Order No. 86 made by the Food Controller under Regulation 1 of "The Defence of the Colony Regulations. 1919."

- 1. From and after the date of commencement of this order, no person shall sell, deliver, or otherwise dispose of any paddy, country rice, kurakkan, or Indian corn grown in the Province of Uva to any manager of an estate over ten acres in extent in the Province of Uva, nor to any person resident and employed on such estate, nor to any person acting on behalf of such manager or person, nor assist in such sale, delivery, or disposal of the same, except on permit issued by the Government Agent of the Province of Uva.
- 2. From and after the date of commencement of this order, no manager of an estate in the Province of Uva which receives rice through the Controller of Estate Supplies, nor any person resident and employed on such estates, nor any person acting on behalf of such manager or person, shall purchase, or otherwise obtain or take delivery of, any paddy, country rice, kurakkan, or Indian corn grown in the Province of Uva, except on permits issued by the Government Agent of the Province of Uva.
 - 3. This order shall commence and come into operation on October 24, 1919.

Order No. 37 made by the Food Controller under Regulation 1 of "The Defence of the Colony Regulations, 1919."

- 1. Order No. 29, made by the Food Controller, published in Government Gazette No. 7,054 of September 26, 1919, is hereby cancelled as from October 25, 1919, and the following order substituted therefor.
- 2. From and after the date of commencement of this order, it is forbidden to remove or transport, by any means, paddy and country rice from the Colombo and Negombo Districts of the Western Province, except under permit, to be issued by the Government Agent, Western Province.
 - 3. This order shall commence and come into operation on October 25, 1919.

Order No. 38 made by the Food Controller under Regulation 1 of "The Defence of the Colony Regulations, 1919."

- 1. From and after the date of commencement of this order, no person in the Jaffna peninsula shall sell to any one person in any day, or transport at one time, more than one bag of imported paddy or rice, except on permits issued by the Government Agent, Northern Province.
 - 2. This order shall commence and come into operation on October 25, 1919.

NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

TENDERS are hereby invited for the conveyance of cash in a vehicle or carriage drawn by one horse for a period of two years from the date of acceptance of tender as under:—

(a) Carriage required daily at Maradana Station at 8 A.M. and to be used for the purpose of conveying cash, the Railway officers travelling with it to the Railway Accountant's Office and to the National Bank and Treasury until 2.30 P.M.

(b) On or about the 22rd day of each month and until the 6th day of the following morth the carriage will be required, in addition to the above service, to be at the Railway Accountant's Office at 6 A.M. to convey wages moneys to Maradana Station, and will also be required for three or four days during each month to make an additional run to the bank to convey moneys to the office and also two journeys from office to Dematagoda.

The above are the present requirements of the service, but they are subject to alteration and revision as may be decided by Government, and the contractor must provide

for this when tendering.

2. That for the purpose above named the General Manager shall provide a vehicle with lamps, which shall be safely housed and kept clean and in good running order and condition by the successful tenderer at his own cost, all heavy repairs being performed at the cost of the General Manager.

3. Payment will be made monthly on the basis of the monthly mileage of the carriage when in use for the conveyance of cash or other sanctioned Railway business and tenderers should accordingly quote a rate per mile in their tenders. For the purpose of calculating the mileage, the following will be taken as the mileage between the respective points:—

Accountant's Office to Maradana Railway Station, ½ mile.

Maradana Railway Station to Loco Shed, Dematagoda, 1½ mile.

Accountant's Office to Fort, $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile.

The probable mileage per month will be about 140 miles, but the Government does not bind itself to this mileage.

4. The successful tenderer shall at his own cost provide a sound horse, not less than fourteen hands in height, with suitable harness and whip, together with a capable driver, who shall be clad in clean uniform to be provided by the successful tenderer and be of a pattern approved by the General Manager.

5. The General Manager shall provide an officer to travel

in the carriage in charge of the money.

6. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the General Manager of the Railway, Colombo.

7. Tenders should either be deposited in the Office of the General Manager of the Railway, or be sent through

the post.

8. Tenders should be marked "Tender for transport of Cash" in the left hand corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the General Manager of the Railway not

later than midday on Tuesday, November 4, 1919. The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Office of the General Manager of the Railway, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form.

9. A deposit of Rs. 50 will be required to be made either at the Treasury or Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. Should any person decline to enter into the contract and bond, or fail to furnish approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Head of the Department, or his duly authorized representative, that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown, and the defaulter will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

10. Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the

contract.

11. The amount of security required will be Rs. 50 in cash. All other necessary information can be ascertained upon application at the office referred to in section 8.

12. The security should be furnished within ten days of

acceptance of tender being notified.

13. All alterations or erasures in tenders should bear the initials of the tenderers, otherwise the tenders will be treated as informal and rejected.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 18, 1919.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 108 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 56 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 10 Moors, 10 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1919, viz., 285,795) was 19.7, as against 21.7 in the preceding week, 20.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 120 (7 Burghers, 63 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 23 Moors, 4 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 21.9, as against 22.1 in the previous week, 57.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 120 total deaths, 18 were of infants under one year of age, same as in the preceding week, 47 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Sixteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, 7 in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 4 in Kotahena, 2 each in Slave Island and Wellawatta, and 1 in New Bazaar, as against 15 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.

- (b) One death of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama Hospital from Phthisis during the week.
- 2. (a) Thirteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 4 in Kotahena, 3 in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Pettah, New Bazaar, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta, as against 11, 17, 16, and 16, respectively, in the four preceding weeks. The weekly average for last year was 27.
- (b) Three deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, Maradana, and Slave Island, as against 2, 5, 1, and 2, respectively, in the four preceding weeks.
- (c) Three deaths from Bronchitis were registered during the week. None were registered during the two previous weeks.
- 3. Four deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 2 in Slave Island and 1 each in Kotahena and Maradana, as against 12 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.
 - 4. Four deaths from Plague were registered, 3 in St. Paul's and 1 in Pettah, as against 3 in the previous week.
- 5. Seven deaths were registered from Debility, 5 from Enteritis, 3 from Worms, 2 from Infantile Convulsions, 1 each from Diarrhosa and Dysentery, and 58 from Other Causes.
- 6. Twelve cases of *Measles*, 12 of *Chickenpox*, and 4 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 9, 6, and 3, respectively, in the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.8°, against 81.2° in the preceding week and 80.8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.917 in., against 29.956 in. in the preceding week and 29.932 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 4.32 in., against 0.82 in. in the preceding week and 2.58 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

THE following extract from the Board of Trade Journal of August 28, 1919, is published for general information.

H. M. Customs, Colombo, October 18, 1919. R. N. THAINE, Acting Principal Collector.

IMPERIAL PREFERENCE.

Notice to Exporters of Ceylon Produce.

Preferential Duties of Customs in Great Britain and Ireland on Goods Consigned from, and Grown, Produced, or Manufactured in, the British Empire.

1. With a view to conferring a preference in the case of Empire products, the duties of Customs on the goods specified in Appendix A will, in accordance with Section 8 of the Finance Act, 1919, be charged on and after September 1 next* at the reduced rates shown in the second column of that Appendix, provided the goods are shown to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise to have been (1) consigned from, and (2) grown, produced, or manufactured in, the British Empire. The "British Empire" for this purpose means all British Dominions outside Great Britain and Ireland, including British India and Indian Native States, and all British Protectorates. Any territories which may subsequently come under His Majesty's Protection, or in respect of which a Mandate of the League of Nations may be exercised by the Government of any part of His Majesty's Dominions, may be included by Order in Council.

2. Goods shall not be deemed to have been manufactured in the British Empire unless such proportion of their value as is prescribed by regulations made by the Board of Trade (printed as Appendix B) is the result of labour within the British Empire. This proportion has for the present been fixed at 25 per cent. of the factory or works cost to the manufacturer for all manufactured articles, except manufactured tobacco, refined sugar, molasses, and other extracts of sugar, for which the proportion is fixed at 5 per cent.

(but see paragraph 3).

Each article is to be considered separately in applying the percentage test. The factors which may be taken into account in arriving at the total value and the proportion of Empire labour are laid down in Regulations 4 and 5

(Appendix B).

3. Where the Board of Trade is satisfied as respects any class of goods to which the preferential rates apply that those articles are to a considerable extent manufactured in the British Empire from material which is not wholly grown or produced in the Empire, the Board may by order direct that the preferential rate shall be charged only in respect of such proportion of those goods as corresponds to the proportion of dutiable material used in their manufacture which is shown to have been grown or produced in the Empire.

This provision has been applied by Order of the Board of Trade (Appendix C) to manufactured tobacco, refined sugar, syrup, molasses, and other extracts of sugar. It is in view of this limitation that the percentage under paragraph 2 has been fixed as low as 5 per cent. for these articles, the combined effect of the two rules being to allow preference where any of these articles are the result of an appreciable amount of Empire labour, but to confine it to the extent to which the finished article is the result of Empire material.

4. The dutiable articles which for the purpose of charging the preferential rate are considered as manufac-

tured articles are :-

Refined sugar.

Manufactured goods containing sugar or cocoa.

Manufactured goods containing spirits, e.g., pomades, varnishes, dyes, &c.

Glucose.

Syrup, molasses, and other extracts of sugar. Saccharin.

Manufactured tobacco.

Cinematograph films.

Motor cars, parts, accessories, &c.

Musical instruments, parts, accessories, &c.

Clocks, watches, &c.

All other goods will be regarded as growth or produce. The term refined sugar means sugar which has passed through a refinery. 5. Where goods are manufactured in a bonded factory in Great Britain or Ireland from dutiable material shown to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise to have been consigned from, and grown, or produced, in the British Empire, the duty on the manufactured goods shall, to the extent to which they are shown to have been manufactured out of such material, be charged at the preferential rate.

This provision applies to sugar refiners and tobacco

manufacturers who work in bond.

6. In the case of goods which are imported on and after September 1, the preferential rate of duty must be claimed by the importer at the time of making entry. He should be prepared to substantiate the declarations on the entry that the goods were (1) consigned from, and (2) were the growth, production, or manufacture of a part of the British Empire, by means of a certificate of origin in the approved form. He must also, if called upon to do so by the Collector of Customs and Excise, produce any other evidence of origin, such as the supplier's invoice, bill of lading, &c.

The certificate of origin must be given by the British overseas grower, producer, or supplier (Appendix D), or manufacturer (Appendix E). In the case of refined sugar, molasses, and other extracts of sugar, or manufactured tobacco, an amplified certificate (Appendix F) giving also the proportion of Empire-produced dutiable material must be given by the manufacturer or refiner. Where the principal certificate is not given by the actual exporter, an additional certificate from the latter is required (see additional forms in Appendices D, E, and F). If the Collector is satisfied by the production of the certificate or certificates, he will forthwith admit the goods to entry as entitled to the preferential rate. The Collector may, in any case of doubt or of an incomplete or informal certificate, call for the production of invoices, bills of lading, or any such further evidence as he may require, but pending the production of such evidence, he may, unless he has reason to suspect an attempt at fraud, allow delivery of the goods on deposit of the full rate of duty, subject to adjustment if and when he is satisfied that the preferential rate is applicable. In the case of goods entered to be warehoused the Collector may allow the goods to be deposited in warehouse, pending settlement of the rate of duty to which they may be decided to be liable.

8. The preferential rates will apply in the case of dutiable goods entered for warehousing, or already in bond, before September 1, and the particulars of consignment and origin as recorded in the official accounts will usually be accepted. The same rule will be applied in respect of Empire and non-Empire goods blended or put together in bond before September 1. In the case of blends, duty will be charged at preferential rates on the proportion of Empire goods shown to be contained therein. It must be understood that where the official records are not sufficient to establish Empire consignment and origin, the onus of proof in all cases rests by law on the importer.

9. As regards goods which were in course of transit prior to the issue of this notice, certificates of origin will not be pressed for if other satisfactory proof of Empire origin is

forthcoming (see paragraph 6).

10. In the case of Empire goods which have been transhipped en route, or have been shipped from a foreign port after overland transit from the Empire country of origin, the importer at the time of making entry will be required to produce the through bill of lading or railway consignment note from the country of production in support of the certificate of origin. Where a through bill of lading or consignment note is not available, the local bill of lading or consignment note from the original point of origin and certificate of arrival or landing at, and exportation from,

the port of transhipment, will be required. Such certificates are to be signed by the proper Colonial or Foreign Customs Officer at the port of transhipment, and in the case of the latter, the signature must be visaed by the British Consular

In the case of post parcels arriving from a part of the Empire, if the contents are not merchandise for sale and do not exceed £10 in value for any one addressee, the following short form of certificate will, in the absence of ground for suspicion, be accepted as satisfactory evidence of origin for charging the preferential rate of duty, except in the case of manufactured tobacco, refined sugar, syrup, &c.:—

"The contents of this package are not merchandise for sale, and every dutiable article herein is the growth or produce, or, if a manufactured article, is to the extent of at least one-fourth of its present value bona fide the manufacture of (Empire country of origin).

All other post parcels, including all parcels containing manufactured tobacco, refined sugar, syrup, &c., will be subject to the ordinary rules of evidence of origin applicable to merchandise generally as set out in the earlier part of this notice.

-REGULATIONS AS TO THE PROPORTION OF VALUE RESULTING FROM LABOUR WITHIN THE BRITISH EMPIRE.

In pursuance of section 8 of the Finance Act, 1919, the Board of Trade hereby make the following regulations:

(1) Save as hereinafter provided, goods shall not be deemed, for the purpose: of section 8 of the Finance Act, 1919, to have been manufactured in the British Empire, unless at least 25 per cent. of their total value is the result of labour within the British

Empire.

(2) In the case of those classes of goods in respect of which an Order has been made by the Board of Trade under section 8, sub-section (2), of the Finance Act, 1919, no part of the goods shall be deemed to have been manufactured in the British Empire,

unless at least 5 per cent. of the total value of the goods is the result of labour within the British Empire.

(3) Where a number of separate articles are included in one parcel or shipment, each and every article shall be considered separately for the purpose of calculating the proportion of value due to labour within the Empire.

(4) For the purposes of these regulations the total value of an article shall be its cost to the manufacturer at the factory or works, and shall include the value of containers and other forms works, and shall include the value of containers and other forms of interior packing ordinarily sold with the article when it is sold retail, but shall not include the manufacturer's or exporter's profit or the cost of exterior packing, carriage to port, and other charges incidental to the export of the goods subsequent to their

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, September 5, 1919.

THE Council met this day at 2.30 P.M., pursuant to notice dated August 29, 1919.

Present:—Mr. C. P. Dias; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. H. L. de Mel, C.B.E.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; Mr. T. L. Villiers; Mr. F. R. Senanayake; the Hon. Mr. W. C. S. Ingles; Mr. Harold Creasy; Mr. M. Cassim Ismail; Mr. W. Philps; Mr. B. W. Leefe; and Mr. A. E. de Silva.

In the absence of the Chairman; through indisposition, Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that, in terms of section 87 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, Mr. C. P. Dias, the Senior Member, do take the Chair. Mr. T. L. Villiers seconded.—Carried.

Mr. C. P. Dias then took the chair, and addressed the members expressing his regret at the Chairman's (Mr. Byrde's) absence through indisposition, brought on by hard and arduous work.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of August 8, 1919, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.—Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of August 8, 1919, be confirmed.

The Secretary read the following: --Since the last Meeting of Council 2 fatal cases of septicæmic plague have been recorded, 1 at Chekku street and the other at Dean's road. One plague infected rat was killed in Dean's road area. This brings the total up to date of 6 human and 7 rat cases for the year, as against 66 human and 57 rat cases during the corresponding period in 1918.

3. Pursuant to rotice, Mr. C. P. Dias presented a petition from the Indian Association in Ceylon suggesting a slight

increase in the day and night fares for jinrickshas.

4. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo asked the Chairman the following questions and the Chairman replied,

(a) Whether he has any idea when the Government is going to make a start with the building of an infectious diseases hospital for the use of this city. If not, will the Chairman be good enough to press upon Government at an early date the urgent necessity of such an institution?—I am not aware when Government is going to start with the I will write to Government on the subject.

(b) As the plans of the above hospital were completed many years ago, will be obtain for this Council an opportunity of re-considering the same ?-I will ask Government to submit the plans for the consideration of the Council when they

have been prepared.

(c) If it is true that the Food Controller is now allowing this city 1,000 bags of rice a day, and it so, what rations does 1,000 bags a day allow in the city, and whether there is any probability of continuing that ration for any length of time?—The Municipality of Colombo is being allotted altogether more than 1,000 bags a day when the allotmerts to the Manning Market for the small firms and the allotment to the Chalmers Granaries for the larger firms are taker into With regard to the depôts, the allotment does not amount to 1,000 bags a day. The allotment for the week ending September 1 was 4,160, which was supplemented by 1,000 bags from the Manning Market. For the previous week it was 5,200 bags, which was supplemented by 1,000 bags from the Manning Market. The ration allotted for the week it was 5,200 bags, which was supplemented by 1,000 bags from the Manning Market. The ration allotted for the week ending September 1 varied from 16 to 18/32. The ration allotted for the week ending August 25 was 16 to 18 and then 32/32.

(d) What is the nett profit made by the Courcil by the sale of rice up to the end of July last, and what is it likely to be for August, and monthly during the succeeding morths and move that the further distribution of rice by this Courcil is both illegal and ur justifiable?—The profit made by the Council by the sale of rice up to end of July last was Rs. 37,353 · 88.

The profit likely to be made ir August is about Rs. 30,000.

(e) Whether the stock of Bangkok rice bought by Government is over, and if not, how much longer will it last?—The Food Controller informs me that there are some 2,400 tons of Bangkok rice still in stock, and a further 7,600 tons due to arrive shortly, which will complete the total amourt arranged for. The figures are approximate only.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo withdrew the motion included in the latter part of his question (d), namely, "That the further distribution of rice by this Council is both illegal and unjustifiable," and stated that he would bring it up at the next

meeting of Council.

5. Mr. C. P. Dias had given notice of the following motion, and in submitting it to the meeting the Chairman, Mr. Dias, stated that Mr. L. B. Fernando, who was absent owing to illness, had informed him that he was fully in accord with the motion. Mr. C. P. Dias having reviewed the period of Mr. R. W. establishment of the same on each of the dates mentioned; (i) Amount expended on the extra and/or temporary hands of the Finance Department during 1917, 1918, and the first half of 1919; (k) Amount expended under the head of stationery during 1917, 1918, and the first half of 1919. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.—Carried.

2. The work shall be done by the contractor at the places named in the orders issued by the head of any Municipal

days after such orders have been served on him and at the rates specified in the schedule hereto Department within

annexed.

The Chairman doth hereby covenant and agree to and with the contractor that he shall and will well and truly pay or cause or procure to be paid to the contractor upon the certificate of the officer who signs the order the value of the work performed under this contract as soon thereafter as accounts and vouchers shall have been prepared and passed.

4. If the work performed by the contractor or any portion thereof be objected to by the officer appointed by the Chairman to supervise the work done as not being satisfactory the contractor shall forthwith re-perform the same work to such officer's satisfaction without any further or extra charge.

Should the contractor fail to perform the work within the period specified in clause 2 of these conditions, or to re-perform the work as mentioned in clause 4 of these conditions, the officer who signs the order will be at liberty to

get the work performed by any other person at whatever price he can get it done.

Should the work so performed by any other person on the order of the officer who signs the order in default of the contractor cost more than the contract rate for the same, the contractor shall pay to the Municipal Council of Colombo the full amount of such excess of cost and all expenses attending the performance of such work, together with a sum of - for every twenty-four hours' delay after the period named aforesaid, as liquidated damages on account of partial failure of his contract.

The payment to which the contractor has made himself liable in the 6th clause of these conditions shall be 7. The payment to which the contractor has made made in the contractor under this or deducted by the Chairman of the Municipal Council from moneys due or to become due to the contractor under this or

any other contracts he may hold or be recovered by action at law.

The contractor shall not give, lend, or advance any money to any officer or servant of the Municipal Council, nor shall he receive or accept or permit any of his servants to receive or accept any extra remuneration or gratification or any money whatever from the persons for whose benefit the work is done by him at the order of the Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo, or from any other person whatever for the performance of any work which he is bound to perform under this contract. If the contractor shall in any manner violate this covenant, or if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Chairman that such extra remuneration or gratification was received or accepted in any single instance, it will be open to the Chairman to cancel the contract and to declare the deposit made under clause 10 hereof to be forfeited.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on September 20, 1919, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated September 16, 1919.

Present: The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. C. A. La Brooy; Dr. Allan de Saram; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle; Mr. F. L. Goonewardene; and Mr. P. M. Bingham.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on August 16, 1919, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and about to be confirmed by the Chairman, when Dr. Attygalle pointed out that in regard to item 7 of the Minutes, mention should be made of his having given notice of dissent. The minutes were accordingly amended by the insertion of the words "Dr. Attygalle gave notice of dissent" at the end of item 7, and confirmed as amended.
 - The following documents were submitted:—
 - (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1918 to August 31, 1919, on account of the Municipal Fund.
 - (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
 - (c) Health Officer's report for August.
 - (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of August
 - (e) The reservoir readings for August.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during August.

- 4. Correspondence:—(1) Letter No. 27 of September 10, 1919, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary inquiring why the Kandy Club wants to build on the portion of land they desire to lease between the Club and the Planters' Association buildings, and whether the Planters' Association has any objection to the proposal.—Read.
- (2) Letter No. 264 of September 11, 1919, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Government Agent, Central Province, re acquisition of land required for the new Infectious Diseases Hospital—for the information of the Chairman.—Read.
- 5. Pursuant to notice, Dr. Attygalle asked—(1) Whether all the public works estimated to cost Rs. 86,000 out of the surplus funds which were not then budgetted would be included in the 1920 Budget, as detailed by him in his reply to His Excellency the Governor to the ratepayers' memorial praying for a reduction of rates?
- (2) If the Chairman is unable to include them in the 1920 Budget, will be state his reasons, and also the likely date they will be taken up?
- (3) Whether the enhanced allowance now recommended would interfere with those works being taken in hand next year?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) Those of the works referred to for which detailed estimates are available will be included by me in the Draft Budget for 1920, whether they will be included in the final Budget depends, of course, on the Council. To the Draft Budget I will append a statement of approximate estimates for those of the works in question for which detailed estimates may not be ready.

- (2) The consideration of the new road through Asgiriya will depend on the War Office giving permission for the portions through military ground, and consideration of the improvements to the water supply, that is, the cost of extension along Peradeniya road will depend on the reply of Government to the letter sent in pursuance of the resolution passed at the last Meeting of Council. The other works should, in my opinion, be taken up at as early as practicable.
- (3) The surplus balances at the end of 1919, according to the 1919 Budget, are estimated in round figures at Rs. 110,000, which would be sufficient to meet the expenditure of Rs. 86,000 referred to and the cost of the scheme of temporary increases recommended by the Special Committee for 1919 and 1920.
- 6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. La Brooy moved—In view of the request by Government for water to the bungalows and the laboratory at the Royal Botanical Gardens, and in order to comply with this request without causing serious inconvenience to the residents of those localities which are now within the water-rate area, that steps may be taken to build an additional reservoir, and that Government be requested to aid this Council in doing so by contributing towards the expenses of the building of this additional reservoir, and by allowing the services of an Engineer to select a site for it and to supervise its construction. Mr Goonewardene seconded.

On the Chairman's suggestion it was agreed to postpone the matter for the next meeting.

- 7. The following motion which stood in the name of Mr. La Brooy was withdrawn with the leave of Council, in view of the action already taken in the matter by the Chairman:—
- In view of the statement made by Mr. Andrews at the Town Hall that the lines occupied by the Municipal coolies are in a very insanitary condition.
- (a) That the Health Officer and the Superintendent of Works be asked to inspect the lines and report as to what improvements they deem necessary to render these lines sanitary.
- (b) That the Superintendent of Works be called upon after such inspection to submit an estimate as to the cost of such proposed improvements.
- 8. Pursuant to notice, Mr. La Brooy moved—As the lease of Roseneath estate will terminate at the end of the year that the estate be not again leased, but that it may be planted with valuable timber trees; and that the Superintendent of Works be asked to submit an estimate of the cost of removing the cacao and planting the land with timber trees. Dr. Attygalle seconded.
- Mr. Goonewardene moved as an amendment—That the matter be referred to a Special Committee consisting of Messrs. La Brooy, Pieris, Dr. Attygalle, and the mover. Mr. Pieris seconded.

The amendment was put to the Meeting and carried.

It was agreed to ask the Superintendent of Works to submit a report first as to steps to be taken on the termination of the present lease for the consideration of the Committee.

- 9. Pursuant to notice Mr. Ratwatte moved—That the Postmaster-General be asked to remove the Post Office at Katugastota to a more central place. Mr. La Brooy seconded.—Carried.
 - 10. Papers re by-laws under the Public Performances Ordinance.

On the Chairman's motion the Council went into Committee,

- Dr. Attygalle suggested that the fee for the annual license for class A, by-law 5, be raised from Rs. 250 to Rs. 350.
- On Mr. Goonewardene's proposal it was agreed to fix the fee at Rs. 300.

The other by-laws as revised by the Law Committee were approved. The Council resumed, and the by-laws as amended in Committee were adopted.

- 11. Report of the Special Committee appointed to consider the question of granting a temporary increase of salaries and pensions to Municipal Officers. Mr. Pieris moved that the report be adopted. Dr. de Saram seconded.
- On Mr. La Brooy's suggestion, supported by Dr. Attygalle, it was resolved that the report be adopted on the understanding that the scheme for 1920 will be considered with the Budget for 1920.
- 12. Papers re the proposed increase of salary of the Superintendent of Sanitation. Mr. Goonewardene moved that the matter lie over. Mr. La Brooy seconded.—Carried.
 - 13. Recommendations of Standing Committees:

Finance and Assessment.

- (1) That Mr. G. B. de Silva, Assistant Government Veterinary Surgeon, be paid an honorarium of Rs. 250 for past years ending December 31, 1918, and a fee of Rs. 100 per annum from January 1, 1919, for work done for the Municipality.
- (2) That the Municipal School Head Teacher be given an increase of Rs. 3 per mensem from June 1, 1919, in accordance with the scale for Government Teachers.

- (3) That the excess deposit of Rs. 32.48 made by collector W. D. C. Appuhamy be refunded to him.
- (4) That the sum of Rs. 23 59 due to the Council from Mr. Wijesinghe, late Clerk to the Medical Officer of Health, be written off
- (5) That the following sums be paid as remuneration to the following officers for work done in connection with the collection of riot compensation:—Accountant, Rs. 125; Chief Clerk, Rs. 100; Accounting Clerk, Rs. 75; Revenue Inspectors, Rs. 100 each; Correspondence Clerk, Rs. 50; Shroff, Rs. 30; First Assistant to the Assessment Clerk, Rs. 25; Second Assistant to the Assessment Clerk, Rs. 25.
- (6) That the sum of Rs. 9.68 be paid to Mr. Mathiesz, substitute employed by the Superintendent of Works during the absence of his clerk on military duty.

Municipal Works.

- (7) That the estimate of Rs. 650 for repairs to the Katugastota toll-house be sanctioned.
- (8) That the following applications for water service be allowed on usual terms:—(i.) 77, Trincomalee street, T. C. S. Fernando; (ii.) 23, Hill street, I. L. M. Sulaima Lebbe.

Resolved that all the recommendations be adopted, except (4) in regard to which it was agreed that a letter of demand be sent for recovery of the amount due.
