SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

Central Province.—Kandy District.

Division as defined in Proclamation dated  
June 24, 1899.

No. 36.—*Nawalapitiya Town.*

Boundaries: North by a line drawn from the Nawalapitiya end of the bridge over the Mahaweli-ganga on the road to Gorokoya estate to the 23rd milepost on the principal road from Kandy, thence to the northernmost point of the eastern boundary of the Crown land reserved as a pasture ground and shown as lot 10182 in the preliminary plan No. 3,667 dated June 7, 1887, prepared in the Surveyor-General's Office; west by the eastern boundary line of the above-mentioned allotment of land to its southernmost point, thence a line drawn to a point on the principal road to Ambegamuwa, 75 yards west of the bridge over the Penituduwe-oya, and continued along the right bank of the said oya parallel to and 75 yards from it to its junction with the Mahaweli-ganga; south and east by the Mahaweli-ganga.

No. 36.—*Nawalapitiya Town.*

Boundaries: North, along the land-marked boundary in an easterly direction, starting from the landmark on the common limit between the Warakawa and Kahamana villages to the Galpeela-ela, along the said ela till it meets the western boundary of the Dolosbage road, thence along the said boundary in a northerly direction to a point  $\frac{1}{2}$  a chain south of the 1st milepost on the Dolosbage road, and thence from the said point in a straight line eastwards crossing the Dolosbage road to the landmark on the eastern boundary of the said road, and thence along the land-marked boundary in a south-easterly direction to the landmark at a distance 11 chains from the landmark on the eastern boundary of the Dolosbage road, thence along the landmarked boundary in a northerly direction till it meets the Galpeela-ela, and along the Galpeela-ela to the culvert on the western boundary of the railway line, thence along the said boundary to the culvert on the Galpeela-ela  $\frac{1}{2}$  a chain and 10 links to the north of the  $\frac{1}{4}$  milepost on the western boundary of the railway line, and thence along the Galpeela-ela till it meets the Mahaweli-ganga and to the centre of it; east, along the centre of the Mahaweli-ganga; south, along the centre of the Mahaweli-ganga to a point 2 chains west from the centre of the railway bridge; west, from the western extremity of the southern boundary a line drawn northwards to meet the boundary defined with rail posts, and along the said boundary till it meets the ela, and along the ela to the land-marked boundary, and along the said boundary to Gansabhawa path, and along the Gansabhawa path 30 links towards north to the landmarked boundary, and thence along the land-marked boundary to the 24th milestone on the Ambagamuwa road, thence along the landmarked boundary in a northerly direction to the landmark at a distance 31 chains and 20 links from the milestone on the Ambagamuwa road, and from the said landmark along the land-marked boundary in a north-easterly direction as far as the Tawalan road, and along the Tawalan road running northwards to Dolosbage till it meets the land-marked boundary, thence along the land-marked boundary in an easterly direction crossing the Peritudumulla-oya till it meets the Gansabhawa path, and thence along the landmarked boundary in a north-easterly direction to the Nawalapitiya trigonometrical station, and thence along the landmarked boundary till it meets the northern boundary.

ORDER FOR FURTHER AMENDING "THE CIVIL APPELLATE RULES, 1913."

We, the Honourable Sir Anton Bertram, Kt., King's Counsel, Chief Justice of the Island of Ceylon, and the Honourable Mr. George Francis Macdaniel Ennis, and the Honourable Mr. Thomas Edward de Sampayo, King's Counsel, and the Honourable Mr. William Thomas Porter, and the Honourable Mr. Gualterus Stewart Schneider, King's Counsel, Puisne Justices of the said Court, do hereby, in pursuance and execution of the powers given to us by "The Courts Ordinance, 1889 and 1901," and all other powers and authorities enabling us in this behalf, order and direct as in manner following:—

1. Rule 3 (1) of "The Civil Appellate Rules, 1913," is hereby annulled, and the following substituted therefor:—

"(1) The appellant shall apply in writing to the Registrar of the Supreme Court, through the District Judge or the Commissioner of Requests, as the case may be, within the time limited by law for the completion of the security for costs of appeal for written copies of the record, stating in such application whether copies of the whole or portions only, if so, of what portions of the record, are necessary for the decision of the appeal."

2. Rule 3 (3) of "The Civil Appellate Rules, 1913," is hereby amended by the addition of the words "which shall be duly cancelled by the appellant or his proctor" after the word "application" and before the word "and" in the second line thereof, and shall read as follows:—

"(3) Payments for such copies shall be made by stamps affixed to the application, which shall be duly cancelled by the appellant or his proctor, and every such application shall state the value of the subject-matter and the nature of the action or proceedings in which the appeal is preferred."

### VITAL STATISTICS.

#### Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 13, 1923.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 208 (3 Europeans, 13 Burghers, 123 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 28 Moors, 6 Malays, and 7 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1923, viz., 249,046) was 43.5, as against 32.5 in the preceding week, 27.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.9 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 185 (1 European, 9 Burghers, 89 Sinhalese, 39 Tamils, 33 Moors, 4 Malays, and 10 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 38.7, as against 46.5 in the previous week, 35.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.2 the weekly average for last year.

*Infantile Deaths.*—Of the 185 total deaths, 35 were of infants under one year of age, as against 50 in the preceding week, 39 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

*Stillbirths.*—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 14.

*Principal Causes of Death.*—1. (a) Twenty-one deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena North, Kotahena South, and New Bazaar, and 1 each in Maradana East, Maradana South, Slave Island, Wellawatta North, and Wellawatta South, as against 31 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Ten deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in St. Paul's, 2 each in Pettah and Kotahena North, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, and Slave Island, as against 1 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Seven deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana hospital, and Slave Island, same as in the previous week. The weekly average for last year was 4.

2. (a) Sixteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 4 each in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents, and Maradana North, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena North, and 1 in Maradana South, same as in the previous week. The weekly average for last year was 12.

(b) Two deaths of residents of Colombo Town were registered at the Ragama hospital from *Phthisis* during the week.

3. Nine deaths from *Plague* were registered, 5 in Wellawatta North, 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 each in Pettah and Maradana hospital, as against 6 in the previous week, and 2 the weekly average for last year.

4. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), and 1 in Kotahena North, as against 7 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

5. Twelve deaths were registered from *Debility*, 9 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 7 from *Diarrhoea*, 6 from *Enteritis*, 5 from *Dysentery*, 4 from *Worms*, 2 from *Puerperal Septicæmia*, 1 from *Measles*, and 71 from *Other Causes*.

6. Twenty-eight cases of *Chickenpox*, 16 of *Measles*, 13 of *Enteric Fever*, and 4 of *Plague* were reported during the week, as against 41, 27, 25, and 12 respectively of the preceding week.

*State of the Weather.*—The mean temperature of air was 79.2°, against 79.0° in the preceding week and 80.4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.861 in., against 29.906 in. in the preceding week and 29.908 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.23 in., against 0.54 in. in the preceding week and 1.27 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

*Births.*—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 161 (1 European, 12 Burghers, 114 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 11 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1923, viz., 249,046) was 33.7, as against 43.5 in the preceding week, 38.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.9 the weekly average for last year.

*Deaths.*—The total deaths registered were 223 (2 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 127 Sinhalese, 45 Tamils, 25 Moors, 8 Malays, and 10 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 46.7, as against 38.7 in the previous week, 36.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.2 the weekly average for last year.

*Infantile Deaths.*—Of the 223 total deaths, 36 were of infants under one year of age, as against 35 in the preceding week, 44 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

*Stillbirths.*—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 17.

*Principal Causes of Death.*—1. (a) Thirty-four deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 14 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 6 in Slave Island, 3 each in New Bazaar and Maradana North, 2 each in Kotahena North and Maradana South, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena South, and Kollupitiya, as against 21 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Nine deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 in Kotahena South, 2 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island, and 1 each in Maradana Hospital (of a non-resident) and Wellawatta North, as against 10 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 7 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Nineteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana Hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 4 in Kotahena South, 2 each in Kotahena North, and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Pettah, New Bazaar, Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 16 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama Hospital from *Phthisis* during the week.

3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 3 in Maradana Hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in Kotahena North and Slave Island, same as in the previous week, and against 4 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in Maradana South, as against 19 in the previous week, and 2 the weekly average for last year.

5. Twenty-one deaths were registered, from *Debility*, 16 from *Enteritis*, 14 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 9 from *Dysentery*, 6 from *Diarrhoea*, 4 from *Worms*, 1 each from *Tetanus* and *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and 81 from *Other Causes*.

ENTRANCE Scholarships ten in number (five for Arts and five for Science of the value of Rs. 480 per annum will be awarded annually, on the results of a competitive examination held annually at the University College to students who have passed the London Matriculation Examination (or secured exemption from it). The date of the examination will be notified later.

2. No student will be admitted to the competitive examination who has reached the age of 19 on the first day of the examination.

3. The scholarships are tenable at the University College for a year, commencing on the 1st of October immediately following the examination, but are renewable for a further period of one or two years, subject to the good conduct and progress of the holders.

4. Candidates should apply to the Principal, University College, for a form of entry on or before June 1, which must be returned on or before June 15, accompanied by—

- (i.) The London Matriculation Certificate.
- (ii.) A proper certificate of birth.
- (iii.) A certificate of good conduct from the Head of the candidate's secondary school.

5. (a) Candidates for the Arts Scholarships will be examined in the following subjects:—

- (i.) English, including an Essay.
- (ii.) One of the following subjects:—Latin, Greek, French, German, Sanskrit, Pali, Sinhalese, Tamil.
- (iii.) One of the following subjects:—English Literature, History, Pure Mathematics, Applied Mathematics.
- (iv.) Any one of the subjects in (ii.) or (iii.) not already taken.

(b) Candidates for the Science Scholarships will be examined in the following subjects:—

- (i.) English, including an Essay.
- (ii.) Physics or Chemistry.
- (iii.) One of the following subjects:—Botany, Zoology, Physics or Chemistry (if not taken under (ii.)).

(iv.) Pure or Applied Mathematics.

(c) There will also be a paper of three hours' duration to test the General Knowledge of candidates. All candidates must take this paper, and in addition will be submitted to a *vivá voce* test.

#### SYLLABUSES.—ARTS SCHOLARSHIPS.

*English, including an Essay.*—One paper of three hours' duration comprising (i.) English Essay, (ii.) a general paper to test the candidate's knowledge of English idiom, syntax, &c.

*Latin.*—Three papers, each of three hours' duration:—(i.) translation of a continuous piece of English Prose into Latin; (ii.) Latin Unseen (passages of moderate difficulty from standard authors will be set for translation into English); (iii.) a general paper, including questions on accidence and syntax, and Roman History, and Literature. Candidates will be expected to show knowledge of the outlines of Roman History from 300 B.C. to 44 B.C., and to be acquainted with the Life and Works of Lucretius, Catullus, Cæsar, Cicero, Virgil, Ovid, Tacitus, and Juvenal.

*Greek.*—Three papers, each of three hours' duration:—(i.) translation of a continuous piece of English Prose into Greek; (ii.) Greek Unseen (passages of moderate difficulty from standard authors will be set for translation into English); (iii.) a general paper, including questions on accidence and syntax, and Greek History and Literature. Candidates will be expected to show knowledge of the outlines of Greek History from 600 B.C. to 404 B.C. and to be acquainted with the History of Greek Literature, with particular reference to the following:—The Homeric Poems, Aeschylus, Sophocles, Euripides, Herodotus, Thucydides, Xenophon, Plato, and Demosthenes.

*English Literature.*—Two papers, each of three hours' duration:—(i.) a general paper on Modern English Literature from 1579 up to the present time; (ii.) a paper on one of the following groups at the choice of the candidate:—

(a) Shakespeare, with a special study of Macbeth, Julius Cæsar, and *Midsummer Night's Dream*.

(b) The Augustan age (with special reference to Dryden and Pope);

(c) The Romantic Revival;

(d) The History of the English Novel.

*History.*—Two papers, each of three hours' duration:—(i.) a paper on *Modern British History*, 1485–1914; candidates should have a general knowledge, and a more special knowledge of any of the following periods:—

(a) 1485–1688, (b) 1660–1815, (c) 1792–1914; special attention should be paid to the History of the British Empire, particularly in the 19th century; (ii.) a paper to test the general information and intelligence of candidates, particularly in general historical, economical, and social questions. This paper will also include questions on the History of Ceylon, at least one of which must be attempted by all candidates. Much importance will be attached to this paper.

*Pure Mathematics.*—Three papers, each of three hours' duration. Questions will be set on (i) Arithmetic, (ii.) Algebra including the theory of indices, logarithms, graphs, elementary theory of equations, determinants of the second and third orders, summation of simple series, permutations and combinations, and the use of binomial, exponential and logarithmic series. (Formal proofs of the binomial and exponential theorems will not be required). (iii.) Pure Analytical Geometry of two dimensions including curves of the second order referred to their principal axes and excluding the use of homogeneous co-ordinates. The properties of the simpler solids.

(iv.) Plané Trigonometry, including complex numbers with their representation in a plane, Demoiivre's Theorem and easy applications.

(v.) Elementary methods for obtaining the values of differential co-efficient and of indefinite and definite integrals. The maxima and minima of a function of a single variable in single cases. Easy geometrical and physical applications of the principles of calculus.

*Applied Mathematics.*—Three papers, each of three hours' duration. Questions will be set on (i.) Statics of Uniplanar forces including properties of the centre of mass, simple mechanisms, simple linkages, graphical methods, and the elementary laws of friction.

(ii.) Elementary Dynamics of a Particle including relative velocity, motion in a circle, and simple cases of direct and oblique impact.

(iii.) Elementary Hydrostatics including pressures of liquids on plane areas; pressures of liquids on solid bodies, partially or wholly immersed and condition of equilibrium of such bodies; specific gravities and densities of substances, and methods of determining them (the methods of calculus will be permitted).

*Sinhalese.*—Three papers, each of three hours' duration:—(i.) translation of a continuous piece of English prose into Sinhalese; (ii.) translation of passages of varying difficulty from Sinhalese into English; (iii.) a general paper including questions on accidence and syntax, outlines of the History of Ceylon, and Sinhalese literature. Candidates will be expected to be acquainted with the works, Amawatura, Kausilumina, Pujavaliya, Kavyasekhara, Sela-lihini Sandesaya.

*Sanskrit.*—Three papers, each of three hours' duration:—(i.) translation of a continuous piece of English prose into Sanskrit; (ii.) translation of passages of moderate difficulty from standard Sanskrit works such as are generally read in Ceylon into English; (iii.) A general paper including questions on accidence and syntax, outlines of early Indian History from 600 B.C. (circa) to the end of the Kushan dynasty, and Sanskrit literature. Candidates will be expected to show some acquaintance with the Ramayana and Mahabharata and with the texts recommended in the syllabus for the London Intermediate Arts Examination (Pass) in Sanskrit.

*Pali.*—Three papers, each of three hours' duration:—(i.) translation of a continuous piece of English prose into Pali; (ii.) translation of passages of varying difficulty from Pali into English; (iii.) a general paper including questions on accidence and syntax, outlines of Early Indian History from 600 B.C. (circa) to the end of the Kushan dynasty, and Pali literature. Candidates will be expected to show some acquaintance with the following works:—Mahawansa, Jatakathakatha, and Dhammapadattakha.

*Tamil.*—Three papers will be set, each of three hours' duration:—(i.) translation of a continuous piece of prose into Tamil; (ii.) translation of passages of varying difficulty from Tamil into English; (iii.) a general paper including questions on accidence and syntax; questions on the outlines of the Early History of South India (particularly of the rise, growth and decline of the Chora, Chola Pandya Kingdoms). Candidates will be expected to be acquainted with Naladiyar, Tirukkural, Kamba Ramayanam, Villiputturar-Bharatam, Arumuga Navalur's Poriapurana Vasanam and the general History of Tamil literature, with special reference to the works of the three Tamil Sangams.

NOTE.—Candidates offering French or German should apply to the Principal for a syllabus.

#### SYLLABUSES.—SCIENCE SCHOLARSHIPS.

*English, including an Essay.*—The same papers as for the Arts Scholarships.

*Pure Mathematics.*—The same papers as for the Arts Scholarships.

*Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology.*—In each of these subjects there will be two written papers, each of three hours' duration, and a practical examination (including an oral test).

*Syllabus for Physics.*—One paper on Heat, Light, and Sound, and one paper on Magnetism and Electricity. A higher standard than that of the London Matriculation will be required.

*Syllabus for Chemistry.*—Paper I: The general principles of chemistry, chemical, and physical changes, elementary and compound substances, symbols and formulae, equations including quantitative calculations based thereon. General characteristics of chemical action and chemical change. Characteristics of acids, bases, and salts, laws of chemical combination, combination of gases by volume, the Atomic

Theory, Molecular Theory, and Molecular weights, Avogadro's hypothesis, the general properties of gases, water, the atmosphere; the following elements and their more important compounds:—Hydrogen, fluorine, chlorine, bromine, iodine, oxygen, sulphur, nitrogen, arsenic, boron, carbon, silicon, sodium, potassium, copper, silver, calcium, strontium, barium, magnesium, zinc, cadmium, mercury, aluminium, tin, lead, antimony, bismuth, chromium, manganese, iron, nickel, and cobalt.

Paper 2: Equivalent atomic and molecular weights, valency and structural formulæ, classification of the elements including the periodic classification, combustion, thermal and electrolytic dissociation, elementary thermochemistry, the ionic theory and its applications, dilute solutions, the elementary treatment of chemical dynamics and equilibrium.

Embryology of Amphioxus up to the formation of the three germ layers.

## WESTERN PROVINCE.

## COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Paddy: (a) prospect of the coming crop (maha), generally satisfactory; (b) prospect of the yield, a fair crop can be expected.

Dry grains: kurakkan has been cultivated and the plants are thriving.

Coconuts: (a) prospect of the coming crop fair; (b) probable yield is about 61,500,000 nuts; (c) estimated crop just harvested is about 61,300,000 nuts; (d) general remarks, nil.

Other products: (a) prospect of the coming crop, good; (b) probable yield, nil; (c) estimated crop just harvested, nil; (d) general remarks, nil.

Prices of foodstuffs: country rice, Rs. 5 to 6.50 per bushel; paddy, Rs. 2.50 to Rs. 3.50 per bushel; imported rice, Rs. 6 to Rs. 8.50 per bushel; maize, nil; kurakkan, Rs. 3 to Rs. 4 per bushel; coconuts, Rs. 5 to Rs. 6 per 100 nuts; salt, 12 to 14 cents per measure; any other prices of interest, nil.

Health of inhabitants: unsatisfactory. There were cases of chickenpox, enteric fever, plague, dysentery, smallpox, measles, and a mild wave of influenza during the month.

Health of cattle: unsatisfactory. At present a somewhat severe outbreak of hoof-and-mouth disease is prevalent in the Colombo District of the Western Province.

Condition of tanks and fisheries: good.

Weather: rainfall for 7 days in the month in the Colombo Observatory was 3.56 inches.

Harvest prospect: satisfactory.

General: (any other remarks of interest) nil.

## KALUTARA DISTRICT.

Paddy: the paddy plants of the maha harvest are thriving.

## MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

## Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held in the Municipal Office on December 9, 1922, at 2 p.m., pursuant to Notice dated December 4, 1922.

*Present* :—Mr. F. Bartlett, Chairman; Mr. H. M. Macan Markar; Mr. D. W. Subasinghe; Mr. C. E. de Vos; Mr. G. E. Abeywardene; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; and Mr. A. Rothwell.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of November 11, 1922, a copy thereof having been furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. G. E. Abeywardene asked :—

(1) Has the Director of Public Works sent in his specifications of the electric lighting scheme? If not, what is the cause of the delay?

*Reply*.—I have not received a reply from the Director of Public Works to my letter of November 13, inquiring if the specifications have been prepared and if I might have a copy. I do not know the cause of the delay.

(2) Are Municipal roads repaired under a contract system? If so, on what principle are contracts given, and by whom are they given?

*Reply*.—The answer is, no. Road repairs are done by unpaid road overseers, who are paid according to the quantity of work done at rates approved in the estimates by Council.

3. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That the Colombo Municipal Council be requested to allow the Galle Municipal Council the services of Captain Eastman to assess the value of the land to be acquired in the Green Market area. With the leave of Council, the Chairman added the words—"if it appears desirable" to the motion.

Mr. H. M. Macan Markar seconded.—Carried.

4. Application from the Head Clerk and Accountant that, in view of his approaching retirement, the temporary increase granted to him may be made permanent and added to his present salary.—Resolved that the application be allowed.

5. Supplemental Budget for 1922.—Resolved that the Supplemental Budget for 1922, as published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,298 of November 24, 1922, be passed.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :—

6.—*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of December 9, 1922.*

(2) Application from the District Engineer to lay water service with seven taps to the War Memorial Hospital Mahamodera.—Recommended.

*Resolution.*

Resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be approved.

7.—*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance and Assessment (meeting together) of December 9, 1922.*

(3) Estimate of Rs. 500 for building a culvert on Kumbalwella road.—Recommended.

(5) Estimate of Rs. 170 for repairing the portion of the drain from the National Drapery Stores to the turn off to Dickson's road.—Recommended.

(7) Estimate of Rs. 125 for a water cart and drum for flushing drains.—Recommended.

## Resolution.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committees be approved.

8.—*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of December 9, 1922.*

- (7) Audit fee for 1922.—Recommended that the enhanced fee be paid for the half-year, July to December, Rs. 125.
- (8) Contract for the supply of draught cattle for scavenging, night soil and water carts during 1923.—Recommended that (1) the tenderer V. A. de Silva should forfeit his deposit of Rs. 75 for failing to carry out his contract; (2) D. D. Jayasekera's tender be accepted, viz., Rs. 50 per mensem per pair of bulls and driver for scavenging and night soil carts, Rs. 2 per diem for water carts.
- (9) Petition from conservancy coolies *re* house rent.—Recommended that the seven coolies who were obliged to vacate their houses in the bazaar on the outbreak of plague be paid Rs. 4 each as house rent.
- (10) Sale of corrugated iron sheets removed from the Fort barrier.—Recommended that Mr. A. W. Winter's offer of Rs. 200 per ton be accepted, and that any other offers at the same rate be accepted. For small quantities, Rs. 2 per sheet of 8 feet.
- (11) Application from the Municipal inspectors and the Pettigalawatta canal overseer for remuneration for services rendered during the prevalence of plague.
- (a) Resolved that the Council is glad to recognize the work of the inspectors, but is not justified in voting additional pay because it was a part of their duties.
- (b) Recommended that the canal overseer be paid Rs. 3.
- (12) *Time Gun*.—Letter from the Superintendent of Police, Galle, *re* cost of firing the time gun.—Recommended that the firing of the time gun be not resumed.

## Resolution.

With regard to item (11) (a) it was resolved that Inspector Nallawangsa be given a remuneration of a half month's pay for special duties at the Segregation Camp. The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were approved.

9.—*Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of December 9, 1922.*

- (2) To consider the area to be defined as the "Bazaar area" in terms of by-law 3 of the proposed building by-laws.—Recommended that the boundaries of the area, as shown on the plan, be approved.
