MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :—

An Ordinance further to amend "The Former Enemy Aliens Ordinance, No. 19 of 1919."

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient further to amend "The Former Enemy Aliens Ordinance, No. 19 of 1919": Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Former Enemy Aliens (Amendment) Ordinance, No. of 1921."

Amendment of section 2 of the principal Ordinance.

2 The definition of "Former enemy alien" in section 2 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, and the following definition shall be inserted in lieu thereof:

" 'Former enemy alien' means an alien who is a subject or citizen of the German Empire or any component State thereof, or of Austria, Hungary, Bulgaria, or Turkey, or who having at any time been such subject or citizen, has not changed his allegiance as the result of the recognition of new States or territorial re-arrangements, or been naturalized in any other foreign State or in any British Possession in accordance with the laws thereof and when actually resident therein, and does not retain according to the law of his State of origin, the nationality of that State.

" Provided further that a woman who was at the time of her marriage, a British subject, shall not be taken to be a former enemy alien."

Insertion of new section in principal Ordinance.

3 There shall be inserted in the principal Ordinance immediately after section 6 thereof, the following section which shall be numbered 6 A :

Restrictions on acquisition of land.

6 A. (1) It shall not be lawful for a former enemy alien, either in his own name, or in the name of a trustee or trustees, to acquire any land or any interest in land, in the Colony.

(2) The expression "interest in land" does not include a tenancy for a period not exceeding three years.

(3) If any land or interest in land as aforesaid is acquired in contravention of this section the Governor in Executive Council may by order declare such property to be forfeited to His Majesty, and thereupon the same shall vest in His Majesty absolutely.

(4) Upon any Government Agent producing or causing to be produced such order before the District Court having jurisdiction within the district in which such property is situated, such court shall forthwith issue a writ of possession requiring the Fiscal or Deputy Fiscal of such district to put and place such Government Agent or any person whom he may name in writing in possession of such property for and on behalf of his Majesty, and, if need be, to remove therefrom any person refusing to vacate the same.

Statement of Objects and Reasons.

It has been found that the definition of former enemy alien given in section 2 of Ordinance No. 19 of 1919 is not sufficiently wide, and that an amendment is therefore necessary.

The definition in section 2 of this Bill is taken from section 15 of "The Aliens Restriction (Amendment) Act, 1919," of the Imperial Parliament.

It will be observed that a woman who at the time of her marriage was a British subject is proposed, in conformity with the provisions of the British Act, to be excluded from the definition of former enemy alien.

Section 3 of the Bill enacts that portion of section 11 of the Imperial Act which prohibits former enemy aliens from holding land for a period of three years from the passing of that Act. The time limit will be imposed locally by section 8 of Ordinance No. 19 of 1919.

The procedure laid down in sub-section (4) of new section 6A is borrowed from section 7 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1887.
