Order No. 17 made by the Food Controller under Regulation 1 of "The Defence of the Colony Regulations, 1919," fixing the Price of Bangkok Rice.

1. The order fixing the price of Bangkok rice dated June 25, 1919, published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 7,025 of June 26, 1919, is hereby cancelled as from the date of commencement of this order.
2. From and after the date of commencement of this order the price of Bangkok rice shall be as follows:—

Order No. 18 made by the Food Controller under Regulation 1 of "The Defence of the Colony Regulations, 1919."

1. From and after the date of commencement of this order, no manager of an estate in the Matale District, nor any person employed on an estate in the said district, nor any person acting on behalf of such manager or person, shall purchase, or otherwise obtain or take delivery of, any paddy, country rice, or kurakkan grown in the Matale District of the Central Province, except on permits issued by the Assistant Government Agent, Matale.

2. From and after the date of commencement of this order, no manager of an estate in the Kurunegala District, nor any person employed on an estate in the said district, nor any person acting on behalf of such manager or person, shall purchase, or otherwise obtain or take delivery of, any paddy, country rice, or kurakkan grown in the Kurunegala District of the North-Western Province, except on permits issued by the Government Agent, North-Western Province.

3. This order shall commence and come into operation on August 14, 1919.

Order No. 19 made by the Food Controller under Regulation 1 of "The Defence of the Colony Regulations, 1919."

1. From and after the commencement of these regulations it is forbidden to remove or transport paddy, kurakkan, and maize, by any means, from the division of Uda Dumbara, in the District of Kandy, Central Province, except on permits issued by the Government Agent of the Province.

2. These regulations shall commence and come into operation on August 14, 1919.
