#### VITAL **STATISTICS** TOWNS IN CEYLON IN SEPTEMBER. MONTH OF 1920.

### REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

This report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

### Births.

2. The number of births registered was 1,579 (804 males and 775 females), and was equivalent to an annual rate of 28 98 per 1,000, against 25 54 in the preceding month, 23 02 in the corresponding month of last year, and 26 00 the average for the corresponding months since 1910. The rate ranged from 10.83 in Vavuniya to 66.16 in Mullaittivu.

3. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 667 (349 males and 318 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 27.56 per 1,000, against 21.23 in the preceding month, 18.73 in the corresponding month of last year, and 21.59 the average for the corresponding months since 1910. The rate ranged from 13.04 in Kollupitiya to 38.52 in Wellawatta.

#### Deaths.

4. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,575 (857 males and 718 females). There were 1,227 deaths of residents in towns, equivalent to an annual rate of 24 · 55 per 1,000, against 27 · 34 in the preceding month, 22 · 61 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27 · 60 the average for the month of September in each year since 1910. The rate ranged from 88 · 24 in Vavuniya to 5 · 51 in Nuwara Eliya.

5. In the city of Colombo the deaths numbered 537 (292 males and 245 females). There were 458 deaths of residents, equivalent to an annual rate of 21 · 95 per 1,000, against 27 · 92 in the preceding month, 22 · 67 in the corresponding

month of last year, and 26.86 the average for the month of September in each year since 1910. The rate ranged from 22 · 20 in Wellawatta to 7 · 25 in Kollupitiya.

The stillbirths registered numbered 94 (57 males and 37 females), as against 99 in the preceding month.

## Infant Mortality.

7. The mortality of infants under one year of age was equal to a rate of 178 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended September 30, 1920. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 165, against 234 in the preceding month, 213 in the corresponding month of last year, and 240 the average for the corresponding

8. In the city of Colombo the mortality of infants was equal to a rate of 168 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended September 30, 1920. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 138, against 309 in the preceding month, 227 in the corresponding month of last year, and 255 the average for the corresponding months since 1910.

# Causes of Death.

9. The highest mortality was from Pneumonia, to which 11 per cent. of the total deaths was due, 8 per cent. was due to Debility, 7 per cent. to Convulsions, 6 per cent. each to Phthisis, Diarrhea, and Enteritis, 5 per cent. to Dysentery, 4 per cent. each to Anchylostomiasis and Bright's Disease and Nephritis, 3 per cent. each to Enteric Fever and Malaria and Malarial Cachexia, 2 per cent. each to Influenza and Plague, and 1 per cent. each to Bronchitis, Prematurity, and Puerperal

10. In Colombo Phthisis and Convulsions each caused 10 per cent. of the deaths, 8 per cent. was due to Pneumonia, 6 per cent. each to Debility and Enteric Fever, 5 per cent. to Enteritis, 4 per cent. each to Dysentery and Bright's Disease and Nephritis, 3 per cent. each to Diarrhæa and Plague, 2 per cent. each to Influenza and Anchylostomiasis, and 1 per cent.

each to Bronchitis and Cancer.

Twenty-six deaths from Plague were registered (15 in Colombo and 11 in Kandy), as against 36 in the preceding

month and 5 in the corresponding month of last year. 5 deaths from Smallpox were registered in Colombo.

12. Infectious Diseases reported.—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was Enteric Fever, of which 122 cases were reported (84 in Colombo, 14 in Galle). Phthisis followed with 111 cases (98 in Colombo, Chickenpox 103 (49 in Colombo, 20 in Kandy, 5 each in Negombo, Jaffna, and Batticaloa), Measles 67 (21 in Colombo, 10 in Galle, 6 each in Negombo, Tangalla, and Ratnapura), Plague 36 (18 in Colombo, 17 in Kandy, and 1 in Gampola), Smallpox 35 (34 in Colombo and 1 in Negombo), Continued Fever 32 (20 in Colombo, 7 in Moratuwa), Dysentery 6 (4 in Panadure), Mumps 5 (in Colombo), and Acute Diarrhea 1 (in Batticaloa).

### Meteorology.

13. Rainfall.—Nawalapitiya recorded the highest rainfall (31 00 inches), followed by Hatton (16 81 inches). In 13. Temperature.—The mean temperature varied from 60.5° in Nuwara Eliya to 85.4° in Trincomalee, and was 80.8° in Colombo.
