**VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE
MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 1922.**

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Marriages.

2. The marriages of residents in proclaimed towns numbered 405 (355 General, 5 Kandyan, and 45 Muhammadan), as against 340 in the preceding month. In Colombo the marriages of residents numbered 131 (101 General and 30 Muhammadan), as against 132 in the preceding month.

Births.

3. The births registered numbered 1,605 (843 males and 762 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 32·29 per 1,000, against 29·24 in the preceding month, 41·73 in the corresponding month of last year, and 30·03 the average for the corresponding months since 1912. The rate ranged from 10·51 in Kurunegala to 54·53 in Ratnapura.

4. In the city of Colombo the births registered numbered 576 (304 males and 272 females), and were equivalent to an annual rate of 28·30 per 1,000, against 26·24 in the preceding month, 38·02 in the corresponding month of last year, 24·84 the average for the corresponding months since 1912. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 11·62 in Kollupitiya to 27·92 in Maradana East.

Deaths.

5. The total deaths registered during the month numbered 1,658 (923 males and 735 females). There were 1,353 deaths of residents in towns, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 29·67 per 1,000, against 24·70 in the preceding month, 33·37 in the corresponding month of last year, 30·33 the average for the month of November in each year since 1912. The rate ranged from 95·33 in Badulla to 12·64 in Tangalla.

6. In the city of Colombo the deaths numbered 608 (356 males and 252 females). There were 525 deaths of residents, equivalent to an annual standardized rate of 29·92 per 1,000, against 23·38 in the preceding month, 31·05 in the corresponding month of last year, 29·44 the average for the month of November in each year since 1912. The rate, exclusive of the Fort and the Pettah Wards, ranged from 31·27 in St. Paul's to 9·98 in Wellawatta South.

7. The stillbirths registered numbered 139 (81 males and 58 females), as against 129 in the preceding month.

Infant Mortality.

8. The mortality of infants under one year of age was equal to a rate of 230 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended November 30, 1922. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 224, against 212 in the preceding month, 225 in the corresponding month of last year, and 281 the average for the corresponding months since 1912.

9. In the city of Colombo the mortality of infants was equal to a rate of 239 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended November 30, 1922. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 234, against 172 in the preceding month, 216 in the corresponding month of last year, and 280 the average for the corresponding months since 1912.

Causes of Death.

10. The highest mortality was from *Pneumonia* to which 13 per cent. of the total deaths was due; *Debility* caused 10 per cent., *Phthisis* and *Convulsions* 7 per cent. each, *Diarrhoea*, *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia*, and *Anchylostomiasis* 4 per cent. each, *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, *Prematurity*, *Enteritis* and *Dysentery*, 3 per cent. each, *Influenza* and *Bronchitis* 2 per cent. each, and *Enteric Fever*, *Puerperal Septicæmia*, and *Plague* 1 per cent. each.

11. In Colombo, too, the highest mortality was from *Pneumonia*, which caused 13 per cent. of the deaths, *Phthisis* caused 12 per cent., *Debility* 8 per cent., *Convulsions* 7 per cent., *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis* 4 per cent., *Diarrhoea*, *Enteritis*, *Influenza*, and *Plague* 3 per cent. each, *Anchylostomiasis*, *Prematurity*, and *Enteric Fever* 2 per cent. each, and *Bronchitis*, *Cancer*, *Dysentery*, and *Malaria* and *Malarial Cachexia* 1 per cent. each.

12. Sixteen cases of *Plague* were registered (in Colombo), as against 14 in the preceding month, and 3 in the corresponding month of last year. Four deaths from *Smallpox* (3 in Colombo and 1 in Kandy) were also registered.

13. *Infectious Diseases reported.*—The infectious disease most prevalent during the month was *Phthisis*, of which 130 cases were reported (112 in Colombo, 7 in Chilaw, *Chickenpox* followed with 61 cases (27 in Colombo, 8 in Galle, 7 in Gampola, 6 in Batticaloa, 5 in Badulla), *Enteric Fever* 43 (26 in Colombo, 7 in Galle, 6 in Jaffna, 6 in Colombo), *Measles* 39 (27 in Colombo), *Plague* 18 (in Colombo), *Continued Fever* 13 (5 in Colombo, 5 in Galle), *Smallpox* 11 (6 in Colombo, 3 in Jaffna, and 2 in Kandy), *Mumps* 6 (4 in Colombo), *Diphtheria* 4 (in Colombo), *Dysentery* 1 (in Ambalangoda), and *Whooping Cough* 1 (in Colombo).

Meteorology.

14. *Rainfall.*—Negombo recorded the highest rainfall (22·47 inches), followed by Kalmunai (21·85 inches). In the other towns it ranged from 21·47 inches in Colombo to 7·27 inches in Tangalla.

15. *Temperature.*—The mean temperature varied from 61·0° in Nuwara Eliya to 80·4° in Mannar and Puttalam, and was 79·2° in Colombo.
