NOW Ye that We, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 25 of "The Co-operative Credit Societies Ordinance, 1911," do hereby remit—

- (a) The stamp duty with which, under any law for the time being in force, instruments executed by or on behalf of "The Tammannewa Co-operative Credit Society," "The Kiran Co-operative Credit Society," "The Kalmunai-Pandurupu Co-operative Credit Society," "The Tampiluvil Co-operative Credit Society," or by an officer or member, and relating to the business of such societies, or any class of such instruments, are respectively chargeable.
- (b) Any fee payable by such societies under the law of registration for the time being in force.

And whereas the said John Nicolas Agapiou has taken the oath of allegiance prescribed by section 4 of the said Ordinance, and has produced to Us a certificate of his having taken and subscribed such oath and of the date of his taking and subscribing the same, and We are satisfied that the said John Nicolas Agapiou has taken the prescribed oath within the period specified in the said section of the said Ordinance;

Now know Ye that We, Sir William Henry Manning, K.C.M.G., K.B.E., C.B., Governor of Ceylon, do hereby grant to the said John Nicolas Agapiou all the rights and privileges of a British subject, and declare that the said John Nicolas Agapiou shall, within the limits of this Colony, be entitled to all political and other rights, powers, and privileges, and be subject to all obligations to which a natural born British subject is entitled or subject.

GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

Order by the Governor in Executive Council under "The Ceylon (Legislative Council)
Order in Council, 1920," Clause 64.

WHEREAS the principle underlying the provisions of clause 24 (e) of "The Ceylon (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1920," is that all persons, not otherwise disqualified, shall be entitled to be registered as electors in the registers relating to the electoral districts in which they bona fide have their homes:

And whereas power is given under the provisions of clause 64 of the said Order in Council to the Governor in Executive Council to do anything which appears to him necessary for the purpose of removing any difficulty which may arise as to first establishment of the Council, or otherwise in giving effect to the provisions of the said Order in Council:

And whereas it is provided by clause 24 (e) of the said Order in Council that no person shall be qualified to have his name entered on any register of voters in any year if he has not resided in the electoral district to which the register relates for a period of one year prior to the Thirty-first day of July in such year:

And whereas, by reason of the practice of subletting dwelling-houses and of the liability of persons to be temporarily absent from their homes on public service, residence for the purposes of the said last-mentioned clause is liable to be interrupted, and many persons in *bona fide* and prolonged occupation of such dwelling-houses may be prevented from exercising the right to be registered intended to be conferred upon them by the said Order in Council:

And whereas a difficulty has, therefore, arisen in first giving effect to the provisions of the said Order in Council:

And whereas the decision of the Governor in Executive Council on any question which may arise as to the intention, construction, or application of the said Order in Council is, under the provisions of clause 65 thereof, final:

Know, therefore, We, William Henry Manning, Governor as aforesaid, do hereby order as follows:—

A person shall be deemed to have resided in an electoral district for the purposes of clause 24 (e) of the said Order in Council for the period of one year prior to the Thirty-first day of July, 1920, even though, during any part of such period—

(a) He has permitted the occupation of his dwelling-house as a furnished house by some other person on a monthly tenancy or on a tenancy at will; or

(b) He has leased his dwelling-house as a furnished house for a term or terms not exceeding six months in all; or

(c) He has been absent on public service from his dwelling-house:

Provided always that during the existence of such tenancy, lease, or absence as aforesaid, his intention to return to the said dwelling-house has continued.

ITH reference to the notice dated November 1, 1919, and published in the Government Gazette of November 7, 1919, respecting the issue of War Medals to the Mercantile Marine, the following revised notice issued by the Board of Trade is published for general information.

Officers, men, and women who are qualified in terms of the notice, and who are resident in Ceylon, should apply personally, with certificates of sea service for the award of the Medals, to the Principal Collector of Customs, who has been appointed the Local Authority to receive and take the necessary action on such applications.

WAR MEDALS.

The following announcement has been made for public information :-

His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to signify his pleasure that the British War Medal which has been granted to His Majesty's Forces be granted also to the British Dominion, Colonial, and Indian Mercantile Marine.

In the United Kingdom the Medal, in Silver, will be given to those who can supply such evidence as may be approved by the Board of Trade of having served at sea for not less than six months between August 4, 1914, and November 11, 1918, inclusive; and those entitled to receive it will include Licensed Pilots, Fishermen, and Crews of Pilotage and Lighthouse Authorities' Vessels, and of Post Office Cable Ships.

In other parts of the Empire the qualifying service will be the same, but all details will be determined by the

several Governments.

His Majesty the King has also been graciously pleased to signify his pleasure that a Mercantile Marine War Medal granted to the persons who are qualified for the British War Medal, by virtue of the previous paragraph, and who can also supply such evidence as may be approved by the Authorities referred to in that paragraph of having served at sea on at least one voyage through a danger zone. For this purpose a voyage through a danger zone means-

(a) A voyage on a ship which entered or cleared a United Kingdom port, or a French port, or a Mediterranean port;

(b) Such other voyages in other parts of the world as

shall be specified in a further notice.

The Medal will be in bronze, and the riband will be green and red arranged vertically, with a narrow white line between them.

III.

The Authorities referred to in paragraphs I. and II. will determine whether any applicant is disqualified for the Medals by reason of misconduct during the war.

IV.

Officers, men, and women referred to in this announcement who, whilst serving at sea, were captured by the enemy or lost their lives through enemy action or were precluded by disablement through enemy action from further service at sea, before being able to complete their qualifying service for one or both of the medals, will be deemed to have qualified.

V.

The medals earned by deceased officers, men, and women, will be issued to their legatees or next of kin entitled to receive them.

- (6) Any Voyage in a ship which entered or cleared any of the following ports, viz. :—Cape Town. Colombo, Bombay, Aden; or which rounded Cape of Good Hope, or Cape Gabo, Australia, or Cape Farewell or Three Kings Islands, New Zealand; or which proceeded between Singapore and Hong Kong.
 - (a) From January 18, 1917, to November 11, 1918 (on account of "Wolf").
 - (7) Any Voyage in a ship on the West Coast of Africa.

 - (a) From May 15, 1918, to November 11, 1918 (on account of Ocean-going submarines).
- (9) The following are also considered as having served in a danger zone :-1 7 mg
 - (a) Masters, officers, and crews of British merchant ships employed in the Black Sea, or in the Baltio Sea, between February, 1915, and March, 1918. June, 1920.

Instructions as to the Submission of Claims, &c., in the United Kingdom.

(a) Officers, men, and women referred to in the foregoing announcement should apply for the award of the Medals to the Authority in that part of the British Empire in which they now reside and in accordance with the Regulations in force there. Those who now reside in forces countries should apply to the Authority in that part of the Empire in which they last resided.

In the United Kingdom applications should be made on the forms which are provided at Board of Trade Mercantile Marine Offices, at the Offices of Association and Unions of Mercantile Marine Officers and Men, and at the Offices of Pilotage and Lighthouse Authorities. If, however, an applicant is unable to attend at any such office, a written request may be sent to the Marine Department, Board of Trade, London, for an application form.

(b) The Mercantile Marine War Medal can only be

(b) The Mercantile Marine War Medal can only be awarded to those who have already qualified for the British War Medal in accordance with clause I. above. It cannot be awarded to any person by reason of his having qualified for the British War Medal by service in the Navy, Army, or

Air Force.

(c) Qualifying service will in all cases be service at sea, and not service in harbours, rivers, or other inland waters.

(d) Applicants who claim to have been precluded by disablement through enemy action from completing their qualifying service must submit proof of their claim.

(e) Legatees or next of kin of deceased officers, men, and women, will not be entitled to participate in the preliminary distributions of medal ribands, but must await the distribution of the medals to which the usual quantity of riband will be attached.

Legatees or next of kin should apply to the Authority in that part of the British Empire in which they now reside. Those who now reside in foreign countries should apply to the Authority in that part of the Empire in which they last

resided.

(f) The Board of Trade will be the sole judge in the United Kingdom as to whether applicants are qualified, under the terms of the foregoing announcement, for any, and if so for which, of the medals referred to.

The preliminary issue to any applicant of medal riband cannot by itself entitle the applicant to the subsequent

award of the corresponding medal.

THE following Notification regarding further areas of irrigable land available for lease for the cultivation of foodstuffs is published for general information:—

The following further areas under existing irrigation works are now available for lease for the purpose of food production:—

Nachchaduwa

1,000 acres.

Nuwarawewa

1,000 acres.

2. These acreages are only approximate, but lessees will be given entry to the leased land prior to survey, the amount of rent due under the lease being ascertained and calculated on the result of final survey.

3. The term of the lease shall be for such period as may be agreed on between Government and the lessees,

but shall not exceed a period of ninety-nine years.

4. The rent shall be a pepper-corn rent for the first ten years, and thereafter at the rate of Rs. 3 per acre per annum for a further period of ten years, after which the rent will be subject to revision.

5. All rents shall be payable annually in advance, the first payment falling due immediately after expiry of the tenth year of the lease, and subsequent payments at intervals of one year from that date.

6. Any rent which remains unpaid for more than one month from the date when it is due shall be paid with interest at 9 per cent. per annum from the date when it becomes payable.

7. If any rent remains unpaid for more than one year from the date when it is payable it shall be competent

to the Government Agent to declare the lease forfeited.

8. The lessee shall be bound to bring one-half of the land under the cultivation of food products within three years, and to bring the whole irrigable extent of the land under paddy cultivation or other foodstuffs approved by the Director of Food Production within five years. Thereafter the lessee shall be bound to cultivate the full extent annually with paddy or other approved foodstuffs.

9. The leased lands will not be liable to irrigation rate prior to January 1, 1925.

10. The timber necessary for the erection of buildings, fences, and otherworks incidental to the cultivation and development of the land may be cut from the leased lands free of royalty to Government. Government will at the same time have the right to extract all ebony and any other timber that may be required for public works or departments, but this right will be exercised so as not to interfere with the work of the lessee in opening and clearing the lands, and the lessee may make arrangements with the Forest Department for that Department taking over any valuable timber felled by the lessee and not required by him for the purposes above stated.

11. Government is anxious to afford every facility to intending lessees, and is prepared to consider any

representations with regard to the terms on which these lands should be leased.

12. Applications for the above-mentioned areas or any portion thereof should be sent in as early as possible and within ten days of the date of this Notification to the Director of Food Production, College House, Colombo.

13. Government reserves to itself the right to refuse any application without assigning any reason. As soon as an application has been received and accepted, no further applications will be entertained for the area covered by the accepted application.

14. Scantlings should be rectangular in form and sawn

perfectly parallel on all sides. On no account will squaring of logs or scantlings with an adze or axe be allowed.

15. Scantlings should be covered with sawdust or immersed in water, and be invariably placed under shade immediately they are sawn until they can be transported to delivery depots, where they should be stacked and kept under shade in the manner to be pointed out by the Forest Ranger. The logs should also be similarly stacked and covered until they are shipped.

STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 23, 1920.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 150 (2 Europeans, 18 Burghers, 72 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 31 Moors, 6 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1920, viz., 295,922) was 26.6, as against 29.4 in the preceding week, 19.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 139 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 72 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 22 Moors, 7 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 24 6, as against 26 0 in the previous week, 22 6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27 7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 139 total deaths, 42 were of infants under one year of age, as against 28 in the preceding week, 24 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 18.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Fourteen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 4 in Kotahena, 2 each in New Bazaar, Maradana, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta, and 1 each in Pettah and Slave Island, as against 9 in the previous week and 21 the weekly average for last year.

- (b) Four deaths from Influenza were registered, 2 in Pettah, 1 each in San Sebastian and St. Paul's, as against 5 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.
- 2. (a) Ten deaths from Phthisis were registered, 6 in Kotahena and 1 each in San Sebastian, St. Paul's, Maradana (of a non-resident in hospital), and Wellawatta, as against 11 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last vear.
 - (b) Two deaths of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama Hospital from Phthisis during the week.
- 3. Five deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 2 in Kotahena and 1 each in Maradana, Slave Island, and Wellawatta, as against 10 in the previous week, and 5 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. Four deaths from Plague were registered, I each in Pettah, San Sebastian, St. Paul's, and Wellawatta (the case of a non-resident), as against 5 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year.
 - One death from Smallpox of a resident of St. Paul's Ward was registered, same as in the previous week.
- Nineteen deaths were registered from Infantile Convulsions, 14 from Debility, 7 from Enteritis, 6 from Diarrhoea, 4 from Dysentery, 3 from Worms, and 48 from Other Causes.

7. Twenty-two cases of Enteric Fever; 7 of Chickenpox, 8 of Smallpox, 7 of Plague, and 4 of Measles were reported during the week, as against 11, 16, 4, 8, and 6, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.2°, against 81.0° in the preceding week and in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.976 in., against 30.010 in. in the preceding week, and 29.913 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on September 18, 1920, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated September 14, 1920.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. W. L. Kindersley, Chairman; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. L. H. S. Pieris; Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle; Mr. F. L. Goonewardena; Mr. G. de Silva; and Dr. C. de Vos.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on August 28, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.
 - The following documents were submitted:-
 - (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1919 to August 31, 1920, on account of the Municipal Fund.
 - (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
 - (c) Health Officer's report for August.
 - (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of August.
 - (e) The reservoir readings for August.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazett.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies,

standpipes, and house service taps inspected during August.

4. Correspondence: (1) Letter No. 34 of September 7, 1920, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary inquiring whether the Municipal Council agrees to the Government undertaking the work of extending the water main to Peradeniya on the terms suggested.—Resolved that the matter be deferred for consideration at the next Meeting.

(2) Letter No. 35 of September 8, 1920, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary requesting that steps be taken to remove the encroachments at the 3rd milestone, Katugastota-Balakaduwa road.—Resolved that the Council withdraw

its application to have these road reservations vested in it and that the Colonial Secretary be so informed.

(3) Letter No. 242 of August 31, 1920, from the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province, forwarding Surveyor-General's bill for Rs. 44·37, cost of survey of Crown land near the Government Dispensary applied for the erection of a granary.—Resolved that the required sum of Rs. 44·37 be voted.

5. Pursuant to notice Dr. Attygalle moved—"That this Council do take immediate steps to put up model tene-

5. Pursuant to notice Dr. Attygalle moved—"That this Council do take immediate steps to put up model tenements for the housing of the poor on the land acquired for the purpose of an Infectious Diseases Hospital or on any other available Municipal lands. The cost to be met from a loan to be obtained from Government on reasonable terms." Mr. de Silva seconded.

After some discussion the following resolution was agreed to:-

That the Superintendent of Works be asked to submit plans and estimates for a model dwelling of 36 tenements on the lines indicated by Dr. Attygalle and to submit a list of lands available, and, if necessary, to be acquired.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. LaBrooy moved—"In view of the great inconvenience caused to the public by the removal of the seats from round the lake that immediate steps be taken to replace them." Mr. de Silva seconded

It was agreed that an estimate be called for for the erection of 6 cement seats.

- 7. Papers re the proposed removal of the Public Market latrines to a site on the grounds of the Kandy Police Barracks.—Resolved that the terms of the Inspector-General of Police be accepted.
- 8. To sanction the expenditure of Rs. 1,000 for the erection of sheds, &c., at Mavilmada, in view of the prevalence of smallpox in Colombo and the likelihood of its spreading to Kandy. The Chairman proposed that the sum of Rs. 1,000 be voted for the purpose. Dr. Attygalle seconded—Carried.

9. Recommendations of Standing Committees:-

Municipal Works.

(1) That the following estimates be sanctioned:—(i.) Retail grain sheds, Rs. 3,660; (ii.) a water service to the disinfecting station at the Grand Hotel, Rs. 155.27.

(2) That the following applications for water service be allowed:—(i.) 124 Peradeniya road, A. de Silva; (ii.) 9, Ward street, R. A. M. Meera Saibo; (iii.) 195, Trincomalee street, H. B. Dullewe; (iv.) 26, 27, 30-31, King street, K. Ibrahim Saibo.

(3) That a tar boiler be purchased at Rs. 450.—Resolved that the recommendations be adopted.

10. The Chairman's Administration Report for 1919:-

The Chairman's Administration Report for 1919 having been previously circulated to the Members was tabled at the Meeting, and it was resolved that, in terms of section 102 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910 the report be submitted to His Excellency the Governor.

Abstract.—The nature of the invention is indicated in the claims as follows:—

1. A device for use in the construction of walls of concrete or the like consisting of a tube having a bar projecting from each side, substantially as described.




