### "THE CEYLON DEFENCE FORCE ORDINANCE, 1910."

THE following amendments to the regulations for the Ceylon Defence Force made by the General Officer Commanding the Troops, under the provisions of section 12 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1910, and approved by His Excellency the Governor, are published for general information:—

Delete paragraphs 223 to 226 and substitute the following:—

223. An annual allowance is granted to Corps of the Ceylon Defence Force as follows:—

- (i.) For every captain or subaltern who has fulfilled the conditions for efficiency laid down for his Corps Rs. 30, and each efficient field officer Rs. 50, with the exception of the 2nd Battalion, Colombo Town Guard, and Provincial Town Guards, who will draw Rs. 25 for field officers and Rs. 15 for captains and subalterns.
- (ii.) For every efficient non-combatant officer Rs. 30. In the case of chaplains, the presence of these officers with their Corps in Camp will be sufficient to entitle the Corps to the allowance.
- (iii.) For every efficient soldier, including buglers, Rs. 20, with the exception of the Ceylon Mounted Rifles, who will earn Rs. 30, the Ceylon Cadet Battalion Rs. 2, and the 2nd Battalion, Colombo Town Guard, and Provincial Town Guards, who will earn Rs. 30 in the first year and Rs. 10 in the second and subsequent years.
- (iv.) The rates of capitation grant for reservists are laid down in the regulations for the Reserves.

224. Boys, except those borne as trumpeters or buglers on the authorized establishment of a Corps, cannot earn capitation allowance.

225. With a view to giving encouragement to officers and sergeants of Ceylon Defence Units in acquiring a thorough knowledge of their duties, a special additional capitation allowance of Rs. 5 is granted on account of each officer who has passed for his rank, and each sergeant (not including permanent staff) who holds a certificate of proficiency for every year in which he earns the ordinary capitation allowance. The same allowance is granted for extra-efficients in musketry and for those who have passed in signalling, also for all efficient specialists of the

Ceylon Garrison Artillery referred to in paragraph 226. A musketry grant of Rs. 2.50 will be granted for each officer and man of the 2nd Battalion, Colombo Town Guard, and Provincial Town Guards, who scores two-thirds points and over in the annual musketry course.

226. Specialists of all ranks of the Ceylon Garrison Artillery in possession of the following certificates earn for their Corps an annual grant of Rs. 5 for each certificate, viz. :—Depression range finding, field range finding, gun laying, and position finding.

It shall not be lawful for any person to erect or re-erect any hut or house within the limits of the Local Board town of Matale, except under the following conditions :—

The following clear air space shall be left around any hut or house which is erected or re-erected, and no portion of the walls of such building, and not more than 2 feet 6 inches of the projecting eaves of such building, shall come within such space :—

- (1) On the side of any road or street 25 feet to the centre of such road or street.
- (2) Behind such space up to 50 feet to any other hut or house, except a kitchen, bathing place, or latrine as the Chairman may require, of which prescribed space at least half shall be land belonging to the same owner as the land upon which the house stands which is erected or re-erected.
- (3) To the side such space up to 15 feet to the nearest building as the Chairman may require, of which prescribed space at least half shall be land belonging to the same

owner as the land upon which the house stands which is erected or re-erected.

Provided that the Chairman may in his discretion relax the operation of this rule in any special case, but he shall not do so unless he is satisfied (1) no detriment is caused thereby to the sanitary condition or amenities of the house or hut to be erected or re-erected or of any other neighbouring house or hut used or intended to be used as a human dwelling place; and (2) that the future alignment, widening, or development of any road or street, or the convenience of the public using such road or street, will not be interfered with by such relaxation of the rule.

Provided further, that the Chairman may allow the erection of a kitchen, bathing place, or latrine upon the portion thus reserved for air space on the side of any house furthest from the road or street in such place as the Chairman shall approve.

Provided further, that where a conservancy lane shall have been provided, or laid out, or projected by the Board, such latrine shall adjoin such lane or projected lane.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

## Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 6, 1919.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 80 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 35 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 9 Moors, 4 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1919, viz., 285,795) was 14.6, as against 18.8 in the preceding week, 20.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.5 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 168 (5 Burghers, 90 Sinhalese, 41 Tamils, 19 Moors, 3 Malays, and 10 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 30.7, as against 23.9 in the previous week, 18.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26.7 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 168 total deaths, 25 were of infants under one year of age, as against 22 in the preceding week, 26 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—(a) Twenty-five deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 13 in Maradana (including 8 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 4 in Kotahena, 2 each in San Sebastian and St. Paul's, and 1 each in Pettah, New Bazaar, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta, as against 12, 13, 18, and 14, respectively, in the four preceding weeks. The weekly average for last year was 27.

(b) Five deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in Pettah, Maradana, and Wellawatta, as against 5, 4, 4, and 6, respectively, in the four preceding weeks.

(c) Eight deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, as against 2 in the previous week.

2. Twenty deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 4 in Kotahena, 3 in Slave Island, 2 each in New Bazaar and Wellawatta, and 1 each in San Sebastian, St. Paul's, and Kollupitiya, as against 11 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

3. Seven deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena, Slave Island, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta, as against 6 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* (suspected) was registered at Maradana, as against nil in the previous week.

5. Eleven deaths were registered from *Debility*, 9 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 6 from *Dysentery*, 5 each from *Enteritis* and *Worms*, 4 from *Tetanus*, 3 from *Diarrhoea*, and 59 from *Other Causes*.

6. Fifteen cases of *Measles* and 2 of *Chickenpox* were reported during the week, as against 13 and 1 respectively in the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 80.8°, against 80.3° in the preceding week and 81.7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.899 in., against 29.908 in. in the preceding week and 29.915 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.66 in., against 0.40 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
