Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim the said by-laws set forth in the Schedules A and B hereto.

SCHEDULES REFERRED TO.

SCHEDULE A.

By-law in respect to regulating the use of public latrines and as to the decent conduct of persons using the same, made under the provision of section 195 (a) of Ordinance No. 2 of 1919.

1. In any public latrine no person shall defaecate except into the pans or urinate, except at the places provided for such purposes.

2. No person shall wash any linen, clothes, or other such articles, or any pots, pans, or domestic utensils, or any animals in any public latrine.

3. No person shall drop or place into the pans, gullies, or other openings into the drains in or of any public latrine any brick, stone, earth, ashes, or any substance or matter which such drains are not intended to receive.

4. No person shall damage, remove, block up, or in any way alter the fixing, position, or arrangement of any pan, pipe, valve, tank, or any other fitting or appliance in any public latrine, or shall wilfully destroy, deface, damage, or abuse any wall, floor, roof, or any part of the structure of such latrine.

5. No person, not being a public officer or other person in the execution of his duties, shall enter any part of any public latrine set apart for the use of persons of the opposite sex or any public latrine or part thereof which may for the time being be closed or barred from use.

6. No person shall wilfully molest, obstruct, interfere with or disobey the legitimate order of any attendant, watcher, or custodian of any public latrine, whilst in the execution of his duties.

7. No person shall frequent or remain in any public latrine except for the purpose for which such latrine has been provided.

8. No person suffering from any infectious disease shall enter a public latrine.

9. Penalties.—Whoever shall contravene any provision of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty rupees.

SCHEDULE B.

By-laws with respect to the charging, levying, and recovering of fees for inspection and cleansing of all drains, water-closets, and other sanitary appliances, and with respect to regulating the issue of licenses to persons carrying out drainage work, and the conditions under which such licenses may be issued and used, and the manner in which such work shall be carried out, and for the inspection and recovery of fees for such license, and of a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees for any contravention of the terms thereof—made under section 195 of Ordinance No. 2 of 1919.

By-laws in respect of licensed drainage contractors and in respect to the inspection and cleansing of drains made under the provisions of section 195 (b) and (c) of Ordinance No. 2 of 1919.

*Definition.*—For the purpose of these by-laws the City Sanitation Engineer shall mean the City Sanitation Engineer of the Colombo Municipal Council or any other officer duly appointed by the Chairman of the Colombo Municipal Council to control or supervise the execution of any of the drainage works hereinafter mentioned or the maintenance and cleansing of drains, water-closets, and other sanitary appliances.

Part I.—With Respect to the Inspection and Cleansing of Drains.

1. The under-mentioned fees shall be chargeable for the inspection and testing of drainage works, and shall be paid to the Chairman by the drainage contractor undertaking the work—

2. Fees for cleansing drains, water-closets, and other sanitary appliances:—

(1) The under-mentioned fees shall be chargeable for the cleansing of drains, including the clearing of blockages in the drains, water-closets or other sanitary appliances, and shall be paid to the Chairman by the occupier of the premises concerned, or, in the case of premises let in tenements or not in the occupation of one person, by the various occupants in such proportion as the Chairman may direct, or by the owner of such premises.

- For cleansing any system of drains or part of any system in or belonging to any premises, including the clearing of blockages in any drains, water-closets, or other sanitary appliances or such system
- (2) Such fees shall be paid, provided the work has been done by the Municipal Council—
- (a) On the application of the occupier or owner of the premises concerned, and subject to the discretion of the Chairman who may charge the full cost of such work.

(b) If the Chairman shall deem immediate action necessary and subject to the occupier or owner being duly notified of his intention to carry out the work and of the fees chargeable.

3. Whoevershall fail to pay within seven days from the receipt of a demand from the Chairman any fees chargeable under sub-section (2) (b) of this section of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding twenty-five rupees.

*Part II.—With respect to Drainage Contractors, Licenses, Conditions, and Penalties.*

1. No person, excepting the duly authorized officers of the Council, shall carry out or cause to be carried out any works connected with the construction, fixing, and alteration of drains and drainage appliances without first obtaining a license in writing from the Chairman.

The persons or firms who shall hold such license from the Chairman shall hereinafter be known as drainage contractors.

2. Before any such license is granted to any person or to carry out any of the aforementioned works, the person or firm must satisfy the Chairman in the following respects, namely, that:—

(a) The person or firm or someone in the employment thereof has a practical knowledge of the said work, or of such class of work as the Chairman may authorize him by his license to undertake.

(b) The person or firm has a suitable place of business, together with a proper and sufficient stock of tools, plant, and materials for the purpose of carrying out the work.

3. Every license shall be issued to a drainage contractor, subject to the following conditions:—

(a) Such license shall specify the period for which it shall remain in force and the class of work the licensee is authorized to undertake.

(b) Such license shall be revokable at any time at the absolute discretion of the Chairman by notice in writing to the licensee.

(c) Such license shall state the business address of the licensee.

(d) Every licensee shall deposit with the Chairman the sum of rupees two hundred and fifty, and shall pay to the Chairman an annual license fee of rupees twenty-five.

(e) The issue of such license shall in no way involve the Chairman in any responsibility for any work or improper work carried out by any drainage contractor under such license or for any damages to buildings or property resulting therefrom.

4. Every drainage contractor shall—

(1) Comply with the provisions of the Municipal Ordinances and the by-laws, rules, and regulations which may from time to time be made thereunder.

(2) Notify the Chairman of any change of his address or place of business.

(3) Proceed with any work undertaken by him diligently and in a proper workman-like manner, and shall not without sufficient cause unduly delay the execution thereof.

(4) Carry out all reasonable and lawful directions of the City Sanitation Engineer in connection with such work.

(5) Be bound to report to the City Sanitation Engineer any defect noticed by him in connection with any drainage works or appliances.

(6) Take such necessary and reasonable steps and provide such appliances as may be required by the City Sanitation Engineer in order to enable any pipes, fittings, appliances, materials, or works of drainage to be examined, inspected, or tested.

5. If any license shall have been issued to a drainage contractor on the grounds that some person in his employ possesses the qualifications specified in by-law 2 (a), the drainage contractor shall notify the Chairman whenever the said person ceases to be in his employ.

6. No drainage contractor shall carry out any of the drainage works hereinbefore mentioned or shall sublet such work to, or cause it to be carried out by, any other licensed contractor without due notice in writing to the City Sanitation Engineer.

7. In carrying out any of the drainage works hereinbefore mentioned no drainage contractor shall use any pipes, fittings, appliances, or materials, unless the same have been duly approved by the City Sanitation Engineer.

8. No drainage contractor shall employ on any works carried out by him under the provisions of his license any person whose license may have previously been withdrawn or revoked by the Chairman, or who has been refused a license by the Chairman, without first notifying the Chairman and obtaining his approval to the employment of such person on such works.

9. It shall be a condition of the license issued to a drainage contractor that, if in the opinion of the Chairman, he has committed a breach of any of these by-laws, he shall be liable to forfeiture at the discretion of the Chairman of a sum not exceeding one hundred rupees from the amount required to be deposited under by-law 3 (d) above.

## BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

## BY-LAWS UNDER SECTION 9E (2) (d).

*Eating-houses, Bakeries, &c.*

20. (a) The sugar used in any eating-house, tea or coffee boutique shall be kept in glass-stoppered wide-mouthed bottles.

(b) All cakes, sweetmeats, and other provisions exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed glass cases free from flies. No foodstuff shall be exposed to the contamination of flies. The glass cases used shall be kept scrupulously clean.

(c) No waste tea, or coffee, or milk, and no remnants of food or cooking waste, shall be thrown on the ground, but the same shall be collected in a proper receptacle and removed daily.

(d) No person shall keep a bakery without a license from the Chairman of the Sanitary Board, Mannar District. The Chairman shall have power to fix the period of the duration of such license and to refuse to grant a license to any person for non-compliance with the provision of any rules made by the Sanitary Board in regard to bakeries, or to any person whose previous license has been cancelled by a competent court.

Any license issued under this section shall be liable to be cancelled by a court on a second or subsequent conviction by such court for breach of any of the rules made by the Sanitary Board with regard to bakeries.

## BY-LAWS UNDER SECTION 9E (e).

22. (a) Every table used in a butcher's stall shall be zinc covered. Such tables and the chopping block and all implements shall be kept scrupulously clean. They shall be washed with water and scrubbed with a hard clean brush immediately after use. All hooks for hanging meat shall be washed and polished and kept free from rust.

(b) Refuse and unsaleable material, offal, &c., if not immediately removed, shall be kept in a zinc lined receptacle with perforated zinc cover, the perforation to be of such size as to prevent flies entering. This receptacle shall be emptied, washed, and cleaned after use.

## BY-LAWS UNDER SECTION 9E (2) (f).

*Anti-Malarial By-laws.*

36. (a) No one shall permit water to remain unemptied in any vessels in their premises for a longer period than 3 days.

(b) On the presence of mosquito larvæ being detected in any well or other collection of water the Chairman shall be empowered to direct the manner in which such nuisance shall be abated.

*Aerated Water Manufactories.*

44. No person shall commence the manufacture of aerated waters within the limits of the Sanitary Board for the purpose of sale without giving one month's previous notice in writing to the Chairman of the Board.

45. No aerated water factory shall be situated less than 150 feet from any gala, stable, or other building used for keeping animals by day and night, or of any latrine or cesspit. No part of the factory shall be used as a dwelling house.

46. All premises used for manufacture of aerated waters must be well lighted, ventilated, and provided with a wood ceiling; must have cemented floors; must be provided with suitably built drains to carry off waste material; and must be kept clear and free from dirt and dust. The preparation of the syrups must be carried out in a separate flyproof room. All chemicals and other materials used in the manufacture of the waters must be of good quality. All utensils and machinery employed in the manufacture must be scrupulously clean.

47. The water used in the manufacture shall be obtained from a source adequately protected from contamination and approved of by the Chairman of the Board. It shall be transported to the factory by means which shall ensure that no pollution occurs in transit. It shall be stored at the factory in properly constructed tanks or reservoirs with dust-tight covers connecting with the aerating apparatus.

48. All waters used in the manufacture of aerated waters shall be passed through a Jewell or other filter approved by the Chairman and connected with the plant, provided that the Chairman shall have the power to exempt from the operation of this rule the water derived from an approved public supply.

49. All bottles used in the manufacture of aerated waters shall be washed with filtered water and shall be kept scrupulously clean.

50. Every bottle containing aerated water shall bear a label setting out the description of the water and the place of manufacture, the name of the person or firm owning the factory, and the number assigned to the factory by the Chairman of the Board.

51. No person under 12 years of age shall be employed in any aerated water factory, nor any person suffering from any cutaneous or contagious disease.

52. All employees engaged in the filling of bottles with gas shall wear fine-meshed wire face and neck-shields and leather gloves.

## BY-LAWS re WELLS.

53. No person shall sink a well or cause a well to be sunk within the limits of any Sanitary Board town, unless he shall have given to the Chairman one month's notice of such his intention, or shall have obtained a permit from the Chairman to sink such well or cause it to be sunk.

54. The Chairman may, whenever he deems such a course to be necessary, cause notice to be given in writing to the owner or lessee or occupant of any compound in which there is a well used for drinking or domestic purposes to bale out the water and clean the well and execute such repairs as the Chairman may consider to be necessary, and if such notice is not complied with within 14 days such person shall be guilty of an offence.

55. Whenever it shall be decided by a resolution of the Sanitary Board that such a course is expedient in the interests of health, it may give notice to the owner, lessee, or occupant of any land to fill up or disinfect any well on such land, and the owner, lessee, or occupier shall thereupon be bound to comply with such order within 8 days time. Should such owner, lessee, or occupier fail within such time to comply with such order such person shall be guilty of an offence.

THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR THE COLONIES TO GOVERNOR SIR W. H. MANNING, G.C.M.G., K.B.E., C.B.

SIR,—I HAVE the honour to inform you that, in view of the work entailed in holding examinations overseas, the Army Council do not consider it advisable to reintroduce the pre-war conditions under which officers of the Military Forces of the Colonies and Protectorates were granted commissions in the British Regular Army, but are of the opinion that it would be more satisfactory to extend the system which was inaugurated during the War in respect of the self-governing Dominions, so as to empower the Officer Administering the Government of a Colony or Protectorate to recommend candidates suited to hold commissions in His Majesty's Regular Forces and fulfilling certain conditions as to age, &c., for nomination to the Royal Military Academy and Royal Military College.

2. It has accordingly been arranged with the Army Council that two cadetships annually, one for the Royal Military Academy and one for the Royal Military College, should be placed at the disposal of the Secretary of State for the Colonies for candidates nominated by him on the recommendation of the Officer Administering the Government of a Colony not possessing responsible government or a British Protectorate.

3. It has not yet been found practicable to issue revised regulations for admission to these Institutions under the scheme outlined above, but I have to transmit to you the papers shown on the accompanying schedule, which contain information as to the regulations governing admission, and to invite special attention to paragraph 39 of the Provisional Regulations respecting admission to the Royal Military Academy, and to paragraph 42 of the similar Regulations in respect of the Royal Military College.



4. In addition to the conditions indicated in the accompanying prints, the following supplementary conditions have been laid down by the Army Council in respect of candidates recommended for nomination by the Secretary of State :—

All candidates recommended must be—

- (i) Within the age limits indicated in the Provisional Regulations.
- (ii.) Members of families established and resident in the Colonies or Protectorates. (These cadetships are not intended for the sons of parents whose connection with the Colonies is only temporary or official.)
- (iii.) Unmarried.
- (iv.) British Subjects and the sons of British Subjects and, in the case of candidates for the British Service, of unmixed European descent. In a doubtful case the burden of clear proof of nationality or descent will rest upon the candidate or upon the parents or guardians of a candidate who is a minor.
- (v.) In the opinion of the recommending authority, suitable in every respect to hold a commission in the Army.

5. I would invite special attention to Section V. of the Provisional Regulations for admission to the Royal Military Academy and the Royal Military College, and to Appendix I., in which are set out the physical conditions requisite for cadets. In order that the Secretary of State may be satisfied that the candidates recommended for his nomination come up to the prescribed physical standard, arrangements should be made for examinations by a Medical Board before any recommendation is put forward. In Colonies or Protectorates where an Imperial Garrison is situated, arrangements for such a Board should be made with the Officer Commanding the Troops. Where this is not possible, it will be left to the discretion of the Officer Administering the Government of the Colony or Protectorate to make the most suitable arrangements for examinations practicable under the circumstances.

Candidates who are passed fit at such medical examination will not be required to undergo a further medical examination prior to their entry to the Royal Military Academy or Royal Military College, provided that the medical standard reached is the same as that laid down in the Provisional Regulations for admission to these Institutions.

6. As regards the educational standard requisite in candidates, it will be observed that no specific regulations have been made, but sufficient indication it is thought is contained in paragraph 11 and in Section VIII. of the Provisional Regulations, and in the syllabus of subjects for the Army Entrance Examination contained in Appendix 2.

7. It will be observed from the Provisional Regulations that names of nominees will be required to be furnished to the Army Council by the 1st of June and 1st November in any year.

8. Should you desire to recommend any candidate to me for nomination, such recommendation should be accompanied by particulars showing that the candidate fulfils the conditions indicated in the foregoing paragraphs and in the enclosures to this despatch, in so far as they are applicable to nominees of the Secretary of State, and it should, of course, be clearly indicated whether the candidate is recommended for the Royal Military Academy or the Royal Military College, or for either; in the latter case an indication of preference should be given. Should I receive recommendations in any year for more than two nominees from the Colonies and Protectorates fulfilling the required conditions, I propose to exercise my discretion as to which candidates shall receive my nomination, and the Officers Administering the Governments of the Colonies or Protectorates who have made recommendations will be informed in due course of the result.

(3) All suitable dead and hollow trees and branchwood within the forest such as are marked by the Forest officer, though below 4 ft. 6 in. girth, should, in addition to all matured sound trees marked by him, be utilized for conversion into sleepers and scantlings or scantlings alone, as may be directed. Contractors should understand that only such portions of trees as cannot be converted into sleepers may be sawn into scantlings.

(4) Parts of logs attacked by fungus or defective parts of logs are not to be sawn into sleepers or scantlings. The

sleepers and scantlings should be sawn from sound matured wood, free from shakes, cracks, sapwood, and large or loose knots.

(5) Broad gauge sleepers are to be 9 ft. by 10 in. by 5 in. and narrow gauge sleepers 5 ft. by 9 in. by 4½ in. or 5 ft. by 10 in. by 5 in. The sizes of scantlings to be sawn are—

(6) Sleepers and scantlings should be rectangular in form, and sawn perfectly parallel, on all sides. On no account will squaring of logs, sleepers, or scantlings with an adze or axe be allowed.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 5, 1921.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 161 (13 Burghers, 92 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 19 Moors, 7 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the Census population on March 18, 1921, viz., 244,140) was 34.4, as against 36.3 in the preceding week, 28.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.5 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 140 (2 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 81 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 19 Moors, 4 Malays, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.9, as against 35.2 in the previous week, 25.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.5 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 140 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, same as in the preceding week, against 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—1. (a) Eleven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 7 in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 20 in the previous week, and 20 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Bronchitis* was registered, at Maradana, as against 4 in the previous week.

(c) One death from *Influenza* was registered, at New Bazaar, same as in the previous week. The weekly average for last year was 6.

2. Nine deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana and 3 in Kotahena, as against 21 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), as against 5 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.

4. Fifteen deaths were registered from *Debility*, 13 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 9 from *Enteritis*, 8 from *Worms*, 6 from *Diarrhoea*, 4 from *Dysentery*, 2 from *Tetanus*, and 57 from *Other Causes*.

5. Thirteen cases of *Chickenpox*, 11 of *Enteric Fever*, 3 of *Measles*, and 1 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 3, 8, nil, and 3, respectively, of the preceding week.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 80.0°, against 80.7° in the preceding week and 80.8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.992 in., against 29.905 in. in the preceding week and 29.950 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3.39 in., against 1.54 in. in the preceding week and 4.33 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

## NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following Specifications have been accepted :—

*Edward Collett Hort.*

"A process for preparing sterilized milk containing active vitamins and sterile condensed or dried milk, sterilized cream, and sterilized butter."

*Abstract.*—The inventor states that when milk or its products are heated under pressure in the ordinary manner at a temperature in the neighbourhood of 116° C. for a sufficient time to produce complete sterilization the vitamin content is reduced, the colour, flavour, and odour are altered, the sugar is broken up and the fat loses its emulsified condition; he describes an autoclave in which complete sterilization is brought about by raising the temperature to 116° C. and then passing superheated steam through the milk for 3 to 5 minutes, and by thus shortening the time of exposure to the high temperature the above-mentioned undesirable changes do not occur. The process can also be applied to cream and condensed milk, while sterile butter and dried milk can be prepared from sterilized milk.

The claims are :—

1. The process for the complete sterilization of milk or its products which consists in the passage therethrough of superheated steam under pressure for a period of time sufficient to effect sterilization but insufficient materially to affect its taste, aspect, and odour, its contained vitamins (Fat-soluble A, Water soluble B), or the emulsified condition of its fats.

2. The process which consists in the addition after sterilization of the milk is complete of sugar which has itself been sterilized before such addition.

3. As new industrial products completely sterilized milk and completely sterilized milk products when manufactured by the method and in the manner described in any or all of the preceding claims.

4. The improved process for the manufacture of sterilized full milk, sterilized separated milk, sterilized dried milk, sterilized condensed milk, sterilized cream, and sterilized butter, all containing active vitamins, and possessing the other advantages detailed, substantially as described.

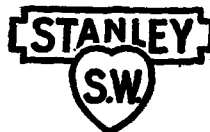

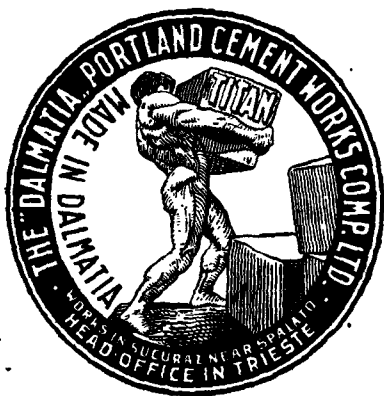
