IN the Name of His Majesty GEORGE THE FIFTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM HENRY MANNING, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by rule 2 (b) of Chapter V. of the rules made under "The Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907," and published by Notification dated April 23, 1918, in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,941 of May 10, 1918, it is enacted that no person shall remove or cause to be removed any forest produce or timber from any land, whether Crown or private, in any area specified by the Governor in Executive Council by notice in the *Government Gazette* as an area to which this rule applies, either within the said area or to any place outside the same, except under a permit issued by the Forest Officer in forms G. or H. in the appendix hereto:

Now know all Men that We, the said Governor in Executive Council, do by this Proclamation proclaim the areas, the limits of which are set forth in the schedule hereto subjoined, to be areas to which the said rule applies as from October 1, 1921.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Eleventh day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty-one.

#### SCHEDULE.

1. All railway stations in the Island on the Ceylon Government Railway.
2. The whole of the Eastern Province.
3. The whole of the North-Central Province.
4. The whole of the Province of Sabaragamuwa, excluding the four korales, i.e., Kinigoda korale, Galboda korale, Paranakuru korale, and Beligal korale, in the Kegalla District.
5. The District of Matale North in the Central Province, excluding "Udugoda Udasiya pattu."
6. Permits for the removal of common round timber and jak (*Artocarpus integrifolia*) are excluded from the provisions of this Proclamation.

IT is hereby notified for public information that five free courses of tuition of three months each will be given annually, at the expense of the Government of Ceylon, at the London School of Tropical Medicine.

2. Three courses will be available (a) for officers already in the Medical Service of the Government of Ceylon, (b) for candidates nominated to appointments in the Medical Service of the Government of Ceylon, and (c) in default of sufficient applications from Government officers in any one year, for private medical practitioners residing in the Island.

3. The cost of board and lodging will be defrayed by Government in the case of an officer in class (a) or (b), provided that he either resides in the school or in quarters found for him by the school. The amount so paid will be limited to the rates charged by the school for board and lodging.

4. The officer must sign a bond with the Crown Agents to the effect that he will refund all charges for board and lodging, and also a sum of £20 in respect of his tuition, if he fails at the end of the three months' course to obtain the school certificate, or if on obtaining it he fails to assume or resume his post, or if he leaves the service of Government, except on the ground of ill-health, within three years of his assumption of or return to duty.

5. A doctor who obtains an appointment under the Government of Ceylon within three months of taking the course at the school may apply for a refund of his tuition fees, provided that one of the free courses for the year in which he attended the school was unused.

6. In the case of a doctor not in the employment of, or not nominated for employment under, the Government of Ceylon being granted a free course of tuition, he will defray the expenses of his board and lodging. He must, however, execute a bond with the Crown Agents undertaking to refund the sum of £20 in respect of his tuition if at the end of his three months' course he fails to obtain the school certificate, or if on obtaining it he fails to return to Ceylon within a period of three years from the last date on which he attended the course of free tuition.

7. There are three School Sessions yearly of three months each, *viz.*, from January 15 to April 14, May 1 to July 31, and October 1 to December 31, inclusive.

8. The Notification dated October 30, 1913, published in *Government Gazette* No. 6,589 of November 7, 1913, is hereby cancelled.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 6, 1921.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 150 (2 Europeans, 12 Burghers, 85 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 26 Moors, 6 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on March 18, 1921, viz., 244,182) was 32·0, as against 34·0 in the preceding week, 17·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24·5 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 127 (3 Burghers, 76 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 22 Moors, 2 Malays, and 1 Other). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27·1, as against 29·9 in the previous week, 28·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·5 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 127 total deaths, 36 were of infants under one year of age, as against 41 in the preceding week, 45 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

(b) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 3 in New Bazaar, 1 in St. Paul's, as against 5 in the previous week.

(c) Three deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in New Bazaar and 1 in St. Paul's, as against 4 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

2. Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Kotahena, 3 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 14 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year.

The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·966 in., against 29·918 in. in the preceding week and 29·984 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3·81 in., against 1·77 in. in the preceding week and 0·25 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

4. 7. The right to collect the produce in question shall not be assigned, re-sold, or sublet by the purchaser without the consent of the Conservator of Forests first obtained in writing.
