**VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE
MONTH OF AUGUST, 1921.**

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Births.

2. The number of births registered was 1,711 (858 males and 853 females), and was equivalent to an annual rate of 29·58 per 1,000, against 30·03 in the preceding month, 25·54 in the corresponding month of last year, and 25·17 the average for the corresponding months since 1911. The rate ranged from 14·61 in Ambalangoda to 61·79 in Kalpitiya.

3. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 647 (328 males and 319 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 24·96 per 1,000, against 26·11 in the preceding month, 21·23 in the corresponding month of last year, and 20·37 the average for the corresponding months since 1911. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 8·48 in Kollupitiya to 36·38 in Wellawatta.

Deaths.

4. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,833 (954 males and 879 females). There were 1,433 deaths of residents in towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 27·00 per 1,000, against 27·26 in the preceding month, 27·34 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·90 the average for the month of August in each year since 1911. The rate ranged from 67·57 in Badulla to 6·21 in Nuwara Eliya.

5. In the city of Colombo the deaths numbered 607 (324 males and 283 females). There were 501 deaths of residents, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 22·42 per 1,000, against 24·57 in the preceding month, 27·92 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·18 the average for the month of August in each year since 1911. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 23·25 in Kotahena to 6·63 in Kollupitiya.

6. The stillbirths registered numbered 139 (74 males and 65 females), as against 121 in the preceding month.

Infant Mortality.

7. The mortality of infants under one year of age was equal to a rate of 241 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended August 31, 1921. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 248, against 257 in the preceding month, 234 in the corresponding month of last year, and 250 the average for the corresponding months since 1911.

8. In the city of Colombo the mortality of infants was equal to a rate of 230 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended August 31, 1921. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 246, against 266 in the preceding month, 309 in the corresponding month of last year, and 282 the average for the corresponding months since 1911.

Causes of Death.

9. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, to which 11 per cent. of the total deaths was due, *Debility* caused 10 per cent., *Convulsions* 8 per cent., *Phthisis* and *Diarrhoea* 6 per cent. each, *Dysentery*, *Anchylostomiasis*, and *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia* 5 per cent. each, *Enteritis* and *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis* 4 per cent. each, *Puerperal Septicæmia*, *Enteric Fever*, and *Influenza* 2 per cent. each, and *Bronchitis* and *Prematurity* 1 per cent. each.

10. In Colombo the highest mortality was from *Phthisis* and *Debility*, each of them causing 11 per cent. of the total deaths, *Convulsions* and *Pneumonia* caused 9 per cent. each, *Dysentery* 4 per cent., *Anchylostomiasis* and *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis* 3 per cent. each, *Diarrhoea*, *Enteritis*, *Influenza*, *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and *Bronchitis* 2 per cent. each, and *Prematurity*, *Enteric Fever*, and *Cancer* 1 per cent. each.

11. Three deaths from *Plague* were registered (in Colombo), same as in the preceding month, and against 36 in the corresponding month of last year.

12. *Infectious Diseases reported.*—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Phthisis*, of which 109 cases were reported (97 in Colombo), *Chickenpox* followed with 81 cases (54 in Colombo, 11 in Nuwara Eliya, 8 in Ratnapura), *Enteric Fever* 50 (36 in Colombo), *Continued Fever* 20 (12 in Colombo), *Measles* 10 (9 in Colombo), *Dysentery* 6 (4 in Panadure), *Diphtheria* 3 (in Colombo), *Plague* 2 (in Colombo), and *Acute Diarrhoea* 1 (in Colombo).

Meteorology.

13. *Rainfall.*—Nawalapitiya recorded the highest rainfall (27·82 inches), followed by Ratnapura (18·29 inches). In the other towns it ranged from 16·29 inches in Hatton to 0·01 of an inch in Jaffna and Mannar. Colombo recorded 3·44 inches.

14. *Temperature.*—The mean temperature varied from 61·1° in Nuwara Eliya to 85·2° in Trincomalee, and was 81·2° in Colombo.
