VITH reference to the Notification dated December 6, 1922, and published in the Gazette dated December 8, 1922, regarding the liquidation of the Transports Maritimes do Estado, it is hereby notified for general information that His Majesty's Minister in Lisbon has learnt unofficially that the Commission appointed by the Portuguese Government to liquidate the affairs of the Transports Maritimes do Estado are prepared to pay the creditors in Treasury Bills should this method of payment be acceptable.

2. The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs observes that, in view of the present financial position of the Portuguese Government, and of the immense loss which would be entailed by payment in cash at the present rate of exchange, the projected method of payment would seem to offer the only prospect of settlement within a reasonable time. The Commission are understood to be treating directly with the creditors with regard to the settlement of their claims, and they will doubtless communicate with the various claimants in due course.

COMMUNIQUE.

1. The following Notification by the Department of Revenue and Agriculture, India, is published for information:

DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND AGRICULTURE.

Emigration.

Delhi, the 17th February, 1923.

- "In exercise of the powers conferred by section 10 of the Indian Emigration Act, 1922 (VII. of 1922), hereinafter referred to as 'the Act,' the Governor-General in Council is pleased to issue the following notification in the form in which it has been approved by both Chambers of the Indian Legislature:—
- "Emigration to Ceylon for the purpose of unskilled work shall be lawful on the following terms and conditions, namely—
- "(1) The emigrant shall-
 - "(a) Have been recruited by a person licensed for that purpose by and responsible to an officer (hereinafter called the Emigration Commissioner) appointed by the Government of Ceylon; or
 - "(b) Have applied direct to the Emigration Commissioner for an assisted passage and have been accepted by
- "(2) The emigrant shall not, before leaving British India, have entered into a contract of service for a period exceeding one month.
- "(3) Within six months from the issue of this notification, or within such further period as the Governor-General in Council may by notification appoint, the Legislature of Ceylon shall have enacted that any contract of service for a period exceeding one month entered into by an emigrant shall be void.

"(4) No part of the cost of his recruitment, subsistence during transport, or transport shall be recoverable from any emigrant, and all expenses in this connection shall be defrayed from a common fund to be raised in such manner and managed by such agency as may appear suitable to the Colonial Government.

"(5) The Government of Ceylon shall at any time when so desired by the Governor-General in Council admit and give all facilities to an Agent appointed under section 7 of the Act.

"(6) Within one year of his arrival in Ceylon any emigrant who has been assisted to emigrate at the cost of the common fund referred to in clause (4) shall, on satisfying the Agent appointed under section 7 of the Act that his return to his home is desirable either on the ground of the state of his health or on the ground that the work which he is required to do is unsuitable to his capacity, or that he has been unjustly treated by his employer, or for any other sufficient reason, be repatriated free of cost to the place of recruitment, and the costs of such repatriation shall be defrayed by the Government of Ceylon or the Ceylon Planters' Association.

"(7) If at any time there is no Agent appointed under section 7 of the Act, the Government of Ceylon shall appoint

a person to perform the duties of the Agent as set forth in clause (6).

(8) Within six months from the issue of this notification, or within such further period as the Governor-General in Council may by notification appoint, the Legislature of Ceylon shall have enacted that no payment made in India by a recruiter to an emigrant to enable him to pay off debts before emigrating shall be recoverable.

"(9) The Government of Ceylon shall furnish such periodical reports and returns as may be required from time to time by the Government of India in respect of the welfare of persons emigrating to Ceylon in accordance

with this notification.'

The Government of India has informed this Government that the notification comes into force forthwith, and trusts that the Government of Ceylon will do its utmost to secure the earliest possible compliance. The Government of Ceylon is taking immediate steps for the passing of an Ordinance to establish a common fund and to deal with the matter.

Meanwhile certain conditions require immediate action, namely, 1, 2, and 4.

3. Accordingly Mr. N. H. M. Bowden, Acting Ceylon Labour Commissioner, Trichinopoly, has been appointed to act as Ceylon Emigration Commissioner in India, under the Indian Emigration Act, with effect from March 5, 1923.

No kanganies, estate labourers, or other recruiters will be allowed to recruit unless they have a license granted by the Ceylon Emigration Commissioner. The Ceylon Emigration Commissioner is taking steps to issue licenses to those recruiters now at the coast, provided with A forms and identification slips and for the next few days until Superintendents have had time to carry out these instructions will station an officer at Dhanushkodi to meet bearers of A forms, &c., and give them directions regarding their applications for licenses.

Henceforward all Estate Superintendents and others who may wish to send kanganies or other recruiters to the coast should attach to both the duplicate and triplicate of the Coast Agency A form an application to the Ceylon Emigration Commissioner in the form heretoannexed, that a license to recruit be issued to the persons named in the A form.

Please issue recruiting license to X. Y. named in the annexed A form.

Estate Superintendents and other persons who are not subscribers to the Coast Agency and who desire to recruit should apply to the Ceylon Emigration Commissioner, Trichinopoly, for A forms, and at the same time deposit with him a sum sufficient to cover the probable expenses of recruitment and transport.

6. The Emigration Commissioner has power to refuse or cancel licenses in case of misconduct. He will see that when recruits are forwarded condition (2) is not contravened, and recruits will be informed that no recruiting or travelling

expenses are recoverable from them. All recruiters must be warned to proceed directly on arrival at their coast to the nearest Agency of the Ceylon emmission to obtain their licenses. They should also be warned that any attempt to recruit without a license Labour Commission to obtain their licenses. from the Emigration Commissioner renders them liable under section 25 of the Indian Emigration Act to prosecution, and, if convicted, to a fine which may extend to Rs. 500.

Estate labourers on the coast who do not intend to recruit and who hold identification slips or other credentials showing that their estate is willing to re-engage them if they return do not require any license, but on presenting themselves

at the nearest Labour Commission Agency may be accepted under condition (1) (b).

HEREAS, under condition (7) of the Notification dated February 17, 1923, issued by the Government of India, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 10 of the Indian Emigration Act, 1922 (VII. of 1922), it is provided that if at any time there is no Agent appointed by that Government under section 7 of the Act, the Government of Ceylon shall appoint a person to perform the duties of the Agent as set forth in condition (6) of the Notification.

And whereas no Agent has been appointed by the Government of India under section 7 of the Act, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to appoint Mr. W. E. Wait to perform the duties of Agent in Ceylon as set forth in condition (6) of the Notification.

- "THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE, No. 24 of 1889."

THE following rule framed by the Village Committees elected by the inhabitants of the subdivisions of the Province of Uva set out in the schedule hereto, under the provisions of section 16 of "The Village Communities Ordinance, No. 24 of 1889," has been approved by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in substitution for rule 76 of the rules dated June 13, 1910, and published in Government Gazette No. 5,786 of June 14, 1901:—

76. Gaming and cock-fighting are prohibited. Any person found gaming or cock-fighting, or abetting it by his presence, or allowing his house or land to be used for any such purpose, shall be liable to a fine, and to a further fine for each day the breach of this rule is continued after notice from the Police Headmen to discontinue it. The term "Gaming" includes lotteries.

9. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

Schedule.

(a) To fell all trees and saplings in a block about 120. acres in extent demarcated in Kosgahahenakele at Udukava village in the Weligam korale, the block being bounded by

private lands on all sides, except by a cut line on the northern portion of its eastern boundary or in demarcated extensions of the said block if so required in writing by the Divisional Forest Officer, Matara.

(b) Felling is to proceed in a straight line across the block from west to east or as otherwise approved of by the Forest Officer in charge and not at irregular intervals throughout

the block.

(c) The approximate distance of transport is 6 miles to Railway line.

General Conditions.

1. To convert every utilizable part of every fallen or felled tree or sapling in the said blocks excepting the boles of teabox trees marked "S" into 9,000 cubic yards more or less of firewood, to deliver the firewood at the nearest place on the Railway considered suitable by the Divisional Forest Officer at the rate of 1,000 cubic yards per month. To have always ready for transport 10 per cent. more wood than is actually delivered monthly.

2. Felling to commence within a week of signing the contract and to cease on November 30, 1923. Final delivery of wood to be made on or before December 15, 1923.

3. All herbacious and other undergrowth to be cut out in a straight line as specified above at least a fortnight before any tree sapling or tree seedling is felled. This operation must be carried out throughout the block even where no utilizable trees remain from previous fellings.

4. Thereafter to coppice-cut with sharp cutties or other suitable instrument within two inches of the ground all saplings and seedlings which are under one inch diameter.

5. Thereafter to fell with axes and immediately to coppice by means of sharp adzes cleanly and flush with the ground or as directed by the Divisional Forest Officer, all saplings which are over one inch diameter and not exceeding 8 inches in diameter.

6. Thereafter to fell all trees over 8 inches in diameter and on the same day to coppice all the stumps which are less than 15 inches in diameter cleanly and flush with the ground or at such height as may be required by the Divisional

Forest Officer.

7. In order to perform this work systematically, cheaply, and efficiently operation 3 above should be completed by a separate working party a fortnight before operation 4 commences. Operation 3 should always cover in advance a depth of the block sufficient to provide three weeks material for the firewood cutters. Operation 4 should be completed one week ahead of operation 5. Separate working parties should be assigned to the separate operations and separate workmen should be detailed to keep the coppicing tools continually sharp. Surplus sharpened tools should always be ready to hand in the felling area. The cost of coppicing in this manner is estimated at 15 cents. per cubic yard.

8. The contractor if so required by the Divisional Forest Officer shall submit a list of every carter employed by him and be responsible for the due delivery of all wood

to the Railway.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 3, 1923.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 163 (9 Burghers, 101 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 24 Moors, 4 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1923, viz., 249,046) was 34·1, as against 25·5 in the preceding week, 30·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 179 (2 Europeans, 4 Burghers, 100 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 28 Moors, 5 Malays, and 9 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 37.5, as against 39.8 in the previous week, 37.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 179 total deaths, 29 were of infants under one year of age, as against 33 in the preceding week, 35 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 13.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-eight deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 4 in Slave Island, 3 in Kotahena South, 2 each in St. Paul's and San Sebastian, and 1 each in Pettah, New Bazaar, Maradana North, Maradana East, Maradana South, and Wellawatta North, as against 41 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

- (b) Ten deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 4 in Kotahena North, 2 in Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's Kotahena South, and Slave Island, as against 13 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.
- (c) Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, and Maradana South, as against 6 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- 2. (a) Eighteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Kollupitiya, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 each in Kotahena South, Maradana North, Maradana East, and Wellawatta North, as against 11 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.
 - (b) One death of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama hospital from Phthisis during the week.
- 3. Five deaths from *Plague* were registered, 2 in Wellawatta North, and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, and Maradana hospital, as against 13 in the previous week, and 2 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. Four deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in St. Paul's and Kotahena South, as against 2 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- 5. Sixteen deaths from Debility were registered, 13 from Infantile Convulsions, 8 from Dysentery, 6 from Worms, 5 from Enteritis, 3 each from Diarrhea and Tetanus, 2 from Puerperal Septicamia, and 55 from Other Causes.
- 6. Fifty-four cases of Chickenpox, 38 of Measles, 9 of Enteric Fever, 6 of Plague, and 1 of Smallpox were reported during the week, as against 42, 32, 5, 10, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.0°, against 79.3° in the preceding week and 80.4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.959 in., against 29.930 in. in the preceding week, and 29.930 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.51 in., against nil in the preceding week and 0.15 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

SEASON REPORTS FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1923.

CENTRAL PROVINCE.

KANDY DISTRICT.

Paddy: maha season fields are blossoming and approaching maturity. A large number of fields were washed away as a result of the heavy rains.

Dry grain: kurakkan chenas are reaching maturity, and some have been harvested.

Coconuts: flowering satisfactory, and prices have

Other products: prices for green tea leaf and rubber are steady.

Prices of foodstuffs: country rice, Rs. 5 to Rs. 7 per bushel; paddy, Rs. 2 50 to Rs. 3 per bushel; imported rice, Rs. 6.25 to Rs. 8 per bushel; coconuts, Rs. 5 to Rs. 10

per 100 nuts; salt, 14 cents to 16 cents per measure.

Health of inhabitants: fair. There have been several cases of smallpox within the Kandy Municipality and its immediate neighbourhood. There were also cases of fever, measles, sore-eyes, &c.

Health of cattle: there were a few cases of hoof-andmouth disease at Ududeniya. A common pasture land for cattle in certain divisions is badly needed.

Weather: there were heavy rains during the month which caused much damage to the paddy crops.

General: the snail pest continues to hamper vegetable cultivation, and the plantain disease is practically in every part of the district.

"Improved apparatus for expanding and beading sheet metal bungs and the like in metal barrels, drums and the like."

Abstract.—The applicant describes an improved apparatus for sealing drums and the like in which a metal bung is expanded and beaded into the filling hole by means of an apparatus which forces the lower ends of a number of cylindrical annular sectors radially outwards by means of the longitudinal movement of a wedge.

The claims are:

1. Improved apparatus for expanding and beading sheet metal bungs and the like, comprising a plurality of cylindrical annular sectors hingedly formed at one end and hingedly attached to the inside of a cylindrical casing, and splayed inwardly and beaded outwardly at the other end, the said splayed and beaded ends projecting longitudinally from the said casing, and receiving diverging or converging radial motion from a screw operated conical wedge acting on the conical surface of the afore described inwardly splayed ends.

limiting and regulating the range of divergence of the said annular hinged sectors.

"Improvements in guillotine machines to adapt them to cut rubber sheets and the like."

Abstract.—The applicant describes an improved form of guillotine machine adapted to cut rubber sheets and the like in which a cam driven guillotine knife, adjusted in regard to its stroke by appropriately shaped cams, at the bottom of its stroke just reaches and engages with an ebonite or the like block without substantially penetrating it.

Improvements in processes for manufacturing Volatile or Sublimable Alkaloids like Caffeine, Theobromine and the

like from their raw products.

Abstract.—The applicant describes a process for obtaining volatile alkaloids, such as caffeine and the like from their raw products. The raw product, as for example tea dust, is raised to a temperature of about 200°C, either by external heating or by the slow combustion of the raw product in a controlled current of air; the vapours containing the volatile alkaloid then pass to a condenser where the alkaloid is condensed and retained.

The claims are :--

1. A process for extracting volatile alkaloids from their raw products by raising the temperature of the raw

products to the temperature of volatilisation of the alkaloid and condensing the vapors as described before.

2. A process for extracting volatile alkaloids from their raw products by raising the temperature by means of direct fire or hot gases or superheated steam or by allowing the raw products to burn or carbonise in a controlled current of air or any other suitable means of raising the raw product to the desired temperature and condensing the vapors so given off as described before.

3. A process for extracting volatile alkaloids by allowing the raw products to carbonise or burn in a current of air charged with water vapor or in a current of air and a current of water vapor introduced into the still to keep the temperature in the still down and condensing the resultant vapors as described above.
