Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the power in Us vested as aforesaid, do hereby extend “ The Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Ordinance, No. 15 of 1921,” to maintenance orders made by courts within the said possession.

#### BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. It shall be lawful for the Board to declare that any well, including the reservoir of such well, is reserved for the supply of drinking water, and to prohibit the commission of any of the following acts beside or within any well or reservoir, viz., bathing, washing of clothes, mats, or any other articles, watering of cattle, soaking of coconuts husks or branches.

Notice of such declaration or prohibition shall be posted up at the well or reservoir, and it shall be an offence for any person to do any act so prohibited, or in any other way to pollute the water of such well or reservoir.

It shall not be lawful for any person to remove water from any public well by casks or barrels, or to cause water to be so removed, when a notice under the hand of the Chairman prohibiting such removal has been posted up at such public well.

*Modification of By-law G 3 appearing in "Government Gazette"  
No. 6,887 of July 13, 1917.*

By-law G 3 to be amended to read as follows:—

It shall not be lawful for any person to mix water with any milk intended for sale within the towns of Tangalla, Hambantota, or Beliatta, or to sell or offer for sale milk which has been adulterated with water.

SIR,—I HAVE the honour to draw your attention to the provisions of the Firearms Act, 1920, and to the fact that an Order in Council of the 24th of March, 1921, has prohibited the importation of firearms and ammunition, except under license given by the Board of Trade.

2. This requirement is now being strictly enforced; and while anyone entering the United Kingdom may import a smooth-bore shotgun or shotgun ammunition without any import license, anyone in possession of a rifle or revolver, or rifle or revolver ammunition, will have to procure and produce a license from the Board of Trade before importation can be allowed. Failing the production of such a license, the weapon or ammunition must be left with the Customs authorities until the license can be procured.

3. It is obvious that the strict enforcement of these regulations will cause some inconvenience to Colonial officials, who frequently take rifles or revolvers to this country when coming on leave; but the Board of Trade do not see their way to relax their requirements in the case of persons who can prove that they are in the service of an overseas Government. The Board, however, are willing to grant licenses to import firearms and ammunition upon the production of a certificate from a competent authority who should be a Commissioner, resident, or other official exercising magisterial functions and described as such in the certificate, that the applicant is "in Government service abroad" and that the arms in respect of which he applies are his own property, and, further, that there is no reason why he should not be allowed to import firearms and ammunition into Great Britain.

4. As regards members of His Majesty's Forces I enclose for your information a copy of regulations made by the Board of Trade from which you will observe that for rifles or revolvers carried by them in their capacity as members of His Majesty's Forces no license is required, provided that satisfactory evidence of identity is produced; and that for weapons not possessed by them in their military capacity a license is required, which will be granted on production of a certificate from the applicant's Commanding Officer. I have ascertained that the Board will be willing to accept the signatures of Officers Commanding Units of any Colonial Military Force, and I enclose for your information a copy of Army Council Instruction No. 550, in which the military requirements are set out in detail.

5. Upon arrival in this country it will be necessary for anyone who has a rifle or revolver to take out a firearms certificate under the provisions of the Firearms Act, and this certificate must be produced when application is being made to the Board of Trade for permission to export the firearms in question.

6. It follows that there are two courses open to officers who desire to take rifles or revolvers to England with them. The first course is to apply in advance from the Colony to the Board of Trade asking for a license to import the firearms. Such an application should be accompanied by a certificate as set out in paragraph 3 above to the effect that the applicant is an officer in Government service abroad. The second course is to leave the weapon with the Customs authorities at the port of landing until a license is procured on application to the Board of Trade after arrival. It will be obvious that in either case a certain amount of inconvenience will be unavoidable, and I should therefore be glad if you would bring this despatch to the notice of all officers of your Government, so that they may be warned of the regulations now in force, and that those who wish to import rifles or revolvers may take the necessary steps in good time.

7. I enclose a copy of the Regulations, which will be issued by the Board of Trade, to deal with the importation of arms and ammunition by persons in Government service abroad.

## (Enclosure 1 in Circular Despatch of 9th January, 1923.)

## REGULATIONS REGARDING THE IMPORT INTO AND EXPORT FROM GREAT BRITAIN OF FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION BY MEMBERS OF HIS MAJESTY'S FORCES.

(1) A member of His Majesty's Forces *travelling in uniform* may be allowed to import or export a rifle or a revolver and appropriate ammunition *possessed or carried by him in his capacity as such*, without requiring any form of permit or license.

(2) A member of His Majesty's Forces *travelling in plain clothes* may be allowed to import or export a rifle or a revolver and appropriate ammunition *possessed or carried by him in his capacity as such*, without requiring a license from the Board of Trade, provided that he can produce documentary evidence of identity issued by the service to which he belongs.

(3) A member of His Majesty's Forces *whether travelling in uniform or not* is not allowed to import or export any firearms or ammunition *not possessed or carried by him in his capacity as such*, save under a license issued by the Board of Trade. A firearm certificate is required for the possession of firearms or ammunition (other than smooth-bore shotguns and ammunition therefor) in this country, and no export license will be granted without the production of such a firearm certificate. An import license may be granted by the Board of Trade without the production of a firearm certificate, upon the production of a certificate from the applicant's Commanding Officer or from the Department under which the applicant is serving, certifying :—

- (a) That the applicant for the import licence is a member of His Majesty's Forces ;
- (b) That the arms in respect of which he applies are his own property ;
- (c) That the Commanding Officer or Department is not aware of any reason why the applicant should not be allowed to import firearms and ammunition into Great Britain.

A covering letter will be sent with any import license granted in these circumstances, warning the importer that unless a firearm certificate is obtained from the Police without loss of time, the possessor in this country of non-service firearms or ammunition that are subject to the provisions of the Firearms Act, 1920, will be liable to prosecution.

(4) As regards members of His Majesty's Forces, *travelling either in uniform or not, in transit through Great Britain*, the same conditions will apply (*save as regards firearms or ammunition possessed or carried by them in their capacity as such*) as in the case of ordinary passengers *in transit*, except that the Commanding Officer of a Unit in transit may be allowed, without a Board of Trade license, to take custody of, and responsibility for, all non-service firearms and ammunition belonging to officers and other ranks.

It is of course to be understood that all relaxations of the ordinary requirements in favour of members of His Majesty's Forces apply only to firearms for their personal use.

No import license is necessary for smooth-bore shotguns or munitions therefor.

## REGULATION REGARDING THE IMPORT INTO GREAT BRITAIN OF FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION BY OFFICERS IN GOVERNMENT SERVICE ABROAD.

An officer in Government service abroad is not allowed to import any firearms or ammunition (other than smooth-bore shotguns and ammunition therefor) save under a license issued by the Board of Trade. A firearms certificate is required for the possession of firearms or ammunition (other than smooth-bore shotguns and ammunition therefor) in this country, and no export license will be granted without the production of such a firearms certificate. An import license may be granted by the Board of Trade without the production of a firearms certificate, upon the production of a certificate signed by a magistrate, commissioner, resident, or other official exercising magisterial functions and so described in the certificate, certifying :—

- (a) That the applicant for the import license is in the service of a Colonial Government ; or of the Government of India.
- (b) That the arms in respect of which he applies are his own property ; and
- (c) That the authority signing the certificate is not aware of any reason why the applicant should not be allowed to import firearms and ammunition into Great Britain.

A covering letter will be sent with any import license granted in these circumstances warning the importer that unless a firearms certificate is obtained from the Police without delay, the possessor in this country of firearms and ammunition, subject to the provisions of the Firearms Act, 1920, will be liable to prosecution.

## Army Council Instruction No. 550.

## 550.—ARMS AND AMMUNITION. IMPORT INTO AND EXPORT FROM GREAT BRITAIN BY OFFICERS AND OTHER RANKS.

## 1.—Arms and Ammunition forming part of Service Equipment.

(a) No Board of Trade license is required for the import and export by officers and other ranks, *travelling in uniform*, of arms and ammunition forming part of their service equipment.

It is not necessary for a firearm certificate, under the Firearms Act, 1920, to be obtained in respect of such arms and ammunition.

(b) Officers and other ranks, *travelling in plain clothes*, will be allowed to import or export, without a Board of Trade license, arms and ammunition forming part of their service equipment on production of the military certificate shown in the Appendix.

## 2.—Arms and Ammunition other than that forming part of Service Equipment.

(a) *Import*.—Whether travelling in uniform or not, officers and other ranks must obtain a Board of Trade license for the *import into Great Britain* of arms and ammunition other than their service equipment, with the exception of smooth-bore shotguns and ammunition therefor, for which no license to import is required.

This license will be issued by the Board of Trade on production of the military certificate shown in the Appendix. It is to be clearly understood that the possession of a military certificate does not absolve officers and other ranks from the obligation to procure a firearm certificate from the local Police authorities for such arms and ammunition, other than smooth-bore shotguns and ammunition therefor, as they may bring into Great Britain in addition to their service equipment, for which no firearm certificate is required. Failure to do so incurs liability to prosecution under the Firearms Act, 1920.

(b) *Export*.—Whether travelling in uniform or not, officers and other ranks must obtain a Board of Trade license for the export from Great Britain of arms and ammunition, including smooth-bore shotguns, other than their service equipment.

This license will be issued by the Board of Trade only on production of the firearm certificate which officers and other ranks are required to obtain from the Police authorities in respect of any arms and ammunition, other than their service equipment or smooth-bore shotguns, of which they may be in possession. In the case of smooth-bore shotguns, the application for a license to export need not be accompanied by a firearm certificate.

(c) The C. O. of a unit which is in transit through Great Britain may, without a Board of Trade license, take custody of and responsibility for all non-service firearms, &c., belonging to officers and other ranks of the unit.

These relaxations of the ordinary requirements in favour of officers and other ranks apply only to firearms for their personal use.

### 3.—Office Stamp.

Any military certificate issued under this A.C.I. should bear the official orderly-room or other stamp of the unit of issue.

An import license for arms and ammunition not forming part of service equipment will be issued by the Board of Trade on production of this military certificate, and an export license on production of a firearm certificate, except in the case of smooth-bore shotguns and ammunition therefor, when the application need not be accompanied by a firearm certificate.

The importation into India by private individuals of rifles of .303- or .450-bore or of parts of or fittings for rifles of such bores, or of ammunition which can be fired from such rifles, is strictly prohibited, and if such arms and ammunition are taken to India, they will be detained by the Customs authorities. No exemption is allowed in favour of sporting rifles of the prohibited bores, or of such rifles when fitted with sporting sights.

Officers holding commissions from His Majesty, officers of His Majesty's Indian Forces, persons who have been registered under the Registration Ordinance, 1917, and warrant officers or staff-sergeants of a British unit of the army (including a staff-sergeant or warrant officer who is an instructor of an Indian Defence Force Corps), may, subject to certain conditions contained in the "Indian Arms Rules," import single-barrel rifles of .303-bore required for match-shooting purposes. Only one such rifle at a time shall be imported or used by any person acting under this rule.

The re-importation of rifles of military patterns which have previously been used in India is permitted under certain conditions.

### 4.—Board of Trade Licenses.

These import and export licenses will be issued by the Board of Trade only, provided that all other formalities required by them are complied with.

† The attention of officers and other ranks is drawn to Section I. of the Firearms Act, 1920. A firearm certificate is required within the United Kingdom for all arms and ammunition, other than smooth-bore shotguns, not used by a member of H. M. Forces in his capacity as such. Application for this certificate should be made to the Police authorities.

“THE IRRIGATION ORDINANCE, NO. 45 OF 1917.”

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has, under section 45 of Ordinance No. 45 of 1917, sanctioned the following scheme which the proprietors of the irrigation area under the Pattipola-arū Irrigation Scheme have adopted by resolution under sections 4 and 39 of the said Ordinance.

SCHEME.

That an irrigation rate shall be imposed on all lands at present irrigable by the Pattipola-arū irrigation works in the Eastern Province, variable by His Excellency the Governor according as the circumstances of the paddy cultivation industry may warrant and in accordance with the following arrangement:—

(1) From the date of the meeting until the end of the year 1931, the rate leviable shall be as follows:—

- (a) In respect of A lands, 50 cents per acre per annum.
- (b) In respect of B lands, Re. 1 per acre per annum.

(2) Thereafter the irrigation rate per acre per annum shall never be increased by Government above a limit which multiplied by the irrigable acreage will bring in annually 5 per cent. on the capital cost and in addition pay the maintenance costs of the irrigation works.

(3) The proprietors of B lands shall, however, pay at the rate of 50 cents per acre more than the proprietors of the A lands from and including the years 1932 to 1936, and after that date the proprietors of the B lands shall pay the same irrigation rate as the proprietors of the A lands.

(4) For the purpose of ascertaining the limit to which the irrigation rate might be raised as aforesaid, the total capital expended on the scheme shall be taken as at September 30, 1920, to have amounted to Rs. 718,000, and to this amount there shall be added every year the cost of such further works of improvement as are carried out for the benefit of the irrigation works and irrigable lands.

In the case of women, applications may be accepted from candidates who have not passed the Cambridge Senior Examination if they are especially recommended by the Principal of their school and the Inspectress.

#### Conditions of Studentship Examinations.

- Candidates must be at least 18 years of age.
- Candidates must forward with their applications (i.) a medical certificate stating that he or she is physically fit for the teaching profession; (ii.) a certificate of recommendation from the Manager of a school or an Inspector; (iii.) two certificates of character.
- Candidates must be prepared to execute a bond pledging themselves to serve not less than five years (men) and three years (women) in a Government or grant-in-aid school after training.
- It must be understood that all students are appointed on probation for the first three months, but that even after the probationary period they are liable to be discontinued, unless a reasonable degree of promise is shown.
- All students in training must devote the whole of their time to College work.
- Students are expected to reside within a convenient distance of the College, and must be able to satisfy the Principal that their place of residence is suitably situated for study. Board and residence will be provided for a limited number of students, on payment of the prescribed charge, during the time the College is in session. Students may be required to reside in the College at the discretion of the Principal.
- All students will receive free passes by rail to and from their homes during vacations.
