NOTIFICATIONS.

Order No. 91 made by the Food Controller under Regulation 1 of "The Defence of the Colony Regulations, 1919."

IN this order, unless the context otherwise requires—

- "Estate" means any estate on which labourers registered under Ordinance No. 13 of 1889 are employed.
- "Manager" includes any person in actual charge of any estate.
- "Controller" means such person as may from time to time be appointed by the Governor to be Controller of Estate Supplies.

2. Every manager shall on or before July 31, 1921, send in a return addressed to the Controller of Estate Supplies at Colombo showing—

- (1) The stock of rice within his possession or under his control on June 30, 1921.
- (2) The number of labourers on the estate on June 30, 1921.

3. No manager shall, after the commencement of this order, purchase, or otherwise obtain, or take delivery of any controlled rice unless he has obtained a license in writing under the hand of the Controller to purchase rice, and no such manager shall purchase, or otherwise obtain, or take delivery of any greater quantity of rice than that mentioned in such license.

4. (1) Any manager desiring to purchase rice shall apply to the Controller, on such forms as may from time to time be approved by the Controller, for such license as aforesaid.

(2) The Controller may in his discretion—

- (a) Issue such license to the applicant; or
- (b) Refuse to issue such license; or
- (c) Issue such license for a quantity less than that applied for.

5. From and after the commencement of this order no manager shall issue or allow to be issued more than half a bushel of rice per head per mensem for all employees resident on the estate and mentioned in the form of monthly return given in the schedule below, excluding all children under four years of age.

6. Every manager shall on or before August 5, 1921, and thereafter on or before the fifth day of each succeeding month, send to the Controller a return in respect of the month immediately preceding such monthly date showing—

- (a) The stock of rice within his possession or under his control on the last day of such last-mentioned month.
- (b) The amount of any rice bought by him during such month.
- (c) The number of men, women, and children over four years of age respectively to whom he has issued rice or caused or allowed the same to be issued during such month.
- (d) The number of labourers on the estate on the last day of such month.
- (e) The total amount of rice issued or caused to be issued by him during such month.

7. This order shall commence and come into operation on July 30, 1921.

Order No. 92 made by the Food Controller under Regulation 1 of "The Defence of the Colony Regulations, 1919."

From and after the date of commencement of this order no rice of the kinds shown in the attached schedule shall be sold or offered for sale at the Chalmers Granaries at a price exceeding that shown in the schedule in respect of each kind of rice.

2. Every bag so sold shall be a measured bag containing the number of bushels specified in the attached schedule.

3. The scheduled prices shall include delivery into railway wagons within the premises of the Granaries or into carts at the doors of the Granaries' stores. The rice merchants shall be entitled to charge 5 cents per bag over and above the controlled prices if they are required to deliver consignments at the Maradana or Kelani Valley Goods Sheds.

4. A rebate of 12 cents a bag shall be allowed by the rice merchants for all cash payments.

5. This order shall commence and come into operation from August 1, 1921, and shall be in force up to and including September 15, 1921.

Order No. 94 made by the Food Controller under Regulation 1 of "The Defence of the Colony Regulations, 1919."

1. (a) When the maximum prices of any foodstuffs have been fixed by the Food Controller or by a Deputy Food Controller, for the area within his jurisdiction, all dealers in such foodstuffs shall keep prominently exhibited for public information outside their stores, godowns, shops, or other places of sale a board showing clearly the prices of all such foodstuffs stocked by them.

(b) In the case of foodstuffs divided into grades for which different prices have been fixed by the Food Controller, or a Deputy Food Controller, the board shall show separately the prices of each grade of such foodstuff stocked by the dealer.

(c) The prices so shown shall in no case exceed the maximum prices fixed by the Food Controller or the Deputy Food Controller.

2. This order shall commence and come into operation on July 30, 1921.
