By-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. The areas defined in the schedule hereto are hereby declared to be commercial areas.

2. The remainder of the area within the limits of the Board of Improvement,

Nuwara Eliya, is hereby declared to be a residential area.

3. Within the limits of the residential area, no range or block of buildings wholly or mainly adapted to be inhabited in tenements by persons of the poorer or labouring classes, and no building intended for commercial purposes or for any other purpose than that of a dwelling house shall be erected or re-erected without the special sanction in writing of the Chairman. Such sanction shall be refused if, in the opinion of the Board, the situation or design or the use to which it is proposed to put the building would not be in keeping with its surroundings or would detract from the amenities of the town.

(a) Old Bazaar commercial area bounded as follows:—

On the north by Lady McCallum's Drive from the junction near Pedro View

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

12. Whenever water is found running to waste from any tap, meter, pipe, or other fitting which is supplied with water from the waterworks (or whenever the condition of any pipe, tap, valve, or other fitting within private premises and connected with the waterworks is likely to lead to waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water supplied from the waterworks for private or public use or to be prejudicial to the proper control or distribution of water from the waterworks), the Chairman of the Local Board, or person duly authorized by him in writing may at once cut off the water, and such service shall not be re-connected until the cause of the waste (misuse, undue consumption, or contamination) is remedied.

13. The Chairman of the Local Board or person duly authorized by him in writing to act on his behalf, may diminish, withhold, or suspend, stop, turn off, or divert the supply of water through or by means of any pipe, service, public fountain, or other appliance connected to the waterworks, either wholly or in part, or whenever such Chairman of the Local Board may think fit, and without prejudice to any water-rate, meter rent, or other sums due or to become due under the by-laws

hereunder:

(1) Whenever the available supply of water from the waterworks shall in the opinion of the Chairman of the Local Board be insufficient.

(2) Whenever it may be expedient or necessary for the purposes of extending, altering, or repairing the waterworks, or for the purposes of the connection of services.

(3) Whenever any public stand post is damaged or the water thereof polluted or wasted.

(4) If the construction or laying of any service by the owner of any tenement is not made, altered, or re-adjusted in accordance with the provision of these

(5) If default be made in the payment of any money due under these by laws from the owner or occupier of any tenement, or so long as such default continues, or at the request of the owner of the tenement; or

(6) In cases of fire.

(7) If any act or thing be done or omitted contrary to the provisions of these by-laws in relation to any damage, waste, pollution, or abuse of the waterworks, or of any service, meter, or public fountain.

The overflow pipes of all cisterns are to be brought out to the outside of the building and shall terminate in a conspicuous position, so that any leakage may be

15. No overflow from any cistern shall on any account be connected with any drain or sewer, or with the waste pipe of any bath, sink, or any other sanitary appliance, or with the overflow from any other cistern. Each cistern shall have a separate overflow pipe.

16. The outlet of every draw-off tap shall be in some open and conspicuous place, so that leakage may be easily detected. And in no case shall the outlet be below the top water level in any cistern, tank, or other vessel into which the tap

delivers.

No service pipe shall be directly connected with any boiler, condenser, or other mechanical appliance without the express sanction of the Chairman of the Local Board.

18. The inlet of every bath, lavatory, basin, or sink must be separate and distinct from the outlet, and the inlet must be situated at the top or above such bath,

lavatory, basin, or sink.

19. Water shall only be taken from the public standpipes for domestic purposes. Where water is required for other than domestic purposes it may be supplied at the discretion of the Chairman of the Local Board, either by meter or otherwise, and at the rates sanctioned by the Local Board.

20. All meters for measuring the supply of water from the waterworks to any premises shall be supplied and fixed by the Local Board, and shall remain the

property of the Local Board.

21. The cost of fixing meters, including labour, materials (other than the meter), and supervision shall be paid in advance by the owner or occupier of the premises to which the water service is laid.

22. All meters shall be maintained by the Local Board, and all repairs, except those caused wilfully or negligently, shall be made by the Local Board free of cost to the consumer; but in the event of damage being wilfully or negligently caused. the owner or occupier of the premises to which the water service is laid shall pay the cost of repair or renewal thereof, as the Chairman of the Local Board may direct.

Meters shall be read at such times as the Chairman of the Local Board may direct, not less frequently than three times a quarter. Whenever a meter is read a memorandum of the reading shall be left at the premises supplied through it,

addressed "The Occupier."

No water shall be drawn from the waterworks, except from the public standpipes and fountains and house services, in the manner laid down in these by laws without the written consent of the Chairman, Local Board, except in the case of fire when water may be obtained from the fire hydrants fixed in the street for

All moneys paid to the Local Board under the provisions of these by-laws shall be paid into the office of the Local Board and carried to the general revenue, and all expenditure by the Local Board in carrying out the provisions of these

by-laws shall be chargeable to such account.

No new water service shall be laid down and no alteration or repair shall be

made in any existing service, save by the Local Board.

Where any such work is undertaken by the Local Board at the request of the owner or occupier of any premises, the owner or occupier shall first deposit with the Local Board the estimated cost of the work; and if, upon the completion of the work, it is found that the amount of the deposit exceeds the cost of the work, the Local Board shall return the difference to the depositor, and if the cost of the work exceeds the deposit, the Local Board may recover the difference from the

The estimated cost of again laying on water to any premises after it has been cut off for any reason whatsoever shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such

premises, and shall be paid in advance to the Local Board.

29. In case any special fittings, constructions, appliances, or arrangements of any kind shall have been allowed for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes (such as garden taps, tanks, hose, &c.), the owner shall whenever a change of occupiers occurs, either himself pay the charge previously agreed upon or procure their payment by the new occupier or remove at his own expense the said special fittings, constructions, appliances, or arrangements to the satisfaction of the Local Board.

In all cases where the supply of water to private premises is measured by 30.

meter, the price charged shall be Rs. 2 per 1,000 gallons.

31. No water supplied for any separate service shall be used, unless any agreement has been previously entered into with the Chairman, Local Board. of that agreement shall be in accordance with these by-laws, and the rates charged

for the supply of water shall be those fixed by resolution of the Board.

32. Every owner or occupier of any premises supplied with water under the Ordinance, who shall supply to any other person, or wilfully permit him to take any such water from any cistern or pipe in such premises, unless for the purpose of extinguishing any fire, or unless he be a person supplied with water from the waterworks, and the pipes supplying him be, without his default, out of repair, shall be guilty of an offence, and liable to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

A RECONSTRUCTIVE RELIEF SCHEME

A National Appeal for the Near East Refugees.

SR,—SINCE the appeal for the Near East was launched from the Mansion House in October last, it has been possible to envisage the relief problem of the Near Eastern refugees more clearly as a whole, and it has become increasingly obvious that the effective means of dealing permanently with a problem of such magnitude is by the undertaking of relief work on a reconstructive basis.

An opportunity for such work is now offered by the Refugee Settlement Scheme which has been organized by Colonel Procter, the Deputy High Commissioner of the League of Nations. A district of land has been allotted in Greece to some 10,000 refugees by the Greek Government, who have supplied such building materials, agricultural implements, tools. &c., as will enable the refugees to build their own villages and settle permanently on the land. Food supplies which will last till the beginning of April are already in hand, but the interval between that date and the gathering of their harvest is unprovided for.

The High Commissioner of the League of Nations, realizing the importance of the settlement of the rural populations as a necessary preliminary to the whole problem of assisting the refugees, has requested the assistance of the British relief organizations to complete and extend this work of permanent relief. The Greek Government has given assurance of the supply of those essentials which will enable the refugees in this area to become self-supporting after the harvest is gathered; the Relief Societies associated in the All-British Appeal, who are already feeding 35,000 refugees in other parts of Greece, have agreed to provide the necessary food which will be distributed under British supervision; and, in view of the serious position which has been created by the outbreak of epidemics, the British Red Cross Society, who are also giving medical relief and assistance in other districts, have consented to take over and enlarge the hospital established by Lady Rumbold, and to administer medical relief over the whole of this area.

While we appreciate the very many calls upon the public purse at the present time, we cannot refrain from drawing the attention of the subscribing public to the fact that here is a scheme which will appeal not only to their common humanity, but which will contribute to the stabilization of economic conditions in the Near East which are so necessary to the peace and prosperity of all Europe.

We would, therefore, bring this appeal to the serious consideration of the British people. We feel sure that they will once more generously respond, and thus help to prevent the continuation of the present condition in the Near East which may otherwise result in widespread disaster.

Donations for this work of practical Christianity, which may be earmarked, if desired, for general relief purposes or for medical relief, will be gladly received by the Lord Mayor of London, Mansion House, London, E.C. Letters should be marked "Near East Relief."

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 31, 1923.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 141 (14 Burghers, 76 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 21 Moors, and 8 Malays). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1923, viz., 249,046) was 29 5, as against 33 9 in the preceding week, 33 0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 143 (6 Burghers, 79 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 26 Moors, 5 Malays, and 3 Others).

The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.9, as against 30.8 in the previous week, 28.1 in the corresponding week of

last year, and 31.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 143 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 28 in the preceding week, 27 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 18.

Principal Causes of Death-1. (a) Eighteen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 10 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 3 each in Maradana North and Maradana East, and 1 each in Slave Island and Kollupitiya, as against 29 in the previous week and 22 the weekly average for last year.
