VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 18, 1921.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 355 (2 Europeans, 23 Burghers, 245 Sinhalese, 45 Tamils, 27 Moors, 9 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the Census population on March 18, 1921, viz., 244,182) was 75.8,* as against 35.9 in the preceding week, 23.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 142 (4 Burghers, 85 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 19 Moors, 5 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 30.3, as against 29.3 in the previous week, 23.9 in the corresponding

week of last year, and 27.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 142 total deaths, 35 were of infants under one year of age, as against 33 in the preceding week, 22 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 5.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Seventeen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 8 in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 4 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazar, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, and Kollupitiya. as against 16 in the previous week, and 20 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Ten deaths from Influenza were registered, 5 in Slave Island, 3 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident

in hospital), and I each in Pettah and St. Paul's, as against 7 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last

year. (c) One death from Bronchitis was registered in New Bazaar, as against 2 in the previous week.

2. (a) Fifteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, 8 in Maradana (inculding 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in New Bazaar and 1 each in Kotahena, Slave Island, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta, as against 10 in the previous week, and 14 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama hospital from *Phthisis* during the week.

Three deaths from Enteric Fever were registered in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital),

as against 6 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

4. Fourteen deaths from Infantile Convulsions, were registered, 14 from Debility, 6 from Diarrhea, 5 from Enteritis,

4 from Worms, 3 from Dysentery, and 50 from Other Causes.

5. Twelve cases of Measles, 5 of Chickenpox, and 2 of Enteric Fever were reported during the week, as against 10, 1, and 7, respectively, of the preceding week.

- (3) To purchase or otherwise acquire and turn to account any concessions, lands, rights in or easements over lands, grants, or authorizations for agricultural, mining, trading, and other purposes in the Island of Ceylon and elsewhere.
- (4) To carry on business as produce brokers, buyers, and sellers of, and dealers in, stocks, shares, and investments of all kinds, insurance brokers, and general merchants.
- (5) To apply for, purchase, or otherwise acquire any patents, brevets d'invention, licenses, concessions, and the like, conferring any exclusive or non-exclusive or limited right to use, or any secret or other information as to any invention which may seem capable of being used for any of the purposes of the Company, or the acquisition of which may seem calculated directly or indirectly to benefit the Company, and to use, exercise, develop, grant licenses in respect of, or otherwise turn to account or profit the property, rights, or information so acquired, and to expend money in experimenting upon, and testing and improving, or seeking to improve, any patents;
- inventions, secret processes, or rights which the Company may acquire or propose to acquire.

 (6) To purchase or otherwise acquire all or any part of the business or property of any person, firm, association, or company carrying on or (in the case of a company) formed to carry on any business which this Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable to the purposes of this Company, and as the consideration for the same to pay cash or to issue any shares, stocks, or obligations of this Company, and in connection with any such transaction to undertake any liabilities relating to the business or property acquired.
- (7) To enter into partnership or into any arrangement, whether perpetual or terminable, for sharing profits, union of interests, joint-adventure, reciprocal concession, or co-operation with any person, firm, association, or company carrying on or engaged in or about to carry on or engage in any business or transaction which this Company is authorized to carry on or engage in, or any business or transaction, or course of action, which may seem to the Company capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit this Company, or to prevent or minimize apprehended loss or damage or cost to this Company or to any such company as aforesaid, and to purchase, subscribe for, or otherwise acquire and hold shares (fully or partly paid up) or stock in, or securities of, or to lend money, to guarantee the contracts of, subsidize or otherwise assist any such person, firm, association, or company, and to sell, hold, re-issue, with or without guarantee, or otherwise deal with shares, stock, or
- (8) Generally to purchase, take on lease or license, or in exchange, hire, or otherwise acquire any real or personal property or any interest therein, and any rights, easements, or privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient with reference to any of the objects of the Company, or capable of being properly dealt with in connection with any of the Company's property or rights for the time being, and to erect and construct and equip, re-construct, and alter buildings and works of all kinds.
- (9) To establish, maintain, develop, extend, subscribe to, or subsidize any association, institution, or fund which may seem directly or indirectly conducive to the interests of the Company, and in particular with a view to experiments, or to the protection of the interests of masters, owners, or employers against strikes, workmen's combinations, or otherwise.
- (10) To establish and support, or to aid in the establishment and support of, essociations, institutions, or conveniences calculated to benefit employees or ex-employees of the Company or its predecessors in business, or the relatives or dependents of such persons, to grant pensions or allowances, and to subscribe or guarantee money for charitable or benevolent objects, or for any exhibition, or for any purpose which may seem likely, whether directly or indirectly, to promote the development of the business of the Company, or to prevent its contraction, or for any public, general, or useful object.
- (11) To sell, exchange, let, develop, dispose of, or otherwise deal with the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof upon such terms and for such consideration as the Company may think fit.
- (12) To sell, improve, manage, develop, exchange, mortgage, let on rent, or in consideration of a share of profits
- (either in money or kind), or otherwise grant licenses, easements, and other rights of and over, and in any manner dispose of, turn to profit, or deal with all or any part of the property and rights of the Company.

 (13) To accept in consideration for the undertaking of the Company or for any property or rights sold, let or disposed of, or any service rendered, or to purchase, substrated for, or otherwise acquire, and to hold the perpetual or any service rendered, or to purchase, substrated or otherwise acquire, and to hold the perpetual or otherwise acquire or delegation of the company. redeemable debentures or debenture stock, or obligations, or the shares (fully or partly paid up), or stock of any company in the Island of Ceylon or elsewhere.
- (14) To promote any other company or companies for the purpose of acquiring all or any of the property, rights, and liabilities of this Company, or in which this Company is interested, or for any other purpose which may seem directly or indirectly calculated to benefit this Company, and to pay the costs, charges, and expenses preliminary or incidental to the promotion, formation, establishment, registration, and advertising of any such company, and the issue of its capital or securities, and to guarantee the payment of any debentures, debenture stock or other securities issued by any such company, and the interest thereon, and the payment of interest of dividends upon the stock or shares of any such company.
- (15) To invest and deal with the moneys of the Company not immediately required upon such investments. and in such manner as may from time to time be determined.
- (16) To receive money on deposit or otherwise, to lend money with or without security to such persons, and generally on such terms as may seem expedient, and in particular to tenants and customers of and other persons have dealings with the Company, and to guarantee the performance of contracts by any such persons.
- (17) To apply for and promote any Ordinance or order for extending the powers of the Company, or for enabling the Company to carry any of its objects into effect, or for effecting any modification of the Company's constitution, and to oppose and resist and to contribute to the costs of opposing any proceedings, applications, agitations. or movements which may seem directly or indirectly adverse to the Company's interests.

- (18) To enter into any arrangements with any government or authority, supreme, municipal, local, or otherwise, or with railway companies, canal companies, shipping companies, dock companies, commissioners, carriers, and other persons, corporations, or companies in any part of the world which may seem conducive to the Company's objects or any of them, and to obtain from any such government or authority, or any such railway'er other company, person, or corporation any rights, privileges, and concessions which may seem conducive to the Company's objects or any of them, and to carry out, exercise, and comply with any such arrangements, rights, privileges, and concessions.
- (19) To register the Company or constitute or incorporate it as an anonymous or other society, or to procure it to be recognized in any foreign country or place.
- (20) To raise or borrow money or to secure the payment of money and the interest thereon in such manner and on such terms as may seem expedient, and in particular by the issue of debentures or debenture stock, whether perpetual or otherwise, and charged or not charged upon the whole or any part of the undertaking, property, and rights of the Company, both present and future, including its uncalled capital.
- (21) To draw, make, accept, endorse, discount, execute, and issue bills of exchange, promissory notes, debentures, bills of lading, charter parties, warrants, policies, and other negotiable or transferable instruments or securities, and to buy, sell, or otherwise deal in the same.
- (22) To remunerate (by cash or other assets or by the allotment of fully or partly paid shares or in any other manner) any persons, firms, associations, or companies for services rendered or to be rendered in acting as trustees for debenture holders or debenture stock holders of the Company, or for subscribing or agreeing to subscribe, whether absolutely or conditionally, or for procuring or agreeing to procure subscriptions, whether absolute or conditional, for any shares, debentures, debenture stock, or other securities of the Company or of any company promoted by this Company, or for services rendered in or about the formation or promotion of the Company or any company promoted by this Company, or in introducing any property or business to the Company, or in or about the conduct of its business, or for guaranteeing payment of such debentures, debenture stock, or other securities, and any interest thereon.
- (23) To distribute any of the property of the Company among the members in specie, and either by way of dividends or upon any return of capital.
- (24) To pay out of the funds of the Company all costs, charges, and expenses preliminary and incidental to the promotion, formation, establishment, registration, and advertising of the Company and the issue of its capital.
- (25) To remunerate the servants of the Company and others by donations, pensions, annuities, or bonuses out of or in proportion to the returns or profits of the Company or otherwise as the Company may think fit.
- (26) To do all or any of the above things in any part of the world, and either as principals, agents, trustees, contractors, or otherwise, and either alone or in conjunction with others, and either by or through agents, sub-contractors, trustees, or otherwise.
- (27) To do all such things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects or any of them.

And it is hereby declared that the word "Company" in this clause, except where used in reference to this Company, shall be deemed to include any partnership or other body of persons, whether incorporated or not incorporated, and whether domiciled in the Island of Ceylon or elsewhere, and that the objects specified in the different paragraphs of this clause shall, except where otherwise expressed in such paragraphs, be in nowise limited by reference to, or inference from, any other paragraph or the name of the Company.

- 4. The liability of the members is limited.
- 5. The capital of the Company is 200,000 Rupees, divided into 20,000 shares of Ten Rupees each, with power to increase or reduce and with power to divide the original or any new capital into shares of different classes which may from time to time be issued or held with any preferences or priorities or special, qualified, or restricted rights in the payment of dividends, or in the distribution of assets or otherwise as compared with any other shares, whether preference, ordinary, or deferred, and whether then already issued or not, or as shares ranking equally with any other shares, or as deferred shares, or with a special right of or restriction, whether absolute or partial, against voting, and to vary the regulations of the Company from time to time so far as necessary to give effect to any such preference or priority or special, qualified, or restricted right, as well as in any other particulars, and upon the subdivision of a share to apportion the right to participate in profits or in the distribution of assets or the right to vote in any manner as between the shares resulting from any such subdivision, and to give to any one or more of such shares any preferences, priorities, or advantages with regard to dividends in the distribution of assets as to rights of voting or in any other respect over the other or others of them.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF MACKWOODS RUBBER TRADING COMPANY, LIMITED.

I.—PRELIMINARY.

I. The regulations contained in "Table C," in the schedule to "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861," shall not apply to this Company, but the following shall be the regulations of the Company.

2. In these Articles, unless there be something in the subject or the context inconsistent therewith:—

"These Articles" means the Regulations of the Company for the time being in force.

"Month" means calendar month.
"Year" means the year from the 1st day of January to the 31st day of December, both inclusive.

"In Writing" means written or i rinted or partly written and partly printed.

"Extraordinary resolution" means, in the case of a meeting of the holders of any class of shares, a resolution passed by a majority consisting of not less than three-fourths of the votes given on the resolution.

Words importing only the singular number include the plural number, and vice versa.

Words importing only the masculine gender include the feminine gender.

Words importing persons include corporations.

The business of the Company may be commenced as soon after the incorporation of the Company as the Directors shall think fit, and notwithstanding that part only of the shares may have been allotted, any branch or kind of business which by the Memorandum of Association is either expressly or by implication authorized to be undertaken by the Company may be undertaken by the Directors at such time or times as they shall think fit, either alone or with any one or more of the other branches or kinds of business thereby authorized, and any such branch or kind of business may be suffered by them to be in abeyance, whether actually commenced or not, so long as the Directors may deem it expedient not to commence or proceed with such branch or kind of business.

II.--CAPITAL.

1.—SHARES.

4. No part of the funds of the Company shall be employed in the purchase of or lent or advanced upon the security

of the shares of the Company.

5. The shares shall be subject to the control of the Directors, who may issue and allot the same to such persons on such terms and conditions as to payment by way of deposit, instalment, or calls or as the amount or time of payment of calls and at such times as the Directors may think fit, subject, however, in the case of any new shares of the Company, to the consent in writing of the holders of two-thirds of the shares of the Company for the time being issued.

6. The Company may make arrangements on the issue of shares for a difference between the holders of such shares in the amount of calls to be paid and time for the payment of such calls.

7. If by the conditions of the allotment of any share the whole or part of the amount or issue price thereof shall be payable by instalments, every such instalment shall when due be paid to the Company by the person who for the time being shall be the registered holder of the share, but this provision shall not affect the liability of any allottee who may have agreed to pay the same.

8. The Company shall be entitled to treat the registered holder of any share as the absolute owner thereof, and consequently shall not be bound by or compelled to recognize, even when having notice thereof, any trust, charge, incumbrance, lien, or other claim to or interest in such share on the part of any person other than an absolute right thereto in

the registered holder thereof for the time being, and such rights upon transmission as are hereinafter mentioned.

9. If two or more persons are registered as joint-holders of any share, any one of such persons may give effectual receipts for any dividends, bonus, return of capital, or other money payable in respect of such share, but all the joint-holders of a share shall be severally as well as jointly liable for the payment of all instalments and calls payable in respect thereof.

The Company may with the consent in writing of the holders of two-thirds of the shares of the Company for the time being issued pay to any person in consideration of his subscribing or agreeing to subscribe, whether absolutely or conditionally, for any shares, debentures, or debenture stock in the Company, or procuring or agreeing to procure subscriptions, whether absolute or conditional, for any shares, debentures, or debenture stock in the Company, such commission as the Directors may from time to time determine, but so that the commission payable in respect of shares (if paid out of capital moneys or satisfied by means of shares of the Company) shall not exceed the rate of 20 per cent of the nominal amount of the shares in each case subscribed or to be subscribed, and that the rate per cent paid or agreed to be paid shall be disclosed in any circular or notice (not being a prospectus) inviting subscriptions for the shares. Such commission shall be disclosed in any circular or notice (not being a prospectus) inviting subscriptions for the shares. Such commission may be satisfied by the allotment of fully or partly paid shares. The total amount of the sum paid by way of commission in respect of any of the same paid by way of commission. in respect of any shares, debentures, or debenture stock, or allowed by way of discount in respect of any debentures or debenture stock, or so much thereof as shall not have been written off, shall be stated in every balance sheet of the Company, until the whole amount thereof has been written off. The Company may also on the issue of shares pay such brokerage as may be lawful.

2.—SHARE CERTIFICATE.

11. The certificates of title to shares shall be issued under the seal of the Company, signed by one Director and countersigned by the Secretary or some other person appointed by the Directors. Every certificate shall specify the name or names of the holder or holders, the number and denoting numbers of the shares in respect of which it is issued, and the amount paid up or credited as paid up thereon.

12. Every member shall be entitled, without payment, to receive within two months after allotment or registration of transfer (unless the conditions of issue provide for a longer period) one certificate for the shares allotted to or acquired by him, but so that two or more persons entitled jointly to a share shall be entitled only to one certificate in respect thereof.

13. If any certificate is worn out or defaced, then, upon delivery thereof to the Directors, they may order the same

to be cancelled, and may issue a new certificate in lieu thereof, and if any certificate is lost or destroyed, then, upon proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Directors, and on such indemnity, whether with or without security, as the Directors may deem adequate being given, and on payment to the Company of any expenses incurred by the Company in connection with the proof of such loss, or in investigating the title to the shares, or in connection with such indemnity, a new certificate in lieu thereof shall be issued to the person entitle! to the shares represented by such lost or destroyed certificate.

14. There shall be paid to the Company for every certificate issued under the last preceding article the sum of one rupee or such smaller sum as the Directors may from time to time determine.

The certificate of shares registered in the joint names of two or more persons shall be delivered to the person first named on the register in respect thereof, unless such joint-holders otherwise direct.

3.—Calls on Shares.

16. The Directors may from time to time, subject to the terms on which shares have been issued, make such calls as they shall think fit upon the members in respect of all moneys unpaid on the shares held by them respectively, and not by the conditions of allotment thereof ruade payable at fixed times, and each member shall be liable to pay the amounts of calls so made to the persons, and at the times and places appointed by the Directors. A call may be made payable by instalments, a date fixed for payment may be postponed, and a call may be wholly or in part revoked.

A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution of the Directors authorizing such

call is passed.

18. Six weeks' notice of any call shall be given, specifying the time and place of payment and the persons to whom

such call is payable.

19. If any instalment payable on a share under the terms of allotment, or any call or instalment of a call payable for payment thereof, the registered holder for the time being or allottee of the share shall pay interest for the same from the day appointed for the payment thereof to the time

of actual payment at the rate of 10 per cent, per annum, or at such less rate as the Directors may determine.

20. The Directors may, if they think fit, receive from any member willing to advance the same all or any part of the money unpaid upon the shares held by him beyond the sums actually called up thereon, either as a loan repayable or as a payment in advance of calls, but such advance, whether repayable or not, shall, until actually repaid, extinguish, so far as the same shall extend, the liability upon the shares in respect of which it is advanced, and upon the money so received, or so much thereof as from time to time exceeds the amount of the calls then made upon the shares in respect of which it has been received, the Company may pay interest at such rate as the member paying such sum and the Directors

4.—FORFEITURE AND LIEN.

21. If any member fails to pay the whole or any part of any instalment payable under the terms of allotment of a share or of any call on or before the day appointed for the payment thereof, the Directors may at any time thereafter, while the said instalment or call or any part thereof remains unpaid, serve a notice on such member requiring him to pay the same, with any interest which may have accrued, and all expenses which may have been incurred by the Company by reason of such non-payment.

The notice shall name a day (not being less than six weeks from the date of the notice) and a place (being either the registered office of the Company or some place at which calls of the Company are usually made payable) on and at which such instalment or call or such part thereof as shall remain unpaid and such interest and expenses are to be paid. The notice shall also state that in the event of non-payment at or before the time and at the place appointed,

the share in respect of which such payment is due will be liable to be forfeited.

23. If the requisitions of such notice as aforesaid are not complied with, any shares in respect of which such notice shall have been given may at any time thereafter, before payment of all instalments, calls, interest, and expenses due in respect thereof, be forfeited by a resolution of the Directors to that effect. Such forfeiture shall include all dividends declared and interest payable in respect of the forfeited shares, and not actually paid before the forfeiture.

24. Any share so forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may be sold, re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of in such manner as the Directors shall with the consent in writing of the holders of two-thirds of the shares of the Company for the time being issued (exclusive of the shares so forfeited) think fit, and in the case of re-allotment

with or without any moneys paid thereon by any former holder credited as paid up thereon.

25. The Directors may at any time before any share so forfeited shall have been sold, re-allotted, or otherwise

disposed of annul the forfeiture upon such conditions as they think fit.

26. The holder at the time of forfeiture of any share which has been forfeited shall, notwithstanding the same, be liable to pay to the Company all instalments, calls, interest, and expenses owing upon or in respect of such share at the time of the forfeiture, together with interest on such instalments, calls, and expenses from the time of forfeiture, until payment at the rate of 10 per cent. per annum, or such less rate as may be fixed by the Directors.

The Company shall have a first and paramount lien on all the shares registered in the name of any member (whether solely or jointly with other persons), and on the dividends or interest declared or payable in respect thereof for the debts, liabilities, or engagements of that member either alone or jointly with any other person to or with the Company, although the period for the payment, fulfilment, or discharge thereof may not have arrived, and whether the same may have been incurred before or after notice of any equitable interest subsisting in any person other than the registered holder. For the purpose of enforcing such lien the Directors may sell the shares subject thereto in such manner as they shall with the consent in writing of the holders of two-thirds of the shares of the Company for the time being issued think fit, but no sale shall be made until such period as aforesaid shall have arrived, and until rotice in writing of the intention to sell shall have been served on such member, his executors, or administrators, and default shall have been made by him or them in the payment, fulfilment, or discharge of such debts, liabilities, or engagements for seven days after service of such The net proceeds of any such sale shall be applied in or towards satisfaction of such debts, liabilities, or engagements, and the residue (if any) paid to such member, his executors, administrators, or assigns. Unless otherwise agreed, the registration of a transfer of shares shall operate as a waiver of the Company's lien (if any) on such shares.

28. 5.—TRANSFER AND TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

29. The instrument of transfer of any share in the Company shall be in writing in the usual common form, but need not be under seal, and shall be signed both by the transferor and the transferee. Shares of different classes shall not be transferred by the same instrument of transfer without the consent of the Directors. Until a transfer is duly registered the transferor shall be deemed the holder of the share transferred.

30. There shall be paid to the Company in respect of the registration of every transfer or transmission of a share

or shares such fee not exceeding one rupee as the Directors deem fit.

31. No share in the Company shall be transferred without the previous consent in writing of the holders of two-

thirds of the shares of the Company for the time being issued.

32. The executors or administrators of a deceased member (not being one of several joint-holders) shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to or interest in the shares registered in the name of such member, and in the case of the death of any one or more of the joint-holders of any registered shares, the survivors or survivor shall be the only persons or person recognized by the Company as having any title to or interest in such shares, but this Article shall not be deemed to release the estate of a deceased joint-holder from any liability in respect of any shares held by him jointly with any other person or persons.

33. Any person becoming entitled to a share in consequence of the death or bankruptcy of a member or otherwise than by transfer, upon producing the share certificate and such evidence of title as the Directors think sufficient, may, with the consent of the Directors or of the holders of two-thirds of the shares of the Company for the time being issued (which

they shall be under no obligation to give), be himself registered as the holder of the shares, or may, subject to the regulations of these Articles as to transfers, transfer such shares to any other person. There shall be paid to the Company in respect of

any such registration such fee not exceeding one rupee as the Directors deem fit.

34. Every instrument of transfer shall be left at the registered office of the Company for registration, together with the certificate of the shares proposed to be transferred, and the Company shall be furnished with such evidence as the Directors may require of the title of the transferor or his right to transfer the shares, and thereupon, and upon payment of the proper fee, the transferee shall, subject to the foregoing regulations, be registered as a member in respect of such shares. The Directors may waive the production of a certificate upon evidence satisfactory to them of its loss or destruction, and on such indemnity, whether with or without security, as the Directors may deem adequate being given, but the transferor shall pay to the Company any expenses incurred in investigating the title to the shares, or in connection with such indemnity.

35. All instruments of transfer which shall be registered and the certificates of the shares to which they refer shall be retained by the Company, but any instrument of transfer which the Directors may decline to register and the certificates of the shares to which it refers shall be returned to the person depositing the same. If a certificate lodged and retained comprises more shares than the transfer, a new certificate for the residue shall be issued to the transferor.

The transfer books may be closed during such time or times as the Directors may think fit, not exceeding

in the whole twenty-one days in each year.

37. The holders for the time being of two-thirds of the shares of the Company for the time being issued may at any time serve the Company with a requisition to enforce the transfer of any particular shares not held by the requisitionists. The Company shall forthwith give to the holder of such shares notice in writing (with a copy of this Article subjoined), and upon the service of such notice the holder of such shares shall be deemed to have authorized the Company to sell his shares to any other member of the Company in accordance with the provisions herein contained at the fair value to be fixed by the Auditor in accordance with these Articles. If the Company shall within the space of twenty-eight days after the service of such notice find a member of the Company willing to purchase the shares (hereinafter called "the purchasing member"), and shall give notice thereof to the holders of such shares, the latter shall be bound upon payment of the fair value to transfer the shares to the purchasing member. In case any difference arises between such holder and the purchasing member as to the fair value of the shares, the Auditor shall on the application of either party certify in writing the sum which in his opinion is the fair value, and such such shall be deemed to be the fair value, and into the Auditor shall be deemed to be acting as an expert and not as an arbitrator. If the holder of such shares after having become bound as aforesaid makes default in transferring the shares, the Company may receive the purchase money and shall thereafter cause the name of the purchasing member to be entered in the register as the holder of the shares, and shall hold the purchase money in trust for the holder of such shares. The receipt of the Company for the purchase money shall be a the purchase money in trust for the holder of such shares. The receipt of the Company for the purchase money shall be a good discharge to the purchasing member, and after his name has been entered in the register in the purported exercise of the aforesaid power, the validity of the proceedings shall not be questioned by any person. Until otherwise determined by the Company in general meeting any shares in respect of which any such requisition shall be served on the Company shall be offered in succession to the holders of the shares of the Company in accordance with the number of shares held by them respectively, the holder of a larger holding being always preferred to the holder of a smaller holding, and as between holdings of equal amount in such order as may be determined by lots drawn in regard thereto, and the lots shall be drawn in such manner as the Directors think fit.

6.-INCREASE AND REDUCTION OF CAPITAL.

38. The Company in General Meeting may with the consent in writing of the holders of two-thirds of the shares of the Company for the time being issued from time to time increase the capital by the creation of new shares of such

aggregate amount as may be deemed expedient.

39. The new shares shall be of such nominal amounts and shall be issued upon such terms and conditions as the Company in General Meeting may with the consent in writing of the holder of two-thirds of the shares of the Company for the time being issued direct, and in particular such shares and also any shares of the original capital for the time being unissued may (subject to the provisions hereinafter contained as to the consent of the holders of any class of shares where such consent is necessary) be issued with any preference or priorities, or special or qualified, or restricted rights in the payment of dividends, or in the distribution of assets or otherwise over as compared with any other shares, whether preference, ordinary, or deferred, and whether then already issued or not, or as shares ranking equally with any other shares, or as deferred shares, or with any special rights of or restrictions (whether absolute or partial) against voting.

40. Subject to or in default of any such directions, the provisions of these Articles shall apply to the new capital

in the same manner in all respects as to the original ordinary capital of the Company.

41. The Company may from time to time by special resolution reduce its capital in any way, and in particular (without prejudice to the generality of this power) may (a) extinguish or reduce the liability on any of its shares in respect of capital not paid up, (b) either with or without extinguishing or reducing liability on any of its shares cancel any paid up capital which is lost or is unrepresented by available assets, or (c) either with or without extinguishing or reducing liability on any of its shares pay off any paid up capital which is in excess of the wants of the Company. The Company may also cancel shares which at the date of the passing of the resolution in that behalf have not been taken or agreed to be taken by any person, and diminish the amount of its capital by the amount of the shares so cancelled. Capital may be paid off upon the footing that it may be called up again or otherwise.

7.—Consolidation and Subdivision of Shares.

42. The Company in General Meeting may consolidate, and by special resolution may subdivide, its shares or any of them into shares of a larger or smaller denomination. The special resolution whereby any share is subdivided may provide that as between the holders of the shares resulting from such subdivision any one or more of such shares shall have any preference, priority, or advantage with regard to dividends, in the distribution of assets, as to right of voting, or in any other respect over the other or others of them.

III.—BORROWING POWERS.

43. The Directors may from time to time at their discretion raise or borrow in any manner, and upon any terms,

any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company.

44. The Directors may for the purpose of securing borrowed money and the interest thereon, or for any other purpose, create any mortgage, charge, or lien upon, or may pledge the undertaking of the Company and the whole or any part of its property, present and future, including its uncalled capital for the time being, by way either of specific or of floating security, and may also, for any purpose and for any consideration, create and issue bonds or perpetual or redeemable debentures or debenture stock or other obligation, and secure the principal represented thereby and the interest thereon by any such mortgage, charge, or lien as aforesaid.

The Directors may also issue or deposit any such debentures or debenture stock by way of collateral or

contingent security for the payment of any debt or the discharge of any liability of the Company.

IV.—MEETINGS OF MEMBERS.

1.—Convening of General Meetings.

The Statutory Meeting of the Company shall be held at such time, not being less than one month nor more than twelve months after the date at which the Company is entitled to commence business, and at such place as the Directors shall determine.

47. General Meetings, not being Extraordinary General Meetings, shall be held once in every year after the year of the incorporation of the Company, at such time and place as may be prescribed by the holders of two-thirds of the Company for the time being issued, or if no time or place is so prescribed as may (subject as aforesaid) be determined by the Directors.

48. The General Meetings mentioned in the last preceding Article shall be called Ordinary General Meetings, and all other General Meetings shall be called Extraordinary General Meetings.

49. The Directors may, whenever they shall think fit, convene an Extraordinary General Meeting and they shall, upon a requisition made in writing by Members of the Company holding together not less than one-tenth of the issued capital upon which all calls or other sums then due shall have been paid, forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting. An Extraordinary General Meeting if convened by the Directors shall be held at such place as the Directors may determine.

50. Any requisition made by members shall state the objects of the meeting to be called, and must be signed by the requisitionists and deposited at the registered office of the Company. It may consist of several documents in like form,

each signed by one or more requisitionists.

If the Directors do not proceed to cause an Extraordinary General Meeting to be held within twenty-one days from the date of the deposit, the requisitionists, or a majority of them in value, may themselves convene the meeting, but any meeting so convened shall not be held after three months from the date of such deposit. If at any such meeting convened under this Article a resolution requiring confirmation at another meeting shall be passed, the Directors shall forthwith convene a further Extraordinary General Meeting for the purpose of considering the resolution, and if the Directors do not convene the meeting within seven days from the date of the passing of the first resolution, the requisitionists, or a majority of them in value, may themselves convene the meeting. Any meeting convened under this Article by the requisitionists shall be convened in the same manner, as nearly

as possible, as that in which meetings are to be convened by the Directors.

52. Twenty-eight days' notice of any General Meeting (inclusive of the day of service, but exclusive of the day appointed for holding the meeting) specifying the place, day, and hour of such meeting, and in case of special business the general nature of such business, shall (except in the case of meetings convened solely for the purpose of confirming a specia resolution or special resolutions, and meetings convened in pursuance of a requisition made by members) be given to the members entitled to attend and vote thereat in manner hereinafter mentioned, or in such other manner (if any) as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting. In the case of General Meetings convened solely for the purpose of confirming a special resolution or resolutions, or a General Meeting convened in pursuance of a requisition made by members,

the length of notice shall be seven days calculated as above mentioned to be given in manner above provided.

The accidental omission to give any such notice to any member, or the non-receipt of the same by any member, shall not invalidate any resolution passed at any such meeting.

2.—PROCEEDINGS AT GENERAL MEETINGS.

54. The business of an Ordinary Meeting shall be to receive and consider the accounts presented by the Directors, and the reports of the Directors and of the Auditors, to declare dividends, to elect Auditors, and to vote their remunera-All other business transacted at an Ordinary Meeting, and all business transacted at an Extraordinary Meeting, shall be deemed special.

55. Two members present in person or by proxy shall be a quorum at a General Meeting. No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless the quorum requisite be present at the commencement of the business.

56. If within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present, the meeting, if convened by or upon the requisition of members, shall be dissolved. In any other case it shall be adjourned to such day and place as the meeting shall by resolution determine, or, in default of such resolution, to the same day in the next week (or if that day be a holiday to the next working day therefore), and at the time and place as the horizontal meeting. At an adjourned meeting the members present and entitled to vote, whatever their number, shall have power to decide upon

all matters which could properly have been disposed of at the meeting from which such adjournment took place.

57. The Chairman of the Directors shall be entitled to preside at every General Meeting, or if there be no Chairman, or if at any meeting he shall not be present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for holding such meeting, and willing to preside, the Deputy-Chairman (if any) of the Directors shall be entitled to preside, or if there be no such Chairman or Deputy-Chairman, or if neither of them shall be present within such fifteen minutes, and willing to preside, the members present shall choose another Director as Chairman, or if one Director only be present, he shall preside, if willing so to do. If no Director is present, or if all the Directors present decline to preside, then the members present shall choose one of their number to act as Chairman.

The Chairman of a General Meeting may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn the same from time to time, and place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left

unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place.

59. At every General Meeting every resolution (including a special resolution) submitted shall, subject to the right to demand a poll, be determined by a show of hands, and unless a poll is demanded by the Chairman or by at least two members personally present, or by a member or members holding or representing by proxy, and entitled to vote in respect of at least one-tenth of the issued capital, or in the case of a special resolution by at least five Shareholders, a minute of the Chairman of the case of a special resolution by at least one-tenth of the issued capital, or in the case of a special resolution by at least one-tenth of the issued capital. signed as hereinafter mentioned, or a declaration of the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, or in the case of a resolution requiring any particular majority that it was passed by the requisite majority, and an entry to that effect in the Book of Proceedings of the Company shall be conclusive evidence of the facts, without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution.

60. If a poll is demanded as aforesaid, it shall be taken in such manner and at such time (within twenty-eight days next after the meeting), and at such place as the Chairman of the meeting before the conclusion of the meeting directs, and either immediately or after an interval or adjournment or otherwise, and the result of the poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded. Any poll duly demanded on the election of a Chairman of a meeting, or any question of adjournment, shall be taken at the meeting and without adjournment. The fact that a poll has been demanded shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of any business other than the question on which a poll has been demanded. A demand of a poll may be withdrawn, and no notice need be given of a poll not taken immediately. poll not taken immediately.

61. In the case of an equality of votes, the Chairman shall, both on a show of hands and at a poll, have a casting

vote in addition to the vote or votes to which he may be entitled as a member.

62. Minutes shall be made in books provided for the purpose of all resolutions and proceedings of general meetings, and any such minutes, if signed by the Chairman of the meeting to which they refer, or by any person present thereat and appointed by the Directors to sign the same in his place, or by the Chairman of the next succeeding meeting, shall be received as conclusive evidence of the facts stated therein.

3.—MEETINGS OF SPECIAL CLASSES OF SHAREHOLDERS.

- 63. The holders of any class of shares shall have power at any time and from time to time, and whether before or during liquidation, by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders, of which notice specifying the intention to propose such resolution shall have been duly given, to consent on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class
 - (a) To the issue or creation of any shares ranking equally with the shares of the class or having any priority thereto, which could not be issued under the powers hereinbefore contained without the consent of all the holders of shares of the class; or
 - (b) To the abandonment or alteration of any preference, privilege, priority, or special right, whether as regards capital or dividends, or of any right of voting affecting the class of shares, or to the abandonment of any accrued dividend, or the reduction for any time or permanently of the dividends payable the eon, or to the amalgamation into one class of the shares of any two or more classes, or to the division of shares into shares of different classes, or to any alteration in these Articles, varying or abrogating, or putting an end to any rights or privileges attached to shares of the class; or

(c) To any scheme for the reduction of capital prejudicially affecting the class of shares as compared with any other class, and not otherwise authorized by these Articles; or

(d) To any scheme for the distribution of assets in money or kind in or before liquidation (though such scheme may not be in accordance with legal rights), or to any contract for the sale of the whole or any part of the Company's undertaking or property determining the manner in which, as between the several classes of Shareholders, the purchase consideration shall be distributed (though such distribution may not be in accordance with legal rights); and
(e) Generally to any alteration, contract, compromise, or arrangement which the persons voting thereon could, if

sui juris and holding all the shares of the class, consent to or enter into;

and a resolution so passed shall be binding upon all the holders of shares of the class, provided that this Article shall not be read as implying the necessity for such consent in any case in which, but for this Article, the object of the resolution could have been affected without it under the provisions contained in these Articles. The consent in writing of the holders of two-thirds of the shares of the class for the time being issued shall have the same effect as an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of holders of shares of the class.

64. Any meeting for the purpose of the last preceding Article shall be convened and conducted in all respects as nearly as possible in the same way as an extraordinary general meeting of the Company, but no member not being a Director shall be entitled to notice thereof, or not being a Director or the duly appointed proxy of a corporation entitled to shares of the class shall be entitled to attend thereat, unless he holds shares of the class intended to be affected by the resolution, and (except that a Chairman, if a Director, may give a casting vote, whether a holder of shares of the class or not) votes shall only be given in respect of shares of that class; and at any such meeting or any adjournment thereof, the quorum shall be members holding or representing by proxy at least one half of the issued shares of the class, and a poll may be demanded at any such meeting by any member of the class present in person or by proxy, and entitled to vote at the

4.—Votes of Members.

65. Subject to any special terms as to voting upon which any shares may be issued or may for the time being be held, on a show of hands every member present in person shall have one vote, and on a poll every member present in person or by proxy shall have one vote for every share held by him. Any company holding shares conferring the right to vote may by resolution of its Directors authorize any of its officials or any other person to act as its representative at any General

Meeting of the Company, and the person so authorized shall be entitled to exercise the same powers on behalf of the Company which he represents as if he had been an individual Shareholder of the Company.

66. If any registered holder of shares conferring the right to vote is a lunatic or idiot, his committee, curator bonis, or other legal curator may vote at any General Meeting or upon a poll in respect thereof as if he were the registered holder of such shares, provided that forty-eight hours at least before the time of holding the meeting or adjourned meeting (as the case may be) at which such committee, curator bonis, or other legal curator proposes to vote, he shall satisfy the Directors that he sustains that character, unless the Directors shall have previously admitted his right to vote in respect of such shares.

If there be joint registered holders of any share or shares conferring the right to vote, any one of them may vote at any meeting either in person or by proxy in respect thereof as if he were the sole registered holder thereof; but in case more than one of several joint-holders be present at a meeting, either in person or by proxy, that one of the holders so present whose name stands first on the register in respect of such shares shall alone be entitled to vote in respect thereof.

68. No member shall be entitled to be present or be reckoned in a quorum, or be entitled to vote, either personally or by proxy or otherwise, at any General Meeting or upon a poll, or to exercise any privileges as a member whilst any call or other sum which shall be due and payable by him in respect of any share of which he is the registered holder remains unpaid.

Votes may be given personally or by proxy.

70. The instrument appointing a proxy shall (except in the case of a form of proxy sent by cable) be in writing under the hand of the appointer or his attorney, or if such appointer is a corporation, under its common seal or under the hand or seal of its attorney, and, whether given for a specified meeting or otherwise, shall, as nearly as circumstances will admit, be in the form or to the effect following:

71. The instrument appointing a proxy and the power of Attorney (if any) under which it is signed (which may take the form of a cablegram or telegram) shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than for yeight hours before the time for holding the meeting or adjourned meeting (as the case may be) at which the person named in such instrument proposes to vote, the donee of any such power of Attorney may appoint himself proxy thereunder.

72. A vote given in accordance with the terms of an instrument appointing a proxy shall be valid notwithstanding the previous death of the principal or revocation of the proxy, or transfer of the shares in respect of which it is given, unless previous intimation in writing of the death, revocation, or transfer shall have been received at the registered office of the

The Directors shall be at liberty, at the expense of the Company, to prepare and issue stamped instruments for the appointment of proxies, and to stamp instruments of proxy at the like expense, and to send stamped envelopes to the Members of the Company for the return thereof to the Company at the like expense.

V.—DIRECTORS.

1.—NUMBER AND APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTORS.

The number of Directors shall not be less than three or more than seven.

The first Directors shall be Francis Oswald Mackwood, Frank Edward Mackwood, and Edward Oswald 75. Mackwood.

76. The holders of two-thirds of the shares of the Company for the time being issued shall have power at any time and from time to time to appoint any other person as a Director, but so that the total number of Directors shall not at any time exceed the prescribed maximum number fixed as above. No casual vacancy shall be filled by the Directors. On any such nomination (which may take the form of a cablegram or telegram) being left at the registered office of the Company the person thereby nominated shall at once become a Director of the Company.

The continuing Directors, or the continuing Director if only one, may act notwithstanding any vacancies on the

Board and notwithstanding that the number of Directors is less than the prescribed minimum number.

2.—REMUNERATION OF DIRECTORS.

78. The remuneration (if any) of the Directors shall be fixed by the holders of two-thirds of the shares of the Company for the time being issued.

3.—DISQUALIFICATION OF DIBECTORS.

79. The office of a Director shall ipso facto be vacated-

(a) If without the sanction of the holders of two-thirds of the shares of the Company for the time being issued, he accepts or holds any other office or place of profit under the Company, except that of manager, secretary, trustee for the debenture holders or debenture stock holders of the Company, or any other office or place of profit herein authorized.

(b) If he becomes bankrupt or suspends payment or compounds with his creditors.

(c) If he is found lunatic or becomes of unsound mind.

(d) If he is absent from the meetings of the Directors continuously during a period of six months without special leave of absence from the Directors, expressed by a duly recorded resolution.

(e) If he sends in a written resignation to the Directors, and the same is accepted, or not being accepted is not

withdrawn within seven days.

- (f) If a notice by the holders of two-thirds of the shares of the Company for the time being issued calling upon him to resign (which may take the form of a cablegram or telegram) is left or delivered at the registered office of the Company.
- 80. No Director shall be disqualified by his office from contracting with the Company either as vendor, purchaser, or otherwise, nor shall any such contract or any contract or arrangement entered into by or on behalf of the Company in which any Director shall be in any way interested be avoided, nor shall any Director so contracting, or being so interested, be liable to account to the Company for any profit realized by any such contract or arrangement by reason only of such Director holding that office, or of the fiduciary relation thereby established, but the nature of his interest must be disclosed by him at the meeting of the Directors at which the contract or arrangement is determined on, if his interest then exists, or in any other case at the first meeting of the Directors after the acquisition of his interest.

4.—PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

The Directors may meet together for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings as they think fit, and may determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business. Until otherwise determined two Directors shall be a quorum. A Director may at any time, and the Secretary, upon the request of a Director, shall convene a meeting of the Directors. Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes of the Directors present. It shall not be necessary to give notice of a meeting of Directors to any Director who is out of the Island of Ceylon, unless he has supplied to the Company an address within the Island of Ceylon, or an address outside the Island of Ceylon ordinarily within forty-eight hours postal delivery from Colombo, in which case notice shall be sent to such address

82. The Directors may elect a Chairman of their meetings, and determine the periods for which he or they is or are to hold office. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Directors, but if at any time there is no Chairman or if at any meeting the Chairman be not present within five minutes after the time appointed for holding the same, and willing to preside, the Directors present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting. The said Frank

Edward Mackwood shall be the first Chairman of the Directors.

83. A meeting of the Directors for the time being properly summoned at which a quorum is present shall be competent to exercise all or any of the powers, authorities, and discretions by or under these Articles vested in or exercisable by the Directors generally, but the provisions of this Article shall be without prejudice to the powers of a sole

continuing Director.

84. The Directors may delegate any of their powers (other than the powers to borrow and make calls) to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as they think fit. Any committee so formed shall in the exercise of the power so delegated conform to any regulations which may from time to time be imposed on them by the

Directors.

A committee of two or more Directors may elect a Chairman of their meetings. If there be no such Chairman, or if he is not present at the time appointed for holding a meeting, and willing to preside, the members present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting. A committee may meet and adjourn as they think proper. tions arising at any meeting shall be determined by a majority of votes of the members present.

86. All acts done at any meeting of the Directors, or of a Committee of Directors, or by any persons acting as Directors, shall, notwithstanding that it shall be afterwards discovered that there was some discovered that there was some discovered that the persons acting as Directors, or by any persons acting as any such Directors or persons acting as aforesaid, or any of them, or that they or any of them were disqualified, be as

valid as if every such person had been duly appointed and was qualified to be a Director.

87. The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in books provided for the purpose of all resolutions and proceedings of meetings of the Directors, or Committees of Directors, and any such minutes, if signed by any person purporting to be the Chairman of the meeting to he the Chairman of the meeting to the chairman of the chair ing to be the Chairman of the meeting to which they relate or by the Chairman of the next succeeding meeting, shall be received as conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated.

5.—Powers of Directors.

- The management of the business and control of the Company shall be vested in the Directors, who, in addition to the powers and authorities by these Articles expressly conferred upon them, may exercise all such powers and do all such acts and things as may be exercised or done by the Company, and are not hereby or by Ordinance expressly directed or required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting, subject nevertheless to any regulations from time to time made in writing by the holders of two-thirds of the shares of the Company for the time being issued, but so that no such regulation shall invalidate any prior act of the Directors which would have been valid if no such regulation had been made.
- 89. Without prejudice to the general powers conferred by the last preceding Article and to the other powers conferred by these Articles (but subject as mentioned in the last preceding Article), the Directors shall have the following powers, that is to say, power-
 - (a) To pay the costs, charges, and expenses preliminary and incidental to the promotion, formation, establishment, and registration of the Company, and of any other Company promoted by the Company under the powers contained in the Memorandum of Association of the Company.

(b) To purchase or otherwise acquire for the Company any property, rights, or privileges which the Company is authorized to acquire at such price, and generally on such terms and conditions as they think fit.

(c) At their discretion to pay for any property, rights, or privileges acquired by or services rendered to the Company, either wholly or partially in cash or in shares, bonds, debentures, deben ure stock, or other obligations or securities of the Company, and any such shares may be issued either as fully paid up, or with such amount credited as paid up thereon as may be agreed upon, and any such bonds, debentures, or debenture stock may be either charged upon all or any part of the undertaking and property of the Company, and its uncalled capital or not so charged.

(d) To secure the fulfilment of any contracts or engagements entered into by the Company, by mortgage or charge of all or any part of the undertaking and property of the Company and its uncalled capital. or in such other

manner as they may think fit.

(e) To appoint and at their discretion remove or suspend such managers, secretaries, officers, clerks, agents, and servants for permanent or temporary or special services as they may from time to time think fit, and to determine their duties and fix their salaries or emoluments, and to require security in such instances and to such amount as they think fit.

(f) To accept from any member a surrender of his shares or any of them by way of compromise of any question as to the holder being properly registered in respect thereof, or any gratuitous surrender of a fully paid share, and to dispose of any surrendered share in the same manner as a forfeited share.

(g) To appoint any person or persons, whether incorporated or not, to accept and hold in trust for the Company any property belonging to the Company, or in which it is interested, and to execute and do all such deeds and things as may be requisite in relation to any such trust, and to provide for the remuneration of such trustee or trustees.

(h) To exercise all the powers of sale mentioned in or to be implied from the Memorandum of Association of the Company, whether for shares or otherwise, including the power to sell the Company's undertaking for shares

or otherwise.

(i) To make, draw, accept, and endorse promissory notes, bills of exchange, cheques, and other mercantile and negotiable instruments, provided that every promissory note, bill of exchange, cheque, or other mercantile or negotiable instrument made, drawn, accepted, or endorsed shall be signed by such person or persons as the Directors may appoint for such purpose.

(j) To institute, conduct, defend, compound, and abandon any legal proceedings by and against the Company or its officers, or otherwise concerning the affairs of the Company, and also to allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts and of any claims or demands by or against the Company.
 (k) To refer any claims and demands by or against the Company to arbitration, and observe and perform or resist

the awards.

(1) To make and give receipts, releases, and other discharges for money payable to the Company, and for the claims

and demands of the Company.

(m) To invest and deal with any of the moneys of the Company not immediately required for the purposes thereof, upon such investments and in such manner as they may think fit, and from time to time deal with, vary, or realize such investments, provided that the funds of the Company shall not be expended in the purchase, or lent upon the security, of its own shares.

(n) To appoint any persons to be the attorneys or agents of the Company with such powers (including power to such delegate and to appear before all proper authorities and make all necessary declarations to enable the Company's operations to be validly carried on abroad) and upon such terms as may be thought fit.

(o) To give to any Director who shall be called upon to perform extra services or to make any special exertions in going or residing abroad (either in addition to or substitution for the remuneration above provided for), such special remuneration either by way of a fixed Summary in favorers of any person who may incur or be about to

(p) To execute in the name and on behalf of the Company in favour of any person who may incur or be about to incur any personal liability for the benefit of the Company such mortgages of all or any part of the undertaking and property of the Company and its uncalled capital as they may think fit, and any such mortgage may contain a power of sale and such other powers, provisions, and covenants as may be agreed upon.

(q) To appoint such persons as they may think fit (who may be Directors or members of the Company or not) to

act as a local board, or as a local managing or consulting committee, in any place where the Company carries on or proposes to carry on business, and to delegate to any board or committee so appointed such of their own powers and authorities as they may deem fit, and to regulate the proceedings and determine the remuneration and the term of office of the members of such local board or committee.

(r) To give to any officer or other person employed by the Company a bonus or commission on the profits of any particular business or transaction, or a share in the general profits of the Company, such commission or share of profits to be treated as part of the working expenses of the Company.

(s) From time to time to make, vary, and repeal by-laws for the regulation of the business of the Company, its officers and servants.

(t) To enter into all such negotiations and contracts, and rescind and vary all such contracts, and execute and do all such acts, deeds, and things in the name and on behalf of the Company as they may consider expedient for or in relation to any of the matters aforesaid or otherwise for the purposes of the Company.

A Director who is at a place or is about to go to a place outside the Island of Ceylon, which is in the ordinary course of post outside a 48 hours postal delivery from Colombo, may with the consent in writing of the holders of two-thirds of the shares of the Company for the time being issued, appoint any person to be an alternate Director during his absence and such appointment shall have effect, and such appointee whilst he holds office as an alternate Director shall be entitled to notice of meetings of the Directors, and to attend and vote thereat accordingly, and he shall ipso facto vacate office if and when the appointer returns to the Island of Ceylon, or vacates office as a Director, or removes the appointee from office, and any appointment and removal under this clause shall be affected by notice in writing under the hand of the Director making the same left at the registered office for the time being of the Company.

The Directors may from time to time by resolution appoint a temporary substitute for the Secretary, and any person so appointed shall, for the purpose of these Articles, be deemed during the term of his appointment to be the

Secretary.

6.-THE SEAL.

92. The Directors shall provide for the safe custody of the Seal of the Company, and it shall not be affixed to any instrument except in the presence of two or more Directors, or of one Director, and the Secretary, who shall attest the sealing thereof.

VI.—ACCOUNTS AND DIVIDENDS.

1.-ACCOUNTS.

93. Directors shall cause accounts to be kept in the English language in books provided for the purpose of the sums received and expended by the Company, and the matters in respect of which such receipt and expenditure takes place, and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company. The books of account shall be kept at the registered office of the Company, or at any such other place or places as the Directors think fit.

94. Except by the authority of the Directors or of the holders of two-thirds of the shares of the Company for the

time being issued, no member shall be entitled as such to inspect any books or papers of the Company, other than the.

balance sheet and the register of members or mortgages.

95. At the Ordinary General Meeting in each year the Directors shall lay before the Company a balance sheet and a profit and loss account, containing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company made up to as recent a date as practicable from the date to which the last preceding balance sheet and account were made up, or in the case of the first balance sheet and account, from the incorporation of the Company.

96. Every balance sheet and account shall be accompanied by a report of the Directors as to the state and condition of the Company and as to the amount (if any) which they propose to carry to the reserve fund, and the amount they recommend to be distributed by way of dividend or bonus to the members in accordance with the provisions in that behalf hereinafter contained, and the balance sheet, account, and report shall be signed on behalf of the Board by two of the Directors of the Company, or if there is only one by that Director.

2.—AUDIT.

97. The Company shall at each Ordinary General Meeting appoint an Auditor or Auditors to hold office until the

next Ordinary General Meeting.

The first Auditors of the Company may be appointed by the Directors before the statutory meeting, and if so appointed shall hold office until the First Ordinary General Meeting, unless previously removed by a resolution of the Shareholders in General Meeting, in which case the Shareholders at such meeting may appoint Auditors. Any Auditor quitting office shall be eligible for immediate re-election. The remuneration of the Auditors shall be fixed by the Company in General Meeting, except that the remuneration of any Auditors appointed before the statutory meeting, or to fill any casual vacancy, may be fixed by the Directors.

A Director or Officer of the Company, or a partner in any business with, or a person employed by a Director or

Officer of the Company, shall not be capable of being appointed or of acting as Auditor of the Company.

100. If a casual vacancy occurs in the office of Auditor, it may be filled by the Directors, or the Directors may forthwith convene an Extraordinary General Meeting for the purpose of supplying the same. Whilst any vacancy continues the surviving or continuing Auditor or Auditors (if any) may act.

101. If no election of Auditors be made at an Ordinary General Meeting, the Directors may appoint an Auditor for

the current year, and fix the remuneration to be paid to him by the Company for his services

102. The Auditors shall have a right of access at all times to the books and accounts and vouchers of the Company, and shall be entitled to require from the Directors and Officers of the Company such information and explanation as may be necessary for the performance of the duties of the Auditors. The Auditors shall make a report to the Shareholders on the accounts examined by them, and on every balance sheet laid before the Company in General Meeting during their tenure of office, and in every such report shall state whether or not they have obtained all the information and explanations they have required, and whether in their opinion the balance sheet referred to in the report is properly drawn up, so as to exhibit a true and correct view of the state of the Company's affairs according to the best of their information, and the explanations given to them, and as shown by the books of the Company, and such report shall be attached to the balance sheet, or there shall be inserted at the foot of the balance sheet a reference to such report, and such report shall be read before the Company in General Meeting, and shall be open to the inspection of any member who shall be entitled to be furnished with a copy thereof, at a charge not exceeding twenty-five cents for every hundred words.

103. A person other than a retiring Auditor shall not be capable of being appointed Auditor at an Ordinary General Meeting, unless notice of an intention to nominate that person to the office of Auditor has been given by a member to the Company not less than fourteen days before the Ordinary General Meeting, and the Company shall send a copy of any such notice to the retiring Auditor, and shall give notice thereof to the member either by advertisement or in any other mode allowed by these Articles not less than seven days before the Ordinary General Meeting. Provided that, if after a notice of the intention to nominate an Auditor has been so given, an Ordinary General Meeting is called for a date fourteen days or less after the notice has been given, the notice, though not given within the time required by this Article, shall be deemed to have been properly given for the purposes hereof, and the notices to be sent or given by the Company may, instead of being sent or given within the time required by this Article, be sent or given at the same time as the notice of the Ordinary General

Meeting.

3.—RESERVE FUND.

104. The Directors may, before recommending any dividends, set aside out of the profits of the Company such sum as they think proper as a reserve fund, to meet depreciation or contingencies or for special dividends, or for equalizing dividends or for repairing, improving, or maintaining any of the property of the Company, or for any other purposes which the Directors may think conducive to the objects of the Company or any of them, and the same may be applied accordingly from time to time in such manner as the Directors shall determine. The Directors may divide the reserve fund into such special funds as they think fit, and may consolidate into one fund any special funds or any parts of any special funds into which the reserve fund may have been divided as they think fit, with full power to employ the whole or any part of the assets constituting the reserve fund in the business of the Company without being under any obligation to keep the same separate from the other assets of the Company. The Directors may also, without placing the same to reserve, carry forward any profits which they may think it not prudent to divide.

4.—DIVIDENDS.

105. The Company may in General Meeting, subject to any preference or priority for the time being subsisting, and subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, declare a dividend to be paid to the members in proportion to the amounts for the time being paid up or credited as paid up on their shares otherwise than in advance of calls, but no larger dividend shall be declared than is recommended by the Directors.

106. The Directors may from time to time pay to the members such interim dividends on account of the dividends for the current year as in their judgment are justified by the position of the Company.

107. Any premium received upon the issue of shares, and any profits realized upon the sale or shown by a valuation of assets, may be treated as revenue of the Company for the year in which the issue is made or the profits realized are ascertained.

The Directors may retain any dividends or instalments of interest on which the Company has a lien, and may apply the same in or towards satisfaction of the debts, liabilities, or engagements in respect of which the lien exists.

109. The Directors may retain the dividends or instalments of interest payable upon shares in respect of which any person is under the provisions as to the transmission of shares hereinbefore contained entitled to become a member, or which any person under those provisions is entitled to transfer, until such person shall become a member in respect of such shares, or shall duly transfer the same.

110. Every dividend and instalment of interest shall belong and be paid subject to the Company's lien (if any) to those members who shall be the registered holders of the shares at the date of the meeting or adjourned meeting at which such dividend shall be declared, or at the date at which such interest shall be made payable respectively, notwithstanding

any subsequent transfer or transmission of the shares.

No dividend or bonus shall, except with the consent of a General Meeting, bear interest against the Company. 112. Notice of any dividend which may have been declared shall be given to the members entitled to participate

therein in manner hereinafter prescribed.

Until otherwise directed, any dividend, bonus, or interest payable in cash to the holders of registered shares 113. shall be paid by cheque or warrant sent through the post directed to the holder at his registered address, or in the case of joint-holders directed to the holder whose name stands first in the register in respect of the shares at his registered address. Every such cheque or warrant shall be made payable to the order of the registered holder, and in the case of joint-holders to the order of the holder whose name stands first on the register in respect of such shares, unless such joint holders otherwise direct, and shall be sent at his or their risk.

A General Meeting declaring a dividend may direct payment of such dividend wholly or in part by the distribution of specific assets, and in particular of paid up shares, debentures, or debenture stock of the Company, or paid up on the shares, debentures, or debentures, or debenture stock of any other company, or in any one or more of such ways, and the Directors shall give effect to such resolution, and where any difficulty arises in regard to the distribution they may settle the same as they think expedient, and in particular may issue fractional extincates, and may fix the value for distribution of such specific assets or any part thereof, and may determine that cash payments may be made to any member upon the footing of the value so fixed in order to adjust the rights of the members, and may vest any specific assets in trustees upon trust for the persons entitled to the dividend as may seem expedient to the Directors.

VII.-NOTICES.

115. A notice may be served by the Company upon any member, either personally or by sending it through the post in a prepaid letter addressed to such member at his registered address in the Island of Ceylon, or at any place outside the Island of Ceylon which is in the ordinary course of post, within a forty-eight hours' postal delivery from Colombo. In the event of a meeting being convened to consider a resolution requiring, if passed, confirmation as a special resolution, the notice convening the meeting to confirm the same may be served with or at the same time as or at any time after the notice convening the first meeting, and it shall be no objection to the notice convening the second meeting that it only

convening the first meeting, and it shall be no objection to the notice convening the second ingetting that it only convenes the same contingently on the resolution being passed by the requisite majority at the first meeting.

116. Any member residing out of the Island of Ceylon at a place which is in the ordinary course of jest outside a forty-eight hours' postal delivery from Colombo may from time to time notify to the Company an address in the Island of Ceylon, or an address out of the Island of Ceylon, which is in the ordinary course of post within a forty-eight hours' postal delivery from Colombo at which all notices may be served upon him, and all notices served at such address shall be determed. Well served. If he shall not have named such address, he shall not be entitled to any notices. But in the case of Heilbut Symons & Company, Limited, or any person, firm, or company for the time being carrying on the business now carried on by them, an intimation of the Company's intention to hold a meeting shall forthwith at the expense of the Company be given by cablegram addressed to them in London, England.

All notices directed to be given to the members shall, with respect to any share held by joint registered holders, be given to the person first named in the register of members in respect of those shares, and notice so given shall be deemed

to be notice to all the holders of such shares.

118. Any notice if served by post shall be deemed to have been served at the expiration of forty-eight hours after the letter containing the same is posted, and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the letter

containing the same was properly addressed and put into the post office.

119. Every executor, administrator, or trustee in bankruptcy of any member, and every person who by transfer, operation of law, or other means whatsoever, shall become entitled to any share shall be bound by every notice in respect of such share, which previously to his name being entered in the register shall have been duly given to the person from whom he derives his title, and if such person was not entitled to any notice, shall be so bound without any notice whatsoever.

120. Any notice or document given, delivered, or sent by post to or left at the registered address of any member in pursuance of these Articles shall, notwithstanding such member be then deceased, and whether or not the Company has notice of his decease, be deemed duly served in respect of any shares held by such member, whether solely or jointly with other persons, until some other person shall be registered in his stead as the hidder or joint-holder thereof, and such service shall for all purposes of these articles be deemed a sufficient service of such notice or document on his heirs, executors, or administrators, and all persons (if any) jointly entitled with him to any such shares.

VIII.-WINDING UP.

121. If the Company shall be wound up and the assets available for distribution among the members shall be insufficient to pay the whole of the paid up capital, such assets shall be distributed so that as nearly as may be the losses shall be borne by the members in proportion to the capital paid up, or which ought to have been paid up at the commencement of the winding up on the shares held by them respectively, and if in a winding up the assets available for distribution among the members shall be more than sufficient to repay the whole of the capital paid up at the commencement of the winding up, the excess shall be distributed amongst the members in proportion to the capital paid up, or which ought to have been paid up at the commencement of the winding up, on the shares held by them respectively, but in no case shall a member be entitled to have any call made upon other members holding shares of the same class for the purpose of adjusting This Article shall be without prejudice to the rights of the holders of any shares issued upon special conditions and to the provisions hereinafter contained.

122. If the Company shall be wound up (whether the liquidation is altogether voluntary, under supervision, or by the Court), the liquidator may with the authority of an extraordinary resulution divide among the members in specie or kind the whole or any part of the assets of the Company, and whether or not the assets shall consist of property of one kind or shall consist of properties of different kinds; and may for such purpose set such value as he deems fair upon any one or more class or classes of property, and may determine how such division shall be carried out as between the members or different classes of markets, and the liquidator may with the like authority west any part of the assets in trustees upon or different classes of members, and the liquidator may with the like authority, vest any part of the assets in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of members as the liquidator with the like authority shall think fit, and the liquidation of the Company may be closed and the Company dissolved, but so that no contributory shall be compelled to accept any shares in respect of which there is a liability.

123. The power of sale of a liquidator shall include a power with the sanction of the holders of two-thirds of the shares of the Company for the time being issued to sell wholly or partly for the debentures, debenture stock, or other obliga-

tions of another company, either then already constituted or about to be constituted for the purpose of carrying out the sale.

124. In any case in which these Articles provide that any powers may be exercised by the holders of two-thirds of the shares for the time being issued, or the consent of such holders is made necessary to the exercise of any power or any other transaction hereunder, such power may be exercised or consent given by cablegram or telegram addressed to the registered office of the Company, or by their Attorney duly appointed in that behalf, and the Company may act upon a consent so given.

IX.—INDEMNITY.

125. Every Director, Manager, Secretary, and other officer, or servant of the Company shall be indemnified by the Company against, and it shall be the duty of the Directors out of the funds of the Company to pay all costs, losses, and expenses which any officer or servant may incur or become liable to by reason of any contract entered into, or act or deed done by him as such officer or servant, or in any way in the discharge of his duties, and the amount for which such indemnity is provided shall immediately attach as a lien on the property and uncalled capital of the Company, and have priority as between the members over all other claims.

126. No Director or other officer of the Company shall be liable for any loss or expense happening to the Company, through the insufficiency or deficiency of title to any property acquired by order of the Directors for or on behalf of the Company, or for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security in or upon which any of the moneys of the Company shall be invested, or for any loss or damage arising from the bankruptcy, insolvency, or tortious act of any person with whom any of the moneys, securities, or effects of the Company shall be deposited, or for any loss occasioned by any error of judgment or oversight on his part, or for any other loss, damage, or misfortune whatever which shall happen in the execution of the duties of his office, or in relation thereto, unless the same shall happen through his own dishonesty.

127. No Director or other Officer of the Company shall be liable for the acts, receipts, neglects, or defaults of any

other Director or Officer, or for joining in any receipt or other acts for conformity.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE NATIONAL PUBLISHING COMPANY, LIMITED.

The Articles of Association of "The National Publishing Company, Limited," shall be the Articles contained in Table C in the Schedule annexed to the Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861, with the following special provisions which shall be observed where they differ from Table C:-

(a) The Directorate shall consist of not less than seven members (with power to add to their number), four of whom shall form a quorum.

(b) The qualification for a Director shall be the holding of not less than fifty shares.

(c) Cheques shall be signed both by the Chief Officer and a Director of the Company nominated for the purpose.
(d) The Directors shall be entitled to a bonus of five per cent, out of the net profits for the year.

(e) Every Shareholder having not less than five shares shall have one vote and shall have an additional one vote for every ten shares beyond the first five shares up to fifty shares. In any case no Shareholder shall be entitled to have more than five votes.

- (f) The accounts shall be prepared yearly.
 (g) Any Shareholder, whether a Director or not, and whether alone or jointly with any other Shareholder or Director, and any person not a Shareholder, may become the purchaser of the property of the Company or any part thereof in the event of a winding up or a dissolution, or at any other time when a sale of the Company's property or effects or any part thereof shall be made by the Directors under the powers by or under the Ordinance conferred

"A process for the manufacture of soles, heels, plates, and the like for boots, shoes, slippers, and footwear generally from scrap or crude or waste rubber."

Abstract.—The inventor describes a method for utilizing waste or scrap rubber for the manufacture of soles, heels, &c., of boots and shoes in which definite amounts of the rubber are placed in shaped moulds and heated while under pressure.

The claims are-

A process for the manufacture of soles, heels, plates, and the like for boots, shoes, slippers, and footwear generally from scrap or crude or waste rubber, comprising heattreatment of predetermined and measured quantities of the scrap with drie and heated air in shaped receptacles, and subsequent treatment of that product by pressure maintained for not more than twenty-four hours in locked and clamped moulds, substantially as described.

2. The step in the process claimed in claim 1, comprising heat treatment of predetermined and measured quantities of the scrap in shaped receptacles, by passing those receptacles and their contents through a chamber in which dried and

heated air is made to circulate, substantially as described.

3. The step in the process claimed in claim 1, comprising treatment of the product of the step claimed in claim 2, by pressure maintained for a period not exceeding twenty-four hours in locked and clamped moulds, substantially as described.

Training School for Surveyors.

N examination for admission to the Departmental. Training School for Surveyors will be held at the following centres: -- Colombo, Kandy, Jaffna, Galle, Kurunegala, Badulla, Anuradhapura, Ratnapura, and Batticaloa on August 22, 1921.

- 1. Candidates must not be less than 19 or more than 25 years of age.
- Candidates will be required to furnish the following certificates, and must attach them to the form referred to in paragraph 3 below:-
 - (a) A certificate of age.

- (b) A certificate of respectability and good moral character from two or more persons whose social or official position can be accepted as a guarantee of reliability.
- (c) Elementary School-leaving Certificate.
- 3. Candidates will be required to fill in an entry form which can be obtained on application to the Surveyor-General. This form must be presented in person to the Assistant Surveyor-General at Colombo, accompanied by the certificates referred to in paragraph 2, or to the Superintendent of Surveys in a Province.
 - 4. Subjects for the examination are-
 - (i.) Mathematics-
 - (a) Arithmetic.
 - (b) Algebra (up to and including quadratic equations)
 - (c) Geometry (theorems and problems on the following: angles at a point; parallel straight lines; side and angle properties of triangles and parallelograms; areas of triangles and quadrilaterals; the chord, angle, and tangent properties of the circle; the properties of the right-angled triangle).
 - (ii.) English Composition (Essay).
- 5. After passing the Entrance Examination candidates will have to pass a Medical Examination to ascertain if they possess a sound constitution, good vision, hearing, and physical fitness for duty in any part of the Island. A fee of Rs. 5 will be charged for the Medical Examination.
- 6. Applications for admission to the above class will not be accepted after midday on August 6. For further particulars regarding prospects, &c., application should be made to the Surveyor-General.

Pay and conditions of promotion:-

Grade I.—The number in this grade is 15, at Rs. 3,180 to Rs. 3,900 per annum by annual increments of Rs. 180, but those who have passed the Senior Departmental Examination will be entitled to rise to a maximum salary of Rs. 4,440 by annual increments of Rs. 180 after a halt of three years on Rs. 3,900.

Grade II.—The number in this grade is 50, at Rs. 1,800 to Rs. 3,000 per annum by annual increments of Rs. 120.

ABSTRACTS OF SEASON REPORTS.

SEASON REPORTS FOR THE MONTH OF MAY, 1921.

WESTERN PROVINCE.

COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Paddy: the yala crop is thriving.

Dry grains: there is no cultivation of dry grain in this district, except in Siyane korale west, where kurakkan is being sown.

Other products: prospects of coconuts are fairly good. The estimated crop for the month is 92,804,700 nuts. There is a fairly good supply of fruits and vegetables.

Prices of staple products: (a) imported rice is sold at Rs. 6 to Rs. 7.50 per bushel; (b) coconuts are sold at Rs. 50 to Rs. 60 per 1,000.

Harvest prospects: fair.

Rainfall: There was sufficient rain during the month.
Health of inhabitants: satisfactory. There were a few cases of dysentery, enteric fever, and chickenpox. Influenza is also reported to be prevailing in Alutkuru korale south and elsewhere, but not in an epidemic form.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, May 13, 1921, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice dated May 6, 1921.

been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of April 22, 1921, be confirmed.

2. (a) The Chairman read the following:—Since the last meeting of Council 6 cases of Human Plague, including a contact in the Segregation Camp, have been reported, making a total up to date, this year, of 154 cases, as against a total of 52 cases during the corresponding period of last year. Three of the cases were septicæmic, and 3 were bubonic in character. All proved fatal. The distribution of the cases was as follows:—Gas Works street 1 case; Green street 2 cases; one of which developed at the Segregation Camp; Albion lane 1 case; Old Kolonnawa road 1 case; 1 homeless vagrant said to have come from Kochchi ade.

Rat Plague.—No case of rat plague has been discovered since March 10, when the total stood at 43 cases.

(b) Smallpox.—The Chairman read the following:—The Medical Officer of Health reports that the town may now be regarded as free from infection, as it is 31 days since the last case was removed to the hospital. A watch is, however, still being maintained in case concealment may have been resorted to.
3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando asked the Chairman the following questions to which the Chairman

replied as follows:-

Q. (1) Whether the Chairman is aware what steps are being taken by Government to redeem its promise to introduce at an early date legislation to amend the constitution of Municipal Councils, so as to bring it into harmony with the principles of the Local Government Bill?

 The answer is in the negative.
 Whether the Chairman is aware that Mr. W. M. Thyne, the Waterworks Engineer, has expended a good deal of money over and above the Rs. 3,260 sanctioned by the Council, in repairing and renovating his bungalow and laying out and terracing its grounds?

A. (2) The Chairman is aware that more than Rs. 3,260 was spent on repairing and renovating this bungalow,

but not that any Municipal funds were expended in laying out or terracing the grounds.

Q. (3) Whether the Chairman is aware what is the total expenditure likely to be incurred on this account and also how much of this has been expended up to date.

A. (3) The answer is in the affirmative.

Q. (4) Whether the Chairman is aware which votes were used to obtain the sum expended up to date and whether such expenditure was with his sanction.

 \hat{A} . (4) The answer to the first part of the question is in the affirmative. The expenditure was made without

reference to the Chairman.

Q. (5) Whether the Chairman has obtained from the Works Engineer an estimate of the actual cost up to date of the repairs to the building and the laying out of the grounds by the Waterworks Engineer, and, if so, what it amounts to ?

A. (5) No estimate was obtained from the Works Engineer. Work of this nature is usually in the hands of the Engineer concerned.

(6) In view of the fact that the Council has neither sanctioned an increase of expenditure under the vote of Repairs to the Waterworks Engineer's Bungalow, nor allowed a transfer of monies assigned under other heads of expenditure to this head, will the Chairman make a statement to Council as to how this extra expenditure came to be made?

(6) The following is the statement asked for :- In March, 1920, the Waterworks Engineer, Mr. W. M. Thyne, reported that he estimated the cost of erecting a new kitchen, bathroom, and other minor alterations at Rs. 3,260, and submitted a plan showing the alterations proposed. On May 7, 1920, this estimate was sanctioned by the Council. In December, 1920, I called for a statement of the cost of work done on this bungalow. The Waterworks Engineer submitted December, 1920, I called for a statement of the cost of work day, 1320, this estimate was sanctioned by the Council. The Waterworks Engineer submitted a statement showing expenditure up to November 30, 1920, as follows:—From vote of Rs. 3,260 sanctioned, Rs. 2,975·26; from vote for Maintenance of Waterworks, Rs. 2,358·89.

With this statement he submitted the following report:—"In submitting my estimate for alterations it was not

anticipated that any rebuilding of walls would be necessary; however, on removing the plaster dangerous cracks were noticed, and in two instances the partition walls built of cabook and mud could be shaken. It was necessary to rebuild these walls, and the work was done on the vote for Maintenance of Colombo Waterworks, under which vote provision is also made for repairs to buildings in Waterworks premises. No new walls have been constructed other than those rebuilt, with the exception of the back verandah wall, which was included in my original suggestion. The rebuilding of the walls would under any circumstances have been necessary were the bungalow to be occupied. Some of the door and window frames were also eaten badly by ants, and were replaced. I am occupying the bungalow on January 1, and any painting and varnishing of doors, &c., will be charged to maintenance of premises. This will cost Rs. 300."

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando moved that, in view of the fact that the Councils' finances show some

improvement, immediate arrangements be made to obtain the services of a Band to afford the citizens of Colombo music at the parks, a privilege they enjoyed for over twenty years and which was discontinued last year owing to the policy of retrenchment. Mr. R. L. Pereira seconded. Mr. E. W. Jayewardene supported the motion.

retrenchment. Mr. R. L. Pereira seconded. Mr. E. W. Jayewardene supported the motion. He moved, as an amendment, The Chairman stated that he was fully in sympathy with and accepted the motion. He moved, as an amendment, the matter he referred to the Standing Committee on Finance to decide that, with the consent of the mover and the seconder, the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Finance to decide the number of performances that should be given and the question of cost. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

The mover and the seconder having acquiesced, the amendment was carried.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. H. Tatham moved that this Council do take immediate steps to make the San Sebastian Canal a navigable waterway, and that, on completion, they urge Government to take it over and work it with the Lake Development Scheme, with which it is intimately connected. Mr. J. S. Collett seconded.

The Chairman suggested that the matter be referred to the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance, with whom may be associated the mover of the motion, to consider the estimates, &c., and submit their recommendation to Council. Messrs. R. L. Pereira, E. W. Jayewardene, and Dr. W. P. Rodrigo spoke on the subject.

The Chairman moved, as an amendment, with the consent of the mover and seconder, that the matter be referred for consideration to the Standing Committee of the mover and seconder. for consideration to the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance, with whom will be associated the mover of the motion, and that, meanwhile, the papers be circulated to Members of Council. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved that this Council desires to place on record its regret at the death of Mr. M. F. Khan, a former Member of the Municipal Council, and to convey to his family an expression of its sympathy in their bereavement. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

The motion was put to the meeting and passed in solemn silence, all the Members standing.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 7 to 13 (inclusive) on the Agenda. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded .- Carried.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing and the Special Committees named were then laid before the Council in Committee:-

(2) To consider the application of Mr. A. T. Bennett for the post of Expert Assessor.—Recommended that Mr. A. T. Bennett be appointed to the post of Expert Assessor, and that steps be taken at once to appoint an assistant to be trained

(3) To re-consider the question of the resignation of Mr. C. L. Cox, the City Sanitation Engineer, and his request to retain a claim to ultimate pension for his service under the Municipality.—Recommended that Council sanction Mr. C. L. Cox's acceptance of the post of Deputy Director, Public Works, Nigeria, and his retention of a claim to ultimate pension for his service (of 14 years 8 months and 23 days, to end of May, 1921) under the Municipality. (Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader dissenting.)

With regard to item No. 2, Dr. E. V. Ratnam and Mr. R. L. Pereira spoke against the recommendation. In consequence of a statement by Mr. R. L. Pereira that a report from Mr. Bennett had been extracted from the papers, the Chairman adjourned the debate on the question while an inquiry was being made as regards the report said to have been abstracted.

Meanwhile, the Council proceeded to consider the next item on the Agenda. This was disposed of as detailed below. Mr. Bennett having been sent for and having assured the Chairman that he had made only two reports which were

with the papers, the Chairman so informed the meeting.

The Chairman gave his reasons for bringing the application of Mr. Bennett before that meeting.
Dr. E. V. Ratnam, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, Mr. R. L. Pereira, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo, and Mr. E. W. Jayewardene spoke against the recommendation and maintained that the resolution of the Council at the previous meeting was binding on the

(Major A. W. de Wilton left the meeting at this stage.)

Mr. Harold Creasy stated that, as it was a matter of urgency, the application of Mr. Bennett had been brought

before that meeting.

Mr. E. W. Jayewardene moved that the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees is ultra vires and should not be considered at present until applications have been received from England, India, and Ceylon. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando * seconded—Carried.

With regard to item No. 3, Mr. R. L. Pereira, Mr. Arthur Alvis, and Dr. W. P. Rodrigo opposed the recommendation.

(Mr. W. C. S. Ingles left the meeting at this stage.)

The Chairman explained the position as regards the Pension Minute, the position as regards Mr. C. L. Cox's resignation, and the position as regards the effect on the Council's service of a refusal to grant this claim.

(Lieut.-Col. S. Boylan Smith, D.S.O., O.B.E., left the meeting at this stage.)
Mr. E. W. Jayewardene and Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando spoke against the recommendation.

The Chairman moved that the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees be adopted. Mr. C. P Dias seconded. The motion was put to the meeting and 8 voted for it and 8 against. The Chairman gave his casting vote for the motion which was thereupon carried.

L. Pereira moved that the temporary increases be restricted to officers drawing Rs. 3,000 per annum and under. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo supported.

The Chairman moved, as an amendment, that the recommendations of the Standing Committees be adopted.

Mr. Harold Creasy seconded.

The amendment was put to the meeting and lost.

The motion was then put to the meeting and carried.

(26) To recommend reconveyance of 823/239-824/239A, Dematagoda, vested in Council to Pena Reena Kana Roona Karuppen Chetty on payment of all rates and costs which would have been due up to the end of the quarter in the Council (a sum of Rs. 541.09 has been which the reconveyance may be signed had the property not been vested in the Council (a sum of Rs. 541.09 has been paid up to and including the 4th quarter, 1920).—Recommended.

(27) To recommend supplementary provision of Rs. 7,300 to meet increased cost of Motor Fire Engine received

on January 31, 1921.—Recommended.

(28) To consider an application for a gratuity from Mrs. R. G. Waterhouse, widow of the late Mr. R. G. Waterhouse of the Colombo Drainage Works.—Recommended that Government be informed that the Council is of opinion that, if the conditions of Mr. R. G. Waterhouse's agreement or the regulations of Government with regard to gratuities entitle his

widow to a gratuity, the same should be paid to her.
(29) To consider letter No. 209 of April 8, 1921, from the Medical Officer of Health recommending the immediate employment of the following staff, so that a special effort may be made during the ensuing hot weather to deal with plague:—I Inspector at Rs. 1,200 and allowances, Rs. 2,340; 5 Overseers at Rs. 300 and allowances, Rs. 2,725; Uniforms,

(32) To further consider the question of the lease of premises occupied by the Municipal Dispensary in Slave Island,-

Recommended that the lease be entered into for 12 months at Rs. 60 per mensem.

(33) To consider a recommendation by the Acting Financial Assistant that the question of selling premises No. 51, Grandpass, be referred to Council for reconsideration. The Acting Financial Assistant recommends that as all the arrears of rates have now been paid up, the original owners be given an opportunity to prove their former title to the property and gain a retransfer.-Recommended.

With regard to item No. 20, Mr. A. E. de Silva stated that a tender from Mr. H. R. de Silva had been suppressed and had not been submitted for consideration by the Committee.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando and Mr. E. W. Jayawardene also spoke on the subject.

The Chairman undertook to have the alleged omission looked into, but pointed out that meanwhile a supply had got to carry on the work. He asked that the matter be left in his hands to see that a supply is got for the time to be got to carry of the work. being and that the papers be circulated to all members and re-submitted for consideration of the Finance Committee.

This was agreed to.

With regard to item No. 30, Dr. E. V. Ratnam and Mr. R. L. Pereira raised questions to which the Chairman replied. Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

Extract from the Minutes of the Special Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance of May 4, 1921.

(1) To consider the question of the appointment of an Account for the Finance Department. The three candidates selected were (1) Mr. T. V. Perera, (2) Mr. R. A. Ekanayake, (3) Mr. G. A. Amarasinghe.—The Committee recommend the appointment of Mr. T. V. Perera.

Pereira moved, as an amendment, that the resolutions of Council in Committee and the recommendations of various Committees, subject to any amendments of such recommendations by the Council in Committee be adopted, with the exception of the resolution with regard to item No. 3 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees of April 29, 1921, which should be rejected. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.




