“THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1897.”

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has declared that the District of Hambantota, in the Southern Province, is infected with cholera, and is a “diseased locality” in terms of regulation I of the regulations framed under the Ordinance No. 3 of 1897, and published in the *Government Gazette* dated July 31, 1914.

*Regulations made by the Governor under the provisions of the Order of Her Majesty in Council dated October 26, 1896, as amended by the Order of His Majesty in Council dated March 21, 1916, and of all other Powers him enabling.*

1. From and after the commencement of these regulations it is forbidden to remove or transport paddy or rice, by any means, from the Province of Uva, except under permit to be issued by the Government Agent of that Province.
2. Any person who contravenes the provisions of the last preceding regulation shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on summary conviction to imprisonment of either description for any term not exceeding six months, or to a fine not exceeding Rs. 1,500, or to both.
3. These regulations shall commence and come into operation on July 12, 1919.
