"THE POLICE ORDINANCE, No. 16 of 1865."

OTICE is hereby given that His Excellency the Governor, by virtue of the powers in him vested by section 32 of the above named Ordinance, as amended by the Ordinance No. 23 of 1891, has been pleased to place the Police Depôt, the Colombo Division of Police, the Harbour Police, and the Police Forces established in the districts of the Western, Central, Southern, and North-Western Provinces, and in the Kegalla District of the Province of Sabaragamuwa under the direct control of the Headquarter Superintendent, the Superintendent of Police, Colombo, the Deputy Inspector-General of Police, Criminal Investigation Department, and the Superintendents of Police of the Provinces respectively, and to place the Police Forces established in all other districts in Ceylon under the direct control of the Government Agents of the Provinces in which such districts may be situated.

The rules and regulations dated March 21, 1908, and published in the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 6,235 of March 27, 1908, and the amended rules dated October 26, 1909, published in the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 6,337 of October 29, 1909, are repealed, and the following rules and regulations are hereby brought into operation.

RULES REFERRED TO.

1. Inspector-General of Police.—The Inspector-General of Police shall have the immediate control of, and be responsible for, the Police Depôt, the Colombo Police, the Harbour Police, and the Police in the Western, Central, Southern, and North-Western Provinces, and in the Kegalla District of the Province of Sabaragamuwa; and he shall be responsible for the expenditure of the votes allotted to those divisions.

2. He shall from time to time inspect and, if necessary, report on the condition of the Police in each Province for the information of the Governor. He shall note their efficiency, discipline, drill, and the knowledge of their duties possessed by the officers and constables and their manner of performing them, and the results as shown by the state of crime. He shall furnish a general report on the Police for each year. He shall inquire into and advise on all Police matters which may be referred to him by the Government or by the Government Agent of any Province.

3. He shall from time to time, as vacancies occur, recommend to the Governor the appointment or promotion of suitable persons to the rank of Deputy Inspector-General, Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent of Police, and Inspector, and he shall himself appoint or promote all officers of rank subordinate to that of Inspector.

4. He shall furnish constables to the divisions from the Depôt, according to the strength of each division, and shall order all such transfers as may be required.

5. He shall be responsible for the training, clothing, and arming of the Police, and for furnishing them with suitable accourrements.

6. He shall frame rules, subject to the approval of the Governor, respecting the leave, punishment, reward, and payment of the Police, and respecting correspondence and the maintenance of Police records.

7. He shall administer all Departmental Funds, and shall be assisted by a committee in the administration of

the Police Compassionate Fund.

8. Deputy Inspector-General of Police, Criminal Investigation Department.—The Deputy Inspector-General of Police, Criminal Investigation Department, shall be in charge of the Criminal Investigation Department and the Colombo Harbour Police. He shall be responsible for—

The supervision over all persons arriving in, or departing

from, the Island.

Supervision over the importation of arms, cocaine,

opium, bhang, and ganja.

Keeping in touch and corresponding with the Police of other countries regarding the movements of bad characters and persons to be watched.

Collecting and distributing information of importance in

and outside the Island.

Scrutinizing the vernacular and daily press, and keeping agitators and street preachers under observation.

The investigation of intricate and difficult cases of crime specially referred to him.

The Deputy Inspector-General shall report direct to the Government on matters relating to—

- (a) Arrival of foreigners.
- (b) Destitutes.
- (c) Enemy subjects.

(d) Extradition warrants, and persons to be arrested or watched at the request of other countries.

(e) Inquiries by other countries.

(f) The supervision of newspapers and printed matter.

(g) Repatriated immigrants.

(h) Special reports on individuals.

- 9. The Deputy Inspector-General of Police (Provinces).—
 The Deputy Inspector-General of Police (Provinces) shall be responsible to the Inspector-General for—
 - Supervision over the state and investigation of crime in the Colony; supervision over every case of serious crime reported, the pursuit of absconders, and the detection of the offender; seeing that steps are taken for the prevention of crime, and particularly looking out for any unusual outbreak of crime in the Colony; and seeing that adequate arrangements are made to deal with it.

Supervision over the investigation of crime by junior Police Officers in charge of Districts; advising and

instructing them.

Securing co-operation between Police in the Provinces and at Headquarters; collecting and distributing information which has been reported from one Province, and which should be known by other Provinces.

Assuming control at Headquarters in the absence of the Inspector-General on inspection:

10: The Headquarter Superintendent.—The Headquarter Superintendent shall personally assist the Inspector-General of Police in his office. He shall be responsible to the Inspector-General of Police for all accounts and financial matters, assisted by the Chief Clerk. He shall, under the Inspector-General, have charge of the Depôt, and shall be responsible for the performance of the duties that shall be assigned to the Depôt and for its general efficiency. He shall superintend the enrolment of recruits, and arrange for the proper supply of men to fill vacancies in the divisions.

11. The Assistant Superintendent of Police, Headquarters.—The Assistant Superintendent of Police, Headquarters, shall be responsible for all arms, ammunition. clothing, and stores at Headquarters, and for all correspondence relating to the strength and conduct of members of the Force. He shall be responsible for the care of

police horses.

12. The Superintendent of Police, Colombo.—The Superintendent of Police, Colombo, shall, under the Inspector-General, have charge of the Colombo Division of Police. He shall be responsible for its drill, discipline, and general efficiency, and for the performance of the Municipal and other duties assigned to it. He shall have charge of the quarters, arms, ammunition, clothing, and stores, the payment of men, and other financial matters. He shall be directly responsible for the expenditure of the votes allotted to the Police of his division, and shall at the proper date frame his estimate for the cost of the establishment and services of the ensuing year. He shall be authorized to inflict punishments on the members of the division according to law and regulations of the Force. He shall

be responsible for, and personally direct, the preventing and investigation of crime, and the registration and supervision or habitual criminals.

The Superintendent of Police of a Province.—The position of the Superintendent is that of the head of the Police of the Province. He shall be responsible for the management of the Force, its drill, discipline, and general efficiency, and for the proper performance of its duties. He shall have charge of the stations, quarters, arms, ammunition, clothing, and stores, of the payment of the men, and all financial matters. He shall be directly responsible for the expenditure of the votes allotted to the Police of the Province. He shall have authority to inflict punishments upon members of the Force according to law and the

regulations of the Force.

14. The Government Agent is the head of the Province, and is responsible for the orderly administration of the Province, and is empowered to give instructions to any Police Officer in his Province in any matter connected with the prevention, investigation, and detection of crime, or preservation of order. Subject to his general administrative control the responsibility for the maintenance of peace and order devolves upon the Superintendent. He shall personally supervise the prevention, investigation, and detection of crime, and registration and supervision of habitual criminals. The Superintendent shall be permitted to correspond direct with the chief and minor headmen with respect to matters connected with any particular case of crime in their respective divisions, and such headmen shall be, in connection with such matters, bound to comply with his instructions as far as possible. He shall not issue any circulars or general instructions to headmen except through the Government Agent. He shall have no power either to reward, reprimand, or punish such headmen, but he shall report to the Government Agent all cases in which he considers that they are deserving of reward, reprimand, or punishment. He shall seek the advise of the Government Agent on all matters concerning the Province, and shall keep the Government Agent fully and specially informed of all matters relating to the well being and management of the Province from a Police point of view, of the occurrence and progress of all cases of grave crime, and of all charges affecting headmen or public servants or departments. Before any station is established or abolished, or before the location of any station is changed, the consent of the Government Agent must be obtained. The Government Agent will inspect the Police Stations in his Province, and may give such orders as he considers necessary on matters within his jurisdiction. The Government Agent matters within his jurisdiction. The Government Agent will, however, not interfere in departmental matters or matters of clearly internal economy.

115. The position of the Assistant Superintendent of Poice towards the Assistant Government Agent is the same, within his own district, as that between the Govern-

ment Agent and Superintendent.

16. In Provinces in which there is no Superintendent of Police the Government Agent shall be "in charge of" the division of the Police of the Province. He shall be responsible for its discipline and general efficiency, for the payment of the men and other financial matters, and for the clothing, arms, ammunition, and other Government property in the possession of the division. He shall be responsible for the expenditure of the votes allotted to the Police of his Province, and shall at the proper date furnish through the Inspector-General of Police his estimate for the cost of Police Establishment and services for the ensuing year. He shall have authority to inflict punishment on members of the division according to law and the regulations. In such Provinces and in districts in which Police Forces have not been established, the Government Agent shall be responsible for the prevention and investigation of crime, and for the registration and supervision of habitual criminals. The Inspector-General shall advise him on all Police matters, and shall aid generally in the supervision of the Police system. He shall correspond direct with the Inspector-General of Police on all matters affecting the Police in his Province.

17. The Assistant Government Agent shall, under the Government Agent, have the same powers and responsibilities in his district as the Government Agent has in his

Province.\
18. The Government Agents in charge of Police,
\[\text{Superintendents of Police} \] Superintendents and Assistant Superintendents of Police shall assist the Inspector-General in recruiting for the Police.

19. All members of the Police Force shall wear the prescribed uniform, and no change shall be made in the

uniform without the authority of the Governor.
20. Cholera, Plague, Smallpox, and other Infectious Diseases.—Subsistence allowance at the usual rate for sergeants and constables employed on duties connected with cholera, plague, smallpox, or other infectious disease is chargeable to the Municipality or Local Board by whom they are employed, or outside the limits of Municipalities or Local Boards by the Medical Department. They shall not take any part in any actual nursing or administering of medicine, nor shall they be required to perform duty inside a hospital or infected house. They shall only assist at the removal of the sick when a medical man or sanitary officer is present to supervise the removal, and their assistance shall be restricted to protecting those charged with the duty of carrying the patient; they shall not be required, in any case, to take part in the actual carriage of the patient themselves; they shall not take part in the burial of the dead, the disinfection of rooms or houses, or the cleansing of sheds, yards, or other premises, but shall, if required by proper authority, supervise those engaged in these duties.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 29, 1919

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 106 (9 Burghers, 54 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 18 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1919, viz., 285,795) was 19.3, as against 22.4 in the preceding week, 25.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21 5 the weekly average for last year.

-The total deaths registered were 195 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 97 Sinhalese, 38 Tamils, 32 Moors, 6 Malays, and 10 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 35.6, as against 32.8 in the previous week, 29.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 195 total deaths, 41 were of infants under one year of age, as against 37 in the preceding week, 39 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 30 the average for last year.

-The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 3,

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirty deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 11 in Maradana (including 4 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 9 in Kotahena, 3 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island, and 2 each in San Sebastian and St. Paul's, as against 26 in the previous week and 27 the weekly average for last year.

- (b) Fifteen deaths from Influenza were registered, 5 in St. Paul's, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 each in San Sebestian, Kotahena, and Maradana, and I in Wellawatta, as against 12 in the previous week.
 - (c) Two deaths from Bronchitis were registered, as against 5 in the previous week.
- (a) Twelve deaths from Phthisis were registered, 6 in Maradana, 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Pettah, New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Wellawatta as against 11 in the previous week and 13 the weekly average for last year.
 - (b) Two deaths of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama Hospital from Phthisis during the week.
- 3. Nine deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 4 in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in Kotahena, and 1 each in Kollupitiya and Wellawatta, as against 10 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. Four deaths from Plague were registered, 2 in Kotahena and 1 each in Pettah and St. Paul's, as against 9, 9, 5, and 7, respectively, in the four previous weeks.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 78.9°, against 79.4° in the preceding week and 80.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.969 in., against 29.939 in. in the preceding week and 29.925 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3.42 in., against 0.03 in. in the preceding week and 0.64 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.



CENTRAL PROVINCE.

KANDY DISTRICT.

Paddy cultivation: maha weeding and transplanting. .Dry grain cultivation: maha, clearing and sowing.

Prospect of crop: good. Rainfall: satisfactory.

Health of cattle: satisfactory.

Coconut cultivation: erop fair. Prices of staple articles: imported rice sold at controlled prices; country rice, Rs. 10 per bushel; paddy, Rs. 4.50 to Rs. 5 per bushel; kurakkan, Rs. 6 to Rs. 8 per bushel;

coconuts, Rs. 6 to Rs. 10 per 100 nuts.

NUWARA ELIYA DISTRICT.

Rainfall: Nuwara Eliya town, 12:24 in.

Paddy: some fields in the district are being harvested, others have young plants.

Dry grains: kurakkan chenas in Uda Hewaheta and Walapane are being sown.
