GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

“THE CEYLON POST OFFICE ORDINANCE, 1908.”

RULE 47 relating to foreign letters of soldiers and seamen, published in the *Government Gazette* of August 20, 1909, made by the Postmaster-General, in exercise of the powers vested in him by Notification dated December 15, 1908, published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,283 of December 18, 1908, is cancelled, and the following substituted therefor:—

Postal Rates for His Majesty's Ships and His Majesty's Forces.

(a) POSTED IN CEYLON.

Postal Packets to and from His Majesty's Ships in Ceylon Waters.—The ordinary inland rates will apply to all classes of postal packets, including parcels.

Postal Packets addressed to His Majesty's Ships in Home and Foreign Waters and His Majesty's Troops serving Abroad.—The rates charged on packets for the United Kingdom and British Possessions will apply, viz., 9 cents per ounce for letters, 6 cents for post cards, &c. The ordinary parcel post rates will apply.

(b) FOR DELIVERY IN CEYLON.

Insufficiently prepaid packets will be charged on delivery with double the amount of the deficiency.

Parcels re-directed abroad will be charged fresh postage at single rate.

2. This Notification shall come into operation on September 1, 1920, except in the case of postal articles, to and from His Majesty's Forces serving in Mesopotamia, to which the substituted rule will apply from December 1, 1920.

“THE LOCAL BOARDS ORDINANCE, 1898.”

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. The keeping of pigs shall be in all cases subject to the regulation, supervision, and control of the Local Board.

2. No pig shall be kept except in a sty or enclosure situated at a distance of not less than 50 feet from any dwelling house or place of human habitation.

3. No pigsty shall be kept so as to be a nuisance to any person residing in the town or making use of any public road.

4. Every pigsty shall be subject to inspection by the officers of the Local Board, and shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition.

5. Every pig found straying outside the sty or enclosure in which it should be kept shall be liable to seizure by any person thereunto authorized by the Chairman in writing.

6. Every pig so seized shall be placed in a pound, and the following charges shall be paid before the removal of any pig so impounded, viz.:—

For occupation, 50 cents a head for a day or part of a day.
For food if supplied, 15 cents a head for a day or part of a day.

7. Every pig seized and not claimed and removed within three days may be sold by public auction, and the charges and costs recovered from the proceeds.

TENDERS are hereby invited for the supply of telegraph posts during 1920-21, to be completed as specified in the schedule annexed below. The area to be exploited for the supplies and further details are given in the schedule.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Office of the Controller of Revenue, Colombo.

3. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box of the Office of the Controller of Revenue, or be sent through the post.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tender for Telegraph Posts Supply, 1920-21, Northern Division," in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Controller of Revenue not later than midday on Tuesday, September 14, 1920.

5. Tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Forest Office, Jaffna, which can be applied for by post or by personal application. No tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the tenders may be treated as informal and rejected.

6. A deposit of Rs. 20 will be required to be made either at the Treasury or Kachcheri, and a receipt forwarded or produced before any form of tender is issued. Should any person decline or fail to enter into the contract and bond after he has tendered, or to furnish approved security, within ten days of receiving notice from the Head of the Department, or his duly authorized representative, that his tender has been accepted, such deposit shall be forfeited to the Crown, and the defaulter will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

7. Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the contract.

8. Sufficient sureties will be required to join in a bond for the due fulfilment of the contract. The amount of the bond, and all other information, can be ascertained on application to the office referred to in section 5. A further security in cash of 5 per cent. of the value of the contract will be required of the contractor when entering into the bond.

9. Separate rates per telegraph post of each dimension and also rate per sleeper, broad gauge and per sleeper narrow gauge, must be quoted in both words and figures.

10. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

11. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and of accepting any portion of a tender not necessarily the lowest tender.

12. The contract may not be assigned nor sublet without the authority of the Tender Board previously obtained, and if not obtained the contract will become null and void.

13. The contractor must not issue a power of attorney to a person whose name is on the list of defaulting contractors authorizing him to carry on the work.

14. Further, the contractor shall not employ any person whose name is on the list of defaulting contractors, nor any person whom the Assistant Conservator of Forests, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, objects to after giving due notice of seven days in writing.

15. Tenderers before tendering should inspect the area of operations as shown in the schedule.

16. For further information, and for inspection of the draft contract, application should be made to the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Northern Division, Jaffna.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

(1) Trees to be felled 6 in. from the ground by saw and axe or saw alone.

(2) Only such trees as are stamped and marked by the Forest Ranger are to be felled, and no sound trees below 4½ ft. in girth will be marked or should be felled.

(3) Parts of logs attacked by fungus or defective parts are not to be sawn into telegraph posts or sleepers. The telegraph posts and sleepers are to be sawn from sound matured wood, free from shakes, cracks, sapwood, and large or loose knots.

(4) Any top pieces which are sound and cannot be converted into telegraph posts are to be sawn into sleepers, but on no account is timber utilizable for telegraph posts to be converted into sleepers.

(5) Telegraph posts and sleepers are to be rectangular in form and sawn perfectly parallel on all sides. On no account will squaring of logs, telegraph posts, or sleepers, with adze or axe be allowed. Frame saws are not to be used for sawing but pit saws.

(6) Broad gauge sleepers are to be 9 ft. by 10 in. by 5 in., and narrow gauge sleepers 5 ft. by 9 in. by 4½ in. or 5 ft. by 10 in. by 5 in.

(7) Telegraph posts and sleepers should be covered with saw dust or immersed in water, and be invariably placed under shade immediately they are sawn, until they can be transported to delivery depôts, where they should be stacked and kept under shade in the manner to be pointed out by the Forest Ranger.

(8) Rejected telegraph posts and sleepers will not be paid for, and they will lapse to Government, as well as all refuse wood in the above operations. The contractor shall have no claim in respect of any material sold as rejections.

(9) Payment may be made for telegraph posts and sleepers accepted by the Assistant Conservator of Forests at delivery depôt.

(10) The felling is to commence on October 15, 1920, and the telegraph posts are to be delivered at the delivery depôt referred to in the schedule below by December 31, 1920.

2. A separate tender should be submitted for each service.

3. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Office of the Controller of Revenue, Colombo.

4. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the Office of the Controller of Revenue, or be sent through the post.

5. Tenders should be marked "Tender for Sleepers, Southern Division, 1920-21," in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Controller of Revenue not later than midday on Tuesday, September 21, 1920.

6. The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Forest Office, Matara, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the tenders may be treated as informal and rejected.

7. A deposit of Rs. 20 will be required to be made either at the Treasury or Kachcheri for each service, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. Should any person decline or fail to enter into the contract and bond after he has tendered, or fail to furnish approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Head of the Department, or his duly authorized representative, that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown, and the defaulter will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

8. Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the contract.

9. Sufficient sureties will be required to join in a bond for the due fulfilment of the contract. The amount of the bond, and all other necessary information, can be ascertained upon application at the office referred to in section 6. A further security in cash of 5 per cent. of the value of the contract will be required of the contractor when entering into the bond.

10. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

11. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.

12. The contract may not be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Tender Board previously obtained, nor shall the contractor issue a power of attorney to a person whose name is in the list of defaulting contractors authorizing him to carry on the contract. Further, the contractor shall not employ any person whose name is in the list of defaulting contractors, nor any person whom the Assistant Conservator of Forests, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, objects to after giving due notice in writing.

13. Separate rates per sleeper, broad gauge and narrow gauge, and scantlings per cubic foot must be quoted, written both in words and figures.

14. Persons desirous of tendering are advised to acquaint themselves carefully of the nature of the work and of the contract they will be required to sign.

15. For any further information, and for inspection of the draft contract, application should be made to the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Southern Division, Matara.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. Trees are to be felled within 6 inches from the ground by saw or axe and saw combined.

2. Only such trees as are stamped and marked by the Forest Ranger are to be felled, and no sound trees below 4 feet 6 inches in girth will be marked or should be felled.

3. All suitable dead and hollow trees and branchwood within the forest such are marked by the Forest Officer, though below 4 feet 6 inches in girth, should, in addition,

to all matured sound trees marked by him, be utilized for conversion into sleepers as may be directed.

4. Part of logs attacked by fungus or defective parts of logs are not to be sawn into sleepers. The sleepers should be sawn from sound matured wood, free from shakes, cracks, sapwood, and large or loose knots.

(5) Broad gauge sleepers are to be 9 ft. by 10 in. by 5 in., and narrow gauge sleepers 5 ft. by 9 in. by 4½ in. or 5 ft. by 10 in. by 5 in. The sizes of scantlings to be sawn are—

6. Sleepers should be rectangular in form, and sawn perfectly parallel on all sides. On no account will squaring of logs or sleepers with an adze or axe be allowed.

7. Sleepers should be covered with saw dust or immersed in water, and be invariably placed under shade immediately they are sawn, until they can be transported to delivery depôts, where they should be stacked and kept under shade in the manner to be pointed out by the Forest Ranger.

8. Rejected sleepers will not be paid for, and they will lapse to Government, as well as all refuse wood in the sleeper operations. The contractor shall have no claim in respect of any material sold as rejections.

9. The contractor may be paid on account a proportionate rate for sleepers sawn, but not removed to delivery depôts in cases when it shall be deemed expedient to do so by the Conservator of Forests.

10. Payment may be made for sleepers accepted by the Assistant Conservator of Forests at delivery depôts.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE "L. L. P." ESTATES, LIMITED.

It is agreed as follows:—

1. *Table C not to apply, Company to be governed by these Articles.*—The regulations contained in Table C in the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," shall not apply to this Company, which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Articles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolution.
2. *Power to alter the regulations.*—The Company may, by special resolution, alter and make provisions instead of, or in addition to, any of the regulations of the Company, whether contained and comprised in these Articles or not.
3. None of the funds of the Company shall be employed in the purchase of or be lent on shares of the Company.

INTERPRETATION.

4. *Interpretation Clause.*—In the interpretation of these presents the following words and expressions shall have the following meanings, unless such meanings be inconsistent with, or repugnant to, the subject or context:—

Company.—The word "Company" means "The "L. L. P." Estates, Limited," incorporated or established by or under the Memorandum of Association to which these Articles are attached.

The Ordinance.—"The Ordinance" means and includes "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinances, 1861 to 1909," and every other Ordinance from time to time in force concerning Joint Stock Companies which may apply to the Company.

Special resolution.—"Special resolution" has the meaning assigned thereto by the Ordinance.

Extraordinary resolution.—"Extraordinary resolution" means a resolution passed by three-fourths in number and value of such Shareholders of the Company for the time being entitled to vote as may be present at any meeting of the Company of which notice specifying an intention to propose such resolution as an extraordinary resolution has been duly given.

These presents.—"These presents" means and includes the Memorandum of Association and the Articles of Association of the Company from time to time in force.

Capital.—"Capital" means the capital for the time being raised or authorized to be raised for the purposes of the Company.

Shares.—"Shares" means the shares from time to time into which the capital of the Company may be divided.

Shareholder.—"Shareholder" means a Shareholder of the Company.

Presence or present.—With regard to a Shareholder "presence or present" at a meeting means presence or present personally or by proxy or by attorney duly authorized.

Directors.—"Directors" means the Directors for the time being of the Company or (as the case may be) the Directors assembled at a Board.

Board.—"Board" means a meeting of the Directors or (as the context may require) the Directors assembled at a Board meeting, acting through at least a quorum of their body in the exercise of authority duly given to them.

Persons.—"Persons" means partnerships, associations, corporations, companies unincorporated or incorporated by Ordinance and registration, as well as individuals.

Office.—"Office" means the registered office for the time being of the Company.

Seal.—"Seal" means the common seal for the time being of the Company.

Month.—"Month" means a calendar month.

Writing.—"Writing" means printed matter or print as well as writing.

Singular and plural number.—Words importing the singular number only include the plural, and *vice versa*.

Masculine and feminine gender.—Words importing the masculine gender only include the feminine, and *vice versa*.

BUSINESS.

5. *Commencement of Business.*—The Company may proceed to carry out the objects for which it is established, and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit; and notwithstanding that the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, applied for, or allotted, they shall do so as soon as, in the judgment of the Directors, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or applied for.

6. *Business to be carried on by Directors.*—The business of the Company shall be carried on by or under the management or direction of the Directors, and subject only to the control of General Meetings, in accordance with these presents.

CAPITAL.

7. *Nominal Capital.*—The nominal capital of the Company is Two million Rupees (Rs. 2,000,000) divided into Two hundred thousand (200,000) shares of Ten Rupees (Rs. 10) each.

SHARES.

8. *Allotment and Issue.*—The shares, except where otherwise provided, shall be allotted at the discretion of and by the Directors, who may from time to time issue any unissued shares and may add to such shares such an amount of premium as they may consider proper; provided that such unissued shares shall be first offered by the Directors to the registered Shareholders for the time being of the Company as nearly as possible in proportion to the shares already held by them, and such shares as shall not be accepted by the Shareholder or Shareholders to whom the shares shall have been offered within the time specified in that behalf by the Directors may be disposed of by the Directors in such manner as they think most beneficial to the Company; provided also that the Directors may at their discretion allot any unissued shares in payment for any estates or lands or other property purchased or acquired by the Company without first offering such shares to the registered Shareholders for the time being of the Company, and may make arrangements on an issue of shares for a difference between the holders of such shares in the amount of calls to be paid and the time of payment of such calls.

9. *Payment of amount of shares by instalments.*—If by the conditions of allotment of any share the whole or part of the amount thereof shall be payable by instalments, every such instalment shall, when due, be paid to the Company by the holder of the share.

10. *Acceptance.*—Every person taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof by writing under his hand in such form as the Company from time to time directs.

11. *Payment.*—Payment for shares shall be made in such manner as the Directors shall from time to time determine and direct.

12. *Shares held by a firm.*—Shares may be registered in the name of a firm, and any partner of the firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm shall be entitled to vote and to give proxies, but not more than one partner may vote at a time.

13. *Shares held by two or more persons not in partnership.*—Shares may be registered in the names of two or more persons not in partnership.

14. *One of joint-holders other than a firm may give receipts; only one of joint-holders resident in Ceylon entitled to vote.*—Any one of the joint-holders of a share, other than a firm, may give effectual receipts for any dividends payable in respect of such share; but only one of such joint-Shareholders shall be entitled to the right of voting and of giving proxies and exercising the other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, and if the joint-holders cannot arrange amongst themselves as to who shall vote or give proxies and exercise such other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, the Shareholder whose name stands first on the register of shares shall vote or give proxies and exercise those rights and powers; provided, however, that in the event of such first registered Shareholder being absent from the Island, the first registered Shareholder then resident in Ceylon shall vote or give proxies and exercise all such rights and powers as aforesaid.

15. *Survivor of joint-holders, other than a firm, only recognized.*—In case of the death of any one or more of the joint-holders, other than a firm, of any shares, the survivor or survivors shall be the only person or persons recognized by the Company as having any title to, or interest in, such shares.

16. *Liability of joint-holders.*—The joint-holders of a share shall be severally as well as jointly liable for the payment of all instalments and calls due in respect of such share.

17. *Trusts or any interest in share other than that of registered holder or of any person under clause 38 not recognized.*—The Company shall not be bound to recognize (even though having notice of) any contingent, future, partial, or equitable interest in the nature of a trust or otherwise in any share, or any other right in respect of any share, except any absolute right thereto in the person from time to time registered as the holder thereof, and except also the right of any person under clause 38 to become a Shareholder in respect of any share.

INCREASE OF CAPITAL.

18. *Increase of capital by creation of new shares.*—The Company in General Meeting may, by special resolution from time to time, increase the capital by creation of new shares of such amount per share and in the aggregate, and with such special, preferential, deferred, qualified, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto as such resolution shall direct.

19. *Issue of new shares.*—The new shares shall be issued upon such terms and conditions and with such preferential, deferred, qualified, special, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto as the General Meeting resolving on the creation thereof or any other General Meeting of the Company shall direct; and in particular such shares may be issued with a preferential or qualified right to the dividends and in the distribution of assets of the Company, and with a special or without any right of voting. The Directors shall have power to add to such new shares such an amount of premium as they may consider proper.

20. *How carried into effect.*—Subject to any direction to the contrary that may be given by the meeting that sanctions the increase of capital, all new shares shall be offered to the Shareholders in proportion to the existing shares held by them: Such offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares to which the Shareholder is entitled, and limiting a time within which the offer if not accepted will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration of such time, or on the receipt of an intimation from the Shareholder to whom such notice is given that he declines to accept the shares offered, the same shall be disposed of in such manner as the Directors may determine. Provided that the Directors may, at their discretion, allot such new shares or any portion of them in payment for any estates or lands or other property purchased or acquired by the Company, without first offering such shares to the registered Shareholders for the time being of the Company.

21. *Same as original capital.*—Except so far as otherwise provided by the conditions of issue or by these presents, any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original capital, and shall be subject to the provisions herein contained with reference to the payments of calls and instalments, transfer, transmission, forfeiture, lien, surrender, and otherwise.

REDUCTION OF CAPITAL AND SUBDIVISION OR CONSOLIDATION OF SHARES.

22. *Reduction of capital and subdivision or consolidation of shares.*—The Company in General Meeting may by special resolution reduce the capital in such manner as such special resolution shall direct, and may by special resolution subdivide or consolidate the shares of the Company or any of them.

SHARE CERTIFICATES.

23. *Certificates how issued.*—Every Shareholder shall be entitled to one certificate for all the shares registered in his name, or to several certificates, each for one or more of such shares. Every certificate shall specify the number of the share in respect of which it is issued.

24. *Certificate to be under seal of company.*—The certificates of shares shall be issued under the seal of the Company.

25. *Renewal of certificate.*—If any certificate be worn out or defaced, then upon production thereof to the Directors they may order the same to be cancelled and may issue a new certificate in lieu thereof; and if any certificate be lost or destroyed, then, upon proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Directors, and on such indemnity as the Directors deem adequate being given, a new certificate in lieu thereof shall be given to the person entitled to such lost or destroyed certificate. A sum of fifty cents shall be payable for such new certificate.

26. *Certificate to be delivered to the first named of joint-holders not a firm.*—The certificate of shares registered in the names of two or more persons not a firm shall be delivered to the person first named on the register.

TRANSFER OF SHARES.

27. *Exercise of rights.*—No person shall exercise any right of a Shareholder until his name shall have been entered in the register of Shareholders and he shall have paid all calls and other moneys for the time being payable on every share in the Company held by him.

28. *Transfer of shares.*—Subject to the restriction of the Articles, any Shareholder may transfer all or any of his shares by instrument in writing.

29. *No transfer to minor or person of unsound mind.*—No transfer of shares shall be made to a minor or person of unsound mind.

30. *Register of transfers.*—The Company shall keep a book or books, to be called "The Register of Transfers, in which shall be entered the particulars of every transfer or transmission of any share.

31. *Instrument of transfer.*—The instrument of transfer of any share shall be signed both by the transferor and transferee, and the transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of such share until the name of the transferee is entered in the register in respect thereof.

32. *Board may decline to register transfers.*—The Board may, at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion, decline to register any transfer of shares by a Shareholder who is indebted to the Company, or upon whose shares the Company have a lien or otherwise; or to any person not approved by them.

33. *Not bound to state reason.*—In no case shall a Shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the Directors to state the reason of their refusal to register, but their declinature shall be absolute.

34. *Registration of transfer.*—Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered, accompanied by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and a fee of Rs. 2 50, or such other sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid; and thereupon the Directors, subject to the powers vested in them by Articles 32, 33, and 35, shall register the transferee as Shareholder and retain the instrument of transfer.

35. *Directors may authorize registration of transferees.*—The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorize the registration of transferees as Shareholders without the necessity of any meeting of the Directors for that purpose.

36. *Directors not bound to inquire as to validity of transfer.*—In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these Articles; and whether they abstain from so inquiring or do so inquire and are misled, the transferor shall have no claim whatsoever upon the Company in respect of the share, except for the dividends previously declared in respect thereof, but, if at all, upon the transferee only.

37. *Transfer books when to be closed.*—The Transfer Books may be closed during the fourteen days immediately preceding each Ordinary General Meeting, including the First General Meeting; also when a dividend is declared, for the three days next ensuing the meeting; also at such other times as the Directors may decide, not exceeding in the whole twenty-one days in any one year.

TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

38. *Title to shares of deceased holder.*—The executors or administrators or the heirs of a deceased Shareholder shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to shares of such Shareholder.

39. *Registration of persons entitled to shares otherwise than by transfer.*—Any curator of any minor Shareholder, any committee of a lunatic Shareholder, or any person becoming entitled to shares in consequence of the death, bankruptcy, or liquidation of any Shareholder, or the marriage of any female Shareholder, or in any other way than by transfer, shall, upon producing such evidence that he sustains the character in respect of which he proposes to act under this clause, or of his title, as the Company think sufficient, be forthwith entitled, subject to the provisions herein contained, to be registered as a Shareholder in respect of such shares on payment of a fee of Rs. 2 50; or may, subject to the regulations as to transfers hereinbefore contained, transfer the same to some other person.

40. *Failing such registration shares may be sold by the Company.*—If any person who shall become entitled to be registered in respect of any share under clause 39, shall not, from any cause whatever within twelve calendar months after the event on the happening of which his title shall accrue, be registered in respect of such share, or if in the case of the death of any Shareholder no person shall, within twelve calendar months after such death, be registered as a Shareholder in respect of the shares of such deceased Shareholder, the Company may sell such shares, either by public auction or private contract, and give a receipt for the purchase money; and the purchaser shall be entitled to be registered in respect of such share, and shall not be bound to inquire whether the events have happened which entitled the Company to sell the same; the nett proceeds of such sale, after deducting all expenses and all moneys in respect of which the Company is entitled to a lien on the shares so sold, shall be paid to the person entitled thereto.

SURRENDER AND FORFEITURE OF SHARES.

41. *The Directors may accept surrender of shares.*—The Directors may accept, in the name and for the benefit of the Company, and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon, a surrender of the shares of Shareholders who may be desirous of retiring from the Company.

42. (a) *If call or instalment be not paid, notice to be given to Shareholder.*—If any Shareholder fails to pay any call or instalment on or before the day appointed for the payment of the same, the Directors may at any time thereafter, during such time as the call or instalment remains unpaid, serve a notice on such Shareholder or his executors or administrators, or the trustee or assignee in his bankruptcy, requiring him to pay the same, together with any interest that may have accrued, at the rate of 9 per cent. per annum, and all expenses that may have been incurred by the Company by reason of such non-payment.

(b) *Terms of notice.*—The notice shall name a day (not being less than one month from the date of the notice) on and a place or places at which such call or instalment and such interest and expenses as aforesaid are to be paid; the notice shall also state that, in the event of non-payment at or before the time and at the place appointed the shares in respect of which the call was made or instalment is payable will be liable to be forfeited.

(c) *In default of payment, shares to be forfeited.*—If the requisition of such notice as aforesaid be not complied with every or any share or shares in respect of which such notice has been given may at any time thereafter, before payment of calls or instalments, with interest and expenses due in respect thereof, be declared forfeited by a resolution of the Board to that effect.

(d) *Shareholder still liable to pay money owing at time of forfeiture.*—Any Shareholder whose shares have been so declared forfeited shall notwithstanding be liable to pay and shall forthwith pay to the Company all calls, instalments, interest, and expenses owing upon or in respect of such shares at the time of the forfeiture, together with interest thereon from the time of forfeiture until payment at 9 per cent. per annum, and the Directors may enforce the payment thereof if they think fit.

43. *Surrendered or forfeited shares to be the property of the Company, and may be sold, &c.*—Every share surrendered or so declared forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may be sold, re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of upon such terms and in such manner as the Board shall think fit.

44. *Effect of surrender or forfeiture.*—The surrender or forfeiture of a share shall involve the extinction of all interest in, and also of all claims and demands against, the Company in respect of the share and the proceeds thereof, and all other rights incident to the share, except only such of those rights (if any) as by these presents are expressly saved.

45. (a) *Certificates of surrender or forfeiture.*—A certificate in writing under the hands of two of the Directors and of the Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries that a share has been duly surrendered or forfeited, stating the time when it was surrendered or forfeited; shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons who would have been entitled to the share but for such surrender or forfeiture; and such certificate and the receipt of the Company for the price of such share shall constitute a good title to such share, and a certificate of proprietorship shall be delivered to any person who may purchase the same from the Company; such purchaser thereupon shall be deemed the holder of such share, discharged from all calls due prior to such purchase, and he shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money, nor shall his title to such share be affected by any irregularity in the proceedings in reference to such forfeiture or sale.

(b) *Forfeiture may be remitted.*—The Directors may in their discretion remit or annul the forfeiture of any share within six months from the date thereof upon the payment of all moneys due to the Company from the late holder or holders of such share or shares, and all expenses incurred in relation to such forfeiture, together with such further sum of money by way of redemption money for the deficit, as they shall think fit, not being less than 9 per cent. per annum on the amount of the sums wherein default in payment had been made, but no share *bona fide* sold, re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of under Article 43 hereof shall be redeemable after sale or disposal.

46. *Company's lien on shares.*—The Company shall have a first charge or paramount lien upon all the shares of any holder or joint-holders for all moneys for the time being due to the Company by such holder, or by all or any of such joint-holders respectively, either in respect of such shares or of other shares held by such holder or joint-holders or otherwise, and whether due from any such holder individually or jointly with others, including all calls, resolutions for which shall have been passed by the Directors, although the times appointed for the payment thereof shall not have arrived; and where any share is held by more persons than one the Company shall be entitled to the said charge or lien in respect of any money due to the Company from any of such persons. The Directors may decline to register any transfer of share subject to such charge or lien.

47. *Lien how made available.*—Such charge or lien may be made available by a sale of all or any of the shares subject to it, provided that no such sale shall be made except under a resolution of the Directors, and until notice in writing shall have been given to the indebted Shareholder or his executors or administrators, or the assignee or trustee in his bankruptcy, requiring him or them to pay the amount for the time being due to the Company, and default shall have been made for twenty-eight days from such notice in paying the sum thereby required to be paid. Should the Shareholder over whose share the lien exists be in England or elsewhere abroad, sixty days' notice shall be allowed him.

48. *Proceeds how applied.*—The net proceeds of any such sale as aforesaid under the provisions of Articles 43 and 47 hereof shall be applied in or towards the satisfaction of such debts, liabilities, or engagements, and the residue (if any) shall be paid to such Shareholder or his representatives.

49. *Certificate of sale.*—A certificate in writing under the hands of two of the Directors and of the Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries that the power of sale given by clause 47 has arisen, and is exercisable by the Company under these presents, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated.

50. *Transfer on sale how executed.*—Upon any such sale two of the Directors may execute a transfer of such share to the purchaser thereof, and such transfer, with the certificate last aforesaid, shall confer on the purchaser a complete title to such shares.

PREFERENCE SHARES.

51. *Preference and deferred shares.*—Any shares from time to time to be issued or created may from time to time be issued with any such right or preference, whether in respect of dividend or of payment of capital, or both, or any such other special privilege or advantage over any shares previously issued or then about to be issued (other than shares issued with a preference), or with such deferred rights as compared with any shares previously issued or then about to be issued, or subject to any such conditions or provisions, and with any such right or without any right of voting, and generally on such terms as the Company may, from time to time by special resolution, determine.

52. *Modification of rights and consent thereto.*—If at any time by the issue of preference shares or otherwise the capital is divided into shares of different classes—

- (1) The holders of any class of shares by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders may consent, on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class, to the issue or creation of any shares ranking equally therewith, or having any priority thereto, or the abandonment of any preference or priority, or of any accrued dividend, or the reduction for any time or permanently of the dividends payable thereon, or to any scheme for the reduction of the Company's capital affecting the class of shares;
- (2) All or any of the rights, privileges, and conditions attached to each class may be commuted, abrogated, abandoned, added to, or otherwise modified by a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, provided the holders of any class of shares affected by any such commutation, abrogation, abandonment, addition, or other modification of such rights, privileges, and conditions consent thereto, on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class, by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders.

Any extraordinary resolution passed under the provisions of this Article shall be binding upon all the holders of shares of the class, provided that this Article shall not be read as implying the necessity for such consent as aforesaid in any case in which but for this Article the object of the resolution could have been effected without it.

53. *Meeting affecting a particular class of shares.*—Any meeting for the purpose of the last preceding clause shall be convened and conducted in all respects as nearly as possible in the same way as an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, provided that no Shareholder, not being a Director, shall be entitled to notice thereof or to attend thereat, unless he be a holder of shares of the class intended to be affected by the resolution, and that no vote shall be given except in respect of a share of that class, and that at any such meeting a poll may be demanded in writing by any Shareholder personally present and entitled to vote at the meeting.

CALLS.

54. (a) *Directors may make calls.*—The Directors may from time to time make such calls as they think fit upon the registered holders of shares, in respect of moneys unpaid thereon, and not by the conditions of allotment made payable at fixed times; and each Shareholder shall pay the amount of every call so made on him to the persons and at the times and places appointed by the Directors, provided that two months' notice at least shall be given to the Shareholders of the time and place appointed for payment of each call.

(b) *Calls, time when made.*—A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution authorizing the call was passed at a Board Meeting of the Directors or by resolution in writing in terms of Article 120.

(c) *Extension of time for payment of call.*—The Directors shall have power in their absolute discretion to give time to any one or more Shareholder or Shareholders, exclusive of the others, for payment of any call or part thereof on such terms as the Directors may determine. But no Shareholder shall be entitled to any such extension except as a matter of grace or favour.

55. *Interest on unpaid call.*—If the sum payable in respect of any call or instalment is not paid on or before the day appointed for the payment thereof, the holder for the time being of the share in respect of which the call shall have been made, or the instalments shall have been due, shall pay interest for the same at the rate of 9 per centum per annum from the day appointed for the payment thereof to the time of the actual payment, but the Directors may, when they think fit, remit altogether or in part any sum becoming payable for interest under this clause.

56. *Payments in anticipation of calls.*—The Directors may at their discretion receive from any Shareholder willing to advance the same, and upon such terms as they think fit, all or any part of the amount of his shares beyond the sum actually called up.

BORROWING POWERS.

57. (a) *Power to borrow.*—The Directors shall have power to procure from time to time, in the usual course of business, such temporary advances on the produce in hand, or in the future to be obtained from the Company's estates, as they may find necessary or expedient for the purpose of defraying the expenses of working the Company's estates, or of erecting, maintaining, improving, or extending buildings, machinery, or plantations, or otherwise. Also from time to time at their discretion to borrow or raise from the Directors or other persons any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company, but so that the amount at any one time owing in respect of moneys so borrowed or raised shall not, without the sanction of a General Meeting, exceed the sum of Five hundred thousand Rupees (Rs. 500,000). With the sanction of a General Meeting, the Directors shall be entitled to borrow such further sum or sums, and at such rate of interest as such meeting shall determine. The Directors may, for the purpose of securing the repayment of any such sum or sums of money so

borrowed or raised, create and issue any mortgages, debentures, mortgage debentures, debenture stock, bonds, or obligations of the Company, charged upon all or any part of the undertaking, revenue, property, and rights, or assets of the Company (both present and future), including uncalled capital or unpaid calls, or give, accept, or endorse on behalf of the Company any promissory notes or bills of exchange. Provided also that before the Directors execute any mortgage, issue any debentures, or create any debenture stock they shall obtain the sanction thereto of the Company in General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, notice of the intention to obtain such sanction at such meeting having been duly given. Any such securities may be issued either at par or at a premium or discount, and may from time to time be cancelled, or discharged, varied, or exchanged as the Directors may think fit, and may contain any special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment of shares, or otherwise. Every debenture or other instrument issued by the Company for securing the payment of money may be so framed that the moneys thereby secured shall be assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued. A declaration under the Company's seal contained in or endorsed upon any of the documents mentioned in this Article and subscribed by two or more of the Directors, or by one Director and the Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries, to the effect that the Directors have power to borrow the amount which such document may represent, shall be conclusive evidence thereof in all questions between the Company and its creditors, and no such document containing such declaration shall, as regards the creditor, be void on the ground of its being granted in excess of the aforesaid borrowing power, unless it shall be proved that such creditor was aware that it was so granted.

(b) *Immediate debenture issue.*—Without prejudice to any of the powers and provisions of Article 57 (a) hereof, and without the necessity of obtaining the sanction of the Company in General Meeting therefor, the Directors shall have power to raise and borrow immediately a sum not exceeding Three hundred thousand Rupees (Rs 300,000) by the creation and issue of Three thousand (3,000) redeemable debentures of One hundred rupees (Rs. 100), each carrying interest at eight (8) per centum per annum and to secure the same by a primary mortgage over the Company's estates

MEETINGS.

58. *First General Meeting.*—The First General Meeting of the Company shall be held at such time, not being more than twelve months after the registration of the Company, and at such place as the Directors may determine.

59. *Subsequent General Meetings.*—Subsequent General Meetings shall be held once in every year at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, and if no time or place is prescribed, at such time and place as may be determined by the Directors.

60. *Ordinary and Extraordinary General Meetings.*—The General Meetings mentioned in the last two preceding clauses shall be called Ordinary General Meetings; all other meetings of the Company shall be called Extraordinary General Meetings.

61. *Extraordinary General Meetings.*—The Directors may, whenever they think fit, call an Extraordinary General Meeting, and the Directors shall do so upon a requisition made in writing by not less than one-seventh of the number of Shareholders holding not less than one-seventh of the issued capital and entitled to vote.

62. *Requisition of Shareholders to state object of meeting; on receipt of requisition, Directors to call meeting, and in default Shareholders may do so.*—Any requisition so made shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called, shall be addressed to the Directors, and shall be sent to the registered office of the Company. Upon the receipt of such requisition the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such time and place as they shall determine. If they do not proceed to convene the same within seven days from the delivery of the requisition, the requisitionists may themselves convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such place and at such time as the Shareholders convening the meeting may themselves fix.

63. *Notice of resolution.*—Any Shareholder may, on giving not less than ten days' previous notice of any resolution, submit the same to a meeting. Such notice shall be given by leaving a copy of the resolution at the registered office of the Company.

64. *Seven days' notice of meeting to be given.*—Seven days' notice at least of every General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, and by whomsoever convened, specifying the place, date, hour of meeting, and the objects and business of the meeting, shall be given either by advertisement in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*, or by notice sent by post, or otherwise served as hereinafter provided, but an accidental omission to give such notice to any Shareholder shall not invalidate the proceedings at any General Meeting.

65. *Business requiring and not requiring notification.*—Every Ordinary General Meeting shall be competent, without special notice having been given of the purposes for which it is convened, or of the business to be transacted thereat, to receive and discuss any report and any accounts presented thereto by the Directors, and to pass resolutions in approval or disapproval thereof, and to declare dividends, and to elect Directors and Auditors retiring in rotation, and to fix the remuneration of the Auditors; and shall also be competent to enter upon, discuss, and transact any business whatever of which special mention shall have been made in the notice or notices upon which the meeting was convened.

66. *Notice of other business to be given.*—With the exceptions mentioned in the foregoing Articles as to the business which may be transacted at Ordinary General Meetings without notice, no General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be competent to enter upon, discuss, or transact any business which has not been specially mentioned in the notice or notices upon which it was convened.

67. *Quorum to be present.*—No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting, except the declaration of a dividend recommended by a report of the Directors or the election of a Chairman, unless there shall be present in person at the commencement of the business three or more persons being Shareholders entitled to vote or persons holding proxies or powers of attorney from Shareholders entitled to vote.

68. *If a quorum not present, meeting to be dissolved or adjourned; adjourned meeting to transact business.*—If at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of persons shall not be present at the meeting, the meeting, if convened by or upon the requisition of Shareholders, shall be dissolved, but in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place; and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present, those Shareholders who are present shall be a quorum, and may transact the business for which the meeting was called.

69. *Chairman of Directors or a Director to be Chairman of General Meeting; in case of their absence or refusal, a Shareholder may act.*—The Chairman (if any) of the Directors shall be entitled to take the Chair at every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary; but if there be no Chairman, or if at any meeting he shall not be present within 15 minutes after the time appointed for holding such meeting, or if he shall refuse to take the Chair, the Shareholders shall choose another Director as Chairman; and if no Directors be present, or if all the Directors present decline to take the Chair, then the Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman.

70. *Business confined to election of Chairman while Chair vacant.*—No business shall be discussed at any General Meeting except the election of a Chairman whilst the Chair is vacant.

71. *Chairman with consent may adjourn meeting.*—The Chairman, with the consent of the meeting, may adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place, unless due notice shall be given.

72. *Minutes of General Meetings.*—Minutes of the proceedings or every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall when so entered be signed as soon as practicable by the Chairman of the same meeting, or by the Chairman of the succeeding meeting, and the same when so entered and signed shall be evidence of all such proceedings and of the proper election of the Chairman.

VOTING AT MEETINGS.

73. *Votes.*—At any meeting every resolution shall be decided by the votes of the Shareholders present. In case there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman at such meeting shall be entitled to give a casting vote in addition to the vote to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder and proxy and attorney; and unless a poll be immediately demanded in writing by some Shareholder present at the meeting and entitled to vote, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the minute book of the Company, shall be sufficient evidence of the fact without proof of the number of votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution.

74. *Poll.*—If a poll be duly demanded, the same shall be taken in such manner and at such time and place as the Chairman shall direct, and the result of the poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded. The demand of a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of any business other than the question on which a poll has been demanded.

75. *Poll how taken.*—If at any meeting a poll be demanded by notice in writing signed by some Shareholder present at the meeting and entitled to vote, which notice shall be delivered during the meeting to the Chairman, the meeting shall, if necessary, be adjourned, and the poll shall be taken at such time and in such a manner as the Chairman shall direct; and in such case every Shareholder shall have the number of votes to which he may be entitled as hereinafter provided, and in case at any such poll there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting at which such poll shall have been demanded shall be entitled to a casting vote in addition to any votes to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder and proxy and attorney, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in such meeting.

76. *No poll on election of Chairman or on question of adjournment.*—No poll shall be demanded on the election of a Chairman of the meeting or on any question of adjournment.

77. *Number of votes to which Shareholder entitled.*—On a show of hands every Shareholder present in person shall have one vote only. In case of a poll every Shareholder present in person or by proxy or attorney shall have one vote for every one fully paid share held by him. Until a share has been fully paid it shall not confer on the holder thereof the right to a vote in respect thereof. When voting on a resolution involving the winding up of the Company, every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him.

78. *Curator of minor, &c., when not entitled to vote.*—The parent or curator of a minor Shareholder, the committee or other legal guardian of any lunatic Shareholder, the husband of any female Shareholder not entitled to her shares as separate estate, and the executor or administrator of any deceased Shareholder, or any one of such persons as aforesaid, if more than one, shall not be entitled to vote in the place of such minor, lunatic, female, or deceased person, unless such person shall have been registered as a Shareholder.

79. *Voting in person or by proxy or attorney.*—Votes may be given either personally or by proxy or by attorney duly authorized.

80. *Non-shareholder not to be appointed proxy; but attorney though not Shareholder may vote.*—No person shall be appointed a proxy who is not a Shareholder of the Company, but the attorney of a Shareholder, even though not himself a Shareholder of the Company, may represent and vote for his principal at any meeting of the Company.

81. *Shareholder in arrear or not registered at least three months previous to the meeting not to vote.*—No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote or speak at any General Meeting unless all calls due from him on his shares, or any of them, shall have been paid; and no Shareholder other than the trustee or assignee of a bankrupt or representative of a deceased Shareholder, or person acquiring by marriage, shall be entitled to vote or speak at any meeting held after the expiration of three months from the registration of the Company, in respect of or as the holder of any share which he has acquired by transfer, unless he has been at least three months previously to the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote or speak duly registered as the holder of the share in respect of which he claims to vote or speak.

82. *Proxy to be printed or in writing.*—The instrument appointing a proxy shall be printed or written, and shall be signed by the appointor, or if such appointor be a corporation, it shall be under the common seal of such corporation.

83. *When proxy to be deposited.*—The instrument appointing a proxy shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than twenty-four hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting at which the person named in such instrument proposes to vote.

84. *Form of proxy.*—Any instrument appointing a proxy may be in the following form:—

The "L. L. P." Estates, Limited.

I, _____, of _____, appoint _____, of _____ (a Shareholder in the Company) as my proxy, to represent me and to vote for me and on my behalf at the Ordinary (or Extraordinary, as the case may be) General Meeting of the Company to be held on the _____ day of _____, One thousand Nine hundred and _____, and at any adjournment thereof, and at every poll which may be taken in consequence thereof.

As witness my hand, this _____ day of _____, One thousand Nine hundred and _____.

85. *Objections to validity of vote to be made at the meeting or poll.*—No objection shall be made to the validity of any vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) except at the meeting or poll at which such vote shall be tendered; and every vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) to which no objection shall be made at such meeting or poll shall be deemed valid for all purposes of such meeting or poll whatsoever.

86. *No Shareholder to be prevented from voting by being personally interested in result.*—No Shareholder shall be prevented from voting by reason of his being personally interested in the result of the voting.

DIRECTORS.

87. *Number of Directors.*—The number of Directors shall never be less than two nor more than five. In the event of the number of Directors in Ceylon ever being reduced to one, such remaining Director shall immediately cause to be convened an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Shareholders for the purpose of filling up one or more of the vacancies; but, in the event of a quorum of Shareholders not attending such meeting, the remaining Director shall himself appoint a Director to fill one of the vacancies. Any Director so appointed shall hold office until the next Ordinary General Meeting of the Company. Until such appointment the remaining Director shall not act, except for the purpose of appointing another, and if necessary enabling him to be placed on the register of Shareholders.

88. *Their qualification and remuneration.*—The qualification of a Director shall be his holding shares in the Company, whether fully paid up or partly paid up, of the total nominal value of at least One thousand Rupees (Rs. 1,000), and upon which, in the case of partly paid up shares, all calls for the time being shall have been paid, and this qualification shall apply as well to the first Directors as to all future Directors. As remuneration for their services the Directors shall be entitled to appropriate a sum not exceeding Five thousand Rupees (Rs. 5,000) annually to be divided between them in such manner as they may determine, but the Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration for the future, and such remuneration shall not be considered as including any remuneration for special or extra services hereinafter referred to nor any extra remuneration to the Managing Directors of the Company.

89. *Appointment of first Directors and duration of their office.*—The first Directors shall be Alexander David Callander, Esq., of Nanthupana estate, Neboda; Alexander Craib, Esq., of Invery estate, Dikoya; John Garlth Napier, of Madulkelle estate, Madulkelle; and James Lochore, Esq., of Colombo, who shall hold office till the First Ordinary General Meeting of the Company, when they shall all retire, but shall be eligible for re-election.

90. *Directors may appoint Managing Director or Directors; his or their remuneration.*—One or more of the Directors may be appointed by the Directors to act as Secretary, Managing Director, or Managing Directors, and (or) Visiting Agent or Visiting Agents of the Company, or Superintendent or Superintendents of any of the Company's estates, for such time and on such terms as the Directors may determine or fix by agreement with the person or persons appointed to the office; and they may from time to time revoke such appointment and appoint another or other Secretary, Managing Director, or Managing Directors, and (or) Visiting Agent or Agents, Superintendent or Superintendents, and the Directors, may impose and confer on the Managing Director or Managing Directors all or any duties and powers that might be imposed or conferred on any Manager of the Company. If any Director shall be called upon to perform any extra services, the Directors may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration for such services, either by way of salary, commission, or the payment of a lump sum of money as they shall think fit.

91. *Appointment of successors to Directors.*—The General Meeting at which Directors retire or ought to retire by rotation shall appoint successors to them, and in default thereof such successors may be appointed at a subsequent General Meeting. No person, not being a retiring Director, shall, unless recommended by the Directors for election, be eligible for election to the office of Director at any General Meeting, unless he or some other Shareholder intending to propose him has, at least seven clear days before the meeting, left, at the office, a notice in writing under his hand signifying his candidature for the appointment or the intention of such Shareholder to propose him.

92. *Board may fill up vacancies.*—The Board shall have power at any time and from time to time before the First Ordinary General Meeting to supply any vacancies in their number arising from death, resignation, or otherwise.

93. *Duration of office of Director appointed to vacancy.*—Any casual vacancy occurring in the number of the Directors subsequently to the First Ordinary General Meeting may be filled up by the Directors, but any person so chosen shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Director would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred.

94. *To retire annually.*—At the Second Ordinary General Meeting and at the Ordinary General Meeting in every subsequent year one of the Directors for the time being shall retire from office as provided in clause 95.

95. *Retiring Directors how determined.*—The Directors to retire from office at the Second, Third, and Fourth General Meetings shall, unless the Directors otherwise arrange among themselves, be determined by ballot; in every subsequent year the Directors to retire shall be those who have been longest in office.

96. *Retiring Directors eligible for re-election.*—Retiring Directors shall be eligible for re-election.

97. *Decision of question as to retirement.*—In case any question shall arise as to which of the Directors who have been the same time in office shall retire, the same shall be decided by the Directors by ballot.

98. *Number of Directors how increased or reduced.*—The Directors, subject to the approval of a General Meeting, may from time to time at any time subsequent to the Second Ordinary General Meeting increase or reduce the number of Directors, and may also, subject to the like approval, determine in what rotation such increased or reduced number is to go out of office.

99. *If election not made, retiring Directors to continue until next meeting.*—If at any meeting at which an election of a Director ought to take place the place of a retiring Director is not filled up, the retiring Director may continue in office until the first Ordinary General Meeting in the next year, and so on from meeting to meeting until his place is filled up, unless it shall be determined at such meeting to reduce the number of Directors.

100. *Resignation of Directors.*—A Director may at any time give notice in writing of his intention to resign by delivering such notice to the Secretary, or by leaving the same at the office or by tendering his written resignation at a meeting of the Directors.

101. No contract, arrangement, or transaction entered into by or on behalf of the Company with any Director, or with any company or co-partnership of which a Director is a partner, or of which he is a Director, Managing Director, or Manager, shall be void or voidable, nor shall such Director be liable to account to the Company for any profit realized by such contract, arrangement, or transaction by reason only of such Director holding that office, or of the fiduciary relation thereby established, provided that the fact of his interest or connection therewith be fully disclosed to the Company or its Directors.

102. *When office of Directors to be vacated.*—The office of Director shall be vacated—

- (a) If he accepts or holds any office or place of profit other than Managing Director, Visiting Agent, Superintendent, or Secretary under the Company.
- (b) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent, or suspends payment, or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs, or compounds with his creditors.
- (c) If by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he becomes incapable of acting.
- (d) If he ceases to hold the required number of shares to qualify him for the office.
- (e) If he is concerned or participates in the profits of any contract with, or work done for, the Company.

Exceptions.—But the above rule shall be subject to the following exceptions:—That no Director shall vacate his office by reason of his being a member of any corporation, company, or firm which has entered into any contract with, or done any work for, the Company of which he is a Director, or by his being Agent, or Secretary, or proctor, or by his being a member of a firm who are Agents, or Secretaries, or proctors of the Company; nevertheless, he shall not vote in respect of any contract work or business in which he may be personally interested.

103. *How Directors removed and successors appointed.*—The Company may, by an extraordinary resolution, remove any Director before the expiration of his period of office, and may, by an ordinary resolution, appoint another person in his stead. The Director so appointed shall hold office only during such time as the Director in whose place he is appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

104. *Indemnity to Directors and others for their own acts and for the acts of others.*—Every Director or officer and his heirs, executors, and administrators shall be indemnified by the Company from all losses and expenses incurred by him respectively in or about the discharge of his respective duties, except such as happen from his respective wilful acts or defaults; and no Director or officer nor the heirs, executors, or administrators of any Director or officer, shall be liable for any other Director or officer or for joining in any receipt or other acts of conformity, or for any loss or expense happening to the Company by the insufficiency or deficiency of title to any property acquired for or on behalf of the Company, or for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security in or upon which any of the moneys of the Company shall be invested, or for any loss or damage arising from the bankruptcy, insolvency, or tortious act of any person with whom any moneys, securities, or effects shall be deposited, or for any other loss, damage, or misfortune whatsoever which shall happen in the execution of the duties of his office or in relation thereto, unless the same happen through his own wilful act or default.

105. *No contribution to be required from Directors, beyond amount, if any, unpaid, on their shares.*—No contribution shall be required from any present or past Director or Manager exceeding the amount if any, unpaid on the shares in respect of which he is liable as a present or past Shareholder.

POWERS OF DIRECTORS.

106. *To manage business of Company and pay preliminary expenses, &c.*—The business of the Company shall be managed by the Directors either by themselves or through a Managing Director or with the assistance of an agent or agents and secretary or secretaries of the Company to be appointed by the Directors for such a period and on such terms as they shall determine, and the Directors may pay out of the funds of the Company all costs and expenses, as well preliminary as otherwise, paid or incurred in and about the formation and the registration of the Company, and in connection with the placing of the shares of the Company and in and about the valuation, purchase, lease, sub-lease, or acquisition of any lands, estates or property, and opening, clearing, planting, and cultivation thereof, and in or about the working and business of the Company.

107. *To acquire property, to appoint officers, and pay expenses.*—The Directors shall have power to purchase, take on lease, or in exchange, or otherwise acquire for the Company any estate or estates, land or lands, property, rights, options, or privileges which the Company is authorized to acquire at such price and for such consideration and upon such title, and generally on such terms and conditions as they may think fit; and to make and they may make such regulations for the management of the business and property of the Company as they may from time to time think proper, and for that purpose may appoint such managers, agents, secretaries, treasurers, accountants, and other officers, visiting agents, inspectors, superintendents, clerks, artisans, labourers, and other servants for such period or periods, and with such remuneration and at such salaries and upon such terms and conditions as they may consider advisable, and may pay expenses occasioned thereby out of the funds of the Company, and may from time to time remove or suspend all or any of the managers, agents, secretaries, treasurers, accountants, and other officers, visiting agents, inspectors, superintendents, clerks, artisans, labourers, and other servants, for such reasons as they may think proper and advisable and without assigning any cause.

108. *To appoint proctors and attorneys.*—The Directors shall have power to appoint a proctor or proctors, solicitor or solicitors, attorney or attorneys to assist in carrying on or protecting the business of the Company on such terms as they may consider proper, and from time to time to revoke such appointment.

109. *To open banking accounts and operate thereon, &c.*—The Directors shall have power to open on behalf of the Company any account or accounts with such bank or banks as they may select or appoint, and also by such signatures as they may appoint to draw, accept, make, endorse, sign, and execute cheques, bills of exchange, and promissory notes, bills of lading, receipts, contracts, and agreements, bonds, mortgages, proxies to any proctor or proctors and other documents on behalf of and to further the interests of the Company.

110. *To sell and dispose of Company's property, &c.*—It shall be lawful for the Directors, if authorized so to do by a special resolution of the Shareholders in General Meeting, to arrange terms for the amalgamation of the Company with any other company or companies, or individual or individuals, or for the sale or disposal of the business, estates, lands, and effects of the company or any part or parts, share or shares thereof, respectively, or the assignment of the whole or any part or parts of its leasehold interests in any estate or estates, land or lands or the sub-lease of the whole or any part or parts thereof to any company or companies, or person or persons, upon such terms and in such manner as the Directors shall think fit, and the Directors shall have power to do all such things as may be necessary for carrying such amalgamation, sale, or other disposition into effect so far as a resolution or special resolution of the Company is not by law necessary for such purpose; and in case any terms so arranged by the Directors include or make necessary the dissolution of the Company, the Company shall be dissolved to that end.

111. *General powers.*—The Directors shall carry on the business of the Company in such manner as they may think most expedient; and in addition to the powers and authorities by the Ordinance or by these presents expressly conferred on them, they may exercise all such powers, give all such consents, make all such arrangements, appoint all such managers, agents, secretaries, treasurers, accountants, and other officers, clerks, assistants, artisans, and workers, and generally do all such acts and things as are or shall be by the Ordinance and by these presents directed and authorized to be exercised, given, made, or done by the Company and are not by the Ordinance or by these presents required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of the Ordinance and of these presents and to such regulations and provisions (if any) as may, from time to time, be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting; but no regulation made by the Company in General Meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Board which would have been valid if such regulation had not been made. The generality of the powers conferred by any clause in these presents on the Directors shall not be taken to be limited by any clause conferring any special or expressed power.

112. *Special powers.*—In furtherance and not in limitation of, and without prejudice to, the general powers conferred or implied in the last preceding clause, and of the other powers conferred by these presents, it is hereby expressly declared that the Directors shall have the powers following (that is to say):—

- (1) To institute, conduct, defend, compound or abandon any action, suit, prosecution, or legal proceedings by and against the Company, or its officers or otherwise concerning the affairs of the Company, and also to compound and allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due and of any claims and demands by and against the Company.
- (2) To refer any claims or demands by or against the Company to arbitration, and observe and perform the awards.
- (3) To make and give receipts, releases, and other discharges for money payable to the Company, and for claims and demands of the Company.
- (4) To act on behalf of the Company in all matters relating to bankrupts and insolvents, with power to accept the office of trustee, assignee, liquidator, inspector, or any similar office.
- (5) To invest any of the moneys of the Company which the Directors may consider not immediately required for the purposes thereof, upon such securities and in such manner as they may think fit, and so that they shall not be restricted to such securities as are permissible to trustees, without special powers, and from time to time to vary or release such investments.
- (6) From time to time to provide for the management of the affairs of the Company abroad in such manner as they think fit, and to establish any local boards or agencies for managing any of the affairs of the Company abroad, and to appoint any persons to be members of such local board or any managers or agents, and to fix their remuneration.
- (7) From time to time and at any time to delegate to any one or more of the Directors of the Company for the time being or any other person or company for the time being, residing or carrying on business in Ceylon or elsewhere, all or any of the powers hereby made exercisable by the Directors, except those relating to shares and any others as to which special provisions inconsistent with such delegation are herein contained; and they shall have power to fix the remuneration of and at any time to remove such Director or other person or company, and to annul or vary any such delegation. They shall not however be entitled to delegate any powers of borrowing or charging the property of the Company to any Agent of the Company or other person except by instrument in writing, which shall specifically state the extent to which such powers may be used by the person or persons to whom they are so delegated, and compliance therewith shall be a condition precedent to the exercise of these powers.

PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

113. *Meetings of Directors.*—The Directors may meet for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings as they may think fit, and determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business; until otherwise determined, two Directors shall be a quorum.

114. *A Director may summon meetings of Directors.*—A Director may at any time summon a meeting of Directors.

115. *Who is to preside at meetings of Board.*—The Board may elect a Chairman of their meetings and determine the period for which he is to hold office, and all meetings of the Directors shall be presided over by the Chairman, if one has been elected and if present, but if there be a vacancy in the office of Chairman, or if at any meeting of Directors the Chairman be not present at the time appointed for holding the same, then, and in that case, the Directors present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

116. *Questions at meetings how decided.*—Any question which shall arise at any meeting of the Directors shall be decided by a majority of votes, and in case of an equality of votes the Chairman thereof shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a Director.

117. *Board may appoint committees.*—The Board may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as the Board think fit, and they may from time to time revoke and discharge any such committee, either wholly or in part, and either as to persons or purposes, but every committee so formed shall, in exercise of the powers delegated to it, conform to all such regulations as may be prescribed by the Board. All acts done by any such committee, in conformity with such regulations and in the fulfilment of the purposes of their appointment, but not otherwise, shall have the like force and effects as if done by the Board.

118. *Acts of Board or committee valid notwithstanding informal appointment.*—The acts of the Board or of any committee appointed by the Board shall, notwithstanding any vacancy in the Board or committee, or defect in the appointment of any Director or of any member of the committee, be as valid as if no such vacancy or defect had existed, and as if every person had been duly appointed, provided the same be done before the discovery of the defect.

119. *Regulation of proceedings of committees.*—The meetings and proceedings of such committees shall be governed by the provision herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of Directors, so far as the same are applicable thereto, and are not superseded by the express terms of the appointment of such committee respectively, or any regulation imposed by the Board.

120. *Resolution in writing by all the Directors as valid as if passed at a meeting of Directors.*—A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors for the time being resident in Ceylon shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted, provided that not fewer than two Directors shall sign it.

121. *Minutes of proceedings of the Company and the Directors to be recorded.*—The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in books to be provided for the purpose of the following matters, *videlicet* :—

- (a) Of all appointments of officers and committees made by the Directors.
- (b) Of the names of the Directors present at each meeting of the Directors and of the members of the committee appointed by the Board present at each meeting of the committee.
- (c) Of the resolutions and proceedings of all General Meetings.
- (d) Of the resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of the Directors and of the committees appointed by the Board.
- (e) Of all orders made by the Directors.
- (f) Of the use of the Company's seal.

122. *Signature of minutes of proceedings and effect thereof.*—All such minutes shall be signed by the person or one of the persons who shall have presided as Chairman at the General Meeting, the Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting at which the business minuted shall have been transacted, or by the person or one of the persons who shall preside as Chairman at the next ensuing General Meeting, Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively; and all minutes purporting to have been signed by any Chairman of any General Meeting, or Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively, shall, for all purposes whatsoever, be *prima facie* evidence of the actual and regular passing of the resolutions, and the actual and regular transaction or occurrence of the proceedings and other matters purporting to be so recorded, and of the regularity of the meeting at which the same shall appear to have taken place, and of the Chairmanship and signature of the person appearing to have signed as Chairman, and of the date on which such meeting was held.

COMPANY'S SEAL.

123. *The use of the seal.*—The seal of the Company shall not be used or affixed to any deed, certificate of shares, or other instrument, except in the presence of two or more of the Directors or of one Director and the Agents and Secretaries of the Company, who shall attest the sealing thereof; such attestation on the part of the Agents and Secretaries, in the event of a firm being the Agents and Secretaries, being signified by a partner or duly authorized manager, attorney, or agent of the said firm signing the firm name or the firm name per procuracionem or signing for and on behalf of the said firm as such Agents and Secretaries, and in the event of a company registered under the Ordinance being the Agents and Secretaries, being signified by a Director or the Secretary or the duly authorized attorney of such company signing for and on behalf of such company as Agents and Secretaries. The sealing shall not be attested by one person in the dual capacity of Director and representative of the Agents and Secretaries.

ACCOUNTS.

124. *What accounts to be kept.*—The Agent or Secretary or the Agents or Secretaries for the time being, or, if there be no Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries, the Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the paid-up capital for the time being of the Company, and of all sums of money received and expended by the Company, and of the matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place, and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company, and generally of all its commercial, financial, and other affairs, transactions, and engagements, and of all other matters necessary for showing the true financial state and condition of the Company; and the accounts shall be kept in such books and in such a manner at the registered office of the Company as the Directors think fit.

125. *Accounts how and when open to inspection.*—The Directors shall from time to time determine whether, and to what extent, and at what times and places, and under what conditions or regulations the accounts and books of the Company or of any of them shall be open to the inspection of the Shareholders; and no Shareholder shall have any right of inspecting any account or book or document of the Company, except as conferred by the Ordinance or authorized by the Directors, or by a resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

126. *Statement of accounts and balance sheet to be furnished to General Meeting.*—At the Ordinary General Meeting in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company a statement of the profit and loss account for the preceding financial year, and a balance sheet containing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company made up as at the end of the same period.

127. *Report to accompany statement.*—Every such statement shall be accompanied by a report as to the state and condition of the Company, and as to the amount which they recommend to be paid out of the profits by way of dividend or bonus to the Shareholders, and the statement, report, and balance sheet shall be signed by the Directors.

128. *Copy of balance sheet to be sent to the Shareholders.*—A printed copy of such balance sheet shall, at least seven days previous to such meeting, be delivered at, or posted to, the registered address of every Shareholder.

DIVIDENDS, BONUS, AND RESERVE FUND.

129. *Declaration of dividend.*—The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, from time to time, declare a dividend to be paid, and (or) pay a bonus to the Shareholders in proportion to the amount paid on their shares, but no dividend or bonus shall be payable except out of nett profits.

(a) Any General Meeting may direct payment of any dividend declared at such meeting or of any interim dividends which may subsequently be declared by the Directors, wholly or in part in sterling by means of drafts or cheques on London or by the distribution of specific assets and in particular of paid up shares, debentures, or debenture stock of the Company, or of any other company, or in any other form of specie, or in any one or more of such ways, and the Directors shall give effect to such direction; and where any difficulty arises in regard to the distribution, they may settle the same as they think expedient, and in particular may issue fractional certificates, and may fix the value for distribution of such specific assets, or any part thereof, and may determine that cash payments shall be made to any Shareholder upon the footing of the value so fixed, in order to adjust the rights of all parties.

130. *Interim dividend.*—The Directors may also if they think fit, from time to time and at any time, without the sanction of a General Meeting, determine on and declare an interim dividend to be paid, and (or) pay a bonus to the Shareholders on account and in anticipation of the dividend for the then current year.

131. *Reserve fund.*—Previously to the Directors paying or recommending any dividend on preference or ordinary shares, they may set aside out of the profits of the Company such a sum as they think proper as a reserve fund, and may invest the same in such securities as they shall think fit, or place the same on fixed deposit in any bank or banks.

132. *Application thereof.*—The Directors may from time to time apply such portions as they think fit of the reserve fund to meet contingencies, or for the payment of accumulated dividends due on preference shares or for equalizing dividends, or for working the business of the Company, or for repairing, or maintaining, or extending the buildings and premises, or for the repair or renewal or extension of the property or plant connected with the business of the Company or any part thereof, or for any other purpose of the Company which they may from time to time deem expedient.

133. *Unpaid interest or dividend not to bear interest.*—No unpaid interest or dividend or bonus shall ever bear interest against the Company.

134. *No Shareholder to receive dividend while debt due to Company.*—No Shareholder shall be entitled to receive payment of any dividend or bonus in respect of his share or shares whilst any moneys may be due or owing from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company in respect of such share or shares or otherwise howsoever.

135. *Directors may deduct debt from the dividends.*—The Directors may deduct from the dividend or bonus payable to any Shareholder all sums of money due from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company, and notwithstanding such sums shall not be payable until after the date when such dividend is payable.

136. *Dividends may be paid by cheque or warrant and sent through the post.*—Unless otherwise directed any dividend may be paid by cheque or warrant sent through the post to the registered address of the Shareholder entitled, or, in the case of joint-holders, to the registered address of that one whose name stands first on the register in respect of the joint-holding; but the Company shall not be liable or responsible for the loss of any such cheque or dividend warrant sent through the post.

137. *Notice of dividend: forfeiture of unclaimed dividend.*—Notice of all dividends or bonuses to become payable shall be given to each Shareholder entitled thereto; and all dividends or bonuses unclaimed by any Shareholder for three years after notice thereof is given may be forfeited by a resolution of the Board of Directors for the benefit of the Company, and, if the Directors think fit, may be applied in augmentation of the reserve fund. For the purposes of this clause any cheques or warrants which may be issued for dividends or bonuses and may not be presented at the Company's Bankers for payment within three years shall rank as unclaimed dividends.

138. *Shares held by a firm.*—Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by a firm may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any partner of such firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm.

139. *Joint-holders other than a firm.*—Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by several persons jointly, other than a firm, may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any one of such persons.

AUDIT.

140. *Accounts to be audited.*—The accounts of the Company shall from time to time be examined, and the correctness of the balance sheet and profit and loss account ascertained by one or more Auditor or Auditors.

141. *Qualification of Auditors.*—No person shall be eligible as an Auditor who is interested otherwise than as a Shareholder in any transaction of the Company, but an Auditor shall not be debarred from acting as a professional accountant in doing any special work for the Company which the Directors may deem necessary. It shall not be a necessary qualification for an Auditor that he be a Shareholder of the Company, and no Director or officer of the Company shall, during his continuance in office, be eligible as an Auditor.

142. *Appointment and retirement of Auditors.*—The Directors shall appoint the first Auditor or Auditors of the Company and fix his or their remuneration; all future Auditors, except as is hereinafter mentioned, shall be appointed at the First Ordinary General Meeting of the Company in each year by the Shareholders present thereat, and shall hold their office only until the First Ordinary General Meeting after their respective appointments, or until otherwise ordered by a General Meeting.

143. *Retiring Auditors eligible for re-election.*—Retiring Auditors shall be eligible for re-election.

144. *Remuneration of Auditors.*—The remuneration of the Auditors other than the first shall be fixed by the Company in General Meeting, and this remuneration may from time to time be varied by a General Meeting.

145. *Casual vacancy in number of Auditors how filled up.*—If any vacancy that may occur in the office of Auditor shall not be supplied at any Ordinary General Meeting, or if any casual vacancy shall occur, the Directors shall (subject to the approval of the next Ordinary General Meeting) fill up the vacancy by the appointment of a person who shall hold the office until such meeting.

146. *Duty of Auditor.*—Every Auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet and profit and loss account intended to be laid before the next Ordinary General Meeting, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto and to report thereon to the meeting generally or specially as he may think fit.

147. *Company's accounts to be open to Auditors for audit.*—All accounts, books, and documents whatsoever of the Company shall at all times be open to the Auditors for the purpose of audit.

NOTICES.

148. *Notice how authenticated.*—Notices from the Company may be authenticated by the signature (printed or written) of the Agent or Secretary, Agents or Secretaries, or other persons appointed by the Board to do so.

149. *Shareholders to register address.*—Every Shareholder shall furnish the Company with an address in Ceylon, which shall be deemed to be his place of abode, and shall be registered as such in the books of the Company.

150. *Service of notices.*—A notice may be served by the Company upon any Shareholder, either personally or by sending it through the post in a prepaid letter addressed to such Shareholder at his registered address or place of abode; and any notice so served shall be deemed to be well served for all purposes, notwithstanding that the Shareholder to whom such notice is addressed be dead, unless his executor or administrators shall have given to the Directors, or to the Agent or Secretary, or Agents or Secretaries of the Company, their own or some other address in Ceylon.

151. *Notice to joint-holders of shares other than a firm.*—All notices directed to be given to Shareholders shall, with respect to any share to which persons other than a firm are jointly entitled, be sufficient if given to any one of such persons, and notice so given shall be sufficient notice to all the holders of such shares.

152. *Date and proof of service.*—Any notice if served by post shall be deemed to have been served on the day on which the letter containing the same would in ordinary course of post have been delivered at his address, and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the letter containing the notice was properly addressed and put into a post-box or posted at a post office and the entry in the Company's books of the leaving or sending by post of any notice at or to such address shall be sufficient evidence thereof, and no further evidence shall be necessary.

ARBITRATION.

154. *Directors may refer disputes to arbitration.*—Whenever any question or other matter whatsoever arises in dispute between the Company and any other Company or person, the same may be referred by the Directors to arbitration.

EVIDENCE.

155. *Evidence in action by Company against Shareholders.*—On the trial or hearing of any action or suit brought or instituted by the Company against any Shareholder or his representatives to recover any debt or money claimed to be due to the Company in respect of his shares, it shall be sufficient to prove that the name of the defendant is or was, when the claim arose, on the register of Shareholders of the Company as a holder of the number of shares in respect of which such claim is made, and that the amount claimed is not entered as paid in the books of the Company; and it shall not be necessary to prove the registration of the Company, nor the appointment of the Directors who made any call, nor that a quorum of Directors was present at the Board at which any call was made, nor that the meeting at which any call was made was duly convened or constituted, nor any other matter whatsoever, but the proof aforesaid shall be conclusive evidence of the debt.

PROVISIONS RELATIVE TO WINDING UP OR DISSOLUTION OF THE COMPANY.

ABSTRACTS OF SEASON REPORTS.

SEASON REPORTS FOR THE MONTH OF JULY, 1920.

WESTERN PROVINCE.

COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Yala season : plants are doing well.

Maha season : preparations are now being made.

Dry grains ; kurakkan and amu crops in Siyane korale east are doing well, in Siyane korale west the kurakkan crop is blossoming, in Alutkuru korale north the kurakkan, muneta, and gingelly crops are being reaped, and in Hewagam korale chenas are now being sown with kurakkan and el-wi.

Other products : prospects of coconuts are fairly good. The estimated crop for the month is 83,425,650 nuts. There is a fair supply of fruits and vegetables.

Prices of staple products : (a) imported rice is sold according to controlled prices ; (b) country rice and paddy are sold at Rs. 5 to Rs. 7 and Rs. 12 to Rs. 13 per bushel, respectively ; (c) coconuts are sold at Rs. 60 to Rs. 70 per thousand.

Harvest prospect : fair.

Rainfall : There was sufficient rain during the month.

Health of inhabitants : fair. There have been a few cases of enteric fever, measles, chickenpox, and influenza.

Health of cattle : rinderpest and hoof-and-mouth disease is still prevalent in some korales of the Colombo District, but is well in hand.

KALUTARA DISTRICT.

Paddy : the paddy plants of the yala harvest are thriving well, except in parts of the totamunes where it is anticipated that the crop will be poor owing to the damage caused by rain. Some of the fields in Waddu and Waskadu baddas are being prepared for maha cultivation.

Dry grain : there is dry grain cultivation on lands leased subject to re-forestation and on private lands. The area leased subject to re-forestation is mostly village forest land in Rayigam korale. In Pasdun korale east an extent of not less than 1,000 acres, mostly illicitly cleared Crown lands, has been cultivated with hill paddy.

Other products : except in the totamunes the supply of vegetables, fruit, and yams is inadequate. The flowering of coconut is good. The month's crop of coconuts is estimated at 1,765,000.

Prices of staple products : rice is sold at the controlled prices ; country rice is not available in the market ; price of 1,000 coconuts, Rs. 60 to Rs. 120.

Remarks on harvest prospects generally : a fairly good harvest can be expected, except in the totamunes.

Rainfall : there was rain during the early and latter parts of the month ; total, 5.26 in. ; average, .16 in.

Health of the people : cases of influenza, fever, measles, and dysentery existed in the totamunes, and in the other korales there were a few cases of measles only.

Health of the cattle : Good. During the early part of the month there were a few cases of rinderpest on Midellamahona estate at Munagama in Rayigam korale.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall.
on Friday, July 9, 1920.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated July 2, 1920.

Present :—Mr. T. Reid, Acting Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. L. B. Fernando; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdull Cader; Mr. H. L. de Mel, C.B.E.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; Mr. T. L. Villiers; the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford; Mr. W. Philips; Mr. B. F. Khan; Mr. B. W. Leefe; Mr. A. E. de Silva; Lieut.-Colonel S. Boylan Smith, D.S.O., O.B.E.; Mr. A. J. Wickwar; and Mr. A. E. Caldicott.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of June 11, 1920, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.—Resolved that the minutes of the General Meeting of June 11, 1920, be confirmed.

2. The Chairman read the following :—Since the last Meeting of Council two fatal cases of human plague, both septicaemic, have been recorded, bringing the total for the year up to date to 59, as against a total of 4 cases for the corresponding period of last year.

Rat plague.—Two further cases of rat plague have been reported, making a total for this year up to date of 64 cases.

Before proceeding with the other business on the agenda, the Chairman stated that he had received that morning a letter from Mr. E. R. Park, on behalf of the Ceylon Motor Syndicate, asking for permission to use a portion of Victoria park for the purpose of holding a motor show from January 10 to February 3, 1921. This piece of land was already leased out as a cricket pitch to the members of the Maha Bodhi Society, and Mr. Park had arranged with the Secretary of the Society to use the ground for the show on the dates mentioned. With the leave of the Council, the Chairman brought the matter up and requested Council's permission to allow the Ceylon Motor Syndicate the use of this portion of the park for the motor show. Council granted permission.

3. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo asked the Chairman :—(1) What nett profit has this Council made from the rice trade (1) up to December 31, 1919, (2) from January 1 to June 30, 1920, (3) during last month (June), excluding from calculation the value of the Department's assets, such as lorries, furniture, &c. ?

(2) What is the estimated value of the Department's assets, motor lorries, furniture, &c. ?

(3) What is the total loss to the Council from defalcation in the Rice Department up to December 31, 1919, and from January 1 to June 30, 1920 ?

The Chairman replied as follows :—The working profits on sale of rice up to the end of December, 1919, were Rs. 61,969. From that date up to the end of June, 1920, the profits were Rs. 73,014. During June, 1920, the profits were Rs. 18,716. These profits are not nett profits. They leave out of account several items, such as rent of offices, salary of Superior Officers who draw no pay for rice work, and the like, and, above all, omit interest on the Council's money which is financing the Rice Department. Out of the profits a sum of over Rs. 50,000 has been sunk in the plant necessary to run the business. The balance profits are entirely insufficient to finance the business and at date 2½ lakhs of the Council's money is tied up in the Rice Department, which is a large concern dealing with a turn over of about Rs. 500,000 a month. If the Member for Wellawatta desires, I shall try to work out actual nett profits, but it will be very difficult to secure anything more than approximate figures. The lorries and furniture, &c., cost Rs. 49,995.32. We have also certain depôts and measures. The total assets would be less than Rs. 55,000. The Council has not taken over any of the profits made by the sale of rice. The ultimate disposal of them has not been settled. For the time being, they are not even sufficient to finance the business. The total losses from defalcations are Rs. 39,961.25. The facts relating to them are now *sub judice* and, therefore, if the Member for Wellawatta has no objection, I do not wish to make any statement as to whether any part of them may be ultimately recovered or not.

4. With the permission of Council, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo withdrew the following motion which stood in his name :—
(1) For a return showing the personnel of the Rice Department from its establishment up to the present time, giving the names of all the officers, with their ages, date of appointment, designation, salary, allowances, date of confirmation of appointment by Council, date of discontinuance of service, cause of discontinuance, date of sanction by the Council of the discontinuance, in a form similar to the annexed :—

(2) That in the opinion of this Council the time is now appropriate for reverting to the boutique system of rice distribution in the city and with that end in view the Chairman do inquire from the Food Controller whether he has any serious objection to it and, if he has none, take immediate steps for the purpose.

With the permission of Council, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo asked the Chairman : (a) Whether the boutique system was a success in Wellawatta Ward, (b) Whether it was his intention to extend the system to other Wards, and (c) Whether he would consider the desirability of reducing the minimum number of bags supplied to each boutique keeper from 10 to 5 as a number of boutique keepers could not buy ten bags at once.

The Chairman stated that as regards the experiment at Wellawatta things were so far very smooth indeed, but that two depôts were still open in the Ward, because boutique keepers had not come forward. He understood from Dr. Rodrigo that the reason was because they could not take ten bags. He would be willing to supply five bags for a time. As regards his intention of extending the system to other parts of the City, he would like to inform the Council as to what had taken place in that connection. The chief reason for the control of the food supply was the scarcity of rice. Circumstances had changed completely and the Food Controller had recently asked him to revert to the boutique system in order to enable him to get rid of the big supply for which he had not the available room. The supply was adequate for some time and he was issuing for the first time full rations of rice. The need for control had disappeared because there were ample supplies. It was his intention to extend the system to the whole of the City by the end of July.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. L. de Mel moved to draw the attention of this Council to the danger to pedestrians and traffic by permitting race-horses to be exercised in the public roads in Colombo and that steps be taken to prevent such danger. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

The Chairman stated that since he had received the motion he communicated with the Superintendent of Police, who had informed him that a similar state of affairs existed in 1917, when many complaints were made by the residents, and that he had then given the Cinnamon Gardens Police some standing orders as to the safe using of the roads by those in charge of race-horses. The Superintendent of Police would order those standing orders to be enforced now.

On the suggestion of Mr. T. L. Villiers it was resolved that the Turf Club be also approached.

The motion was put to the Meeting and was carried unanimously.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 6 to 13 (inclusive) on the agenda.

Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

(Dr. E. V. Ratnam left the Meeting at this stage.)

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Special and the Standing Committees named were then laid before the Council in Committee :—

Extract from the Minutes of the Special Committee on Drainage Works of May 31, 1920.

(3) To consider an application from the Colombo Drainage Works Staff for the grant to them of the same temporary increases to their salaries as are paid to Government Servants.—Recommended. There is no objection to the granting by Government of the temporary increases asked for.

Resolution of Council of June 11, 1920.

With regard to item No. 3 (corresponding to item No. 25 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of June 7, 1920), the Chairman stated that the Finance Committee had resolved to ask Government what the cost would be, but should the Council so desire the matter might be decided on the recommendation of the Drainage Committee.—Resolved that the consideration of the matter be deferred for the next meeting.

Resolution.

With regard to this item (corresponding to item No. 7 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of June 23, 1920), the Chairman stated that the Finance Committee recommended that the temporary increases be granted, with effect from June 1, 1920. The Council had, therefore, to decide as to whether the temporary increases should be paid, with effect from January 1 or from June 1, 1920.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that the recommendation of the Finance Committee be adopted. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried unanimously.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Committee re Supply of Electricity in the Municipality of June 9, 1920.

2. To consider an application from Messrs. Boustead Brothers asking whether the refusal to sanction further overhead mains applies in the case of consumers erecting overhead service mains on their own properties, connecting same with the Company's underground mains system at the boundaries of the properties.—Recommended that Government give Messrs. Boustead Bros. the permission asked for, but that in each case the sanction of the Chairman should be obtained before overhead mains are allowed.

3. To consider the opinion submitted by Messrs. F. J. & G. de Saram, in consultation with Mr. F. Dornhorst, K.C., and Mr. F. A. Hayley, with regard to the construction of clause 9 of the Tramway Agreement.—Recommended that the Council do not take over the Tramways at present. Recommended that the Council prepare a scheme for running Municipal motor bus services on selected routes.

Resolution of Council of June 11, 1920.

With regard to items Nos. 2 and 3, it was resolved that the consideration of these matters be deferred and the papers be circulated.

With regard to item No. 2, it was resolved that the recommendation of the Special Committee be adopted.

With regard to item No. 3, it was resolved that the recommendation of the Special Committee be adopted.

It was further resolved that the Works and Finance Committees consider the motor bus question.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of June 21, 1920.

3. To consider an application from R. Ratnayake for a license to sell beef and mutton at No. 21¹, Skinner's road south.—Recommended.

4. To consider a petition forwarded through Dr. E. V. Ratnam, M.M.C., opposing the proposed erection of the latrine at Wolfendahl.

Resolved to ask the City Sanitation Engineer if no alternative site is available.—Recommended that matter be decided at next Meeting.

5. To consider the proposed amendment to rule 3 (d) of schedule to Housing Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915.—Recommended that the recommendation of the Finance Committee be adopted, viz. :—“That the rule be amended so as to ensure window space equivalent to at least 1/15th of the floor space and, in addition, adequate means of ingress and egress so that the total of doorway and window should not be less than 1/7th of floor area.”

6. To consider the proposed amendment to section 106 (1) (b) of Housing Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915.—Recommended that the recommendation of the Finance Committee be adopted, but that 20 feet space is deemed necessary. “That in the case of streets, where street lines are not laid down, walls or buildings should not be erected nearer than 15 feet to the centre of the street.”

7. To consider the proposed amendment to rule 7 (a) of schedule to Housing Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915.—Recommended that the recommendation of the Finance Committee be adopted, viz. :—“That in the case of tenements less than 100 feet in length, one side of the tenements, the gable end, if necessary, should abut on a street.”

8. To consider the proposed amendment to section 2 of Housing Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915.—Recommended that the word “street” should include river, lake, and canal.

12. To consider the proposed amendments to the Waterworks Ordinance, No. 18 of 1905.—Recommended that the amendments as per Annexure A, attached to these Minutes be made (*vide* page 2022).

Resolutions.

With regard to item No. 4 (corresponding to items Nos. 4 and 10 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Works and Finance Committees, respectively, of June 23, 1920), it was resolved that the recommendation of the Works and Finance Committees be adopted.

With regard to item No. 6 (corresponding to item No. 4 of the Finance Committee of June 2, and No. 4 of the Law Committee of June 4, 1920), the Chairman explained that there was a difference of opinion between the Sanitation Committee and the Finance Committee. The Finance Committee was inclined to think that buildings might be allowed within 15 feet of the centre of the road, while the Sanitation Committee, on grounds of public health, seemed to think that buildings should be at least 40 feet apart.

Mr. A. E. Caldicott; Lieut.-Colonel S. Boylan Smith, D.S.O., O.B.E.; Mr. H. L. de Mel, C.B.E.; the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford; Mr. T. L. Villiers; and the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, spoke on the subject.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that the recommendation of the Sanitation Committee be adopted. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.

The motion was put to the Meeting and declared carried, ten voting for it and five against.

Mr. H. L. de Mel, C.B.E., called for a division, and the Council divided as follows :—

Mr. H. L. de Mel, C.B.E., gave notice of a dissent.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

Kilmister, Acting Works Engineer, be adopted (a copy of the proposed advertisement annexed gives the details of the scheme—annexure C on page 2024 of these Minutes).—Recommended that the chief Colombo colleges be approached.—Recommended that the Members of the Works Committee and the Works Engineer be a board of selection.

(9) To consider an application from the Chairman, Local Board, Negombo, asking whether Mr. W. M. Thyne, Waterworks Engineer, would be prepared to draw up a water scheme for the town of Negombo, and, if so, whether the Council would have any objection to his doing so.—Recommended that Mr. W. M. Thyne's services can be spared.—Recommended that all travelling expenses be borne by the Local Board and that Mr. Thyne be not paid his salary by the Council for the week days on which he is employed by the Local Board.—Recommended that Mr. W. M. Thyne be paid by the Local Board a fee correlative to the value of the work done.

(2) That pending Mr. Waterhouse's departure Mr. Blizard should receive consolidated pay (including war allowance) and travelling allowance equivalent in total to his present pay and allowance, *i.e.*, a total of Rs. 800 per mensem; (3) that on Mr. Waterhouse's departure Mr. Blizard should assume duties as Chief Assistant, Drainage Works Department, and receive consolidated pay (including war allowance) of Rs. 900 per mensem with a travelling allowance of Rs. 50 per mensem (*Note*.—Mr. Waterhouse's emoluments as Chief Assistant are Rs. 900 per mensem, with a temporary increase under the new Government scheme of Rs. 187.50 and a travelling allowance of Rs. 50); (4) That, if occasion arises, Mr. Blizard be permitted to attend the City Sanitation Office for short periods during the City Sanitation Engineer's absence on casual leave; (5) that Mr. Blizard is from the date of his transfer seconded for service with the Drainage Works Department and that the period of such service counts as Municipal service for purposes of leave and pension; (6) that the travelling allowance of the City Sanitation Engineer be temporarily increased from Rs. 150 to Rs. 200 per mensem during the continuance of this arrangement.—Recommended (sections 1 to 6).

Resolutions.

With regard to item No. 3 (corresponding to item No. 5 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Finance Committee of June 23, 1920), the Chairman explained that the plans received by the Works Department were not in conformity with the building by-laws and a considerable time of the Engineers was wasted in checking the plans, and the Works Engineer recommended the scale of fees approved by the Committees.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo opposed the recommendation.

Mr. H. L. de Mel, C.B.E., supported the recommendation.

The Chairman moved that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted. Mr. H. L. de Mel, C.B.E., seconded.—Carried.

With regard to item No. 5 (corresponding to item No. 11 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of June 23, 1920), it was decided that the words "quarrying of cabook stone at Rs. 3 per hundred from Municipal quarry at Kalubowila" should be substituted for the words "purchase hundred."

With regard to item No. 13 (corresponding to item No. 29 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Finance Committee of June 23, 1920), the Chairman made the following statement :—

When preparing the budget my estimate of revenue for 1920 was Rs. 3,814,485. This forecast was regarded as a maximum and I allowed for the effects of reform of the Finance Department in 1920. Since Mr. Maybin assumed duties as Second Financial Assistant I am glad to be able to report to Council that he has tackled a difficult situation with very exceptional capacity and that his staff have put in very hard work. I anticipated in the budget the recovery in 1920 of 7½ lakhs of the arrears on property tax, a very liberal sum. I am glad to say that by the end of last month the sum of almost 7 lakhs had been collected. The procedure for collecting current revenue has also been practically brought up to date. Under almost each head of revenue similar improvements have been effected. For instance, a sum of Rs. 96,000 was anticipated under the head "Taxes on vehicles and animals." But at the end of June, a sum of over Rs. 101,000 had been collected. Again the revenue under the headings "Trade Licenses and Professional Fees" at the end of June was Rs. 82,000 odd and exceeded the estimates for the whole year, *viz.*, Rs. 80,000. It is true most of the revenue under these heads comes in early in this year; still the figures are most satisfactory. "Market rents" for the first half year are most satisfactory and so are the figures for "Sale of Water." Mr. Beling and his staff have put

in most strenuous work in dealing with the objections to assessment which approached the unprecedented figure of 4,000 in number, a state of affairs aroused partly by the system of assessment obtaining at the end of 1919. The objections have been practically all settled without ultimate recourse to the law courts, save perhaps in one case. The final result is an increase in the nett annual valuation of property of nearly 1½ million rupees and an increase in the recoverable tax due for 1920 of about two lakhs.

The nett result is that the Council's revenue at the end of June was about Rs. 2,350,000, as compared with Rs. 1,854,666 for the first half of 1919, i.e., an increase of half a million for the half year, and the year's revenue will not be the sum of Rs. 3,814,485 estimated, a figure which is about a lakh in excess of 1919 revenue, but will, for the first time, reach and almost certainly exceed Rs. 4,000,000. Of course, this unexpected state of affairs is partly due to collection of arrears which should not exist; and with the reduction of arrears the average revenue will fall automatically, unless permanent increases in revenue are devised meantime. For the time being, however, the anxiety about our solvency on this year's working has disappeared even though we are still far distant from the annual revenue of Rs. 5,000,000 needed by the Council. It will be necessary to re-cast our 1920 expenditure, and I have called on all Heads of Departments to estimate afresh their expenditure for the rest of the year. I then propose to let the Council know what sums can be expended over and above the sums voted in the Budget and the unexpected expenses which have had to be met since the Budget was passed. What I have said explains why the Committees have put up to Council to-day proposals to spend on much needed, long delayed new works a sum of Rs. 91,669, viz., Rs. 37,500 on the removal of the Galle Face drive eyesore and nuisance and Rs. 54,169 on the first hygienic Municipal laundry at Wekanda. I have gone into the figures in detail with the two Financial Assistants and I can assure the Council that this expenditure may be incurred with absolute safety.

Resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

With the permission of Council, the Chairman submitted the recommendation of the Acting Works Engineer for the purchase of 500 barrels of English cement at Rs. 18 per barrel from Mr. A. A. M. Saleem of Pettah.

It was resolved that the cement be tested and, if found up to British standard, the Works Engineer be authorized to purchase.

ANNEXURE A.

Section 26.—The Water Works Engineer may repair or renew or substitute any pipe, valve, cock, cistern, soil pan, water closet, or other apparatus or receptacle, so as to prevent any waste of water, and the expense of such repair or renewal or substitution, when certified under his hand, shall be defrayed by the owner or occupier of the premises, and the same may be recovered by the Council as if it were a tax payable under "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1887," and any existing or future amending Ordinances, and when recovered shall be accounted for as the Council may direct.

SCHEDULE.

Regulations.

Regulation 5 (re-draft).—Not more than one service connection pipe for the supply of water to any premises within the same curtilage and under the same assessment shall be connected to the Waterworks.

Regulations 9 and 11 are combined (and re-numbered 9).—All new services, or alterations to, repairs to, or renewing or cleaning of existing services are to be carried out in accordance with the instructions and to the satisfaction of the Waterworks Engineer.

The right is reserved to the Waterworks Engineer, whilst consulting the wishes of the consumer, as far as practicable, to determine finally all matters concerning the construction or alteration of services, such as the diameter of the pipe to be used, the manner in which it is to be laid, and the number, size, pattern, and position of the taps. Pipes and fittings of the approved quality only are to be used. "And all water fittings and apparatus used, including those supplied from cisterns, shall conform to samples approved of by the Waterworks Engineer which may be seen at his office and must pass the required test and be officially stamped before being fitted up in any house or premises."

Regulation 10.—Notice of intention to construct a new service or to alter or extend, clean out, or renew any existing one must be given to the Waterworks Engineer by filling up a printed form, which may be obtained on application at the Office of the Waterworks Engineer.

This notice (Form C hereto annexed) must be addressed to the Waterworks Engineer and delivered at his office and no such work shall be commenced without the approval in writing of the Waterworks Engineer.

Regulation 11 (new drafted).—“No service pipe which may have been connected with the waterworks for a temporary supply of water to a building during its erection, or other similar temporary purpose, shall be used for the permanent supply to the premises till application, as hereinafore provided, has been made and approved of by the Waterworks Engineer.”

Regulation 13.—Every service is to be provided with a strong brass or gun metal stop-cock, or, in cases of services larger than two inches in diameter, with a sluice or slide valve. The stopcock or valve is to be fixed under the pavement where there is one, as near to the tenement as practicable, but in a public street or place, and is to be provided with a cast iron cover and lid, so that it may at all times be accessible.

Regulation 14.—The service pipe from the street main and up to and including the stop-tap shall be the property of the Municipal Council and the cost of the necessary repairs to the same shall be paid by the Waterworks Engineer; but should any damage be done to the stop-tap on the service pipe to any premises, it shall be made good by the Waterworks Engineer at the expense of the owner or occupier of such premises, and the cost of the repair of such damage shall be paid to the Council, and the Waterworks Engineer is hereby authorized and empowered to discontinue the supply of water to such premises until such payment is made.

ANNEXURE C.

The Chairman of the Colombo Municipal Council is prepared to receive applications from youths of good education and physique who are desirous of obtaining employment as apprentices in the office of the Municipal Works Engineer.

They will be trained in the duties of a Building Inspector, Surveyor, Draughtsman, &c. They will also be called upon to attend certain classes at the Technical Institute, the fees to be paid by the Council. Applicants must be cyclists and provide their own machine, for the upkeep of which they will be allowed Rs. 10 per month. They will receive pay at the rate of Rs. 10 per month the first year, Rs. 20 per month the second year, Rs. 30 per month the third year.

Applicants should possess either the Elementary School-Leaving Certificate or have passed the Senior Oxford or Cambridge Local Examination or similar educational test.

They must be not less than 16 years nor more than 19 years of age.

They will be called upon to conform to such hours and discipline as the Chairman may deem necessary. Any misconduct or want of application will result in the termination of the apprenticeship.

It must be distinctly understood that the Chairman reserves to himself the right of terminating the appointment at any time by giving one month's notice beforehand.

The Chairman does not bind himself to give employment to apprentices on completion of their 3 years' apprenticeship, but it is highly probable that to those of them who have taken advantage of the opportunities given them to acquire a knowledge of the work they have been engaged upon, posts will be offered in the Council's service. On the other hand, those who fail to get employment in the Council's service will have received a 3 years valuable training which will qualify them for employment elsewhere.

The names of those who are desirous of taking up such apprenticeship, with full particulars of their school career, &c., and when they would be free to take up the appointment, should be sent to the Chairman of the Municipal Council through the Principal of their College not later than August 15, 1920, for a selection to be made.

It is proposed to nominate four apprenticeships in the first instance.

ANNEXURE D.—Leave to Improve Qualifications.

The Council may grant special leave without pay to an officer who holds a pensionable appointment in the Municipal Service for the purpose of enabling him to obtain technical training or professional qualifications in his particular branch of work, subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) He shall have had at least seven years continuous service in the Municipality.
- (b) The Council shall be satisfied that his work in the Municipal Service has been exceptionally satisfactory and that he possesses the qualifications necessary to enable him to take full advantage of the concession granted.
- (c) The special leave without pay shall be continuous with any vacation, half-pay, or commuted half-pay leave to which the officer may, subject to the Municipal leave regulations, be ordinarily entitled, and such leave without pay, together with any such vacation, half-pay, or full-pay leave, shall exceed the period of three years.
- (d) He shall on his return to the Municipal Service revert to his appointment and, subject to the special sanction of Council, his rate of salary shall thereon be augmented by such ordinary or extraordinary increments as would have accrued during the period of his absence. Without such special sanction he will receive the salary of his appointment at the date of the expiration of his vacation, half-pay, or commuted half-pay leave. If the officer does not qualify himself in the manner for which the leave was granted, his salary on reversion to his post shall be that which he drew when he went on leave.
- (e) The special leave will not be granted unless the Council can dispense with the officers' services.
- (f) It shall be a condition precedent to the grant of such special leave that the officer understands he shall on his return have no special claim by reason of such leave to any higher appointment in the Municipal Service.

2. Rule 18 of the Municipal Pension Minute to be amended by the following addition:—

“Any period of absence on special leave without pay granted under the Municipal Leave Regulations for the purpose of obtaining technical training or professional qualifications will not be included as part of the period of service on which the calculation for pension is based; but such special leave will not be considered as a break of service under this rule, provided the officer concerned returns on the expiration of such leave to the Municipal Service, and remains therein for a period of at least two years.”
