HEREAS by section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof, or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance, for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Southern Circuit, twice at least at Galle, and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Galle on April 25 and on September 15 in each year.

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court should be holden on the day hereinafter mentioned at Matara, a place within the said Southern Circuit:

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the said Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Matara, in the said Southern Circuit, on or about Monday, May 21, 1923.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Tenth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Twenty-three.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended April 14, 1923.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 121 (3 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 69 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 14 Moors, 8 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1923, viz., 249,046) was 25.3, as against 31.8 in the preceding week, 28.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27.9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 151 (1 Burgher, 93 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 18 Moors, 4 Malays, and 2 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 31.6, as against 36.8 in the previous week, 26.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31.2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 151 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 41 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 12.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-four deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), 2 each in Kotahena North, Kotahena South, Maradana North, and Wellawatta North, and 1 each in Fort, St. Paul's, Maradana East, Maradana South, and Kollupitiya, as against 32 in the previous week, and 22 the weekly average for last year.

- (b) Eight deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, and Maradana North, and 1 each in New Bazaar and Maradana East, as against 1 in the previous week, and 6 the weekly average for last year.
- (c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, I each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, as against 7 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- 2. (a) Eleven deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, and Slave Island, as against 17 in the previous week, and 12 the weekly average for last year.
 - (b) Two deaths of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama hospital from Phthisis during the week.
- 3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, and Wellawatta South, as against 6 in the previous week, and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- 4. Three deaths from Plague were registered, 2 in Maradana hospitals and 1 in New Bazaar, same as in the previous week, and 2 the weekly average for last year.
- 5. Thirteen deaths were registered from Debility, 12 from Infantile Convulsions, 7 from Dysentery, 6 from Enteritis, 4 from Diarrhæa, 2 from Measles, 1 each from Worms and Puerperal Septicæmia, and 52 from Other Causes.
- 6. Fifty-three cases of Chickenpox, 40 of Measles, 16 of Enteric Fever, and 4 of Plague were reported during the week, as against 39, 23, 15, and 4, respectively, of the preceding week. Two cases of Smallpox were also reported from the Harbour.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 83°1°, against 82°5° in the preceding week, and 81°0 in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29°798 in., against 29°855 in. in the preceding week and 29°871 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0°88 in., against 0°10 in. in the preceding week and 3°63 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following Specifications have been accepted:

No. 1,907 of March 23, 1922.

Demetrio Maggiora:

"Elastic tyre for carriages, motor cars, and other vehicles formed of elastic elements arranged within a non-extensible outer cover."

Abstract.—The applicant describes a solid tyre with a non-extensible outer cover and an elastic inner core made of successive tubes drawn over each other under tension. He points out that if the section under no load is circular, under load it will be approximately elliptical, and the outer cover being non-extensible will have a smaller internal area, while the core being elastic tends to keep the same area, so giving rise to a tendency to burst the cover. He makes his section elliptical under no load with the longer axis of the ellipse in the direction of the radius of the wheel, so that under moderate load the section becomes circular leaving a space between the core and cover into which air is admitted by means of air holes. Under heavy load the section again becomes elliptical with the short axis of the ellipse in the direction of the radius of the wheel and the core again fills the cover. On the rim side of the core a support of trapezoidal section is provided in which the elasticity gradually decreases as we pass outwards from the core to the rim.

The claim is :--

Elastic tyre for carriages, motor cars, and other vehicles with elastic elements disposed within a non-extensible outer cover characterized by the fact that the elastic elements consist on one side by rubber elements (Tube and like) drawn over each other, under tension, in the well-known manner, and on the other side in a support that is trapezoidal in section, of varying degrees of hardness so that the elastic elements together with the support present an ellipsoidal cross section and fill the outer cover both when in a state of rest and when it is completely loaded, without substantially straining either the outer cover or the elastic elements during its distortions.

"Process and device for stretching and widening elastic bodies and fitting them to other bodies."

Abstract.—The applicant describes a device for fitting a stretched rubber tube on a rubber core, in one form of which the rubber tube is placed inside a metal tube of the size to which it is to be stretched, and the rubber tube is then expanded by means of compressed air: a hollow piston is then forced by compressed air into the inside of the stretched tube and the rubber core is placed, sucked or pulled into the inside of the hollow piston. On withdrawing the piston and reducing the air pressure the rubber tube contracts on to the core. The core may be stretched if desired while the tube is contracted on to it.

Similar results may be obtained by a decrease of pressure on the outside of the tube.

The claims are :-

1. Process for the stretching and widening of elastic bodies and for fitting them to other bodies, in which the inner diameter of the receiving body is less than the outer diameter of the body to be insheathed, characterized by the fact that the elongation and expansion are brought about by difference of pressure and that the body to be covered is introduced into the hollow body extended and expanded.

2. Process according to claim 1, characterized by the fact that the body to be introduced into the hollow body extended and expanded whose introduction may be effected either by differences of pressure, or mechanically by traction at one end, for instance by means of a cord or the like is held fast during its introduction at the other end in such manner

as to extend in a longitudinal direction during introduction.

3. Device for executing the process according to claim 1, characterized by a cylinder a provided with a mouth-piece b for the hollow body i to be extended and expanded and also with an air inlet conduit d^1 and distributing conduit d^2 , in which cylinder plays a piston b with a hollow rod and detachable head a in which channels a^2 provided in the cover of cylinder and in its socket-pieces a^3 enable the passage of compressed air into the annular space between the piston-rod and the body a to be expanded and in which the cylinder a may moreover, be provided with a second conduit a with an arrangement a for distributing suction-air and compressed air, which may penetrate through a channel a into the hollow piston rod.

4. Process according to claim 1 with the use of the device according to claim 2, characterized by the fact that the extension and expansion of the hollow body are brought about by the driving in of the head g through the displacement of the piston b after which the head is removed the body to be introduced being slightly pushed into the hollow piston-rod a depression being brought about in the rod itself, the piston rod being thereupon gradually drawn out of the hollow body held fast at its free end the transportation of the body to be introduced being regulated by the free end being suitably held fast, so that the body undergoes an extension in a longitudinal direction, which may if so required, be made to equal that undergone by the hollow body.

5. Process according to claim 3 characterized by the fact that the piston-rod c the piston b and the upper cylinder cover are traversed in an air tight manner by a means of traction such for instance as a cord, a wire t or the like, which is connected with the body s to be introduced into the expanded hollow body i and which draws the latter into the hollow body, while the body s may be held fast at the outer end so that it can be extended in a longitudinal direction during the

traction towards the interior.

6. Process according to claim 3, characterized by a cylinder x to be fitted to the free end of the hollow body i and closed at its lower part, which surrounds the body s to be driven into the interior and in which, during the drawing in compressed air is present which is let out of the cylinder x and the hollow body i so that the latter adheres closely to the body s.

7. Process according to claim 1 for effecting the expansion of a hollow body, characterized by the fact that the hollow body is exposed, externally to the action of depression, so that the atmospheric air acting from within or else the

compressed air widens the tube.

8. Process for fitting the hollow body to be treated to a mouh-piece h to be located on the cylinder a, characterized by the fact that this conical mouth-piece occupied by a cylinder h^1 that may be perforated is driven into the hollow body surrounded and held fast by a muff k by means of a screw pin a while by means of a channel a penning out onto the perimeter of the mouth-piece attachment compressed air is introduced in between the mouth-piece and the hollow body for the purpose of facilitating introduction.

"Roller bearing journal box."

Abstract.—The applicant describes a journal bearing in which a cage for rollers is inserted between the sleeves fixed respectively to the casing and the journal pin. The cage is composed of two pairs of rings having two rings in contact, spacing pins connect the first and third and second and fourth rings and are staggered. In the intervals between the pins are bearing points for the rollers. Additional rotary members are provided to absorb the axial thrust of the bearing.

The claims are :-

1. Journal bearing, including a casing for the journal pin, sleeves rigidly fixed to the end and to the casing respectively and a cage for rollers inserted between said sleeves, the rollers being in contact with both of said sleeves. 2. Journal bearing, as set forth in claim 1, including roller supporting means on the cages for holding the rollers out of axial alinement relatively to each other and for maintaining their axes parallel to the axis of the bearing.

3. Journal bearing, as set forth in claims I and 2, including in the cages pairs or rings between which the rollers are supported, the inner ring of the outer cage being located more inward of the bearing than the outer ring of the inner cage.

4. Journal bearing, as set forth in claims 1 and 3, including spacing pins for the rings of each cage, the spacing pins of each cage being secured to the end ring of the cage and passing through the other ring of the other cage.

5. Journal bearing, as set forth in claims 1, 3, and 4, including pointed projections on the pins which projections

act as bearing points for the rollers of the cage.

6. Journal bearing, set forth in claims 1, 3, and 4, including on each outer ring of the cage pointed projections adapted to serve as bearings for the rollers and insertable into sockets of the rollers for spacing the same and for rotatably holding them in the cages.

Journal bearing, as set forth in claims 1 and 2, including mounted ends at the rollers adjacent the sockets by

means of which said rollers are supported on the cages.

8. Journal bearing, set forth in claim 1, including additional rotary members adapted to absorb the axial thrust

of the bearing during rotation.

9. Journal bearing, as set forth in claims 1 and 8, including a cage for the rollers, having their axes arranged radially of the bearing and a disc in a plane perpendicular to the axis of the bearing against which said rollers engage to absorb the axial thrust under reduced friction.

10. Journal bearing, as set forth in claims 1 and 9, including as cage for the axial thrust rollers a disc provided

with pockets in which the axial rollers rotate, and means for spacing said disc from the end of the journal pin.

11. Journal bearing, as set forth in claims 1 and 9, including pins of cylindrical cross-section inserted into the pockets for the axial thrust rollers and in engagement with the circumference of the rollers to prevent increase of friction in the rotation of said axial thrust rollers in their pockets.

12. Journal bearing, as set forth in claims 1 and 9, including spherical end portions on the axial thrust rollers, said spherical end portions being in engagement with each other, the rollers however, being independently rotatable in their

pockets.

Journal bearing, as set forth in claims I and 8, including a member provided with a spherical end surface and secured to the end of the journal pin, and a wear plate in engagement with the spherical portion of said member adapted to absorb axial thrust exerted by said member on said wear plate.

14. Journal bearing, as set forth in claim 1, wherein the rollers and the sleeves between which said rollers rotate

are made of chromium steel.

Journal bearing, as set forth in claims 1 and 13, in which the wear plate is made of manganese steel.

Journal bearing, as set forth in claim 1, including rings inserted between one end of the inner sleeve and the outer closing cap of the bearing and means on said sleeves for retaining them in tight engagement with the bearing to prevent discharge of lubricant from the interior of the bearing.

Journal bearing, substantially as described and shown with respect to Figures 1 to 7, and for the purpose set forth.

18. Journal bearing, substantially as described and shown with reference to Figures 8 and 9, and for the purpose set forth.

'Improvements in apparatus for cleaning ship's bottoms."

Abstract.—The applicant describes an apparatus for cleaning ship's bottoms whereby the operation is carried out whilst the ship is water borne, thereby obviating the necessity of dry docking her for the purpose.

The claims are:

1. Apparatus for cleansing ships bottoms comprising a working rope, scraping devices attached to such rope, means for imparting reciprocating motion to the said rope, means for adjusting its working position both in horizontal and vertical plane in relation to the hull of the vessel, and means for advancing or retiring the position of the scrapers relative to the cleaned portion of the hull of the vessel, as the work proceeds.

2. Apparatus for the purpose specified comprising a working rope to which a scraping device is attached, means for imparting reciprocating motion to such rope, means for winding in either end of the rope to advance or retire it and the scraping device attached thereto as the work proceeds, and means for altering the position of the rope both in horizontal and vertical plane to cause the scraping device to traverse the surface of the hull during the operation.

3. In apparatus for the purpose described a scraping device comprising a plurality of shackled members, thus permitting the efficient automatic positioning of the apparatus on the surface of the hull, a plurality of scraper blades constructed and arranged as shown to form truncated cones and a plurality of brushes positioned in rear of such scrapers.

4.
