, as against 20·3 in the preceding week, 22·1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21·5 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 131 (2 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 72 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 15 Moors, 8 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 23·9, as against 23·2 in the previous week, 17·2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26·7 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 131 total deaths, 22 were of infants under one year of age, as against 25 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 5.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1 (a) Twelve deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 4 in Maradana of non-residents in hospitals, 2 each in Slave Island, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta, and 1 each in Pettah and Kotahena, as against 13, 18, 14, and 10, respectively, in the four preceding weeks. The weekly average for last year was 27.

(b) Five deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in Pettah, San Sebastian, Kotahena, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 4, 4, 6, and 13, respectively, in the four preceding weeks.

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, as against 4 in the previous week.

2. (a) Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 2 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya and 1 each in Maradana, Slave Island, and Wellawatta, as against 9 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths of residents of Colombo occurred at the Ragama Hospital from *Phthisis* during the week.

3. Six deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 each in New Bazaar and Wellawatta and 1 each in Kotahena and Maradana, as against 7 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. Twelve deaths were registered from *Debility*, 10 each from *Enteritis* and *Infantile Convulsions*, 7 from *Dysentery*, 6 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 from *Worms*, and 48 from *Other Causes*.

5. Thirteen cases of *Measles* and 1 of *Chickenpox* were reported during the week, as against 7 and 7 respectively in the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 80·3°, same as in the preceding week and 80·9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·908 in., against 29·951 in. in the preceding week and 29·907 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·40 in., against 0·68 in. in the preceding week and 0·37 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Paddy cultivation—yala: harvesting. Maha: fields being sown.

Dry grain cultivation: kurakkan crops ripening. Hill paddy in plants.

Rainfall: satisfactory.

Prospect of crop: good, but rain has damaged some fields.

Health of the people: satisfactory.

Health of cattle: satisfactory. There were a few cases of rinderpest in Udapalata.

Coconut cultivation: crops fair.

Prices of staple articles: imported rice sold at controlled prices; country rice, Rs. 9 to Rs. 11.50 per bushel; paddy, Rs. 4 to Rs. 5 per bushel; kurakkan, Rs. 6 per bushel, but not available in some parts; coconuts, Rs. 6 to Rs. 9 per 100.

**SOUTHERN PROVINCE.****GALLE DISTRICT.**

The yala crop is being reaped. In some parts of the district the crop was damaged by wild animals and heavy rains.

Dry grain is cultivated in the district only on a small scale.

Coconut, tea, rubber, cinnamon, citronella, and vegetables are the principal products. The estimated coconut crop for the month was 11,775,000 nuts.

Coast rice varied from Rs. 8.96 to Rs. 10.56 per bushel; paddy varied from Rs. 4 to Rs. 7 per bushel; dry grain varied from Rs. 2 to Rs. 8 per bushel; coconuts, varied from Rs. 45 to Rs. 80 per 1,000.

The weather was wet throughout the month.

Harvest prospects are good.

The health of the people was on the whole satisfactory.
