WHEREAS by section 5 of “The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910,” the Governor in Executive Council is empowered by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to alter the number and limits of the divisions of any Municipal town :

And whereas by a Proclamation dated November 9, 1911, and amended by Proclamation dated November 4, 1920, made under the provisions of the said section of the said Ordinance, the limits of the Municipal town of Colombo, and the divisions into which the said town was divided were respectively defined for the purposes of the said Ordinance, and it is expedient to alter the limits of the different divisions of the said town :

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon in Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by the said section of the said Ordinance, do hereby alter the limits of the divisions of the said Municipal town of Colombo, described in the schedule attached to the said Proclamations, by substituting therefor the limits of the different divisions set forth in the schedule hereto.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Seventh day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty-one.

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

No. 1.—Fort Ward.

North by the Harbour.

East by the canal leading from the Harbour to the lake, the spill canal, the lake as far as Bridge street, and a portion of the Church road.

South by the Church road, Galle Face Drive, and in a straight line westward to the sea.

West by the sea.

No. 2.—Pettah Ward.

North by the Harbour.

South by New Moorstreet, Dam street, and Kayman's gate.

West by a line along the centre of the St. John's street to the Harbour and along the Harbour.

No. 5.—Kotahena Ward.

North by Kelani-ganga.

East by Kelani-ganga, by and including the San Sebastian canal, the Weragoda-ela, and a line going south in prolongation of the eastern boundary of the North and South Baseline road.

South by New Urugodawatta road, Grandpass road, Layard's Broadway, Barber street, Green street, and a line along the centre of Jampettah street to the Harbour.

West by the Harbour and the sea.

No. 6.—New Bazaar Ward.

North by Barber street, Layard's Broadway, and Grandpass road.

East by New Urugodawatta road.

South by San Sebastian canal.

West by San Sebastian hill, Hulftsdorp, and Kuruwe street.

No. 7.—Maradana Ward.

North by the canal basin, San Sebastian canal, and the New Urugodawatta road.

East by the eastern limit of North and South Baseline road and Dematagoda-ela and Kinda-ela as far as Cotta road.

South by Cotta road, Ward place up to Kynsey road, Kynsey road up to Norris canal road, Norris canal road up to Regent street, Regent street and Union place up to Darley road.

West by Darley road up the northern boundary of New park, and along this boundary to the lake along the lake and the canal basin.

No. 8.—Slave Island Ward.

North by the spill canal and the lake.

East by the lake, northern boundary of the New park, Darley road, and Union place.

South by Turret road.

West by Hunupitiya Cross road up to Alston place, Alston place, and the lake.

(This division includes within it the lake.)

No. 9.—Kollupitiya Ward.

North by a straight line drawn westwards along the centre of Galle Face Drive to the sea, Church road, Bridge street, the lake as far as Alston place, Alston place up to Hunupitiya Cross road, Hunupitiya Cross road, Turret road, Regent street up to Norris canal road, Norris canal road up to Kynsey road, Kynsey road up to Ward place, Ward place and Cotta road up to its junction with East and West Baseline road.

SIR,—I HAVE the honour to inform you that I have recently been in communication with the Army Council on the subject of the status of officers on retirement from the Colonial Volunteer Forces, and that His Majesty the King has been pleased to approve of the privilege of wearing uniform, granted to *ex*-officers of Dominion Forces and Colonial Volunteers under local conditions, which is now effective only within local limits, being extended to cover the wearing of uniform on special occasions at home and elsewhere throughout His Majesty's dominions.

2. His Majesty has also been pleased to approve that the privilege of retaining rank by such officers should be extended to be effective throughout His Majesty's dominions.

3. These privileges will be limited to an officer who held a commission between the 5th of August, 1914, and the date of the termination of the war—midnight of 31st August as notified to you in my telegram of 16th August.

4. Military officers in this country who have relinquished their commissions and who have been permitted to retain their rank, also officers who have been demobilized or disembodied, are permitted to wear uniform on special occasions when attending ceremonies and entertainments of a military nature, and on occasions when the wearing of uniform would appear appropriate, and this limitation should be observed in respect of officers of the Colonial Volunteer Forces who have relinquished their commissions and have been permitted to retain their rank under due authority by notification in the local *Gazette*.

5. The uniform should be restricted to service dress, and should be that of the unit or of the general list to which the officer belonged when he relinquished his commission or was demobilized. The badges of rank should be those of the rank he held when demobilized or that retained by him when he quitted the service.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 8, 1921.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 180 (3 Europeans, 14 Burghers, 110 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 22 Moors, 4 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the Census population on March 18, 1921, viz., 244,182) was 38.4, as against 39.1 in the preceding week, 24.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 147 (2 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 70 Sinhalese, 32 Tamils, 28 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 31.4, as against 26.7 in the previous week, 23.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 147 total deaths, 43 were of infants under one year of age, as against 24 in the preceding week, 29 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Fifteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 8 in Maradana (including 5 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Kollupitiya and Wellawatta, as against 13 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama hospital from *Phthisis* during the week.

2. (a) Twelve deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 6 in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 each in Kotahena and New Bazaar, and 1 each in St. Paul's and Wellawatta, as against 5 in the previous week and 20 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Five deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in St. Paul's and 1 each in Slave Island and Kollupitiya, same as in the previous week. The weekly average for last year was 6.

(c) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 in St. Paul's and 1 each in Pettah, Kotahena, and Wellawatta, as against 1 in the previous week.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), as against 7 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

4. Seventeen deaths were registered from *Debility*, 15 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 7 from *Diarrhoea*, 4 from *Dysentery*, 3 each from *Enteritis* and *Worms*, 2 from *Tetanus*, 1 from *Chickenpox*, and 54 from *Other Causes*.

5. Fourteen cases of *Chickenpox*, 7 of *Enteric Fever*, and 2 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 13, 11, and 2, respectively, of the preceding week. There were no cases of *Measles* reported during the week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82° 3', against 82° 0' in the preceding week and 79° 9' in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.928 in., against 29.987 in. in the preceding week and 29.952 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. AN auction sale of the under-mentioned satinwood will be held at the Central Timber Depot, Kew road, Slave Island, Colombo, on Saturday, November 5, 1921, at 11 A.M., subject to the following conditions:—

1. The timber will be put up in lots to suit buyers at a rate per cubic foot, and no advance of less than 25 cents per cubic foot will be accepted.

2. The highest bid will be accepted, subject to the approval or disapproval of the Conservator of Forests. The highest bidder will be required by the officer conducting the sale to sign the sale book kept for the purpose directly a lot has been knocked down to him.

3. Payment of 25 per cent. of the successful bid to be made at time of sale, if so required.

4. Depot measurements must be accepted, but previous to date of auction any prospective bidder is at liberty to check the measurements recorded in the notice and to represent any differences promptly.

5. No timber shall be removed before payment of the full price bid, and all timber sold must be removed from the depot within ten days of date of notification of acceptance by the Conservator of Forests of such bid and will be at the risk of the purchasers until removed.

6. Should any person to whom a lot is knocked down refuse to take it over at the full price bid or refuse or fail to sign the sale book and pay 25 per cent. of his bid when so required, or refuse or fail to pay the full purchase amount or balance thereof, as the case may be, and to remove the timber within the time specified in clause 5 above, the lot will again be put up for auction, and the original purchaser or bidder will be held liable for any loss to Government owing to a lower price being realized at the re-sale, while, if an enhanced price is realized at such re-sale, he shall, however, have no claim to the profit which shall accrue to Government.

7. Flowered logs, if not so advertised, shall be excluded from the lots advertised in the list, and shall be put up separately, at the discretion of the Assistant Conservator of Forests, after consulting the wishes of prospective purchasers.

8. Agents bidding for others will be required to produce a written authority from the firm or person for whom they bid, such authority will be retained by the Assistant Conservator of Forests, and will hold good only at the particular sale at which it is produced.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, September 6, 1921, at 3 p.m.

THE Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice dated August 30, 1921.

Present :—Mr. B. G. de Glanville, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; Major A. W. de Wilton; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; the Hon. Mr. Arthur Alvis; the Hon. Mr. H. L. De Mel, C.B.E.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford; Mr. W. C. S. Ingles; the Hon. Mr. Harold Creasy; Mr. E. W. Jayewardene; Mr. R. L. Pereira; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; Mr. T. H. Tatham; and Mr. J. S. Collett.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of August 2, 1921, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.—Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of August 2, 1921, be confirmed.

2. The Chairman read the following :—Since the last Meeting of Council, 2 fatal cases of bubonic plague have been recorded, making a total of 7 cases during the last four months, and a grand total of 160 cases since the beginning of the year. The corresponding grand total during 1920, was 80 cases.

Rat Plague.—Three cases of rat plague have been recorded, making a total for the year up to date of 51, as against 92 during the corresponding period of last year. Four new hand Claytons and a miniature hand Clayton arrived from England and were put into action during August, thus bringing the total number of available machines up to 6 petrol and 5 hand machines. A special plague staff of 1 Inspector, 5 overseers, and 5 coolies were engaged during August, bringing the total plague staff up to 1 Inspector, 6 overseers, 8 masons, and 36 coolies.

3. (1) Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando presented a petition from the Reverend Brother Director of St. Benedict's College asking that a sufficient area of land out of Municipal land in Mansergh avenue be leased to him for the use of the College as cricket and football grounds, and moved that the petition be accepted and be referred to the Works Committee for disposal. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

(2) Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando presented a petition from K. J. Perera, a contractor, praying for certain relief.

(3) Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando presented a petition from the Secretary, Motor Car Runners' Union, asking that the Council do license motor car runners in Colombo on payment of a fee, and moved that it be accepted and referred to the Finance Committee. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.—Carried.

4. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo asked the Chairman what is the cost of the Chairman's car? What is the average monthly cost to the Council of its upkeep and running expenses?

The Chairman replied as follows :—The original cost of the present car was Rs. 7,000. The average monthly expenditure on upkeep, &c., during the last two years is Rs. 342.91 per month, inclusive of pay of driver, insurance, and all repairs and running expenses.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando asked the Chairman the following questions, and the Chairman replied *seriatim* :—

Q. Has a report been received from the Acting Government Analyst, Mr. W. N. Rae, on the state of pollution existing in the lake and canal?

A. The Acting Government Analyst sent me on July 14 last copy of a report made by him on the examination of the Colombo Harbour water.

Q. Does the report attribute the high state of pollution existing in the Lockgate section of the canal to the tipping dépôt built on the bank?

A. So far as I am aware, there is no tipping dépôt built on the bank either of the San Sebastian canal or of the canal between the lake and the harbour.

Q. What reference has been made to the sewer which discharges itself into the canal and its contribution to the pollution of the harbour?

A. It is not clear to which canal this question refers. There is no sewer discharging into either canal. Reference is made to drains discharging into the canal between the lake and harbour on the east side north of Norris road bridge, and it is shown that at certain times the pollution near the point of discharge of these drains is higher than elsewhere in the lake and harbour.

Q. What action does the Chairman intend to take on the report?

A. The report was placed before the Standing Committees on Works and Finance, who are considering the question of the San Sebastian canal. It was not considered that any action was called for at present.

6. (1) Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that no newspaper cuttings representing the opinions of the editors or of correspondents to such newspapers regarding any matter concerning this Council be allowed to go into any of the Council's files. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded *pro forma*.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, Mr. E. W. Jayewardene, and Mr. C. P. Dias opposed the motion.

The Hon. Mr. H. L. De Mel moved, as an amendment, that the proposal contained in the motion be referred to the Chairman for consideration and disposal. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo accepted the amendment and withdrew his motion. The amendment was put to the Meeting and carried.

(2) Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that a return showing the names, ages, and dates of first appointments, present status, and salary of all officers of the Council over the age of 55 be submitted to the Council, with reasons, if any, of their retention in service beyond the limits prescribed by regulations. The Hon. Mr. H. L. De Mel seconded.

Mr. E. W. Jayewardene moved, as an amendment, that the matter be referred to the Chairman for disposal. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

The Chairman pointed out that the motion, which he was prepared to accept, was for a return which he had had prepared and would lay on the table. The amendment was withdrawn.

The motion was then put to the Meeting and carried.

It was decided that the return should be circulated to Members of Council.

(3) Dr. W. P. Rodrigo had given notice of the following motion :—That in the opinion of this Council the ruling of the Chairman on the point of order raised by the Member for Colpetty Ward at the last Meeting of Council, viz. : that the motion proposed by the Member for New Bazaar Ward, No. 9 in the Agenda, was in order, although the matter covered by the motion had been dealt with recently by the Council is not correct, and is not in keeping with the rules and regulations of other respectable deliberative institutions, nor in keeping with the traditions of this Council.

The Hon. Mr. Arthur Alvis rose to a point of order and asked for a ruling of the Chairman as to whether the motion was in order, as the ruling of the Chairman on a point of order was final and could not be questioned.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo replied as to the point of order raised.

The Chairman stated that this motion was to the effect that a ruling given by the Chairman at the last Meeting of the Council was incorrect. Under by-law 2 of Chapter II. of the by-laws of this Council, it is provided that the Chairman shall decide all points of order. The Chairman is the sole judge of points of order and his decision on a point of order is final. When such decision has been given any discussion by Council is, therefore, clearly out of order. He therefore ruled this motion out of order.

(4) Dr. W. P. Rodrigo had given notice of the following motion:—That in view of the following facts, in particular, viz.: (a) That the motion proposed by the Member for New Bazaar Ward at the last Meeting of Council, No. 9 in the Agenda was not in order, in that it contravened rules and regulations of all decent debate; (b) that the question of pension rights of Mr. C. L. Cox, the late City Sanitation Engineer of this Council, had been decided against Mr. Cox at two Meetings prior to the last; (c) that the granting of pension rights to Mr. Cox establishes a precedent mischievous in principle and detrimental to the interests of this Council; and (d) that the pension rules of the Council do not permit the grant of such privilege, this Council rescinds resolution No. 9 in the Agenda of the last Meeting, and declines to approve of the acceptance by Mr. C. L. Cox, late City Sanitation Engineer, of the post of Deputy Director of Public Works in Nigeria, and do not recognize his retention of a claim to ultimate pension in respect of his service under the Municipal Council.

The Chairman stated that clause (a) of this motion contains a statement that a motion moved at the last Meeting of Council "was not in order, in that it contravened rules and regulations of all decent debate." For the reasons given in his ruling with regard to the previous motion such a statement made with reference to a motion ruled by the Chairman to be in order was not permissible. He, therefore, ruled that this motion as it stands is out of order.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved for the leave of Council to put the motion eliminating clause (a).

On the question being put, the leave was refused by Council.

(6) Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that the papers in connection with the supply of granite setts and road metal to this Council for the past 10 years be tabled for the benefit of Members. The Hon. Mr. H. L. De Mel seconded.—Carried.

(7) Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that all papers in connection with the metalling of that portion of the roads within 18 inches of the outer rails along the tram routes by the Council, instead of by the Tramway Company, be tabled.

With the leave of Council Dr. W. P. Rodrigo added the following words:—"And that arrangements be made in future with the Tramway Company for the Council to do the work and charge the Company the cost." Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

The Chairman moved, as an amendment, that the matter be referred to the Works Committee for consideration. The Hon. Mr. H. L. De Mel seconded.

The amendment was put to the Meeting and carried.

7. (1) Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando moved that a return be made of the number of properties sold in Kotahena North for arrears of rates during the last five years, the amount of arrears in each case at the time of sale and the total amount now outstanding. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

The Chairman explained that Kotahena is divided for purposes of assessment into two divisions, A and B.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando said that what he wanted was a return for the Mutwal area of Kotahena, and promised to let the Chairman know what the exact boundaries were of the area referred to.

The motion was put to the Meeting and carried.

(2) Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando moved that a return be made of the number of properties sold for non-payment of taxes in Kotahena North during the last five years and surveyed by Council, the total amount of survey fees due to Council on such properties, and the total amount recovered up to date. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

The Chairman stated that he was entirely in sympathy with the object with which these two motions were brought forward, but that the return required would take time and involve a good deal of clerical labour. The motion was put to the Meeting and carried.

8. To consider the report of the Special Committee re reservation of special areas. (*vide* Annexure B.)

The Hon. Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that the report of the Special Committee be adopted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

9. To submit, in terms of section 102 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Chairman's Administration Report for the financial year 1920.

The Hon. Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that, in terms of section 102 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Chairman's Administration Report for the financial year 1920 be submitted in due course to His Excellency the Governor. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 10 to 15 (inclusive) on the Agenda. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.—Carried.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Special and the Standing Committees named were then laid before the Council in Committee:—

Extract from the Minutes of the Special Committee on Drainage Works of July 25, 1921.

(3) To consider letter No. 87 of June 9, 1921, from Mr. J. M. Blizard, who assumed duties as Acting Resident Engineer, Colombo Drainage Works, from June 9, 1921, asking that he may be granted the same allowances as drawn by Mr. C. L. Cox, the payments to be met from Drainage Works funds:—(1) Additional remuneration, Rs. 333 per mensem; (2) Travelling allowance, Rs. 75 per mensem (no travelling allowance to be drawn while the official car is used).—Recommended that for the time during which Mr. Blizard performs the duties of the Resident Engineer, Colombo Drainage Works, he should be paid from Drainage Works funds a sum of Rs. 333 per mensem and a travelling allowance of Rs. 75 per mensem (no travelling allowance to be drawn while the official car is used).

Resolution of Council of August 2, 1921.

With regard to item No. 3, (corresponding to item No. 19 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of June 28, 1921), Dr. E. V. Ratnam moved that the consideration of the matter be deferred, and that the papers be circulated. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando seconded.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved, as an amendment, that Mr. J. M. Blizard be paid the sum and allowance as recommended by the Committees, till the matter is decided, the papers being circulated meanwhile, and the matter to be brought up for decision at the next Meeting of Council. Lt.-Col. S. Boylan Smith seconded.—Carried.

Resolution.

The papers having been circulated, in compliance with the resolution of Council of August 2, 1921, the matter was submitted for consideration.

Resolved that the recommendation of the Special Committee be adopted.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of August 29, 1921.

(3) To consider the charges framed against Mr. U. W. Herft, Veterinary Inspector, by the Veterinary Surgeon, and the explanation of Mr. Herft. After considering the charges framed against Mr. U. W. Herft and his reply thereto, the

Committee are of opinion that he has clearly been guilty of grave dishonesty and neglect of his duties, and therefore consider that it is inadvisable to retain him in the Council's service.—Recommended that he be dismissed as from the date of his suspension.

(4) To consider the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health, with regard to the application for five weeks' sick leave from Miss G. Ebert, Matron, Enteric Hospital, that he be granted authority to appoint a nurse temporarily on Rs. 52 per month. (Provision of Rs. 32 per month is included in the Budget, the difference of Rs. 20 has to be provided.)—Recommended. (Nurse to be employed pending sanction of Council.)

(5) To consider letter No. 412 of August 23, 1921, from the Medical Officer of Health recommending that Government be asked to adopt legislation with a view to the destruction of mosquitoes.—Recommended that Government be asked to introduce legislation similar to that introduced in the Gold Coast Colony in 1911.

(7) To consider an application from Mrs. W. Paton, Health Visitor, St. Paul's Dispensary, for one month's leave, commencing from September 5, to be spent in India.—Recommended.

Resolutions.

With regard to item No. 3 (corresponding to item No. 16 of the extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of August 30, 1921), Mr. R. L. Pereira moved that the consideration of the matter be deferred to the next Meeting, and that in the meanwhile the papers be circulated. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of August 30, 1921.

(4) To consider an application from the Mercantile Cricket Association: (a) For the transfer to them of the lease of the Y. M. C. A. Cricket ground in Victoria Park; (b) for permission to erect a small pavilion, subject to the position and plans being approved by the Chairman, Municipal Council; (c) for the removal of certain trees; (d) for the alteration of certain drains; (e) for the planting of certain small portions of hedges.—Recommended, except that the erection of a pavilion should not be allowed, and that the occupation and use of this land by the applicants should not be to the exclusion of others.

(5) To consider an amended plan, No. 1,840, dated August 5, 1921, signed by Mr. N. M. Ingram, the Works Engineer with regard to street lines for Laurie's road.—Recommended.

(6) To recommend street lines for the following streets in Wellawatta between the Galle road and the sea to be declared "Minor streets," as per plan No. 1,844, dated August 24, 1921, signed by Mr. N. M. Ingram, the Works Engineer.—(1) Moor's lane; (2) Nelson Place; (3) a street which has no name and is marked "AA" in the plan.—Recommended.

Resolutions.

With regard to item No. 4, Mr. T. H. Tatham moved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted with the omission of the words "the erection of a pavilion should not be allowed and that." Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando seconded.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved, as an amendment, that the matter be referred to the Law Committee for consideration of the legal questions involved. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.

The amendment was put to the Meeting and carried.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items be adopted.

Chairman, Municipal Council, and Mayor of Colombo.

ANNEXURE A.

By-laws re Taxi-Cabs.

(Framed under Section 22 (1) of Ordinance No. 4 of 1916.)

1. *Chairman.*—In these by-laws (a) the word "Chairman" means the Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo.

(b) *Taxi-cab.*—The word "Taxi-cab" means a motor car of weight not exceeding 40 cwt. unloaded, fitted with a taximeter or other approved mechanical device for automatically and visibly registering on each occasion the fare to be charged according to the rates for distance or time or a combination of distance and time.

2. No motor car or other mechanically-propelled vehicle other than a taxi-cab shall ply for hire in the streets or from any public stand within the limits of the Municipality of Colombo.

3. No taxi-cab shall ply for hire at any place within the limits of the Municipality of Colombo unless and until the same shall have been registered as a taxi-cab, and unless and until a license to that effect shall have been granted by the Chairman.

4. On the registration of a motor car as a taxi-cab, a license shall be granted by the Chairman in the form given in Appendix I. to these by-laws.

5. *Taximeter.*—Every taximeter shall be fitted with an indicator or handle in the form of a flag, on which shall be printed the words "For Hire." The taximeter shall be so constructed that when the indicator is vertical the taximeter shall be out of action. Such indicator shall be so placed as to be clearly visible to any person outside of or in front of the vehicle, and to the hirer when inside.

6. *Use of its Indicator.*—The placing of the indicator in a vertical position is subject to the proviso in by-law 10 an intimation that the vehicle is available for hire, and no driver shall, without reasonable excuse, refuse to accept a fare when the indicator is in a vertical position.

7. *Table of Fares.*—In every taxi-cab there shall be available for the inspection of the hirer a list of rates, and the fare charged for the hire of the taxi-cab shall not exceed the maximum fare calculated according to the scale of the rates applicable as set out in Appendix IV.

8. *Painting.*—It shall be lawful for the Chairman at any time to require that any taxi-cab or group of taxi-cabs shall be painted any particular colour or colours either previous to or after registration, and also to prescribe that any taxi-cab or group of taxi-cabs shall carry some particular distinguishing mark, badge, design, or figure. Any licensee of a taxi-cab who shall paint his taxi-cab a colour other than that assigned to his taxi-cab, or who shall make use of any particular mark, badge, design or figure prescribed for the use of any other taxi-cab or group of taxi-cabs, shall be deemed to have committed an offence punishable under these by-laws.

9. The driver of every taxi-cab shall, as soon as he is hired and no sooner, set the taximeter in motion, and upon the termination of the hiring shall immediately stop the same. If he neglect or fail to do so, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this by-law. But if a taxi-cab is called from a garage or a stand to take up a passenger at any place less than 500 yards from the garage or stand, the taximeter shall not be set in motion until the taxi-cab shall arrive at such place and be ready to take up the passenger. Provided that in the event of a taxi-cab whilst under hire being unable to proceed owing to any mechanical derangement or tyre failure, either temporary or otherwise, the driver shall at once stop the mechanism of the taximeter as against the hirer and shall not re-start the same until such time as the defect is remedied.

10. Any owner, driver, attendant, or other person who shall, with intent to deceive, tamper with the taximeter or the driving mechanism thereof shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this by-law.

11. *Routes to be followed.*—A driver of a taxi-cab shall, in the absence of reasonable cause to the contrary, proceed to the destination named by the hirer by the shortest and quickest route.

12. *Standing Places.*—The driver of a taxi-cab shall not permit the same to stand for hire in any street otherwise than on a stand licensed for taxi-cabs.

13. (1) *Driving License.*—No person shall drive a taxi-cab or other mechanically-propelled vehicle plying for hire within the limits of the Municipality except under a license granted in that behalf by the Chairman. Such license shall be in force till the end of the year within which the same is issued, and shall be in the form given in Appendix II. of these by-laws, and the conditions therein contained shall be read as part of these by-laws.

13. (2) The license mentioned in the preceding sub-paragraph shall always be carried by the driver on his person, or in the vehicle when the vehicle is in use.

14. *Fitness of Driver.*—An applicant for a driver's license under these by-laws shall not be entitled to receive such license unless he satisfies the Chairman, Colombo Municipal Council, that he is acquainted with the principal places and streets in and around Colombo, that he has a thorough knowledge of the prescribed rates of hire, and that he is in all respects a fit person to be the driver of a taxi-cab or other mechanically-propelled vehicle plying for hire.

15. The license of a driver may be cancelled or suspended or otherwise dealt with by the Chairman for any breach of these by-laws, or of the conditions contained in the license issued to him.

16. (1) *Brakes, &c.*—The brakes shall, as far as possible, be so affixed as to be capable of easy adjustment. At least one brake shall be so made as to be applied by the foot of the driver, and at least one shall act directly upon the road wheels.

16. (2) All brake and steering connections secured with bolts shall have such bolts secured with nuts, the same to be locked or pinned.

17. *Oil and Petrol.*—No oil shall be allowed to drop upon the roadway, and where a tray or undershield is fixed below the mechanism of the car for the purpose of preventing this, or for any other purpose, such tray or undershield shall be so placed or constructed that no petrol from the tank, supply pipe, or carburettor can collect therein.

18. *Situation and Filling of Petrol Tanks.*—Tanks for petrol must be so placed that any overflow shall neither fall on nor soak into cushions, upholstery, or floor mats in or about the body, and the filling nozzle shall be brought to some point outside the body. No petrol shall be poured into the tank whilst the engine is running, or whilst any lamp other than an electric lamp is burning in or on any portion of the car.

19. *Wheels and Tyres.*—Every vehicle licensed under these by-laws shall have at least one driving wheel fitted with an approved means of preventing or limiting side slip, and shall carry at least one spare inflated tyre and rim or other approved device which can, if necessary, be quickly fitted to any wheel. Such tyre shall be carried in such a position that the number plate is not obscured.

20. *Furniture.*—The doors, windows, seats, roofs, springs, wheels, cushions, linings, panels, &c., and all furniture and appointments shall be in proper order and repair, the paint and varnish in good condition, and the inside perfectly clean. The floor shall be covered with a mat of rubber, coir, or other suitable material.

21. *Gas Generator.*—Where acetylene or other gas is used for lighting, the cylinders or vessels which contain the gas or in which it is generated, must be fixed outside in such a position as to minimize the danger of accidental ignition.

22. (a) *Horns.*—No horn or other instrument for producing sound which is operated mechanically or electrically shall be used on any vehicle licensed under these by-laws within the limits of the Colombo Municipality.

22. (b) Every such vehicle shall be provided with a suitable pneumatic horn to be blown by hand.

23. *Advertisements.*—No printed or written matter, other than the sanctioned rates for hire of these by-laws, shall appear on the inside or outside of any vehicle licensed under these by-laws or be carried by way of advertisements, except with the approval of the Chairman, Colombo Municipal Council.

24. *Maintenance.*—Every precaution shall be taken by the owner to see that all parts of the mechanism of the vehicles are periodically inspected and kept in proper working order, and a register shall be kept of such inspections in a convenient form, giving the particulars shown in Appendix III. to these by-laws. This register shall be open at any reasonable time to inspection by the Chairman, Colombo Municipal Council, or any person duly authorized by him in that behalf. Any failure to maintain this register, or to produce it when called for by lawful authority, shall be deemed to be a breach of this by-law.

25. *Number of Passengers.*—A taxi-cab or any other mechanically propelled vehicle plying for hire shall not carry more passengers in the aggregate than the number specified in the license, provided that two children over five and under ten years of age shall be counted as one person, and that children under five years of age held in arms or on the lap shall not be counted.

26. (a) *Inspection of Taxi-cabs.*—At any time, whether before or after the issue of a license, the Chairman may call upon the applicant for a license, or the person to whom a license has been granted, to produce the taxi-cab or other mechanically-propelled vehicle, for the use of which a license has been sought or has been granted, for examination at any given time and place, and/or may direct such applicant or licensee to submit a certificate signed by an examiner, approved by the Chairman, as to whether such taxi-cab or other mechanically-propelled vehicle complies in all respects with the requirements contained in these by-laws.

26. (b) The fee (if any) charged by the examiner shall be paid by such applicant or licensee.

26. (c) Any failure on the part of any person to whom a license has been granted to comply with any direction of the Chairman issued under this by-law shall be deemed to be a contravention of these by-laws.

27. *Breach of By-laws.*—The Chairman may refuse to issue a license for or may withdraw or cancel the license of any taxi-cab or other mechanically-propelled vehicle plying for hire, if at any time, whether before or after the issue of the license, there may be any breach of, or failure to comply with, any of the conditions set forth in these by-laws.

28. *Penalty.*—Any person acting in contravention of these by-laws shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs. 20.

APPENDIX II.

License to drive a Taxi-cab or other Mechanically propelled Vehicle within the Limits of the Town and Suburbs of Colombo.

By virtue of the powers vested in the Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo, by the Taxi-cab, By-laws, this license is granted to _____ to act as driver of any taxi-cab, or other mechanically propelled vehicle licensed to ply for hire, the property of _____, from the date hereof till December 31, 19____, subject to the conditions hereinafter following :—

1. The driver named in this license shall at all times when on duty with a taxi-cab or other mechanically-propelled vehicle licensed to ply for hire, wear in a conspicuous position a metal badge bearing the number of this license to be supplied by the Chairman, Colombo Municipal Council, on payment of a fee Re. 1, such badge to remain the property of the Chairman, Colombo Municipal Council, and to be surrendered if this license is suspended or cancelled for any reason or on the expiry of the same.

2. All changes in the licensee's address shall be at once notified to the Chairman, Colombo Municipal Council, in writing signed by the holder of this license, and quoting the number and date of this license.

3. Neither this license nor the badge referred to shall be transferred or lent to any other person under any circumstances whatever.

4. A fee of Rs. 2.50 shall be paid to the Chairman, Colombo Municipal Council, on the issue of this license. If this license be suspended or cancelled for any breach of the by-laws or the conditions herein contained, a fee of Rs. 2.50 shall be payable before this license is re-issued or a new one granted.

5. Any breach of the by-laws or of the foregoing conditions will entail liability to suspension or cancellation of this license by the Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo, in addition to the punishment for the offence.

APPENDIX IV.

The rate of hire shall be as follows :—

Tariff 1 : Within Municipal limits 50 cents for the first 1,405 yards, and 10 cents for each subsequent 281 yards.

Tariff 2 : Outside Municipal limits 50 cents for the first 1,175 yards, and 10 cents for each subsequent 225 yards.

Tariff 3 : Between 9 P.M. and 6.30 A.M. 50 cents up to and including first 1,175 yards, and 10 cents for each subsequent 225 yards.

Detention : At the rate of Re. 1.80 per hour.

The above rates shall be automatically indicated on the meter.

Extras : (a) For a third passenger an additional 50 cents, and for a fourth passenger an additional 25 cents for the journey shall be paid, irrespective of distance.

(b) If the taxi-cab be discharged outside the Colombo Municipal limits, the passenger shall pay for the return journey up to the Municipal limits only at the rate of 25 cents per mile between 6.30 A.M. and 9 P.M., and at the rate of 35 cents per mile between 9 P.M. and 6.30 A.M.

(c) A charge of 10 cents shall be paid by the passenger for each piece of luggage carried other than hand luggage.

All extras shall be marked up on the meter by the drivers before commencing the journey.

2. The Committee recommends that it should be laid down as a general policy that for the present, at least, existing offensive trades which are already established should not be discontinued, unless there is some special reason for so doing, as, for instance, the creation of an intolerable nuisance, but that in future new licenses for the offensive and dangerous trades specified in schedule A should not be issued in respect of buildings in areas other than those declared to be special areas reserved for such trades.

3. The Committee is of opinion that for the present it is inadvisable to attempt to legislate in detail by means of by-laws as to the class of buildings to be allowed in any particular street or locality, but that it is desirable that by-laws should be introduced giving the power to control the placing of commercial and manufacturing buildings in certain areas, a power which does not at present exist.

4. The Committee recommends the adoption of the following by-laws under section 27 of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915 :—

(1) In any area declared to be a residential area, no building shall be erected or re-erected other than a domestic building (as defined under the Ordinance) a public building or a Municipal building.

(2) In any area declared to be a residential area no domestic building other than a dwelling house, and no range of block of buildings wholly or mainly adapted to be inhabited in tenements by persons of the poorer or labouring classes, shall be erected or re-erected without the special sanction in writing of the Chairman.

(3) No building shall be erected or re-erected for the purposes of any offensive or dangerous trade included in schedule A hereto annexed, except within an area declared to be a special area for the purpose of such trade.

(4) Where, in the definition of the boundaries of any residential area, a street or lane is named as part of such boundaries, the provisions with regard to the erection or re-erection of buildings within such residential area shall apply to any building to be erected or re-erected in such a position that any portion of such building lies within 100 feet of the outer side of such street or lane.

(5) The following are declared to be residential areas:—

"A" *Southern area* bounded as follows: North by Galle Face outlet from the lake to the sea, the lake spill, the western arm of the lake, the main rain-water drain from the lake to Turret road, formerly known as Polwatta ditch, Turret road, up to Dean's road, Dean's road up to De Saram place, De Saram place up to Norris Canal road, Norris Canal road up to Hedges court, Hedges court up to Stafford place, Stafford place up to De Saram place, and De Saram place up to Rockwood place; east by Rockwood place from De Saram place to Regent street, Kynsey road, Kanatta road, and Narahenpitiya road, from Kynsey road up to Kirillapone canal; south by a portion of Kirillapone canal as far as Dehiwala canal, and Dehiwala canal up to the sea; and west by the sea.

"B" *Kotahena* bounded as follows: North by private property assessed as No. 342/353, Alutmawata road, and by a portion of a swamp known as Koraliawala; east by Wasala road up to Wall street and Wall street; south by St. Lucia's street, Kotahena street up to Pickering's road, and Pickering's road up to Santiago street; west by Santiago street and College street up to the property assessed as No. 342/353, Alutmawata road.

"C" *Mutual* bounded as follows:—North the Fishery Harbour and the sea, Temple lane, and Madampitiya road up to Bloemendahl road; east by Bloemendahl road up to St. James's street, St. James's street up to Alutmawata road, and Alutmawata road up to New Fishers' quarters; south by New Fishers' quarters; west by portion of Fishers' hill and Marshall street.

(6) The following area is declared to be a special area set apart for offensive trades specified in schedule A, namely, the area contained within the following limits: Victoria Bridge road, Madampitiya road, Vine street, Vuystwyke road, and the Kelani river.

(7) The following is declared a special area set apart for the following trades: (1) Plumbago curing; (2) Lime burning; (3) Brick making.

Area:—The portion of the Municipal area to the east of Baseline road, excluding the portion bounded by Baseline road, Kelani Valley Railway, and Buller's road.

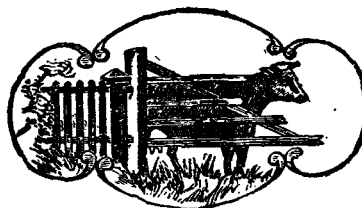
