WHEREAS the Judges of the Supreme Court have, in exercise of the power vested in them by section 54 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," enacted the rules and proviso set forth in the Order appearing in the schedule hereto in substitution for rules 3 (1) and (3) of "The Civil Appellate Rules, 1913," and in addition thereto:

And whereas the said rules and proviso were, in pursuance of section 53 of the said Ordinance, laid before the Legislative Council; and whereas a period of forty days after their being so laid before the Legislative Council has elapsed, and the said rules and proviso have not been annulled by the said Council:

The said rules and proviso are hereby proclaimed in terms of the said Ordinance, and shall come into effect as from and after the date hereof.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Thirteenth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty-three.

Order for further amending "The Civil Appellate Rules, 1913."

We, the Honourable Sir Anton Bertram, Kt., King's Counsel, Chief Justice of the Island of Ceylon, and the Honourable Mr. George Francis Macdaniel Ennis, and the Honourable Mr. Thomas Edward de Sampayo, King's Counsel, and the Honourable Mr. William Thomas Porter, and the Honourable Mr. Gualterus Stewart Schneider, King's Counsel, Puisne Justices of the said Court, do hereby, in pursuance and execution of the powers given to us by "The Courts Ordinance, 1889 and 1901," and all other powers and authorities enabling us in this behalf, order and direct as in manner following:—

- 1. Rule 3 (1) of "The Civil Appellate Rules, 1913," is hereby annulled, and the following substituted therefor:—
 - "(1) The appellant shall apply in writing to the Registrar of the Supreme Court, through the District Judge or the Commissioner of Requests, as the case may be, within the time limited by law for the completion of the security for costs of appeal for typewritten copies of the record, stating in such application whether copies of the whole or portions only, if so, of what portions of the record, are necessary for the decision of the appeal." •
- 2. Rule 3 (3) of "The Civil Appellate Rules, 1913," is hereby amended by the addition of the words "which shall be duly cancelled by the appellant or his proctor" after the word "application" and before the word "and" in the second line thereof, and shall read as follows:—
 - "(3) Payments for such copies shall be made by stamps a ffixed to the application, which shall be duly cancelled by the appellant or his proctor, and every such application shall state the value of the subject-matter and the nature of the action or proceedings in which the appeal is preferred."
- 3. The following additional proviso shall be inserted immediately after (5) and be numbered (6):—
 - "(6) Provided that in the event of any additional copy being found necessary subsequently to the original application, the Registrar may in his discretion supply such additional copy on application being made either direct to the Registrar or through the District Judge or Commissioner of Requests, and the provisions of this rule as to payment and scale of charges shall apply to every such application."

"THE MUSEUM ORDINANCE, 1873."

NHE following rules and regulations made by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under the provisions of section 3 of the above-named Ordinance are published for general information, in pursuance of section 8 of the said Ordinance.

2. The rules and regulations published in the Government Gazette of April 4, 1912, are hereby cancelled.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COLOMBO MUSEUM.

Museum.

The Museum shall be open to the public on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Saturday from 10 A.M. to 6 P.M., and on Sunday, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day from 3 P.M. to 6 P.M.

Visitors shall, on entering the hall, give up their sticks and umbrellas, during such time as they remain within the Museum building, to the custody of the attendant, who shall give tickets in exchange free of charge.

3. A book shall be kept in the Museum in which visitors may enter their names and record any suggestions for the improvement of the Museum.

4. A classified daily list of visitors shall be kept by the watcher in charge of the central hall.

5. Visitors are to be decent and orderly in their appearance and behaviour. The officers are to exclude all disorderly persons or cause them to withdraw.

Smoking and chewing tobacco or betel within the Museum are strictly prohibited.

7. No dogs shall be admitted into the Museum building.

Persons engaged in the study of any sections of science or art represented in the Museum, who may desire to examine any part of the collections with more attention than can be done in the ordinary way of viewing the Museum, or who may have occasion to make drawings of anything contained in the collections, shall apply to the Director for permission to execute such work. The Director shall exercise his discretion in granting or refusing such applications.

9. No officer of the Museum shall, on any pretence whatever, accept any fee or

gratuity from a visitor.

10. Any officer of the Museum who may be detected taking fees shall be liable to instant dismissal (in the case of watchers, peons, &c.); and to be reported to Government for dismissal in the case of the higher subordinate officers.

The Reading Room shall be kept open on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 10 A.M. to 6 P.M., on Saturday from 10 A.M. to 2 P.M., and on Sunday from 7.30 A.M. to 12 noon and from 3 P.M. to 6 P.M., but not on any Government holiday.

12. All persons desiring to avail themselves of the privilege of using the Museum Library shall apply in writing to the Director of the Museum for readers' tickets; should such persons be unknown to the Director, their applications must be accompanied by a written recommendation signed by two persons of respectability.

13. Readers' tickets shall be returned to the Librarian for renewal every year

on or before December 31.

14. Readers on entering the Reading Room shall sign their names in a book

kept for that purpose, and produce their tickets if required by the Librarian.

15. No persons (other than Members of the Ceylon Branch of the Royal Asiatic Society or persons holding readers' tickets) shall be admitted to the Reading Room, except on the order of the Director or Librarian. In no circumstances, except by permission of the Director, will readers and others be admitted to the private rooms of the Library.

16. A book shall be kept in the Reading Room in which readers may enter the names of any works they desire to recommend for purchase, and record any

suggestions for the improvement of the Library.

No marks or notes shall be made by readers on the Museum books.

18. Any reader found wilfully defacing or damaging Museum books will be struck off the roll of readers, and will render himself liable to punishment under section 9 of Ordinance No. 11 of 1873.

19. Except in rare cases, where books may be required for purposes of scientific research, no books shall be issued for use outside the Museum. Rare and valuable books will on no account be issued to anyone outside the Museum.

Committee.

- 20. The management of the Colombo Museum shall be entrusted to a Committee consisting of the following Members:
 - The Director, Colombo Museum (Chairman); the Archæological Commissioner; the Principal, University College; the Secretary, Royal Asiatic Society (Ceylon Branch); and such other persons as may be from time to time appointed by the Governor.
 - 21. The Librarian shall act as Secretary to the Committee.

Three Members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of all business of the Committee.

23. The Committee shall meet quarterly, unless otherwise appointed; and more frequently should occasion arise.

The duties of the Committee will be to assist the Director in matters of general policy and to exercise a supervision over the affairs of the Museum.

25. All meetings of the Committee shall be called by circular, specifying the hour and place of the meeting, and, if possible, the proposed business of the meeting. 26. Free copies of all Museum publications shall be sent to Members of the Committee.

27. The duties of the Director include the control of the Museum staff, the care and the custody of the Museum collections, and the general supervision of the Library, the buildings, and grounds, and the editing of "Spolia Zeylanica," the Museum bulletins, and other Museum publications.

28. The Director shall have charge of all the records, minutes, and accounts of the Museum, and of all correspondence connected therewith.

The Director shall extend the Museum collections (1) by means of his own scientific expeditions; (2) through the agency of paid collectors; (3) by purchase; (4) by exchange; (5) by inviting and encouraging donations; (6) by securing the co-operation of all Government officials, as well as of the Native Chiefs and

30. He shall identify and name the natural history specimens, and, in order to establish correct identifications and nomenclature, shall seek the assistance of, and

refer specimens to, distinguished specialists

31. He shall prepare an inventory of the collections, numbering and labelling the specimens in such a manner as to admit of the verifications of the collections from time to time, and he shall once in six months report to the Committee as to the correctness of the same.

32. At each meeting of the Committee he shall submit a progress report.

33. At the first meeting of each year he shall submit to the Committee 33. At the first meeting of each year he shall submit to the Committee the General report required by the Ordinance No. 11 of 1873 on the condition and progress of the Museum and Library during the preceding year, and also an account of all moneys received and expended during the said period.

STATISTICS. VITAL

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 10, 1923.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 150 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 93 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 19 Moors, 10 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1923, viz., 249,046) was 31.4, as against 34.1 in the preceding week, 25.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 160 (6 Burghers, 88 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 27 Moors, 2 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 33·5, as against 37·5 in the previous week, 33·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31·2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 160 total deaths, 38 were of infants under one year of age, as against 29 in the preceding week, 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

Principal Causes of Death.-1. (a) Twenty-one deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 4 in St. Paul's, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in Maradana North, and 1 each in Pettah, San Sebastian, Kotahena South, Maradana South, and Slave Island, as against 28 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Nine deaths from Influenza were registered, 3 in Kotahena North, 2 each in New Bazaar and Slave Island, and 1 each in San Sebastian and Maradana North, as against 10 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Six deaths from Bronchitis were registered, 2 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Wellawatta North, as against 3 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

Twenty-one deaths from Phthisis were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (incluiding 3 deaths of non-residents). 3 each in Slave Island and Kollupitiya, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, Kotahena South, New Bazaar, Maradana South, and Wellawatta South, as against 18 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.

3. Six deaths from Plague were registered, 3 in Wellawatta North, 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 in Kotahena South, as against 5 in the previous week, and 2 the weekly average for last year.

4. Four deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 2 each in Kotahena South and Maradana hospitals, as against 4 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.

5. Eighteen deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 10 from Debility, 8 from Diarrhaa, 6 from Enteritis, 4 from Dysentery, 1 each from Worms and Tetanus, and 45 from Other Causes.

6. Forty-four cases of Chickenpox, 40 of Measles, 11 of Enteric Fever, and 4 of Plague were reported during the week, as against 54, 38, 9, and 6, respectively, of the preceding week. 1 case of Smallpox was reported, same as in the

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.6°, against 81.0° in the preceding week, and 81.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. 

"Method of cutting bamboo and like woods into splints and apparatus therefor."

Abstract.—The applicants describe a method of carrying out their invention in which the internodes of the bamboo are split into convenient widths by hand and are then fed lengthwise between a pair of rollers having longitudinal grooves. The rollers push the bamboos between a pair of thicknessing knives which reduce them to the required degree of thickness. The material then passes between a pair of rolls provided with circumferential grooves, the grooves on one roller being opposite the projections in the other: here the bamboo is split to the required width and then passes to a pair of rolls with longitudinal knife edge which cut the strips to the required length.

The claims are :-

- The method of splitting bamboo and like woods into desired widths by means of a pair of rollers having encircling grooves, the rollers being arranged that the projections on one enter the grooves in the other.
- Means for splitting bamboo and like woods into desired widths consisting of a pair of rollers having encircling grooves, the rollers being arranged that the projections on one enter the grooves in the other.
- In splitting rollers such as secondly claimed, arranging the grooving in belts alternated with ungrooved belts. whether the belts having grooving of the same width or some or all have different widths of grooving, and whether or not the rollers be in the changeable with rollers having different widths of grooving.

4. In mechanism for converting bamboo and like woods into splints, thicknessing blades, with means for feeding the material thereto, in combination with splitting rollers such as secondly or thirdly claimed.

5. Means for converting bamboo and like woods into splints consisting of a pair of feeding rollers, thicknessing blades, a pair of groove encircled splitting rollers and a pair of cutting rollers.

6. Mechanism for converting bamboo and like woods into splints substantially as described and/or illustrated.
