1. No rice shall be allowed to leave the Customs premises or to enter the Granaries without a Customs Outward Pass (Form F), which shall be shown to the Tidewaiter at the Leyden Bastion Gate, and shall be given up to the gate keeper at the Granaries.
2. All rice removed from the Customs premises shall be taken through the Leyden Bastion Gate direct to the Granaries.
3. Every cart or person bringing rice into the Chalmers Granaries shall enter by the gate facing Main street.
4. All rice brought into the Granaries shall be under the control of the Food Controller and his Deputies.
5. No rice in the Granaries shall be sold by any merchant, except in accordance with a permit signed by the Deputy Food Controller or the Controller of Estate Supplies.
6. No rice which has been sold in the Granaries shall be removed from the Granaries or loaded into trains without an Outward Pass (Form B) obtained from the Deputy Food Controller, or in respect of estate supplies from the Controller of Estate Supplies.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 30, 1921.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 159 (3 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 100 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 20 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the Census population on March 18, 1921, viz., 244,182) was 34.0, as against 31.0 in the preceding week, 21.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 140 (2 Europeans, 4 Burghers, 89 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 20 Moors, 3 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.9, as against 34.8 in the previous week, 28.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 140 total deaths, 41 were of infants under one year of age, as against 34 in the preceding week, 31 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Fourteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 5 in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 4 in Kotahena, 2 in San Sebastian, and 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya, as against 20 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Thirteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 3 each in Kotahena and Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 each in New Bazaar and Wellawatta, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, and Slave Island, as against 14 in the previous week and 20 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in St. Paul's and 1 each in Kotahena, Maradana (of a non-resident in hospital), and Wellawatta, as against 3 in the previous week.

(c) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in San Sebastian and 1 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island, as against 9 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

3. One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered in Maradana (of a non-resident in hospital), as against 8 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in Pettah, as against Nil in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

5. Fourteen deaths were registered from *Debility*, 11 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Infantile Convulsions*, 6 from *Enteritis*, 5 from *Worms*, 1 from *Dysentery*, and 54 from *Other Causes*.

6. Three cases of *Chickenpox*, 1 of *Enteric Fever*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 3, 11, and Nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.8°, against 82.3° in the preceding week and 80.0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.918 in., against 29.947 in. in the preceding week and 29.968 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.77 in., against 0.25 in. in the preceding week and 0.73 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

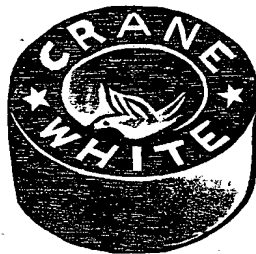
