IT is hereby notified for public information that five free courses of tuition of three months each will be given annually, at the expense of the Government of Ceylon, at the London School of Tropical Medicine.

2. Three courses will be available (a) for officers already in the Medical Service of the Government of Ceylon, (b) for candidates nominated to appointments in the Medical Service of the Government of Ceylon, and (c) in default of sufficient applications from Government officers in any one year, for private medical practitioners residing in the Island.

3. The cost of board and lodging will be defrayed by Government in the case of an officer in class (a) or (b), provided that he either resides in the school or in quarters found for him by the school. The amount so paid will be limited to the rates charged by the school for board and lodging.

4. The officer must sign a bond with the Crown Agents to the effect that he will refund all charges for board and lodging, and also a sum of £20 in respect of his tuition, if he fails at the end of the three months' course to obtain the school certificate, or if on obtaining it he fails to assume or resume his post, or if he leaves the service of Government, except on the ground of ill-health, within three years of his assumption of or return to duty.

5. A doctor who obtains an appointment under the Government of Ceylon within three months of taking the course at the school may apply for a refund of his tuition fees, provided that one of the free courses for the year in which he attended the school was unused.

6. In the case of a doctor not in the employment of, or not nominated for employment under, the Government of Ceylon being granted a free course of tuition, he will defray the expenses of his board and lodging. He must, however, execute a bond with the Crown Agents undertaking to refund the sum of £20 in respect of his tuition if at the end of his three months' course he fails to obtain the school certificate, or if on obtaining it he fails to return to Ceylon within a period of three years from the last date on which he attended the course of free tuition.

7. There are three School Sessions yearly of three months each, viz., from January 15 to April 14, May 1 to July 31, and October 1 to December 31, inclusive.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, July 5, 1921, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice dated June 28, 1921.

Present.—Mr. B. G. de Glanville, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; Major A. W. de Wilton; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; the Hon. Mr. H. L. de Mel, C.B.E.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; the Hon. Mr. Harold Creasy; Mr. A. E. de Silva; Lieut.-Col. S. Boylan Smith, D.S.O., O.B.E.; Mr. E. W. Jayewardene; Mr. R. L. Pereira; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; Mr. T. H. Tatham; and Mr. J. S. Collett.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of June 10, 1921, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of June 10, 1921, be confirmed.

2. The Chairman read the following:—Since the last Meeting of the Council only one fatal case of bubonic human plague has been recorded. The total for the year up to date is 156 cases, as against 59 cases during the corresponding period of last year.

Rat Plague.—No plague-infected rats have been found since March 10, and the total for the year is 43 cases.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando asked the Chairman—What is the total number of motor cars in Colombo which are licensed for hire? Out of these how many possess stand licenses for the privilege of occupying space in the stands in the Fort? What is the accommodation at these stands? Is it a fact that owing to the Registrar-General's Office being disturbed by the noise of the cars, only six cars are allowed in the stand opposite the Bristol Hotel, which has accommodation for 12 cars? What is the total number of cases from January 1 to date in which chauffeurs of hiring cars have been charged for obstructing the traffic or plying for hire outside the stands? Does the Chairman not consider it necessary for the Council to provide additional stands in the Fort, in view of the fact that the Council does not scruple to levy stand license fees from as many hiring car owners as apply for them?

The Chairman replied as follows:—The number of motor cars licensed to ply for hire in Colombo for the current year is 235. Licenses to ply from a stand are issued monthly, and the number applied for varies from month to month. The average at present is about 70. These licenses do not convey the privilege of occupying space on any particular stand in the Fort or elsewhere, but merely the general privilege of plying from a stand in Colombo. The stand accommodation at present available in the Fort for hiring cars other than taxi cabs is 24-18 in Church street and 6 opposite the Bristol Hotel. There are also stands for 6 taxi cabs at both these places. The stand for 6 taxi cabs in front of the Bristol Hotel is seldom, if ever, used by taxi cabs, and ordinary hiring cars are, therefore, allowed to stand there. So far as I can ascertain there has been no curtailing of the number of cars allowed on the stand opposite the Bristol Hotel. The Superintendent of Police, Colombo, informs me that from January 1 to June 30 of this year there have been nine prosecutions for obstruction of traffic, and 93 prosecutions for obstruction and plying for hire outside the stands. It is not possible to provide standing accommodation in the Fort for all hiring cars for which stand licenses are applied for, though it is possible to provide ample accommodation elsewhere. The difficulty arises from the fact that nearly all the hiring cars to ply in the vicinity of the jetty. Applicants for stand licenses are aware, and are warned at the time they apply for licenses, that the accommodation available in the vicinity of the jetty is much less than the number of stand licenses issued, but they prefer to take out licenses and take their chance of obtaining a place on the stand from time to time. The Works Engineer has for some time been going into the question of the provision of extra accommodation in the Fort with the Superintendent of Police, and it is hoped that it may be possible to provide stands for about double the present numbers. It is difficult to see how, with any fairness, a selection can be made from the various applicants, of those who are to be given the special privilege of plying from particular stands in the Fort.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando moved that this Council presses on Government the urgent necessity for the immediate reform of the constitution of Municipal Councils.

Mr. E. W. Jayewardene rose to a point of order. He said that it would not be proper to press on Government for the reform of the Municipal Councils in general. They might press on Government the necessity of reforming the constitution of the Colombo Municipal Council. He asked the Chairman whether the motion, as it stood, was in order. The Chairman ruled that the motion, as it stood, was not out of order. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

Mr. E. W. Jayewardene, Lieut.-Col. S. Boylan Smith, Mr. C. P. Dias, and Mr. R. L. Pereira spoke in support of the motion.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that the motion be amended by the addition of the words "and that a Committee consisting of the Elected Members of this Council, with the Chairman, be appointed to consider the subject of the reform of the Municipal Councils (if necessary, in conference with the Elected Members of the other Municipal Councils), and to report to this Council what action should be taken in the matter." The Hon. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.

The mover and the seconder having agreed to the amendment, the Chairman put the motion, as amended, to the meeting, and it was carried unanimously.

The amended motion read as follows:—"That this Council presses on Government the urgent necessity for the immediate reform of the constitution of Municipal Councils, and that a Committee consisting of the Elected Members of this Council, with the Chairman, be appointed to consider the subject of the reform of the Municipal Councils (if necessary, in conference with the Elected Members of the other Municipal Councils) and to report to this Council what action should be taken in the matter."

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 5 to 11 (inclusive) in the Agenda. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

The following report with regard to Tax on Professions and the extracts from the Minutes of the Special and the Standing Committees named were then laid before the Council in Committee:—

(5) To consider the report submitted by the Special Committee re Financial Position of Council on the motion of the Hon. Mr. H. L. de Mel, C.B.E., in Council on September 3, 1920, with regard to levying a license fee or tax on Professions, Arts, Trades, Callings and Appointments, as well as a tax on companies transacting business within the city; that the maximum fee be fixed by law; that the classes of persons be specified in a schedule and that thereafter the present commutation tax be abolished.

The Chairman stated that he had prepared a statement of the present financial position of the Council to be placed before that Meeting, but had since received from the Resident Engineer, Drainage Works, an estimate showing that another four lakhs of rupees would be needed to complete the Modified Drainage Scheme. This necessitated a revision of the statement on the present financial position of the Council. As requested by Government, he would confer that week with the Colonial Treasurer as regards the Council's loans and the Drainage loan. After this conference it will be easier to estimate the general financial position; and he hoped to circulate a revised statement before the next Meeting of Council. He would, therefore, suggest that consideration of the question of the profession tax and of additional sources of revenue in general be postponed until the next Meeting.

A discussion followed in which Messrs. R. L. Pereira, E. W. Jayewardene, the Hon. Mr. H. L. De Mel, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo, and Dr. E. V. Ratnam took part. Messrs. R. L. Pereira and E. W. Jayewardene were of opinion that the report required further consideration. The latter desired that the Madras Act, from which particulars were taken for the report, be circulated to Members who were not on the Special Committee, along with other connected papers. The Chairman undertook to have the papers so circulated.

The Hon. Mr. H. L. de Mel, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo, and Mr. T. H. Tatham spoke in favour of the report being adopted as early as possible, with such modifications as might be approved by Council.

The Chairman moved that the consideration of the report be postponed for a Special Meeting of the Council. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Committee re Financial Position of Council of June 20, 1921.

(6) With regard to the proposal for levying of fees for balconies, verandahs, and sunshades, which form encroachments on the streets, and on all placards, signboards, &c., displayed so as to be seen and read from the public streets, to consider the question of amending section 156 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910.—Recommended that steps be taken to recover fees on all encroachments on streets and that the Ordinance be amended, if necessary, to make this legal.

Resolution.

Resolved that the recommendation of the Special Committee be adopted.

Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of June 25, 1921.

(4) To consider the proposed further amendment to the proclamation published in *Government Gazette* No. 6,464 of September 29, 1911, with regard to the limits of the town of Colombo.—Recommended (*vide* Annexure "B" attached at the end of these Minutes).

Resolved that the above recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Special Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, July 26, 1921, at 3 p.m.

Pursuant to notice dated July 19, 1921, a Special Meeting of the Municipal Council was held at the Town Hall, this day in order to consider the report submitted by the Special Committee *re* Financial Position of Council on the motion of the Hon. Mr. H. L. de Mel, C.B.E., in Council on September 3, 1920, with regard to levying a license fee or tax on Professions, Arts, Trades, Calling and Appointments, as well as a tax on Companies transacting business within the City; that the maximum fee be fixed by law; that the classes of persons be specified in a schedule; and that thereafter the present commutation tax be abolished.

Present :—Mr B. G. de Glanville, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; the Hon. Mr. Arthur Alvis; the Hon. Mr. H. L. de Mel, C.B.E.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford; the Hon. Mr. Harold Creasy; Mr. A. E. de Silva; Lieut.-Col. S. Boylan Smith, D.S.O., O.B.E.; Mr. E. W. Jayawardene; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; Mr. T. H. Tatham; and Mr. J. S. Collett.

The Chairman stated that he had placed before the Members of Council a memorandum setting out the present financial position of the Council. He suggested that the Meeting should consider first the question whether the imposition of a tax such as that proposed was desirable as an alternative to the maintenance of the present assessment rate, and that, if this question was decided in the affirmative, they should then consider the details of the Committee's report.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider the report. The Hon. Mr. H. L. de Mel, C.B.E., seconded.—Carried.

The report of the Special Committee *re* Financial Position of Council with regard to levying a license fee or tax on Professions, Arts, Trades, Callings and Appointments, as well as a tax on companies transacting business within the city, that the maximum fee be fixed by law; that the classes of persons be specified in a schedule; and that thereafter the present Commutation Tax be abolished, was laid before the Council in Committee, together with the Memorandum (No. 3) by the Chairman on the present Financial Position of the Colombo Municipal Council.

The Hon. Mr. H. L. de Mel spoke in favour of the adoption of the report, and opposed the increase or even the continuance of the present assessment rate of 20 per cent.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo and Mr. A. E. de Silva spoke in favour of the proposed taxation. Mr. E. W. Jayawardene, the Hon. Mr. Arthur Alvis, Mr. T. H. Tatham, Mr. C. P. Dias, Dr. E. V. Ratnam, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, and the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader opposed the proposal.

The Hon. Mr. H. L. de Mel moved that, in view of the Chairman's Memorandum and the views of Members put forward at this Meeting, the proposal to introduce a tax on trades, professions, and callings, in order to obtain new sources of revenue, be deferred *sine die*. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.

In putting the motion to the Meeting, the Chairman pointed out that the proposal with regard to a profession tax could only be deferred on the understanding that the assessment rate should remain meanwhile at its present figure of 20 per cent. The motion was then put to the Meeting and carried.

The Hon. Mr. H. L. de Mel moved that the Council do resume and that the resolution of the Council in Committee be adopted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman formally moved in Council that the resolution of Council in Committee be adopted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

THE following Specifications have been accepted:—

No. 1,734 of July 7, 1920 (date applied for under Section 50 of the Ordinance, October 2, 1919).

Raphael Stuart Fleming.

"The production of certain new food products and to a process for producing the same."

Abstract.—The inventor states that fruit products, such as lemon juice, either alone or mixed with cane sugar cannot be reduced to a dry powder by atomizing into a current of heated air, the product being of a gummy nature; but that he has discovered that fruit products, such as lemon juice, will yield the desired dry powder on atomizing into a current of heated air, if a drying promoter consisting of the products of hydrolysis of starch (technical glucose) are added.

The claims are:—

1. A product in powdered form comprising fruit material combined with a drying promoter, including a product obtained by the hydrolysis of starch.
2. A product in powdered form comprising fruit material and glucose.
3. A product in powdered form comprising the solids of the juice of citrus fruit combined with glucose.
4. The product claimed in claims 1, 2, and 3, in which the glucose is of high dextrine content.
5. The product claimed in claims 1, 2, 3, and 4, in which the particles of the powder are spheres or fragments of spheres.

L'air Liquide, Societe Anonyme Pour L'etude et L'exploitation des Procèdes Georges Claude.

"Process for the separation of gaseous mixtures and particularly the extraction of hydrogen from gaseous mixtures."

Abstract.—The applicants describe a process for the extraction of gases from gaseous mixtures, characterized by the use of a suitable solvent under hyper-pressure which reduces the amount of solvent necessary, and by the device of releasing the dissolved gases at a pressure greater than atmospheric so as to reduce loss of solvent owing to volatilization, at the same time making use of the pressure drop to drive more solvent round the cycle.

The claims are:—

1. A process for the separation of mixtures, of gases that are not very soluble in liquids, and in particular for the extraction of hydrogen from gaseous mixtures that contain it, and especially of the hydrogen contained in water gas and a sufficient quantity of a suitable solvent are caused to circulate methodically, that is to say, in opposite directions and in contact with one another.

2. A process according to claim 1, in which the solvent is constrained only to give up the dissolved gases at a pressure much greater than atmospheric pressure, before re-entering the cycle.
3. In the process according to claim 1, the entrance of the unsaturated liquid into the dissolving apparatus under the action of the pressure of the liquid passing out, increased by that of a column of mercury.
4. A process for the separation of mixtures of gases that are not very soluble in liquids, substantially as herein described with reference to the accompanying drawing.

"Improvement in machines for use in making boxes."

Abstract.—The inventor describes an improved machine for use in making boxes as set out in the claims below :—

1. A machine for making wirebound boxes, crates, and the like, having work-feeding mechanism and mechanism for driving staples into the work to secure the box-binding wire thereto, in which the feeding mechanism is adapted to feed the work continuously and the staple-driving mechanism is adapted to drive the staples into the work while it is being fed, the machine being adapted to operate uninterruptedly upon a succession of box-assemblies.
2. A machine for making wirebound boxes, crates, and the like, according to claim 1, having mechanism for forming staples from staple wire automatically fed thereto and presenting said staples to the driving mechanism.
3. A machine for making wirebound boxes, crates, and the like, according to claim 1, in which the staple-driving mechanism is carried by a carriage which is reciprocated in a path parallel to the path in which the work is fed, the forward movement of said carriage in the direction of feed being synchronous with the feed movement of the work.
4. A machine for making wirebound boxes, crates, and the like, according to claims 2 and 3, in which the staple forming and presenting mechanism is carried by the reciprocating carriage.
5. A machine for making wirebound boxes, crates, and the like, according to claim 1, having wire-cutters and operating mechanism therefor adapted to sever the wires between successive box-assemblies while the work is being fed.
6. A machine for making wirebound boxes, crates, and the like, according to claim 5, in which the wire-cutters move forward with the work during the cutting operation.
7. A machine for making wirebound boxes, crates, and the like, according to claim 5, in which the wire-cutters are operated by a part of the work-feeding mechanism.
8. A machine for making wirebound boxes, crates, and the like, according to claim 5, in which the wire-cutters are normally maintained in inoperative position, and automatically move into operative position between two successive box-assemblies to sever the binding wires between the assemblies.
9. A machine for making wirebound boxes, crates, and the like, according to claims 5 and 6, in which the wire-cutters each comprise a pair of movable cutting knives, both normally maintained above the binding wire connecting the box-assemblies, one of the knives being adapted when lowered against the wire to snap in beneath the same and then to co-operate with the other knife, when moved with the work, to sever the wire.
10. In a machine of the class described for making wirebound boxes, crates, and the like, work-feeding mechanism constructed and operating substantially as described with reference to the accompanying drawings.
11. In a machine of the class described for making wirebound boxes, crates, and the like, staple-driving mechanism constructed and operating substantially as described with reference to the accompanying drawings.
12. In a machine of the class described for making wirebound boxes, crates, and the like, staple-forming and presenting mechanism constructed and operating substantially as described with reference to the accompanying drawings.
13. In a machine of the class described for making wirebound boxes, crates, and the like, wire-cutting mechanism constructed and operating substantially as described with reference to the accompanying drawings.
14. A machine of the class described for making wirebound boxes, crates, and the like, constructed and operating substantially as described with reference to the accompanying drawings.

"Improvement in wire joining tools."

Abstract.—The inventor describes a tool which receives the ends of wires to be joined, intertwists these wires in an even manner, severs the ends of the wires so as to leave them free from sharp edges or points, and which can be used on wires of various sizes.

The claims are :—

1. A tool for joining wires by intertwisting, comprising wire-gripping means adapted to receive the wires to be joined, and by rotation to cause them to be intertwisted and then severed, said wire-gripping means, including wire-gripping members which are relatively movable for the purpose described.
2. A tool for joining wires by intertwisting, according to claim 1, in which relative movement of the gripping members to grip the wires is effected by pressure of the tool against a relatively fixed object, such, for example, as the package about which the wire, the ends of which are to be joined, extends.
3. A tool for joining wires by intertwisting, according to claim 1 or 2, having means enabling the gripping pressure of the gripping members upon the wire to be varied or controlled for the purpose described.
4. A tool for joining wires by intertwisting, according to claim 1 or 2, comprising means adjustably to control the extent of movement of the gripping members toward each other.
5. A tool for joining wires by intertwisting, comprising means for effecting predetermined adjustment of the gripping members to limit the closing movement thereof for the purpose described.
6. A tool for joining wires by intertwisting, according to claim 1, in which the gripping members are provided with narrow wire-engaging portions.
7. A tool for joining wires by intertwisting, having wire-gripping members constructed and operating substantially as described with reference to the accompanying drawings.
8. A tool for joining wires by intertwisting, constructed and operating substantially as described with reference to the accompanying drawings.

“A process for the manufacture of crude dipentene from crude rubber and for the recovery of liquid rubber.”

Abstract.—The inventor describes a process for the manufacture from waste rubber of products which he calls crude dipentene and liquid rubber, the particular meaning which he attaches to these terms is defined in the specification.

The claims are :—

1. A process for the manufacture of crude dipentene from crude rubber comprising: melting to liquid form a predetermined charge of crude rubber in a suitable still; vaporizing and/or gasifying a fraction of that melted or melting charge at a temperature not exceeding 350° C. and at a pressure not exceeding two atmospheres; condensing the vapour of the distillate at or about atmospheric pressure and collecting the condensate; collecting the uncondensed gases of the distillate and transmitting them for use as fuel in the furnace of the still or of a boiler supplying steam to the still, and collecting the liquid rubber forming the residue in the still when a fraction between one-half and three-quarters more or less of the original charge of crude rubber has been vaporized and/or gasified.

2. A process for the manufacture of crude dipentene from crude rubber, as claimed in claim 1, characterized by melting and gasifying and vaporizing a predetermined charge of crude rubber, condensing the vapour, and subsequently separating and collecting the condensate, the uncondensed gases, and the residue in the still, at that stage in the process when a specified fraction of the original charge has been gasified and/or vaporized.

3. A process for the manufacture of crude dipentene from crude rubber, as claimed in claim 1, characterized by the collection of crude dipentene as the condensate and liquid rubber as the residue at the stage in the process when a fraction not substantially exceeding one-half the original charge of crude rubber has been vaporized and/or gasified.

4. A new commercial product of the process claimed in claim 1, characterized as the liquid residue in the still, and named herein liquid rubber, obtained when a fraction not substantially exceeding one-half nor substantially less than one-quarter the original charge of crude rubber has been melted and vaporized and/or gasified.

“Process for the manufacture of compressed hydrogen.”

Abstract.—The inventors describe a method for separating hydrogen from mixtures, such as water gas, coal gas, &c., which contain hydrogen mixed with such substances as carbon monoxide and/or methane, in which a solvent, such as ether, is used to dissolve the undesirable gas or gases under suitable conditions of temperature and pressure.

The claims are :—

1. A process for the direct extraction of hydrogen from mixtures that contain it, such as water gas, coal gas, coke-oven gas, and the like, by the methodical elimination by dissolving of the other gases contained in these mixtures, the said process being characterized by the use of ordinary ether or of such liquids that have approximately the same good power of dissolving carbon monoxide, ratio of solubilities $\frac{CO}{H}$, and temperature—co-efficient of this solubility ratio, as possessed by ether, these liquids being employed (1) at medium pressures of 50 to 300 atmospheres and (2) at a low temperature of -40° C. to -60° C. in order to take advantage of the increase in the ratio of solubilities $\frac{CO}{H}$ when the temperature falls, and only to have at the same time, a rather low value of the losses by vapour tension, the subsequent desaturation of the solvent preferably being effected in two stages, first from the pressure at which it is utilized to a much lower pressure, then from this lower pressure to atmospheric pressure, so as to obtain complete desaturation while reducing to a minimum the losses by vapour tension, substantially as described.

2. Process for the direct extraction of hydrogen under pressure from mixtures that contain it, substantially as herein described with reference to the accompanying drawing.

Abstract.—The inventors state that when a liquid saturated with dissolved gas under pressure is introduced into an apparatus in which the pressure is released, the liberation of the gas from the solution is accompanied by cooling, and they make use of this to cool the solvent.

The claims are :—

1. In a process for the extraction of hydrogen from its mixtures by dissolving under pressure at a low temperature, as described in our earlier Application No. 1,838, the method of obtaining the low temperature necessary, consisting in utilizing for the direct cooling of the solvent the cold produced by the expansion in a motor of the gases liberated from the said solvent.

2. Apparatus for carrying out the expansion provided for in the process according to claim 1, consisting in sending the saturated liquid on to the larger face of a differential piston, the other face of which will send an equal quantity of desaturated liquid to the dissolving apparatus.

“An improved method of filling up pores and like defects in castings.”

Abstract.—Undesirable holes in castings are closed by cleaning, filling with powdered metal, and then heating to melt the powder. The opening is cleaned with a reamer driven by a flexible shaft, then by acid and a flux, such as zinc, muriatic acid, and sal ammoniac. The powdered metal, such as tin, silver, nickel, copper, or tin alloyed with 2 per cent. of either or all of the other three metals, is inserted. The powder is then melted by an arc or concentrated flame and pressed and rubbed by means of heavy irons made of copper or nickel, preferably heated, and finally the surplus is scraped off and the surface finished correctly.

The claims are :—

1. The method of making useable defective castings, which consists in reaming or cleaning out the pores or openings found in the walls of said castings, subjecting the pores or openings found in the walls to the action of an acid, and applying a flux thereto, filling the pores or openings with a metallic substance, subjecting the filling to the action of localized heat, subjecting the filling while in heated condition to pressure, and rubbing the same into a homogeneous state, and finally scraping away the surplus of the filling and reducing the latter to conform to the contour of the finished surface of the casting.

2. The method of making useable defective castings, which consists in reaming or cleaning out the pores or openings found in the walls of said castings, subjecting the pores or openings found in the walls to the action of an acid, and applying a flux thereto, filling the pores or openings with a metallic compound, subjecting the filling to the action of an arc or spot flame, subjecting the filling while in the fused state to pressure, and rubbing the same into a homogeneous state, and finally scraping away the surplus of the filling and reducing the latter to conform to the contour of the finished surface of the casting.

3. The method of making useable defective castings, which consists in subjecting the pores or opening of defective castings to a suitable flux, filling the pores or openings with a material comprising a large percentage of block-tin, and silver, copper, and nickel in smaller quantities, subjecting the filling to localized heat, and then reducing the filling to the contour of the wall of the casting by scraping the surplus of the filling away, reducing the same to the contour of the finished surface.

4. The method described, which consists in subjecting the pores or openings of defective castings to a suitable flux, filling the pores or openings with block-tin 94 per cent., silver 2 per cent., copper 2 per cent., and nickel 2 per cent., subjecting the filling to localized heat, subjecting the filling while in heated condition to pressure, and rubbing the same into a homogeneous state, and finally scraping away the surplus of the filling and reducing the latter to conform to the contour of the finished surface of the casting.
