SCHEDULE.

Section 111, Rules 10 and 11. The existing Rule 10 is numbered 12.

(10) Live stock shall only be landed in a stage boat or pontoon fitted with a flat deck of ample strength with cross bars on the floor spaced at intervals to prevent animals from slipping; the deck to be fitted with a fence all round not less than 3 ft. 6 in. high, and a gate or other appliance to be provided for the purpose of loading and unloading; suitable gangways to be provided for unloading animals from the ship and landing them ashore.

(11) When it is not possible to use a gangway on board the ship, the canvas sling used to discharge live stock from the vessel shall not be less than 2 ft. 6 in. in width.

Note.—These rules do not apply to live stock shipped in crates or boxes.

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") :

And whereas the principal Order was amended by the Treaty of Peace (Amendment) Order, 1920, and the Treaty of Peace (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1920 ; and it is expedient that the principal Order as so amended, should be further amended, in manner hereinafter appearing :

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

1. The principal Order shall have effect, and shall be deemed always to have had effect, as if at the end of paragraph (vii.) of Article 1 thereof, the following words were inserted :—

"and where, under the provisions contained in the said Annex, the creditor has notified an enemy debt as due to him and the debt so notified has been admitted or found due to that creditor under the said provisions, payment by the Clearing Office of the sum credited to it in respect of that debt shall be made only to the creditor by or on whose behalf the debt was so notified, except that in the event of the death, bankruptcy, liquidation, or lunacy of the said creditor, payment by the Clearing Office shall be made to the person entitled by law to stand in his place."

2. In paragraph (xviii.) of Article 1 of the principal Order, as so amended as aforesaid, for the words "sixteen months" there shall be substituted the words "nineteen months."

3. This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1921, and this Order shall be included amongst the Orders which may be cited together as the Treaty of Peace Orders 1919 to 1921.

The Black-headed Coconut
Caterpillar (*Nephantis
serinopa*)

Column 2.

It shall be the duty of the owner or occupier of any coconut cultivation on which any stage of the coconut caterpillar (*Nephantis serinopa*) is present to burn "light traps" or "fires" for at least two hours between the hours of 7 and 10 p.m. throughout the said area for a period of ten consecutive weeks, at the rate of at least three to every acre or one to every one-third of an acre or any smaller area of coconut cultivation.

The term "light trap" shall signify a "light" placed just above a flat pan or tray containing kerosine or coconut oil and water, the said pan or tray to be at least 24 inches across. The above-mentioned "light" may be either acetylene gas or an ordinary bullock cart lamp adapted to burn oil. The term "fire" shall signify a fire made of coconut refuse (such as portions of dried leaves, stems, husks, &c.) or other inflammable materials which shall give a continuous bright flame.

One small oil "light trap" above mentioned shall be considered equivalent to one "fire" and one acetylene gas "light" trap shall be considered as equivalent to three of the said oil "light traps" or "fires."

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 24, 1921.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 253* (2 Europeans, 17 Burghers, 173 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 27 Moors, 4 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the Census population on March 18, 1921, viz., 244,182) was 54.0, as against 65.6 in the preceding week, 26.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 151 (2 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 80 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 21 Moors, 4 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 32.2, as against 32.7 in the previous week, 24.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 151 total deaths, 32 were of infants under one year of age, as against 40 in the preceding week, 27 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 13.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eleven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 3 each in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), and Wellawatta, 2 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island, and 1 in Kotahena, as against 17 in the previous week and 20 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Influenza* was registered in Pétta, same as in the previous week. The weekly average for last year was 6.

(c) One death from *Bronchitis* was registered in San Sebastian, as against 2 in the previous week.

2. (a) Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 3 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Kotahena, New Bazaar, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta, as against 18 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama hospital from *Phthisis* during the week.

3. Nine deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 4 in Maradana, 2 in Kotahena, and 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, and Wellawatta, as against 6 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

4. Sixteen deaths were registered from *Debility*, 10 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 8 from *Enteritis*, 7 from *Worms*, 6 from *Dysentery*, 3 from *Diarrhœa*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 67 from *Other Causes*.

5. Fourteen cases of *Enteric Fever*, 8 of *Chickenpox*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 9, 8, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week. No case of *Measles* was reported for the last three weeks.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82.8°, against 82.9° in the preceding week and 80.4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.986 in., against 29.991 in. in the preceding week and 29.979 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.09 in. against nil in the preceding week and 0.86 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

 - (10) To purchase, take in exchange, hire, or otherwise acquire and hold boats, barges, tugs, launches, and vessels of any description whatsoever; to purchase, take in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire and hold vans, omnibuses, carriages, carts, and other vehicles of any description whatsoever; and to purchase, take in exchange, hire, or otherwise acquire and hold all live and dead stock, chattels, and effects required for the maintenance and working of the business of carriers by land or by water; of proprietors of docks, wharves, jetties, piers, warehouses, and boats; of tug-owners and wharfingers or of any other business which can or may conveniently be carried on in connection with the above respectively.
 - (11) To build, make, construct, equip, maintain, improve, alter, and work rubber and tea factories, coconut and coffee curing mills, manufactories, buildings, erections, roads, water-courses, docks, wharves, jetties, and other works and conveniences which may be necessary or convenient for the purpose of the Company, or may seem calculated directly or indirectly to advance the Company's interests; and to contribute to, subsidize, or otherwise assist or take part in the construction, improvement, maintenance, working, management, carrying out, or control thereof.
 - (12) To cultivate, manage, and superintend estates and properties in the Island of Ceylon, the Federated Malay States, India, and elsewhere, and generally to undertake the business of estate agents in the Island of Ceylon, the Federated Malay States, India, and elsewhere, to act as agents for the investment, loan, payment, transmission, and collection of money, and for the purchase, sale, improvement, development, and management of property, including concerns and undertakings; and to transact any other agency business of any kind.
 - (13) To engage, employ, maintain, and dismiss managers, superintendents, assistants, clerks, coolies, and other servants and labourers; and to remunerate any such at such rate as shall be thought fit, and to grant pensions or gratuities to any such or the widow or children of any such.
 - (14) To enter into any arrangements with any authorities, Government, Municipal, local, or otherwise, that may seem conducive to the Company's objects or any of them, and to obtain from any such authority any rights, privileges, rebates, and concessions which the Company may think it desirable to obtain, and to carry out, exercise, and comply with such arrangements, rights, privileges, and concessions.
 - (15) To enter into partnership or into any arrangement for sharing profits, union of interest, reciprocal concession, amalgamation or co-operation with any person, corporation, or company carrying on or about to carry on or engage in any business or transaction which this Company is authorized to carry on or engage in, or any business or transaction capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit this Company; to take or otherwise acquire and hold shares or stock in or securities of, and to subsidize or otherwise assist, any such company, and to sell, hold, re-issue with or without guarantee, or otherwise deal with such shares or securities; and to form, constitute, or promote any other company or companies for the purpose of acquiring all or any of the property, rights, and liabilities of this Company, or for any other purpose which may seem directly or indirectly calculated to benefit this Company.
 - (16) To procure the Company to be registered or established or authorized to do business in the Island of Ceylon, the Federated Malay States, India, or elsewhere.

- (17) To lend money on any terms and in any manner and on any security, and in particular on the security of plantations, factories, growing crops, produce, bills of exchange, promissory notes, bonds, bills of lading, warrants, stocks, shares, debentures, or book debts, or without any security at all.
- (18) To borrow or raise money for the purposes of the Company, or receive money on deposit at interest or otherwise, and for the purpose of raising or securing money for the performance or discharge of any obligation or liability of the Company or for any other purpose to create, execute, grant, or issue any mortgages, mortgage debentures, debentures, debenture stock, bonds or obligations of the Company either at par, premium, or discount, and either redeemable, irredeemable, or perpetual, secured upon all or any part of the undertaking, revenue, rights, and property of the Company, present and future, including uncalled capital or the unpaid calls of the Company.
- (19) Generally to purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire, or otherwise acquire any real or personal property, and any rights, privileges, licenses, or easements which the Company may think necessary or convenient with reference to any of these objects and capable of being profitably dealt with in connection with any of the Company's property or rights for the time being.
- (20) To cause or permit any debentures, debenture stock, bonds, mortgages, charges, incumbrances, liens, or securities of or belonging to or made or issued by the Company or affecting its property or rights or any of the terms thereof to be renewed, extended, varied, redeemed, exchanged, transferred or satisfied, as shall be thought fit; also to pay off and re-borrow the moneys secured thereby or any part or parts thereof.
- (21) To sell the undertaking of the Company or any part thereof for such consideration as the Company may think fit, and in particular for shares, debentures, or securities of any other company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of this Company.
- (22) To invest and deal with the moneys of the Company not immediately required upon such securities and in such manner as may from time to time be determined.
- (23) To make, accept, endorse, and execute promissory notes, bills of exchange, bills of lading, and other negotiable and transferable instruments.
- (24) To remunerate any parties for services rendered or to be rendered in placing or assisting to place any shares in the Company's capital, or any debentures, debenture stock, or other securities of the Company, or in or about the formation or promotion of the company or the conduct of its business.
- (25) To do all or any of the above things in any part of the world as principals, agents, contractors, or otherwise, or alone or in conjunction with others, or by or through agents, sub-contractors, trustees, or otherwise, and generally to carry on any business or effectuate any object of the Company.
- (26) To sell, let, lease, under-lease, exchange, surrender, transfer, deliver, charge, mortgage, dispose of, turn to account, or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property and rights of the Company, whether in consideration of rents, moneys, or securities for money, shares, debentures, or securities in any other company, or for any other consideration.
- (27) To pay for any lands and real or personal, immovable or movable, estate, property, or assets of any kind acquired or to be acquired by the Company, or for any services rendered or to be rendered to the Company; and generally to pay or discharge any consideration to be paid or given by the Company, in money or in shares (whether fully paid up or partly paid up), or in debentures, debenture stock, or obligations of the Company, or partly in one way and partly in another, or otherwise howsoever, with power to issue any shares either as fully paid up or partly paid up for such purpose.
- (28) To accept as consideration for the sale or disposal of any lands and real or personal, immovable or movable, estate, property, or assets of the Company, or in discharge of any other consideration to be received by the Company, money or shares (whether fully paid up or partly paid up) of any company, or debentures or debenture stock or obligations of any company or person, or partly one and partly any other.
- (29) To distribute among the Shareholders in specie any property of the Company, whether by way of dividend or upon a return of capital, but so that no distribution amounting to a reduction of capital be made, except with the sanction for the time being required by law.
- (30) To do all such other things as may be necessary, incidental, conducive, or convenient to the attainment of the above objects or any of them.

It being hereby declared that in the foregoing clauses (unless a contrary intention appears) the word "person" includes any number of persons and a corporation, and that the other "objects" specified in any one paragraph are not to be limited or restricted by reference to or inference from any other paragraph.

4. The liability of the Shareholders is limited.

5. The nominal capital of the Company is Seven hundred and Fifty thousand Rupees (Rs. 750,000), divided into Seven thousand Five hundred (7,500) shares of One hundred Rupees (Rs. 100) each, with power to increase or reduce the capital. The shares forming the capital (original, increased, or reduced) of the Company may be subdivided, consolidated, or divided into such classes, with any preferential, deferred, qualified, special, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto, and be held upon such terms as may be prescribed by the Articles of Association and regulations of the Company for the time being, or otherwise.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE ALBION TEA ESTATES COMPANY, LIMITED.

It is agreed as follows :—

1. *Table C not to apply ; Company to be governed by these Articles.*—The regulations contained in Table C in the Schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies' Ordinance, 1861," shall not apply to this Company, which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Articles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolution.
2. *Power to alter the Regulations.*—The Company may, by special resolution, alter and make provisions instead of, or in addition to, any of the regulations of the Company, whether contained and comprised in these Articles or not.
3. None of the funds of the Company shall be employed in the purchase of or be lent on shares of the Company.

INTERPRETATION.

4. *Interpretation Clause.*—In the interpretation of these presents the following words and expressions shall have the following meanings, unless such meanings be inconsistent with, or repugnant to, the subject or context :—

Company.—The word "Company" means "The Albion Tea Estates Company, Limited," incorporated or established by or under the Memorandum of Association to which these Articles are attached.

The Ordinance.—"The Ordinance" means and includes "The Joint Stock Companies' Ordinances, 1861 to 1918," and every other Ordinance from time to time in force concerning Joint Stock Companies which may apply to the Company.

Special Resolution.—"Special resolution" has the meaning assigned thereto by the Ordinance.

Extraordinary Resolution.—"Extraordinary resolution" means a resolution passed by three-fourths in number and value of such Shareholders of the Company for the time being entitled to vote as may be present in person or by proxy, where proxies are allowed, at any meeting of the Company of which notice specifying an intention to propose such resolution as an extraordinary resolution has been duly given.

These Presents.—"These presents" means and includes the Memorandum of Association and the Articles of Association of the Company from time to time in force.

Capital.—"Capital" means the capital for the time being raised or authorized to be raised for the purposes of the Company.

Shares.—"Shares" means the shares from time to time into which the capital of the Company may be divided.

Shareholder.—"Shareholder" means a shareholder of the Company.

Presence or Present.—With regard to a shareholder "presence or present" at a meeting means presence or present personally or by proxy or by attorney duly authorized.

Directors.—"Directors" means the Directors for the time being of the Company or (as the case may be) the Directors assembled at a Board.

Board.—"Board" means a meeting of the Directors or (as the context may require) the Directors assembled at a Board meeting, acting through at least a quorum of their body in the exercise of authority duly given to them.

Persons.—"Persons" means partnerships, associations, corporations, companies, unincorporated or incorporated by Ordinance and registration, as well as individuals.

Office.—"Office" means the registered office for the time being of the Company.

Seal.—"Seal" means the common seal for the time being of the Company.

Month.—"Month" means a calendar month.

Writing.—"Writing" means printed matter or print as well as writing.

Singular and Plural Number.—Words importing the singular number only include the plural, and *vice versa*.

Masculine and Feminine Gender.—Words importing the masculine gender only include the feminine, and *vice versa*.

BUSINESS.

5. *Commencement of Business.*—The Company may proceed to carry out the objects for which it is established, and to employ and apply its capital as soon after the registration of the Company as the Directors in their discretion shall think fit; and notwithstanding that the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, applied for, or allotted, they shall do so as soon as, in the judgment of the Directors, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed or applied for.

6. *Business to be carried on by Directors.*—The business of the Company shall be carried on by, or under the management or direction of, the Directors, and subject only to the control of General Meetings, in accordance with these presents.

CAPITAL.

7. *Nominal Capital.*—The nominal capital of the Company is Seven hundred and Fifty thousand Rupees (Rs. 750,000), divided into Seven thousand Five hundred (7,500) shares of One hundred Rupees (Rs. 100) each.

SHARES.

8. *Allotment and Issue.*—The shares, except where otherwise provided, shall be allotted at the discretion of and by the Directors, who may from time to time issue any unissued shares, and may add to such shares such an amount of premium as they may consider proper; provided that such unissued shares shall be first offered by the Directors to the registered Shareholders for the time being of the Company as nearly as possible in proportion to the shares already held by them, and such shares as shall not be accepted by the Shareholder or Shareholders to whom the shares shall have been offered within the time specified in that behalf by the Directors shall be then offered by the Directors to the remaining registered Shareholders for the time being of the Company as nearly as possible in proportion to the shares then held by them, and such shares as shall not be accepted by the remaining registered Shareholders to whom the shares shall have been so offered within the time specified in that behalf by the Directors, may be disposed of by the Directors in such manner as they think most beneficial to the Company; provided also that the Directors may if authorized by the Company in General Meeting by special resolution allot any unissued shares in payment for any estate or lands or other property purchased or acquired by the Company, without first offering such shares to the registered Shareholders for the time being of the Company, and may make arrangements on an issue of shares for a difference between the holders of such shares in the amount of calls to be paid, and the time of payment of such calls.

9. *Payment of Amount of Shares by Instalments.*—If by the conditions of allotment of any share the whole or part of the amount thereof shall be payable by instalments, every such instalment shall, when due, be paid to the Company by the holder of the share.

10. *Acceptance.*—Every person taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof by writing under his hand in such form as the Company from time to time directs.

11. *Payment.*—Payment for shares shall be made in such manner as the Directors shall from time to time determine and direct.

12. *Shares held by a Firm.*—Shares may be registered in the name of a firm, and any partner of the firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm shall be entitled to vote and to give proxies, but not more than one partner may vote at a time.

13. *Shares held by two or more Persons not in Partnership.*—Shares may be registered in the names of two or more persons not in partnership.

14. *One of Joint-holders other than a Firm may give Receipts; only one of Joint-holders resident in Ceylon entitled to Vote.*—Any one of the joint-holders of a share, other than a firm, may give effectual receipts for any dividend payable in respect of such share; but only one of such joint-shareholders shall be entitled to the right of voting and of giving proxies and exercising the other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, and if the joint-holders cannot arrange amongst themselves as to who shall vote or give proxies and exercise such other rights and powers conferred on a sole Shareholder, the Shareholder whose name stands first on the register of shares shall vote or give proxies and exercise those rights and powers; provided, however, that in the event of such first registered Shareholder being absent from the Island, the first registered Shareholder then resident in Ceylon shall vote or give proxies and exercise all such rights and powers as aforesaid.

15. *Survivor of Joint-holders, other than a Firm, only recognized.*—In case of the death of any one or more of the joint-holders, other than a firm, of any shares, the survivor or survivors shall be the only person or persons recognized by the Company as having any title to, or interest in, such shares.

16. *Liability of Joint-holders.*—The joint-holders of a share shall be severally as well as jointly liable for the payment of all instalments and calls due in respect of such share.

17. *Trusts or any interest in share other than that of registered holder or of any person under clause 38 not recognized.*—The Company shall not be bound to recognize (even though having notice of) any contingent, future, partial, or equitable interest in the nature of a trust or otherwise in any share or any other right in respect of any share, except any absolute right thereto in the person from time to time registered as the holder thereof, and except also the right of any person under clause 38 to become a Shareholder in respect of any share.

INCREASE OF CAPITAL.

18. *Increase of Capital by a creation of new Shares.*—The Company in General Meeting may, by special resolution, from time to time increase the capital by creation of new shares of such amount per share and in the aggregate, and with such special, preferential, deferred, qualified, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto as such resolution shall direct.

19. *Issue of new Shares.*—The new shares shall be issued upon such terms and conditions and with such preferential, deferred, qualified, special, or other rights, privileges, or conditions attached thereto, as the General Meeting resolving on the creation thereof, or any other General Meeting of the Company shall direct; and in particular such shares may be issued with a preferential or qualified right to the dividends and in the distribution of assets of the Company, and with a special or without any right of voting. The Directors shall have power to add to such new shares such an amount of premium as they may consider proper.

20. *How carried into effect.*—Subject to any direction to the contrary that may be given by the meeting that sanctions the increase of capital, all new shares shall be offered to the Shareholders in proportion to the existing shares held by them. Such offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares to which the Shareholder is entitled, and limiting a time within which the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined, and after the expiration of such time, or on the receipt of an intimation from the Shareholder to whom such notice is given that he declines to accept the shares offered, such shares shall be then offered in the same manner by the Directors to the remaining registered Shareholders for the time being of the Company as nearly as possible in proportion to the shares then held by them, and such shares as shall not be accepted by the remaining registered Shareholders to whom the shares shall have been so offered within the time specified in that behalf by the Directors shall be disposed of in such manner as the Directors may determine. Provided that the Directors may, if authorized by the Company in General Meeting by special resolution, allot such new shares or any portion of them in payment for any estates or lands or other property purchased or acquired by the Company without first offering such shares to the registered Shareholders for the time being of the Company.

21. *Same as original Capital.*—Except so far as otherwise provided by the conditions of issue or by these presents, any capital raised by the creation of new shares shall be considered part of the original capital, and shall be subject to the provisions herein contained with reference to the payments of calls and instalments, transfer, transmission, forfeiture, lien, surrender, and otherwise.

REDUCTION OF CAPITAL AND SUBDIVISION OR CONSOLIDATION OF SHARES.

22. *Reduction of Capital and Subdivision or Consolidation of Shares.*—The Company in General Meeting may by special resolution reduce the capital in such manner as such special resolution shall direct, and may by special resolution subdivide or consolidate the shares of the Company or any of them.

SHARE CERTIFICATES.

23. *Certificates how issued.*—Every Shareholder shall be entitled to one certificate for all the shares registered in his name, or to several certificates, each for one or more of such shares. Every certificate shall specify the number of the share in respect of which it is issued.

24. *Certificates to be under Seal of Company.*—The certificates of shares shall be issued under the seal of the Company.

25. *Renewal of Certificate.*—If any certificate be worn out or defaced, then upon production thereof to the Directors they may order the same to be cancelled and may issue a new certificate in lieu thereof; and if any certificate be lost or destroyed, then, upon proof thereof to the satisfaction of the Directors, and on such indemnity as the Directors deem adequate being given, a new certificate in lieu thereof shall be given to the person entitled to such lost or destroyed certificate. A sum of fifty cents shall be payable for such new certificate.

26. *Certificate to be delivered to the first-named of Joint-holders not a Firm.*—The certificate of shares registered in the names of two or more persons not a firm shall be delivered to the person first named on the register.

TRANSFER OF SHARES.

27. *Exercise of Rights.*—No person shall exercise any right of a Shareholder until his name shall have been entered in the Register of Shareholders and he shall have paid all calls and other moneys for the time being payable on every share in the Company held by him.

28. *Transfer of Shares.*—(1) Subject to the provisions of sub-clauses (5), (7), or (8) of this article no share shall be transferred to a person who is not a Shareholder so long as any Shareholder is willing to purchase the same as hereinafter provided.

(2) (a) Except where the transfer is made pursuant to sub-clauses (5), (7), or (8) of this Article, the person proposing to transfer any share (hereinafter called "the proposing transferor") shall give notice in writing (hereinafter called "the transfer notice") to the Company that he desires to transfer such share. The transfer notice shall specify the sum he fixes as the price of the share (hereinafter called "the proposing transferor's price"), which price must be approved by the Directors as not being prohibitive or excessive, and shall constitute the Company his agent for the sale

of the share to any Shareholder of the Company at such price. The transfer notice may include several shares, and in such case shall operate as if it were a separate notice in respect of each, and shall specify the denoting number of each share which the proposing transferor desires to sell. A transfer notice shall not be revocable except with the sanction of the Directors.

(2) (b) If the Directors do not approve of the proposing transferor's price and consider the same prohibitive or excessive, the question shall be referred to the Company's auditors for their decision and the valuation of the shares as fixed by the auditors shall be binding on all parties, and such valuation shall be immediately inserted in the transfer notice as the proposing transferor's price.

(3) If the Company shall within the space of ninety days after being served with such notice, find a Shareholder willing to purchase the share at the proposing transferor's price (hereinafter called "the purchasing Shareholder") and give notice thereof to the proposing transferor, the latter shall be bound, upon payment of the said price, to transfer the share to the purchasing Shareholder.

(4) If in any case the proposing transferor, after having become bound as aforesaid, makes default in transferring any share, the Company may receive the purchase money and shall thereupon cause the name of the purchasing Shareholder to be entered in the register as the holder of that share, and shall hold the purchase money in trust for the proposing transferor. The receipt of the Company for the purchase money shall be a good discharge to the purchasing Shareholder, and after his name has been entered in the register in purported exercise of the aforesaid power, the validity of the proceedings shall not be questioned by any person.

(5) If the Company shall not within the space of ninety days after being served with the transfer notice find a Shareholder willing to purchase all or any of the shares comprised therein, and give notice in manner aforesaid, the proposing transferor shall at any time within three calendar months after the expiration of the said period of ninety days, be at liberty, subject to Article 32, to sell and transfer the said shares, or such of them as have not been sold to a purchasing Shareholder, to any person but at a price not less than that specified by him in his transfer notice, or the price fixed by the Company's auditors, as the case may be.

(6) The Company in General Meeting may make, and from time to time vary, rules as to the mode in which any shares specified in any transfer notice shall be offered to the Shareholders, and as to their rights in regard to the purchase thereof, and in particular may give any Shareholder, or class of Shareholders a preferential right to purchase the same. Until otherwise determined, every such share or shares will be offered to the Shareholders as far as practicable in proportion to the shares held by them, and in case where this is not possible such share or shares will be offered to the Shareholders by lots drawn in regard thereto as the Directors shall think fit.

(7) Any share may be transferred by a Shareholder to any child or other issue, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, father, mother, brother, sister, nephew, niece, wife, or husband of a Shareholder, and any share of a deceased Shareholder may be transferred by his executors or administrators to any trustees under the will of any such deceased Shareholder, or to any child or other issue, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, father, mother, brother, sister, nephew, niece, widow, or widower of such deceased Shareholder, to whom such deceased Shareholder may have specifically bequeathed the same, or who may be entitled to the residuary estate of such deceased Shareholder or any part or share of such residuary estate, and shares standing in the name of the trustees of the will of any deceased Shareholder may be transferred to any beneficiary as aforesaid under the will, or upon any change of trustees, to the trustees for the time being of such will, and the restrictions in sub-clause (1) of this Article contained shall not apply to any transfer authorized by this sub-clause.

(8) A Shareholder may, with the consent of the Directors, transfer any shares the total nominal value of which shall not exceed Five hundred Rupees (Rs. 500) to a person who is not a Shareholder for the purpose of making such person to qualify as a Director or for any purpose connected with the conduct and management of the Company's business or for such other purposes (not being an absolute sale of the said shares) as the Directors may in their absolute discretion think proper. Any transfer to a person who is not a Shareholder made under this Article which operates as an absolute sale or otherwise than for the purposes herein specifically mentioned shall be absolutely null and void.

29. *No transfer to Minor or Person of Unsound Mind.*—No transfer of shares shall be made to a minor or person of unsound mind.

30. *Register of Transfers.*—The Company shall keep a book or books, to be called "The Register of Transfers," in which shall be entered the particulars of every transfer or transmission of any share.

31. *Instrument of Transfer.*—The instrument of transfer of any share shall be signed both by the transferor and transferee, and the transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of such share until the name of the transferee is entered in the register in respect thereof.

32. *Board may decline to Register Transfers.*—The Board may, at their own absolute and uncontrolled discretion, decline to register any transfer of shares by a Shareholder who is indebted to the Company, or upon whose shares the Company have a lien or otherwise; or to any person not approved by them, but the latter restriction shall not apply where the proposed transferee is already a Shareholder nor to a transfer made pursuant to Article 28 (7) hereof.

33. *Not bound to state Reason.*—In no case shall a Shareholder or proposed transferee be entitled to require the Directors to state the reason of their refusal to register, but their declinature shall be absolute.

34. *Registration of Transfer.*—Every instrument of transfer must be left at the office of the Company to be registered, accompanied by such evidence as the Directors may reasonably require to prove the title of the transferor, and a fee of Rs. 2.50, or such other sum as the Directors shall from time to time determine, must be paid; and thereupon the Directors, subject to the powers vested in them by Articles 32, 33, and 35, shall register the transferee as Shareholder and retain the instrument of transfer.

35. *Directors may authorize Registration of Transferees.*—The Directors may, by such means as they shall deem expedient, authorize the registration of transferees as Shareholders without the necessity of any meeting of the Directors for that purpose.

36. *Directors not bound to inquire as to validity of Transfer.*—In no case shall the Directors be bound to inquire into the validity, legal effect, or genuineness of any instrument of transfer produced by a person claiming a transfer of any share in accordance with these Articles, and whether they abstain from so inquiring or do so inquire and are misled, the transferor shall have no claim whatsoever upon the Company in respect of the share, except for the dividends previously declared in respect thereof, but if at all upon the transferee only.

37. *Transfer Books when to be closed.*—The Transfer Books may be closed during the fourteen days immediately preceding each Ordinary General Meeting, including the First General Meeting; also, when a dividend is declared, for the three days next ensuing the Meeting; also, at such other times as the Directors may decide, not exceeding in the whole twenty-one days in any one year.

TRANSMISSION OF SHARES.

38. *Title to Shares of Deceased Holder.*—The executors, or administrators, or the heirs of a deceased Shareholder shall be the only persons recognized by the Company as having any title to shares of such Shareholder.

39. *Registration of Persons entitled to Shares otherwise than by Transfer.*—Any curator of any minor Shareholder, any committee of a lunatic Shareholder, or any person becoming entitled to shares in consequence of the death, bankruptcy, or liquidation of any Shareholder, or the marriage of any female Shareholder, or in any other way than by transfer, shall, upon producing such evidence that he sustains the character in respect of which he proposes to act under this clause, or of

his title, as the Company think sufficient, be forthwith entitled, subject to the provisions herein contained, to be registered as a Shareholder in respect of such shares on payment of a fee of Rs. 2·50; or may, subject to the regulations as to transfers hereinbefore contained, transfer the same to some other person.

40. *Failing such Registration Shares may be sold by the Company.*—If any person who shall become entitled to be registered in respect of any share under clause 39, shall not, from any cause whatever, within twelve calendar months after the event on the happening of which his title shall accrue, be registered in respect of such share, or if, in the case of the death of any Shareholder, no person shall within twelve calendar months after such death, be registered as a Shareholder in respect of the shares of such deceased Shareholder, the Company may offer the same to the Shareholders in proportion to the existing shares held by them in manner specified in Article 20 hereof; and such shares as may not be taken up by the Shareholders the Director may sell, either by public auction or private contract, and give a receipt for the purchase money; and the purchaser shall be entitled to be registered in respect of such share, and shall not be bound to inquire whether the events have happened which entitled the Company to sell the same; the nett proceeds of such sale, after deducting all expenses and all moneys in respect of which the Company is entitled to a lien on the shares so sold, shall be paid to the person entitled thereto.

SURRENDER AND FORFEITURE OF SHARES.

41. *The Directors may accept Surrender of Shares.*—The Directors may accept, in the name and for the benefit of the Company and upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon, a surrender of the shares of Shareholders who may be desirous of retiring from the Company.

42. (a) *If Call or Instalment be not paid, Notice to be given to Shareholder.*—If any Shareholder fails to pay any call or instalment on or before the day appointed for the payment of the same, the Directors may at any time thereafter, during such time as the call or instalment remains unpaid, serve a notice on such Shareholder or his executors or administrators, or the trustee or assignee in his bankruptcy, requiring him to pay the same, together with any interest that may have accrued, at the rate of 9 per cent. per annum, and all expenses that may have been incurred by the Company by reason of such non-payment.

(b) *Terms of Notice.*—The notice shall name a day (not being less than one month from the date of the notice) on and a place or places at which such call or instalment and such interest and expenses as aforesaid are to be paid; the notice shall also state that, in the event of non-payment at or before the time and at the place appointed, the shares in respect of which the call was made or instalment is payable will be liable to be forfeited.

(c) *In Default of Payment, Shares to be forfeited.*—If the requisition of such notice as aforesaid be not complied with, every or any share or shares in respect of which such notice has been given may at any time thereafter, before payment of calls or instalments, with interest and expenses due in respect thereof, be declared forfeited by a resolution of the Board to that effect.

(d) *Shareholder still liable to pay Money owing at time of forfeiture.*—Any Shareholder whose shares have been so declared forfeited shall, notwithstanding, be liable to pay and shall forthwith pay to the Company all calls, instalments, interest, and expenses owing upon or in respect of such shares at the time of the forfeiture, together with interest thereon from the time of forfeiture until payment at 9 per cent. per annum, and the Directors may enforce the payment thereof if they think fit.

43. *Surrendered or forfeited Shares to be the Property of the Company, and may be sold, &c.*—Every share surrendered or so declared forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may be sold, re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of in the same manner as provided in Article 20.

44. *Effect of Surrender or Forfeiture.*—The surrender or forfeiture of a share shall involve the extinction of all interest in, and also of all claims and demands against, the Company in respect of the share and the proceeds thereof, and all other rights incident to the share, except only such of those rights (if any) as by these presents are expressly saved.

45. (a) *Certificates of Surrender or Forfeiture.*—A certificate in writing under the hands of two of the Directors and of the Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries that a share has been duly surrendered or forfeited, stating the time when it was surrendered or forfeited, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated, as against all persons who would have been entitled to the share but for such surrender or forfeiture; such certificate and the receipt of the Company for the price of such share shall constitute a good title to such share, and a certificate of proprietorship shall be delivered to any person who may purchase the same from the Company; such purchaser thereupon shall be deemed the holder of such share discharged from all calls due prior to such purchase, and he shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money nor shall his title to such share be affected by any irregularity in the proceedings in reference to such forfeiture or sale.

(b) *Forfeiture may be remitted.*—The Directors may, in their discretion, remit or annul the forfeiture of any share within six months from the date thereof upon the payment of all moneys due to the Company from the late holder or holders of such share or shares, and all expenses incurred in relation to such forfeiture, together with such further sum of money by way of redemption money for the deficit, as they shall think fit, not being less than 9 per cent. per annum on the amount of the sums wherein default in payment had been made, but no share *bona fide* sold, re-allotted, or otherwise disposed of under Article 43 hereof shall be redeemable after sale or disposal.

46. *Company's Lien on Shares.*—The Company shall have a first charge or paramount lien upon all the shares of any holder or joint-holders for all moneys for the time being due to the Company by such holder, or by all or any of such joint-holders respectively, either in respect of such shares or of other shares held by such holder or joint-holders or otherwise, and whether due from any such holder individually or jointly with others, including all calls resolutions for which shall have been passed by the Directors, although the times appointed for the payment thereof shall not have arrived; and where any share is held by more persons than one the Company shall be entitled to the said charge or lien in respect of any money due to the Company from any of such persons. The Directors may decline to register any transfer of shares subject to such charge or lien.

47. *Lien how made available.*—Such charge or lien may be made available by a sale of all or any of the shares subject to it, provided that no such sale shall be made except under a resolution of the Directors, and until notice in writing shall have been given to the indebted Shareholder or his executors or administrators, or the assignee or trustee in his bankruptcy, requiring him or them to pay the amount for the time being due to the Company, and default shall have been made for twenty-eight days from such notice in paying the sum thereby required to be paid. Should the Shareholder over whose share the lien exists be in England or elsewhere abroad, sixty days' notice shall be allowed him.

48. *Proceeds how applied.*—The nett proceeds of any such sale as aforesaid under the provisions of Articles 43 and 47 hereof shall be applied in or towards the satisfaction of such debts, liabilities, or engagements, and the residue (if any) shall be paid to such Shareholder or his representatives.

49. *Certificate of Sale.*—A certificate in writing under the hands of two of the Directors and of the Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries that the power of sale given by clause 47 has arisen, and is exercisable by the Company under these presents, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated.

50. *Transfer on Sale how executed.*—Upon any such sale two of the Directors may execute a transfer of such share to the purchaser thereof, and such transfer, with the certificate last aforesaid, shall confer on the purchaser a complete title to such shares.

PREFERENCE SHARES.

51. *Preference and Deferred Shares.*—Any shares from time to time to be issued or created may from time to time be issued with any such right of preference, whether in respect of dividend or of payment of capital, or both, or any such other special privilege or advantage over any shares previously issued or then about to be issued (other than shares issued with a preference), or with such deferred rights as compared with any shares previously issued or then about to be issued, or subject to any such conditions or provisions, and with any such right or without any right of voting, and generally on such terms as the Company may, from time to time, by special resolution determine.

52. *Modification of rights and consent thereto.*—If at any time by the issue of preference shares or otherwise the capital is divided into shares of different classes—

- (1) The holders of any class of shares, by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders, may consent, on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class, to the issue or creation of any shares ranking equally therewith, or having any priority thereto, or the abandonment of any preference or priority, or of any accrued dividend, or the reduction for any time or permanently of the dividends payable thereon, or to any scheme for the reduction of the Company's capital affecting the class of shares;
- (2) All or any of the rights, privileges, and conditions attached to each class may be commuted, abrogated, abandoned, added to, or otherwise modified by a special resolution of the Company in General Meeting, provided the holders of any class of shares affected by any such commutation, abrogation, abandonment, addition, or other modification of such rights, privileges, and conditions; consent thereto, on behalf of all the holders of shares of the class by an extraordinary resolution passed at a meeting of such holders.

Any extraordinary resolution passed under the provisions of this Article shall be binding upon all the holders of shares of the class, provided that this Article shall not be read as implying the necessity for such consent as aforesaid in any case in which but for this Article the object of the resolution could have been effected without it.

53. *Meeting affecting a particular Class of Shares.*—Any meeting for the purpose of the last preceding clause shall be convened and conducted in all respects as nearly as possible in the same way as an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Company, provided that no Shareholder, not being a Director, shall be entitled to notice thereof or to attend thereat, unless he be a holder of shares of the class intended to be affected by the resolution and that no vote shall be given except in respect of a share of that class, and that at any such meeting a poll may be demanded in writing by any Shareholder personally present and entitled to vote at the meeting.

CALLS.

54. (a) *Directors may make Calls.*—The Directors may from time to time make such calls as they think fit upon the registered holders of shares in respect of moneys unpaid thereon, and not by the conditions of allotment made payable at fixed times; and each Shareholder shall pay the amount of every call so made on him to the persons and at the times and places appointed by the Directors, provided that two months' notice at least shall be given to the Shareholders of the time and place appointed for payment of each call.

(b) *Calls, Time when made.*—A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution authorizing the call was passed at a Board Meeting of the Directors or by resolution in writing in terms of Article 121.

(c) *Extension of Time for Payment of Call.*—The Directors shall have power, in their absolute discretion, to give time to any one or more Shareholder or Shareholders, exclusive of the others, for payment of any call or part thereof on such terms as the Directors may determine. But no Shareholder shall be entitled to any such extension, except as a matter of grace or favour.

55. *Interest on Unpaid Call.*—If the sum payable in respect of any call or instalment is not paid on or before the day appointed for the payment thereof, the holder for the time being of the share in respect of which the call shall have been made, or the instalment shall have been due, shall pay interest for the same at the rate of 9 per centum per annum from the day appointed for the payment thereof to the time of the actual payment, but the Directors may, when they think fit, remit altogether or in part any sum becoming payable for interest under this clause.

56. *Payments in anticipation of Calls.*—The Directors may at their discretion receive from any Shareholder willing to advance the same, and upon such terms as they think fit, all or any part of the amount of his shares beyond the sum actually called up.

BORROWING POWERS.

57. *Power to borrow.*—The Directors shall have power to procure from time to time, in the usual course of business, such temporary advances on the produce in hand, or in the future to be obtained from the Company's estates, as they may find necessary or expedient for the purpose of defraying the expenses of working the Company's estates, or of erecting, maintaining, improving, or extending buildings, machinery, or plantations, or otherwise. Also from time to time, at their discretion, to borrow or raise from the Directors or other persons any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company, but so that the amount at any one time owing in respect of moneys so borrowed or raised shall not, without the sanction of a General Meeting, exceed the sum of Fifty thousand Rupees (Rs. 50,000). With the sanction of a General Meeting, the Directors shall be entitled to borrow such further sum or sums and at such rate of interest as such meeting shall determine. The Directors may, for the purpose of securing the repayment of any such sum or sums of money so borrowed or raised, create and issue any mortgages, debentures, mortgage debentures, debenture stock, bonds, or obligations of the Company, charged upon all or any part of the undertaking, revenue, property, and rights or assets of the Company (both present and future), including uncalled capital or unpaid calls, or give, accept, or endorse on behalf of the Company any promissory notes or bills of exchange. Provided also that before the Directors execute any mortgage, issue any debentures, or create any debenture stock they shall obtain the sanction thereto of the Company in General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, notice of the intention to obtain such sanction at such meeting having been duly given. Any such securities may be issued either at par or at a premium or discount, and may from time to time be cancelled or discharged, varied or exchanged, as the Directors may think fit, and may contain any special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment of shares, or otherwise. Every debenture or other instrument issued by the Company for securing the payment of money may be so framed that the moneys thereby secured shall be assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued. A declaration under the Company's seal contained in or endorsed upon any of the documents mentioned in this Article and subscribed by two or more of the Directors or by one Director and the Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries, to the effect that the Directors have power to borrow the amount which such document may represent, shall be conclusive evidence thereof in all questions between the Company and its creditors, and no such document containing such declaration shall, as regards the creditor, be void on the ground of its being granted in excess of the aforesaid borrowing power, unless it shall be proved that such creditor was aware that it was so granted.

MEETINGS.

58. *First General Meeting.*—The First General Meeting of the Company shall be held at such time, not being more than twelve months after the registration of the Company, and at such place as the Directors may determine.

59. *Subsequent General Meetings.*—Subsequent General Meetings shall be held once in every year at such time and place as may be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting, and if no time or place is prescribed, at such time and place as may be determined by the Directors.

60. *Ordinary and Extraordinary General Meetings.*—The General Meetings mentioned in the two last preceding clauses shall be called Ordinary General Meetings ; all other meetings of the Company shall be called Extraordinary General Meetings.

61. *Extraordinary General Meetings.*—The Directors may, whenever they think fit, call an Extraordinary General Meeting, and the Directors shall do so upon a requisition made in writing by not less than one-seventh of the number of Shareholders holding not less than one-seventh of the issued capital and entitled to vote.

62. *Requisition of Shareholders to state Object of Meeting ; on Receipt of Requisition Directors to call Meeting, and in default Shareholders may do so.*—Any requisition so made shall express the object of the meeting proposed to be called, shall be addressed to the Directors, and shall be sent to the registered office of the Company. Upon the receipt of such requisition the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such time and place as they shall determine. If they do not proceed to convene the same within seven days from the delivery of the requisition, the requisitionists may themselves convene an Extraordinary General Meeting, to be held at such place and at such time as the Shareholders convening the meeting may themselves fix.

63. *Notice of Resolution.*—Any Shareholder may, on giving not less than ten days' previous notice of any resolution, submit the same to a meeting. Such notice shall be given by leaving a copy of the resolution at the registered office of the Company.

64. *Seven Days' notice of Meeting to be given.*—Seven days' notice at least of every General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, and by whomsoever convened, specifying the place, date, hour of meeting, and the objects and business of the meeting, shall be given either by advertisement in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*, or by notice sent by post, or otherwise served as hereinafter provided, but an accidental omission to give such notice to any Shareholder shall not invalidate the proceedings at any General Meeting.

65. *Business requiring and not requiring Notification.*—Every Ordinary General Meeting shall be competent, without special notice having been given of the purposes for which it is convened or of the business to be transacted thereat, to receive and discuss any report and any accounts presented thereto by the Directors, and to pass resolutions in approval or disapproval thereof, and to declare dividends, and to elect Directors and Auditors retiring in rotation, and to fix the remuneration of the Auditors ; and shall also be competent to enter upon, discuss, and transact any business whatever of which special mention shall have been made in the notice or notices upon which the meeting was convened.

66. *Notice of other Business to be given.*—With the exceptions mentioned in the foregoing Articles as to the business which may be transacted at Ordinary General Meetings without notice, no General Meeting, Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be competent to enter upon, discuss, or transact any business which has not been specially mentioned in the notice or notices upon which it was convened.

67. *Quorum to be Present.*—No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting, except the declaration of a dividend recommended by a report of the Directors or the election of a Chairman, unless there shall be present in person at the commencement of the business three or more persons being Shareholders entitled to vote or persons holding proxies or powers of attorney from Shareholders entitled to vote.

68. *If a quorum not present, Meeting to be dissolved or adjourned ; adjourned Meeting to transact Business.*—If at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the required number of persons shall not be present at the meeting, the meeting, if convened by or upon the requisition of Shareholders, shall be dissolved, but in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week at the same time and place ; and if at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present, those Shareholders who are present shall be a quorum and may transact the business for which the meeting was called.

69. *Chairman of Directors or a Director to be Chairman of General Meeting ; in case of their absence or refusal a Shareholder may act.*—The Chairman (if any) of the Directors shall be entitled to take the Chair at every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary ; but if there be no Chairman, or if at any meeting he shall not be present within 15 minutes after the time appointed for holding such meeting, or if he shall refuse to take the chair, the Shareholders shall choose another Director as Chairman ; and if no Directors be present, or if all the Directors present decline to take the chair, then the Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman.

70. *Business confined to election of Chairman while Chair vacant.*—No business shall be discussed at any General Meeting, except the election of a Chairman, whilst the chair is vacant.

71. *Chairman with consent may adjourn Meeting.*—The Chairman, with the consent of the meeting, may adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place, unless due notice shall be given.

72. *Minutes of General Meetings.*—Minutes of the proceedings of every General Meeting, whether Ordinary or Extraordinary, shall be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall when so entered be signed as soon as practicable by the Chairman of the same meeting, or by the Chairman of the succeeding meeting, and the same when so entered and signed shall be evidence of all such proceedings and of the proper election of the Chairman.

VOTING AT MEETINGS.

73. *Votes.*—At any meeting every resolution shall be decided by the votes of the Shareholders present. In case there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman at such meeting shall be entitled to give a casting vote in addition to the votes to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder and proxy and attorney ; and unless a poll be immediately demanded in writing by some Shareholder present at the meeting and entitled to vote, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the Minute Book of the Company, shall be sufficient evidence of the fact without proof of the number of votes recorded in favour of or against such resolution.

74. *Poll.*—If a poll be duly demanded, the same shall be taken in such manner and at such time and place as the Chairman shall direct, and the result of the poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded. The demand of a poll shall not prevent the continuance of a meeting for the transaction of any business other than the question on which a poll has been demanded.

75. *Poll how taken.*—If at any meeting a poll be demanded by notice in writing signed by some Shareholder present at the meeting and entitled to vote, which notice shall be delivered during the meeting to the Chairman, the meeting shall, if necessary, be adjourned and the poll shall be taken at such time and in such a manner as the Chairman shall direct, and in such case every Shareholder shall have the number of votes to which he may be entitled as hereinafter provided, and in case at any such poll there shall be an equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting at which such poll shall have been demanded shall be entitled to a casting vote in addition to any votes to which he may be entitled as a Shareholder and proxy and attorney, and the result of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company in such meeting.

76. *No Poll on Election of Chairman or on Question of Adjournment.*—No poll shall be demanded on the election of a Chairman of the meeting or on any question of adjournment.

77. *Number of Votes to which Shareholder entitled.*—On a show of hands every Shareholder present in person shall have one vote only. In case of a poll every Shareholder present in person or by proxy or attorney shall have one vote for every share held by him up to ten shares ; he shall have an additional vote for every ten shares held by him beyond the first ten shares up to one hundred shares ; an additional vote for every twenty-five shares beyond the first one hundred shares. When voting on a resolution involving the winding up of the Company, every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him.

78. *Curator of Minor, &c., when not entitled to Vote.*—The parent or curator of a minor Shareholder, the committee or other legal guardian of any lunatic Shareholder, the husband of any female Shareholder not entitled to her shares as separate estate, and the executor or administrator of any deceased Shareholder, or any one of such persons as aforesaid, if more than one, shall not be entitled to vote in the place of such minor, lunatic, female, or deceased person, unless such person shall have been registered as a Shareholder.

79. *Voting in Person or by Proxy or Attorney.*—Votes may be given either personally or by proxy or by attorney duly authorized.

80. *Non-Shareholder not to be appointed Proxy; but Attorney, though not Shareholder, may Vote.*—No person shall be appointed a proxy who is not a Shareholder of the Company, but the attorney of a Shareholder, even though not himself a Shareholder of the Company, may represent and vote for his principal at any meeting of the Company.

81. *Shareholder in arrear or not registered at least three months previous to the Meeting not to Vote.*—No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote or speak at any General Meeting unless all calls due from him on his shares, or any of them, shall have been paid; and no Shareholder other than the trustee or assignee of a bankrupt or representative of a deceased Shareholder, or person acquiring by marriage, shall be entitled to vote or speak at any meeting held after the expiration of three months from the registration of the Company, in respect of or as the holder of any share which he has acquired by transfer, unless he has been at least three months previously to the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote or speak, duly registered as the holder of the share in respect of which he claims to vote or speak.

82. *Proxy to be printed or in writing.*—The instrument appointing a proxy shall be printed or written and shall be signed by the appointer, or if such appointer be a corporation, it shall be under the common seal of such corporation.

83. *When Proxy to be deposited.*—The instrument appointing a proxy shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than twenty-four hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting at which the person named in such instrument proposes to vote.

84. *Form of Proxy.*—Any instrument appointing a proxy may be in the following form:—

I, _____, of _____, appoint _____, of _____ (a Shareholder in the Company), as my proxy, to represent me and to vote for me and on my behalf at the Ordinary (or Extraordinary, as the case may be) General Meeting of the Company to be held on the _____ day of _____, One thousand nine hundred and _____, and at any adjournment thereof, and at every poll which may be taken in consequence thereof.

As witness my hand this _____ day of _____, One thousand Nine hundred and _____.

85. *Objection to validity of Vote to be made at the Meeting or Poll.*—No objection shall be made to the validity of any vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney), except at the meeting or poll at which such vote shall be tendered; and every vote (whether given personally or by proxy or by attorney) to which no objection shall be made at such meeting or poll shall be deemed valid for all purposes of such meeting or poll whatsoever.

86. *No Shareholder to be prevented from Voting by being personally interested in result.*—No Shareholder shall be prevented from voting by reason of his being personally interested in the result of the voting.

DIRECTORS.

87. *Number of Directors.*—The number of Directors shall never be less than two nor more than five. In the event of the number of Directors in Ceylon ever being reduced to one, such remaining Director shall immediately cause to be convened an Extraordinary General Meeting of the Shareholders for the purpose of filling up one or more of the vacancies; but, in the event of a quorum of Shareholders not attending such meeting, the remaining Director shall himself appoint a Director to fill one of the vacancies. Any Director so appointed shall hold office until the next Ordinary General Meeting of the Company. Until such appointment the remaining Director shall not act except for the purpose of appointing another, and if necessary enabling him to be placed on the Register of Shareholders.

88. *Their Qualification and Remuneration.*—The qualification of a Director shall be his holding shares in the Company, whether fully paid up or partly paid up, of the total nominal value of at least Five hundred Rupees (Rs. 500) and upon which, in the case of partly paid up shares, all calls for the time being shall have been paid, and this qualification shall apply as well to the first Directors as to all future Directors. As remuneration for their services the Directors shall be entitled to appropriate a sum not exceeding One thousand Five hundred Rupees (Rs. 1,500) annually, to be divided between them in such manner as they may determine, but the Company in General Meeting may at any time alter the amount of such remuneration for the future, and such remuneration shall not be considered as including any remuneration for special or extra services hereinafter referred to nor any extra remuneration to the managing Directors of the Company.

89. *Appointment of First Directors and duration of their Office.*—The first Directors shall be Graham Mackintosh Smit of Caledonia Estate, Lindula; Cosmo Moray Gordon of Colombo; and James John Park of Colombo; who shall hold office till the First Ordinary General Meeting of the Company, when they shall all retire, but shall be eligible for re-election.

90. *Directors may appoint Managing Director or Directors; His or Their Remuneration.*—One or more of the Directors may be appointed by the Directors to act as Secretary, Managing Director or Managing Directors, and (or) Visiting Agent or Visiting Agents of the Company, or Superintendent or Superintendents of any of the Company's estates, for such time and on such terms as the Directors may determine or fix by agreement with the person or persons appointed to the office; and they may from time to time revoke such appointment and appoint another or other Secretary, Managing Director or Managing Directors, and (or) Visiting Agent or Agents, Superintendent or Superintendents; and the Directors may impose and confer on the Managing Director or Managing Directors all or any duties and powers that might be imposed or conferred on any Manager of the Company. If any Director shall be called upon to perform any extra services, the Directors may arrange with such Director for such special remuneration for such services, either by way of salary, commission, or the payment of a lump sum of money, as they shall think fit.

91. *Appointment of Successors to Directors.*—The General Meeting at which Directors retire or ought to retire by rotation shall appoint successors to them, and in default thereof such successors may be appointed at a subsequent General Meeting. No person, not being a retiring Director, shall, unless recommended by the Directors for election, be eligible for election to the office of Directors at any General Meeting, unless he or some other Shareholder intending to propose him has, at least seven clear days before the meeting, left at the Office, a notice in writing under his hand signifying his candidature for the appointment or the intention of such Shareholder to propose him.

92. *Board may fill up Vacancies.*—The Board shall have power at any time and from time to time before the First Ordinary General Meeting to supply any vacancies in their number arising from death, resignation, or otherwise.

93. *Duration of Office of Director appointed to Vacancy.*—Any casual vacancy occurring in the number of the Directors subsequently to the First Ordinary General Meeting may be filled up by the Directors, but any person so chosen shall retain his office so long only as the vacating Director would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred.

94. *To retire annually.*—At the Second Ordinary General Meeting and at the Ordinary General Meeting in every subsequent year one of the Directors for the time being shall retire from office as provided in clause 95.

95. *Retiring Directors how determined.*—The Directors to retire from office at the Second, Third, and Fourth General Meetings shall, unless the Directors otherwise arrange among themselves, be determined by ballot; in every subsequent year the Directors to retire shall be those who have been longest in office.

96. *Retiring Directors eligible for re-election.*—Retiring Directors shall be eligible for re-election.

97. *Decision of Question as to Retirement.*—In case any question shall arise as to which of the Directors who have been the same time in office shall retire, the same shall be decided by the Directors by ballot.

98. *Number of Directors how increased or reduced.*—The Directors, subject to the approval of a General Meeting may from time to time at any time subsequent to the Second Ordinary General Meeting increase or reduce the number of Directors, and may also, subject to the like approval, determine in what rotation such increased or reduced number is to go out of office.

99. *If Election not made, retiring Directors to continue until next Meeting.*—If at any meeting at which an election of a Director ought to take place the place of a retiring Director is not filled up, the retiring Director may continue in office until the First Ordinary General Meeting in the next year, and so on from meeting to meeting until his place is filled up, unless it shall be determined at such meeting to reduce the number of Directors.

100. *Resignation of Directors.*—A Director may at any time give notice in writing of his intention to resign by delivering such notice to the Secretary, or by leaving the same at the office, or by tendering his written resignation at a meeting of the Directors.

101. No contract, arrangement, or transaction entered into by or on behalf of the Company with any Director, or with any company or co-partnership of which a Director is a partner, or of which he is a Director, Managing Director, or Manager shall be void or voidable, nor shall such Director be liable to account to the Company for any profit realized by such contract, arrangement, or transaction, by reason only of such Director holding that office, or of the fiduciary relation thereby established, provided that the fact of his interest or connection therewith be fully disclosed to the Company or its Directors.

102. *When office of Directors to be vacated.*—The office of Director shall be vacated—

- (a) If he accepts or holds any office or place of profit other than Managing Director, Visiting Agent, Superintendent, or Secretary under the Company.
- (b) If he becomes bankrupt or insolvent, or suspends payment, or files a petition for the liquidation of his affairs, or compounds with his creditors.
- (c) If by reason of mental or bodily infirmity he becomes incapable of acting.
- (d) If he ceases to hold the required number of shares to qualify him for the office.
- (e) If he is concerned or participates in the profits of any contract with or work done for the Company.

Exceptions.—But the above rule shall be subject to the following exceptions:—That no Director shall vacate his office by reason of his being a member of any corporation, company, or firm which has entered into any contract with or done any work for the Company of which he is a Director, or by his being agent, or secretary, or proctor, or by his being a member of a firm who are agents, or secretaries or proctors of the Company; nevertheless, he shall not vote in respect of any contract work or business in which he may be personally interested.

103. *How Directors removed and Successors appointed.*—The Company may, by an extraordinary resolution, remove any Director before the expiration of his period of office, and may, by an ordinary resolution, appoint another person in his stead. The Director so appointed shall hold office only during such time as the Director in whose place he is appointed would have held the same if he had not been removed.

104. *Indemnity to Directors and Others for their own Acts and for the Acts of Others.*—Every Director or officer, and his heirs, executors, and administrators, shall be indemnified by the Company from all losses and expenses incurred by him respectively in or about the discharge of his respective duties, except such as happen from his respective wilful acts or defaults; and no Director or officer, nor the heirs, executors, or administrators of any Director or officer, shall be liable for any other Director or officer, or for joining in any receipt or other acts of conformity, or for any loss or expense happening to the Company by the insufficiency or deficiency of title to any property acquired for or on behalf of the Company, or for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security in or upon which any of the moneys of the Company shall be invested, or for any loss or damage arising from the bankruptcy, insolvency, or tortious act of any person with whom any moneys, securities, or effects shall be deposited, or for any other loss, damage, or misfortune whatsoever which shall happen in the execution of the duties of his office or in relation thereto, unless the same happen through his own wilful act or default.

105. *No Contribution to be required from Directors beyond Amount, if any, unpaid on their Shares.*—No contribution shall be required from any present or past Director or Manager exceeding the amount, if any, unpaid on the shares in respect of which he is liable as a present or past Shareholder.

POWERS OF DIRECTORS.

106. The Directors shall have power to purchase or otherwise acquire the said Albion and Caledonia Estates.

107. *To Manage Business of Company and Pay Preliminary Expenses, &c.*—The business of the Company shall be managed by the Directors either by themselves or through a Managing Director or with the assistance of an Agent or Agents and Secretary or Secretaries of the Company to be appointed by the Directors for such a period and on such terms as they shall determine, and the Directors may pay out of the funds of the Company all costs and expenses, as well preliminary as otherwise, paid or incurred in and about the formation and the registration of the Company, and in connection with the placing of the shares of the Company and in and about the valuation, purchase, or acquisition of the said Albion and Caledonia Estates, and the purchase, lease, or acquisition of any other lands, estates, or property, and the opening, clearing, planting, and cultivation thereof, and in or about the working and business of the Company.

108. *To acquire Property, to appoint Officers, and pay Expenses.*—The Directors shall have power to purchase, take on lease, or in exchange, or otherwise acquire for the Company any estate or estates, land or lands, property, rights, options, or privileges which the Company is authorized to acquire at such price and for such consideration and upon such title and generally on such terms and conditions as they may think fit; and to make, and they may make, such regulations for the management of the business and property of the Company as they may from time to time think proper, and for that purpose may appoint such managers, agents, secretaries, treasurers, accountants, and other officers, visiting agents, inspectors, superintendents, clerks, artisans, labourers, and other servants for such period or periods and with such remuneration and at such salaries and upon such terms and conditions as they may consider advisable, and may pay the expenses occasioned thereby out of the funds of the Company, and may from time to time remove or suspend all or any of the managers, agents, secretaries, treasurers, accountants and other officers, visiting agents, inspectors, superintendents, clerks, artisans, labourers, and other servants, for such reasons as they may think proper and without assigning any cause.

109. *To appoint Proctors and Attorneys.*—The Directors shall have power to appoint a proctor or proctors, solicitor or solicitors, attorney or attorneys to assist in carrying on or protecting the business of the Company, on such terms as they may consider proper, and from time to time to revoke such appointment.

110. *To open Banking Accounts and operate thereon, &c.*—The Directors shall have power to open on behalf of the Company any account or accounts with such bank or banks as they may select or appoint, and also by such signatures as they may appoint to draw, accept, make, endorse, sign, and execute cheques, bills of exchange, and promissory notes, bills of lading, receipts, contracts, and agreements, bonds, mortgages, proxies to any proctor or proctors, and other documents on behalf of and to further the interests of the Company.

111. *To sell and dispose of Company's Property, &c.*—It shall be lawful for the Directors, if authorized so to do by a special resolution of the Shareholders in General Meeting, to arrange terms for the amalgamation of the Company with any other company or companies, or individual or individuals, or for the sale or disposal of the business, estates, lands, and effects of the Company, or any part or parts, share or shares thereof, respectively, or the assignment of the whole or any part or parts of its leasehold interests in any estate or estates, land or lands, or the sub-lease of the whole or any part or parts thereof to any company or companies, or person or persons, upon such terms and in such manner as the Directors shall think fit, and the Directors shall have power to do all such things as may be necessary for carrying such amalgamation, sale, or other disposition into effect so far as a resolution or special resolution of the Company is not by law necessary for such purpose; and in case any terms so arranged by the Directors include or make necessary the dissolution of the Company, the Company shall be dissolved to that end.

112. *General Powers.*—The Directors shall carry on the business of the Company in such manner as they may think most expedient; and in addition to the powers and authorities by the Ordinance or by these presents expressly conferred on them, they may exercise all such powers, give all such consents, make all such arrangements, appoint all such agents, managers, secretaries, treasurers, accountants, and other officers, clerks, assistants, artizans, and workers, and generally do all such acts and things as are or shall be by the Ordinance and by these presents directed and authorized to be exercised, given, made, or done by the Company, and are not by the Ordinance or by these presents required to be exercised or done by the Company in General Meeting, subject, nevertheless, to the provisions of the Ordinance and of these presents and to such regulations and provisions (if any) as may from time to time be prescribed by the Company in General Meeting; but no regulation made by the Company in General Meeting shall invalidate any prior act of the Board which would have been valid if such regulation had not been made. The generality of the powers conferred by any clause in these presents on the Directors shall not be taken to be limited by any clause conferring any special or expressed power.

113. *Special Powers.*—In furtherance and not in limitation of, and without prejudice to, the general powers conferred or implied in the last preceding clause, and of the other powers conferred by these presents, it is hereby expressly declared that the Directors shall have the powers following (that is to say):—

- (1) To institute, conduct, defend, compound, or abandon any action, suit, prosecution, or legal proceedings by and against the Company or its officers, or otherwise concerning the affairs of the Company, and also to compound and allow time for payment or satisfaction of any debts due and of any claims and demands by and against the Company.
- (2) To refer any claims or demands by or against the Company to arbitration, and observe and perform the awards.
- (3) To make and give receipts, releases, and other discharges for money payable to the Company and for claims and demands of the Company.
- (4) To act on behalf of the Company in all matters relating to bankrupts and insolvents, with power to accept the office of trustee, assignee, liquidator, inspector, or any similar office.
- (5) To invest any of the moneys of the Company, which the Directors may consider not immediately required for the purposes thereof, upon such securities and in such manner as they may think fit, and so that they shall not be restricted to such securities as are permissible to trustees, without special powers, and from time to time to vary or release such investments.
- (6) From time to time to provide for the management of the affairs of the Company abroad in such manner as they think fit, and to establish any local boards or agencies for managing any of the affairs of the Company abroad, and to appoint any persons to be members of such local board or any managers or agents and to fix their remuneration.
- (7) From time to time and at any time to delegate to any one or more of the Directors of the Company for the time being or any other person or company for the time being, residing or carrying on business in Ceylon or elsewhere, all or any of the powers hereby made exerciseable by the Directors, except those relating to shares and any others as to which special provisions inconsistent with such delegation are herein contained; and they shall have power to fix the remuneration of and at any time to remove such Director or other person or company and to annul or vary any such delegation. They shall not, however, be entitled to delegate any powers of borrowing or charging the property of the Company to any Agent of the Company or other person, except by instrument in writing, which shall specifically state the extent to which such powers may be used by the person or persons to whom they are so delegated, and compliance therewith shall be a condition precedent to the exercise of these powers.

PROCEEDINGS OF DIRECTORS.

114. *Meetings of Directors.*—The Directors may meet for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings as they may think fit, and determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business; until otherwise determined, two Directors shall be a quorum.

115. *A Director may summon Meetings of Directors.*—A Director may at any time summon a meeting of Directors.

116. *Who is to preside at Meetings of Board.*—The Board may elect a Chairman of their meetings and determine the period for which he is to hold office, and all meetings of the Directors shall be presided over by the Chairman, if one has been elected and if present, but if there be a vacancy in the office of Chairman, or if at any meeting of Directors the Chairman be not present at the time appointed for holding the same, then and in that case the Directors present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of such meeting.

117. *Questions at Meetings how decided.*—Any question which shall arise at any meeting of the Directors shall be decided by a majority of votes, and in case of an equality of votes the Chairman thereof shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a Director.

118. *Board may appoint Committees.*—The Board may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such member or members of their body as the Board think fit, and they may from time to time revoke and discharge any such committee, either wholly or in part, and either as to persons or purposes, but every committee so formed shall, in exercise of the powers delegated to it, conform to all such regulations as may be prescribed by the Board. All acts done by any such committee, in conformity with such regulations and in the fulfilment of the purposes of their appointment, but not otherwise, shall have the like force and effect as if done by the Board.

119. *Acts of Board or Committee valid notwithstanding informal Appointment.*—The acts of the Board or of any committee appointed by the Board shall, notwithstanding any vacancy in the Board or committee, or defect in the appointment of any Director or of any member of the committee, be as valid as if no such vacancy or defect had existed, and as if every person had been duly appointed, provided the same be done before the discovery of the defect.

120. *Regulation of Proceedings of Committees.*—The meetings and proceedings of such committees shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of Directors, so far as the same are applicable thereto and are not superseded by the express terms of the appointment of such committee respectively, or any regulation imposed by the Board.

121. *Resolution in writing by all the Directors as valid as if passed at a Meeting of Directors.*—A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors for the time being resident in Ceylon shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted, provided that not fewer than two Directors shall sign it.

122. *Minutes of Proceedings of the Company and the Directors to be recorded.*—The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in books to be provided for the purpose of the following matters, *videlicet* :—

- (a) Of all appointments of officers and committees made by the Directors.
- (b) Of the names of the Directors present at each meeting of the Directors and of the members of the committee appointed by the Board present at each meeting of the committee.
- (c) Of the resolutions and proceedings of all General Meetings.
- (d) Of the resolutions and proceedings of all meetings of the Directors and of the committees appointed by the Board.
- (e) Of all orders made by the Directors.
- (f) Of the use of the Company's seal.

123. *Signature of Minutes of Proceedings and Effect thereof.*—All such minutes shall be signed by the person or one of the persons who shall have presided as Chairman at the General Meeting, the Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting at which the business minuted shall have been transacted; or by the person or one of the persons who shall preside as Chairman at the next ensuing General Meeting, Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively; and all minutes purporting to have been signed by any Chairman of any General Meeting, Board Meeting, or Committee Meeting, respectively, shall, for all purposes whatsoever, be *prima facie* evidence of the actual and regular passing of the resolutions, and the actual and regular transaction or occurrence of the proceedings and other matters purporting to be so recorded and of the regularity of the meeting at which the same shall appear to have taken place, and of the Chairmanship and signature of the person appearing to have signed as Chairman, and of the date on which such Meeting was held.

COMPANY'S SEAL.

124. *The Use of the Seal.*—The Seal of the Company shall not be used or affixed to any deed, certificate of shares, or other instrument, except in the presence of two or more of the Directors or of one Director and the Agents and Secretaries of the Company, who shall attest the sealing thereof; such attestation on the part of the Agents and Secretaries, in the event of a firm being the Agents and Secretaries, being signified by a partner or duly authorized manager, attorney, or agent of the said firm signing the firm name or the firm name *per procuracionem* or signing for and on behalf of the said firm as such Agents and Secretaries, and in the event of a company registered under the Ordinance being the Agents and Secretaries, being signified by a Director or the Secretary or the duly authorized Attorney of such company signing for and on behalf of such company as Agents and Secretaries. The sealing shall not be attested by one person in the dual capacity of Director and representative of the Agents and Secretaries.

ACCOUNTS.

125. *What Accounts to be kept.*—The Agent or Secretary or the Agents or Secretaries for the time being, or, if there be no Agent or Secretary or Agents or Secretaries, the Directors, shall cause true accounts to be kept of the paid-up capital for the time being of the Company, and of all sums of money received and expended by the Company, and of the matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place, and of the assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company, and generally of all its commercial, financial, and other affairs, transactions, and engagements, and of all other matters necessary for showing the true financial state and condition of the Company; and the accounts shall be kept in such books and in such a manner at the registered office of the Company as the Directors think fit.

126. *Accounts how and when open to Inspection.*—The Directors shall from time to time determine whether, and to what extent, and at what times and places, and under what conditions or regulations, the accounts and books of the Company or of any of them shall be open to the inspection of the Shareholders; and no Shareholder shall have any right of inspecting any account or book or document of the Company, except as conferred by the Ordinance or authorized by the Directors or by a resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

127. *Statement of Accounts and Balance Sheet to be furnished to General Meeting.*—At the Ordinary General Meeting in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company a statement of the profit and loss account for the preceding financial year, and a balance sheet containing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company made up as at the end of the same period.

128. *Report to accompany Statement.*—Every such statement shall be accompanied by a report as to the state and condition of the Company, and as to the amount which they recommend to be paid out of the profits by way of dividend or bonus to the Shareholders, and the statement, report, and balance sheet shall be signed by the Directors.

129. *Copy of Balance Sheet to be sent to the Shareholders.*—A printed copy of such balance sheet shall, at least seven days previous to such meeting, be delivered at or posted to the registered address of every Shareholder.

DIVIDENDS, BONUS, AND RESERVE FUND.

130. *Declaration of Dividend.*—The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, from time to time, declare a dividend to be paid, and (or) pay a bonus to the Shareholders in proportion to the amounts paid on their shares, but no dividend or bonus shall be payable except out of nett profits.

(a) Any General Meeting may direct payment of any dividend declared at such meeting or of any interim dividends which may subsequently be declared by the Directors, wholly or in part in sterling by means of drafts or cheques on London, or by the distribution of specific assets and in particular of paid up shares, debentures, or debenture stock of the Company, or of any other Company, or in any other form of specie, or in any one or more of such ways, and the Directors shall give effect to such direction; and where any difficulty arises in regard to the distribution, they may settle the same as they think expedient, and in particular may issue fractional certificates, and may fix the value for distribution of such specific assets, or any part thereof, and may determine that cash payments shall be made to any Shareholder upon the footing of the value so fixed, in order to adjust the rights of all parties.

131. *Interim Dividend.*—The Directors may also, if they think fit, from time to time and at any time, without the sanction of a General Meeting, determine on and declare an interim dividend to be paid, and (or) pay a bonus to the Shareholders on account and in anticipation of the dividend for the then current year.

132. *Reserve Fund.*—Previously to the Directors paying or recommending any dividend on preference or ordinary shares, they may set aside out of the profits of the Company such a sum as they think proper as a reserve fund, and may invest the same in such securities as they shall think fit, or place the same on fixed deposit in any bank or banks.

133. *Application thereof.*—The Directors may from time to time apply such portions as they think fit of the reserve fund to meet contingencies, or for the payment of accumulated dividends due on preference shares or for equalizing dividends, or for working the business of the Company, or for repairing or maintaining or extending the buildings and premises, or for the repair or renewal or extensions of the property or plant connected with the business of the Company, or any part thereof, or for any other purpose of the Company which they may from time to time deem expedient.

134. *Unpaid Interest or Dividend not to bear Interest.*—No unpaid interest or dividend or bonus shall ever bear interest against the Company.

135. *No Shareholder to receive Dividend while Debt due to Company.*—No Shareholder shall be entitled to receive payment of any dividend or bonus in respect of his share or shares whilst any moneys may be due or owing from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company in respect of such share or shares, or otherwise howsoever.

136. *Directors may deduct Debt from the Dividends.*—The Directors may deduct from the dividend or bonus payable to any Shareholder all sums of money due from him (whether alone or jointly with any other person) to the Company, and notwithstanding such sums shall not be payable until after the date when such dividend is payable.

137. *Dividends may be paid by Cheque or Warrant and sent through the Post.*—Unless otherwise directed any dividend may be paid by cheque or warrant sent through the post to the registered address of the Shareholder entitled, or, in the case of joint-holders, to the registered address of that one whose name stands first on the register in respect of the joint-holding; but the Company shall not be liable or responsible for the loss of any such cheque or dividend warrant sent through the post.

138. *Notice of Dividend; Forfeiture of unclaimed Dividend.*—Notice of all dividends or bonuses to become payable shall be given to each Shareholder entitled thereto; and all dividends or bonuses unclaimed by any Shareholder for three years after notice thereof is given may be forfeited by a resolution of the Board of Directors for the benefit of the Company, and, if the Directors think fit, may be applied in augmentation of the reserve fund. For the purposes of this clause any cheques or warrants which may be issued for dividends or bonuses and may not be presented at the Company's Bankers for payment within three years shall rank as unclaimed dividends.

139. *Shares held by a Firm.*—Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by a firm may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any partner of such firm or agent duly authorized to sign the name of the firm.

140. *Joint-holders other than a Firm.*—Every dividend or bonus payable in respect of any share held by several persons jointly, other than a firm, may be paid to, and an effectual receipt given by, any one of such persons.

AUDIT.

141. *Accounts to be audited.*—The accounts of the Company shall from time to time be examined, and the correctness of the balance sheet and profit and loss account ascertained by one or more auditor or auditors.

142. *Qualification of Auditors.*—No person shall be eligible as an auditor who is interested otherwise than as a Shareholder in any transaction of the Company, but an auditor shall not be debarred from acting as a professional accountant in doing any special work for the Company which the Directors may deem necessary. It shall not be a necessary qualification for an auditor that he be a Shareholder of the Company, and no Director or officer of the Company shall, during his continuance in office, be eligible as an auditor.

143. *Appointment and Retirement of Auditors.*—The Directors shall appoint the first auditor or auditors of the Company and fix his or their remuneration; all future auditors, except as is hereinafter mentioned, shall be appointed at the first Ordinary General Meeting of the Company in each year by the Shareholders present thereat, and shall hold their office only until the first Ordinary General Meeting after their respective appointments, or until otherwise ordered by a General Meeting.

144. *Retiring Auditors eligible for Re-election.*—Retiring Auditors shall be eligible for re-election.

145. *Remuneration of Auditors.*—The remuneration of the auditors other than the first shall be fixed by the Company in General Meeting, and this remuneration may from time to time be varied by a General Meeting.

146. *Casual Vacancy in Number of Auditors how filled up.*—If any vacancy that may occur in the office of auditor shall not be supplied at any Ordinary General Meeting, or if any casual vacancy shall occur, the Directors shall (subject to the approval of the next Ordinary General Meeting) fill up the vacancy by the appointment of a person who shall hold the office until such meeting.

147. *Duty of Auditor.*—Every Auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet and profit and loss account intended to be laid before the next Ordinary General Meeting, and it shall be his duty to examine the same with the accounts and vouchers relating thereto; and to report thereon to the meeting, generally or specially, as he may think fit.

148. *Company's Accounts to be open to Auditors for Audit.*—All accounts, books, and documents whatsoever of the Company shall at all times be open to the Auditors for the purpose of audit.

NOTICES.

149. *Notice how authenticated.*—Notices from the Company may be authenticated by the signature (printed or written) of the Agent or Secretary, Agents or Secretaries, or other persons appointed by the Board to do so.

150. *Shareholders to register Address.*—Every Shareholder shall furnish the Company with an address in Ceylon, which shall be deemed to be his place of abode, and shall be registered as such in the books of the Company.

If after such payments there shall remain any surplus assets, such surplus assets shall be divided among the ordinary Shareholders in proportion to the capital paid up, or reckoned as paid up on the shares which are held by them respectively at the commencement of the winding up, unless the conditions attached to the preference shares expressly entitle such shares to participate in such surplus assets.

159. *Payment in Specie, and vesting in Trustees.*—If the Company shall be wound up, the liquidator, whether voluntary or official, may, with the sanction of an extraordinary resolution, divide among the contributories in specie any part of the assets of the Company, and may, with their sanction, vest any part of the assets of the Company in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of the contributories as the liquidator, with like sanction, shall think fit.

"The production of certain new food products and to a process for producing the same."

Abstract.—The inventor states that fruit products, such as lemon juice, either alone or mixed with cane sugar cannot be reduced to a dry powder by atomizing into a current of heated air, the product being of a gummy nature, but that he has discovered that fruit products, such as lemon juice, will yield the desired dry powder on atomizing into a current of heated air if a drying promoter consisting of the products of hydrolysis of starch (technical glucose) are added.

The claims are :—

1. The process of producing a fruit product in powdered form, consisting in forming a solution of fruit material and a drying promoter, including a product obtained by the hydrolysis of starch, and then desiccating the solution.
2. In the process claimed in claim 1, the use of glucose as the drying promoter.
3. In the process claimed in claim 2, the use of glucose of high dextrin content.
4. In the process claimed in claims 1, 2, and 3, the use of citrus fruit juice as the fruit material.
5. In the process claimed in claims 1, 2, 3, and 4, effecting the desiccating step by spraying the solution into moisture absorbing air.

"Improvements in or relating to the treatment of tea."

Abstract.—The nature of the invention is described in the claims which are as follows :—

1. A method of separating the stalk from the leaf in tea mills or cutters of the kind having honeycombed rollers or their equivalent and resiliently controlled cutting knives, which consists in initially adjusting the position of the knives relatively to the rollers so as to leave sufficient clearance for the stalk to escape or work its way through the space which is left between the rollers and the knives independently of the cut leaf, for the purpose specified, substantially as described and illustrated.
2. A method of separating the stalk from the leaf in tea mills or cutters of the kind set forth in claim 1, which consists in providing baffles or separators which are located beneath or slightly to one side of the said space, so that the stalks which have worked their way past the knives drop on one side of the said baffles or separators, while the cut or broken leaves located within the cells of the rollers are carried beyond said baffles or separators and fall on the other side of the same, substantially as described and illustrated.
3. Apparatus for separating the stalk from the leaf in tea cutters of the kind having honeycombed rollers and cutting knives, the parts of said apparatus being so constructed or arranged that the stalks are automatically separated from the leaves during the cutting operation, so that the leaves can be delivered free from stalk through a discharge opening in the cutter, substantially as described and illustrated.
4. A tea cutter comprising honeycombed rollers, resiliently mounted cutting knives, adjusting mechanism for controlling the position of the cutting edges of said knives relatively to said rollers, and baffles or separators located substantially beneath the space left between the cutting edges of said knives and said rollers which serve automatically to separate the stalks from the leaves, substantially as described and illustrated.
5. A method of separating the stalk from the leaf in tea mills or cutters of the kind set forth in any of the preceding claims in which supplementary honeycombed rollers, resiliently mounted cutting knives, and baffle plates are provided for the purpose of subjecting to a secondary separating operation that portion of the material which has previously undergone treatment in the main part of the machine, substantially as described and illustrated.
6. Baffle plates or separators for attachment to tea mills or cutters of the kind having honeycombed rollers and cutting knives, said baffle plates or separators serving automatically to separate the stalk from the leaf, substantially as described and illustrated.
7. The herein described and illustrated method of and apparatus for separating the stalk from the leaf during the operation of cutting or milling tea.

"Improvements in driving belts and the like."

Abstract.—The applicant describes an improved belt in which the outer part of the belt is made of a material which resists traction without undergoing undue elongation, and to which are suitably fastened strips of a material having great adhesive powers. Between these strips are longitudinal air passages, and at the points of attachment local depressions are produced which prevent the formation of air pockets and so assist adhesion.

The claims are :—

1. An improved arrangement of driving belt having high adhesion characterized by an external part or traction band of variable thickness and width made of tanned leather, cotton vulcanized cloth, or other material resistant to traction, recessed or cut out on its inner face and over a small part of its thickness, with two or more narrow longitudinal grooves to give it more flexibility in a transverse direction.

2. An improved arrangement of driving belt having high adhesion, in which an inner part is formed by an adhesive material which is slightly supple, like chrome tanned leather or other like rough material, arranged in continuous longitudinal bands of uniform thickness, these bands being arranged with pieces implicated between them, the said bands being separated one from the other by a continuous longitudinal channel placed opposite the grooves in the external part.

3. An improved arrangement of driving belt having high adhesion, in which a coupling of the longitudinal adhesive bands with the external part is obtained from place to place by means of stitching points or rivets or metal fasteners which, by reason of the suppleness of the adhesive material, form a slight local depression opposite each coupling point, the said depressions assisting in the adhesion of this belt to the pulleys by acting as ventilators.

4. A driving belt having outer and inner bands composed of different materials, the outer band of which is composed of one continuous band, the inner band composed of several interspaced bands, the said outer and inner bands being joined together by countersunk rivets capable of forming ventilators for said belt, substantially as described.

5. A driving belt as claimed in claim 4, in which the outer band has longitudinal slots made upon its inner surface, substantially as described.

6. A driving belt as claimed in claim 5, in which the interspaced bands forming the inner surface are mounted longitudinally on the outer band and with the interspacing opposite the slots formed in the outer band, substantially as described.

7. A driving belt as claimed in claims 4, 5, and 6, in which the inner surface is composed of a material of high coefficient of friction, substantially as described.

8. A driving belt as claimed in claims 4, 5, 6, and 7, in which the outer band is composed of a material having a high modulus of elasticity, substantially as described.

“Driving and controlling mechanism for power operated machines.”

Abstract.—The inventor discloses an apparatus in which the act of releasing a treadle separates the friction clutch connecting a high speed motor to the sewing machine, applies a brake to the driven machine and shifts the contact arm of the motor controlling rheostat so as to reduce the speed of the motor: on depressing the treadle, the resistance is cut out, the speed of the motor thereby increasing, and the clutch discs are then pressed together starting the machine.

The claims are :—

1. A sewing machine comprising, in combination, a frame, stitch-forming mechanism incorporated in said frame and including a main-shaft, a driving motor carried by said frame and having a power-shaft extending transversely of said main-shaft, and operative connections including a manually controlled friction-clutch device between said shafts, said clutch device including rotary driving and driven elements, the axes of which are in alignment with the axis of said main-shaft.

2. A sewing machine comprising, in combination, a frame, stitch-forming mechanism incorporated in said frame and including a main-shaft, a driving motor carried by said frame and having a power-shaft extending transversely of said main-shaft, and operative connections between said shafts, said connections including a worm and gear drive and a manually-controlled friction clutch device, including separable driving and driven elements.

3. A sewing machine comprising, in combination, a frame, stitch-forming mechanism incorporated in said frame and including a main-shaft, a self-contained motor unit detachably carried by said frame and including a power-transmitting shaft, a manually-controlled friction-clutch including separable driving and driven elements, a positive driving connection between said power-shaft and driving element, and an operative connection between said driven element and said main-shaft.

4. A sewing machine comprising, in combination, a frame, stitch-forming mechanism incorporated in said frame and including a main-shaft, a driving motor carried by said frame and having a power-shaft disposed transversely of said main-shaft, a manually-controlled friction-clutch including separable driving and driven elements, a positive driving connection between said power-shaft and driving element, and an operative connection between said driven element and said main-shaft.

5. In a sewing machine, in combination, a frame including a bracket-arm, stitch-forming mechanism incorporated in said frame and including a main-shaft journaled lengthwise of said bracket-arm, a motor having a power-shaft journaled to rotate in fixed non-intersecting relation with and transversely of said main-shaft, a manually-controlled friction-clutch device including separable driving and driven elements, and positive driving connections between said power-shaft and driving element and between said driven element and said main-shaft.

6. A sewing machine comprising, in combination, a frame including a bracket-arm, stitch-forming mechanism incorporated in said frame and including a main-shaft journaled lengthwise of said bracket-arm and having an outboard projection, a driving motor having a power-shaft disposed transversely of said main-shaft, and a manually-operable clutch connection between the motor-shaft and the outboard projection of said main-shaft.

7. In a sewing machine, in combination, a frame, stitch-forming mechanism incorporated in said frame and including a main-shaft having an outboard projection, a manually controlled clutch-device including a driven element mounted upon said outboard projection and a driving element disposed between said driven element and the frame of the machine, a motor having a power-shaft disposed transversely of said main shaft and positive driving connections between said power-shaft and driving element.

8. In a sewing machine, in combination, a frame including a bracket-arm, stitch-forming mechanism incorporated in said frame and including a main-shaft journaled lengthwise of said bracket-arm, a motor element having a power-shaft journaled transversely of said main-shaft, a manually-controlled friction clutch-device including relatively movable driving and driven elements arranged axially of said main-shaft, and a worm and gear driving connection between said power-shaft and driving element, said driven element being rotatably connected to said main-shaft.

9. The combination with a machine having a main-shaft to be driven, of a manually-controlled clutch-device including driving and driven elements, said driving element being mounted to turn upon and relatively to said main-shaft, and said driven element being connected with but free to slide axially of said main-shaft, a thrust-bearing between said driving element and the frame of the machine for sustaining the manually-controlled pressure of said driven element against the driving element, and a motor having a power-shaft in positive driving engagement with said driving element, the axis of which power-shaft is displaced from the axis of said main-shaft.

10. The combination with a clutch-device comprising driving and driven elements and treadle-controlled mechanism for establishing and interrupting driving relation between said elements, of an electric motor connected to the driving element, and a motor-controller including a shiftable member connected to said treadle-controlled mechanism, the parts being so constructed and arranged that when the treadle is released the shiftable member is positioned to cause the motor to run at a predetermined low speed and, when the treadle is depressed, to accelerate the motor before driving relation between said driving and driven elements is established.

11. The combination with a clutch-device comprising driving and driven elements and treadle-controlled mechanism for establishing and interrupting driving relation between the said elements, of an electric motor connected to the driving element, and a motor-controller in the form of a rheostat including a plurality of contact-points and a shiftable contact-arm connected to said treadle-controlled mechanism, the parts being so constructed and arranged that when the treadle is released the contact-arm is shifted to include a definite value of resistance in the motor-circuit, thereby causing the latter to run at a predetermined low speed and, when the treadle is depressed, to cut out said resistance before driving relation between said driving and driven elements is established.

12. The combination with a machine to be driven including a frame having an outwardly projecting bearing boss and a main-shaft journaled in and projecting outwardly beyond said bearing boss, of motor-frame supporting means fixed to and embracing said bearing boss, a power-shaft journaled in said motor-frame, a driven clutch-element operatively connected to said main-shaft, a live clutch-element journaled on said main-shaft and operatively connected to said power-shaft, and manually-controlled means for establishing and interrupting driving relation between said clutch-elements.

13. The combination with a machine to be driven including a frame having an outwardly projecting bearing boss and a main-shaft journaled in and projecting outwardly beyond said bearing boss, a motor-frame supporting means fixed to and embracing said bearing boss, a power-shaft journaled in said motor-frame and extending transversely of said main-shaft, a driven clutch-element operatively connected to said main-shaft, a live clutch-element journaled on said main-shaft and operatively connected to said power-shaft, and manually-controlled means for establishing and interrupting driving relation between said clutch-element.

14. The combination with a machine to be driven including a frame having an outwardly projecting bearing boss and a main-shaft journaled in and projecting outwardly beyond said bearing boss, of motor-frame supporting means fixed to and embracing said bearing boss, a power-shaft journaled in said motor-frame, a driven clutch-element operatively connected to said main-shaft, a live clutch-element journaled on said main-shaft, a speed reducing connection between said power-shaft and live clutch-element, and manually-controlled means for establishing and interrupting driving relation between said clutch-elements.

15. In a machine having a shaft to be driven, in combination, a driven element, a driving element out of contact with said driven element, a treadle operated toggle device operating when straightened to establish driving contact between said elements, and electric motor connected to said driving element, and a motor speed regulator connected to the operating means for said toggle device, and timed to accelerate the motor on no load before driving contact between the driving and driven elements is established.

16. A motor attachment for sewing machines comprising a motor frame having an aperture adapted to fit over and be secured to a projecting portion of a sewing machine frame, a power-shaft journaled in said motor-frame transversely of the axis of said aperture, and a driving gear fixed to said motor-shaft and adapted to mesh with a companion gear connected to the main-shaft of the sewing machine.

17. The combination with a machine to be driven including a frame having an outwardly projecting bearing boss and a main-shaft journaled in and projecting outwardly beyond said bearing boss, of motor-frame supporting means fixed to and embracing said bearing boss, a power-shaft journaled in said motor-frame, and an operative connection between the power-shaft and the main-shaft.

18. In a sewing machine, in combination, a frame, stitch-forming mechanism incorporated in said frame and including a main-shaft having an outboard projection, the machine frame including a bearing extension adjacent to the outboard projection of the main-shaft, a driving motor having a frame apertured to receive the bearing extension of the sewing machine frame, and a power-shaft arranged transverse to the axis of said aperture, and operative connections between said power-shaft and said main-shaft.

"Improvements in automobile vehicles."

Abstract.—The nature of the invention is described in the claims which are as follows:—

1. An automobile vehicle wherein the engine, gear box, and driving axle constitute a unitary structure pivotally mounted about a transverse axis upon the vehicle frame, and the engine cylinders (or cylinder) are so arranged that the crank shaft is parallel with the driving axle.

2. An automobile vehicle wherein the engine, gear box, and driving axle constitute a unitary structure pivotally mounted about a transverse axis upon the vehicle frame, and the engine cylinders (or cylinder) are arranged to be the outermost element of the pivoted structure and the pivot axis is located outside the driving axle with respect of the car body.

3. An automobile vehicle wherein the engine, gear box, and driving axle constitute a unitary structure pivotally mounted about a transverse axis upon the vehicle frame, and the engine cylinders (or cylinder) form the outermost element of the pivoted structure, and are so arranged that the crank shaft is parallel with the driving axle and is geared therewith through parallel spur gears.

4. An automobile vehicle wherein the engine, gear box, and driving axle constitute a unitary structure pivotally mounted about a transverse axis upon the vehicle frame, and the engine cylinders (or cylinder) form the outermost element of the pivoted structure, and are arranged horizontally side by side in a transverse row with the cylinder heads outwards, the crank shaft being connected by parallel gears with the driving axle which constitutes the innermost element of the pivoted structure.

5. In the constructions claimed in the preceding claims, mounting the pivoted unitary structure on the vehicle frame so as to be capable of swinging about a longitudinal axis as well as about a transverse axis.

6. In automobile vehicles having engine, gear box and driving axle mounted as a unitary structure on the vehicle frame, the arrangement of gears comprising a pinion freely mounted in a central position on the crank shaft, means for clutching the pinion to the crank shaft, a spur wheel freely mounted on the driving axle in mesh with the pinion, means for clutching the spur wheel to the driving axle directly, and means for driving the said axle from the spur wheel indirectly through gears on a lay shaft, substantially as described.

7. In automobile vehicles, the construction and mounting of two-stroke cycle engines, substantially as herein described with reference to the accompanying drawings.

Training Class for the Surveyor-General's License.

AN examination for admission to the Training Class for the Surveyor-General's License in Surveying and Levelling will be held at the Colombo Observatory on Monday, November 21, 1921, and the following days, commencing at 9 A.M. :—

2. Application to enter for the examination must be made on the prescribed form, which can be obtained from the Surveyor-General.

3. The subjects of the examination are as follows :—

(a) English Composition; (b) Arithmetic; (c) Algebra (up to and including quadratic equations); (d) Geometry (theorems and problems on the following :—Angles at a point, parallel straight lines, side and angle properties of triangles and parallelograms, areas of triangles and quadrilaterals, the chord, angle, and tangent properties of the circle, the properties of the right-angled triangle); (e) Plane Trigonometry (up to and including the solution of triangles); (f) Mensuration (elementary, of areas and solids); (g) Plan Drawing.

In order to qualify for admission to the class, candidates must obtain not less than 40 marks per cent. in each subject and 50 marks per cent. in aggregate.

Marks will be deducted for bad handwriting.

4. The number of students admitted to the class is limited to ten.

5. The fee for the course is Rs. 150, payable in advance; in addition, a deposit of Rs. 100 must be made on admission, to be returned to the student at the end of the course, less the estimated value of any damage he may have done to instruments or other property of Government.

Conditions for Registration of Medical Students.

IT is hereby notified for general information that from and after January 1, 1923, all those who desire to be registered as medical students of the Ceylon Medical College must produce evidence that they have attained the age of 17

years and that they have passed the Matriculation Examination of a University in Great Britain or have been exempted therefrom.

Before registration as a medical student every applicant must, in addition to the above, pass an examination in Elementary Chemistry and Elementary Physics, conducted or recognized by a Licensing Body. This requirement will be fulfilled by candidates taking up the Medical Entrance Examination, and all candidates for the Medical Entrance Examination of August, 1923, will be required to take up the following subjects, viz. :—English, Mathematics, Elementary Chemistry and Elementary Physics. The Medical Entrance Examination also serves a further purpose of providing candidates with an order of merit as vacancies for admission to the College will be filled according to the order of merit obtained by candidates at the Medical Entrance Examination.

The Cambridge Senior School Certificate with credit in English and Mathematics will be accepted only up to December, 1922. After that date it will not be accepted unless that examination is passed in a form acceptable for University Matriculation in Arts or Pure Science in Great Britain. In the case of Senior School Certificates which fulfil the requirements for Matriculation in any University of Great Britain, every applicant must produce evidence that he or she has been duly exempted from Matriculation of that University. A mere statement from the Principals of Colleges to this effect will not be accepted.

In order that there may be no misunderstanding, it is further notified that the examination in Elementary Chemistry and Elementary Physics mentioned above must be taken *in addition to* the Matriculation Examination in General Education. The latter must be complete in itself without reference to the examination in Elementary Chemistry and Elementary Physics.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on August 20, 1921, at 8-30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated August 16, 1921.

Present :—Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle; Mr. G. E. de Silva; Dr. C. de Vos; Mr. A. Vallipuram; Dr. G. P. Hay; and Mr. P. M. Bingham.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on July 16, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statements of receipts and disbursements from close of 1920 to July 31, 1921, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for July.
- (d) Statements of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of July.
- (e) The reservoir readings for July.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during July.

4. Correspondence :—

(1) Letter No. 28 of July 18, 1921, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, nominating Mr. P. M. Bingham to be a Member of the Municipal Council to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. H. F. Tomalin.—Read.

(2) Letter No. 30 of August 8, 1921, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, sanctioning the payment of a gratuity of Rs. 280 to the widow and four children of the late P. E. Perera, slaughter-house keeper, Municipal Council, Kandy.—Read.

(3) Letter No. 31 of August 8, 1921, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary forwarding copy of despatch to the Secretary of State for the Colonies on the subject of the proposed tax on the capital value of lands uncovered by buildings.—Read.

(4) Endorsement No. 13 of August 13, 1921, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, asking that the measures of Municipal Reform, which the Municipal Council of Kandy would advocate, be stated specifically and in detail.—It was agreed that Dr. Attygalle, who brought the matter up before the Council, be asked to submit his proposals first for consideration, and that a Special Committee be then appointed to deal with the matter.

(5) Letter No. 1,556 of August 3, 1921, from the Superintendent of Census, sanctioning the payment of Rs. 175 to the Census supervisors and noting the excellent work done by Mr. D. J. Abeysinghe, the chief supervisor.—Resolved that the Council do place on record its appreciation of the services of the officers of the Municipal Council in connection with the Census.

(6) Letter of August 6, 1921, from the President, Young Women's Christian Association, forwarding copy of annual report of the Association for 1920 in connection with the application for the annual grant of Rs. 100 from the Municipal Council.—Resolved that the terms on which the vote was sanctioned be pointed out to the President, Young Women's Christian Association, and that she be informed that the Council regrets its inability to make a grant for this year, as the conditions do not appear to have been fulfilled.

(7) Letter of August 12, 1921, from the Honorary Secretary, Kandy District Nurse Association, applying for a grant towards the District Nurse Fund.—Resolved that the application be considered with the Budget for next year.

Dr. Hay left the meeting at this stage.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. de Silva asked—(1) With reference to the replies given in Council, and also the report of the Superintendent of Works, is the Chairman satisfied with the work done regarding the playground at Mahaiyawa? (2) Has the Chairman inspected the place? (3) What is the work actually done, and the amount expended for the same? (4) Will the Chairman table for the information of members all connected papers on the subject?

The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) In view of the terms of the estimate sanctioned by the Council for this work, my reply is in the affirmative. I beg to point out that according to the estimate, the filling is to be effected by dumping ash from the incinerator. I understand that all available ash has been used for filling this ground. If the playground is to be filled otherwise than by dumping ash, a supplementary estimate of some Rs. 2,000 will be required. (2) Yes; (3) 81·80 cubes earthwork in cutting channel to divert the stream, Rs. 102·93; 11·85 cubes dry rubble masonry, Rs. 286·66; trees cut and ground cleared, Rs. 16·50; cost of 12 feet jumper steel, Rs. 19·50. Total Rs. 425·59; (4) Certainly.

6. The following motion which stood in the name of Mr. de Silva was, with the leave of the Council, withdrawn :—“That immediate steps be taken to complete the playground at Mahaiyawa, and that a visit of inspection be made by the members to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the work done so far.”

7. The following motion which stood in the name of Dr. Attygalle was, with the leave of Council, withdrawn :—“That this Council do contribute the sum of Rs. 500 per annum as grant in aid of the District Nurse Association under section 45 j of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910.”

8. Pursuant to notice, Dr. Attygalle was to have moved the following :—“In view of the abnormal increase in rents of houses in the town of Kandy, that, this Council do request the Government to introduce legislation on the lines of the Rents Restriction Act of 1920, whereby rents would be kept within reasonable limits by the introduction of a ‘Standard Rent.’”

On the Chairman's suggestion, he moved the following amendment, with the leave of the Council :—“In view of the abnormal increase in rents of houses in the town of Kandy, that, prior to asking Government to introduce legislation on the lines of Rents Restriction Act of 1920, a Special Committee of this Council be appointed to submit a report on the necessity or otherwise for such legislation.” Dr. de Vos seconded.

Mr. de Silva left the meeting at this stage.

Messrs. Ratwatte, Pieris, and Vallipuram spoke against the motion.

The resolution was put to the meeting and carried by 4 to 3.

Ayes :—Dr. Attygalle, Dr. de Vos, Mr. Bingham, and the Chairman. *Noes* :—Mr. Ratwatte, Mr. Pieris, and Mr. Vallipuram.

The following Special Committee was appointed :—Messrs. Ratwatte, Pieris, Bingham, Dr. Attygalle, and the Chairman.

9. Pursuant to notice, Dr. Attygalle moved.—“That estimates be called for for the improvement of the Victoria esplanade and Market frontage, and the same be included among the new works in the forthcoming Budget.” Mr. Ratwatte seconded.—Carried.

10. To read Rs. 180 for Rs. 150 in resolution 8 (13) of June 18, 1921, sanctioning estimate for a platform to place the captured German gun.—Resolved that Rs. 180 be substituted for Rs. 150 in resolution 8 (13) of June 18, 1921. It was also agreed that Mr. Bingham be asked to report on placing the gun on a site near the market, instead of on the esplanade.

11. Recommendations of Standing Committees:—

Law and General Subjects.

(1) That the ticket of occupancy given in favour of T. V. Upanis, in respect of the land required for the proposed Infectious Diseases Hospital, be cancelled, and the land leased on the same terms to Medumma Banda, Gangawatta Korala.

Finance and Assessment.

(2) That the payment of Rs. 36·93, cost of survey of land to be acquired for model tenements, be sanctioned.

(3) That a vote of Rs. 125 be taken for payment of rent of telephone installed at the office of the Superintendent of Works.

(4) That the following sums be written off as irrecoverable, as recommended by the Colonial Auditor:—(i.) Rs. 288·50, conservancy charges from December, 1919, to December, 1920; (ii.) Rs. 2,949·71, excess water charges from 4th quarter, 1915, to 1st quarter, 1920.

Municipal Works.

(5) That the following estimate be passed:—Re-erecting the outhouses of Roseneath bungalow, Rs. 500.

(6) That a sum of Rs. 35 be contributed towards repairing the culvert at the back of Lake bungalow in Victoria Drive.

(7) That the ticket of occupancy, in respect of encroachment opposite 213 B and C, Katugastota road, be cancelled as the encroachment has been removed.

(8) That the following application for water service be allowed on usual terms:—No. 172, Peradeniya road, D. S. Weerapuli.—Resolved that the recommendations be adopted.

12. Draft rules for the Central Town Free Library, Kandy, as revised and approved by the Council's lawyer and by the Standing Committee on Law.—Resolved that the rules be passed.

13. Draft lease of encroachment in Castle Hill street to Messrs. Miller & Co.—Resolved that the draft lease be approved.
