WHEREAS by a resolution duly passed at a Meeting of the Legislative Council on the 26th January, 1921, it was resolved that the import duty on rice be increased from 50 cents per cwt. to Re. 1 per cwt. from such date as may be fixed by the Governor in Executive Council; and whereas the said resolution has been submitted to and sanctioned by the Secretary of State as required by section 11 (b) of the Customs Ordinance, No. 17 of 1869, as amended by section 2 of the Customs Amendment Ordinance, No. 5 of 1914;

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the 9th day of May, 1921, to be the date on and from which the import duty on rice shall be increased from 50 cents per cwt. to Re. 1 per cwt.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Seventh day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty-one.
