PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of His Majesty GEORGE THE FIFTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions, beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM HENRY MANNING, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

KNOW Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the powers in Us vested by section 6 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889 and 1901," and with the concurrence of the Judges of the Supreme Court, do hereby, as from and after the date hereof, alter the division of the Island into Circuits as contained in section 5 of the said Ordinance, as follows :

For the purposes of the administration of Justice in this Colony the Island shall be divided into five Circuits, to be called, respectively, the Western Circuit, the Midland Circuit, the Northern Circuit, the Southern Circuit, and the Eastern Circuit :

And We do further hereby, with the advice of the Executive Council (and after consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court), alter the division of the said Northern and Eastern Circuits into the under-mentioned districts, respectively :—

The Northern Circuit shall comprise and be divided into three districts, as follows: Jaffna, Mannar, and Mullaittivu.

The Eastern Circuit shall comprise and be divided into two districts, as follows : Trincomalee and Batticaloa.

The said Northern and Eastern Circuits shall be further divided into divisions, as follows :—

The Northern Circuit into five divisions, viz. : Jaffna, Point Pedro, Kayts, Mannar, and Mullaittivu.

The Eastern Circuit into two divisions : Trincomalee and Batticaloa.

And we do further hereby alter the limits of the districts and divisions appertaining to the said Northern and Eastern Circuits, respectively, as set out and defined in the second schedule annexed to the said Ordinance, as follows:—

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

BY-LAWS UNDER SECTION 9 E (2) (d).

Eating-houses, Bakeries, &c.

20. (a) The sugar used in any eating-house, tea or coffee boutique shall be kept in glass-stoppered wide-mouthed bottles.

(b) All cakes, sweetmeats, and other provisions exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed glass cases free from flies. No foodstuff shall be exposed to the contamination of flies. The glass cases used shall be kept scrupulously clean.

(c) No waste tea, or coffee, or milk, and no remnants of food or cooking waste, shall be thrown on the ground, but the same shall be collected in a proper receptacle and removed daily.

(d) No person shall keep a bakery without a license from the Chairman of the Sanitary Board, Mannar District. The Chairman shall have power to fix the period of the duration of such license and to refuse to grant a license to any person for non-compliance with the provision of any rules made by the Sanitary Board in regard to bakeries, or to any person whose previous license has been cancelled by a competent court.

Any license issued under this section shall be liable to be cancelled by a court on a second or subsequent conviction by such court for breach of any of the rules made by the Sanitary Board with regard to bakeries.

BY-LAWS UNDER SECTION 9 E (e).

22. (a) Every table used in a butcher's stall shall be zinc covered. Such tables and the chopping block and all implements shall be kept scrupulously clean. They shall be washed with water and scrubbed with a hard clean brush immediately after use. All hooks for hanging meat shall be washed and polished and kept free from rust.

(b) Refuse and unsaleable material, offal, &c., if not immediately removed, shall be kept in a zinc lined receptacle with perforated zinc cover, the perforation to be of such size as to prevent flies entering. This receptacle shall be emptied, washed, and cleaned after use.

BY-LAWS UNDER SECTION 9 E (2) (f).

Anti-Malarial By-laws.

36. (a) No one shall permit water to remain unemptied in any vessels in their premises for a longer period than 3 days.

(b) On the presence of mosquito larvæ being detected in any well or other collection of water the Chairman shall be empowered to direct the manner in which such nuisance shall be abated.

Aerated Water Manufactories.

44. No person shall commence the manufacture of aerated waters within the limits of the Sanitary Board for the purpose of sale without giving one month's previous notice in writing to the Chairman of the Board.

45. No aerated water factory shall be situated less than 150 feet from any gala, stable, or other building used for keeping animals by day and night, or of any latrine or cesspit. No part of the factory shall be used as a dwelling house.

46. All premises used for manufacture of aerated waters must be well lighted, ventilated, and provided with a wood ceiling; must have cemented floors; must be provided with suitably built drains to carry off waste material; and must be kept clear and free from dirt and dust. The preparation of the syrups must be carried out in a separate flyproof room. All chemicals and other materials used in the manufacture of the waters must be of good quality. All utensils and machinery employed in the manufacture must be scrupulously clean.

47. The water used in the manufacture shall be obtained from a source adequately protected from contamination and approved of by the Chairman of the Board. It shall be transported to the factory by means which shall ensure that no pollution occurs in transit. It shall be stored at the factory in properly constructed tanks or reservoirs with dust-tight covers connecting with the aerating apparatus.

48. All waters used in the manufacture of aerated waters shall be passed through a Jewell or other filter approved by the Chairman and connected with the plant, provided that the Chairman shall have the power to exempt from the operation of this rule the water derived from an approved public supply.

49. All bottles used in the manufacture of aerated waters shall be washed with filtered water and shall be kept scrupulously clean.

50. Every bottle containing aerated water shall bear a label setting out the description of the water and the place of manufacture, the name of the person or firm owning the factory, and the number assigned to the factory by the Chairman of the Board.

51. No person under 12 years of age shall be employed in any aerated water factory, nor any person suffering from any cutaneous or contagious disease.

52. All employees engaged in the filling of bottles with gas shall wear fine-meshed wire face and neck-shields and leather gloves.

BY-LAWS re WELLS.

53. No person shall sink a well or cause a well to be sunk within the limits of any Sanitary Board town, unless he shall have given to the Chairman one month's notice of such his intention, or shall have obtained a permit from the Chairman to sink such well or cause it to be sunk.

54. The Chairman may, whenever he deems such a course to be necessary, cause notice to be given in writing to the owner or lessee or occupant of any compound in which there is a well used for drinking or domestic purposes to bale out the water and clean the well and execute such repairs as the Chairman may consider to be necessary, and if such notice is not complied with within 14 days such person shall be guilty of an offence.

55. Whenever it shall be decided by a resolution of the Sanitary Board that such a course is expedient in the interests of health, it may give notice to the owner, lessee, or occupant of any land to fill up or disinfect any well on such land, and the owner, lessee, or occupier shall thereupon be bound to comply with such order within 8 days time. Should such owner, lessee, or occupier fail within such time to comply with such order such person shall be guilty of an offence.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 12, 1921.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 188 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 124 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 26 Moors, 6 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the Census population on March 18, 1921, viz., 244,140) was 40·2, as against 34·4 in the preceding week, 24·3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24·5 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 155 (2 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 93 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 16 Moors, 1 Malay, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 33·1, as against 29·9 in the previous week, 28·2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 155 total deaths, 42 were of infants under one year of age, as against 31 in the preceding week, 44 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 15.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 4 in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in Kotahena, 2 each in New Bazaar and Wellawatta, and 1 each in San Sebastian and Slave Island, as against 11 in the previous week and 20 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's and Maradana (of a non-resident in hospital), as against 1 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year,

(c) One death from *Bronchitis* was registered at Kotahena, same as in the previous week.

2. Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 3 in Maradana (of non-residents in hospitals), 2 each in Kotahena, New Bazaar, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Pettah and St. Paul's, as against 9 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year.

3. One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered in Kotahena, as against 4 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

4. Twenty-four deaths were registered from *Debility*, 13 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 6 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Enteritis*, 5 from *Worms*, 3 from *Dysentery*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 67 from *Other Causes*.

5. Six cases of *Chickenpox*, 5 of *Enteric Fever*, and 1 of *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 13, 11, and 3, respectively, of the preceding week. No case of *Plague* was reported during the week. One was reported in the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79·8°, against 80·0° in the preceding week and 80·3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 30·030 in., against 29·992 in. in the preceding week and 29·978 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·30 in., against 3·39 in. in the preceding week and 2·73 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, October 4, 1921, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice dated September 27, 1921.

Present : Mr. T. Reid, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; the Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; the Hon. Mr. Arthur Alvis; the Hon. Mr. H. L. De Mel, C.B.E.; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford; Mr. W. C. S. Ingles; Mr. W. Philips; Mr. A. E. de Silva; Lieut.-Col. S. Boylan Smith, D.S.O., O.B.E.; Mr. E. W. Jayewardene; Mr. R. L. Pereira; Mr. T. H. Tatham; and Mr. J. S. Collett.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of September 6, 1921, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of September 6, 1921, be confirmed.

2. The Chairman read the following:—Since the last Meeting of Council two fatal cases, one of septicæmic and the other of bubonic plague have been recorded, one of the cases having been detected at Kegalla. The total up to date this year is 162, as against 97 during the corresponding period of last year.

Rat Plague.—Two cases of rat plague were recorded, making a total of 53 up to date, as against 97 during the corresponding period of last year. In order to test the efficiency of the Clayton fumigators, a rat burrow under the floor of a building was dug up after being fumigated, whereupon 31 rats were found, all killed by the fumes.

3. Pursuant to notice, the Hon. M. H. L. De Mel moved that in view of the fact that the site for the new Infectious Diseases Hospital at Kolonnawa is not now available, this Council should take steps to indicate to Government a central site suitable for the purpose. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.

The Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford spoke to the motion.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved, as an amendment, that the matter be referred to the Sanitation Committee for re-consideration. The Chairman seconded. The amendment was put to the Meeting and carried.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 4 to 10 (inclusive) on the agenda. The Hon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

(Council in Committee.)

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Special and the Standing Committees, named, were then laid before the Council in Committee:—

Extract from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees on (Law, Sanitation, Finance, and Works) of September 24, 1921

(1) To consider the applications for the post of Expert Assessor.—Recommended that an Assessor be appointed on three years' probation on a salary of Rs. 9,000 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 500, and that he be confirmed in the post if his work is satisfactory on the same scale of increments, rising to Rs. 15,000, per annum. Dr. E. V. Ratnam alone dissenting.

Recommended that a travelling allowance of Rs. 150 a month be attached to the post. Recommended that the Assessor's Department be independent of the Finance Department. Recommended that free passages be granted to the officer selected and his family on appointment and at the end of three years, if not confirmed.—Carried.

Recommended that the post be offered to Captain E. G. Eastman, O.B.E., and that Captain H. G. Lyne be offered the post, if Captain Eastman does not accept it.

Recommended that no temporary Assessor be appointed to assess the Harbour area, as the permanent Assessor may be expected before the end of the year.

Resolution.

With regard to the above item, the Chairman stated that since the Four Standing Committees met, Captain H. G. Lyne had withdrawn his application, and Captain Eastman had cabled requesting an early decision.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam opposed the recommendation as regards the permanent employment of an Assessor, primarily on the ground of a want of consistency in the Council's policy.

The Chairman stated the reasons for the contemplated departure from the previous decision regarding the employment of an Expert Assessor for a few years, and the difficulties experienced in securing the services of a capable man for temporary employment. He also explained the necessity for a permanent Assessor.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo supported the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees and moved that it be adopted, subject to the deletion of the words "and that Captain H. G. Lyne be offered the post if Captain Eastman does not accept it." The Hon. Mr. H. L. De Mel seconded.—Carried.

Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of September 24, 1921.

(4) To consider the legal questions involved in the application from the Mercantile Cricket Association for permission to erect a small pavilion, subject to the position and plans being approved by the Chairman.—Papers to be circulated for the opinion of Members, and then to be submitted to Council.

(5) To recommend street lines for that portion of Dean's road between Symond's road and Maradana as indicated in plan No. 64, dated January, 1915, and signed by Mr. N. M. Ingram, Works Engineer.—Recommended that street lines following the existing street boundaries be adopted.

Resolutions.

(4) To consider a memorandum No. 182 of the Acting City Sanitation Engineer, dated August 8, 1921, recommending house allowance of Rs. 600 per annum to each of the following officers:—(1) Foreman of minor pumping stations, Mr. G. L. Siebel; (2) Foreman of sewers, Mr. E. O. Abdul Wahid.—Recommended that the allowances be granted temporarily from January 1, 1922, pending revision of salaries and allowances of Municipal Officers, or prior to that date if they occupy houses in the required area before January, 1922.

(6) To recommend supplementary provision of Rs. 2,737 under Vote M 65 (I), "Temple road, Tipping Depot" (City Sanitation Department), owing to the payment of Rs. 5,000 for land acquisition against a provision of Rs. 2,263 only.—Recommended.

(24) To re-consider the question of leasing Municipal Council premises No. 2, Hulftsdorp street.—Recommended to give the premises to Mr. J. Crosby Rodrigo at Rs. 70 per month (inclusive of rates), if Mr. A. Talaivasingham does not deposit Rs. 210 by September 30.

"Improvements in pneumatic tyre valves for wheeled vehicles and the like."

Abstract.—The applicants describe a form of valve which is automatic in action and will come into action when, owing to rise of temperature or other cause, the pressure in the tyre exceeds a predetermined value (which is adjustable at will). The centre stem of the valve is pressed on to its seating to give an airtight joint, by a screwed sleeve pressing on a coiled cylindrical spring; the compression of the spring is altered by means of the screwed sleeve to the desired value, and the sleeve is then fixed by a locking nut.

If the air pressure in the tube increases sufficiently, it will be able to overcome the compression of the spring, and so the stem will rise from its seat and air will escape through the passages provided.

The claims are:—

1. In pneumatic tyre valves for wheeled vehicles and the like, providing a spring loaded release valve and means of adjustment of it and means of locking it, so that the said valve can lift and release air when the air pressure within the tyre and/or tube exceeds a predetermined limit.

2. In pneumatic tyre valves for wheeled vehicles and the like, seating the usual retaining valve on a seating which is itself movable and adjustable, and which can lift when the pressure of air within the pneumatic tyre and/or its tube exceeds a predetermined limit.

3. In pneumatic tyre valves for wheeled vehicles and the like, constructing and adapting the centre stem as a spring loaded valve which is made to seat itself on a prepared face in the valve body or stem; the said centre stem being loaded to lift at a predetermined limit of pressure by adjusting a screwed sleeve or the like which can compress a cylindrical coiled spring or the like that is interposed between that sleeve and the back of the said release valve; and locking it with a lock nut or the like.

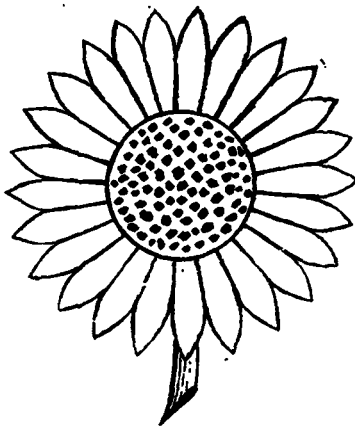
