MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT made the First day of December, 1920, between His Excellency Sir William Henry Manning, K.C.M.G., K.C.B.E., C.B., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof, acting for and on behalf of His Majesty the King, of the one part, and the Ceylon Steamship Company, Limited, a Company incorporated under the Joint Stock Companies' Acts, 1862 to 1886, of the other part.

Whereas the Ceylon Steamship Company, Limited, hereinafter referred to as the "Contractors," have agreed to supply a weekly service of steamers between the several ports of the Island of Ceylon hereinafter mentioned for a term of five years from the First of January, 1920, and the parties hereto have agreed to execute these presents as containing the terms and conditions by and subject to which the said Contractors shall be bound during the continuance of these presents :

Now these presents witness that for considerations hereinafter appearing the Contractors during the continuance of these presents do hereby covenant and agree with the Government of Ceylon as follows ; that is to say :—

Interpretation.

1. The following expressions as used herein and in the schedule hereto shall have the respective meanings following, *i.e.* :—

- (a) "The Colony" means the Colony of Ceylon.
- (b) "The Island" means the Island of Ceylon.
- (c) "The Inspector." means the person appointed by the Government of Ceylon to exercise in the Island the powers and duties hereby invested in the Inspector.

2. For the purpose of the Steamer Service aforesaid the Contractors will, at their own expense, equip and maintain ready for sea during the continuance of these presents the Screw Passenger Steamers whose names, dimensions, power, and tonnage are set forth and described in the schedule hereto to the satisfaction of the Inspector, who shall be at liberty to inspect the condition as to seaworthiness of the hull of each such Steamer and the general efficiency of the boats, engines, boilers, machinery, and fittings of and in the said Steamer, and shall report thereon to the Ceylon Government, and a certificate from the Inspector that each of such Steamers is fully and perfectly equipped and ready for sea shall be a condition precedent to this Contract being in force and binding on the Government of Ceylon.

3. Each Steamer shall, so soon as the Inspector shall have given his certificate of approval thereof, and not before, be deemed ready for service for the purpose of this Contract, and shall thereafter during the continuance of these presents be maintained and kept properly manned with proper and sufficient crews, and fully fitted, found, and equipped as aforesaid at the cost and risk of the Contractors, to the reasonable satisfaction of the Inspector, who shall have access to such vessel at all reasonable times for the purpose of this Contract.

4. The Steamer selected for the first voyage under this Contract shall sail on Thursday, the First January, 1920, from the port of Colombo ; the sailings of the subsequent Steamers from the port of Colombo shall be on each succeeding Thursday during the continuance of this agreement. Provided that the sailing date may be altered for docking purposes after arrangement with the Principal Collector of Customs twice a year for each Steamer mentioned in the schedule to clause 2, sufficient notice being given to the travelling public.

5. On each outward voyage the Steamer shall proceed south about, and shall call at the several ports named in the following schedule, and remain thereat respectively during the time set opposite to the name of each port in the same schedule (that is to say) :—

Galle ..	Not less than 4 hours of daylight.

On each homeward voyage from Kankesanturai or Jaffna to Colombo the Steamer shall call at the several ports named in the following schedule, and remain thereat respectively during the time set opposite to the name of each port in the same schedule, and shall have the option of calling at one or more of the Indian ports named in the 8th clause of this agreement. Provided, however, that a Steamer calling at any Indian port shall, both on the outward and homeward voyages, reserve space at the aforesaid ports in the Island for cargo, of which

intimation shall have been given to the Contractors or their Agents before the Steamer leaves Colombo on her outward voyage:—

6. For the purpose of the last preceding clause, hours of daylight shall be reckoned only between sunrise and sunset.

7. The period of detention at any of the aforesaid ports may, on any occasion and for special cause, be reduced, with the written sanction of the Chief Revenue Officer at that port.

8. The time occupied on the voyage between two successive ports in either direction shall not exceed the following times respectively, such times being reckoned from the time when the Steamer weighs anchor or casts off from the pier or quay at one port to the time when she is brought to ready to discharge passengers and cargo at the next port:—

9. The duration of every voyage, and the actual time of weighing anchor or casting off as aforesaid at each port, and the time of bringing to at the next port ready to discharge passengers and cargo, shall be certified by a record under the hand of the Captain of the Steamer, to be verified, if required, by production of the Steamer's log and by statutory declaration or otherwise to the satisfaction of the Governor, and the Captain shall, on the return of the Steamer to Colombo at the end of each voyage, deliver such record to the Master Attendant at Colombo.

10. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think it expedient, either for any purpose connected with the holding of the Supreme Court of the Colony at any of the said ports or otherwise by notice under his hand, at any time, or from time to time, to alter or extend, either generally or for any one or more occasions, the times hereby appointed for the sailing of the Steamer or the periods of detention at the several ports respectively.

11. If and whenever the Contractors shall fail to despatch any Steamer on the day hereby appointed or to be appointed as aforesaid for the sailing thereof, or within such period thereafter as the Inspector may allow, the Contractors shall pay to the Government by way of liquidated damages the sum of Rupees One thousand Five hundred (Rs. 1,500) for every such default, and the same may be recovered accordingly, or may, at the option of the Government, be set off against and deducted from any moneys payable to the Contractors under these presents.

“Hours of daylight” how to be reckoned. Period of detention may be reduced.

Time of voyage between two successive ports, how such time to be reckoned.

Duration of every voyage, time of weighing anchor, &c., to be certified and proved if required.

Power to Governor to alter or extend times appointed for sailing, or period of detention at ports.

Liability of Contractors for delay in despatching Steamer.

Penalty for delay in voyage.

12. The Contractors shall forfeit and pay on demand to the Government of this Colony a penalty of Rupees Fifteen (Rs. 15) for every complete hour and for every part of an hour over any complete hour or multiple of an hour by which any voyage between any two successive ports shall exceed in duration the time allotted therefor under these presents, unless the Government think fit to waive the same.

Proviso for stress of weather accidents.

13. Provided always that no penalty shall be payable in case of any delay either in sailing or on the voyage which the Contractors shall prove to the reasonable satisfaction of the Master Attendant to have been solely due to stress of weather or some accident not attributable to their neglect or default, or other unforeseen event not within their control.

Passengers and merchandise to be conveyed according to regulations and conditions set forth in schedule.

14. On each and every voyage the Contractors will convey as passengers, subject a hereinafter mentioned, all persons who shall be desirous of travelling by Steamer between the several ports aforesaid, subject to and in accordance with the regulations and conditions set forth in that behalf in the schedule hereto, and also receive, convey, and deliver at, from, and to the several ports aforesaid all such merchandise, goods, and cargo as shall be tendered to them for that purpose, subject to and in accordance with the regulations and conditions set forth in that behalf in the same schedule. Provided always that the number of passengers to be conveyed by any Steamer shall not exceed such number of each class respectively as the Inspector shall certify to be the maximum number to be so carried, and the amount of merchandise, goods, and cargo to be carried thereby at any one time shall likewise not exceed the quantity which shall be likewise certified to be the maximum quantity to be so carried.

Maximum number of passengers and amount of merchandise to be conveyed and carried.

Rates and charges for conveyance of passengers and merchandise not to exceed rates and charges in schedule.

15. The rates and charges to be paid by passengers between the said several ports and for the conveyance of merchandise, goods, and cargo shall not exceed the several rates and charges set forth in the said schedule. Provided always that the rates and charges to be paid as aforesaid may, upon sufficient cause in that behalf being shown to the satisfaction of the Government, by reason of the change in the value of the rupee or otherwise (such satisfaction to be certified in writing under the hand of the Colonial Secretary), be raised above, but not so as to exceed by more than 20 per cent., the rates and charges specified in the said schedule. Provided also that a reduction of 10 per cent. on ordinary rates shall be made in the case of passengers who are persons in the employment of Government, and goods and cargo transmitted by or for the purpose of Government.

List of rates and charges and time table of sailings to be set up for public inspection.

16. The Contractors shall from time to time supply to the Principal Collector of Customs at Colombo and keep set up for public inspection at the office of their Agents at each of the ports aforesaid a list of the rates and charges for the time being in force, and a table of the ordinary times of the sailing of the Steamers.

Steamer if required by Governor on special occasions and for special purposes to make special trips at rates and charges mentioned in schedule. Contractors not to be liable for non-performance of Contract if performance prevented by compliance with provisions of this clause.

17. The Steamers shall, if so required by the Governor by order under his hand, on special occasions and for special purposes make special trips for the purposes of the Government, and shall be paid in respect thereof the several rates and charges mentioned in that behalf in the said schedule, but such special rates and charges shall apply only to persons in the employment of the Government and goods and cargo transmitted by or for the purposes of the Government on such occasions. All other passengers and goods (if any) carried on such special trips shall be conveyed at ordinary rates. Provided always that no penalty or other liability shall be imposed on or incurred by the Contractors by reason of their non-performance of the other provisions and requirements of this Contract, so far as the performance thereof may be prevented by their compliance with any requisition under this present clause.

Subsidy, how and when payable.

18. In addition to the rates and charges to be received by the Contractors as aforesaid for the conveyance of passengers, merchandise, goods, and cargo as aforesaid by their steamers which the Contractors shall retain for their own use, there shall be paid by way of subsidy to the Contractors by the Government, subject as hereinafter mentioned, the sum of £6,000 sterling per annum by equal quarterly payments, whereof the first payment shall become due on the expiration of three calendar months from the commencement of the first voyage of a Steamer from Colombo under this Contract, and each quarterly instalment thereof shall be paid within seven days after the Contractors shall have obtained from the Colonial Secretary a certificate that the terms of this Contract have been duly complied with by the Contractors up to the day on which such instalment shall have become due, and showing the amount payable to the Contractors after deducting any fines or penalties which may have been incurred by them and then remain unpaid or unsatisfied, and the payment of the said subsidy shall be conditional on such certificate being produced. In addition to the subsidy the Government will pay annually during the continuance of this agreement, a sum of Rupees Six thousand (Rs. 6,000) per annum in quarterly payments of Rupees One thousand Five hundred (Rs. 1,500) by way of compensation for the Port and Harbour Dues payable by the Company in respect of each of the two ships engaged on the services hereby agreed to be performed.

If vessel disabled or laid up, Contractors to provide another suitable vessel.

19. If and whenever any Steamer shall be disabled or laid up for repair for any period or periods exceeding in the whole six weeks in the course of any one year, the Contractors shall at their own cost provide, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, a suitable vessel to perform the voyages and services which ought to be performed under this Contract by the Steamer so disabled or laid up during the time that the same shall be so disabled or laid up over and above the period or periods aforesaid, and the vessel so provided shall during such period take the place of the Steamer so disabled or laid up as aforesaid for the purpose of these presents.

Contractors not to be exempt from Port or Harbour Dues.

20. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to exempt the Contractors from the payment of Port and Harbour Dues in respect of their Steamers, or in respect of any passengers, merchandise, goods, or cargo conveyed thereby, while engaged in the fulfilment of this Contract

Power to the Governor to determine Contract in cases of breach of its provisions by Contractors.

21. In case the Contractors fail to keep the Steamers properly found, manned, fitted, and equipped, and in good and seaworthy order and condition, or shall, except for some reasonable and sufficient cause, fail punctually to perform the stipulated number of voyages, or to observe the provisions of this Contract as to speed, detention at ports, or any other matter, it shall be lawful for the Governor of the Colony by notice under his hand absolutely to determine this Contract without prejudice to any other right or remedy of the Government in respect of such default.

Power to Contractors to assign contract, but not to be thereby released from their personal liability, unless assignment made with assent of Governor.

22. The Contractors may at any time assign to any other person or persons, Company, or Corporation the benefit of this Contract and all their duties and rights hereunder. Provided always that no such assignment shall be deemed to release the Contractors from their personal liability under these presents or prejudice any right or remedy which the Government may have in respect of the premises, unless such assignment shall have been made with the assent in writing of the Governor of the Colony expressed by writing under his hand, and unless and until an agreement shall have been entered into in writing between such other person or persons, Company, or Corporation and the Government of Ceylon for the purpose of binding such other person or persons, Company, or Corporation for the Government of Ceylon for the due fulfilment of all the terms in this agreement contained, with such further terms, alterations, and modifications, if any, as the circumstances shall require, and as shall be required, by the Government of the Colony at the time of giving such assent. In the case of any such assignment so assented to as aforesaid, the person or persons, Company, or Corporation to whom such assignment shall be made shall thenceforward be deemed to be substituted for the Contractors for all the purposes of these presents.

As to service of notice on Contractors.

23. The period or duration of this Contract shall be five years from the First day of January, 1920.

24. All notices given to the Contractors for the purposes of this Contract shall be in writing, and shall be deemed to have been sufficiently given and served if either delivered to the Contractors or any or either of them, or to their Agent at Colombo personally, or left for or sent by post addressed to them or him at their usual place of business.

Matters in dispute to be referred to arbitration.

25. In case and so often as any difference shall arise between the Government and the Contractors or any of their agents concerning the subject-matter of these presents or any part thereof, the same shall be referred to the arbitration of two indifferent persons, one to be nominated in writing by each party, and a third to be appointed in writing by the two so appointed, and the decision or award of any two shall be conclusive and binding upon both parties hereto. In default of either party nominating an arbitrator within seven days next after request in writing to do so, then the subject in difference may be referred by the other party to the arbitration of any indifferent person to be named by such last-mentioned party alone, and such person shall be as competent to act as if he had been appointed by all the parties. All costs and reasonable expenses attending any such reference, arbitration, and award as aforesaid shall be in the discretion of the arbitrator or arbitrators appointed as aforesaid.

Governor, members of Government, &c., not to be personally liable.

26. The Governor, or any other member or officer of the Government of the Colony respectively, shall not be in anywise personally bound for the acts and obligations of the Government under these presents, or answerable for any default or omission in the observance, performance, or fulfilment of the acts, matters, or things which are hereby made obligatory on the Government.

In the event of Arugam Bay being opened as a port, Steamer to call thereat. Supplementary agreement to be entered into to adjust time table, &c.

27. It is hereby specially provided that in the event of Arugam Bay being opened as a port, the Steamer shall call there on each voyage, and remain thereat during a period to be determined by the parties on the completion and utilization of the said port, and clauses 5, 7, and 8 of this agreement shall be amended accordingly by means of a supplementary agreement to be entered into by the parties for the purpose.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO PASSENGERS.

Cabin Passengers.—The passage rates include messing, bedding, and linen only; wine, beer, and spirits may be obtained on board for payment. Should the vessel be detained in port beyond forty-eight hours after anchoring, and passengers mess on board, they will be liable to an extra charge of six rupees per day after the expiration of that time.

Passage Tickets.—These, both cabin and deck, can only be obtained from the Steamers' Agents on payment of the fare. No passenger will be received on board without a ticket. Children under five years of age allowed free, but charged Rs. 2.50 per day for messing, except infants of one year; children over five years and under ten, one-half rates, to include messing. Servants of cabin passengers, one-half deck passage rates, and Re. 1 per day for messing.

Baggage.—5 cwt. or 15 cubic feet measurement allowed to each person free; children liable to charge for passage, half that quantity; all in excess and furniture accompanying passengers to be charged freight as per agreement with Agent at the port of shipment.

Deck Passengers.—The passage rate includes water and deck accommodation only, which is restricted to that portion of the vessel before the funnel. Children under five years, free; over five and under ten, half the full rate.

Baggage.—1 cwt. or 5 cubic feet measurement, not being merchandise, allowed to each person free. Children liable to charge for passage, half that quantity; all in excess to be charged as freight.

RATES TO BE CHARGED FOR HIRE OF STEAMERS ON SPECIAL OCCASIONS.

Conveyance of Troops.—On the Steamers' ordinary trips a limited number of Troops, not exceeding 25, including women and children, may be conveyed on the same terms and regulations as deck passengers, and officers on the same terms as cabin passengers.

Should the Steamer be required specially for Troops, and other duties will admit of this, the following rates will be charged:—

From Colombo to Trincomalee and back, including 24 hours' detention at Trincomalee, Rs. 2,160 for the trip one way, or Rs. 3,600 for the voyage there and back.

From Colombo to Galle and back, including 24 hours' detention at Galle, Rs. 1,152 for the trip one way, or Rs. 1,728 for the voyage there and back.

These rates includes water and fuel, and the whole of the vessel's hold and 'tween decks for the use of the Troops. Officers proceeding by the Steamer on these occasions will be charged the ordinary cabin fare extra.

Conveyance of Supreme Court.—The Officers comprising the Court will be conveyed at the usual rates of passage; and an extra charge of Rs. 288 for each day's detention of Steamer in ports where the Court may be held.

Pearl Fishery Duties.—When employed on these duties Rs. 288 per day and the cost of coals consumed will be charged.

2. Government undertakes to take delivery of the toddy at the collecting stations on the main roads and to have it transported to the Government Distillery in a motor car at its own cost. Toddy should be delivered to the carrier at the collecting stations to be mentioned by the tenderer between the hours of 7 A.M. and 11 A.M. The toddy shall be measured in the presence of an Excise Officer at the collecting station, and again at the Distillery. Payment will be made according to the quantities received at the distillery. The total quantity of toddy required each day is 1,750 gallons. Tenders may be made in the form annexed hereto for the whole quantity or for quantities not less than 50 gallons to be delivered each day. The officer in charge of the distillery shall have discretion to accept a quantity of toddy in excess of the quantity referred to above up to a limit of 10 per cent. If the officer in

charge is unable to accept such excess it shall be within his discretion to allow the contractor to dispose of the excess in such legal manner as shall seem to him fit.

3. The toddy supplied shall be pure fresh toddy as drawn from the trees on the day of delivery to the carrier. It must in no way be diluted, adulterated, or have any substance whatever added to it. The officer in charge at the distillery will test the toddy, and if he finds it to be unsatisfactory in any respect, it shall be in his discretion either to reject the toddy or to make a reduction from the contract price for the same.

4. Each tender shall be in duplicate. The tenderer shall state clearly in words and in figures the quantity and the rate per 100 gallons at which he is prepared to supply the toddy.

5. Each tender shall be accompanied by a Treasury or Kachcheri deposit receipt for Rs. 50 if the tender is for the supply of 100 gallons or less per day, or a similar receipt to the extent of the quantity tendered for in the proportion of Rs. 50 for every 100 gallons or less to be

supplied per day. The deposits made by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned. VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the week ended December 18, 1920.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 178 (3 Europeans, 10 Burghers, 93 Sinhalese, 30 Tamils, 32 Moors, 6 Malays, and 4 Others.). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1920, viz., 295,292) was 31·5, as against 25·9 in the preceding week, 20·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21·0 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 190 (3 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 96 Sinhalese, 46 Tamils, 25 Moors, 3 Malays, and 9 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 33·6, as against 35·2 in the previous week, 37·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 190 total deaths, 46 were of infants under one year of age, as against 47 in the preceding week, 42 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 31 the average for last year.

Still-Births.—The number of still births registered during the week was 9.

1. **Principal Causes of Death.**—(a) Eighteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 13 in Maradana (including 6 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in San Sebastian, St. Paul's, and Kollupitiya, as against 24 in the previous week and 21 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Six deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Pettah, Kotahena, Maradana, and Slave Island, as against 10 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, and Maradana, as against 7 in the previous week.

2. Fifteen deaths from *Plague* were registered, 6 in St. Paul's, 3 in Slave Island, 2 each in Kollupitiya and Wellawatta, and 1 each in New Bazaar and Maradana, same as in the previous week. The weekly average for last year was 2.

3. Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 in St. Paul's, 3 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 each in San Sebastian and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Kotahena and Slave Island, as against 17 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year.

4. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena, New Bazaar, and Maradana, same as in the previous week. The weekly average for last year was 5.

5. One death from *Smallpox* was registered at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Wellawatta, same as in the previous week.

6. Twenty-one deaths were registered from *Debility*, 17 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 8 from *Enteritis*, 7 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Dysentery*, 3 from *Worms*, and 67 from *Other Causes*.

7. Twenty-two cases of *Plague*, 17 of *Enteric Fever*, 9 of *Chickenpox*, 5 of *Measles*, and 2 of *Smallpox* were reported during the week, as against 22, 15, 5, 8, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79·3°, against 77·5° in the preceding week and 80·1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·982 in., against 29·987 in. in the preceding week and 29·986 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3·00 in., against nil in the preceding week and 0·57 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Maha season: paddy plants are doing well, except in Colombo Mudaliyar's division, where the crop is reported to have been almost totally damaged by floods.

Dry grains: chenas are being prepared in Siyane korale east and Alutkuru korale north for the cultivation of kurakkan and amu, and in the other korales the work in this connection has not yet begun.

Other products: prospects of coconuts are fairly good. The estimated crop for the month is 76,914,500 nuts. There is a fairly good supply of fruits and vegetables.

Prices of staple products: (a) imported rice is sold according to controlled prices; (b) country rice and paddy are sold at Rs. 4.50 to Rs. 6 and Rs. 11 to Rs. 11.25 per bushel, respectively; (c) coconuts are sold at Rs. 80 to Rs. 90 per thousand.

"Improvements in thermionic receiving devices for wireless telegraphy and telephony."

Abstract.—The inventors state :—

This invention relates to improvements in thermionic receiving devices for wireless telegraphy and telephony, and has for its object an increased magnification of signals.

According to this invention two valves are coupled by means of a transformer formed of resistance wire with an air core hereinafter called a resistance transformer, and so arranged that the ratio of inductance to capacity is as great as possible. More than two valves may be arranged in cascade, each valve being coupled to the next by a transformer of the kind already described. In some cases the two windings of a transformer may be connected through a condenser.

The claims are :—

1. A thermionic wireless receiver comprising two valves, coupled together by a resistance transformer, substantially as described.
2. A thermionic wireless receiver comprising a cascade series of valves, each of which is connected to the next by a resistance transformer, substantially as described.
3. A thermionic wireless receiver comprising two valves coupled together by a resistance transformer, and a condenser connected between the two windings of the transformer, substantially as described.
4. Thermionic wireless receivers substantially as described with reference to the drawing.

"Improved apparatus for wireless telegraphy and telephony."

Abstract.—The inventors state :—

In apparatus comprising three electrode valves dependent for their working upon the mere change of potential of the grids troubles frequently arise owing to the effects of parasitic capacities.

According to this invention the winding is enclosed in a metal screen or sheath so arranged as not to form a completely closed circuit, and the sheath is connected to the battery which heats the filament. The effect of this arrangement is that no difference of potential as mentioned above will occur. The leading wires and the valve or valves may be also protected in like manner.

The sheath may be formed of a sheet of metal bent round the winding so that its edges do not quite meet, or of a mass of fine wire which does not form a complete circuit.

The claims are :—

1. In a wireless receiver, a metal sheath which surrounds a winding connected to the grid of a valve and is connected to the filament battery of the valve, substantially as described.

"Improvements in receiving systems for wireless telegraphy and telephony."

Abstract.—The inventors state :—

This invention relates to improved methods of receiving wireless signals by which incoming signals can be affected as desired, and may, when it is so required, be rendered ineffective.

It is well known that when two high frequency currents of different frequency are caused to act simultaneously in a current the result when rectified and passed through a telephone produces a beat tone. In certain cases this beat tone is beyond the frequency for audibility and a further process is necessary in order to make it audible.

It has now been discovered that the phase of the beat tone can be altered by altering the phase of either of the two original high frequency currents. Thus, if one of the high frequency currents has its phase shifted through n degrees, the phase of the other current remaining constant, the beat tone shifts through n degrees also.

According to this invention incoming signals are heterodyned so as to produce a beat current, and on this beat current is superimposed another current of a frequency equal to that of the beat current, the phase of the heterodyne or of the signals being adjusted so as to render the phase of the beat current such that the beat current can be added algebraically to the other current.

Thus, if it is desired to eliminate the effect of certain signals, these signals are heterodyned so that on each of two receiving aerials, which are spaced a fraction of the wave length of the signals apart, there may be the same phase difference between the signals and the heterodyne, and therefore the beat currents in the two aerials can be made to balance one another with the result that the signals are ineffective.

The claims are :—

1. A method of receiving wireless signals which consists in heterodyning the signals so as to produce a beat current, superimposing on the beat current another current of the same frequency and adjusting the phase of the heterodyne or of the signals in such a way as to render the phase of the beat current such that it can be added algebraically to the other, substantially as described.
2. A method of eliminating wireless signals which consists in heterodyning the signals so that there may be the same phase difference between the heterodyne and the signals on each of two aerials which are spaced a fraction of the wave length of the signals apart, substantially as described.
3. A wireless receiving system comprising two aerials spaced apart, means for heterodyning incoming signals, means for rectifying the currents in the two aerials, low frequency transformers connected to the rectifiers, and a balancing transformer.
