SCHEDULE.

6. No person other than a *bona fide* passenger or ship's officer shall go on board any vessel within the port except in accordance with a general or special permit issued by the Master Attendant, or by the Inspector-General of Police, or by the Principal Collector of Customs.

"THE LOCAL LOANS AND DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE, No. 22 OF 1916."

REGULATION made by the Commissioners and approved by the Governor in Executive Council, under the provisions of section 10 of "The Local Loans and Development Ordinance, No. 22 of 1916," in substitution for regulation 24 of the regulations dated May 30, 1917, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 6,879 of June 8, 1917:—

24. Loans to co-operative and similar societies shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(a) The President of the Society applying for the loan shall be a person approved by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent of the District in which the society is situated.

(b) The loan shall be recommended by the Registrar of Co-operative Societies.

(c) Loans shall in no case exceed—in case of societies with unlimited liability—double the paid up capital of the society at time of application, and in case of societies with limited liability an amount equal to the paid up capital of the society at the time of application, provided that in special cases in certain districts, on the recommendation of the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent, endorsed by the Registrar of Co-operative Societies, and on condition that the society undertakes to have as its president, during the period of its indebtedness to Government, an officer of Government approved by the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent, loans not exceeding Rs. 2,000 may be granted to societies with unlimited liability, even though the paid up capital of such societies may be less than Rs. 1,000.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. (a) The Chairman, when specially empowered thereto by resolution of the Board, may by notice in writing require the owner or occupier of any house or building or land (1) having a cesspit in his premises to close the same, or (2) disposing of night soil by burial or otherwise upon his premises to desist therefrom and to provide a dry earth closet instead.

(b) Any person failing to comply with an order under sub-section (a) shall be guilty of an offence.

2. Permission may be granted in writing by the Chairman to any householder having on his premises a dry-earth closet or a cesspit to have night soil from the same buried or otherwise disposed of on his premises, or in some other place sanctioned by the Chairman. Any householder having on his premises a dry-earth closet or a cesspit who shall permit any night soil to be buried or otherwise disposed of on his premises or in any place other than that sanctioned by the Chairman without permission in writing from the Chairman shall be guilty of an offence.

3. All owners or occupiers of premises furnished with dry-earth closets within the limits of the Local Board of

Jaffna shall pay to the Board for the removal of the night soil a fee which shall be Rs. 2 per mensem per bucket or such amount as the Board may from time to time determine. All such fees shall be paid at the Local Board Office before the 10th day of the month following that during which the service was rendered.

4. (a) It shall be competent to the Chairman or the Board to require that any particular type of cesspit or dry-earth closet approved by the Board and no other shall be constructed.

(b) The Chairman or the Board may further prescribe the position on which such cesspit or dry-earth closet shall be constructed, and refuse permission to construct any cesspit or dry-earth closet in any other position.

(c) It shall further be competent to the Chairman or the Board to refuse permission to construct any cesspit or dry-earth closet at all upon any premises, should the Chairman or the Board be of opinion that such construction should not be permitted on sanitary grounds.

“THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE, No. 13 OF 1896.”

THE following rules and orders made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under Ordinance No. 13 of 1896, entitled “An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages,” for the conduct of the Kataragama pilgrimage and festival, where special precautions have been and are necessary, are published for general information, in lieu of the rules promulgated annually for several years.

RULES.

1. For sanitary reasons the duration of the Kataragama Imahakachchi festival and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama shall be and it is hereby limited to three days, namely, November 14 to 16, 1921. Pilgrims arriving before the day first named or staying beyond the period here prescribed shall be guilty of an offence.

2. In the event of an epidemic breaking out at Kataragama during the festival, it shall be lawful for the officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders to declare the festival at an end, and to direct pilgrims at once to leave the village and proceed to their homes, and to prescribe the roads they have to travel.

3. The officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama and at Kataragama—

- (a) To appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water and drinking, and for natural offices.
- (b) To appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims.
- (c) To prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims.
- (d) To regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims.
- (e) To fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them, and to detain them if unfit to travel.

Any person disobeying an order given by the appointed officers shall be guilty of an offence.

4. The police are empowered and required to seize and destroy all food condemned as unwholesome on the march or in camp by the Medical Officer, or, if there be none,

by the Chief Officer of Police; and any person resisting or obstructing the Police in the discharge of this or of any other duty prescribed by these rules shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

5. Any person bringing any cattle or cart bulls within one quarter of a mile of the camp without a permit from the Supervising Officer or any person authorized by him to issue such permits shall be deemed guilty of an offence. The issue of such permit shall be subject to compliance by the permit-holder with such conditions as may be imposed by the Supervising Officer for the purpose of enforcing sanitation and maintaining the health of the camp.

6. Any person selling meat in camp in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the officer in charge of the camp, and any other person selling food condemned as unwholesome by the Medical Officer, or in his absence by the Chief Officer of Police, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

7. Any person who shall, during the occupation of the camp, use any other place for offices of nature than that provided for the purpose by Government, or failing to cover the deposit with earth or sand, and any person who shall during the same period bathe in or enter the river above the spot appointed by the officer in charge of the camp, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

8. Any person suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and not reporting the same to the Medical Officer, or in his absence to the Chief Officer of Police, and any person abetting or assisting in the concealment of such disease, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

9. All persons shall take up the quarters assigned to them by the Chief Officer of Police at the halting places and in the camp, and any person declining or neglecting to do so shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

"THE SMALL TOWNS SANITARY ORDINANCE, No. 18 of 1892."

direct at a minimum rate of 200 tons per mensem from December 15, 1921, to May 15, 1922. Final delivery in Jaffna Depôt to be made on or before May 15, 1922, when the balance remaining, if any, out of the total quantity to be supplied should be delivered.

Distance of transport by cart to seashore is up to 2 miles and by boats to the Jaffna Depôt 18 miles.

(Service B) *Kalluthalavai, Kallamparavai, and Palavi.*

To clear fell all trees 6 in. from the ground with axe in released areas at Kalluthalavai, Kallamparavai, and Palavi up to two miles from seashore.

To cut into firewood every tree so felled and every other dead or fallen tree whatsoever sufficient to yield 3,000 tons of firewood more or less, with the least amount of wastage. All firewood immediately after conversion to be transported to the seashore and thence by boats to Jaffna Customs, and taken to Jaffna Depôt, weighed and stacked in the Jaffna Depôt, in such a manner as the Depôt-keeper may direct at a minimum rate of 600 tons per mensem from December 15, 1921, to May 15, 1922. Final delivery in Jaffna Depôt to be made on or before May 15, 1922, when the balance remaining, if any, out of the total quantity to be supplied should be delivered.

Distance of transport by cart to seashore is up to 2 miles and by boats to the Jaffna Depôt 20 to 35 miles.

General Conditions.

Felling must proceed steadily and systematically in one direction straight across the areas, every tree being cut and the areas stripped clean of all firewood.

Any tree pointed out by a Forest Officer as one to be felled for firewood shall, without question, be felled, and any tree pointed out or marked by a Forest Officer as not to be felled shall not be felled or injured.

The contractor will be responsible for the safety of firewood stacked on the seashore, and until delivered to Depôt-keeper.

The contractor may be required at times to increase supplies, should the Depôt requirements necessitate, and at times also to decrease supplies, but the average output will be as described in the schedule.

It must be clearly understood that for failure to have full monthly supplies ready as required a penalty of Rs. 2 per ton for every ton short will be levied.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

(1) Trees are to be felled within 6 inches from the ground by saw or axe and saw combined.

(2) Only such trees as are stamped and marked by the Forest Ranger are to be felled, and no sound trees below 4 ft. 6 in. in girth will be marked or should be felled.

(3) All suitable dead and hollow trees and branchwood within the forest such as are marked by the Forest Officer, though below 4 ft. 6 in. in girth, should, in addition to all matured sound trees marked by him, be utilized for conversion into sleepers and scantlings, or scantlings alone as may be directed. Contractors should understand that only such portions of trees as cannot be converted into sleepers may be sawn into scantlings.

(4) Part of logs attacked by fungus or defective parts of logs are not to be sawn into sleepers or scantlings. The sleepers and scantlings should be sawn from sound matured wood free from shakes, cracks, sapwood, and large or loose knots.

(5) Broad gauge sleepers are to be 9 ft. by 10 in. by 5 in. and narrow gauge sleepers 5 ft. by 10 in. by 5 in. or 5 ft. by 9 in. by 4½ in., and the sizes of scantlings to be sawn are—

(6) Sleepers and scantlings should be rectangular in form and sawn perfectly parallel on all sides. On no account, will squaring of logs, sleepers, or scantlings with an adze or axe be allowed.

(7) Sleepers and scantlings should be covered with saw dust or immersed in water and be invariably placed under shade immediately they are sawn until they can be transported to delivery depôts, where they should be stacked and kept under shade in the manner to be pointed out by the Forest Ranger.

(8) Rejected sleepers or scantlings will not be paid for, and they will lapse to Government as well as all refuse wood

in the sleeper operations. The contractor shall have no claim in respect of any materials sold as rejections.

(9) The contractor may be paid a proportionate rate for sleepers and scantlings sawn, but not removed to delivery depôts, in cases when it shall be deemed expedient to do so by the Conservator of Forests.

(10) Payment may be made for sleepers and scantlings accepted by the Divisional Forest Officer at delivery depôts.

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

Service A.

To fell a sufficient number of palu, milla and ranai trees standing in Maha-oya forest; bounded on the north and west by Kallodai-aar, on the east by Maha-oya, and on the south by footpath from Lahugala to Hingurana-ela and thence along the ela, to convert the trees felled into 2,000 broad gauge and 800 narrow gauge sleepers (more or less), and as many scantlings as possible; to transport the sleepers, scantlings, and any outside slabs required by the Forest Department, stack and deliver them at Batticaloa Bar, a distance of 45 to 55 miles, as instructed by the Divisional Forest Officer, Eastern Division.

Service B.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 22, 1921.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 191 (12 Burghers, 115 Sinhalese, 32 Tamils, 26 Moors, 3 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the Census population on March 18, 1921, viz., 244,140) was 40·8, as against 34·2 in the preceding week, 26·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24·5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 119 (1 European, 9 Burghers, 58 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 26 Moors, 4 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 25·4, as against 33·7 in the previous week, 24·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 119 total deaths, 34 were of infants under one year of age, as against 45 in the preceding week, 42 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 20.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in Kotahena, 2 each in New Bazaar and Maradana, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta, as against 10 in the previous week, and 14 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Six deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 2 each in St. Paul's and Maradana, and 1 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island, as against 9 in the previous week, and 20 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 3 in St. Paul's and 1 in Kotahena, as against 3 in the previous week.

(c) Two deaths from *Influenza* were registered in Maradana, same as in the previous week. The weekly average for last year was 6.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana (of non-residents in hospital), as against 5 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.

4. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered, 1 each in Pettah, and San Sebastian, as against 1 in the previous week, and 3 the weekly average for last year.

5. Fifteen deaths were registered from *Infantile Convulsions*, 12 from *Debility*, 9 from *Dysentery*, 4 from *Diarrhoea*, 3 from *Enteritis*, 2 from *Worms*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 44 from *Other Causes*.

6. Fourteen cases of *Enteric Fever*, 8 of *Chickpox*, and 2 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 8, 4, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·7°, against 80·1° in the preceding week and 80·2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 30·011 in., against 29·978 in. in the preceding week and 29·976 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·35 in. against 3·15 in the preceding week and 4·15 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
