GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO ALL EXCISE LICENSES.

"THE EXCISE ORDINANCE, No. 8 of 1912."

Excise Notification No. 133.

T is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor has, under the provisions of section 24 of "The Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912," been pleased to direct that the following shall be the general conditions applicable to all Excise licenses on and after July 1, 1923, from which date the general conditions applicable to all Excise licenses appearing in Excise Notification No. 128 dated May 18, 1922, will be cancelled.

General Conditions applicable to all Excise Licenses.

1. Sales at taverns (whether country liquor or foreign liquor) must be conducted in a suitable building, of which the whole or part must be set aside for exclusive use as a tavern. If there are means of communication between the tavern and an adjoining dwelling house, they must be kept permanently closed. In the case of all taverns there shall be no possible means of ingress or egress except by the front door. In the case of taverns in Municipalities, Local Board towns, or towns brought under the operation of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, the tavern premises shall have no doors except into the main street. The interior of the tavern shall be sufficiently lighted by day and by night, and the tavern shall not be used as a place of residence, save by the vendor or a caretaker.*

No alterations or additions shall be made to any tavern building, nor shall any wall, fence, or other enclosure be

erected without the approval of the Government Agent.

- 2. A signboard must be affixed to the front of each licensed distillery, brewery, wholesale warehouse, arrack renter's storehouse, bottling warehouse, or tavern (including beer and porter) showing the number and nature of the license, the name of the licensee, and, in the case of country liquor taverns, the current rate of sale. These particulars must be legibly painted in English or the local vernacular. The license and a printed copy of these conditions must be hung up in a conspicuous place within all licensed premises. In the case of taverns the license must show the names of
- (1) The possession upon any licensed premises of any liquor or intoxicating drug, except that to which the license relates, or of any essence or substance used or capable of being used for colouring or flavouring liquor, is prohibited, provided that this shall not apply to harmless substances kept or used in distilleries to flavour or colour liquor, if such are approved by the Excise Commissioner.

(2) All liquor and intoxicating drugs sold or kept for sale shall be of good quality and unadulterated. Nothing shall be added to them, either to increase their intoxicating power or for any other purpose, provided that this shall not apply to harmless substances kept or used in distilleries to flavour or colour liquor, if such are approved by the Excise

Commissioner.

- (3) No licensee or renter and his tavern keeper shall sell any liquor at a price higher than the current rate appearing on the signboard.
- All officers authorized to inspect licensed premises (vide condition 21 infra) are authorized to detain any liquor or intoxicating drug reasonably suspected to be unfit for consumption or use, or which they may believe to have been tampered with, and all licensees shall give all such officers all such facilities and assistance as they may require for the exercise of their powers.
- The sale or transport of liquor or intoxicating drugs by persons below the age of sixteen, or by persons suffering from leprosy or any contagious disease, and the employment of such persons for the sale of the same, are prohibited. The names of all persons employed or proposed to be employed in godowns, warehouses, taverns, or bars shall be furnished to the Government Agent, who may forbid the employment of any person of whom he may disapprove.
 - The rules regarding the hours of opening and closing places licensed for the sale of liquor are as follows:--

Toddy Taverns.—Toddy taverns shall remain open between the hours of 8 A.M. and 6.30 P.M., and shall be kept closed at all other hours. The Government Agent may, after consulting the Advisory Committee, fix the opening hour of toddy taverns as early as 7 A.M., where local circumstances are found to require it, and may extend the hour of closing any taverns in towns, and for special reasons outside towns, to such hour as he may fix, not being later than the closing hour of arrack taverns in the same area, and shall enter such hours of opening and closing in the license. No sale shall take place between the time at which the tavern is required to be closed at night and the time fixed for opening.

Arrack Taverns.—Arrack Taverns shall remain open between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m., and shall be kept closed at all other hours. The Government Agent may, after consulting the Advisory Committee, extend the hour of closing any such taverns in towns, and for special reasons outside towns, to such hour as he may fix, not being later than the closing hour of such taverns in April, 1917, and in no case later than 9 p.m., and shall enter the hour of closing in the license. No sale shall take place between the time at which the tavern is required to be closed at night and 8 A.M.

No sale of liquor shall take place between the hour at which the premises are required to be closed and the hour fixed for opening. (including places licensed for the sale of beer and porter only) and bars shall remain closed between the hour fixed for closing and the hour fixed for opening. The closing hour of foreign liquor taverns (including places licensed for the sale of beer and porter only) shall not be later than the closing hour of arrack taverns in the same area.

The licensing authority may, however, in special cases authorize licensed premises, other than taverns and places licensed for the sale of beer and porter, to be kept open to such later hour as may be fixed by him, provided that no liquor shall be sold between the hours of closing and opening appearing in the liquor license.

^{*} In taverns which are clearly of a superior character, private bars may be sparingly allowed by the Government Agent, under a special license to be granted by him, free of fee; provided that the interior of the bar is wholly visible from the doorway, and that the entrance to it is either through the main door of the shop, or through a separate door clearly labelled or provided with a proper signboard to show its nature.

- 7. No drunkenness, disorder, or gaming shall be permitted in taverns and other licensed premises. Every person licensed to sell liquor and every keeper of any licensed premises shall refuse to admit to, and shall turn out of, the premises in respect of which the license is granted any person who is drunk, violent, quarrelsome, or disorderly, and any person whose presence on the premises would subject him to a penalty under any Ordinance for the time being in force.
- 8. No robbers, thieves, habitual criminals, or disorderly or riotous persons or reputed prostitutes shall be harboured in any licensed premises. Intimation of their resort thereto shall be given to the nearest Magistrate or Police Officer by the licensee.
- 9. No person shall be harboured in any licensed premises between the hours of closing and opening such premises, and no constable shall be harboured in such premises during his time of duty.
- 10. Tayerns situated on or adjacent to the line of march must be closed, if the Government Agent so orders, while a regiment or detachment of European or native soldiers is passing, or is encamped in the vicinity; and, if the Government Agent so orders, any licensed premises must be temporarily closed in times of religious excitement, or when a disturbance exists or is apprehended. Every Excise licensee shall of his own motion close his licensed premises when there is a riot or disturbance in the neighbourhood.
- 10 (a). On days of polling the Government Agent or his Assistant shall order the closure of all taverns in the area in which polls are held, and the grantee shall have no claim to a remission on this account.
- 11. The right is reserved to the Government Agent to grant "Occasional Licenses" for the sale of liquor on the occurrence of fairs, festivals, &c. Such licenses shall ordinarily be granted to the tavern keepers who usually supply the locality, or to the representative of the renter. Their period shall not exceed ten days, and the fee to be paid therefor shall be fixed at the discretion of the officer issuing the licenses.
 - 12. No liquor shall be sold or given-
 - (a) Except at licensed premises specially approved by the Officer Commanding the Troops in the Colony or the Officer Commanding the Station or Camp, and then only in respect to such liquors as shall be approved by the same authority in consultation with the Excise authorities and specified in the license-
 - (1) To sailors in the Royal Navy, soldiers, and the members of their families; or (2) To any other person living in barracks.

- (b) Whilst on duty to any-
 - (1) Member of the Police Force or officer of the Excise Department; or

(2) Railway servant; or

- (c) In any circumstances to any-
 - (1) Person under sixteen years of age; or

(2) Insane person; or

- (3) Person known or believed to be intoxicated.
- 13. No privilege of manufacture, supply, or sale, or any interest therein shall be sold, transferred, or sub-rented without the Government Agent's previous permission; nor, if the Government Agent so orders, shall any agent be appointed for the management of any such privilege without his previous approval.
- 14. Taverns must be kept open, unless their temporary closure is authorized under condition 10 supra, and such supply of liquor as the Government Agent may consider sufficient to meet local requirements must be maintained therein. Tayerns not opened by dates to be fixed by the Government Agent shall be liable to be re-sold at the risk of the licensees.
- 15. No liquor shall be sold in taverns except for cash. All licensees shall, subject to any special condition limiting the quantity that may be sold, be bound to supply liquor on demand and on tender of cash to any person entitled to demand it.
- 16. No liquor or intoxicating drug shall be sold either below the minimum or above the maximum prices fixed for sale of the same in accordance with the law for the time being in force.
- 17. No liquor or intoxicating drug in excess of the quantity prescribed for possession without a license shall be permitted to be removed by any person at any one time from any licensed premises without a valid permit; nor shall liquor or intoxicating drugs be sold at godowns or warehouses in quantities less than the minima prescribed.
- 18. True accounts of transactions shall be maintained from day to day in ink in forms approved by the Excise Commissioner, and shall be kept in the licensed premises. Such accounts shall be correctly and promptly totalled at the end of each month. The accounts and passes shall be in printed books, which may be obtained from any Kachcheri on payment of cost price, or on production of receipts for the payment of the cost price into a Government Treasury. Passes for liquor or intoxicating drugs received and the counterfoils of passes issued must be carefully filed in the licensed premises. The signing of blank passes for subsequent issue is prohibited. The accounts and counterfoils of passes shall be preserved by the licensee for one year after the period covered by the license, and shall be produced when called for by an officer not below the rank of Assistant Superintendent of the Excise Department.
- 19. Such returns and information as may be required by the Excise Commissioner or by the Government Agent from time to time shall be furnished by holders of licenses.
- *20. When any weights, measures, or instruments have been prescribed for use in any licensed premises, only such weights, measures, and instruments as have been prescribed shall be possessed or used on such premises, and they shall be tested and stamped by the stamping establishment of the district, if the Government Agent shall so direct. The possession or use of weights or measures that are incorrect on any licensed premises will render the licensee liable to punishment.
 - 21. The officers authorized to inspect licensed premises are
 - (1) Any officer of the Revenue Department of rank not lower than a Ratemahatmaya, Mudaliyar, Muhandiram. or officer of like rank;

(2) Any officer of the Excise Department of rank not lower than Inspector; and

(3) Any person appointed under section 7 (c) to perform the acts and duties mentioned in sections 32, 34, and 45 (a). (Vide Excise Notification No. 68.)

These officers are empowered to enter and examine the premises, to test weights and measures in use, and the liquor and intoxicating drugs in the possession of the licensees, to remove samples of the same, free of charge, after duly sealing them in presence of the licensees, for purposes of chemical analysis where there is reason to test quality or strength, and to call for and check the accounts kept in the licensed premises. In regard to taverns (including premises licensed for the sale of beer and porter only) such officers are further empowered to examine any private documents or books within the premises, and, if any offence is disclosed thereby, to seize and remove such documents or books. All licensees shall give to all such officers all such facilities and assistance as they may require for the exercise of their powers. Nothing in this condition shall be interpreted as depriving Police Officers of any powers vested in them by law, and no claim shall lie for compensation for the value of such samples.

- An inspection notebook with the pages numbered consecutively shall be kept by the licensee in the licensed premises for the entry in it by Inspecting Officers of their remarks, and be handed over to the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Excise, or any officer authorized by him to receive it, on a receipt being given therefor.
- 23. Licensees are bound to report to the Government Agent all instances which come to their knowledge of persons employed by them in the manufacture, transport, or sale of liquor and intoxicating drugs committing breaches of the Excise laws, and to comply with the Government Agent's orders respecting the continued employment of such persons. No persons who have been convicted under the Ceylon Penal Code or under "The Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912," shall be employed in the transport or sale of liquor and intoxicating drugs without the Government Agent's previous permission.
- 24. Pecuniary dealings of any kind whatever by licensees with officials of the Excise Department are absolutely prohibited.
- 25. All licensed premises and all vessels, measures, and other articles used for the storage or sale of liquor therein, shall be kept scrupulously clean.
- 26. All licensees shall be bound by any additional general rules that may be prescribed under the Excise law, and, if so required by the Government Agent or any officer authorized by him, to deliver up their licenses for amendment or for the issue of fresh ones.
- 27. The possession (save under and in accordance with the law applicable to unlicensed persons) or sale by any licensee of any excisable article elsewhere than at the premises to which his license refers is prohibited.
- 28. In no case shall an arrack or toddy renter or a licensee of a foreign liquor tavern, either personally or by an agent, transport from a tavern any quantity of liquor that may have been sold without a special permit from the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent.
- 29. All vessels at arrack renters' storehouse, arrack taverns, toddy taverns, and beer and porter shops used for storing or for transport of liquor shall have their correct capacities marked in terms of gallons, and be provided with accurate dip-rods to ascertain the correct quantities they hold.

Rules made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under section 62 (1) of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910."

- 1. The expression "rules to be amended" shall, in these rules, mean the rules made under section 62 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, and published by Notification dated October 26, 1910, appearing in Government Gazette No. 6,408 dated October 28, 1910, as amended by Notifications dated January 20, 1914, September 26, 1919, December 3, 1919, January 22, 1920, March 19, 1920, March 7, 1921, October 13, 1921, and June 21, 1922, published in Government Gazettes bearing Nos. 6,603, 7,055, 7,069, 7,079, 7,094, 7,161, 7,219, and 7,264 dated respectively January 23, 1914, October 3, 1919, December 5, 1919, January 23, 1920, March 26, 1920, March 11, 1921, October 21, 1921, and June 23, 1922.
 - For rule 2 of the rules to be amended, the following rule shall be substituted:—
 - 2. (i.) Any person who shall have served for one hundred and twenty months or less than one hundred and twenty-one months may receive an annuity equal to 180/720ths of the salary as defined hereinafter of the permanent office or offices held by such person at the time of retirement.

(ii.) Any person who shall have served for hundred and twenty-one or less than one hundred and twenty-

two months may receive an annuity equal to 181/720ths of such salary.

(iii.) In like manner, an addition may be granted of 1/720th for each additional month of service until the completion of four hundred and twenty months of service, when the maximum pension of 480/720ths of the salary may be granted.

These fractions include in each case a climate bonus of 60/720ths, representing five years' service, granted

for service in the tropics.

- (iv.) (a) Any person retiring on account of illness or age after completing 120 months' gross service, but before completing 120 months' service counting for pension in accordance with section 8, may receive an annuity, calculated on 720ths as in the preceding sub-sections, but based on the actual number of months counting for service under that section, with an addition of one month for each complete period of two months of such service.
- (b) Any person retiring on account of illness or age before completing one hundred and twenty months' gross service may receive a gratuity calculated at the rate of 1/12th of a month's salary of the permanent office or offices held by such person at the time of retirement for each month of service.

Provided that female employees holding pensionable appointments may receive gratuities on compulsory retirement on marriage under the following conditions:-

(a) The grant of such gratuities will be limited to cases in which resignation on marriage is required by the Council's regulations or terms of appointment.

(b) The marriage must be notified to the Chairman immediately on its taking place.

(c) Persons retiring under such circumstances, at the discretion of the Chairman, and with the approval of the Council, may receive a gratuity at the rate of 1/12th of a month's pay for each complete month of established service, but not exceeding in the whole a maximum of twelve months' pay. No gratuity will, however, be paid when the service is less than thirty-six months, and any period under temporary agreement will be excluded unless followed by two years on the permanent establishment.

(d) No person who has received such a gratuity and has subsequently become a widow can be re-employed on the pensionable establishment without the sanction of the Council, and her previous service will

not be allowed to count for pension.

- 3. For rule 5 of the rules to be amended, the following rule shall be substituted:—
- (1) In the case of abolition of office the pension orgratuity grantable to a Municipal officer or servant, whose office has been declared to be pensionable, will be as follows:-
 - (i.) If the officer has completed 120 months' gross service, he may be granted a pension of 1/720th of his salary for each month of his service counting for pension in accordance with section 8, with an addition to such service of one month for each complete period of two months' service, the addition in no case exceeding 120 months.

(ii.) If the officer has not completed 120 months' gross service he may be granted a gratuity of 1/12th of a month's salary for each month of service counting for pension in accordance with section 8, with an addition of 50 per cent. thereon.

(2) Provided always that the officer who is thus retired shall be liable to be re-called to the Municipal service for re-employment on a salary which, together with his pension, shall not be less than that enjoyed at the time of abolition, and that in no case shall the number of months to be added to the actual service exceed that which, if added to the age of the retiring officer, would bring that age up to 60 years.

- 4. In the second paragraph of rule 18A of the rules to be amended for the figures and words "1/60th of each year of service," there shall be substituted the figures and words "1/720th for each month of service."
- 5. In rule 18B of the rules to be amended for the word and figures "section 2 (iv.);" there shall be substituted the figures and letter "2 (iv.) (b)"; and for the fraction "15/60ths," there shall be substituted the fraction "180/720ths."
- 6. In the first paragraph of rule 21 of the rules to be amended for the words "one-third of a month's salary for each year's service," there shall be substituted the figures and words "1/36th of a month's pay for each complete month's service."
- 7. In sub-rule (iii.) of rule 22 of the rules to be amended for the figures and words "60ths as the years," there shall be substituted the figures and words "720ths as the months."

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-Generals' Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended May 19, 1923.

Births—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 122 (10 Burghers, 78 Sinhalese, 10 Tamils, 11 Moors, 7 Malays, and 6 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1923, viz., 249,046) was 25 5, as against 29 3 in the preceding week, 31 8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27 9 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths —The total deaths registered were 172 (7 Burghers, 95 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 30 Moors, 9 Malays, and 7 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 36 0, as against 31 0 in the previous week, 29 9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 31 2 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths —Of the 172 total deaths, 35 were of infants under one year of age, as against 27 in the preceding week, 29 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 33 the average for last year.

Stillbirths — The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirty-seven deaths from Pneumonia were registered, 19 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents), 5 in Slave Island, 3 in Maradana North, 2 each in Kotahena South, New Bazaar, and Wellawatta South, and 1 each in Pettah, St. Paul's, Kotahena North, and Wellawatta North, as against 26 in the previous week and 22 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Five deaths from Influenza were registered, 3 in New Bazaar, and 1 each in St Paul's and Kotahena North, as

against 6 in the previous week and 6 the weekly average for last year.

- (c) Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in New Bazaar and Maradana North, as against 1 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- 2 (a) Nineteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents), 3 in New Bazaar, 2 each in St Paul's, Kotahena North, and Kotahena South, and 1 each in Maradana South, Slave Island, and Kollupitiya, as against 11 in the previous week and 12 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Ragama hospital from Phthisis during the week.

- 3 Five deaths from Plague were registered, 2 each in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident), and Wella watta North, and 1 in Maradana North, as against 4 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year.
- 4 Three deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, 1 each in Kotahena North, Maradana hospital (of a non-resident), and Slave Island, as against 6 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year.
- 5 Fourteen deaths were registered from Debility, 10 from Enteritis, 7 from Infantile Convulsions, 6 from Dysentery, 4 from Worms, 3 from Tetanus, 1 each from Diarrhea and Measles, and 55 from Other Causes.
- 6 Twenty-eight cases of Chickenpox, 9 of Enteric Fever, 8 of Measles, and 3 of Plague were reported during the week, as against 32, 23, 16, and nil, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.2°, against 81.5° in the preceding week and 81.3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.858 in., against 29.853 in. in the preceding week and 29.834 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.38 in., against nil in the preceding week and 3.94 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

 $\overline{}$ OTICE is hereby given that an examination for candidates wishing to enter Class II. will take place annually in August. The next examination will commence on Tuesday, August 21, 1923.

- 2. Applications for admission to the examination by persons not now in the Survey Department must be addressed to the Director of Education, bearing a duly cancelled stamp of Rs. 10, and in the prescribed form (Schedule A), which can be obtained either at the Education Office or at the Surveyor-General's Office on application. A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth, showing him to have been born on or after August 22, 1900. but not later than August 21, 1906, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person,* to the satisfac. tion of the Director of Education, must be attached to the form of application. If a certificate of birth for a previous examination has already been sent in, and is filed in the Education Office, it will be sufficient to refer to the name, and date of that examination. Affidavits will not be accepted. In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration from the register of past births, the certificates will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs, either by alteration or addition from the name by which the candidate is known, the parent or guardian should, before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 7 of Ordinance No. 23 of 1900. Certificates of birth issued for the purpose of the Code for Aided Schools will not be accepted for this examination. This examination is confined to British subjects whose families are permanently resident in the Island.
- 3. Clerks and Draughtsmen in Class III. of the Survey Department, who have completed three years' service, and whose service has been throughout satisfactory, are eligible for examination, irrespective of age and without fee. Their applications (in the same form, Schedule A) for admission to the examination should be forwarded to the Director of Education through the Surveyor-General.

4. Applications should reach the Director of Education not later than 2 P.M. on June 16, 1923. Any

applications received after that hour will be rejected.

5. The Director of Education will return to the candidate his application, approved or disapproved, as the case may be, after taking, if necessary, the orders of Government thereon. The approved application shall constitute the candidate's ticket of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Director of Education. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

6. The examination will be held at Colombo only, under the supervision of the Director of Education, in

the places which will be notified to the candidates in due course.

7. The examination will be competitive. The number of places assigned for general competition will be two and for Departmental competition three. In the event of insufficient departmental candidates qualifying to fill these three places, they will be filled by outside candidates who have qualified.

8. Successful candidates will be required to produce a health certificate from the Government Medical Officer, testifying to the candidate's sound constitution, good vision, hearing, and physical fitness for duty in any part of

the Island.

- 9. The subjects for examination are those set out in Schodule B of this notice. The examination will be held in two parts. The first part is a qualifying examination in Handwriting, Spelling, and Arithmetic. Any candidate failing to obtain two-thirds of the marks allotted for Handwriting or half those allowed for Spelling or for Arithmetic will be excluded from the remainder of the examination. Special attention will be paid to Handwriting, and candidates whose writing is untidy or illegible or contains defects in the formation of letters will be rigorously excluded. The kind of writing preferred is that generally known as the "Civil Service" hand. The second part of the examination will be in the remaining subjects in Schedule B. Credit will not be given for any paper in which a candidate scores less than 30 per cent. of the maximum marks. In all the writing papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling.
