WHEREAS the following by-laws have been made by the Municipal Council of Kandy, under the provisions section 109 (1) and 110 (1) (a) of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910," and have been confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council, as provided by section 109 (3), subject to the provisions of section 100 of the said Ordinance:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the power vested in Us by the said section of the above-mentioned Ordinance, do hereby proclaim the said by-laws.

BY-LAWS RELATING TO LEAVE OF ABSENCE TO OFFICERS OF THE KANDY MUNICIPALITY.

1. These by-laws shall apply to all officers and servants of this Council, save and except the Chairman, the Assistant Chairman, if any, appointed under the provisions of section 50 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910,

and the Municipal Magistrate.

2. Leave may be recalled .- All leave is granted or withheld subject to the necessities of the Municipal service, and leave once granted may be recalled at any time, if such a step be deemed necessary for the Municipal service, by the Chairman; provided that no leave granted by the Chairman with the sanction of the Council shall be recalled by the Cnairman, except with the like sanction.

Absence from Kandy.—An officer may not absent himself from his station without leave from the Chairman.

- Leave to be obtained formally.—Formal application for such leave must be made in all instances to the Chairman, even though permission may have been obtained verbally or demi-officially, and although the days for which leave of absence is desired are Government holidays.
- 5. Absence without Leave. -In the event of an officer absenting himself from his station or his duties without leave, or violating in any respect these by-laws, the Head of the Department in which the officer is employed will at once report the case to the Chairman, and the pay of such an officer will be stopped until the order of the Chairman upon the case is made known.
- 6. Periods of Leave to be granted by Chairman and Council.—It shall be lawful for the Chairman to grant leave to any officer or servant of the Council, provided that no leave for a period exceeding six weeks on full or half pay or both shall be granted by the Chairman without the sanction of the Council.
- 7. Sick Leave.—When an application for leave or an extension of leave is based on the ground of ill-health, or when an officer cannot attend office on account of sickness, a medical certificate must invariably be sent in on Form A
- in the schedule. 8. Forms for Leave Applications.—Heads of Departments must forward application for leave, either on their own account or on that of officers of their department, on the proper form, viz. :--
 - (a) Leave in the Colony on Form B in the schedule.
 - (b) Leave out of the Colony on Form C in the schedule.

Applications which are not made on the proper form will be returned.

Application by Telegram.—Every officer who applies for leave by telegram must prepay the charges for transmission of such telegram and of every subsequent telegram sent by him on the subject. Whenever an officer, for his own convenience, desires a reply by telegram, he should either pay for the reply in advance or subsequently refund its cost.

When, however, in connection with leave applications, telegrams are sent for reasons of public business, they will

be passed free.

10.

Leave Register.—A register of all leave granted must be kept.

Annual Full Pay Leave.—Vacation leave on full pay may be granted for periods not exceeding six weeks in 11.

respect of any year.

12. Accumulation.—(i.) Vacation leave may be accumulated for two years only, and, subject to the requirements of the service, an officer will be allowed accumulated vacation leave for not more than three months in respect of the leave due to him for the year preceding and the year in which he takes the leave.

(ii.) An officer who has taken his accumulated vacation leave of three months in any year may nevertheless, subject

to sub-section (i.), be granted six weeks vacation leave in the following year.

(iii.) Where an officer has not taken the whole three months' vacation leave in any period of two years, and, in a subsequent period of two years, requires leave on account of sickness beyond the period of vacation leave for which he is eligible, he may at the discretion of the Council be granted sick leave with full pay to an extent not exceeding the lapsed vacation leave, and in any event not exceeding three months in all.

13. "Continuous Duty" Rule.—As a general rule, officers will be required to perform nine and eighteen months'

continuous duty before vacation leave on full pay for six weeks and three months respectively can be granted to them.

14. Arrangements for Duties of Officer on Leave.—Where an officer seeks to obtain vacation leave only, he must, with the concurrence or sanction of the Chairman, make such arrangements as may be necessary for the adequate discharge of his duties without expense or inconvenience to the Council, except in very special circumstances.

15. Substitute's Expenses payable by Council in certain (ases.—It shall be lawful for the Chairman, with the approva of the Standing Committee on Finance, to engage a substitute to perform the duties of an officer or servant on leave, and such substitute shall be paid such salary as the Chairman, with the approval of the Standing Committee on Finance, shall In case the officer or servant in whose place the substitute is sought to be appointed is in receipt of a salary exceeding Rs. 1,200 a year, the appointment of the substitute shall be made, and the amount of his salary shall be fixed by the Council. In no case should the salary of the substitute exceed the initial salary of the officer.

Casual Leave.—Short periods of leave not exceeding fourteen days in any year, may be granted to an officer by the Chairman, provided that such officer can be conveniently spared from his duties. Such leave is not accumulative, and in no case can it be granted to prolong the period for which ordinary leave is granted. Such leave will not be counted in calculating the amount of vacation leave on full pay for which an officer is eligible when he is proceeding on long leave

17. Periods of Leave to be continuous. - Every period of leave applied for (other than casual leave under section 16)

must be continuous, irrespective of any holidays or Sundays that may intervene.

18. Mode of Calculation of Three Months Full-Pay Leave.—Three months vacation or sick leave on full pay will be regarded as equal to 13 weeks or 91 days, and any leave already taken (other than casual leave) should be subtracted from 91 days.

19. Leave to Peons and other Minor Salaried Employees .- (i.) Peons and other minor employees in similar positions, rated at annual salaries, who have been continuously employed for a period of two years and upwards, and whose services warrant the concession, may, on the production of a proper medical certificate, be allowed sick leave on full pay up to a maximum of fourteen days in a year.

(ii.) In addition to the above, such employees may be allowed casual leave at the discretion of the Head of the

Department not exceeding fourteen days in any year, or six days at any one time.

20. Temporary Officers not Entitled to Leave.—Temporary officers are not entitled to leave except as provided in their agreements. The Chairman may, however, grant such officers full- or half-pay leave, provided that no leave for a period exceeding six weeks shall be granted by the Chairman without the sanction of the Council, and the Council may in case of sickness grant further leave if they think fit.

21. Half-Pay Leave. -Subject to the necessities of the service leave of absence on half pay may be granted without any special grounds after six years service from first appointment in the Municipal service, or in the case of seconded or transferred officers a period of six years total service with the Government and the Council. It may be given after a less duration of service in cases of serious indisposition or of urgent private affairs, if the Council is satisfied that the indulgence is indispensable. In cases of serious indisposition the state of the officer's health must be certified by his medical attendant, or if required by the Council by a Medical Board. In cases of urgent private affairs the nature of such private affairs must be stated confidentially to the Chairman.

Calculation of Leave Due. -In the absence of special grounds half-pay leave must not exceed one sixth of the officer's service. On special grounds it may exceed that period by six months, but these six months cannot be commuted.

23. Commutation of Half-Pay Leave.—At the request of any officer who may be entitled to half-pay leave, the Council may commute the whole or any portion of such leave provided it is to be spent outside the Colony, into one helf, the period of leave with full salary, provided that the total period of commuted and uncommuted leave, together with any period of vacation leave that may be granted, does not exceed ten months at a time. No officer can claim as a right to commute his leave in this manner, the decision whether commutation can or cannot be allowed being wholly within the discretion of the Council.

24. No Private Arrangements to benefit Officers allowed.—When an officer is entitled to half pay leave, no private

arrangements made with the object of securing to him more than half pay will be allowed.

Combined Vacation and Half-Pay Leave.—(i.) Vacation leave may be granted to an officer to be followed

immediately by leave on half pay.

(ii.) Leave on half pay begun in one year and running into the next must be treated as a continuous period and must be all on half pay. A period of vacation leave on full pay cannot follow immediately upon a period of half-pay leave. Vacation leave in respect of any year cannot be granted unless the officer has performed the duties of his office for a reasonable period during that year. No exception to this rule must be made without the sanction of the Council.

(iii.) Where full pay (i.e., vacation) leave is to be followed by half-pay leave (including commuted half-pay leave), the arrangements for the discharge of the officer's duties will be made by the Council, and every officer is liable and required to act without any increase of pay in an office ranking as high as, or higher than, his fixed appointment during the period

of vacation eave thus granted.

(iv.) No officer shall proceed on vacation leave until he has handed over to the officer who has been app; inted to

act for him during his absence, or to some other officer authorized by the Chairman.

26. Leave of Schoolmasters, &c. — (i.) When vacation leave is granted to the Teachers of the Municipal School,

such leave must extend to the ordinary vacations of the school, but may not exceed them.

(ii.) Leave of absence during school term will not be granted except under extraordinary circumstances, teachers being expected to make arrangements for the transaction of their legitimate private affairs during the regular vacations. Whenever such leave is granted it will be without pay, unless an approved substitute is provided, in which case the substitute will receive the initial pay of the absence. In the case of absence on account of ill-health the Chairman may grant, at his discretion, leave on full pay up to a maximum of seven days in any one year without imposing the requirement that a substitute should be provided.

27. Acting Pay.—(i.) If any office be vacated by the death, removal, or absence on half-pay leave or commuted half-pay leave of the holder, the person appointed to perform his duties may receive the available half-salary or an allowance not exceeding half the salary of the office in proportion to the extra work he is required to do. The Chairman will decide in what proportions the available half pay or allowance is to be paid, provided that no officer can draw more than one-third

of his own full salary as remuneration for the extra work he is called on to perform.

(ii.) Should an officer be appointed to act temporarily in a class or grade higher than that to which he belongs, he may draw the available half pay of the class to which he is appointed to act and half his own pay.

(iii.) Where an officer acts in a post to which a higher commuted or travelling allowance than that which he normally draws is attached, he may draw the higher allowance while available.

28. Rate of Exchange for Payment of Salary in "Silver Currency" Countries.—Rates of exchange for payment of

salaries in England :-

(i.) Officers of the Municipal Council on leave residing in any part of Asia (except Cyprus) in any rupee-using country, or in any country the currency of which is based on a silver standard, will draw their salaries in the local currency at the current rate of exchange between the country in question and Ceylon or England, according as the salary is paid direct by the Municipal Council, or through Crown Agents by arrangement with Government.

(ii.) The rate of exchange for payment of salaries in England will be 1 shilling 4 pence to the rupee.
29. Date of Resumption of Full Salary.—An officer returning from leave will be entitled to draw full salary or from the day on which he assumes the duties of his fixed office, or of the office the duties of which he may be ordered temporarily to discharge.

30. Pay of Officers on Leave.—Arrangements will be made with Government for the payment by the Crown Agents

for the Colonies of the full salary and half salary of officers on leave in England.

- · 31. Cases not provided for in these By-laws.—Should any case arise which has not been provided for in these by laws, such case shall be considered and decided by the Council, regard being had to the provisions, if any, in that behalf contained in the Government Leave Minute.
- 32. Leave in lieu of Statutory Holidays.—If, in the opinion of the Chairman, it is necessary that any officer shall continue to perform his duties during the statutory holidays which occur at Christmas, the New Year, or Easter, he may at his discretion grant leave of absence to such officer in lieu of, and not exceeding the term of, such statutory holidays.

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

Whereas in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the Treaty of Peace (Austria and Bulgaria) Act, 1920, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, and it is expedient that the said Order should be amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, andit is hereby ordered,

The provisions of the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, set out in the first column of the schedule to this Order shall be amended in the manner shown in the second column of that chedule.

2. This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace (Austria) (No. 2) Amendment Order, 1921, and this Order shall be included amongst the Orders which may be cited together as the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Orders, 1920 to 1921.

Nature of Amendment.

- (ix.) At the end of paragraph (ix.) the following proviso shall be inserted:
 - Provided further that where it is alleged that any property, right, or interest is not subject to the said charge by reason of its belonging to a person who is not a national of the former Austrian Empire within the meaning of this Order, the Administrator shall be entitled to make such charges as, subject to the consent of the Treasury, he may consider necessary to cover the costs incurred by him in investigating the allegation and in tracing and identifying the said property, right, or interest."
 - At the end of sub-paragraph (d) there shall be inserted the words "and to require any person having in his (x.)possession any documents of title to any such stock, shares, or other securities to deliver the same to him, and an acknowledgment of such delivery signed by him shall be a sufficient discharge to the person delivering the same.

After sub-paragraph (e) the following sub-paragraphs shall be inserted :-

The provisions of the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, set out in the first column of the schedule to this Order shall be amended in the manner shown in the second column of that schedule.

2. This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) (No. 2) Amendment Order, 1921, and this Order shall be included amongst the Orders which may be cited together as the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Orders, 1920 to 1921.

The SECRETARY OF STATE FOR THE COLONIES to Governor Sir W. H. MANNING, G.C.M.G., K.B.E., C.B.

SIR,—I HAVE the honour to inform you that I have recently been in communication with the Army Council on the subject of the status of officers on retirement from the Colonial Volunteer Forces, and that His Majesty the King has been pleased to approve of the privilege of wearing uniform, granted to ex-officers of Dominion Forces and Colonial Volunteers under local conditions, which is now effective only within local limits, being extended to cover the wearing of uniform on special occasions at home and elsewhere throughout His Majesty's dominions.

- 2. His Majesty has also been pleased to approve that the privilege of retaining rank by such officers should be extended to be effective throughout His Majesty's dominions.
- 3. These privileges will be limited to an officer who held a commission between the 5th of August, 1914, and the date of the termination of the war—midnight of 31st August as notified to you in my telegram of 16th August.
- 4. Military officers in this country who have relinquished their commissions and who have been permitted to retain their rank, also officers who have been demobilized or disembodied, are permitted to wear uniform on special occasions when attending ceremonies and entertainments of a military nature, and on occasions when the wearing of uniform would appear appropriate, and this limitation should be observed in respect of officers of the Colonial Volunteer Forces who have relinquished their commissions and have been permitted to retain their rank under due authority by notification in the local *Gazette*.
- 5. The uniform should be restricted to service dress, and should be that of the unit or of the general list to which the officer belonged when he relinquished his commission or was demobilized. The badges of rank should be those of the rank he held when demobilized or that retained by him when he quitted the service.

"THE VEHICLES ORDINANCE, No. 4 OF 1916."

3. All suitable dead and hollow trees and branchwood within the forest, such are marked by the Forest Officer, though below 10 feet in girth should, in addition to all matured sound trees marked by him, be utilized for conversion into sleepers as may be directed.

4. Part of logs attacked by fungus or defective parts of logs are not to be sawn into sleepers. The sleepers should be sawn from sound matured wood free from shakes,

cracks, sapwood, and large or loose knots.

5. Broad gauge sleepers are to be 9 ft. by 10 in. by 5 in. and narrow gauge sleepers 5 ft. by 9 in. by $4\frac{1}{2}$ in. or 5 ft. by 10 in. by 5 in.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 15, 1921.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 160 (1 European, 12 Burghers, 101 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 22 Moors, 5 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the Census population on March 18, 1921, viz., 244,182) was 34.2, as against 38.4 in the preceding week, 29.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 153 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 80 Sinhalese, 35 Tamils, 28 Moors, 4 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 33.7, as against 31.4 in the previous week, 26.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 158 total deaths, 45 were of infants under one year of age, as against 43 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 17.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Ten deaths from Phthisis were registered, 4 in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island, and I each in Pettah and Kollupitiya, as against 15 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama hospital from Phthisis during the week, (a) Nine deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 5 in Kotahena, 2 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non. resident in hospital), and I each in New Bazaar and Kollupitiya, as against 12 in the previous week and 20 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Three deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 2 in St. Paul's and 1 in New Bazaar, as against 5 in the previous

(c) Two deaths from Influenza were registered, I each in San Sabastian and New Bazaar. as against 5 in the

previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

3. Five deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 2 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), and I each in Kotahena, New Bazaar, and Kollupitiya, as against 4 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from Plague was registered in Pettah, as against nil in the previous week and 3 the weekly average

for last year.

5. Twenty-four deaths were registered from Debility, 14 from Infantile Convulsions, 5 from Enteritis, 4 from Diarrhæa, 3 from Dysentery, 2 each from Worms and Tetanus, and 74 from Other Causes.
6. Eight cases of Enteric Fever and 4 of Chickenpox were reported during the week, as against 7 and 14 respectively, of the preceding week. No cases of Plague was reported this week. Two cases were reported in the previous

week. State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.1°, against 82.3° in the preceding week and 81.0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.978 in., against 29.928 in. in the preceding week and 30.010 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3.15 in., against 0.51 in. in the preceding week and 0.17 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

SEASON REOPRTS FOR THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1921.

WESTERN PROVINCE.

COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Paddy: the yala crop is being reaped, and cultivation is in progress for maha.

Dry grains: in Siyane korale west the kurakkan crops have been reaped, and in Siyane korale east chenas are

being prepared for the sowing of kurakkan and amu.

Other products: prospects of coconuts are fairly good.
The estimated crop for the month is 101,686,500 nuts.

There is a fairly good supply of fruits and vegetables.

Prices of staple products: (a) imported rice is sold according to controlled rates; (b) coconuts are sold at Rs. 60 to Rs. 70 per 1,000.

Harvest prospects: fair.

Rainfall: there were a few showers of rain during the month.

Health of inhabitants: fair. There were a few cases of dysentery, fever, chickenpox, and enteric fever. A case of typhoid fever was reported from Siyane korale west.

Health of cattle: excellent. No cases of rinderpest or

hoof-and-mouth disease were reported during the month.

KALUTARA DISTRICT.

Paddy: the yala harvest has been reaped, and the maha cultivation has commenced.

Dry grain: there has been very little dry grain cultivation in the district.

Other products: fruit and vegetables were scarce, except in the tetamunes where the supply was as usual fair. The flowering of coconuts was good, and the month's crop is estimated at 1,926,000 mits. Prices of staple products: Coast rice was sold from 20to 25½ cents per measure. No country rice was available in the market. Coconuts ranged from Rs. 60 to Rs. 110 per 1,000 nuts.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on September 17, 1921, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with notice dated September 13, 1921.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle; Mr. G. E. de Silva; Dr. C. de Vos; Mr. A. Vallipuram; and Mr. P. M. Bingham.

The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on August 20, 1921, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman. The following documents were submitted:-

(b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.

Health Officer's report for August.

(d) Statements of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of August.

(e) The reservoir readings for August.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

The following papers were laid on the table :--

Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during August.

Correspondence: (1) Letter No. 32 of August 22, 1921, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary re proposed road through Asgiriya.—Read.

(2) Letter No. 33 of September 10, 1921, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary re encroachment at the 3rd milepost, Katugastota-Balakaduwa rcad.—Resolved that tickets of occupancy in respect of the encroachments be issued on the usual terms.

(3) Letter No. 208 of September 8, 1921, from the Government Agent, Central Province, inquiring whether the Council is willing to pay Rs. 4,000 for the land to be acquired in Katukelle for model tenements for the poorer classes.

On the Chairman's motion the Council went into Committee and it was resolved that the payment of Rs. 4,000 be agreed to. The Council resumed and the resolution passed in Committee was confirmed.

(4) Letter No. 1,685 of July 25, 1921, from the Colonial Auditor re expenditure exceeding Rs. 1,000 on purchase of · materials for sanctioned works requiring the sanction of Council.—Resolved that for the purpose of carrying out estimates sanctioned by the Council, particulars of every purchase of material in which the cost of any one article exceeds Rs. 1,000 be tabled for the information of Council at the Meeting, following the purchase.

(5) Letter of September 12, from Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle forwarding memorandum on Municipal Reform for consideration of Council. It was agreed that Dr. Attygalle be thanked for his memorandum, and that copies of the

memorandum be printed and circulated.

The following Special Committee was appointed to consider what measures of Municipal Reform the Municipal

Council of Kandy would advocate:—Dr. Attygalle, Messrs. Ratwatte, Pieris, De Silva, and the Chairman.

5. Pursuant to notice, Dr. Attygalle moved—That a Committee be appointed to be called the Establishment Committee, to inquire generally into the working of the various departments with a view to (a) Re-organization of the same as will ensure retrenchment coupled with greater efficiency; (b) to ascertain the adequacy or otherwise of the pay of all Municipal Officers; (c) to revise the present rules and regulations, or frame others governing the appointments, duties, • salaries, and promotions of all Municipal Officers. Mr. De Silva seconded.

The Chairman pointed out that no Standing Committee could be appointed except at the first General Meeting of

With the leave of the Council the mover then withdrew his motion and agreed to submit the motion in an amended

form at a future Meeting.

The following motion which stood in the name of Mr. De Silva was, with the leave of the Council, withdrawn to be brought up at the next Meeting of Council:—In consideration of the present state of the town and the scavenging now done, that the scavenging of the town be done by the Medical Officer of Health and his Department, and that steps be taken to recognize the Health Department and place it on a better footing, and that an extra officer be appointed if necessary to help the Medical Officer of Health in the discharge of that duty.

(7) Papers re the proposed lease of lot No. 10 of the Palladeniya land.

Dr. Attygalle proposed that, as recommended by the Board of Improvement Commissioners, Kandy, the land be not leased for the present. Mr. Bingham seconded.—Carried.

8. Recommendations of Standing Committees-

(i.) The Council proposes subject to approval of Government and subject to mutually satisfactory terms being arranged to take over the Company's Installation at Kandy, immediate possession being an essential condition.
