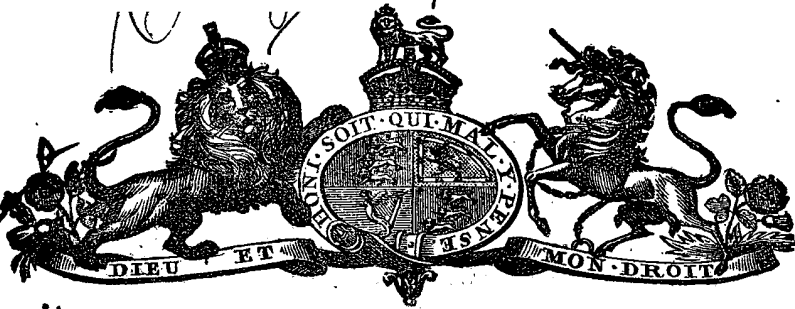

WHEREAS it is directed by clause 61 of "The Ceylon (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1920," that the first general election of members of the Legislative Council to be constituted under the said Order in Council shall be held at such period not more than six months after the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette* as the Governor shall appoint, but subject to the proviso that the Governor may, by Proclamation, postpone the holding of such first general election for a further period not exceeding three months, if in his opinion it is not practicable to hold the same within such first-mentioned period:

And whereas the said Order in Council was duly published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* on the 23rd day of September, 1920; and the said period of six months expires on the 22nd March, 1921:

And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor, it is not practicable, by reason of the work entailed in the preparation and revision of the electoral registers, to hold such first general election within the said period of six months, and it has become necessary to postpone the holding of the said first general election:

Know, therefore, that We, William Henry Manning, Governor as aforesaid, do hereby postpone the period within which the said first general election may be held for a further period of three months from the said 22nd day of March, 1921.

BY-LAW REFERRED TO.

The following by-law is numbered 30 and the existing by-law No. 30 of the by-laws published in the *Government Gazette* of November 20, 1914, is re-numbered 32 :—

Leave to Improve Qualifications.

30. The Council may grant special leave without pay to an officer who holds a pensionable appointment in the Municipal service for the purpose of enabling him to obtain technical training or professional qualifications in his particular branch of work, subject to the following conditions :—

- (a) He shall have had at least seven years' continuous service in the Municipality.
- (b) The Council shall be satisfied that his work in the Municipal service has been exceptionally satisfactory, and that he possesses the qualifications necessary to enable him to take full advantage of the concession granted.
- (c) The special leave without pay shall be continuous with any vacation, half pay, or commuted half pay leave to which the officer may, subject to the Municipal leave regulations, be ordinarily entitled,

and such leave without pay, together with any such vacation, half pay, or full pay leave, shall not exceed the period of three years.

- (d) He shall on his return to the Municipal service revert to his appointment and subject to the special sanction of Council, his rate of salary shall thereon be augmented by such ordinary or extraordinary increments as would have accrued during the period of his absence. Without such special sanction he will receive the salary of his appointment at the date of the expiration of his vacation, half pay, or commuted half pay leave. If the officer does not qualify himself in the manner for which the leave was granted, his salary on reversion to his post shall be that which he drew when he went on leave.
- (e) The special leave will not be granted unless the Council can dispense with the officers' services.
- (f) It shall be a condition precedent to the grant of such special leave that the officer understands he shall on his return have no special claim by reason of such leave to any higher appointment in the Municipal service.

WHEREAS by Chapter II., section 5, and sub-section (b), of "The Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907," it is enacted that whenever the following event has occurred, viz., when lands have been declared the property of the Crown by an order passed under the Waste Lands Ordinances, 1897 to 1903, the Governor may, by Proclamation

to be published in the *Government Gazette*, declare all or any of such lands or any part or parts thereof to be a reserved forest, and such Proclamation shall specify the limits of the forest which it is intended to reserve, and declare the same to be reserved from a date fixed by such Proclamation :

And whereas the lands hereinafter mentioned have been declared the property of the Crown by an order passed by the District Court, Kurunegala, under the Waste Lands Ordinances of 1897, 1899, 1900, and 1903, on February 21, 1916, set forth in the Schedule B hereto subjoined, and it is expedient to specify the limits of such forest :

Now know all Men that We, the said Governor, do by this Our Proclamation proclaim the forest, the limits of which are set forth in the Schedule A hereto subjoined, to be a reserved forest from and after March 11, 1921, and We do hereby further specify the limits of the said reserved forest to be those set forth in the said Schedule A.

"THE BUTCHERS' ORDINANCE, 1893."

A MENDED rules and regulations made in substitution for those dated March 20, 1915, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 6,706 of March 26, 1915, by the Local Board, Chilaw, under the provisions of section 23 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1893, in reference to the public slaughter-house, Chilaw, and confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council.

Rules and Regulations made by the Local Board, Chilaw, under Section 23 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1893.

1. No cattle shall be slaughtered at a slaughter-house except between the hours of 9 and 10 A.M. and the hours of 5 and 6 P.M.
2. The place appointed for the exposure of cattle before slaughter shall be the building known as "Cattle Pound," and situated on the grounds adjoining the slaughter-house.
3. Every licensed butcher shall produce for inspection before the Medical Officer, Chilaw, at 8.30 A.M., any head of cattle he desires to slaughter. The Medical Officer shall note on the voucher produced his opinion as to whether the said head of cattle is healthy or not.
4. Cattle rejected by the Medical Officer as unfit for slaughter shall not be received into the cattle pound.
5. Cattle pronounced to be healthy and fit for slaughter shall be put in the pound and given over to the person in charge of the slaughter-house, together with the voucher endorsed by the Medical Officer. The Inspector will then verify the voucher by comparing the brandmarks appearing on the animal with those noted on the voucher.
6. If on any animal being slaughtered the carcass shall appear diseased or unfit for human food, the Inspector, Local Board, shall bring the same to the notice of the Medical Officer, and if the Medical Officer shall be of opinion that the meat is unfit for human food, he shall cause the same to be forthwith buried, and report the matter to the Chairman, Local Board.
7. The carcasses of animals slaughtered shall be hung up after being flayed and cleaned the same day in the room provided for the purpose.
8. Except with the special permission of the Chairman the meat of the animals slaughtered between 9 and 10 A.M. shall not be removed for sale until 4 P.M. of the same day;

and the meat of the animals slaughtered between 5 and 6 P.M. shall not, except with the permission, be removed for sale until next morning at 5.30 A.M.

9. The Inspector of the Local Board shall not permit the slaughter of any cattle which have not been approved as aforesaid, or any cattle for which special license to slaughter has not been obtained from the "proper authority."

10. Every butcher or person using the slaughter-house or cattle pound shall pay fees according to the schedule annexed:—

	Cents.
For each head of cattle	50
For each sheep or goat	25

11. All fees shall be paid in advance at the Local Board Office and receipt should be obtained, which shall be shown to any officer or servant of the Board when called for.

12. The Inspector, Local Board, shall keep a register in the form annexed of all cattle brought to the slaughter-house:—

"THE DEFENCE FORCE ORDINANCE, 1910."

A DDITIONS to the regulations for the Ceylon Defence Force made by the General Officer Commanding the Troops, under the provisions of section 12 of "The Defence Force Ordinance, 1910," as amended by Ordinance No. 20 of 1918, and approved by His Excellency the Governor after consultation with the Commandant, Ceylon Defence Force:—

After Rule No. 28 add—

28 A. Officers must recognize that, as long as they are in the Ceylon Defence Force, the rank to which they are entitled under Army Order 376/1918 is in abeyance, and they must assume any rank to which they are appointed.

Delete Rule 43 and substitute the following:—

43. If recommended by the Commandant through the General Officer Commanding to His Excellency the Governor, steps of honorary rank on retirement, and the right to wear uniform on certain special occasions, may be granted to Officers of the Ceylon Defence Force, subject to the conditions hereinafter laid down:—

- (1) The privilege will be granted only to those Officers who have completed a minimum aggregate period of 6 months' commissioned service, which shall reckon from the date of first appointment as announced in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*, except that in the case of Officers who served in the Ceylon Defence Force as enrolled soldiers prior to being appointed to commissioned rank, half of such service in the ranks will be allowed to count towards the qualifying period of 6 months' service required.
- (2) It must be certified that the Officer's services were good and satisfactory, and that he was qualified to hold his rank. On instructions being given by the Colonial Government, a certificate to this effect will be rendered in respect of each Officer by the Commanding Officer under whom he served or, if impracticable, by a senior Officer of his Unit fully cognizant of his service. In the case of Officers Commanding Units, the certificate will be rendered by the Commandant; in the case of the latter Officer, the certificate may be dispensed with.
- (3) The honorary rank accorded will be the rank which the Officer concerned held on relinquishing his commission, or any higher rank the Commandant may recommend.
- (4) An Officer who relinquished his Defence Force Commission on joining His Majesty's Forces for full time service will be eligible for honorary rank and the right to wear uniform under this order, provided he has completed the necessary period of 6 months' qualifying service, but he will not be entitled to make use of the privilege until after the relinquishment of any commission which he may subsequently have held, or after final discharge from such forces.

- (5) An Officer resigning or relinquishing his commission on account of misconduct or by reason of an adverse report will not be eligible for the grant of honorary rank and the right to wear uniform.
- (6) Until further orders uniform may only be worn by an Officer granted the privilege under this order when he is employed in a military capacity or on ceremonial occasions of a military nature. In either case the letters C. R. (Ceylon Reserve) will be worn on the collar of the service dress jacket below the collar badges.

Any period of absence on special leave without pay granted under the Municipal Leave Regulations for the purpose of obtaining technical training or professional qualifications will not be included as part of the period of service on which the calculation for pension is based; but such special leave will not be considered as a break of service under this rule, provided the officer concerned returns on the expiration of such leave to the Municipal service, and remains therein for a period of at least two years."

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 5, 1921.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 137 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 67 Sinhalese, 14 Tamils, 36 Moors, 7 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1921, viz., 300,171) was 23.8, as against 18.8 in the preceding week, 21.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 171 (8 Burghers, 85 Sinhalese, 38 Tamils, 25 Moors, 9 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.7, as against 35.4 in the previous week, 21.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 171 total deaths, 37 were of infants under one year of age, as against 49 in the preceding week, 24 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Fifteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 8 in Maradana (including 4 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena, and 1 each in New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Wellawatta, as against 20 in the previous week and 20 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 each in St. Paul's and Slave Island and 1 in New Bazaar, as against 7 in the previous week.

(c) Three deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, and Maradana (of a non-resident in hospital), as against 7 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

2. Seven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), and 1 each in St. Sebastian and Slave Island, as against 15 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year.

3. Six deaths from *Plague* were registered, 2 in Pettah and 1 each in St. Sebastian, St. Paul's, New Bazaar, and Wellawatta, as against 14 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Six deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Kotahena, and 1 each in St. Sebastian, St. Paul's, Maradana (of a non-resident in hospital), and Slave Island, as against 5 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

5. Twenty-one deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 14 from *Debility*, 7 from *Enteritis*, 6 from *Dysentery*, 2 from *Worms*, 1 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Tetanus*, and 77 from "Other Causes."

6. Fifty-five cases of *Chickenpox*, 12 of *Measles*, 10 of *Plague*, and 8 of *Enteric Fever* were reported during the week as against 22, 5, 16, and 7, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 78.4°, against 77.2° in the preceding week and 80.7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.943 in., against 29.999 in. in the preceding week and 29.988 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against nil in the preceding week and 2.66 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

TODDY RENTS, WESTERN PROVINCE, 1921-22. — COLOMBO DISTRICT.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Government Agent for the Western Province will, at the Colombo Kachcheri, at 10 A.M. on Monday, April 18, 1921 (and on such subsequent days as the Government Agent shall, if necessary, notify), expose for sale by auction, subject to the Conditions in the Schedule A hereto, the privilege of selling Fermented Toddy by Retail from October 1, 1921, to September 30, 1922, at Taverns to be established by the purchasers in the villages specified in the Schedule B hereto, not more than one shop being allowed in each such village, at a site to be approved by the Government Agent.

2. No sale of Fermented Toddy will be allowed in villages other than those in the said Schedule B expressly specified.

(b) No rebate will be allowed in respect of any taverns in the event of objections to sites being upheld after inquiry by the Government Agent.

4. The purchasers will be required to pay in stamps the stamp duty under the Stamps Ordinance of 1919 in respect of the Conditions of Sale as well as of the security bond referred to in clause 2 (a) of the Conditions of Sale.

5. The attention of intending purchasers is specially drawn to clause 2 (b) of the Conditions of Sale.

6. Save in exceptional circumstances no trees will be licensed in dry areas.

Schedule A.—TODDY RENT SALE CONDITIONS.

The conditions on which the exclusive privilege of selling fermented toddy by retail within the villages described in Schedule B., from October 1, 1921, to September 30, 1922, is sold are, in addition to the general conditions applicable to all excise licenses published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,615 of March 13, 1914, as follows :—

1. The Government Agent shall have power, in his discretion, to refuse to accept any bid or tender, subject to which power the highest bidder or tenderer shall be the grantee of the privilege, and shall conform to and perform all the conditions under which the privilege is sold.

2. (a) The grantee shall, immediately on being declared the grantee, sign these conditions of sale and pay to the Government Agent a sum equivalent to two months' rent of the privilege as a security deposit, which amount shall be liable to forfeiture in whole or in part, at the discretion of the Government Agent, for breach of any of the conditions; and such forfeiture shall be in addition to any other penalty prescribed by the conditions for such breach. The grantee shall hypothecate the said security deposit by a bond in form Excise T 23 within fourteen days of sale of the privilege above prescribed.

(b) If the highest bid or tender under condition 1 exceeds the sum of Rs. 2,000, the grantee shall at the same time execute, if so required by the Government Agent, in the form sanctioned by law, a power of attorney to confess judgment in any action which may be instituted against him for the recovery of any moneys due in respect of this privilege.

(c) The grantee shall, on signing the conditions of sale, elect, and under his hand signify, a post office to which all notices and processes whatever in connection with the above said privilege shall be addressed under registered post; and all such notices or processes as aforesaid so addressed to the post office so elected and posted in due course shall be considered as good and effectual to all intents and purposes as if the same were served personally.

3. The grantee shall pay to the Government Agent the purchase money or rent in twelve equal monthly instalments, and also any duty, fee, cost price, or other sum due to the Government from him. The first instalment of the purchase money or rent shall be considered due and payable on September 30, 1921, and the remainder on the last day of each succeeding month. Interest at the rate of 9 per cent. per annum shall be payable on all arrears.

4. No payment of any sum due by the grantee to the Crown shall be considered as duly made unless the grantee shall produce a Kachcheri receipt therefor; and no money which, for his own convenience, the grantee may think fit to leave in the hands of the Shroff or any other officer of the Kachcheri shall be considered as money paid under this contract.

5. If an instalment or part of the instalment of the purchase money or rent, or any duty, fee, cost price, or other sum due to the Government from the grantee remains unpaid after the same shall have become due and payable, the Government Agent shall have power, after 15 days' notice to the grantee of his intention to do so, without further process of law, to cancel the license or licenses issued to the grantee, and to re-sell the privilege at the risk and loss of the grantee. The notice referred to may be given in such manner as the Government Agent may direct.

6. The grantee shall, on receipt of the license to sell, furnish to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Excise an application on the prescribed form showing the numbers and situations of the trees which he proposes to tap for the supply of fermented toddy for sale at each tavern, and no tree shall be tapped or toddy drawn for this purpose except under cover of a license setting forth the numbers and situations of the trees, the name of the drawer, and the tavern for which the fermented toddy is intended. The Superintendent of Excise or Assistant Superintendent of Excise shall have power, subject to appeal to the Excise Commissioner, to refuse any application to tap trees for any tavern if such application is, in his opinion, open to serious objection.

7. No tree shall be tapped or toddy drawn therefrom for the supply of fermented toddy for sale at a tavern unless such tree shall first have been marked for this purpose in a manner prescribed by the Excise Commissioner; nor shall toddy be transported to the tavern except under cover of a pass granted by the Superintendent of Excise or the Assistant Superintendent of Excise. Such pass shall set forth the name of the person who transports the toddy and shall be issued to the grantee, who shall hand it to the person who transports the toddy.

8. The grantee, if he taps the trees and draws the toddy himself, or, if he delegates the work to another person, such person shall, at the time of tapping the trees or drawing the toddy, invariably carry the license on his person, and shall produce it forthwith on the demand of any Excise Officer or village headman.

9. The grantee shall have no concern or interest, direct or indirect, in the sale of arrack, or in the purchase of any privilege for the sale of arrack, within the Revenue District in which he possesses the privilege of selling toddy.

10. Except under the written authority of the Assistant Commissioner of Excise, no toddy, except toddy drawn from trees licensed and marked for a particular tavern, shall be kept, offered for sale, or sold in that tavern.

11. No fermented toddy shall be sold at a lower price than 40 cents per gallon, and in proportion for any smaller quantity.

12. The Government Agent shall not be bound to find a site for any tavern in the event of the grantee not being able to procure a site. No tavern shall be opened at any place except with the approval of the Government Agent.

13. The purchaser shall, within ten days from the date on which the privilege commences to run, or within such extended time as the Government Agent may grant, apply to the Government Agent and obtain a license or licenses for the sale by retail of fermented toddy at the taverns within the area covered by the privilege.

14. The grantee shall have no claim to a remission if the Government Agent or his Assistant shall find it necessary to order the taverns upon any road to be closed for a limited period during the march of troops, or upon the plea of losses arising from any cause whatever.

15. (a) No bids will be accepted from any person who is a habitual criminal as defined by Ordinance No. 32 of 1914.

(b) The purchaser shall, whenever called upon to do so by the Government Agent, satisfy him that he is not a habitual criminal within the meaning of the said Ordinance.

16. The taverns within the areas of the exclusive privilege granted under the foregoing conditions shall open and close at the hours specified in Schedule C., and no toddy shall be sold at such tavern between the hour of closing and that opening.

"Improvements in the process of manufacture of black tea, and apparatus for the same."

Abstract.—The inventor state:—

In the manufacture of black tea by the method usually employed, the green leaf, after being withered, is rolled, and then, if the fermentation which had taken place during the rolling process is considered insufficient, is subjected to a further period of fermentation before being fired.

Our invention relates to the treatment by steam of the leaf after the withering stage and before advanced fermentation has set in, and to apparatus for such treatment.

According to our invention the withered leaf is treated by being subjected to the action of steam. The action of the steam improves the condition of the withered leaf, softens any part of the leaf which is hard, and generally preserves those qualities which tend to produce body and flavour in the liquor, and produces a better sample of made tea.

The steam treatment is conveniently applied in an apparatus composed of a chest or an enclosed chamber or compartment, which we hereinafter refer to as the chamber, provided with surfaces for spreading leaf so as to bring it into contact with the steam when introduced. The chamber is also provided with openings for the regulated introduction and/or exhaust of the steam, and with openings affording convenient means for introducing and taking out the leaf, which should be designed so as to make the chamber practically steam-tight during the steam application.

The claims are:—

1. In the manufacture of black tea, subjecting withered leaf to the action of steam before advanced fermentation has set in, as and for the purposes described.

2. In apparatus for the manufacture of black tea, a chamber or compartment provided with means for the introduction and removal of withered leaf and with internal surfaces for spreading the withered leaf for the steam treatment claimed in (1), and with inlets and outlets for the regulated introduction and exhaust of the steam.

"Improvements in the process of manufacture of black tea."

Abstract.—The inventors state:—

According to our invention the green tea leaf brought in fresh from the field is subjected to the action of a suitable non-injurious gas (or mixture of gases) containing a greater percentage of oxygen than is contained in air. This gas or mixture of gases we hereinafter refer to as the gas. The essential property of the gas is that it contains a greater percentage of oxygen than is contained in air. The extra oxygen brings the leaf more rapidly to the requisite chemical state for rolling than when air alone is used.

The period taken for withering is thus largely independent of climatic conditions. It is very greatly shortened, and by the use of suitable apparatus may be substantially reduced compared with the period required by an ordinary wither on tats. When green leaf has been withered by the use of the gas the essential elements in the leaf are preserved, and the quality of the made tea improved and generally kept uniform, and the tea infusion improved.

The gas known as ozone or ozonair is suitable for use in our invention.

The claim is:—

In the manufacture of black tea bringing fresh leaf to the requisite physical and chemical condition for rolling by subjecting the leaf to the action of a gas or mixture of gases containing a greater percentage of oxygen than is contained in air, as described.

Marconi's Wireless Telegraph Co., Ltd.

"Improvements in valve receivers for wireless signals."

Abstract.—This invention relates to receivers of wireless signals which comprise a vacuous vessel containing a heated filament, a grid and an anode, and the main object of the invention is to arrange that the current in the anode circuit shall not be able to rise beyond a certain limiting valve so that no further increase of the potential of the anode will cause any corresponding increase in such current. One important result of this will be that the sounds caused by atmospheric in a telephone will be reduced and will thus be prevented from over-powering the sounds caused by the signals which is desired to detect. This limitation has previously been obtained by dulling down the filament.

According to this invention we obtain it by applying a small steady potential to the grid which should be made of fine mesh and should be so arranged as to form a complete screen across the path between the filament and the anode; the smaller the potential difference between the grid and the filament the greater is the limitation.

If it is desired to obtain a limitation of the current between the filament and the anode and at the same time to obtain a magnification of the signals received, we employ two grids, the aerial being coupled to the outer grid, or that which is further from the filament, while the limitation is effected by a steady potential applied to the inner grid. In this case the inner grid should be of fine mesh while the outer grid may be constructed as required, the properties of fine and coarse mesh for magnifying purposes being well known.

Again by applying a small steady potential to the anode or to the outer grid if two are employed we obtain a rising and falling current in the anode circuit, as the potential of the anode or outer grid is increased.

When, therefore, signals are applied to the anode or outer grid, weak signals are efficiently rectified or conducted while atmospheric or strong signals are actually reduced to a strength less than that of the weak signals.

The claim is :—

Valve receivers for wireless signals in which the current which can pass is limited, substantially as described.
