## VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE MONTH OF APRIL, 1921.

### REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

#### Births.

2. The number of births registered was 1,643 (850 males and 793 females), and was equivalent to an annual rate of 29·35 per 1,000, against 28·14 in the preceding month, 25·20 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·63 the average for the corresponding months since 1911. The rate ranged from 10·42 in Vavuniya to 61·63 in Chilaw.

3. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 603 (301 males and 302 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 24·03 per 1,000, against 20·87 in the preceding month, 21·69 in the corresponding month of last year, and 22·42 the average for the corresponding months since 1911. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 5·48 in Kollupitiya to 36·97 in Wellawatta.

#### Deaths.

4. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 2,067 (1,124 males and 943 females). There were 1,599 deaths of residents in towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 31·13 per 1,000, against 33·69 in the preceding month, 25·13 in the corresponding month of last year, and 26·71 the average for the month of April in each year since 1911. The rate ranged from 86·30 in Mullaittivu to 12·24 in Ratnapura.

5. In the city of Colombo the deaths numbered 718 (426 males and 292 females). There were 625 deaths of residents, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 28·90 per 1,000, against 27·61 in the preceding month, 21·28 in the corresponding month of last year, and 24·28 the average for the month of April in each year since 1911. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 27·93 in San Sebastian to 7·94 in Kollupitiya.

6. The stillbirths registered numbered 124 (61 males and 63 females), as against 130 in the preceding month.

#### Infant Mortality.

7. The mortality of infants under one year of age was equal to a rate of 263 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended April 30, 1921. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 256, as against 264 in the preceding month, 223 in the corresponding month of last year, and 225 the average for the corresponding months since 1911.

8. In the city of Colombo the mortality of infants was equal to a rate of 281 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended April 30, 1921. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 280, as against 294 in the preceding month, 244 in the corresponding month of last year, and 244 the average for the corresponding months since 1911.

#### Causes of Death.

9. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 11 per cent. of the total deaths was due, *Debility* and *Convulsions* caused 8 per cent. each, *Anchylostomiasis* and *Dysentery* 6 per cent. each, *Enteritis*, *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, *Phthisis* and *Diarrhoea*, 5 per cent. each, *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis* 4 per cent., *Enteric Fever*, *Influenza*, and *Bronchitis*, 2 per cent. each, and *Prematurity* and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 1 per cent. each.

10. In Colombo too the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, which caused 12 per cent. of the deaths, *Convulsions* caused 11 per cent., *Debility*, 9 per cent., *Phthisis*, 8 per cent. *Dysentery*, 5 per cent., *Enteritis*, *Enteric Fever*, and *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, 4 per cent. each, *Bronchitis*, *Influenza*, *Diarrhoea*, and *Anchylostomiasis*, 3 per cent. each, and *Prematurity*, *Plague*, and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 1 per cent. each.

11. Nine deaths from *Plague* were registered (in Colombo), as against 27 in the preceding month and 3 in the corresponding month of last year. One death from *Smallpox*, 1 from *Chickenpox*, and 1 from *Measles* were also registered in Colombo.

12. *Infectious Diseases reported.*—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Chickenpox*, of which 210 cases were reported (145 in Colombo, 22 in Nuwara Eliya, 21 in Kandy, 7 in Moratuwa), *Phthisis* followed with 155 cases (145 in Colombo), *Enteric Fever* 64 (44 in Colombo), *Measles* 36 (30 in Colombo), *Continued Fever* 30 (14 in Colombo, 7 in Moratuwa, 5 in Kandy), *Dysentery* 11 (8 in Moratuwa), *Plague* 8 (in Colombo), *Diphtheria* 3 (1 in Colombo, 1 in Moratuwa, and 1 in Kandy), *Mumps* 3 (1 in Colombo, 1 in Nuwara Eliya, and 1 in Anuradhapura), *Acut Diarrhoea* 1 (in Moratuwa), *Smallpox* 1 (in Colombo), and *Whooping Cough* 1 (in Colombo).

#### Meteorology.

13. *Rainfall.*—Kalutara recorded the highest rainfall (34·93 inches), followed by Ratnapura (19·33 inches). In other towns it ranged from 18·57 inches in Galle to 1·78 inches in Mullaittivu. Colombo recorded 8·97 inches.

14. *Temperature.*—The mean temperature varied from 60·6° in Nuwara Eliya to 85·0° in Jaffna, and was 81·7° in Colombo.
